Yonkers refusing entries from Tom Milici

The track's second leading trainer in 2016 is not welcome to race at the New York track while being investigated for an alleged association with banned trainers Josh Marks and Tracy Brainard.

Tom Milici, the second leading trainer at Yonkers in 2016, is not allowed to enter horses at Yonkers while under investigation.

Tom Milici, the second-leading trainer at Yonkers Raceway with 221 victories in 2016, is no longer allowed to enter horses at that track, pending further investigation.

"As of right now, we are not accepting entries from Milici because we are still investigating any association he might have with Josh Marks," Yonkers racing secretary Steve Starr said Thursday morning. Starr said no other trainer who competed regularly at Yonkers in 2016 is being subjected to that action at this time.

Marks and his wife, Tracy Brainard, have not been allowed





to compete at Yonkers for more than a year. But a rival trainer, speaking on the condition of anonymity, said it is "common knowledge" on the backside that Milici is attaching his name to an ongoing operation overseen by Marks.

"The owners were employing Josh. There is no doubt about that," the person said, adding, "Look at (Milici's) statistics. He didn't do nothing before this."

A second source said management's decision was based on a large amount of information. "We know what goes on," the person said. "We're not guessing."

Milici vehemently defended himself. "I am not a paper trainer," he said. "I am very much hands on."

Milici, 61, produced modest results before enjoying a level of success last year that dwarfed anything he had previously accomplished and left him trailing only Rene Allard's 233 wins in 1,008 starts. Previously, Milici had never won more than 44 races in a season, setting that career high in 2005.

He won 27 races in 2015 while taking in \$304,020. His earnings last year ballooned to \$2,636,702. In addition to the 221 wins in 763 races, he recorded 115 second-place finishes and 85 third-place showings. His UDRS was a gaudy .411.

Milici said he is "fully cooperating" with the ongoing investigation. He noted that he is voluntarily reducing the size of his stable to make it more manageable for him.

In an interview with *Harness Racing Update* last April, Milici credited his new-found prominence to what he described as

freeing himself from "the grip of the devil." He was referring to the hold that alcohol and drugs once had on him.

Milici said then that he was working hard to put behind him a checkered past. Among other offenses, New Jersey revoked his license for "financial irresponsibility" in 1991. His license was suspended indefinitely on Aug. 4, 2010 after he tested positive for cocaine.


He said on Thursday that, with the help of Alcoholics Anonymous, he has remained sober since Aug. 4, 2010 and that he continues to be available to others struggling with alcoholism or addiction.

Milici admitted that CIs Buckeye, one of his horses, recently tested positive for TCO2. He said he learned after the race that the horse had run with a significant fever, leading him to be admitted to a veterinary clinic for extensive treatment. He attributed the positive test to the fever.

Racing resumes at Yonkers on Sunday after its annual winter hiatus. Milici said he was "shocked" when eight or nine horses he attempted to enter for that day were refused.

He said of his startling results, "I'm a winner. I know what I'm doing. I know how to win races."

Changing of the Morning Line

Selections from this column last week went two out of three but despite both being selected based on morning line odds of 6-1 the two winners paid paltry win mutuels of \$4.00 and \$3.80, respectively. And in neither case was I the least bit surprised.

Morning line odds — or odds as they appear in program pages — are clearly taking a hit today in harness racing.

In general, the morning line odds are set for each horse as to mirror how bettors will rate those same horses' chances at race time. In recent times however, the difference with the regularity between a horses odds as posted in the program compared to the actual odds as the race goes off has never been greater.

In one of two instances just from this print last week, Windsun Glory was a fresh acquisition to the Ron Burke barn, making her fourth start for the top trainer following wins from two of her prior three races in which she cruised. The 6-1 morning line should have never been that high and I noted as much when stating she was bound to get hammered down from her initial odds offering, which she did while en route to an easy wire-to-wire score. In the other instance, fellow 6-1 morning line proposition and former classmaster Iam Bonasera drew the rail while dropping to his lowest level on view for superior driving and training connections. At 90 cents on the dollar, he too was put on the front and never faced a serious threat while closing out the nightcap event.

With purely coincidental timing, today (Jan. 6) will mark the first time in the history of the Meadowlands Racetrack that a computerized morning line will be deployed. This will come on the heels not from the two instances as described above, but from routine similar occurrences that have taken place at the track in recent meets.

As Meadowlands Racing & Entertainment general manager and COO Jason Settlemoir told me, "We (the Meadowlands) realize that people have fiercely criticized the

morning line odds-makers at many tracks for decades, but it seemed like those criticisms have really ramped up over the years." Using the Trackmaster computerized morning line, which is also currently in use at many other harness tracks, Settlemoir added the Meadowlands wanted to try something new and to see what the Trackmaster line would look like at the track.

It's worth taking a moment to look at how we got here; not just with regards to the Meadowlands, but to the industry as a whole.

Way back when, the old school role of an odds-maker was largely that individual's sole responsibility at a track. I've never been one personally, but those who have performed the role of morning line odds-maker can tell you that in order for the job to be done properly, assigning the program odds for each race card requires a substantial amount of skill and time in order to master the art night in and night out.

Today, the subjective art of assigning the program odds has largely been lost. It's not uncommon for the track odds-maker to also be the same tracks resource for marketing, public relations, announcer, program vendor or slot machine attendant. At least in part due to the competing priorities, the quality of morning lines across the board has noticeably suffered.

The increasing disparity between a horse's program odds and actual race odds creates a number of obvious perception issues. First and foremost is the integrity of the racetrack.

If any track is consistently publishing nonsensical morning line odds, it sends the signal to me that they don't have a high regard for their racing product. And if a track is indifferent towards the product it's putting forth, why would anyone want to watch it let alone wager on it.

The second issue is the integrity of the race itself. This doesn't apply to many of us who are already students of the game, but what is it supposed to mean to a novice when a 12-1 programmed longshot rightfully so opens up at 4-5? For those new or not yet well versed to the sport, it might be reasonable to interpret the odds fluctuations as some type of

inside information or 'race fixing' rather than simply a poor morning line.

So the question now becomes, are the computerized morning lines any better than their human counterparts today. Based from what I have seen where its employed elsewhere, I'm surprised in myself to be inclined to say 'yes', the program odds are better. While not perfect, they do provide a certain level of consistency. Of course, no matter how reliable the predictive modeling is, there will always be variables and nuances that the algorithms that go into the creation of the computerized morning line won't be able to correctly capture and apply.

To safeguard against gross anomalies that can occur as a result of the Trackmaster system generated line, the Meadowlands will be adding a resource in Justin Horowitz to assist with looking over the morning lines as generated by Trackmaster to make sure that nothing is unreasonably out of line.

Settlemoir said, "We (Meadowlands) are hopeful that the computerized morning lines will get the job done, but if we see that the 'human line' is better because of all the intangibles that can't be picked up on, we won't hesitate to switch back."

It won't take a person long to notice the structural changes in the odds assignments in tonight's program, and for some it might take some getting used to. Settlemoir closed his explanation of the morning line shift to me by stating that, above all, the Meadowlands wants to do what's best for its customers. I, for one, think this new school approach is worth taking a shot with.

HALF A BILLION was one of the only few that managed to close in the aforementioned Jackpot race from 12 weeks ago and this one closed in :26:3 that night; should be moving forward once again towards the end of the mile. BOOMBOOM BALLYKEEL is always a threat with these and I wouldn't disregard despite going off-form here in November.

\$10 Win/Place 5 \$1 Exacta Box 2/5/6/7

Race 5: TRASHYTONGUETALKER was used early into a quick opening quarter when last seen three weeks ago. He was just fair that night, but trainer Weller has been doing good work of late. The winner from his race two back went onto race in the Preferred next out; I think we can take a swing on this one at a square price. ALWAYS A HOTSHOT cruised in that recent qualifier for Mayotte to win handily in 1:53:4. I'd love if not for this being his first start since November; likely will be coming from the back but I'd be tempted if the price were high enough. AWESOMENESS just missed last out in the Valedictory final and is certain to land the deserved role of favorite tonight. Maxwell trainee was first or second in all but a single race last year; will likely need to go a tick faster tonight than what he's accustomed to.

\$10 Win/Place 6 \$2 Exacta Box 2/6/8

Race 10: NIRVANA SEELSTER was cooked last out on Dec. 10 when pressed to make the lead through a :26 flat opening quarter and then gave way late. We all know what he's capable of at his best and this is a level he can typically handle; blasts. COMPANY goes from post 10 to the pole while making his fourth start off the claim for Moreau; was a 1:50:3 winner two back and is a player from the inside. ASAP exits a game try on the engine and picks up MacDonnell who drove him to an open length score three back. VEGAS ROCKS fits on paper and DOVUTO HANOVER makes his first start since August and switches barns; needs one?

Wiggle It Jiggleit and Foiled Again are very different money makers

Foiled Again, the richest horse ever, and Wiggle It Jiggleit, the richest pacer over two seasons, have very different bios entering their five-year-old seasons.

Foiled Again was 67 20-13-7 \$396,678 coming off a four-year-old season where his record was 13-8-2 in 40 starts, \$337,139.

WIJI comes off a Horse of the Year season and a HOY runnerup season and is 38-for-51 lifetime with over \$3.9 million earned. That's 10 times what Foiled Again had at a similar stage. Of course, Foiled Again then embarked on the most remarkable seasons, combined, in harness racing history from ages five through 12.

Can anyone remember...

... another \$3 million plus winner, other than Nuncio, that has had three different trainers? Nuncio was trained by Jim Oscarsson at two, Jimmy Takter at three and Stefan Melander at four.

Most votes ever?

What is the most votes an horse has ever earned in any year-end balloting?

In 1982, Three Diamonds earned 304 votes in the sophomore pacing filly division. In 1985, On The Road Again garnered 303 votes in the older male pacer group.

Most amazing three-peats

Some of the most amazing three-peats ever include:

- Moni Maker winning the Nat Ray (Cashman) in all three appearances 1997-1998, 2000 and setting her lifetime mark of 1:52.1 in her last.
- Jimmy Takter having three straight HOY titles 1997-1999 with two different horses Malabar Man, plus Moni Maker, twice.

- Glen Garnsey winning his first three drives in the Hambletonian Oaks, and it coincided with the race's inauguration: 1971 Gay Blossom, 1973 Colonial Charm and 1974 Berna Hanover.
- Stanley Dancer's three Triple Crowns. No one else has more than one. Dancer won in 1968 with Nevele Pride, 1970 with Most Happy Fella and 1972 with Super Bowl.
- Bret Hanover and Nevele Pride going back-to-back winning Horse of the Year all three years they were on track 1964-1969.
- Takter sending out the three Hambletonian favorites in 2014 Father Patrick, Nuncio and Trixton.

Remembering Slapstick

The good stuff: Slapstick was seven-for-seven entering the first ever \$2 million race and went off the heavy favorite in 1980, finishing fifth. Then, in 1981, he was John Campbell's first ever Meadowlands Pace drive (finishing fourth).

Now, the not so great stuff. After starting his career a perfect seven-for-seven, he then went five-for-25 and wound up at \$471,000 lifetime.

Oh, wait. There is some more good stuff. He sired, from his first crop, the 1985 Woodrow Wilson winner Grade One and gave Ray Remmen the richest driving win of his career (\$1.4 million).

Quiz

- **Q.** Which race debuted at over \$1 million the first two years it was held and was not held the third year?
- **A.** The Governor's Cup. In 1985, the \$1,357,500 edition was won by Barberry Spur. In 1986, the \$1,513,500 contest was won by Redskin. The race was not contested in 1987, but resumed in 1988 with How Bout It winning for Tommy Haughton for a purse of \$750,000. Garden State Park was the original host

Marion's mom

Marion Marauder's dam, Spellbound Hanover, is owned by William Mulligan. The daughter of Donerail was11-for-15 as a two-year-old in 2000, good for \$748,346, which was \$67,549 more than Syrinx Hanover). Bill Popfinger trained Spellbound Hanover.

Never give up

Stanley Dancer, the only man with three Triple Crowns to his credit, started his Hambletonian career finishing 16th, 11th, 11th and 16th in his first four appearances.

Frank O'Mara dies

Gerald Francis O'Mara, known for seven decades around the harness racing world as "Frank," passed Wednesday (Jan. 4). The 84 year-old O'Mara, succumbed to pneumonia in Florida after suffering from ill health for several months.

O'Mara is probably best known for developing and campaigning the great Mystic Park, winner of the American Trotting Championship, The Dexter Cup and the Yonkers Trot. He also campaigned the fast performer Keystone Accent, Timely's Best Man, a winner of over \$700,000, and the very fast — but erratic at times — General's Skipper.

Timely's Best Man was driven on many occasions by Frank's son, Mark, who also campaigned the great Jate Lobell. Yet another son, Dan, sat back of Babe Kosmos, voted Aged Trotting Mare of the Year in 1984.

Born July 25, 1932 in Detroit, Michigan, Frank O'Mara was an honor student and an "11-letter man" in high school, earning at scholastic scholarship to Michigan State University.

As fate would have it, Frank wound up back on the family farm when his father became temporarily blind.

He drove his first race in 1951 and won his first race at the Hale, MI fair in 1952.

After "piling up" four wins during the 1952-1953 seasons,

in 1954 O'Mara left the farm and went to work on an ore carrier in the Great Lakes — that is until a storm did some quick readjustment of his career strategy and it was back to the track for the 1955 season to, earnestly, begin his grand career.

Among his early successes were winning the M & M Trot with Top Pro, 15 straight wins with Kindly Rodney and 16 consecutive victories with Danny Lite.

In 1959, Frank thought it was time for Danny Lite to graduate from the fairs to the "big time" and he brought the horse to Hazel Park to enter the Beaubien Stake.

At that point in their careers, both horse and driver were unknown quantities so, before the Danny Lite entry would be accepted, certified funds had to be put up.

Off at 40-1, O'Mara bided his time as there was a fierce battle going on up front and, at the end of the 2:02 mile, Danny Lite and Frank O'Mara were no longer unknown.

He drove the last of his 1,859 lifetime victories on July 29, 2014, four days after his 82nd birthday.

Surviving members of the O'Mara family include his wife, Cheryl, sons Mark (Martha), Dan (Kristi), Sean, Joshua, and daughters Dawn, Crystal and Michelle.

A memorial ceremony is to be announced in the near future.

Betting down in the U.S., up in Canada in 2016

The United States Trotting Association announced earlier this week that total wagering on harness racing at U.S. racetracks in 2016 was \$1,446,796,214, a 4.33 per cent decrease from the \$1,512,300,328 bet in 2015.

The 2016 per-race average wagering was \$37,325, a \$464 (1.23 per cent) decrease from \$37,789 a year ago, while total race days also declined 1.95 per cent to 3,675 compared with 3,748 in 2015.

Total purses were slightly down by \$532,112 (0.13 per cent) with \$423,067,643 awarded in 2016 compared to \$423,599,755 in 2015.

Data from Standardbred Canada indicates that pari-mutuel wagering on Canadian harness racing increased by 1.97 per cent in 2016.

Canadian harness racing attracted more than \$460 million in handle in 2015, which was an increase of 10 per cent from 2014. This past year (2016) saw Canadian harness racing handle \$469,705,495, which works out to a 1.97 per cent overall increase from 2015.

The number of Canadian races with pari-mutuel wagering in 2016 was 12,383, which attracted an average per-race handle of \$38,066. The average per-race handle in 2016 increased by 6.25 per cent in comparison to the 2015 average of \$35,827.

Total purses in Canada were down in 2016. Combined purses surpassed \$120 million in 2015, but were \$111,796,128 in 2016.

WEG announces \$10 million-plus stakes schedule

The Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) has unveiled its \$10 million-plus standardbred stakes lineup for 2017.

The stakes schedule is highlighted by the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup for three-year-old pacers on Saturday, June 17 at Mohawk Racetrack.

Several changes have been made to the stakes calendar for 2017 to allow horsemen the opportunity to maximize opportunities both in Sires Stakes and Grand Circuit events.

Beginning in 2017, the \$700,000 Metro Pace and \$500,000 Shes A Great Lady for two-year-old pacers will be moved from their usual position on Labor Day weekend to Saturday, Sept. 23.

The \$350,000 William Wellwood and \$350,000 Peaceful Way for two-year-old trotters also find new spots on the calendar and will take place on Monday, Sept. 18.

The \$550,000 Canadian Pacing Derby remains in the Labor Day weekend slot and will be the feature event on Saturday, Sept. 2, while the \$650,000 Canadian Trotting Classic and \$600,000 Maple Leaf Trot hold their same spot on the calendar on Saturday, Sept. 16.

Along with adjustments to the stakes calendar, WEG has also altered the stakes payment schedule for 2017.

For many years, nominations have closed in both February and March for different events, but beginning in 2017 all nominations to WEG Stakes will now close on February 15.

WEG will continue to distribute purse money to all finishers in major stakes events during the 2017 season.

Stall applications for Hawthorne

Stall applications for the 2017 summer harness meet at Hawthorne Race Course are now available. The five-month summer season will begin on Thursday, May 11 and will race through Sunday, Sept. 24.

Horsepeople that raced at Hawthorne in 2016 will have stall applications mailed to them, but can also access the application through the Hawthorne website under the 'Horsemen' section. Stall applications are due no later than April 1, as stalls will be allotted by April 15.

Harness Racing Secretary Robin Schadt has put together an expanded list of conditions that will allow for horses racing at all levels to be competitive. Additionally, purses for 2017 will be increased 30-40 per cent across the board.

In addition to the increase in purses, Illinois conceived and foaled horses will race for some added bonuses in 2017. For those conditions restricted to Illinois-bred horses, the purse will be increased 10 per cent off the purse for an open condition. Illinois-bred horses will also receive a 50 per cent allowance when racing with open horses. This will allow Illinois-bred horses to be more competitive against open company at all conditioned levels.

In 2017, Hawthorne will conduct three racing meets. Spring thoroughbreds kick off March 3 and race through April 29. The summer harness meet will race May 11 through September 24. Fall thoroughbreds return Oct. 6 and race through Dec. 30.
