WEG / Big M integrity rule being tweaked to address concerns

WEG chairman Clay Horner said he's currently talking to major industry players and crafting a tweak to his integrity rule.

Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) chairman Clay Horner said the reaction he's had to a new WEG / Meadowlands integrity rule (full story here) has been overwhelmingly positive, but there were enough serious concerns from some major industry players that the rule is now being tweaked. The language behind a revised rule could be available as early as next week.

The original Standardbred Racing Integrity and Accountability Initiative (SRIAI) banned any trainer, horse or owner (with at least a 25 per cent stake in the horse with a positive) from participating in stakes races at Woodbine,



Mohawk, the Meadowlands, Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs in 2018 if they have been found by a racing regulatory agency to have tested positive for prohibited substances as defined within the Association of Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification for Foreign Substances of Class I, II, TCO2 or steroids after Jan. 1, 2018. (Note: the original article in HRU failed to point out that in the case of Class II positives, owners, trainers and horses would only be subjected to a ban after two Class II positives).

Last week, Horner further explained the original rule as follows, "Say Owner A has a horse with Trainer A. If Trainer A has a positive test of one of these natures, then all of Owner A's horses in which he or she owns 25 per cent or more are disqualified from future participation, regardless of who the partners are and regardless of who the trainer is. We want partners to say to their fellow partners, 'Look, I see that you've got horses with somebody that is riskier than the trainer that we have horses with together. It would be a terrible thing for there to be mistake, or something that's done, that could impact us all here. And, in particular, for me to suffer that bad consequence because you weren't careful and diligent in your choice of trainers."



Horner said Thursday that he was "always open to changes" and the revised rule will be less "Draconian."

"I think the main concern that people had was 'don't punish me if I haven't done anything wrong' and, of course, that's a very hard thing to disagree with," Horner said, "but the trick was coming up with the way to make that happen and still achieve our objectives."

He said the objectives behind the modified rule are:

- **1.** A rule that fosters greater bettor confidence.
- **2.** A rule that enhances the reputation of both harness racing, in general, and the tracks' premier events, specifically.
- **3.** A rule that has a "less-intrusive impact" on good owners and good trainers.
- **4.** A rule that, although directly applied to stakes events, would force owners to think about the trainers that they use for overnight horses, as well.
- **5.** A rule that gives new or prospective owners the confidence that there is a level playing field.

"The core principle (of the original rule was) that if a 25 per cent or greater partner had a positive on any of his horses, then initially all of his horses would be out of the stakes, which meant his other partners, who hadn't done anything wrong or been with a trainer who had done wrong – then all of those horses would be out of stakes races," Horner said. "People said, 'it's a pretty Draconian outcome.' As you know, we did a lot of consultation beforehand with our own (WEG) board, with John (Campbell from the Hambletonian Society), with COSA (the Central Ontario Standardbred Association), with AGCO (the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario)... I probably wish in retrospect I had thought of this then, but maybe there's another way to do this."


Horner then suggested the punishment be financial and tied more to the offending party.

He used the example of a partnership between three people that each own a third of a horse that earned \$100,000 by winning a stakes race. If one of the partners has horses with a different trainer that received a Class I positive, then, this particular group would lose one-third of the stakes money owed to it due to the fact that one-third of the owners is in violation of the integrity rule. In this case, instead of \$100,000, the group would earn \$66,000 to divide up amongst themselves.

"Ordinarily, they would divide it up in accordance with their partnership interest, but, in this case, one would think from a moral point of view, the good partners would have a good argument that they would get all or substantially all of that money and the bad partner would bear the consequences of that," Horner said. "However, there's a practical matter that if the bad owner was paying for the care of the horse, then he might have a claim to some share, a reduced share of it. Then we'd take the \$33,000 and distribute all or substantially all of it to the other horses that earned money in the race. Some people have suggested that the money should maybe go for enhanced testing and other integrity initiatives. We haven't made a decision on that yet, but we think all or substantially all of the withheld purse would go to the horses that were otherwise finishing in the money... and that would be a further reward for what we'd call 'vigilant and safe owners."

Horner said the majority of the feedback he received on the original rule was, "from people who just liked the idea that we're going to really do something serious about integrity and people are really going to pay a price, not just talking about it... but there were some, not surprisingly, significant players that were looking at things more intensely. They were invested in them and more public about making them clear."

On Wednesday, Horner spent 12 hours reaching out "to the most significant players who have been voicing substantial concerns or outright opposition to: a) tell them that we care and that we want and value their input, even those that had



been quite extreme in their comments. We took no offense. It was a sign of how passionate and important the issues were to them, both in principle and financially, and, b) tell them that we were listening and prepared to make changes if it was consistent with our objectives and it would attract enough support."

Horner said he spoke to seven owners and three trainers on Wednesday and a further two trainers and one major owner/breeder on Thursday by the time he spoke to HRU around noon.

"All 13 have said, 'If this is what you propose to do, then we're prepared to support it or are enthusiastically in support now," Horner said. "We have some more people to talk to, but I'm very encouraged by what we've heard. Assuming the buy-in continues, we'll then turn to reducing that to text.

"We'll all need to meet as a governance matter, to take that back to (WEG's) Standardbred Committee at Woodbine and make sure they are fine with making the changes. (Meadowlands owner) Jeff (Gural) will have his own process at his end, but I'm highly optimistic, given that our principles are maintained, given that we will have a very high degree of buy-in from the significant stakeholders."

Horner said most people were concerned about the potential for Class II positives.

"There are very few Class Is... One of the things I've heard from trainers is them saying, 'I'm not going to have a Class I unless it's a wacko situation because I don't use those things,' but a couple of them were really candid and said, 'But I do use some Class IIs. I've never had a Class II positive, but it's not beyond the realm of possibility other than being very prudent in that regard."

Horner said another concern expressed to him was the potential for someone to commit sabotage by putting a banned substance in a horse's feed or water.

"One of the things that a lot of people said was, 'because we have a big investment in this game, we really do worry about the weirdo, random situation.' I'm not going to get into it, but part of our proposal will deal with that," Horner said.

He said he is also aware that some owners will simply plan to own less than a 25 per cent share of horses in order to avoid being subject to the rule.

"We're already aware of people saying 'I'd like to take my 33 per cent interest down to 24. So if I have a positive somewhere else, I don't suffer any consequences here.' That's something to be worked out amongst the partners and obviously we're going to give them some time to do that.

We're not close to stakes season yet," Horner said. "Some people will do something to adjust the ownership to protect themselves, some people won't, but they'll have some other agreement for how to deal with that, in that event."

Horner said the new rule is not only aimed at enhancing integrity, but transparency, as well.

"Everyone is going to know what the rules are and by entering the horse and paying the money they are on notice and are accepting what the consequences are going to be. We're really in a contractual relationship in terms of what the deal is," Horner said.

HRU will publish the language of the new rule when it becomes available.

but nice group of broodmares offered, as well as dispersals from the estate of the Hempt family and from the estate of Bill Mulligan, "which includes two sisters to Tripe Crown-winner Marion Marauder in the group. We also have a reduction of White Birch Farm that's offering mares along with some yearlings.

"Then we have a great selection of stallion shares. In the supplement, we're going to be offering five 2018 breedings to Sweet Lou, along with shares in Credit Winner and Dewycheatumnhowe."

The primary attraction will be racehorses.

"It's a typically deep, solid, strong racehorse offering...
We've got a good selection of horses that can race over
all-size tracks. The most important thing that I always stress,
and continue to stress, is to keep looking at the updated past
performance lines... between (Wednesday) and Monday, there
are 73 horses in-to-go, either quality or racing. So I just can't
stress for people enough to continue watching the past
performance lines, which will be updated and available here.
And there will be an updated booklet printed and spread
throughout various tracks."


Videos will be available for the racehorses in the sales paddock.

"Some have raced in the last couple of days, so and a very high number of horses are performing and that's what the people want," said Northwood Bloodstock's Bob Boni who will sell some 65 horses.

"I think it's one of the differences in personality between Harrisburg and the January sale here. At Harrisburg, you can sell horses that have not raced in a while... because the stakes schedule has wound down, but I think when you sell here in January, you're kind of committed to having horses that are qualified and racing," Boni said.

Reid's Preferred Equine Marketing Inc., will consign the most horses.

From the Preferred consignment, Reid highlighted hip 162 Miso Fast, hip 179 Snowstorm Hanover (the 2017 Kentucky Futurity winner) and hip 149 Art Scene, "on top of some young horses that have been racing (at Woodbine) in the Valedictory Series, including the winner of the final (hip 186 Windsun Gotham) and then another horse (hip 151 Better B



Rolling) that won multiple legs of it."

From the Northwood consignment, Boni highlighted, "a dozen or so really nice (horses) that are three, just turning four now. All legitimate stakes horses, a bunch of Jimmy Takters and three really nice trotters from Chris Beaver."

Boni pointed to hip 147 Always A Good Time, hip 148 Andy M, hip 154 Cresurrey, hip 155 Dekeyser, hip 168 Ocean Colony, hip 178 Sir John F, hip 180 Texican, hip 181 The Wall, hip 193 Art History and hip 194 B Yoyo

"There are quality horses and either they are ready to race or are racing... it's what people want to buy," Boni said. "They are fresh, young horses that have shown they can go. With what they race for now, especially if you have horses that show they can go on a half... and I think everything I've mentioned shows that they can, it's a big opportunity to make money."

Reid said he was "really looking forward" to the sale.

"I'm looking to see strong participation. It's always good to see people come in from out of town and do some networking and hopefully the owners will come in and fill their orders and everyone goes home happy with a winner. That's what I'm hoping for," Reid said.

At the 2017 January Select Mixed Sale, the gross of \$6,6288,400 was the best since 2010 and the average of

\$26,989 for the 233 horses/stallion shares sold was the highest since 2008 when the sale posted all-time record numbers.

The gross was up 7.5 per cent over the \$5,849,400 fetched in 2016 despite 25 fewer horses being sold this year. This year's average was up 19 per cent over the 2016 sale average of \$22,672.

In 2016, the gross was down 6.6 per cent from the \$6,265,200 fetched at the sale in 2015 when 269 horses, stallion shares and breedings were sold and was off two per cent from the gross of \$5,971,500 reached in 2014 for 234 horses and items were auctioned.

The 2016 average was down 2.7 per cent compared to 2015's average of \$23,291 and off 11.2 per cent from the average of \$25,519 reached in 2014 when 234 horses and stallion shares were sold for a gross of \$5,971,500.

In 2013, 206 horses and stallion shares sold for a gross of \$4,549,600, an average of \$22,085. In that sale, 158 racehorses grossed \$4,192,000 and averaged \$26,532.

Trace Tetrick gets hot, takes \$25,000 Drivers Challenge

USHWA's Rising Star won the last three races to jump from ninth to first at Miami Valley Raceway in Ohio.

For Trace Tetrick, 2017 was a great year – 569 wins, \$6.8 million in earnings, a pair of Breeders Crown titles and the United States Harness Writers Association's "Rising Star" award. With his victory in the \$25,000 North American Drivers Challenge on Jan. 9 at Miami Valley Raceway, 2018 is off to a great start.

Coming from 'off-the-pace,' Tetrick won the final three races in the competition to rally past Chris Page to take the second edition of the challenge and the \$10,000 first place check.

The three-day event started with the preliminary rounds on Sunday and Monday. Thirty drivers competed in eight races each and the top 10 points earners moved on to Tuesday's final round where the points are reset.

It didn't take long for the final round fireworks to begin as Simon Allard guided Real Revenge to a 3 3/4 length win, paying a whopping \$216.40 to win. Peter Wrenn took the third race at \$74.80.

Miami Valley regular, Chris Page won two of the first four races and held a sizable 18-point lead over Wrenn at the half way point.

With three races left in the competition, Tetrick found himself in 9th place, 54 points from the pacesetting Page.

Tetrick then rattled off a pair of wins with Twin B Honor (\$10.80 to win) and Flyin Orion (\$19.80) to cut the Page lead to 19 points.

Going into the final leg, Tetrick needed at least a second place (20 points) finish to have a chance at the title. Page could have iced the event with a third place (14 points) finish in the final race.

When the field of 10 went postward, Tetrick was behind the bettor's choice, Dalianna, and Page found himself with Desire One, the longest choice on the board.

A win in the final race with race favorite Dalianna gave Tetrick the victory in the North American Drivers Challenge.

Tetrick gunned the five-year-old pacing mare off the gates wings and took the early lead. A bad break in stride by Alibi Seelster (Louis Roy) gave Page at least a ninth place finish (one point), forcing Tetrick to win the finale to take the title outright.

E R Hilary (Corey Callahan) stuck a nose in front at the three quarter mile pole. Tetrick rallied Dalianna in the lane and edged Pretty Real Desire (Simon Allard) by a half-length. Page could not urge Desire One past any other rivals and finished ninth.

At the end of the day, the 31 year-old Tetrick stood in the winner's circle with the oversized \$10,000 check, the same amount a driver would win for a \$400,000 stakes race.

"I know we are going to Florida next month," said Tetrick.
"We'll save some of the (prize) money for down there.

"I can't complain. Last year was a big success and so we kind of carry it over and keep the momentum going forward. It was a good time. It is a good event to have and a good event to support."

Page took home the \$5,000 second place check. Allard (\$3,000), Wrenn (\$2,000) and the 2017 dash champion, Aaron Merriman (\$1,500) rounded out the top five finishers.

The North American Drivers Challenge is a welcome distraction for fans and drivers during the normally "dead" part of the season.

"I was challenged by the assistant general manager, John Marshall to start the meet as strong as we finish it," said Gregg Keidel, Miami Valley's race secretary. "The (drivers challenge) has created new export partners and helped business."

Looking for a signature event in the wintertime is difficult.

"It is tough to get the better horses here at the start of the meet, so I thought we should get the big name drivers," said Keidel.

What about changes for the expected third annual event? "At the end of the meet, we'll sit down and discuss possible changes, maybe a tweet or so, nothing major," said Keidel.

Brower talks tonight's Pick 5 carryover at the Big M

After a week's worth of weather cancellations, the Meadowlands resumes live racing tonight and with it, a carryover in the Pick 5 of over \$28,000 resulting from the Dec. 30 card. A pool guarantee of \$125,000 has been put in place for the wager, but it's quite possible that the total pool including the carryover and new money could exceed \$200,000.

With nearly \$30,000 in free money up for grabs and a large pool to shoot at, I consulted with Meadowlands odds maker and track handicapper Dave Brower to get his read on tonight's Pick 5 sequence.

In looking at these races, most seem fairly open to me. What are you thinking that a ticket should cost for someone to have a reasonable chance of hitting?

"For me personally, the number is generally \$100. On TV, we're not going to put up a \$100 ticket because that's just not realistic for a lot of people. But for me, when I play it, then that's kind of number that probably I'm looking at. You're going to need coverage in certain races, and find that one race in the sequence where you think you have an edge one way or the other and then you're going to key off that. You hope to be right with that one strong opinion and then possibly get a little lucky in some of the other ones.

Beginning with first leg of the Pick 5 sequence, race 3 – this one seemed to be one of the more-wide open of the races to me. I was looking at the 6 (Mojarra Hanover) to start. She came up a little disappointing last out considering the trip but based on what she's accomplished here over the years I'd have to think this is a level she should still be good at. Even the 8 (Fire N Diamonds) looks like she has a chance on paper, going a 1:53 type mile here three back. But there's really no one in here that I'd feel particularly comfortable with.

"One hundred per cent. This is a leg where anyone can win. There are a few horses that look completely overmatched but I wouldn't be shocked by any one of five or six horses in here winning. But I would lean against Mojarra Hanover

personally because I've seen her race for so many years and know her. She was just so bad in the final 50 yards of that last race where it looked like she was going to win and she hung and she drifted. Just because the program line looks good she's going to be overbet. She may end up even being the favorite; there's a possibility of that. The horse I made the favorite Casa Miasa, shows one start and it was no good. But because Brett (Miller)'s back on her she's going to take money. I could see the 8, but I don't like the post and the fact she doesn't show any speed. But if there's one guy I want as a driver on a value horse is Eric Carlson. He's won with a lot of horses and has won with horses that haven't shown speed, but you need coverage in this leg for sure.

To me, this race 4 is the key to the entire sequence for a lot of people. What do you do with the 6 (Receivership)? You were spot on last week in heeding warning against this horse and of course as everyone knows he never came close to even making the gate as the 1 to 2 favorite off the Q and noticeable barn change to Jenn Bongiorno. Do you single him now and hope he trots or throw him out altogether? What's the right approach?

"I'm going to give you two schools of thought and it depends on whether you're going to try to make a big score on this bet. This is your key race right here. And for me, what I'm going to do is to throw this horse out. When he qualified two back he was bumpy gaited at the end and Joey (Bongiorno) kind of had to hold him together at the end –



even though he was full of trot – I'm not going to argue that. But he did not look happy at all on the track last week while scoring down in the post parade and especially with a new driver last week (Tyler Buter got the call because Bongiorno wasn't there). Now we get another new driver tonight. This horse has issues, attitude problems and he's going to be a big favorite. Now I may end up being 100 per cent wrong and if I am I'll turn the page and move on, but why not take a stand here against this questionable big favorite and try to make a score."

Onto race 5, I think I'm going to line up here with you for the most part. That recent mile from New Jersey Viking where he led much of the way in a 1:53 mile stands out and it's obvious that he would need to be included in any ticket. He's also in the sale on Monday so he has some additional incentive to do well. Caulfield seems to be hit or miss to me but it looks like you're willing to give him another chance.

"There's three horses that can win this race. The 4 (Caulfield), the 6 (Two Hip Dip) and the 8 (New Jersey Viking). Two Hip Dip was good in his qualifier and gets a big driver change; could be fresh and fit. We know what the game plan is with New Jersey Viking is – and Caulfield if he trips out – you certainly wouldn't want to leave him off the ticket."

Race 6 was another where it was tough for me to feel strong about any one horse. I see that you're leaning towards the 1 (Keystone I Wish), but trainer Watson is just 1 for 28 so far and the mare was 90-1 last week. But I guess she doesn't seem much worse than most. I thought the 6 (Misqued) might be worth taking a flyer on because of the new barn change and Brett Miller back on board. Plus if you're playing the sale angle, she's another one that needs a good effort in advance of Monday's sale.

"I have to tell you, Misqued has been completely empty in every start of the program. This is a mare that as a filly last year was charging home in :26 and :27 each week and she's just tailed off. Now Brett did choose her last week over a couple other fillies, but barring a total turnaround I'm not using her. The 10 (Free Show) is the best horse but has the worst post and keeps finding ways to lose. In addition to the 1, I'd like to have the 7 (Beautiful Lady) in there as well."

Heading into the last race, again I think you can make a case for a few in here. I think your review is spot on with the 1 (Downundermatter) and last week's race may be the best we've ever seen from him. As you said, the speed was a new dimension and he looks like an obvious must-use on the heels of that race. To me, the 5 (P L Icabod) is one to include that has consistently been close, Watkins is back and forth but I suppose is capable. I could be persuaded to look at including the 8 (Cash Leebrook) who drops for trainer Andrew Harris and had some late trot to offer last out, or even Broadway Concert for Butenschoen. In addition to the 1, what type of coverage would want to have on

your ticket at this stage to feel comfortable with?

"The 3 (Tycoon Seelster), the 5 (P L Icabod) and the 6 (Watkins). The 3 because Billy Dobson and Monica Krist have tried a few horses here over the past month or so and they've had some success. This one is actually taking a bit of a class drop and he wasn't terrible against Montalbano Bi last time. The 5 will probably be overbet as the favorite even though he hasn't been able to find a way to win. The 6 has been good. He loses Brett Miller here but I expected that but he's been good lately and was coming from an impossible spot in his last."

Based on the collective thoughts of myself and Brower, as well as Brower's race reviews from the Meadowlands website, here is a proposed to ticket to consider. This was a tough call because while clearly being forewarned, I'm going to (almost sheepishly) let the ticket ride on Receivership in the 4th race. If he trots, he wins. And if he doesn't trot, including an additional handful of horses from that race as alternatives would cause the cost of the ticket to skyrocket. Game-changing horses, trotters that run down and whether small or large stables are better


Nick Salvi asks: Hello maestro, thought of a query, among all of the great horses you trained, which meant the most to your career, which was your favorite and what was the horse you trained that you felt would have been great but wasn't and the reason why that was so?

Long question, but interesting and really took a lot of thought. Obviously, my career became vertical with my exposure at the Meadowlands. Training horses like Franconia, Cayster, Kerry's Crown, Imperfection, Baltic Striker, and MB Felty all edged my career forward, but they all had something in common. I never selected one as a yearling and never trained any of them at two. They did solidify my reputation as a good trotting horse trainer and provided me with a great owner base for the moment, but looking back none of them were life changing for me. I was training for the best in the business, Lou Guida, Phil Tully, Andy Grant, Larry DeVan and David James but none of them gave me a commitment to buy yearlings.

When I had the sale company of Brewer and Gurfein, before the untimely death of my partner Max Brewer, I became friends with Frank Antonacci of Lindy Farm. He was working for Phil Tully at Woodstock Stud. When Howard "the Boss" Beissinger retired Frank's uncle the Frank Antonacci of Crown Stable needed a trainer. Little Frank, as he was known then, influenced Big Frank to give me the horses. The only brighter day in my life was when my children were born. Crown stable had fine-bred horses and fortunately I did well with their stock. When fall came, I got the great bred trotting yearlings of Crown Stable and among them was Lady Starlet. She was undefeated at two, winning the Merrie Annabelle and \$250,000 in only eight starts. Crown's next crop included the best looking colt I ever saw, as well as the career changer for me — Victory Dream. Although his two-year-old season was limited to five starts due to an evulsion fracture in his right front leg, he showed so much talent that there were a myriad of prospective buyers. Here is where the game change came. George Segal's Brittany Farm was interested and had him vetted out. I will not divulge the name of the veterinarian, but his report was horrifying to say the least and team Segal backed away. But in their place came a wonderful group, and if I leave someone out please don't shoot me: Lindy Farm, Walnut Hall (AJL), Per Erickson and Jimmy Takter to name the ones I remember.

We all know what a wonderful year it was for the big bay colt winning the Hambletonian and over \$1 million and hitting the board in 13 of 15 starts. One person was particularly impressed, and that was Art Zubrod (the heart and soul of Brittany Farm). He told George Segal that if I could do what I did with Victory Dream after reading that vet report "we should give him some horses to train." Well that was 1994 and I trained some really great horses for Brittany Farm for the next 20 years. But looking back Victory Dream launched my career.

My favorite horse was, without question, Continentalvictory. I have trained many fast horses, but she was different. She had more desire to win than any horse I ever drew a line over. Her victory in the 1996 Hambletonian was to many the most courageous performance by equine athlete of any sex or gait. Then winning the World Trotting Derby after being parked the first heat in 53 seconds to the half, was nothing short of miraculous. "Connie" as we called her was the last 3-year-old filly to beat the boys, and she did it in grand style. I have seen some really great fillies in the last 21 years try



and fail to mimic her feats.

The last part of the question, one that didn't live up to my hopes would have to be Mr. Vic. He had a good two-year-old season and came out like gangbusters in his three-year-old campaign and going into the Hambletonian I thought he could have been the best. However, he injured a suspensory in the warm ups and was never to race again. Then to add insult to injury, no pun intended, he was a less-than-spectacular sire.

Jerry Riordan (recent winner of the Yonkers International Trot in world record fashion with Twister Bi and soon to be testing the waters in Paris) asks: Dear Guru, I noticed that over the years you seemed to prefer white brace bandages on your trotters as opposed to shin boots. Any particular reason? Lastly, was it you that coined the phrase he couldn't train a pig to get dirty?

I really didn't use brace bandages much. What you were looking at was white vetrap, which is neater, lighter and waterproof. I did change from white to black after I got to watching some of my less than wonderful gaited pupils on TV and realized how much the white brought out the flaws. I do however recommend old fashioned cottons and vetrap over boots for two reasons. One, they widen a horse out more than boots and two they provide a far smaller target for interference. However if you have a horse that really pounds his shins stick with trotting boots.

No, I didn't coin the phrase about training a pig to get dirty. That quote comes from the Pride of Dalton Georgia, John Sonny Patterson Jr, but my gut feeling is that he got it from his dad Big John.

Cynthia Milano asks: Hi Ron I find your articles in Harness Racing Update very enlightening, one can never learn enough in the horse business. My question is about trotters that run down. I have an 8-year-old that runs down badly. It's much worse on the right where he does have a suspensory.

Running down in standardbreds is a major problem that has to be addressed immediately because the pain is excruciating and eventually will change your horse's gait entirely. Horses are going faster year to year and the quality of the tracks surfaces are becoming poorer. Between the speed and the grainy surfaces more horses are sliding than ever before. That is what causes a horse to run down. The dropped suspensory only exacerbates the issue.

To cure this problem you can go from mild to wild. Start simple and try to use the easiest of methods. First get the angles of his hind feet as high as you can — 60 degrees is not out of the question. Make sure you hind shoe has some kind of grab like a swedge or borium. If he is still running down you have to be more aggressive. Putting degree shoes on will ultimately work. Start with one degree and increase up to three degrees. I think three is the maximum, any higher

you are looking to break an ankle. I have had more than my share of horses needing this procedure and I have never seen one that the degree shoe wouldn't cure. As for the suspensory part of it, the higher your angle is, the better off you are and your horse is eight years old it hard to believe the leg isn't set and should remain so.

Please buy some rundown patches to use while you are trying to figure this all out, they will prevent any excessive damage along the way.

Joel Kravet asks: Is it better to have a horse with a trainer that has a small stable and actually handles the horse on a day to day basis or a large stable where the trainer rarely sits behind the animal? How can a trainer make sure the horse is fine without sitting behind them?

Joel, it is a loaded question and I refuse to fall in the trap. Your point is well taken, but there are different situation that require your attention. Nine of the 12 Horse of the Year categories were won by three trainers – two train 80 horse stables and one trains 200 horses. If you had a horse that required special attention then you would certainly be better off in a small barn but to me the name of the game at the top is DRIVER. The big barns have the best drivers locked up tight. The small stable guy has no chance of getting a top jock unless he has a wonder horse. If you want to have fun and get the most out of your dollar a top small trainer will be a more pleasant experience — especially within the communication factor. But to get the gold ring you have a much better chance in the big factories. It is sad but true. You even get the advantage of being separated from their entries in elimination races. I never had a really big stable, most likely because I only trained trotters. It is hard to find a dozen top trotting yearlings let alone 100. But that wasn't in the era of Takter and Burke. When they have the best drivers in the sport under their thumb you are swimming upstream trying to beat them. For 20 years I had the privilege of putting Mike Lachance on every entry, never having to call the judges to see who he selected because it was automatic/ Today, even the biggies fight over Yannick Gingras.

I want to thank all my readers for there input and please keep the questions coming in. I am really happy to be hearing from the European owners and trainers. Next week will feature a question from Art Zubrod on subject of the proposed new rule from WEG and GURAL. Should be more than interesting...

Sweden's Sulkysport ranks the Top 50 trotters in the last 100 years

Swedish harness racing magazine Sulkysport has recently presented a list of the 50 best trotters in the world for the past 100 years. It is an interesting list, in several aspects, and there are many American bred horses among the 50.

A horse that has showed its accomplishments on both sides of the Atlantic ocean earned more points when this list was made. But still, even if Greyhound never raced outside America, his 25 world records was something special and the fact that it took 31 years before Nevele Pride beat Greyhound's world record is an almost unbelievable story in harness racing history.

The number one: Varenne (Waikiki Beach) raced 73 times, won 62 out of those starts and earned 6,038,408 euro.

Varenne won the Elitloppet twice, Prix d'Amérique twice, Italian Derby, Gran Premio Lotteria three times, Breeders Crown at Meadowlands, Trot Mondial in Montreal and the list can be much longer.

Today, Varenne lives at Scuderia Il Grifone, near Turin, Italy, where he still serves as stud stallion and the 23-year-old son of Waikiki Beach knows that he is the champion of all trotters in the world.

"Obviously, I have no problem with Varenne being #1," Heyden said. "That was the only time I can ever remember a horse and his connections toying with the field 6-7 hours before the race and then during the race in the 2001 \$1 million Breeders Crown at the Meadowlands.

"Ideal Du Gazeau was a beast. I probably should have him on my list. Loved the Roosevelt surface, too... Rocquepine on longevity gets credits... and Ourasi held off Sugarcane Hanover in the 1988 March Of Dimes at Garden State Park and would have made the list. He beat our HOY fair and square that night — Mack Lobell — it was easy to see how he went past \$4 million in his career.

"Jamin surprised me making the top 10. That artichoke story and the State Dept getting involved, the cover of Sports Illustrated, etc. in the 1959 RR International still carries weight. Love it."

McKirgan to Ohio Hall of Fame

Donald "Don" McKirgan, one of the top trainers in the state of Ohio, has been elected as the newest member of the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame. He was elected by a vote of the Ohio chapter of the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Known as "Ohio's Trotmaster," McKirgan has enjoyed success with both gaits, including the 2015 Ohio Horse of the Year, Like Old Times and is credited with 3,640 career driving wins.

McKirgan, 77, came to Northfield Park when it opened in 1957 and remains stabled there today. He was the leading driver at the Cleveland oval in 1977 and 1981 and led all Northfield drivers in the Universal Drivers Rating in 1980, 1982, 1983 and 1985. He was elected to the Northfield Park Wall of Fame in 1992.

McKirgan has won at least one race at Northfield Park every year before being sidelined for the entire 2004 season.

In November 2003, McKirgan suffered what would have been a career ending illness for most people. He was diagnosed with Guillain-Barré disease, an inflammatory disorder that paralyzed McKirgan for nearly half a year.

McKirgan will be honored at the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association banquet in Worthington, OH on Saturday (Jan. 13).

The Ohio Chapter has voted Brian Brown as the recipient of the Winner's Circle Award for the Ohioan who has achieved outstanding accomplishments in the past year; Cameron McCown as the Peter Haughton Memorial Award winner as the young Ohioan who is an "up-and-coming" star among harness horsemen; Joe Adamsky into the Immortal Hall of Fame; Feelin Friskie into the Standardbred Hall of Fame; and Ed Mullinax as the winner of the Rambling Willie Award for the Ohioan who has done the most for harness racing over the past two decades.

Brown, 53, enjoyed a career year as he conditioned three of the top pacers in the country; Downbytheseaside (\$1,602,452 in seasonal earnings), Fear The Dragon (\$1,350,146), and filly Blazin Britches (\$540,424). The Brown

Don McKirgan, the newest inductee to the Ohio Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

Stable earned \$5.8 million this season and secured a .402 UTR and was selected as the Trainer of the Year by the United States Harness Writers Association.

McCown is a 29-year-old resident of Ostrander, OH. McCown had 86 wins and his drives earned \$330,892 in purse money. McCown started driving in 2014 and earned an impressive .379 UDRS this season.

Adamsky was one of the top drivers in Ohio during the 1980s and 1990s. For his career he posted 2,707 victories and more than \$11.4 million in purses. The native of Rochester, MI won 12 Ohio Sires Stakes finals, including four with Ohio Standardbred Hall of Fame member, Majestic Osborne. Adamsky received the Achievement award from the Ohio Chapter of the U.S. Harness Writers' Association in 2002 and was the first Jerry Kaltenbach Trophy winner, awarded to the top driver in the Ohio Sire Stakes series.

Feelin Friskie earned \$784,210 during his racing career, but the son of Artiscape left his mark on Ohio racing in the breeding shed. Owned by Wayne Whebby and Midland Acres, Feelin Friskie sired winners of \$12.9 million and 78 foals in 1:55, including Igotafeelinfran (\$569,650), Noble Finesse (\$415,886) and Feelin Lika Winner (\$344,996).

Mullinax, is a successful breeder and owner of standardbreds, including P Forty Seven, winner of the 2005 Little Brown Jug, and Dragon Again, winner of \$2.3 million and a successful stallion, who fathered the sports richest performer, Foiled Again (\$7.5 million). Mullinax is a supporter and sponsor of many industry events including the Hambletonian, the Harness Racing Hall of Fame and the Breeders Crown.

Wagering up at WEG in 2017

Woodbine Entertainment (Woodbine) announced Jan. 8 that wagering on its standardbred meet, contested between Woodbine and Mohawk, saw a marked increase in average per-race handle to \$153,505 up 5.5 per cent from the 2016 average of \$145,448.

The 221-date standardbred season produced an "all-sources" handle of \$347,384,040.61, a 1.7 per cent increase from the \$341,513,448 total recorded in 2016. Average field size for the standardbred meets held steady at 8.8 horses per race.

At Mohawk, the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup had a handle of \$4.03 million for the June 17 card. The 34th edition of Canada's richest harness race was captured by Fear The Dragon and driver David Miller, who won his second consecutive Pepsi North America Cup.

The month of September brought harness racing's top pacers and trotters to Mohawk, as 33 Grand Circuit stakes races totalling \$6.3 million in purses were contested. These stakes included the \$816,000 Metro Pace (won by Lost In Time), \$684,000 Canadian Trotting Classic (What The Hill), \$615,000 Canadian Pacing Derby (Sintra), \$593,000 Maple Leaf Trot (Hannelore Hanover) and \$500,000 Shes A Great Lady (Youaremycandygirl).

Woodbine scored 71 per cent on the Great Places to Work Trust Index, an employee survey score indicating a certification the company has built a first-class work environment that is committed to a core mandate of a culture in achieving the highest quality of horse racing.

Vital to the Great Places to Work success is a continued commitment to culture through Woodbine Cares Week, a week-long celebration of the many valuable community organizations and causes Woodbine supports as a strong community partner.

Strong community ties were celebrated through the annual United Way Turf Races, Rexdale Games and continued

support of community partners such as Youth Without Shelter, Trust 15, Ernestine's Women's Shelter, and Etobicoke General Hospital.

Technological developments in 2017 included the launch of a mobile app for Apple and Android as well as a refresh of Woodbine and Mohawk Park websites. In addition, thoroughbred's The Queen's Plate became the first ever live broadcast of a horse race in 4K, distributed across North America via Direct TV.

Woodbine continued to lead the horse industry in Ontario overseeing the Standardbred Alliance, which includes nine racetracks, via an unprecedented model of cooperation to achieve operational cost savings for all participants.

In December, a merger was announced between the Standardbred Alliance and Ontario Racing to create an independent industry organization that will result in one strong, unified voice in the Ontario horse racing industry, with a goal of self-governance. The merged entity will engage Ontario Racing Management (ORM), which will utilize resources from Woodbine's management team to manage all aspects of the industry, including guarantees of purse payments for member tracks, staking programs and race schedules, as well as administering common racetrack rules and policies. ORM is charged with preparing a three-year business plan by April 1, 2018.

Several development initiatives were announced at both the Woodbine and Mohawk Park properties including the installation of a second turf course at Woodbine, slated to open in 2019.

More than \$10 million was invested to winterize Mohawk Park allowing for year-round racing beginning in April, 2018. The refreshed facility will include new Woodbine branding, a renovated Terrace Dining Room completed with guest suites, internal building expansions and improvements to the paddock.

"We're very excited about our commitment to year-round racing at Mohawk Park and further developing our ties within the local community," said Jessica Buckley, President, Woodbine, Mohawk Park. "The significant upgrades to the property will only add to the great racing experience and I look forward to overseeing the ongoing development of the property to include additional lifestyle and entertainment options."


