My first taste of what we were all in for with Somebeachsomewhere came nearly 10 years ago to this day while waiting for a hotel elevator on a mild Toronto winter night in early February.

The 2007 O'Brien Awards had just ended, the photos had been taken and that's when Brent MacGrath – arms full of trophies and his tuxedo still looking crisp – dropped a bombshell.

Somebeachsomewhere had just done something fairly remarkable, in my estimation. As a 2-year-old, he had tied Tell All for Canada's Horse of the Year Award. This after Tell All won both Canada's biggest race, the Pepsi North America Cup, and the Little Brown Jug in the 3-year-old heavyweight division. Sure, Somebeachsomewhere was undefeated as a 2-year-old and had impressively won the Metro, Battle of Waterloo and some Grand Circuit stakes at Mohawk. But, he only raced six times and precocious freshmen often benefit from not having to race against a full compliment of their birth year's best, just yet.

I was, admittedly, a skeptic.

How did we really know how good he was before the slow starters arrived on the scene?

Why were we so quick to buy the hype and honor a 2-year-old?

And who exactly were these Maritimers most of us had never heard of prior to six months ago?

"You know, the *big* party is going to be right here next year," MacGrath said, matter-of-factly just before stepping into the elevator.

At the time, it seemed like an awfully cocky statement from a man few of us really knew; a man that owned just one horse and ran a car dealership in Truro, NS for a living.

But as time passed, Somebeachsomewhere repeatedly dropped jaws and I got to know MacGrath better, I learned that on that night in that elevator MacGrath wasn't telling me that he had some otherworldly skill as a trainer. He was

simply telling me that he knew exactly what he had – the horse of a lifetime.

And he was blessed to have him.

Weren't we all?

MacGrath would repeat that phrase often over the years that followed.

Horse of a lifetime.

Not just for MacGrath and driver Paul MacDonell and the rest of MacGrath's partners in the Schooner Stable of Bible Hill, NS – Garry Pye, Stu Rath, Reg Petitpas, Pamela Dean and Jamie Bagnell – but for many of us, as well.

Count me in that group.

With more than 30 columns written about Somebeachsomewhere in the *Guelph Mercury* newspaper, a huge number of stories in *The Canadian Sportsman* and many more for other outlets in the years since Beach left the racetrack, I can safely say I have had the honor of writing about this horse more than anyone.

As much as I fell in love with the horse for all the obvious reasons – the power, the heart, the gait, the personality – it was the back story that drew me to the horse and kept me close.

Most pointedly, how MacGrath cobbled together \$40,000 between himself and five other Maritimers to buy a single Ontario-sired horse and on his very first trip to Lexington plucked Somebeachsomewhere out of the 2006 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale for exactly \$40,000.

Over the years, I have reused the same quote on the subject – one MacGrath gave me the very first time we met in the winner's circle at Mohawk after Beach set a 1:49.3 world record in the \$1 million Metro Pace.

"I didn't have \$40,100. I had \$40,000. I said, 'If he goes for \$40,000, I own him,'" MacGrath told me that night in September of 2007.

MacGrath had considerable good fortune on his side that night at Fasig-Tipton. Somebeachsomewhere sold first in that session and some buyers were delayed getting to the sale because the afternoon card at The Red Mile – one that culminated with Ron Pierce waving bye-bye to Trond Smedshammer in a race-off in the Kentucky Filly Futurity won by Passionate Glide – ran long.

How Somebeachsomewhere came to be bred by Stephanie Smith-Rothaug of Ohio in the first place is a similar tale of good fortune. She purchased Beach's dam, Wheres The Beach, in foal to Astreos, for \$6,000 at the 2003

Standardbred Horse Sale Company's Mixed Sale.

"That was pretty much my limit," she told *The Canadian Sportsman* in 2008. "At the time, it was the most I ever paid for a broodmare."

Smith-Rothaug bred Wheres The Beach to Mach Three in 2004 and the resulting foal was, you guessed it, the horse of a lifetime.

MacGrath would defy conventional wisdom – as he would throughout Beach's career – by training Somebeachsomewhere in Truro, NS to the great delight of the horse-crazy locals.

The pairing with MacGrath's old friend MacDonell, was also perfect. It only made people love Somebeachsomewhere even more that he was driven by the talented and classy veteran, a man widely respected by his peers.

Together, the two Macs meticulously planned every step of Somebeachsomewhere's career. When the colt was two, MacGrath sent Somebeachsomewhere to Jean Louis Arsenault to train in Ontario. When it came time for the all-important sophomore season, MacGrath took a year's sabbatical from the car dealerships he owns with Pye to personally manage every facet of Beach's campaign.

That's when I got to know and like this candid Maritimer; a writer's dream for his accessibility, honesty and deft analysis

of the scene.

Through it all — a 1:46.4 world record in Lexington, more than \$3 million in earnings, a nearly-flawless record of 20 wins in 21 starts, national mainstream headlines in Canada, induction in the Halls of Fame in Canada and the U.S. and a lucrative stallion deal with Hanover Shoe Farms where Somebeachsomewhere became the greatest pacing stallion of his age and, perhaps, all time — MacGrath always did what he thought was best for the horse.

Doing what was right was the reason he said from the beginning of Somebeachsomewhere's sophomore season that he was going to skip the Jug in favor of setting a world record in Lexington — not, possibly setting, but setting. In MacGrath's mind, it was always definite.

Doing the right thing for the horse was the reason the original owners retained majority ownership to the end.

It was the reason they picked Hanover and its world-class broodmare band in the first place.

It was the reason they aggressively treated his cancer with chemotherapy in an attempt to save the horse regardless of what it might have meant to his breeding career.

That penchant for doing what was right for the horse was the reason my heart sank when I received MacGrath's text message on Sunday afternoon asking me to call him as soon as possible. I knew the news would not be good.

The right thing to do, he said, his voice thick, was to follow the advice of Hanover's respected farm manager Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky — who loved the horse like he was her own. We swiftly moved to end the horse's pain, he said.

MacGrath is quite right that Somebeachsomewhere, who had just turned 13, was taken from all of us too soon.

But I choose to remember what Beach gave all of us in his relatively short time with us — including, as predicted, one hell of a party at the O'Brien Awards one year after MacGrath made that exact prophecy near that elevator.

At the 2008 O'Brien Awards, guests were given little vials filled with sand from a beach in Nova Scotia, and Somebeachsomewhere was feted as the unanimous choice for both Canada's Horse of the Year and sophomore pacing colt of the year as the country song that gave him his name blasted through the banquet hall. Despite just stepping off the racetrack a few months before, Somebeachsomewhere also became the first horse to win the rarely-awarded Cam Fella Award for meritorious service following the inaugural winner and namesake in 1997.

By that night, I had long turned from skeptic to fan boy.

I will long remember how Beach fought like a wolverine in his lone, epic, defeat in the Meadowlands Pace.

How he dazzled a Lexington autumn afternoon with the fastest race mile in history at that time.

The awful night in late October that he defeated Shadow Play by a neck in the monsoon-induced slop at Yonkers in the Messenger.

His two-heat dominance on the half-mile track at Flamboro in the Confederation Cup.

How he toyed with the field in the Breeders Crown at the Meadowlands.

And how he acknowledged the roar from a huge crowd at Mohawk with a bow after winning the Pepsi North America Cup.

Most of all, I will remember how Somebeachsomewhere inspired dreamers in a sport built on them.

He raised all of us up and proved, that despite the odds, virtually anyone could end up with a champion.

And take their own version of one heck of an elevator ride.

Caretaker shortage in Ontario

A number of factors have made it particularly difficult for many barns to find help this winter.

Put two Ontario trainers in a room in mid-January and the conversation usually revolves around weather: how cold it has been, how much snow has fallen, how training centre track conditions have held up and how many race nights have been cancelled. This winter, however, the conversation has had a distinctly different theme: Have you got enough help? Do you know anybody who is looking for work? If you hear of anyone could you send them my way?

From Facebook posts to advertisements on the Standardbred Canada website to word of mouth offers, almost every major stable in the province has been looking for caretakers, riders and assistant trainers.

"It's tough to find help," said Blake Macintosh, who just finished filling his winter staffing requirements on Jan. 17. "I haven't talked to one barn that's not short help and people are begging people to come to their barn."

Part of the problem is that trainers, not just in Ontario, but across North America, are at peak capacity at this time of year. They are educating yearlings, readying three-year-olds for a return to the races and training racehorses; not much of their stock is idle so the need for staff is at its highest level. Trainers that stay in Ontario throughout the winter, filling the races at Woodbine Racetrack, Flamboro Downs and The Raceway at Western Fair District, are also at a distinct disadvantage to trainers that ship south for the winter.

"There's a lot of professional grooms, people I would term career caretakers, and a lot of those people are not here," said Ben Wallace, who is still looking to fill caretaker positions. "They've hooked onto American outfits or Canadian outfits that opted to go to Florida."

"So it's kind of a two-pronged devil that we're dealing with here. Canadian trainers are usually maxed out at this time of year with their numbers and we're training in this climate, and you've got people that are leaving the province to go and work and train where it's much more suitable."

In addition to the business cycle issues, Wallace pointed to the contraction the industry suffered following the end of the Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP) in 2012 as a direct cause of the current shortage of experienced staff. According to Ontario Harness Horse Association (OHHA) general manager Brian Tropea a total of 4,300 individual horses made at least one start in Ontario in 2017, down from highs of 10,500 to 11,000 in 2010-11. You do not have to be a

math major to see how those numbers impact caretakers. Assuming most caretakers look after five horses each, the Ontario standardbred industry needed 2,100 of them in 2010 and just 860 in 2017.

"I talked to a couple of people the other day that got out of it and got 9-to-5 jobs and they said you know what, we grew up in the business, that's all we ever knew, we didn't know this other world existed out there, and it's kind of nice to have your weekends off, it's kind of nice to be home at 5:30 pm," said Tropea. "And I think there's probably a lot that went and said, you know what, I can get a job with Purolator, or FedEx, or at the mill, or in the quarry, and those people are doing well and they're telling their friends about it and people are going out and finding other employment."

Which highlights the other aspect that may be contributing to the current staffing shortfalls –working with horses is not a 9-to-5 job and some caretakers will struggle to make

Ontario's new \$14 per hour minimum wage when they divide their weekly pay check by the number of hours worked. Both Wallace and Tropea call it a lifestyle, anchored by a passion for horses, but it may be a lifestyle that is resonating with fewer Ontarians.

Between 2001 and 2016 the province's census data reported that the number of farm operators shrunk by 14,550 and the percentage of rural residents, which has been in a steady decline since the census was first conducted, stands at just 14 per cent of the population. Those numbers would suggest that fewer of the province's residents understand the 24-hour-a-day, seven-days-a-week, 365-days-a-year nature of dealing with any kind of livestock, not just horses.

So what is the solution to Ontario's current caretaker shortage? Macintosh mused about obtaining temporary foreign worker permits or reaching out to other equine disciplines, perhaps hosting a workshop or open house to allow those already familiar with horses an opportunity to see how the harness racing industry works.

"I'm thinking quarter horses or all the different disciplines," said Macintosh. "You advertise it like, 'In the afternoon you can still go do your riding horses because you're usually done by 12:30 or 1 pm,' and try and get them interested in our game."

Tropea, who sits on Equine Guelph's advisory council, would like to see the industry restore funding for something like the Equine Guelph Groom One program, which was shelved in 2012.

"We had two days where everybody would come together and we'd teach them basic horse handling and safety, and then we'd help them find positions out in the industry," said Equine Guelph Director Gayle Ecker. "Then their hours of experience plus their online completion of the course was followed by a one-day testing where they had to demonstrate their skills, and then they would get a certificate from Equine Guelph as a groom."

The University of Guelph's Ridgetown Campus currently offers two equine programs based at the Regional Equine and Agricultural Centre of Huron (REACH Huron) in Clinton, a one-year Performance Horse Handler Certificate and a two-year Associate Diploma in Equine Care and Management. Those students may have an interest in the racing industry and Ecker suggested trainers try posting their jobs on Equine Guelph's free job posting tool, JobTrack.

Other trainers have addressed the issue by altering their business practices, offering higher wages, enhanced benefits or increased opportunities in an effort to appeal to those

currently working in the industry.

Trainer Anthony MacDonald lured retired trainers Kevin McMaster and Harry Poulton back to the business with the offer of horses to train within thestable.ca fold, and after spending last season as a caretaker for thestable.ca Jason McGinnis is currently training 10 of the operation's horses.

"It's going to be a transition for the whole industry to move into the 21st century," said MacDonald, whose 107-horse operation is at near full staff. "But something we're trying to do at thestable.ca is to give people a way forward."

Giving people a way forward, by introducing them to the industry, giving them enhanced education or responsibility, or offering increased financial rewards, may be the best way for Ontario harness racing to solve the labour problem, and might just go a long way toward solving a few others.

Somebeachsomewhere leaves with us wishing for more

The untimely passing of Somebeachsomewhere is a tough one to take. With an unbelievably brilliant – albeit brief – career on the racetrack and then as a stallion, I can't help but feel cheated in a way that he didn't get to see more of him in either of those capacities.

By almost any objective account, Somebeachsomewhere was the best harness horse that this century has known and one could argue he's the best horse that harness racing has ever known in history. And at the same time, I carry a bittersweet sense of what may have been.

This column talks often about horses from a betting perspective, but Somebeachsomewhere transcended all of that. Although it was betting that first drew me to Somebeachsomewhere when I tabbed him in his Metro elimination in the third start of his career at odds of 5-1, he was already and easily far more than simply a winning wager. Like any other fan or participant in the sport, I'm attracted to witnessing greatness and there was no one greater.

A horse has never done more with less time than Somebeachsomewhere did.

In 2007, as a 2-year-old, he raced for what amounted to only a month and a half, and yet it was good enough to take home a share of the O'Brien Award for Canada's Horse of the Year. In 2008, he made just 15 starts and yet between those two seasons he was able to stamp himself into both the Canadian Horse Racing and U.S. Harness Racing Halls of Fame.

Just like that, the racing career of the best horse that probably any person under the age of 35 had ever seen, was over. But the fact that he is seen today as one of the best ever despite a career that quickly came and went, speaks volumes as to how just impressive his accomplishments were.

Somebeachsomewhere was the rare harness horse that had a connection with everyday fans of the sport. There's no better example than the 2008 Pepsi North America Cup in which a near capacity crowd at Mohawk erupted in cheers as Somebeachsomewhere led through the stretch en route to winning the richest race of his career.

It was something seldom still seen in thoroughbred racing (most recently with American Pharoah and before that with Zenyatta), but rarely seen anymore today in harness racing. He was one of the few horses that I truly enjoyed watching for his sheer talent, and horses since then that even came close to measuring up to the ability of Somebeachsomewhere have been few and far between.

Most people seem to consider the 2008 Meadowlands Pace to be the defining race of Somebeachsomewhere's career, for the reason that in his lone career loss he raced his guts out under impossible conditions. But for me, I've always struggled in how I look back at this race.

It's not to take anything away from the Pace winner Art Official, but Somebeachsomewhere deserved to win that race. For the unique horse that he was, he deserved to have an unbeaten career record. To this day, that race remains a tough one to explain. The image of Art Official coming back to Somebeachsomewhere nearing the wire is almost haunting in that you can't believe it actually happened. It's the same feeling I get torturing myself when watching replays of Birdstone run down Smarty Jones in the 2004 Belmont.

Although that race didn't diminish his legacy – ironically it only enhanced it – it still would have been fitting and would have added to his place in history to have raced without ever losing; something that none of the greats including Bret Hanover and Niatross were ever able to do.

From that point onward, nearly every remaining race from Somebeachsomewhere was special. The ones that stand out most was the world record 1:49:2 at Flamboro in the second heat of the Confederation Cup, his win over Shadow Play in an absolute monsoon at Yonkers where he was first over and visibly not at his best, and his 1:48:3 win over Shadow Play in the Breeders Crown on a frigid night at the Meadowlands.

Horses have been faster since Somebeachsomewhere set the 3-year-old world record of 1:46:4 at the Red Mile, but

none have been more dominant. Time isn't everything, and when Somebeachsomewhere set his 1:46:4 record he was miles ahead of his closest competition.

It happens with frequency where horses that are stars on the racetrack don't pass that same level of talent to their offspring, but such wouldn't be the case with Somebeachsomewhere. His record as the leading pacing stallion in the sport is well documented and speaks for itself. And the fact that he was a freakish horse on the track as well as a vitally important sire only underscores the uniquely special animal that he was.

The feeling of now missing out on future Somebeachsomewhere offspring is similar to the void from when he left the racetrack. It says a tremendous amount however about Somebeachsomewhere that in just two racing seasons and six foal crops of racing age that he's had such a profound impact on the industry and people who follow the sport.

Somebeachsomewhere will continue to be celebrated for his accomplishments and contributions to racing. A horse of his caliber deserves no less. The fact that he was able to accomplish all that he did in such a short time speaks volumes.

Although it would have been nice if an outcome here or there throughout his career would have been different, any such difference would have only been a bonus for already getting to watch the best horse I've ever seen.

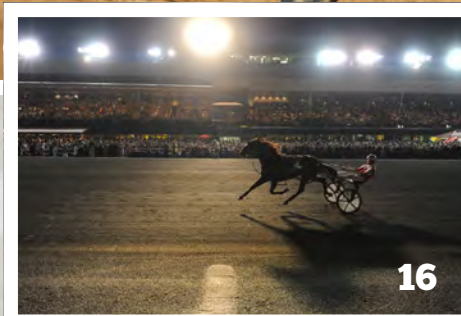

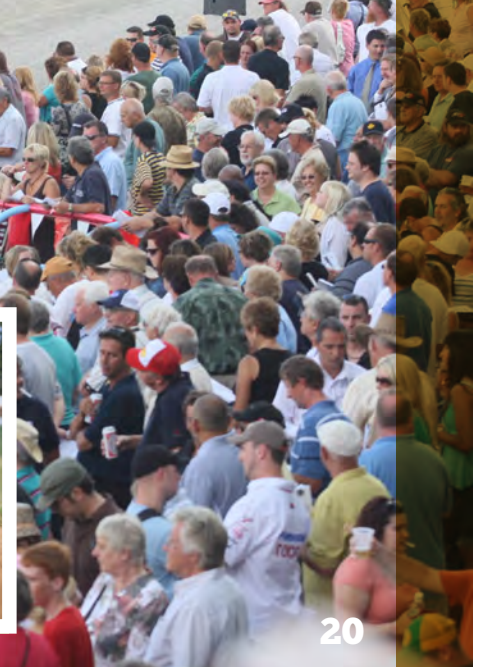

Premature stallion losses sting

In early March, 2008, trotting Triple Crown winner Windsong's Legacy died suddenly after serving a mare at Perretti Farms in New Jersey. He was seven years old.

He was starting only his fourth season at stud and his limited number of foals included the 2012 Horse of the Year Chapter Seven, now off to a rousing stud in the stud with his son Walner.

Five years later, tragedy would once again strike the stallion barn at Perretti Farms. Rocknroll Hanover, the 2005 Horse of the Year, showed signs of discomfort in mid-March, 2013, and he was rushed to Mid-Atlantic Equine in nearby Ringoes.

Examining veterinarians found the champion pacer was suffering from gastric impaction and had no choice but to euthanize him. Rocknroll Hanover was only 11.

It was yet another devastating loss. Rocknroll Hanover had won the Meadowlands Pace, Breeders Crown, and North America Cup in his sophomore season. After his short time in the stallion ranks, he had sired a Horse of the Year in Rock N Roll Heaven as well as Put On A Show and A Rocknroll Dance.

So the recent death of Somebeachsomewhere was not certainly not unprecedented in standardbred history. Death seems to love a shining mark. Few events are more poignant than a life unfulfilled. We mourn all deaths, but when a person — or, for our purposes, a horse — dies prematurely, the sting of loss hurts so much more.

Thus was the case with Windsong's Legacy, Rocknroll Hanover, and Somebeachsomewhere. But they are only among the latest in the history of harness racing.

Somebeachsomewhere had been treated for cancer for months and his death, while tragic, was not wholly unexpected. Yet it certainly was wholly devastating to the breed and to those people closest to the champion — trainer and part-owner Brent MacGrath and his partners and the team at Hanover Shoe Farms.

Somebeachsomewhere is not the first outstanding pacing stallion at Hanover Shoe Farms stallions lost at the unlucky age of 13.

In 1990, Tyler B died at age 13. The son of Most Happy Fella hit with remarkable impact when his first foals raced in 1984. They include Dragon's Lair, Amneris, and Dignitarian. He later added the gifted filly So Cozy and Tyler B gained a posthumous Little Brown Jug credit when his son Magical Mike won the Jug in 1991.

In 1947, Billy Direct died suddenly, apparently of a heart attack, in his paddock at Hanover Shoe Farms. The full impact of that loss was perhaps not fully appreciated. While he had sired Ensign Hanover, the winner of the first Little Brown Jug in 1946 in his first season (1942) at Hanover, Billy Direct would gain two posthumous Jug credits in Dudley Hanover (1950) and Tar Heel (1951).

In fact, you can perhaps make the case that Billy Direct accomplished more in a few years at Hanover than any other stallion. The farm's broodmare band at that time was comprised largely of trotting-bred mares as Billy Direct was the first pacing stallion ever in the Hanover stud barn.

In addition to his trio of Jug winners, Billy Direct sired the dams of pacing champs such as Adios Butler and Bullet Hanover.

The same year that Billy Direct died at Hanover, the young Hambletonian winner Spencer Scott was declared sterile and withdrawn from stud service. He started in the stud at Hanover the same year as Billy Direct.

Spencer Scott's son Rodney would reign as Horse of the Year in 1948 and Rodney's brother Egan Hanover won the Kentucky Futurity the same season.

The year that Rodney and Egan Hanover were making headlines, the Hambletonian winner was a storybook colt named Demon Hanover.

He was a horseman's dream on the track, but the man who trained and drove him was not a horseman at all. Harrison Hoyt was a hat manufacturer in Connecticut who bought Demon as a hobby horse and trained him on a one-third mile track across from his home.

Demon turned out to be a star on the track and Hoyt rejected a \$100,000 offer (more than \$1 million in current dollars) for him during his sophomore season. Demon won the Hambletonian easily and later went to stud at Gay Acres Farm in Ohio.

When his first foals — horses such as Steamin Demon, Demon Rum, Buckeye Demon, Demon Damsel and many others — raced so successfully, young John Gaines

approached Bob Critchfield of Gay Acres to buy Demon for \$505,000 and syndicate him. Critchfield wasn't allergic to money, but was puzzled by the odd figure.

"Del Miller syndicated Adios for \$500,000 and I'd like to top that price," Gaines said. Critchfield refused to play that game. He said that Miller was a friend and had done him many favors. He'd sell Demon Hanover for a flat half-million.

Gaines assembled a stable of syndicate members that included some of the biggest names in the breeding business. Demon Hanover stood at Walnut Hall Farm and served a full book in 1959. After the breeding season was diagnosed with kidney stones and treated.

Soon thereafter, farm manager Ted Woodley was showing Demon Hanover to visitors one day when the stallion suddenly collapsed. Efforts to save him were unsuccessful. An autopsy showed that he had a blood clot in his heart. Demon Hanover was just 14 years old.

In 1986, Nihilator came off the track with a glittering resume that included 35 wins in 38 tries, a \$3.2 million bank account, and a Horse of the Year title to his credit. His 1:49.3 mark as a 3-year-old was the fastest race ever and it wasn't surprising that mares lined up to get Nihilator's attention

despite his \$ 35,000 stud fee.

Nihilator died after serving only a few books of mares. Despite his extraordinary speed and success on the track, he left little impact as a stallion.

Premature stallion deaths are hardly new to standardbreds. A century ago, harness racing mourned the loss of the handsome Lee Axworthy, the fastest trotting stallion in history. As a five-year-old, Lee Axworthy lowered the trotting record to stallions from 2:01 to 1:58-1/4, just missing the gelded Uhlan's ultimate trotting speed standard of 1:58.

Lee Axworthy went to stud in Kentucky at Castleton, but died at age seven after just two seasons. During his two seasons, he sired Lee Tide, in turn the sire of Hambletonian winner Spencer. Lee Axworthy also sired superstar trotter Lee Worthy, who sired the dam of champion mare Rosalind.

Indeed death does seem to leave a shining mark.

How great was Self Possessed, does winter training negatively impact young horses, more great food and good movies

I was going to use a question from Art Zubrod, who as well as managing Brittany Farms is also on the board of the EDRC (Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council) about the WEG/Gural new rules regarding positive tests etc. However I have decided to wait until the new version is unveiled to make any further comments. I will temporarily put the topic on the back burner. Please stay tuned as Mr. Zubrod has brought up some interesting points that have never even

been approached in the uprising that this subject has created. One of the most important dilemmas facing the New Rules is "many of the numbers for withdrawal times for the RCI/RMTC (Racing Commissioners International/ Racing and Medication Testing Consortium) are not upheld by science, and therefore cannot be upheld in court," said Zubrod.

I personally feel that proper implementation of this new idea will be wonderful for our sport, however we must be very careful not to approve of a system that will cause collateral harm to the innocents. As soon as they publish the updated version I will discuss the questions you have on the subject.

Bob Marks asks: We all know Self Possessed was a great colt. How great was he and when did you know?

Great is a strong word, especially for a horse that had some issues that sorrowfully showed up at inopportune moments like the Beacon Course and the Breeders Crown. Therefore, I would change the word great to very fast. He definitely had some wonderful moments and to me and Michel Lachance could easily been the first sub-1:50 trotter. When he won the Hambletonian in 1:51.3 he was on idle and had never really been asked to trot. All that occurred before the Meadowlands became a speedway, the surface then was much like Vincennes in Paris which is the finest surface I have ever

seen, but too heavy to promote fast times, and he raced in a wooden bike to boot.

Bob, you may not remember but after his most awe-inspiring race you sent me a videotape that I must have watched 20 times. On June 24, he qualified at the Meadowlands in 1:53 winning by 23 lengths that precipitated a phone call from the late Curt Greene, a good friend and very knowledgeable horseman. "Have you and Mike gone crazy," he said. I told him he did it on his own and he was well within himself. The following week is when I really took notice of how amazing this colt was. It was a three-year-old open at the Meadowlands and Self Possessed drew the 9 hole. There were a very formidable group of colts in the race including Angus Hall and CR Renegade. Mike (Lachance), and I discussed the race and decided to race him from off the pace as all the big stakes were coming up and we didn't want to stress him so early in the season. What followed was nothing short of amazing. When the man said go Mike took the colt back to ninth. He was officially timed :30.1 at the quarter about a dozen lengths from the top horses. My reaction was, he will race another day, because there is no chance he will even hit the board from where he was situated. Then he started to move and pick up horses like they were walking. He trotted the last three quarters of the mile in 1:22.1 a feat unheard of at that time winning easily in 1:52.2 last quarter in 27 seconds flat. That race showed me and all that saw it, we had a special colt.

If there was any chance he could have really achieved greatness it would have been as a stallion, however that was not meant to be either. After producing Cantab Hall from his first crop, he fell into the Valley Victory infertility syndrome and spent his final stud days in Italy with limited success.

For sure, he had the opportunity to be a great horse but somehow I really don't think he achieved that status.

James Grosse asks: Like to get your opinion on two topics that have been troubling me the last four years. I have had numerous yearlings in the harsh winters of Indiana. My yearlings have shown some talent but have been affected by landing on the hard ground.. So I have wondered about farm track training in the cold winter months. Also, I would like your opinion on shipping during the winter months. I am thinking about changing trainers to one based in the south.

Horses are cold weather animals they prefer the cold to the heat. I am not saying the weather that you have had in the past few weeks in the north is ideal because it has been uncommonly severe, but a normal winter will have no deleterious affect on a healthy standardbred. As far as hard tracks, we have such a wonderful variety of shoes available today that you can literally bring your track with you. Some

version of a flip flop will provide the cushion you need.

Good trainers are harder to find than warm air or soft tracks. Training in the south is more important to the trainer's comfort than that of the horse. I have trained in the tundra called Monticello and sunny south Florida and believe me there is no question the decision to be south was based on my desires not the horses. If I find one plus to the south it would be the ability to hear the horse hit the ground. Listening to the cadence of the hooves is invaluable to me as a tool to diagnose problems. When you are bundled up with ear laps etc and the wind is howling this is a lot more difficult to achieve. Jimmy Takter, arguably the best standardbred trainer in the sport, trains his horses in New Jersey all winter with great success. I would reassess firing your current trainer.

As far as shipping in the winter, if the horse is healthy when he gets on the truck he will be healthy when he arrives. Just be careful not to overtrain a horse before a long journey because you will weaken his immune system and that is asking for trouble.

David McDuffe asks: You did a really good job with the article on dining in south Florida. Where should we go for lunch?

I will keep this as local as possible, narrowing to three areas Boca/Deerfield, Delray Beach and Palm Beach. There are so many more wonderful lunch eatery's than dining spots please don't berate me for omitting your favorites.

Boca/ Deerfield

My favorites would be Frank and Dino's because the lunch and dinner menus are basically the same, which means lots of good choices. I will suggest Rigatoni Bolognese as one of the best dishes in south Florida. I eat at Houston's very often as it is near my home and the food is always good. The French Dip with au jus and horse radish is a must, for the lighter fare Artichoke dip with sour cream chips and salsa are great. The Whales Rib as mentioned previously in my dining article is also a must go, just for a special experience. They appeared on dinners and dive bars etc. and have things on the menu you have never had and they are all good. I would suggest the Rock Shrimp a little messy to eat but truly worth it.

There are some great sushi restaurants that serve lunch as well. I am not going to rate them because I frequent them all and they are all excellent. Your choice would depend solely on location. They include Sushi Ray, Lemongrass, and Bluefin Sushi.

There are more Delicatessens in my area than houses of worship, but there are two that stand out Zingers Deli has the best corned beef and pastrami, they have a small dining

area and V&S Deli far and away the best Italian hero available on earth, however it's take out only. For those of you that care more about seeing the ocean and the other wonderful sights the beach has to offer Oceans 234 will provide you with just that along with some good American fare and some very good sushi rolls

Sex on the beach (sushi roll) is fabulous.

Delray Beach:

I find it difficult to make many suggestions in Delray because parking is next to impossible, but there are a few that I can't omit. Tramonti has a great lunch with good specials every day, the Spedino di Mozzarella is to die for. If you like Mexican food, La Bamba is as authentic as it gets and they actually have a parking lot. Tostada combo and Black bean soup with a lot of chopped onion would be my selections. For my ocean-loving friends, there is Cafe Luna Rosa, although the food is great the view is not nearly as good as Oceans 234. I would suggest brunch or late breakfast fabulous eggs Benedict great Bloody Marys.

Moving a bit north to Palm Beach: there is Ta Boo, right on Worth Avenue it's been there forever. A true taste of old world Palm Beach where many of the rich and famous gather to have the Palm Beach salad or the fried oyster Po Boy. My favorite lunch spot is my last to mention. An afternoon at Bice is not only a culinary experience it is a visual one as well. Go on a day that is not uncomfortably hot so you can be seated in the courtyard and enjoy carpaccio di manzo, fruti de mare or Rigatoni ala Norma (eggplant, tomato, basil, and fresh mozzarella) while watching the beautiful people of South Florida.

Paul Miller asks: I know you are an avid reader but are you a movie buff as well and if so what are some of the newer movies you would recommend?

I am really not a big movie fan as it has always been a full-time job training horses. However, at this time of year most of the better pictures are released to be positioned for consideration for the Academy Awards. I will give you a few I really enjoyed. Darkest Hour is the story of Winston Churchill's decisions for 40 days at the beginning of WWII. Gary Oldman's performance as Churchill won him a Golden Globe. The story is basically about his having to decide whether or not to bargain with Hitler.

I really loved Molly Bloom a true story of a young, well-educated woman that ends up running a high stakes poker game first in LA and then in New York City a riveting experience. Saving the best for last, The Post would be my pick for Best Picture of the year. Tom Hanks and Meryl Streep were fantastic as the editor and owner of the Washington Post at the time the New York Times divulged excerpts from

the "Pentagon Papers." To publish or not to publish was the problem at hand and as the courts decided whether or not president Nixon had the right to stop newspapers from printing information that "endangered" national security. The movie starts out surprisingly slow but becomes totally enthralling in due time.

No Twister Bi in Prix d'Amérique

Bold Eagle was served a perfect trip when Prix de Belgique was held at Vincennes racetrack in Paris last Sunday, but despite that fact, the son of Ready Cash couldn't catch the leader, another son of Ready Cash named Bird Parker.

The Philippe Allaire trainee won Prix du Bourbonnais in December and now Prix de Belgique in January. Two of the four Prix d'Amérique prep races have seen the 7-year-old trotter on top of the result list.

In the Prix de Belgique, Bold Eagle was second over for driver Franck Nivard and could easily have made contact with leader Bird Parker in the last turn, but Bird Parker fought strongly and had no thoughts about letting Bold Eagle pass by in the stretch.

Allaire's horse won in 1:57.3 (mile rate) over 1.6 miles.

The Swedish trotter Ready Express (Ready Cash) had a bad start, but finished incredibly strong from last position and was third when the finish line was crossed.

On Thursday morning, trainer Jerry Riordan made the decision to keep his International Trot winner Twister Bi out of the field of 18 horses in Prix d'Amérique. Twister Bi was not 100 per cent healthy when he raced in Prix Tenor de Baune on Dec. 24, where he finished fifth behind winner Ready Express.

"Twister Bi had a bad lung infection when he raced the last time and he hasn't really recovered from that, yet. I don't want to risk anything with this horse and now we're skipping the rest of the winter meeting in France and aiming for the big races in Scandinavia in the forthcoming spring," Riordan told HRU.

The American-born trainer still has a chance in the big race in Paris on Jan. 28, since his Ringostarr Treb qualified with a third-place finish in the Prix du Bourbonnais in December.

Anne Doolin to receive January Davies Humanitarian Award

Anne Doolin, whose compassion for animals and people in peril has moved her to rescue and foster thousands of pets and provide meals and services for so many in need, has been named the 2017 January Davies Humanitarian Award

winner presented by the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

The award was created in 2008 by USHWA member Callie Davies-Gooch in memory of her daughter to recognize contributions beyond harness racing.

Doolin, whose work in harness racing began as publicist at the Meadowlands in 1988, has always been a staunch advocate for animals, from racehorses to stray dogs and feral cats. In the last 10 years, she has transitioned into an important cog in a large network of dog and cat fosters, rescues and shelters.

A resident of Lexington, KY, Doolin, who after leaving the Meadowlands later worked in publicity and marketing positions at Scioto Downs in Columbus, OH, and The Red Mile in Lexington, seemingly works 24 hours, seven days a week, making sure the homeless have food and shelter, and that dogs and cats can be placed in caring homes. Doolin was also a sought after member of the Breeders Crown and Hambletonian Special Event teams, and still works for the Breeders Cup, writing entrant bios.

"With all the volunteer work with the homeless and animals that Anne does I believe January would very much approve of the award," said Davies-Gooch. "January would be

very proud of what Anne has done over the years in ensuring people don't go hungry and animals are cared for. Anne's compassion is truly admirable and remarkable."

Doolin said she felt overwhelmed when she learned from Davies-Gooch of the award.

"This is amazing and I am floored," said Doolin. "I thought a lot of January and to win this award makes it even more special."

Doolin has been a foster parent to more than 1,000 dogs and cats over the years. She also helps coordinate transfers of the animals from shelters to forever homes. Despite working tirelessly in that capacity, she still finds time to check on the elderly and the homeless in the Lexington area. To help in that capacity, Doolin is currently president of Downtown People Inc.

"We are a group that feeds the homeless and under-served a home-cooked meal ever Sunday in downtown Lexington," said Doolin. "We average between 150-200 people a week, and we do this year-round. I also do some rescue work as I am transport coordinator for an average of 25 people a week out of shelters."

"The animals are also year-round. Besides the fostering, I help coordinate the transfers of mainly dogs and some cats from shelters to homes."

Doolin will be honored at the Night of Champions, the Dan Patch Awards banquet, which will take place on Sunday, Feb. 25, at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, FL. While most of the award winners have already been announced, the names of the 2017 Pacer of the Year, Trotter of the Year, and Horse of the Year will be revealed at the banquet.

HOF broodmare Country Kay Sue dead at 32

Hall of Fame broodmare Country Kay Sue, the dam of 1995 Horse of the Year CR Kay Suzie, died Monday (Jan. 15) in Ocala, FL, owner Rod Allen reported. She was 32.

Country Kay Sue was limited to nine lifetime races because of injuries, but made her name as a broodmare. In addition to being the dam of CR Kay Suzie, she produced CR Renegade, who counted the 1999 Breeders Crown for 3-year-old male trotters among his stakes wins. Both were homebreds by Royal Troubador, the Allen family's Dan Patch Award-winning colt and later stallion.

Last August, on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands, Country Kay Sue was found in the maternal line of four horses competing on the card — Allen's filly Dream Baby Dream in the Hambletonian Oaks and Dover Dan in the Hambletonian plus Cufflink Hanover and Italian-born Tuonoblu Rex in the Open.

"If there can be such a thing as good timing in a situation like this, she might have had it," Allen said. "She had more of

her offspring racing at the Grand Circuit level last year, so it was kind of fitting.

"We stuck it out with that family for a long time. I was criticized at times for it, with people saying it was more for sentimental reasons, but it really worked out."

Country Kay Sue, a daughter of Speedy Somolli out of Pams Key, was purchased for \$25,000 under the name Molli Pam by Allen and his father, Carl. She was renamed after Rod's daughter, Kaylie Suzanne. She actually was the second horse named in Kaylie's honor; the first, Country Kaylie, was sold.

"She was upset because we sold her horse," Allen said. "My dad said we were going to buy another horse and we would never sell her. And she never left the farm."

Country Kay Sue was inducted into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in 2001.

"When we first got Foreclosure N in Ireland," Derek Delaney explained, "Kody contacted me to say he has his dam in Australia and he had a keen interest in him and had followed his success as a sire in the USA. He asked about shipping his frozen semen to use for some of his mares and we stuck a deal to also make it available for outside mares too."

This will be the first time that KTC Bloodstock, which is run by Kody with his mom and dad and Brittany, have been involved with shipping semen overseas and they are very excited to see his foals on the ground next year in Australia and New Zealand.

"This is a new venture for KTC Bloodstock," said Kody Charles. "We are very pleased to be selected as Agent for the frozen semen of Foreclosure in Australia and New Zealand."

"It has been a dream of ours for some time to get involved in a stallion and I can't think of no better stallion to get involved in at our first attempt. He is already competing with the best in the states and already has the points on the board from his first small crop. I think he will be a big plus for local breeders. He will be supported by our own mares and frozen semen will be available in Australia and New Zealand for a fee of \$2,500 including GST."

Foreclosure N, (Rocknroll Hanover—Pleasing Package A—Fake Left) was bred in USA and foaled in NZ, then shipped back to USA as yearling, raced in the USA and Canada, then

bred one crop with 21 foals in the USA.

His oldest foals are now age 4 and have earned over \$1 million through their three-year-old season. He finished 6th on the top 20 sires for average earnings for three-year-old pacers in 2017 and sired the Ohio Sire Stakes Championship winner, Drunk On Your Love p,3 1:51.1f. He was also recently honored as the top Ohio-bred 3-Year-Old Colt Pacer of the year in 2017 and earned \$328,286 to date.

Foreclosure N's richest daughter is Rosemary Rose p,3 1:51.4h \$255,692, and holds the track record for 3-year-old fillies at Northfield Park with her record mile of 1:51.4 and won multiple legs of the OHSS and won the Grand Circuit event, the Courageous Lady.
