Burke horse's high TCO2 may be big test for integrity rule

A judges' hearing on the high TCO2 result at The Meadows is scheduled for next week. Should a penalty be assessed, the bigger issue is how it would impact Burke's operation going forward with the WEG/Jeff Gural integrity rule in place.

The Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission has confirmed that TJ Blast — a horse trained and owned, in part, by the sport's leading money-winning conditioner Ron Burke — had a high blood gas reading (TCO2) prior to the third race on Monday (Jan. 22) at The Meadows and was scratched.

A bigger issue is how that might impact Burke's large operation going forward due to the new Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) / Jeff Gural rule (full story here).

That rule is currently being revised (full story here).

Judges have yet to hold a hearing on TJ Blast's high TCO2 reading. That hearing is expected to be held sometime next week, at which time a penalty may be assessed.

At the request of the horse's connections — and in accordance to an authorized procedure offered to others with horses with high TCO2 readings in the past — TJ Blast has been sequestered for 72 hours, beginning Wednesday at 10 am. The horse will be retested and, it is possible that new reading may be part of the evidence presented in the judges' hearing.

A high TCO2 reading in Pennsylvania can result in a relatively minor 30-day suspension and \$1,000 fine, but the issue has taken on new urgency given the huge number of horses trained by Burke and the new WEG/Gural rule that will have a severe impact on any trainer and his owners connected to a horse with a high TCO2 reading, or a positive for Class I or II drugs or steroids.

TJ Blast, a 5-year-old gelded son of Yankee Cruiser out of She's A Blast, was purchased by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Lawrence Kerr and Donald Emond on Dec. 28. In 2017, TJ Blast raced mostly at Harrah's Philadelphia for Jim Groff.

The gelding has earned over \$50,000 in his career with a record of 3-5-3 in 48 starts and was scheduled to race in an \$11,000 conditioned race on Monday.

WEG chairman Clay Horner, the chief architect of the

WEG/Gural rule, told HRU via email that he received an email from Mark Weaver of Weaver Bruscemi LLC on Monday afternoon, not long after TJ Blast's high TCO2 reading.

"He was very helpful and forthright," Horner said of Weaver. "We spoke on Wednesday. We discussed how the revised rule would apply in the event a resulting positive Commission decision is issued and not subsequently overturned.

"We also discussed our intended Extraordinary Circumstances exemption provision. Under the Initial Rule and the revised proposals, the Burke barn horses (other than the subject horse) would remain eligible to the stakes of the subject tracks with a trainer independent of the Burke operation and under the revised proposal and in the event Ron Burke and his related trainer group did not have another subject positive, would not be subject to a purse share reduction. Once again, Mark was very helpful and forthright and updated me on expected developments in seeking to understand the situation in the near term. We also received separate advice on the Pennsylvania process. We will monitor the situation as it develops."

Prix d'Amérique Preview

Two-time defending champ Bold Eagle will be challenged by the likes of Readly Express, Propulson, Bird Parker and more in one of the world's greatest and toughest trotting tests.

Sunday marks the annual renewal of one toughest races in the world for the trotters when 18 horses will contest the Prix d'Amérique over 1.7 miles at Vincennes in Paris.

This year, the French home team, which is usually strong, features horses such as two-time champion Bold Eagle, Bird Parker and Belina Josselyn.

But there are strong challengers from outside of the country that will try to stop the French dominance in what is billed as the biggest race in the world for elite trotters.

Swedish-bred Readly Express has shown that he manages the conditions at Vincennes racetrack without problems. American-bred Propulsion, trained in Sweden, is considered by many harness racing fans to be one the toughest participants in 2018 Prix d'Amérique, while another U.S.-bred, Wild Honey, is a longshot in the race.

Norway's Lionel and Italy's Timone Ek, Oasis Bi, Tony Gio and Ringostarr Treb are all in Paris to try and record the upset. None of them are named as the probable winner, but when it comes to racing, you never know. In 2010, Oyonnax was one of the big sensations in the race and when he crossed the finish line as a winner, the odds showed 173-1.

This year, it seems like there are five horses that will draw a lot of attention from the bettors' side.

Bold Eagle – The winner of two previous editions of the race and the king of harness racing in France. He enters the race without a victory since August of last year, when he won the Prix de Wallonie in Belgium. Still, he's the likely favorite to win Prix d'Amérique for the third year in a row.

Trainer: Sébastien Guarato (who trains five horses in the field), France

Driver's colours: Red and black, yellow (helmet).

Bird Parker - Has beaten Bold Eagle two times this winter



and has lately developed speed that will be necessary in the race. Known for his enormous strength, he is in top shape. He is a horse that can do a lot of the job on his own.

Trainer: Philippe Allaire (who trains two horses in the field), France

Driver's colours: Dark blue and yellow, yellow.

Belina Josselyn – A mare that has everything and was runner up behind Bold Eagle last year. She has raced with one goal this winter and driver Jean-Michel Bazire is tough to beat in his castle. Belina Josselyn will most certainly finish among the top five.

Driver's colours: Blue and yellow, yellow.

Readly Express – The 6-year-old Swede that hardly knows how it feels to lose a race. Twenty victories in 24 attempts speaks for itself and this is one of the most interesting horses in the European circuit this year. Could be favorite in this race.

Trainer: Timo Nurmos, Sweden

Driver's colours: Red, white and yellow, white.

Propulsion – It's the second attempt to win the Prix d'Amérique for Propulsion. Last year, the son of Muscle Hill finished fourth after a trip where he got no luck at all. The preparations have been better this year and he is one of the horses that will challenge for the victory.

Trainer: Daniel Redén, Sweden

Driver's colours: Brown, black and white, black.





Harness racing's one per cent integrity fee

The game should follow the lead of the NBA, which is proposing a one per cent "integrity fee" should sports betting become legal nationally.

This week, the National Basketball Association (NBA), in advance of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling in the coming months that could strike down a federal prohibition against legalized sports betting, made it known that they would be seeking a piece of the action should the ban on state sponsored sports betting be lifted.

The NBA is calling for an "integrity fee" of one per cent, which would be based on the total handle legally wagered and paid by sports gaming operators (i.e. sportsbooks, as an example). The NBA is citing that the controversial one per cent fee would be necessary for the league to implement new efforts related to ensuring the integrity of the game is maintained while intertwined with legalized betting. Whether you believe the NBA's reasoning for the fee, there are things that harness racing can take away from this.

For years, there have been people in the harness racing industry who are proponents of redirecting a small percentage of money from tracks with alternative gaming (slots) and using it towards the betterment of the sport.

GM and COO of Meadowlands Racing & Entertainment Jason Settlemoir is one of those individuals, and he sees some parallels between what the NBA and professional sports leagues are proposing, and harness racing.

"I think what the NBA is proposing as far as the earmarking or allocating money for what purposes they are describing, correlates very well with something that myself and Mr. (Jeff) Gural have been huge proponents of for the last 10 to 12 years," said Settlemoir. "And what that is, is taking a percentage of our gaming revenues and earmarking it for not only an integrity initiative, but also a marketing initiative, so I

think there are plenty of parallels there.

"I truly feel that we need to have a percentage of money earmarked nationally for marketing and integrity, and along with that, money towards two types of super labs right here in the U.S. Testing can then be sent directly to these super labs and money can be used to get on the cutting edge of (drug testing). In our industry, the chemists are always one step ahead so I think this would go a long way in combating that."

In the past, a number that has been floated as the percentage to take from slot tracks or slot states towards integrity and marketing initiatives has been as low as one per cent, the same fee proposed by the NBA. But for the sports betting industry, one per cent would be far more detrimental than one per cent would be to harness racing. Nevada sports books operate on tight margins (only 3.5 to five per cent revenue according to the American Gaming Association), so a one per cent fee would on all handle would equate to 20 per cent to 29 per cent of its total revenue. On the other hand, race purses in many states with slots continue to be distributed as if the money will never run out.

I know, it's easy for me to sit here and say what's only one per cent to be taken from purses and redirected elsewhere. But I've spoken with various owners – both large and small



- on the topic and all would be for such an initiative if it were professionally organized and managed by reputable groups completely independent of harness racing.

It's a fair assumption that most people involved in the industry wish for the future security of the sport and have a responsibility to help ensure it. A type of harness racing integrity fee – if applied intelligently – would help to secure that by assuring money provided to the sport is properly being reinvested back into it.

While the NBA and USTA are undeniably two very different types of organizations, could the USTA exert any influence over tracks when it comes enforcing an integrity fee? In previous occasions, the USTA has stated that it doesn't have power to implement changes as its purely a record keeping organization. But is that entirely the case? Just last year, the USTA temporarily suspended the membership of Northfield Park over an issue of financial responsibility, so a recent instance exists of it operating in a capacity of control over membership.

Similarly, Settlemoir doesn't necessarily buy into the notion that the USTA is powerless either. "The USTA has our biggest tool in their agreement they have with Trackmaster, and that's the racing programs, and our membership into the USTA from the racetrack standpoint. We pay for the data, and to facilitate the process of making the programs and send those to our customers. So, I don't think the USTA is powerless from that standpoint."


The point in this isn't to denigrate the USTA but rather to point out the unique position it may be in if it wishes to help tackle these issues that have been only talked about to date for quite some time. While some tracks do well at promoting harness racing, there are some tracks that do everything in their power not to promote racing.

In these instances where tracks haven't been able to create a model where they can stand on their own, it would be well warranted for a governing or overseeing body to step in and take measures on its own to help ensure a quality harness racing product. Marketing of a product only goes so far if the product itself is bad, and the product will only improve when it's cleaned up. Only then will both owners and gamblers return – the two things that were necessary for racing prior to alternative gaming.

I understand that right now slots are the name of the game and if I were in charge of things, preserving slots would be the most immediate priority just like it is for those running things today. But there is nothing to say that sustained national campaigns revolving around integrity and marketing can't occur at the same time.

If the NBA can somehow find a way to charge a one per cent fee on something most people would argue it shouldn't be entitled to, maybe harness racing can find a way to come together to find one per cent to fund initiatives that would benefit everyone. To borrow from the 1980's NBA, perhaps harness racing can be FANtastic.a

Promising babies, early Hambletonian favorites and thoughts on shoeing and half-mile racing

I am still awaiting the official publication of the new version of the WEG/Gural rule. Therefore, the questions pertaining to the revised edition will once again be delayed until we have the final product. There have been way too many posts on this subject, and I feel they are, without question, premature to say the least. I agree the first draft of rules was a bit over the top, but the powers behind the idea were more than gracious about their mistakes and we should all wait to hear what they have to say before condemnation begins. I have been in contact with Clay Horner via email and am more than satisfied that the new rule will be a step in the right direction for our business. For certain it will have a positive effect, if the proposal is viable. So let's hope for the best and discuss the matter when the facts become available.

As a bolt of lightning, the Ronnie Burke blood gas positive comes, almost as a divine intervention into the middle of all this chaos. The timing is almost unbelievable, and, somehow, I think this will bring to light one of the major obstacles of the rules. I am not saying that there is any guilt involved, but that is not in my field of expertise. I know Ronnie very well and I doubt this was from any action on his part.


Blair Burgess, to me one of the most intelligent horseman I ever met, said on Facebook regarding sodium bicarbonate "the substance in question this time is grossly mishandled by the commissions right now and is a therapeutic med when used correctly. False positives are way more likely than the powers that be would lead you to believe. Sick, dehydrated horses always have a high number. Most horses that test high get beaten multiple lengths."

For all of you that asked questions on this subject please have patience. I will answer all your questions when the new rule is complete. The Burke positive will undoubtedly lengthen the time frame but more likely than not have a very positive effect on the decision-making process.

Paul Arthur asks: I know you live near Sunshine Meadows. Have you been to the track at all or has retirement kept you away from the barns? If you have been have you seen any babies that you like.

To be honest, I have not been there as much as I would like, partially because I like to write in the mornings and also the weather has not been as wonderful as a typical south Florida winter. Although, as WC Fields said, "Better here than in Philadelphia."

I have seen a few colts that have caught my eye. Kings County a big brown colt by Muscle Hill out of the Conway Hall mare Brooklyn, looks like a man amongst boys. He is a full brother to Brooklyn Hill who attained a two-year-old record of 1:53.1, from the family of Creamy Mimi and Pizza Dolce. He was purchased by Lindy Farm for \$210,000 in the Concord Stud consignment at Harrisburg. Another colt I like is also a Lindy Farm purchase for \$60,000 from the Kentuckiana Farm, agent, in the Lexington Selected Sale. Gobi Bandit is a smallish bay colt by Chapter Seven out of



the Muscles Yankee mare Blazing Musclegirl. He didn't get the greatest drive, but showed good speed to get into the thick of things. He is from the immediate family of Emile Cas El the dam of Hambletonian winner Trixton. Chin Chin Hall, a Peter Wrenn pupil owned by David MacDuffee and Gene Olford looks like his pedigree. He is a very big bay Cash Hall brother to Cantab Hall, thus a foal of the Garland Lobell mare Canland Hall. He was a \$50,000 purchase at the Ohio Select Sale from the consignment of Walnut Hall Limited sold by Winterwood Farm as agent. He is dual eligible Kentucky and Ohio and truly looks the part. Although he is the 12th foal of the mare, she was not exactly bred to the sport's leading sires. Far be it for me to question AJL (Alan Leavitt) in his breeding choices, but in my humble opinion he could have done a far better job selecting matings for the dam of one of the finest horses in the sport, now enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

Switching to the pacing side, US Captain looks like he was well worth the price of admission, \$180,000, for the beautiful big bay son of Captain Treacherous out of the world champion mare America Jewel purchased at the Lexington Selected Sale by Tony Alagna agent for the Captains Court. He was consigned by Brittany Farms of Versailles, Kentucky and is also dual eligible, Pennsylvania and Kentucky.

Joel Kravet asks: Why has half-mile track racing fallen out of favor with so many trainers?

It's not so much that half-mile track racing has fallen out of favor, its that there are so many other viable choices. When I started in the business, you raced at Yonkers, Roosevelt, Saratoga, Monticello, or Freehold. Pocono or Vernon were the nearest larger tracks, but their paddocks were like a swamp when it rained. Liberty Bell and Brandywine were available but that was a long way to ship.

I personally hate half-mile track racing. My first training mile on the Meadowlands mile was like a dream come true. I loved training trotters and they all found the bigger oval to their liking. Thoroughbred people refer to horses switching leads and I am not convinced that standardbreds don't do it also. You definitely feel a horse change his gait going into and out of every turn on a half-mile track, especially. Now think of the increased centrifugal force on the tight turns that a horse must negotiate eight times on the half, six times on the five eighths and only four times on the mile. The pressure on the joints is significantly greater on the smaller tracks. Where would you like to race?

Arthur Brown asks: I realize it's a bit early but can you divulge

some of your choices for the 2018 Hambletonian?

Arthur it's never to early to talk about my favorite subject and by chance I have spoken to one of the trainers over the weekend. I will probably be hung for this quote but I love it. Bob Stewart said, "If Tactical Landing doesn't win the Hambletonian I will be terribly disappointed." This is coming from a fine horseman that has knocked on this door before. We have been friends for quite a while and our friendship was truly tested when Self Possessed raced Angus Hall in all the classic three-year-old races and one day standing on the rail watching one of those events he looked down at me, sneered and said, "Do you always have to win?" Bobby maybe it's your turn. Tactical Landing may not be my first choice but he is truly a viable candidate. He was an \$800,000 yearling being a full-brother to the fast, but ill-fated, Mission Brief by Muscle Hill out of the Varenne mare Southwind Serena a fast filly in her own right. I watched all of his starts and to be he seemed too big and immature to handle the extreme speed that he had inside. He is a great-gaited and sound colt that definitely displayed talent on the track last year. I wish Bobby, Linda and all the connections the very best.

My pick for the 2018 Hambletonian would be another one you may scratch your head about, but to anyone who thinks this choice is crazy please ask Yannick Gingras about him. I am referring to the son of MVP out of the Mr. Vic mare Summer Savory, Wolfgang. Maybe I am a bit prejudiced because the owners and breeders are close friends, but this colt is really something special. To begin with, I trained the dam and she was a big, beautiful, great-gaited mare, but had limited opportunities on the racetrack as her owners were more apt to breed than race. Her first two foals were by Master Glide and Mr Cantab. Neither has produced a Hambletonian winner as of this writing. Her third of four foals was Chef Lee a son of Cantab Hall and a winner of a third of a million dollars. Last year, the colt had some awful racing luck but righted the ship at the end of the year winning the Matron and finishing second in the Valley Victory. He is a very big colt that will most definitely improve at three. Best of luck to trainer Jimmy Takter and the proud owners, my friends the Zubrods of Fair Island Farm, the Hatfields, and the other connections for a great 2018.

Stephane Beaudoin asks: My trotting filly hits both hind ankles. I tried aluminum in front, tried 5/8" half round, nothing worked. Behind she has a half round half swedge, I tried a egg bar that didn't work either. What should I do?

First you have to understand that the more weight a horse carries on the bottom of his foot the bigger his gait and the more chance for interference. Horses legs are like pendulums the heavier they are at the bottom the further they swing. Therefore, adding a 5/8th shoe would do more harm than good. My first suggestion is to try the filly barefoot for a few days to get her to wear her foot naturally, then without changing the level of the foot put on a wide web flat aluminum shoe. Go to a full swedge aluminum behind and try brace bandages instead of boots. To be honest, Chuck Sylvester is the only trainer I have seen have success with half rounds behind and he certainly has had success. On the other hand, they just don't work for me. Sometimes, these problems are impossible to fix. Continentalvictory, hit her right hind ankle her entire career and never took a bad step. The great one overcome everything.



Ontario caretakers assess their changing industry

A labor shortage in Ontario's agricultural sector, coupled with a shrinking horse racing industry means work for caretakers has changed dramatically.


Ontario's harness racing industry is not the only one facing a labor shortage heading into 2018. Researchers and organizations across the province's agricultural spectrum have been sounding warnings about the threat to business growth and sustainability due to a lack of available labor for a number of years and there are no easy solutions on the horizon.

Seasonal employment, the physical nature of the work, limited pay scales and the decreasing rural population have all been cited as causes for the shortage and are all issues familiar to those who work as caretakers in harness racing.

"It's not just our business from what I hear, it's a lot of businesses that sometimes the money is basically the same, but there's a little more work involved," said Paul "Huey" Clark, who has been caring for standardbred racehorses since he was 15 years old.

Clark, who was the night watchman for On The Road Again and earned the 1989 caretaker of the year award while caring for Matts Scooter, has had a birds eye view to the considerable changes the industry has undergone over the last 35 years. Some of those have had a significant impact on the role of the caretaker — night watchmen are a thing of the past, as is travelling across North America for months at a time with one horse while someone else cared for the two horses you left behind — while others have had a broader effect. In spite of all the changes Clark, who has worked for Rob Fellows for the last 15 years, said he would still make the same choice he made when one of his father Gene's staff members failed to show up for work in 1981.

"I've often said if I was fortunate enough to win the Lotto Max tomorrow night I'd still be shovelling shit," said Clark with a laugh. "Maybe not every day — it would be my own horses, I'd have enough money to pay somebody so that I could go away here and there — but I'd still like the hands on with the horses, you know they're all similar, but they're all different, they've all got their own personalities and little quirks and what they like and don't and this and that."

The landscape has shifted in Ontario for those in the business of caring for racehorses.

That love for horses has kept Clark engaged in the industry through all the ups and downs, but it is something he worries few people today are able to develop.

"As a kid, in Milton they used to have harness races every fall," said Clark, who grew up in the Campbellville area and now lives outside of Fergus. "Every small town had a racetrack in it, and they had harness races."

Jeff Baillargeon also grew up in the industry and noted that many of his current co-workers in his father Ben Baillargeon's operation are rural residents.

"There's not very much way for outside people to make their way into this business," said Baillargeon, who worked part-time for his father through his undergraduate studies in history and political theory at McGill University and will be full-time until he heads to the University of Guelph this fall, adding philosophy to the mix before pursing graduate studies.

While he has heard conversations about the cause of the current labor shortage, ranging from the loss of the dormitories at Mohawk Racetrack to the changes in the business that have made catch paddocking more lucrative than working during the day as a caretaker, Baillargeon has given the issue a great deal of thought and thinks the issue boils down to money.

"I feel like it's very reductive to say it's just money at the end of the day, but you need money to live at the end of the day, and if you're kind of living on a very low budget it can be really disheartening, so why would you bother doing this?" said Baillargeon. "It's long hours being a groom for a racehorse, it really is. A horse is an athlete and you're like their physiotherapist and their parent and their best friend. It's emotional as well as physical."

The 23-year-old Guelph resident believes an adjustment to the way purse money is allocated could solve the problem, either by increasing the percentage paid to trainers, enabling them to increase the amount they are able to pay staff, or by directing a percentage directly to caretakers.

"I feel like to be able to consistently have a good big barn, you need to have a sustainable economic plan to a certain extent," Baillargeon said. "I think it's a very lucrative business, but at the same time my mom always told me that in this business you can be a hero and the next day a zero, and it's very true, and I think the nature of things being so precarious also makes people, you could say less compassionate, less willing to share.

"I mean it's the same thing in the world outside of horse racing, it's a very precarious existence and it breeds a little bit of antagonism and wariness of the other. Whereas, like I said, a more root analysis of the problem, if you redistribute money — and one of the options which I think is very good is to actually take money directly from the purses to the groom — I think eventually you get a change in attitudes when everyone feels like they're being taken care of."

Considering the labour shortages agricultural business are facing all across the province, the idea of directing money directly to caretakers may boost the industry's appeal to young job seekers, like the 40 University of

Guelph students currently pursuing an education in the equine programs at the Regional Equine and Agricultural Centre of Huron (REACH Huron).

Teesha Symes, who was honored with the 2016 O'Brien Award as caretaker of the year while working for Dr. Ian Moore and has recently struck out on her own with four horses, has already discovered another potential solution during her short tenure as a trainer. The Cambridge resident has a high school co-op student starting with her when the second semester gets under way.

"He's from Waterdown with zero ties to the industry," said Symes. "He just happened to go to the races one day and his dad's like, this kid loves it, like he loves it."

The young man volunteered his time with Janice Hubbard through the summer and fall and moved over to Symes' stable when Hubbard left for Florida with the Moore string. Since then Symes said he has not missed a race night and handled the barn chores while she spent some time with her family in Nova Scotia over Christmas.

"He did my horses, by himself. He's in Grade 11 and I trusted him fully because he just loves the game, he got bit by the bug," said Symes.

"Working in Florida with Ian, you see all kinds of people, like grooms, coming from the streets and being taught. That doesn't happen a lot in Ontario, you don't see people starting out. And I don't know if it's because the trainers aren't as open to that, they want the best help and the best groom, well you've got to start somewhere, you have to bring them up, right."

Symes has also chosen not to buy into the pessimism that has dogged the industry since the end of the Slots at Racetracks Progam (SARP). The 28-year-old has set her sights on a career in the business and she is confident that her hard work and passion for the game will lead to success.

"You listen to the older folks and they're like, 'Oh you should go home and get your life together.' My life's together, I'm in the Dominican," said the vacationing Symes with a laugh. "I am training my own horses, and doing well, and here I am in the Dominican. If you want to put your head down and work, yeah sometimes it's six, seven nights a week, but there's all kinds of opportunity."



Stratton dissects Yonkers changes

Leading driver talks about the removal of the passing lane, milestones and the future.

Although driver Jordan Stratton had a career-best season in 2017, pulling in just over \$9 million in purses, making 394 trips to the winner's circle, and finishing second in the Yonkers driver's standings for the first time in his career, you probably didn't read about it in the headlines. The 30-year-old reinsman prefers it that way. He'd rather see the recognition go to the equine athletes who do the hard work. "Drivers get too much credit as it is," he said.

Although Stratton quickly points out his luck could change tomorrow or that he could make a mistake in his very next drive that will leave bettors cursing his name, for now, he remains the one to beat. He's sat behind 32 winners in his first 125 drives of the 2018 racing season at Yonkers, putting him atop the driver's standings. His quick start to the year comes amidst the removal of the passing lane at Yonkers and double-digit handle increases.

Stratton took the time to discuss driving with the new track configuration, his personal milestones, and his goals for the future.

The 2017 racing season closed with the passing lane in mid-December. This year, you opened without the passing lane. Were you expecting this to happen so quickly?

JS: It's been thrown around a lot for about six or seven months. It's been in the back of their minds that if racing didn't improve or if handle didn't improve, then that was the go-to move that they always threatened and that coincided with the time Cammie (Haughton) came along (as the new director of racing). I'll be the first to admit, I was always against it. From day one, I was against it. I was completely wrong. I really like it now, I think it's really improved the product.

Why were you against it initially?

JS: I just thought it would be stale racing, it would be all front-end. Just what I think in my mind of the old days: somebody makes the front and they go really, really slow and the horse first-over comes and they go really, really slow and they lag around the racetrack and the horse on the front and the horse first-over finish one-two. It was just boring racing. It seems like now, guys are being

ultra-aggressive. I pulled the two-hole the last week-and-a-half more than I have in the last five years. It's definitely improved.

You even pulled the pocket at the half last week.

JS: Yeah, a few nights ago, I pulled in front of the grandstand. I ended up winning the race, but before, you would have never even thought about that. You would have just sat in the two-hole. The horse on the front, I could see he was kind of pulling up and not wanting to go on the front, but with the passing lane, I probably would have just rode it out and probably would have gotten beat, I don't know if that horse would have gotten me to the front. But with no passing lane, it wasn't an option to just sit in there.

Had you spent much time on tracks without passing lanes before this?

JS: No. I've driven at Tioga, which doesn't have a passing lane, but other than that, no.

What was the learning curve like for you? It seems like you adjusted to it very quickly.

JS: It really didn't take much because I seem to be first-over a lot more often than not and it works out great for me being first-over because the horses two and three back on the fence don't have that passing lane where

before, if I beat the horse on the lead, I'd get beat by the horse in the passing lane and finish second or third. I like being first-over now, I can kind of control things.

It sounds like the new track configuration is giving a better, or at least a fairer chance, to drivers who are being more aggressive with their horses.

JS: Definitely. That guy sitting third on the fence who thinks he has a shot, he better be pulling or else he'll be in no man's land being third or fourth on the fence turning for home.

How do you see this playing out as the year goes on?

JS: We've only seen one weekend of the better horses and even some of the better horses are still turned out. The really good Saturday night horses, you can use them two or three times in a mile. I think the no passing lane is great with the cheaper horses because if they get stung to the quarter pole, they're cooked and that allows horses to come from behind. I'm kind of nervous to see what it does to the better horses who you can string out to a quarter in 27 seconds and they can still sprint home.

The drivers and trainers racing at Yonkers have dealt with a lot of changes over the past few years. French racing, the new finish line, removal of the passing lane. Why do the horsemen here embrace these big changes so willingly?

JS: I think we have some of the best drivers in the country, the best horses in the country, the best purses in the country, and yet, every year we see the handle dwindle and dwindle. You have to just try whatever you've got to try. We have a great product and it should be something that the gamblers want to gamble on, but something wasn't right, something needed to change.

Is the handle something you pay close attention to?

JS: It wasn't like every night I was checking the handle, but the first thing you would hear from people, the first thing people talked about is how we were giving out all this purse money with no handle. But at the same time, there was no one steering the ship. It was just here's post time, there's the product, nobody pulls, nobody wants to change anything, and harness racing is dead, look at the handle, this is the way it is. It was all negative, negative,

negative. Not that Cammie was the save all, but luckily, someone is now in that position to steer the ship and make sure we're not going head to head with other tracks and try to better the product for the gamblers, and I think that's what we need. I think making sure we're not going head to head with other tracks. That's huge. It's common sense almost that guys aren't going to bet on two different tracks going at the same time. I wish in a utopian world, all tracks would work together and go at different times so gamblers would always have a product to bet on and not overflood the market, but that's easier said than done.

Is there anything else you'd like to see at Yonkers in the future to continue to improve the racing?

JS: I think in the future, a slanted gate might really just be the cherry on top. But right now, I think it's just a leaps and bounds better product than last year. I think maybe with a slanted gate where you can give the seven and eight the option to leave out of there, that might solve our problem.

The 2017 season was a career year for you in terms of purses. Reflect on that and talk about what last year was like for you.

JS: Pete Tritton, I really have to give a lot of thanks to his whole barn and Bit Of A Legend and all the good horses he put me on. The confidence you get sitting behind those horses, I mean, the rest of the horses are easy. The other trainers and owners see me winning those big races. It's all perception I think with drivers. If you're on a bunch of favorites and you're winning three, four, five a night, all the sudden you're a good driver. It's all perception.

Last year we talked early in the season and you said you'd set a goal for yourself to be in the top three in the driver's standings at Yonkers. You accomplished that. Have you set another goal for yourself this year?

JS: I think it's kind of the same goal. Ideally, it would be number one, but you've got to be happy with progress and not always beating yourself up over a bad night. But I think top three would be an attainable goal and obviously shoot for being number one and be happy with whatever comes.

Gingras reflects on huge 2017

The driver was the regular pilot for four Dan Patch winners, including the top three horses in the sport's weekly Top 10 poll.

Yannick Gingras' focus is on winning races, not awards, but when you win races like he did in 2017 it's no surprise when recognition follows.

Gingras drove four horses last year that captured Dan Patch Award divisional honors, including the three horses ranked at the top of the season's final Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll: No. 1 Hannelore Hanover, No. 2 Ariana G, and No. 3 Manchego. The remaining Dan Patch winner, Youaremycandygirl, was ranked seventh.

He led the sport in purses for the fourth consecutive year, with \$12.9 million, and topped the driver standings on the Grand Circuit. His Grand Circuit victories included four Breeders Crown finals, the Hambletonian Oaks (for a record-extending fourth consecutive year), the Maple Leaf Trot, and Little Brown Jug.

All totaled, Gingras won 33 races worth at least \$100,000 last season and did it with 16 different horses. And when it was all said and done, Gingras received his second Driver of the Year Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association. His previous honor came in 2014.

"It's always nice, there's no doubt," Gingras said about the award. "Going into the year, it's not what I'm looking to get. I'm trying to win the big races and stay healthy. But it's nice recognition. It means you had a good year and the horses had a good year.

"You go on the track and try to do your job. I was lucky this year that the horses I drove stayed healthy. That's the main thing."

There were numerous memorable moments for Gingras last year. In addition to winning his fourth Hambletonian Oaks, with Ariana G, he guided Hannelore Hanover to the fastest mile by a female trotter in history, 1:49.2 at Lexington's Red Mile, and piloted Youaremycandygirl to the fastest mile ever by a 2-year-old female pacer, 1:50, also at the Red Mile.

Ariana G, Hannelore Hanover, Youaremycandygirl, and Manchego all won their respective Breeders Crown finals, with Manchego becoming the first undefeated Breeders Crown 2-year-old female trotting champion in history.

It was a rewarding weekend for Gingras, who said he never felt pressure with Ariana G, Hannelore Hanover, or Manchego other than at the Breeders Crown because he wanted to keep

potential Horse of the Year honors alive for all three of the horses.

"Going into the Breeders Crown I definitely did feel a little pressure on those three," Gingras said. "I love all three of them in different ways and all three are special to me. You want all three of them to have the best shot at winning the Horse of the Year. You don't want to come to a point where you win with two of them and one of them you mess up the drive.

"It's one thing if they get beat because they're sick or some other horse is better and beats them. But it's another thing to lose the race and maybe lose a chance for those owners to have a Horse of the Year because of my own mistake. Getting it done with all three of them was definitely very special. They got the job done. They did the work. But I put them in position to win and they all three did it."

As for which of the three should receive Horse of the Year, which will be announced at the Dan Patch Awards banquet Feb. 25 in Orlando, Gingras had a simple solution.

"Personally, I hope it's a triple dead-heat," he said. "I think all three are very special."

With the horsepower Gingras has returning this year, the 38-year-old Quebec native could be looking forward to another strong season.

"I'm really happy with the way (2017) went," said Gingras, who was the sport's Rising Star Award winner in 2003 and has won 6,672 races and \$157 million in purses lifetime. "Hopefully we have a couple more like that."

Circle The Page repeats in Blizzard

Round two of the Blizzard Series took place Thursday evening at Woodbine Racetrack and last week's round one winners put on a great display in one of two \$17,000 divisions.

Circle The Page was able to edge fellow first-leg winner Franschoek by a neck in a career-best 1:52.4.

Driven by Jonathan Drury, Circle The Page got away fourth in a field of seven and would eventually angle out at the half to come first up on the far turn. Franschoek shot to the lead and hung up fractions of :27, :56.1 and 1:24.3 to lead by a length turning for home.

In the stretch, the two first-leg winners dueled right to the wire with Circle The Page ultimately coming out on top. Big Chute finished third, while Promise Blue Chip grabbed fourth.

A four-year-old daughter of Real Artist—Queen Marie, Circle The Page is now two for two at Woodbine and will have an opportunity for a series sweep. She is now three for three in 2018 and seven for 26 lifetime for earnings of \$62,394.

Circle The Page is currently racing for trainer Victor Puddy and is owned by regular trainer John Sullivan and Michael Marocco. She paid \$3.90 to win.

The evening's first division saw Bettim Jackie score a three-length victory in 1:53.2.

Driven by Louis Philippe Roy, Bettim Jackie got away fifth and was moved at the half to follow the cover of Glancewithme heading into the far turn. Glancewithme cleared to the lead at three-quarters in 1:24.4 to lead into the lane.

In the stretch, Bettim Jackie surged by Glancewithme in the final-eighth of the mile to score a decisive victory. Glancewithme held on for second, while Village Jamie grabbed third and The Time To Win fourth.

Trained by Richard Moreau, Bettim Jackie finished fourth in last week's first-leg, but was placed eighth for interference. The three-year-old daughter of Prince Edward Island sire Andreoli Hanover out of Bettim Laura is now one for three this year and five for 14 overall.

Bettim Jackie has banked \$12,500 this season to bring her career earnings to \$24,046 for owners Jeff Lilley, Blair MacLauchlan and Danny Purcell. She paid \$9.70 to win.

Sophomore and four-year-old pacing fillies and mares, who

were non-winners of two races or \$30,000 lifetime, were eligible for nomination to the Blizzard Series.

The Blizzard Series final is scheduled to take place next Friday (Feb. 2). The top-10 earners from the preliminary legs to enter will compete in the \$39,400 series finale.

Live racing continues tonight at Woodbine Racetrack. A trio of Snowshoe Series second-leg divisions will highlight the 11-race program. Post time is 7:10 p.m.

Update on Equine Herpes Virus at The Meadows

A standardbred horse at The Meadows Racetrack and Casino in Washington County tested positive Wednesday (Jan. 24) for Equine Herpes Virus, or EHV-1, making it the second confirmed case in the state this month. Last week, veterinarians with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture and the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine confirmed a case at the school's New Bolton Center in Kennett Square, Chester County.

The Washington County horse tested positive after it was moved to the Ohio State College of Veterinary Medicine for diagnostic tests. Veterinarians report that the horse is responding well to treatment.

As a precaution, two barns at The Meadows racetrack have been quarantined to control any potential spread of the virus. Trainers are monitoring two of approximately 60 potentially exposed horses in the quarantined barns that presented with elevated temperatures. No additional horses at the racetrack have shown signs of clinical illness, but the movement of horses into or out of the track has been restricted until all horses receive a clean bill of health.

The Meadows Racetrack was closed Wednesday due to a power outage and poor track conditions, but reopened Thursday. Clinically healthy horses are being allowed to jog around the track to stay in shape. Pending improvement in track conditions, all non-quarantined horses should be eligible to race again on Saturday.

In the New Bolton Center case last week, a 30-year-old horse developed symptoms compatible with Equine Herpes Myeloencephalopathy, or EHM, then tested positive for EHV-1 on Jan. 16. A second horse, housed in an adjacent barn, also developed a fever and later tested positive for EHV-1. The second horse was moved to a state-of-the-art, on-site isolation facility with dedicated staff who are entirely separate from personnel handling other horses.

The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture contacted owners and quarantined other potentially exposed horses that left the New Bolton Center prior to confirming the EHM diagnosis. To control the spread of the virus, Orders of Special Quarantine were posted at other Pennsylvania premises that had recently received potentially exposed horses. In addition to increased biosecurity, these locations are required to conduct twice daily temperature checks, monitor and report any horses showing signs of EHV-1 infection. No new cases have been identified since the original diagnosis.

EHV-1 is a highly contagious virus that commonly circulates in horse populations. Depending on the specific strain of the virus, the Equine Herpes Virus can cause a variety of clinical signs in infected horses, including respiratory disease or abortion in pregnant mares. The EHM form of the disease can cause horses to suffer varying degrees of paralysis and ataxia; in severe cases, the infected horse may be euthanized. While EHV-1 can cause illness in horses, other equine animals and camelids (llamas and alpacas), it does not pose a health threat to people or other animals.

Unless a new case is detected, all horses can be cleared after 28 days without symptoms, or after 21 days with confirmation of negative test results for both blood samples and nasal swab tests.

Experts note that many horses carry a latent form of the herpes virus, and symptoms may not appear unless the animal is stressed. Although horses are vaccinated for other strains of the Equine Herpes Virus, there is no existing vaccine for the EHV-1 strain of the virus.

The winning horseplayer, who was playing at Western Fair, wagered just \$2.40 on Saturday's Jackpot Hi-5. The actual winning ticket cost \$0.80 and was structured 1,2/1,2/7,8/7,8/5.

Big guns returning to Big M

With the groundhog's weather report due in nine days, some of the Meadowlands' most recognizable names will be seen popping up more in the program in the coming weeks as winter's chill begins to slowly melt into spring.

First up is Yannick Gingras.

"The Green Hornet" won 395 times a year ago, ending his streak of 400 or more at eight, but things went well nonetheless. The 38-year-old was voted the 2017 Driver of the Year by the United States Harness Writers Association after leading the sport in money earned (\$12.9 million) while guiding horses such as Hannelore Hanover, Ariana G and Manchego, all of whom are in the Horse of the Year conversation.

Gingras will be at the Big M tonight (Jan. 26) and Saturday (Jan. 27), and will be seen on Fridays regularly from this point forward.

Tim Tetrick, who won his fifth Meadowlands Pace in 2017 with Huntsville, is getting ready for his return to the East Rutherford track.

The 36-year-old "Bionic Man" had another big year in 2017, as horses he drove earned at least \$11 million for an 11th consecutive year. His Meadowlands return is slated for Friday, Feb. 2, at which time he will drive regularly at the mile oval where he's been so successful over the last decade.

Corey Callahan is coming to Friday nights at the Big M and his opponents can't be too happy about that. The eight-time leading driver at Dover Downs has been a Saturday night terror at the Meadowlands of late, winning six races on Dec. 23, three on Dec. 30 and four more on Jan. 20.

The 39-year-old, known as "The Captain", is as consistent as they come, having won at least 400 races and earned at least \$5 million for 10 straight years. Callahan's schedule calls for him to be a Big M regular (drive both on Fridays and Saturdays) effective Feb. 9.

Big action at Big M

Western Joe might have been the top performer at the Meadowlands after taking the Preferred Handicap last Saturday (Jan. 20) night, but the big winners were the betting faithful, who were treated to big payoffs, which were created by spirited wagering.

Over the course of the 14-race program only four favorites visited victory lane, which served as the catalyst for big payouts in the 20-Cent Survivor Pick 10 (\$18,028), Pick 5 (\$11,645) and Pick 4 (\$2,022). The total pools for the 'Survivor' (\$21,653) and Pick 4 (\$86,996) reached new 2018 heights while the Pick 5 remained strong as usual (\$54,802).

Thus far in 2018, here are the average payouts for three popular nightly puzzles (all of which offer a reduced takeout of 15 percent):

- Pick 4: \$1,322 (50-cent base wager)
- Pick 5: \$6,692 (50-cent base wager)
- Survivor Pick 10: \$8,050 (20-cent base wager)

All-source wagering on Saturday reached \$2.7 million, which was another 2018 best, while the average payoffs that evening for the Win (\$18.65), Exacta (\$181.27) and Trifecta (\$1,549.20) wagers were rock solid.

When racing resumes with a 13-race card tonight at 6:35 p.m., players can look forward to a \$25,000 guaranteed pool in the Pick 5, a \$50,000 guarantee in the Pick 4 and a huge \$75,102 carryover in the Late 20-Cent Jackpot Super High Five, which gives the Meadowlands' faithful a good reason to hang in there until the last race of the night.



McMullen named PA County Fairs Person of the Year

McMullen was happy to take over the role due to his dedication to both the sport and to his family. "We spend a lot of time at the fairs. We always have."


