Rick Zeron reflects on a fantastically emotional 2016

The veteran trainer/driver said he's gratified and grateful to be in the running for three O'Brien Awards – including the award for Horsemanship – in a year in which he hit \$100 million in driver earnings, scored his 8,000th career win and his son, Scott, had a banner year in the U.S. driving trotting Triple Crown winner Marion Marauder.

Another great year by Rick Zeron has earned him three O'Brien Award nominations.

Rick Zeron hadn't had much time to sit back and reflect on an outstanding 2016 racing campaign. When he finally did, the veteran horseman got a little emotional.

"Tears of joy," said Zeron with a somewhat self-deprecating laugh. "It's sunk in now. It's been about a month or so since I got the call from (Standardbred Canada's) Kathy Wade-Vlaar letting me know. It's very gratifying and I'm completely grateful."

The phone call of note was a quick conversation to let Zeron know two of his star horses, Shamballa and Mass Production, were finalists in the Older Pacing Horse and

2-year-old Trotting Colt categories, respectively, for Saturday's O'Brien Awards honoring the best in Canadian harness racing in 2016.

While he was hopeful and somewhat expecting Mass Production would be on the final ballot, Zeron was surprised, albeit pleasantly, at Shamballa's inclusion on the shortlist that features multiple stakes-winning superstar Wiggle It Jiggleit, as well as discovering he was up for the Horsemanship Award, an honor he received in 2010.

"I'm shocked at Shamballa getting nominated and myself for the Horseman award," admitted the Ottawa native, who eclipsed both 8,000 career wins and \$100 million in driver purse earnings in 2016. "I was really hoping that Mass Production would be nominated because he had such a great year. To have Shamballa and myself nominated, it's a bonus."

Mass Production, a son of Muscle Mass and All Time Favourite, certainly lived up to his name in 2016. The colt won five of nine starts and banked in excess of \$285,000 in his rookie season. Highlights included four Ontario Sires Stakes scores, accompanied by a 1:54.4 stakes record performance in the OSS Super Final.

Zeron, who drives and co-owns the \$32,000 purchase at the 2015 Canadian Yearling Sale, knew early on that he had a promising youngster in the fold.

"He had a really nice gait," said Zeron. "He went through a few bumps and issues mid-winter of last winter. When spring and the good weather hit, he just kind of took off. He started to excel and training faster than others in the group that we had. I thought we had a pretty good one when it all came together."

Zeron said he is hoping for even more primetime production from Mass Production in his sophomore season.

Zeron teamed up with his son, driver Scott Zeron, on Shamballa and upset both Wiggle It Jiggleit and Always B Miki on Hambletonian Day.

"I had him turned out at Olive Branch Farm in North Carolina – Shamballa and Mass Production were both turned out there – and boy, he's really grown," he said. "He's stretched out, grown up high and filled out. He's a great horse to be around. He loves when you pet him and loves to

get his carrots. I'm thinking some really big things for him this year."

Shamballa, a now seven-year-old son of Somebeachsomewhere and Bolero Takara, pulled off one of the biggest upsets on the 2016 North American racing calendar.

The 1:47.1 victory, on Hambletonian Day, saw Shamballa upset both 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit and eventual 2016 Horse of the Year and 1:46 world record-setter Always B Miki in the \$225,000 U.S. Pacing Championship.

Even better? Zeron's son, Scott, who would win the Hambletonian with O'Brien three-year-old trotting colt finalist and potential Canadian Horse of the Year, Marion Marauder, happened to be in Shamballa's driver's seat.

For the elder Zeron, who co-owns, trains and is the lead driver of Shamballa, it was one of the greatest moments of his career, even if he was about 450 miles north of East Rutherford.

"I couldn't get down to the Meadowlands for the race because I had lot of horses going that night (at Mohawk)," he said. "I was actually racing a really good three-year-old trotting filly and I was hoping to get into her some bigger races in 2016. I was lying down in bed and watching the races on my iPad and when Scott hit the head of the lane with Shamballa, I said, 'He's a winner.' And he was. I was pretty pumped and I know I'll never forget it."

The bay gelding is closing in on the \$1 million mark in purse money, recorded 11 top-three finishes in 19 starts for \$439,091 in purse earnings in 2016.

As for his own O'Brien recognition, Zeron is understandably thrilled by the Horsemanship nomination.

"It's wonderful to be acknowledged," he said. "I'm very honored by it. It's a really big boost for me to know that the hard work, day in and day out, night racing, traveling, flying, lack of sleep – it's all recognized. That's how you get nominated for this award."

"As a driver/trainer, it's more difficult. I'm really realizing not too many people drive and train anymore. You get the trainers and you get the drivers, but I've always done both and I always will be."

Retirement isn't on the radar for the 60-year-old who calls Oakville, ON home. There are, he says happily, still plenty of miles left in the bike.

"Oh, absolutely," said Zeron, who recently surpassed 1,400

training victories. "My wife Joyce is sitting beside me. There have been conversations as to when I was going to retire. I told her that I'm not ready to retire yet because I'm still having fun. The day that I look out and realize I'm not having fun with it, that's the day I won't be doing it anymore."

How does Freedom 75 sound?

"That would be fine with me. I remember telling Joyce that the day that I turned 55, that will be my Freedom 55 – I won't be driving anymore. And that's here and gone."

What hasn't gone, however, is Zeron's enduring affinity and appreciation for the standardbred world.

It's something he'll no doubt be reminded of Saturday night when the O'Brien hardware is handed out in Mississauga, ON.

Expect Zeron to make sure his tuxedo has a few extra tissues in the pockets.

"You get a little bit more emotional as the years go on," he said. "I'll probably be a little teary-eyed at the awards, too."

Handicapping the Big Ones

HRU asked a number of industry insiders to handicap who will win O'Brien Awards for Canada's Horse of the Year, Trainer of the Year and Driver of the Year when the awards are handed out Saturday night in the Toronto area.

The winners of all of the O'Brien Awards honoring the best in Canadian harness racing for 2016 will remain a mystery until the hardware — named for the Canadian-born Hall of Famer Joe O'Brien — is handed out, Oscars-style, Saturday night at a black tie gala in Mississauga, ON.

Harness Racing Update asked a number of prominent industry people to handicap who will win three of the biggest awards of the night.

The Horse of the Year Award is open to all horses that are finalists, the Trainer of the Year race is between Richard Moreau, who has won the award the last three straight years, and five-time winner Casie Coleman. The Driver of the Year award will be between 2016 Canadian dash king and first-time finalist Bob McClure and earnings leader and three-time winner and defending champ Sylvain Filion.

Keep in mind, O'Brien voters are tasked with selecting the people and horses that made "the greatest contribution to Canadian racing" in 2016 and, to be eligible, horses had to make at least three starts in the country during the year and trainers had to have at least 30 per cent of their starts in Canada.

Horse of the Year – Betting Line

Betting Line. Any time you can accumulate that kind of record and, for good measure, throw in victories in the NA Cup and Little Brown Jug, then that is good enough for me!

Trainer of the Year – Casie Coleman

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

Horse of the Year – Marion Marauder

I don't think you can fit the "contribution to Canadian racing" angle any better than with Marion Marauder. Call me old-fashioned, but I still have great respect for the trotting Triple Crown, and Marion Marauder accomplished that rare feat. He even did it with a Canadian driver. He's not only a wonderful racehorse, but also a really good story.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

This is often one of the most difficult choices to make each year, both north and south of the border. Is the criteria tilted towards money and stable management, or big horses winning big races? Looking at the sheer power and depth of the Richard Moreau stable is frightening, and I think he probably deserves the nod.

Driver of the Year – Bob McClure

This is also one of the more interesting votes each year, because often we have a dash-winning driver toiling mostly on the "B" tracks versus the Woodbine/Mohawk leader, who earned some nice stakes wins. Examining the numbers I think I'd lean to Bob McClure. This isn't the pre-slots era

where massive amounts of race dates allowed drivers on smaller tracks to rack up wins and plenty of money. It's much more competitive and much harder to achieve success now. Bob has been nothing short of a star, and \$3 million in earnings on the rough and tumble Jr. circuit is ridiculously impressive to me, and oh so Canadian harness racing.

Gordon Waterstone / The Horseman And Fair World

Horse of Year – Wiggle It Jiggleit

This was a very tough choice as there were other leading candidates. But how can you not give the nod to Wiggle It Jiggleit and all he achieved last year? It seemed every race he was in became an "instant classic." His victories included the Canadian Pacing Derby, which solidified the belief that he is the right pick.

Trainer of Year – Casie Coleman

In a perfect case of "quality and not quantity," Casie excelled in 2016 despite a reduction in her stable size. She also has to be rewarded for sending out Betting Line, whose victories included the North America Cup and Little Brown Jug. Already a five-time winner of this O'Brien Award, she should now start counting trophies with her second hand.

Driver of Year – Sylvain Filion

He led Canadian drivers in earnings in '16, and with a resume that includes three O'Brien finalists – Beyond Delight, Emoticon Hanover and Yaris Bayama – he's my choice.

Horse of the Year – Betting Line.

His North America Cup victory, coupled with Ontario Sires Stakes dominance, makes him a lock.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

Moreau, by a nose. He got the nod the three previous years and actually improved his purse total in 2016.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

Bob McClure is getting there, but Sylvain Filion is in his prime and deserves another award.

Horse of the Year – Marion Marauder

I think this comes down to Betting Line and Marion Marauder, both who had outstanding seasons. I think the voters may be swayed by Marion Marauder's trotting Triple Crown win – which is historic – and he will win by a nose; but both horses are obviously very deserving winners and it could go both ways.

Trainer of the Year – Casie Coleman

If Betting Line was a length or two closer at the three-quarter pole in his season's debut, he'd have chased down his elder opponent Jins Shark and he would have had an undefeated season. That trainer Coleman kept him at the very top of his game all year will likely sway the vote her way in this category.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

It's hard to imagine a driver who won at a 23.8 per cent clip while leading the nation in winning 576 races from 2,418 starts not winning in this category, and based on the great season he had in 2016, Bob McClure is certainly a worthy nominee, but it seems likely that Sylvain Filion's body of work may hold more weight with voters. Filion led the nation in earnings by a wide gap (\$2.5 million), helped by a signature win in the biggest race for two-year-olds, the Metro Pace, with Beyond Delight. Nod to Filion.

Horse of the Year – Wiggle It Jiggleit

Give credit to the connections of Wiggle It Jiggleit for bringing the fan favorite champion to Canada for not only the Canadian Pacing Derby in which he won, but for showcasing him in races at Flamboro Downs and the Hippodrome Trois-Rivieres in Quebec. Take nothing away from Shamballa, but Wiggle It Jiggleit is overwhelmingly deserving of the award.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

Sylvain Filion was super this year at Woodbine and

Mohawk, winning the driving titles at both tracks by close to 50 driving wins at each one and racking up close to \$8 million in earnings in the process. There's no doubt this was a breakout year for Bob McClure in the way he dominated many of the smaller tracks and his time will come, just not right now.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

Richard Moreau led a powerhouse stable throughout the year and once again cruised in the total number of training wins. Casie Coleman's Betting Line did win the North America Cup and Little Brown Jug, although I suspect a bit of controversy that came out of the latter race might cost her in this category.

Moir Fanning / Hambletonian Society

Horse of the Year – Marion Marauder

I cannot imagine voting for anyone other than Marion Marauder. Not only did the horse win the Triple Crown, which is an extremely hard thing to do, but comes from a family legacy that cannot be more Canadian and the owners cannot be more deserving.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

I believe Richard Moreau will win trainer of the year and Sylvain Filion driver of the year because of the past performance trend of the voters.

Horse of the Year – Marion Marauder

His biggest victories may have come on American soil, but in each of those races it felt like Marion Marauder was racing for the Maple Leaf. Marion Marauder's connections have deep roots in Canadian racing and it was evident throughout the season that fans and horsepeople in Canada were proud to call the star trotter one of their own. O'Brien Award voters are asked to vote based on "greatest contribution to Canadian racing" and I don't see how any other horse could top a Canadian owned and trained Triple Crown winner.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

Filion's numbers and dominance on the WEG circuit in 2016 make him the clear choice. He topped \$7 million in seasonal earnings for just the second-time in his career and also surpassed \$100 million in career earnings. It seemed on many nights at Mohawk and Woodbine he lived in the winner's circle. Filion didn't just clean up in overnights, he also had success in major events such as the Metro Pace and OSS Super Finals.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

Will Richard Moreau repeat as Trainer of the Year for the fourth straight year?

Moreau has won this award three years in a row and instead of plateauing or even having a drop off in 2016, he raised the bar by surpassing \$4 million in single-season earnings for the first time in his career. His barn was red-hot from start to finish and his success was felt nightly on the WEG Circuit as he captured another training title.

Greg Blanchard / Director of Racing The Raceway at The Western Fair District

Horse of the Year – Betting Line

He will be tough to overlook for this honor. He was dominant against a very good three-year-old crop and compiled an almost perfect resume while often winning in breathtaking fashion.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

He maintained his steady production throughout this past season. He sent out winners at every level and his high profile performers kept him in the spotlight. I think he adds another O'Brien to his growing trophy case.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

He has blossomed into an elite driver in his second go-round on the WEG circuit. I think his productivity against the sport's best and his record in the big money races will give him a slight edge over his fellow finalist.

Or will Casie Coleman win her fifth Canadian Trainer of the Year title?

Horse of the Year – Betting Line

It better be! OMG! No brainer here. He swept all the major events – in ultra-convincing style – and the only reason he wasn't Horse Of The Year were some end-of-the-season mishaps that were 100 per cent not his doing. He was 14-for-15 and won the NA Cup over Racing Hill. Betting Line is headed off to Hanover Shoe Farm, hopefully with the O'Brien Award in tow.

Trainer of the Year – Casie Coleman

Betting Line's North America Cup effort, sweeping the OSS and the final, along with a good supporting cast. Even though Casie is not the presence in Canada she was a decade ago, she did more than enough to warrant a Trainer of the Year O'Brien statue. Remember, too, that no other trainer – ever – has had more than three straight seasons of a sophomore colt or gelding surpassing \$750,000 each year. Casie did it five straight years from 2010 to 2014. I know this is not retroactive, but it gives the voter a better sense of what she's done and her place in history – even at such a young age.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

He's about to win this for the fourth time in seven seasons. Beyond Delight, Emoticon Hanover, Yoris Bayama, Sylvain is the rare son of a top horseman who has outdone dad. Yves Filion, one of eight driving Filion brothers, was the only one to win a million-dollar race when he took the 1988 North America Cup with Runnymede Lobell. Sylvain has progressed nicely through the past decade and is improving with age. Although he's not a Sears or a Tetrick or a Gingras, he's held his own with all the big names of the past decade.

Will Canadian dash king Bob McClure win his first Driver of the Year crown?

Horse of the Year – Marion Marauder

The trotting Triple Crown; the Goodtimes, on home turf at Mohawk; the familiar, respected Keeling and Wellwood families: it's hard to dispute the appeal of Marion Marauder. Supplementing him to the Kentucky Futurity was widely, and correctly, viewed as a very sporting gesture; his expected return to the track for a four-year-old campaign also resonated with many.

Trainer of the Year – Richard Moreau

A tough call, but Moreau's dominance on the WEG scene has impressed O'Brien voters sufficiently to win him the last three consecutive Trainer of the Year titles. Five-time Canadian Trainer of the Year Coleman had an attention-grabbing season with Betting Line in particular, but Moreau's greater numbers (starts, wins, earnings) and Canadian visibility suggest voters will likely give the nod to the latter.

Driver of the Year – Sylvain Filion

Money talks, and in 2016, Filion made more of it than all but one previous year (2012) – over \$7.8 million. Bob McClure's 576 seasonal wins came on the lower-profile tracks that fail to grab the imagination of voters on a national scale. A three-time Driver of the Year associated with a trio of 2016 equine O'Brien finalists (Beyond Delight, Emoticon Hanover and Yaris Bayama), WEG stalwart Filion appears on the brink of a repeat.

Anthony MacDonald / Trainer / Owner Thestable.ca

Horse of the Year – Wiggle It Jiggleit

BETWEEN THE LINES



It's a trainer's game

There's a scene in the film *Rounders* where an ultra-gifted poker player played by Matt Damon amazes his lesser talented colleagues by successfully playing a poker hand with seeing only half of the cards dealt. He later says, "Put a guy like me in a game like that, the cards don't even matter."

At the risk of over simplifying handicapping in harness racing today, that's almost how you can look at the relationship between a trainer and everything else that appears in the past performances.

There's a dynamic at tracks today where many of the races are won by a select group of trainers. In 2016, horses sent out by the controversial stables of Rene Allard or Tom Milici at Yonkers always warranted a look regardless of how they may look on paper and similar can be said for horses from the Chris Oakes barn at Pocono Downs. On the larger circuits, horses from the Ron Burke stable at the Meadowlands always deserve respect as do pupils from Richard Moreau at Woodbine and Mohawk. There are countless other trainers at these and other tracks that may not put up the sheer volume of starters that these barns produce but that are crafty in their own right just the same.

In my own handicapping, all things begin and largely end with the horse's trainer. Trainer data is the single most important piece of information contained in a racing program, yet not all past performances show this information the same.

The standard across all past performances for Canadian tracks is that the trainer is listed for every race line on view in the same manner that the driver is. This is not so in the U.S., where standard past performances issued by the Trackmaster company only show the trainer for today's race, without any indication if the trainer of the horse today is the same as the trainer from last week, or last month. Only in upgraded versions of the Trackmaster program is this data available, including the noting of when a barn change took occurred. This is extremely necessary in cases of sale or private transfer where there is nothing in a race line (such as a claim) that would indicate a trainer change.

The reason why this information is so important is that in my opinion there is no greater chance for form change (improvement or regression) from one week to the next than when a change in barns occurs. For the most part, horses in the same stable are fairly easy to predict from one week to the next, but all bets are off when a horse changes environments. Whether it be due to equipment changes, routine, program, call it what you want — it's not uncommon to see dramatic reversals of form shortly after these types of changes occur. I'd even go as far as to say that in some cases, a horse's past performances prior to a trainer change are meaningless once you see how a horse performs in its first start for a new barn.

To illustrate with a recent example, the 6-year-old mare *Pretty Hot* was claimed by Richard Moreau in the middle of December at Woodbine for a bottom-level tag of \$10,000 where she was race timed in 1:55:3 and the week prior was timed in 1:56:3 when racing for a slightly higher claiming tag of \$12,000. In her first start for Moreau just one week later at Woodbine, she won a conditioned event in a new lifetime best mark of 1:53:2. In this case it wasn't only the obvious improvement in time but also the manner in which it was accomplished. In the race, *Pretty Hot* went a long first over and appeared flat in the stretch before she was somehow able to find more. It was to the point where track announcer Ken Middleton called a horse he almost forgot about and stated incredulously, "How about *Pretty Hot*!" *Pretty Hot* paid 8-1 on the move first off the claim to the top barn.

In another example, there's a horse that we've become familiar with in the weekly picks section over the last couple weeks, *JJs Delivery*. This horse was claimed at Woodbine on Dec. 19 by a trainer I'm not as familiar with, but one that I should be. Trained off the claim by Rob McMillan, he shows a training record of 76 18-16-7 as of the last Woodbine program of 2016; those are some pretty gaudy numbers. *JJs Delivery* scored first start off the claim in Flamboro in a time of 1:52:1 and you don't have to follow that track daily to know how rare of a time that is and to know that this horse is clearly thriving in the new barn. When *JJs Delivery* came back to Woodbine he ended up in a race that went nearly as quick as the Preferred that night and didn't fire his best, but

his very next start out he dropped and paid \$9.90 as an easy winner. While not nearly as profitable, he stepped back up to the N/W \$14,000 level last week and jogged at 3-5.

If you don't follow a track religiously most track programs document trainer statistics over given recent time periods and it's easy to see who the producing stables are. And if you do follow a track closely, it's critical to note trainers who seemingly win out of nowhere or who were previously unheard of. Such is often the case with beard trainers – a trainer on paper, but perhaps a suspended trainer or other individual remains behind the operation.

Just as horses have their form cycles, trainers have theirs as well. I recall last winter at the Meadowlands (2015-16) when Saratoga-based trainer Kyle Spagnola took the Meadowlands by storm and started the meet by winning with 10 of his first 23 starters. This meet at the Meadowlands, barns other than Burke such as Richard Johnson, Jack Franklin and Mike Russo have all had success as top winter barns. In fact, Russo has the best first-off-the-claim numbers as anyone, going six out of 19 dating back to the fall meet of 2014 at a track where claims have become sparse.

There can be many intricacies in handicapping a harness race, but sometimes the trainer will tell the story and that's all that matters. You can play it blind from there.

SOMESIZESOMESTYLE closes in :26 and change every week and will be moving forward late; PARNU HANOVER seems to figure early on.

\$10 Win 2

Race 8: PREPARTY suffered a tough DQ here on New Years Eve for a pylon violation when he would have otherwise upset at 24-1. That field looked better than this one and I hate the likely short price but recognize he's one that should be included. SPEED AGAIN goes from Bongiorno to Gingras and I'd be shocked if he doesn't end up as the favorite in here when all is said and done; almost guaranteed to be put on the front. Has there been a bigger money burner than BLATANTLY BEST? He should have been better against that field last week and I'd have a hard time playing now at the usual short price. TITUS SEELSTER folded last out, but was a decent second two back to Hillbilly Hanover; that should count for something.

\$2 Exacta Box 6/1,2,8

Race 9: JACKSON BRADY hasn't put forth a bad effort in his four recent starts here and had good pace to offer on both ends of his mile last week. He has the post edge on all main rivals and I'd easily be inclined to play. SO TAKE THAT picks up YG for trainer Watson and that could be a dangerous combination. CITY PIE closed from the clouds last out and gets Callahan back again for Russo. DR C'S Z TAM swept last week but can he do it two weeks straight with Marcus?

\$2 Exacta Box 5,8,9

Race 10: PERSEVERANT looks like an astute claim from last week and goes from Taft to Russo in the process; bound to attract attention. LEGION OF BOOM faded a couple weeks ago when racing in less than perfect conditions and now promptly drops back to the level of his win two back; we'll see. DANCINGWITHDELIGHT was claimed away from Burke last out but retains Gingras for Bier; hasn't had any real excuse in last pair. UNIX HANOVER is fastest on paper but is compromised by the post; Brett Miller is going to take an early shot.

- The fields and post positions for all races; preliminary, finals and consolations will be drawn by lot. All races 1 mile dashes.
- A Trainer/Owner will be limited to 1 (one) declaration per division for each preliminary.
- If there is more than one division of any preliminary race, each division will race for the full advertised purse. If more than three divisions of a preliminary race are required, right is reserved to race one or more of these additional divisions on the next two racing nights.

In the event not enough money-winners declare for the final or consolations, starters in the series that are not money-winners may declare and will be drawn by lot, to obtain a full field of eight. A trainer and/or owner will be limited to only a two horse coupled entry in both the final and consolation. Any horse that changes owner or trainer after time of declaration of its first start in the series will be ineligible to race in the finals or consolations. The consolation race must have six separate betting interests or it may be canceled by the raceway.
- Purse Distribution: 50% - First, 25% - Second, 12% - Third, 8% - Fourth, 5% - Fifth (Dead Heats will be divided evenly)
- Declarations to start close at a prescribed time and date, and must be made for all preliminary, final and consolation races.
- Should circumstances prevent the racing of any or all of these races, monies paid in will be refunded to owners of horses nominated unless one race of the series has been contested. In the event of weather or other unforeseeable cancellation of any preliminary race, no make-up will be made. In the event of weather or other unforeseeable cancellation of the consolation and final races a make-up will be made the following week. All divisions of a Preliminary must be completed in order for points to be earned.
- One charted line meeting the qualifying standards is required within 30 days. If continued satisfactory performance is not maintained in races, additional qualifying line(s) will be required and subsequent declaration rejected until this requirement is fulfilled.
- There will be no refunds for horses that are not properly nominated.
- Yonkers Raceway reserves the right to refuse any horse, trainer, driver and/or owner to race in this series.
- These races will be conducted under the rules and regulations of the New York State Gaming Commission and Yonkers Raceway General Rules and Procedures.
- Judges official order of finish will be used in determining eligibility to the Final events, exclusive of all appeals yet to be decided at the time of declaration to the Final events. In the case of a positive drug test, all appeals will be excluded from eligibility to final events until they are resolved by adjudication.

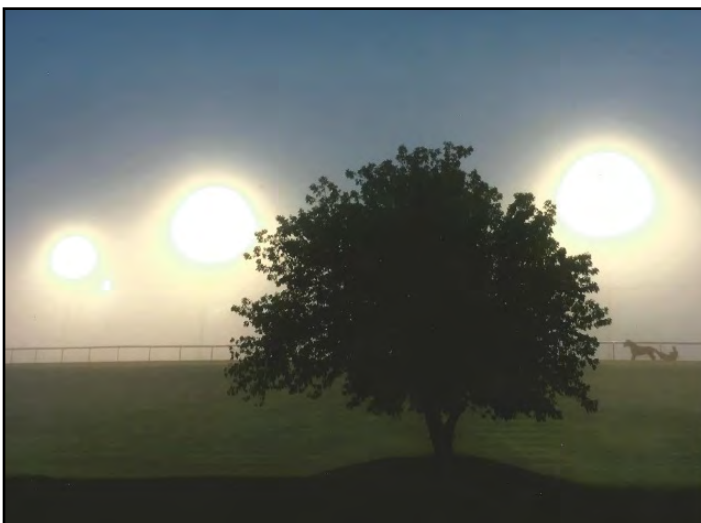
In addition, Clive Cohen and Mark Hall were named the winners in the Smallsreed Awards for excellence in harness racing photography.

Aime Choquette

Choquette dead at 102

Aime J. Choquette, one of the best known second trainers in the sport of harness racing, died Tuesday afternoon at the age of 102.

Choquette, born in Sherbrooke, QC on Oct. 31, 1914, passed away from natural causes at a nursing facility in Sherbrooke.

As a youth after World War I, Choquette's life revolved around horses as they were still utilized for daily transportation. He had jobs driving wagons and after he was finished his schooling, he found full time work at the hosiery mills, but still devoted his free time to training jumping horses.

By the 1940s, Choquette, with his brother Robert, opened the Fairplay Stable at the local fairgrounds. They turned the stable into a thriving business for years as Choquette became one of the best show horse and jumper trainer/riders in Canada.

In 1952 at the age of 38, Choquette decided to leave Sherbrooke and head south to the United States to work in

the national emerging sport of harness racing, which had just received pari-mutuel wagering in Quebec. He went to Ben White Raceway near Orlando, FL as a caretaker and learned about training racehorses.

He was promptly hired by Jimmy Arthur and Harry Harvey, who were working for the Delvin Miller Stable.

When Miller once asked for volunteers to head west to California to race some of his stakes horses, Choquette did not hesitate to go as he loved to travel. Miller soon knew he had a top man in Choquette, who helped train Kentucky Futurity winner Harlan.

Miller later selected Choquette to take his top trotter at the time, The Great Lullwater, to France to compete in the 1959 Prix d'Amerique. The Great Lullwater did not fare well in the race, but Miller saw how well Choquette did and when they returned, he promoted Choquette to second trainer.

That decision paid off over the year as Choquette worked with Miller and helped develop some of the greatest standardbred racehorses in the sport. Perhaps the shining moment of Choquette's career was when Miller sent him with the top trotting mare, Delmonica Hanover, back to France to compete in the 1974 Prix D'Amerique.

This time, Choquette made sure his mare was ready for the race, training her up and down the hills of the training center at Grosbois in preparation for the big race in Vincennes, so that she was tough and ready to take on the best trotters in the world.

And with the talented German driver Hans Fromming in the sulky, Delmonica Hanover won the Prix D'Amerique over the great French mare Une De Mai, and sixteen other rivals. Miller, in a letter written to Choquette, said "There is no doubt in my mind that she would not have won the race without all your fine work in training and preparing her in France for Mr. "Arnold" Hanger and I. Of all the races that I have won I will always consider this race the most enjoyable win of all."

Choquette worked for over three decades, mainly as a second trainer for Miller. During that span he helped with the training of world champions Dancer Hanover, Tarport Hap, Meadow Skipper, Countess Adios, Speed In Action, Tyler B and many other top racehorses.

Along with training horses, Choquette also trained and educated many caretakers who have gone on to become household names in harness racing. The list includes Andy Grant of The Hambletonian Society, John Cashman of Castleton Farms, Tom Charters of the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown, Jerry Monahan of the Red Mile, Bob Leuhrman of the USTA, Jim Moran and Walter Bonafice of Vernon Downs; and such horsemen as Don McKirgan, L. "Bucky" Waugh, Bob Yohn, Soren Landin, Tomas Nilsson, John Butenschoen and many others.

Choquette retired from training in 1984 and settled at Palm Aire Country Club, right across the street from Pompano Park, where he winter-trained with Miller for so many years.

In 1991, Choquette was awarded by the United States

Harness Writers Association (USHWA) with the Dick Baker Second Trainer Award. In 1998, the Florida Chapter of USHWA honored Choquette as the first recipient of the Delvin Miller Award and in 2010, inducted him into the Florida Harness Racing Hall of Fame. In 2014, honoring his 100th birthday, the Keystone Chapter of USHWA presented Choquette with their most prestigious honor, the Mary Lib Miller Award.

For nearly seven decades, Aime Choquette served as a positive icon in the world of harness racing. Many who had the pleasure of visiting Choquette and Miller at the stable will remember their trademark salutation when leaving... "We're glad you got to see us!"

Choquette was one of eight children and a confirmed bachelor.

Funeral details will be announced when available.

Caretaker of the Year Justin MacEachern and Call Me Queen Be.

Justin MacEachern named Caretaker of the Year

Justin MacEachern, who works in the Ross Croghan Stable, has been named the recipient of the 2016 Caretaker of the Year Award sponsored by Hard Rock Rocksino Northfield Park (HHRNP) in conjunction with the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

MacEachern, 26, has worked for Croghan for three years, and in 2016 he was the caretaker of Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace champ Call Me Queen Be, who also won the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes final as well as the first heat of the Jugette at Delaware, OH, when she set a new world record of 1:50.1h for her division.

"I am so overwhelmed by this, I can't even begin to explain it," said MacEachern. "When you take care of a horse — and I've taken care of Call Me Queen Be for two years and she was my only horse up until this winter — just waking up every day knowing that I had so much to do with the horse, it's just great. There is a whole connection there and it's an amazing feeling."

All caretakers in North America are eligible for the award, with nomination letters submitted detailing the skills and special qualities of the nominee. A seven-member panel — all of whom were former caretakers themselves — chose MacEachern as the winner. As winner of the HHRNP Caretaker of the Year Award, MacEachern will receive a cash prize of \$500, transportation, hotel accommodations and two tickets to USHWA's annual Dan Patch Awards banquet presented by Hoosier Park on Sunday, Feb. 26, at the Planet Hollywood Resort and Casino in Las Vegas, where he will be presented a trophy.

A third-generation horseman, MacEachern had been pursuing a degree in culinary management at the Art Institute of Philadelphia when the lure of the horses changed his direction.

MacEachern received several nominations, with one noting the "countless hours he has dedicated to the filly (Call Me Queen Be)" and a pacer who he needed "to use his horsemanship skills to gain the trust of"

Croghan agreed. "(Justin) has spent hours and hours with this filly giving her confidence and getting her mannered. Justin has just put his heart and soul into this horse."

Croghan also noted MacEachern's attention to detail, whether it involved shipping, shoeing, exercise schedules or equipment.

Another nominator noted that MacEachern "risked his own life" last winter when fire engulfed a barn at the South Florida Trotting Center. One of the first on the scene, MacEachern helped rescue several horses from the burning barn, later helping ship the injured to a nearby vet clinic.

MacEachern, along with all the USHWA 2016 award winners, including Always B Miki as Horse of the Year, will be recognized during the banquet on Feb. 26. Information on tickets and accommodations for the event can be found at www.ushwa.org.

Field set for Sunday's Prix d'Amerique

Eighteen trotters will compete in the 1 million Euro race, Grand Prix d'Amerique Opodo 2017 on Sunday afternoon (Jan. 29) at Vincennes in Paris, France. For the first time in many years, two North American-bred trotters are entered.

They are Wild Honey and Propulsion, both owned by the big Swedish stable The Zet Stable and trained by Daniel Redén. In fact Redén will make history in the race as he is the first trainer to send out four trotters. Besides Wild Honey and Propulsion he has Lionel from Norway and Call Me Keeper from Sweden.

French trotting sensation Bold Eagle, driven by Franck Nivard, is the big favorite to win the race for the second consecutive time. The distance is 1-11/16th miles.

Currently, standardbreds are only eligible for nomination to harness racing's highest accolade if they comply with the following strict criteria:

They must be retired from racing for five years and had a drug-free career. In addition, racehorses must have won 75 per cent of their lifetime starts, or gone undefeated in a single season campaign of 12 or more races, or been the winner of \$3 million lifetime or named Harness Horse of the Year (US and/or Canada).

Stallions must rank among the 10 all-time leading money-winning sires at their gait or have sired at least 100 \$200,000 winners or been a leading money-winning sire at his gait in three or more seasons.

Broodmares are automatically elected if they have produced a \$1 million winner and two other winners of \$500,000 OR produced a Harness Horse of the Year (US and/or Canada) and another \$500,000 winner.
