Blanchard picks the O'Brien winners

The O'Brien Awards celebrating the best in Canadian harness racing are on tap for Saturday night in Toronto. To get you ready for the black tie event, former O'Brien co-host Greg Blanchard tells us who he thinks will take home the awards.

harness racing's great
events. It is a swanky,
black tie gala that is
part Academy Awards
and part prom
celebrating the best in
the sport in Canada
from the previous year.

One of the things that makes the O'Briens great is the suspense. Every category has pre-announced finalists, but the winners aren't

announced until that night. It makes the entire event suitable for some fun table wagering and handicapping, which is why HRU asked handicapper, broadcaster, former O'Brien Award co-host and The Raceway at The Western Fair District's director of racing Greg Blanchard to give us his picks for who he thinks will win this year's O'Briens.

Please remember a few things that make the O'Brien Awards unique. Voters are asked to decide which person or horse made the "greatest contribution to Canadian racing" and to qualify for an O'Brien, horses need to make at least three starts in Canada in a year.

Here's Blanchard's picks:

Two-year-old filly pacer - Kendall Seelster vs. Percy Blue Chip

Winner: Kendall Seelster

In what I consider perhaps the closest division of the night, I give this filly the slight edge in a tight photo finish. While Percy had the better head-to-head record, Kendall Seelster came into her own in mid season and, for a stint, might have been the best filly pacer in North America.

Two-year-old colt pacer - Pedro Hanover vs. Stay Hungry

Winner: Stay Hungry

This should be another tight horse race for the O'Brien trophy between two ultra-talented sons of Somebeachsomewhere. Both compiled similar records but Stay Hungry's larger bankroll and his major win in the Breeders Crown will likely tip the scales in his favor.

Three-year-old filly pacer - Bettors Up vs. The Joy Luck Club Winner: Bettors Up

I believe there is potential for a mild upset in this division as The Joy Luck Club won plenty of supporters with several head-turning victories during the season. But, I will give the slight nod in this category to Bettors Up who took on many of the continent's best while notching a couple of Grand Circuit wins along the way.

Three-year-old colt pacer - Classic Pro vs. Mateo

Winner: Classic Pro

The Shadow Play colt looks like the solid top choice here based on the level of competition he faced during a gruelling sophomore campaign. His effort in the high-profile Pepsi NA Cup will help his case but I certainly can't diminish the dominant season that Mateo put together in Western Canada.

Older Pacing Mare - Pure Country vs. Sandbetweenurtoes

Winner: Pure Country

Another tough division to handicap that pits the well-travelled Pure Country against the local stalwart Sandbetweenurtoes. The latter was a winning machine with 12 trips to the winner's circle including a pair of sub 1:50 efforts. Voters must weigh that against the fact Pure Country



got better as the season wore on and notched quartet of major stakes victories along the way. Could go either way!

Older Pacing Horse - McWicked vs. Sintra

Winner: Sintra

You could make a strong argument for either finalist in this division. McWicked was one of the great comeback stories of the season and certainly had his moments in the spotlight, however Sintra put together some electrifying performances during his brilliant season. I think his win in the Canadian Pacing Derby on home soil is what garners him an O'Brien Award.

Two-year-old filly trotters - Kadabra Queen vs. Smoke and Mirrors

Winner: Kadabra Queen

For me, this match up of two talented daughters of Kadabra came down to Kadabra Queen's better overall record. She compiled more wins, more money and a major victory in the OSS Super Final. I give her a big chance to take home the hardware.

Two-year-old colt trotter - Alarm Detector vs. You Know You Do

Winner: Alarm Detector

Though both colts had excellent rookie seasons, Alarm Detector will likely get the edge on the strength of his head-to-head record and the fact that he is Canadian based.

Three-year-old filly trotter - Ariana G vs. Magic Presto

Winner: Ariana G

While Magic Presto enjoyed a tremendous campaign, her counterpart put together one of the greatest seasons ever by a three-year-old filly trotter and was undefeated in Canada. Ariana G is the overwhelming favourite in this category.

Three-year-old colt trotter - International Moni vs. R First Class

Winner: International Moni

International Moni enjoyed a higher profile than his fellow finalist while competing in the sport's biggest races such as the Hambletonian, Canadian Trotting Classic and Breeders Crown. That, combined with his successful record north of the border, should give him the edge.

Older Trotting Horse - Musical Rhythm vs. Odds On Amethyst

Winner: Odds On Amethyst

No one trotter emerged dominant in this division, which makes this a wide-open race. Both finalists are locally stabled and enjoyed the bulk of their success on the WEG circuit. I'll give Odds On Amethyst the call based on a heavier overall workload and his impressive six-race win

streak at the preferred level last spring.

Older Trotting Mare - Emoticon Hanover vs. Hannelore Hanover

Winner: Hannelore Hanover

Hannelore Hanover was dominant once again, including resounding wins in all five of her Canadian appearances in 2017. She has stamped herself as one of the all time great trotting mares and, in my opinion, is the slam dunk of the night!

Award Of Horsemanship - Marc Campbell vs. Guy Gagnon

Winner: Marc Campbell

Two excellent horsemen slug it out in this category – both putting up gaudy numbers in 2017. In fact, Campbell put up career-best totals for wins, average and earnings on both the driving and training side, which is what should put him over the top.

Breeder Of The Year - Marvin Katz/Al Libfeld vs. Stan Klemencic

Winner: Marvin Katz/Al Libfeld

The duo of Katz and Libfeld has become synonymous with excellence in harness racing and they continued to add to that reputation in 2017. They have developed a breeding dynasty and will be tough to knock off in this category.



Driver Of The Year - Doug McNair vs. Louis Philippe Roy

Winner: Doug McNair

While Roy enjoyed a meteoric rise in 2017 and should certainly win his share of O'Brien Awards, this was the year that McNair put it all together and enjoyed a great deal of success at the sport's top level. It's a close race, but I think McNair is a solid choice to take home his first Driver Of The Year trophy.

Trainer Of The Year - Gregg McNair vs. Richard Moreau

Winner: Richard Moreau

Slow and steady wins the race! That certainly applies to Richard Moreau who continued his amazing record of consistent production, recording his second consecutive \$2 million season. In fact, his stable banked \$3.7 million – the second best total of his career. While Gregg McNair's stable enjoyed another outstanding year, I don't think it was enough to knock Canada's reigning training king off his perch.

Future Star Award - Brett MacDonald vs. Maxime Velaye

Winner: Brett MacDonald

Both of these young gentlemen have bright futures indeed and it would be hard to go wrong picking either in this category. I believe MacDonald, who has competed in a National Driving Championship, has garnered more mainstream attention, which could be the deciding factor.


Horse Of The Year



A new kind of experimental rating

For decades, harness racing giant Stan Bergstein made predictions as to which 3-year-olds would be the sport's fastest based on how the crop raced the previous year as freshmen. These predictions came to be known as the Experimental Ratings, and the ratings were an annual industry favorite right up until the time of Mr. Bergstein's passing in 2011.

Attempting to predict the success of 3-year-olds in advance of the upcoming season almost seems sacrilegious following the work of Mr. Bergstein, but it's something whose time has come. The problem with statistical measures today in harness racing is that they're largely outdated.

For example, the USTA maintains a publicly available Average Earnings Index for sires and broodmare sires, but that doesn't quite tell a complete story. What nothing until now considers is the strength of the sire relative to the family of the dam it's been bred to, and conversely the strength of the dam's side relative to the sire. It becomes a complex circular reference. Fortunately, modern analytics allows the ability to figure all of this out.

In 2017, American Ideal and Bettor's Delight showed a near identical average of earnings for all starters. At least specific to the top speed of 3-year-olds, which is what this analysis entailed, American Ideal rated more than twice as high as Bettor's Delight and I'd contend is the more likely sire between them to produce superior levels of speed.

Although Bettor's Delight recently produced the 1:47.2 winner Betting Line, he's been aided by the fact that six of his fastest 12 starters over the past three years were out of dams sired by Western Hanover – a highly-rated broodmare sire by these calculations. Conversely, American Ideal has recently produced a number of fast 3-year-olds including Dude's The Man and In The Arsenal, while doing it with a far lesser calculating caliber of broodmare sires.

When predicting which horses will be at the top of the 3-year-old pacing ranks in terms of fastest record, there are first some basic statistics to work with. Everyone knows that top 2-year-old speed doesn't always equate to top 3-year-old speed, but the rate at which horses fail to develop their freshman season speed may be a surprise. There are 182 2-year-olds that appear on the USTA's Top Performers list from 2014 through 2016 and of those 182, only 58 appeared on the same list as a 3-year-old. What this tells us is for all of the freshman pacers there were in 2017, less than half of them will be that fast (relative to other horses in the division) the next year.

Although less than a third of starters could replicate their high level of speed between ages two and three, starters from certain sires fared better than others. And it's no surprise that starters from Somebeachsomewhere exceeded their starters from their sire counterparts. Of the 31 starters from Somebeachsomewhere that made the Top Performers list for fastest 2-year-olds, 14 of them turned the trick as a 3-year-old; far better than the overall average. Similarly, other sires have exceled in getting their starters to progress from 2 to 3, including Well Said (4 out of 9) and Dragon Again (an incredible 5 for 5, led by Fear The Dragon and Wakizashi Hanover).

While only simple math yielded these statistics, they give



some validation to what a more complex analysis for 3-year-old shows. Through this modelling, Well Said came out with the highest rating for sires to produce top speed in 3-year-olds; even higher than Somebeachsomewhere. On the surface, it may not make sense – especially when compared to an average earnings index – but the underlying data supports it.

Like the American Ideal/Bettor's Delight example, the broodmare sires connected to Well Said rate less than that of fellow Hanover sire Somebeachsomewhere. With regards to top potential speed, Well Said has done well for himself. Control The Moment was a fast 2-year-old and obviously was fast at 3, winning the Meadowlands Pace in 1:48.2. He also produced Lyon's Snyder (1:48.3), Boogie Shuffle who paced in 1:48.2 over the 5/8th's mile track at Harrah's Philadelphia, as well as multiple other sub-1:50 3-year-olds; all with a smaller number of horses to work with than Somebeachsomewhere.

The interesting thing is when doing the same type of modelling and it's restricted to top 2-year-old speed, Well Said rates below Somebeachsomewhere as well as also rating below sires Western Ideal, Dragon Again, Art Major, and others. But Well Said really improves them from ages two to three. In fact, it's partially the reason the reason why I think that the unbeaten 2-year-old multiple PASS winner Done Well (a Brian Brown trainee) has a chance to be one of the fastest 3-year-olds this upcoming year.

This same type of logic holds true for the calculation of broodmare sires, although the broodmare sire ratings carry only half the weight of that of the sire in this modelling. The reason being that since the broodmare sires are a generation removed from the sire, their genetic value is worth only half as much as a starters sire (or dam).

One of the top-rated broodmare sires for producing the highest levels of speed by my calculations is Western Hanover. While he's teamed up with super sire Somebeachsomewhere to produce Huntsville, Pure Country, Filibuster Hanover, etc., he's also been paired with lesser rated sires such as Yankee Cruiser, Stonebridge Regal and Cam's Card Shark to produce 3-year-olds in recent years with sub-1:50 speed.

A horse that I predict will be one of the fastest this year will be I'm A Big Deal; a colt trained by Chris Ryder and by Somebeachsomewhere. In addition to being by the Beach, he's out of the speedy filly Big McDeal, who in turn is by Mcardle. In a limited dataset, Mcardle only had one horse represented by him as a Top Performer and it was Boston Red Rocks. Boston Red Rocks was the fastest starter from sire Rocknroll Hanover, which makes Mcardles influence that

much worthier.

Based on the analysis as described along with some personal recalibration thrown in to account for intangibles that can't simply be picked up on pedigree analysis alone, here are my predictions for the top 3-year-old pacers of 2018 (in Stan Bergstein format):

Great racing in Paris and Florida, the evolution of decks and my biggest mistakes and success stories at sales

I received a really nice note from Clay Horner this week RE: the revised WEG/Gural integrity rule and the delay caused by the Ronnie Burke TCO2 positive. Horner is as anxious as we all are to see the new rule finalized, however the crafters of the document are more concerned with getting it done properly than speeding to a solution.

However, it is a mystery to me as to why Burke's horse was retested on Saturday and 72 hours later there is no information available as to the results. If in fact the horse came out with the same numbers, or even close, it would shed a totally new light on the subject and put a major kink into the new rule's process.

Paul Bruce asks: I know you are a fan of both thoroughbred and standardbred racing. What did you think of the big races in Paris and South Florida?

What a great weekend it was for the racing industry. A fabulous finish to the Prix d'Amerique, providing us with one of the best races we have seen from Paris in years. Plus, the \$16 million show from Stronachland (Gulfstream Park). Although very predictable, it was a social event in south Florida. We had the opportunity to see the last races of two great horses — one won easily as was expected, the other beaten by a great drive and there was no shame in his defeat. Gun Runner and jockey Florent Geroux destroyed a very suspect field in the second edition of the Pegasus, a race where you put up \$1 million for a place in the gate and don't have to name the horse till a later date, strange but true. Thinking as a trainer it's a good bet for you, not so good for the owner as there were 12 entered and all received at least \$650,000. However, that meant that eight owners lost \$350,000. I could see that if there was no big favorite it could work out better. Of note, when they were saddling Gun Runner the horse identifier checked the tattoo and nodded

his okay and with that Steve Asmussen said, "Thank God we brought the right horse." Although the undercard was lacking and the cost of admission exorbitant, the crowd was great and the beautiful people were out in force. I even spotted a few standardbed folks in attendance.

Sixteen hours later, after more reformations than I care to enumerate, the Prix d'Amerique was contested in Paris at the Vincennes Race Course, which is, in my opinion, the best racing surface in the sport. The favorite, Propulsion, an American horse bred and raised by Elizabeth Caldwell in Kentucky finished a very creditable third within a length of the winner Readly Express driven by Bjö rn Goop. Bold Eagle the morning line favorite after a gutsy stretch performance had to settle for second-place money.

Something I found very interesting is that they bet \$40 million on the entire Gulfstream card and the bet 40 million euros or \$49,350,000 on the Prix d'Amerique alone. There were no statistics on the total Paris card available.

Paul London asks: I noticed that a trainer had a trotter race exceptionally well and in a post race interview he said, "We pulled the shoes." I am confused as to what the rules are, can you shed some light on the subject?

Paul, I hate to say it, but there are no rules. It seems to me that it is up to the discretion of the racing commission in the various localities as to whether this situation is addressed. There should be uniform rules for this and many other things like medication. Hopefully this will eventually happen. For now you are at the mercy of the equipment checker most of whom are very thorough and you should check the changes that appear on the TV screen. At most of the Pennsylvania tracks you will see this horse "no front shoes." Don't look for it now because the only trainer I know of that will pull shoes in the dead of winter is me and I am in sunny south Florida writing a column for your entertainment.

Jim Romans asks: I would be very interested to know the evolution of the viewing decks at the south Florida training areas.

Bill Bigler has raised the bar on the subject. He has built the most beautiful decks the sport has ever seen, creating a warm and friendly atmosphere to the process of viewing the standardbred colts. However the origins of "the deck" were not for patrons, but for the trainers. The originals were on the training side of Pompano Park in the '60s and '70s. They were built on the track where the trainers would sit and await their training sets. The large barns of the time, Haughton, Dancer, Popfinger, Silverman, Baldwin, Beissinger, with the familiar assistants as Apples Thomas, Bones Vaughn, Tim Brown and the unforgettable Doc Morris would sit on the deck and await the grooms to bring the horses. The Deck at Sunshine Meadows in Delray Beach, FL is a particularly-active social spot on Saturdays during the winter.

Glantz reminded me that the Haughton barn was so big that they had an old rotary dial telephone on their deck to call the barn and tell them to send up the next set. The owners in those days would congregate at the track kitchen where there was a viewing stand that could accommodate lots of people as well as tables outside where you could have breakfast and watch the horses at the same time. The decks at Pompano could not have been like the ones we have now at Sunshine Meadows, not because Bigler wasn't born yet, but because of the logistics, the barns were not aligned to the track.

The decks as we know them today started there popularity in the early '90s with my barn and Per Erickson, Jimmy Takter, Continental Farms, Mark Omara, Bruce Nichols, Fred Grant and Lindy Farms (that shared my deck) Bill Popfinger, and Doug Miller.

Unlike today, the conversations were rarely about horses, but mostly about politics. I remember one conversation very well. It was on my deck and the participants were Frank Antonacci, of Crown Stable, Guy Antonacci father of Frank the Elder and Gerald, Jimmy Vigliotti, Bill Perretti, Jim Wheeler and me. We were in a heated discussion on weapons of mass destruction. My comment was that Harry, my famed assistant,

was more dangerous driving on 95 than Sadam with his WMDs.

The deck crowds were nothing like today either. A few times a year when George Segal would come to town, or Mrs Kleiberg would visit Per, they may have looked a little busy. But on a daily basis you had the Frosts, the Gerrys, and the Antonaccis, Wild Bill Perretti, and Big Jim Wheeler all denizens of south Florida. Traffic did get substantially better when Chuck Sylvester moved his operation from North to South Florida. We then saw more of the McDuffees and the Goodmans.

With the building of the Bigler deck last year and the wonderful hospitality of Tony Alagna and Stephanie and Myron Bell the Saturday on the deck has become a major event in south Florida racing. Although the place abounds with people all week long, Saturdays are a true party. There are times when at least 30 or more visitors will be watching eating and conversing. Even the sponsorship has grown to include David Reid of Preferred Equine and other titles, and Murray Brown of Hanover Shoe Farm fame and Frank Antonacci of Lindy Farm who actually shares ownership of the deck with Tony Alagna.

Toward the southern end of the track, Casie Coleman Herlihy has a beautiful new Bigler creation that a visitor may find a bit more on the conservative side than the group in the Alagna barn. Fred Grant, Paul Kelley and Rick Zeron can also provide nice viewing stands for the track. Anyone with an interest in harness racing should come visit on Saturday if you are socially inclined or during the week if you would like to learn about the business.

Phil Gray asks: I know you have bought and sold many horses in your lifetime, we all have successes and failures. What was a big mistake you made and a great buy you remember?


Unfortunately, the failures are stuck in your head, the successes you have to think about. I did make a horrible error in the mid 1970s. I was working with Don Prussak in the years after racing Songcan and he had a full brother selling at the Tattersalls in Lexington. Donnie couldn't get away so he gave me a blank check and asked me to go to Kentucky and look at the colt. It was a long time ago and I don't remember what bothered me about the colt but I couldn't pass him. Not being confident in my appraisal, I asked two friends to look at the colt also. Phil Tully of Woodstock Stud and Mort Finder master of Pine Hollow. Unfortunately they both concurred with my decision. The colt was hammered down to Delvin Miller, I think, for \$23,500, well within my budget. His name was Songflori. You know "the rest of the story".


On the positive side, when the late John Cashman was visiting Sunshine Meadows on a daily basis he would be at my barn every morning at 6:30 sharp to discuss the daily business while I had my 4th cup of coffee. He told me George Steinbrenner had a bunch of bad horses and asked me if I would try them for a few weeks to determine their future. I accepted and my first ride for "the boss" I found myself upside down in the creek that borders the eurotrack. Not a fun beginning. After a few weeks, I said to John, "Take them all back. Tell George to keep one, a colt named Express It and sell the others." Express It was a Supergill brother to Express Ride 4,153 \$1,000,000+ that had talent but needed some time to heal and mature. What made me think he would listen to me, he didn't listen to Billy Martin and there was not to be a Ronnie 2? It did get back to me that he was upset that I made a decision so quickly and didn't really give the horses a chance. I would have thought he would be thankful that I did pull the trigger that fast and didn't draw out a bad situation. I really lost track of the horses and really didn't care and then one day I was looking at a mixed sale catalog and there he was Express It almost four years old and still unraced. Great pedigree or not he wasn't the kind to demand much attention in the sale ring. The sale was not well

attended as it was a brutally hot day at the Meadowlands in July and they hammered the colt down to me for \$3,000, a \$97,000 discount on his yearling price. The colt was fresh and sound and really looked wonderful. I gave half of him to my second trainer Chris Lakata who, as it turned out, drove him in all his starts, the first of which came on October 1 at Garden State Park where he won by 7 lengths in 1:57.1. He then reeled off big margin victories at Pompano in three of his next five starts and attracted a lot of European interest as Express Ride was a popular horse on the continent. For a green horse with less than \$10,000 on his card in only 7 lifetime starts, one could never even dream that we were to receive a check in the low six figures. However, the purchasers were to be as rewarded as we were when the horse became a more than successful sire in Denmark.

Waikiki Beach impressive in NA debut; Magical Albert magical

A new shooter in the older pacing ranks caused a bit of a buzz Sunday night at Pompano Park (replays available here).

The six-year-old Somebeachsomewhere—Cyclone Beach gelding Waikiki Beach A — a former star Down Under — was making his North American debut in Pompano's top class after being sold to local interests Let It Ride Stables of Boca Raton, and the grandson of Bettors Delight didn't disappoint.

In rein to Scott Zeron, Waikiki Beach was content to sit third early through a moderate opening half of :57. 2 cut by favorite Drachan Hanover, who was sent off at odds of 1-2 on the strength of two wins, a second and a third in his most recent four starts, all raced in the top class.

With the ball seemingly in Drachan Hanover's court, driver Wally Hennessey ratcheted up the tempo to the 3/4 pole, but Zeron moved Waikiki Beach closer, despite being required to pace a :27-flat third stanza to get near the leader. On the strength of another :27-flat quarter, Waikiki Beach got past his rival by a half-length on the wire and he was an impressive 1:51.4 winner in his continental debut.

The man who announced the race – Gabe Prewitt – liked what he saw from the newcomer. "Visually, it was a very impressive performance, especially when you consider he had just a lone slow qualifier prior at Pompano after arriving in the states and missing over two months," Prewitt said. "I will be very interested to follow his career, I know his connections have high expectations and he is off to a great start for them."

Indeed, Waikiki Beach A – winner of all his 19 starts at age two and three – is an interesting newcomer to the oldedr pacing ranks to keep an eye on as the year progresses.

Making a buzz of his own at Woodbine last night was the "miracle horse" Magical Albert. The four-year-old gelded son of Mach Three out of Illusionist was born via a rare Caesarean section and barely survived the birth. After


initially being kept alive via a ventilator, Magical Albert made it to the races as a sophomore in December of last year. His debut didn't go so well, as he was distanced and thus required to requalify.

Upon returning to the races in January, Magical Albert paced progressively better miles finishing fifth, fourth, then second last week to promising debutant Larrys Petrock, who paced an explosive :26.2 final quarter to blow by the field.

But last night was Magical Albert's coming out party and under perfect Johnathan Drury rating, he gave his connections a thrill they likely never dreamed of when he was born, a maiden-breaking head victory in 1:55.4 (replay available here)

Owner Renata Lumsden was predictably thrilled. "It's been crazy, the phone has been ringing; so many people offering well wishes through tears of joy," she said. "It's amazing to finally get that first win. Albert's a very special horse, he does everything his way in his own time. We're just grateful to have him with us. Albert's happy and he loves racing."





Chris Gooden: Photographer at heart

Photography allows Chris Gooden to enjoy two of his passions.

"I love being able to make art," Gooden said. "And I'm a really tech-nerdy geek guy, so I love equipment.

"Both sides go together and make me love my job."

Gooden is in his 16th year as the full-time track photographer at The Meadows in western Pennsylvania. Earlier this month, he won the George Smallsreed Award for outstanding harness racing action photography with "Shadow Racing," which appeared in the December issue of Hoof Beats magazine.

The photograph was taken from a drone and captured horses — as well as their shadow counterparts — battling three wide just after the three-quarter-mile point of a race at The Meadows. Gooden's inspiration for the shot came from a story he read online.

"It was about a family photographer that had shot the same family for years and years," Gooden said. "They wanted to come up with something different, so they decided to use a drone for their photo. It was at the time of day when the shadows would be perfectly stretched out. They were all holding hands together, so you see this line of people and the shadows holding hands. I thought it would be really interesting if I could come up with a way to do that during a race.


"I looked at the track and could tell where I needed to fly the drone so the shadows would be falling away from the horses. With drones, when you take photos it's not like a regular camera where I can take 10 photos a second. I get one shot at it. I took a sample shot and it was okay, but there wasn't anything special about it. I adjusted the drone a little and as the horses were coming around I fired off one shot and that's the shot I ended up getting.

"I liked the fact they were three wide because it gives so much more depth than just horses in a line. I was really surprised that I got the shot that I did. It worked out perfectly."

Gooden grew up in western Pennsylvania, not far from The Meadows. He developed his interest in photography after taking a trip to Utah.

"I wanted to buy a camera to take with me because I knew it was going to be pretty," Gooden said. "I'd used my dad's growing up, but not a huge amount. So I bought a camera, I was in my 20s, and I really enjoyed it. I don't know if there was one thing about that trip, but I think I just fell in love with being behind the camera."

When he returned from his trip, Gooden began shooting sports at California University of Pennsylvania. In 1997, he

started assisting track photographer Doug Bishop at The Meadows before taking over on a fulltime basis five years later.

"I really enjoy the horse racing," Gooden said. "I love horses. I'm a big animal right's person, so it's good to see the way everyone takes care of their animals. I know a lot of people look down on that, but I see a lot more than the average everyday person on what goes on and how important horses are to people."

In addition to taking photos, Gooden is active on social media, notably with live feeds on Facebook.

"Social media has been the perfect outlet to get out as much content as possible," Gooden said. "It's worked out well. With the advent of live feeds, all that stuff, it really helps me get a lot of different things out; be able to do some video work, some photography work."

No matter the outlet, no matter the technology, Gooden is having a good time.

"I can't draw. I can't paint. The only other artistic thing I did was play drums until I graduated high school," Gooden said. "My eye for photography makes me view the world differently than most people do. I've always noticed that I pay attention more, like if I'm driving down the road or somewhere. I always look at the photography aspect of things rather than just looking at them.

"There are many, many times where I've pulled over to take photos because something looked good. It happens quite often, actually. I guess I'm just a photographer at heart."

Western Fair's Molson Pace renamed Camluck Classic

After a successful 25-year run as The Raceway at Western Fair District's signature race, the Molson Pace, will have a new name in 2018.

Introducing The Camluck Classic, a \$150,000 Invitational Pace, featuring the best older horses in North America. It will make its debut on a new date this year — Saturday, May 26 — at London, ON half-mile oval.

The new race name is a tribute to the late world champion pacer who went on to become the most prolific stallion in Canadian harness racing history and a horse that was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2003. The Raceway is very excited to announce our new title sponsor for the biggest night of racing in London — Seelster Farms of Lucan, ON.

"We thank Molson for what has been a wonderful partnership for a quarter century," said director of racing Greg Blanchard. "But change is inevitable and this marks the beginning of an exciting new chapter for this race and for racing in this part of the province. Camluck helped put this area on the harness racing map and we think it's fitting that the race be renamed in his honour."

The late, great Camluck will be immortalized as the new namesake for the Molson Pace at The Raceway at The Western Fair District in London, ON. The new \$150,000 Camluck Classic invitational pace, sponsored by Seelster Farms, will be held on May 26 this year.

Camluck hit the race track in the early 1990's under the tutelage of trainer Bob McIntosh and compiled an excellent record at ages two and three for McIntosh, who was part of the New Destiny Stable that co-owned the pacer along with Al McIntosh.

At age four, he competed as one third of the powerful McIntosh-trained trio that also included triple millionaire Artsplace and the \$1.4 million winner Odds Against. Camluck concluded his career on the racetrack with 26 wins from 69 starts and just over \$1 million in purse winnings. However, it was in the breeding shed where the handsome son of Cam Fella would truly make his mark and, in the process, he raised the bar for the standardbred breeding industry in Canada.

Camluck sired close to 2,400 foals with more than 2,000 of those making it to the races.

"When he first went to stud I was cautiously optimistic," recalls McIntosh. "He was a tough race horse and had great conformation but sons of Cam Fella hadn't really hit as sires to that point. I took a shot and bred about 18 mares that first year and it all turned out pretty well. I'd have to say he's one of the greatest pacing stallions ever."

His offspring combined for earnings in excess of \$235 million and included 635 \$100,000 winners and 28 winners of \$1 million or more.

"To have this race named after him is very special to myself and the entire group associated with the horse. As a kid, London was the track I came to most with my dad and I have a lot of fond memories over the years. I've watched this race grow and was even fortunate enough to win it so this is definitely a big deal," said Bob McIntosh.

Ann Straatman of Seelster Farms, home of Camluck for more than 20 years, shares the sentiment of the entire group.

"We are delighted to have him immortalized in the prestigious Camluck Classic at The Raceway at Western Fair District, which is our home track and thrilled to be the presenting sponsor," she said. "Camluck's legacy will live on for generations through his sons and daughters and having this race named in his honour will now add to that legacy."

The Raceway's signature night of racing got its start in 1972 and was sponsored by Labatt until 1992 when Molson took over sponsorship.

"This race is almost 50 years old now and it's amazing to look back to watch its evolution," said Blanchard. "It has become more than a race, it is also a terrific event we look forward to enhancing in the future.

We are very proud to play host to a race of this stature and are fortunate to have attracted some of very best in the sport who have produced some of the most memorable and exciting races in recent years."

Snowshoe and Blizzard finals set for tonight

Both series were open to three and four-year-old pacers who were non-winners of two-races or \$30,000 lifetime as of Oct. 31, 2017.

This year's Snowshoe Series has generated good buzz through the opening two-weeks, as a total of 32 pacers competed in the preliminary legs. The large turnout made for great racing during the preliminary legs with top results necessary to qualify for the final.

JK Pridenjoy will be seeking a series sweep for trainer Nick Surick. The four-year-old gelding built off his round-one victory by capturing his second leg division in a career-best of 1:52.4.

The second leg victory was notable for JK Pridenjoy, as he defeated a pair of first-leg winners (Burn Out Hanover,

Tremendous Play) to boost his record to a solid three for four in 2018.

JK Pridenjoy will be competing in his second Woodbine Winter Series final of the meet.

The Surick trainee raced in the Valedictory on Boxing Day and left hard from post 10, ultimately fading to finish 10th. The son of Rock N Roll Heaven—J K Pure Pearl will be looking for a little redemption and will start from post-seven with driver Doug McNair.

Tonight's final will feature five other starters who won a preliminary leg division.

Burn Out Hanover (PP4, Jody Jamieson), Tremendous Play (PP6, Mario Baillargeon) and Abbeydorney (PP8, James MacDonald) were victorious in round one, while Artofficial Flavor (PP2, Bob McClure) and Gillys Boy (PP5, Sylvain Filion) visited the winner's circle in round two.

Burn Out Hanover is one of two three-year-olds in the final. The Jack Darling trainee had a four-race win streak snapped when he finished fifth in his second leg division.

The other sophomore in the field is Gerardo (PP3, Louis Philippe Roy), who finished second in both his first and second leg divisions. The Richard Moreau trainee is winless in 11 outings, but has hit the board in seven of those starts.

Completing the field is Star Clipper (PP1, Ed Hensley), In Spades (PP9, Trevor Henry) and Casimir Quasimodo (PP10, Jonathan Drury).

One of the notable past champion's of the Snowshoe Series is Modern Legend, who won the 2012 edition. The Dave Drew trainee went on to win the 2014 Canadian Pacing Derby and finished his career with \$1 million in earnings.

The Snowshoe Series final is carded as Race 7 on Friday's card.

A series sweep is also a possibility in the Blizzard final, as Circle The Page will look to go three for three at Woodbine. The four-year-old pacing mare was sent up from the Meadows by co-owner John Sullivan to trainer Victor Puddy to compete in the Winter Series.

Circle The Page arrived at Woodbine on a nice roll and now enters the Blizzard final having won four of her last five starts, while also finishing first or second in 10 straight outings.

Jonathan Drury will again sit behind the daughter of Real Artist—Queen Marie, who last week lowered her career-mark to 1:52.4.

Eric Adams trainee Franschoek (PP10, Mike Saftic) and Moreau student Bettim Jackie (PP3, Louis Philippe Roy) were also victorious during the preliminary rounds.

Four-year-old Franschoek, who won a first leg division, nearly went all the way in her second round split, but just couldn't hold off Circle The Page and lost by a neck.

Bettim Jackie is one of four sophomores in the Blizzard Series final. She impressively came first up to win her second leg division in a career-best 1:53.2.

The Blizzard Series final is carded as Race 5.

Friday evening's 10-race card gets underway at 7:10 p.m. with a free program (available here).

NYSS 2018 schedule confirmed; Finals to be held at Yonkers

The Agriculture & New York State Horse Breeding
Development Fund has released the approved schedules for
the 2018 New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) season, announcing
that this year's \$1.8 million NYSS Finals will be held at
Yonkers Raceway on Saturday, Sept. 22. Finals for the
Excelsior Series will be held at Saratoga on Sept. 23. The
NYSS season officially begins Tuesday, May 8, with 3-year-old
filly trotters in both the NYSS and Excelsior Series divisions

at Yonkers. The schedule for the County Fair Series will be released in the coming weeks.

The New York Sire Stakes is the state's premier harness racing program for 2- and 3-year-old Standardbreds designed to stimulate the breeding, buying and racing of Standardbred horses in New York State. It is the nation's oldest harness racing program of its kind, and is administered by the Fund, which provides assistance to county agricultural societies to maintain and repair racing facilities. The Fund also contributes to both the state-wide 4-H program and the Dr. Harry M. Zweig Fund for Equine Research at Cornell University.

"The creators of the New York Sire Stakes program many decades ago had incredible vision for what was needed to grow and expand standardbred breeding in this state and support agriculture," said M. Kelly Young, executive director, Agriculture & NYS Horse Breeding Development Fund. "It promises to be another exciting season as some strong finishers from last year return to the track, and a new crop of horses begin to make a name for themselves."

The NYSS Finals features eight championship events offering \$225,000 in purses for each race. Individual race purses for the Excelsior Finals have been increased this year to \$55,000. The NYSS Consolation Finals and the County Fair Finals will be contested for \$40,000 and \$10,000 purses, respectively.

As part of its legislative mission, the Fund receives financial resources from the mutual handle and gaming at licensed tracks across the state, which it uses to provide purse money. Since the inception of racinos at harness tracks, NYSS purses have more than doubled and continue to increase annually, further spurring horse breeding while also creating more jobs and greater public involvement in Standardbred horse racing.

Big M Pick 4 pool reaches six figures

It was another good 48 hours for Meadowlands players last weekend (Jan. 26-27) as big pools led to big payouts over the two racing programs.

The Saturday night 13-race card saw a 2018-high total handle of \$2,790,201 (\$214,630 per race) pushed through the windows, highlighted by the track's signature Pick 4

wager, which had a pool that topped \$100,000 for the first time this year.

"Going into the 2018 season," said track chief operating officer and general manager Jason Settlemoir. "Our goals were getting the Pick 5 pools back to \$50,000 and the Pick 4 pools back to \$75,000. Last weekend, both Pick 5 pools surpassed \$56,000 while the Pick 4s clocked in at \$85,000 and \$101,000, respectively. Our 20-Cent Jackpot Super High Five carryover heading into Friday is at \$84,000. These large pools are obviously attracting all types of night-time players to the Meadowlands' signal."

The highlights:

- The Pick 5 (Races 3 through 7), which is a wager with a 50-cent base, paid over \$12,000 both nights
- Despite the fact that the "jackpot" was not hit, the Late 20-Cent Jackpot Super High Five still returned \$3,778 to Friday winners and \$5,259 for those who had the correct combination Saturday
- Friday's Pick 4 pool was \$85,775, meaning that the average pool size for the wager over the weekend was \$93,871
- Saturday night's 20-Cent Survivor Pick 10 saw \$19,196 in wagers, and the one lucky patron that hit it walked away with \$16,312

"The new tax laws are helping the horseplayer immensely, which, of course, helps the Meadowlands," said Settlemoir. "Friday night, one of the Pick 5 winners was in Chicago. The cost of the ticket was \$54. Last year, there would have been over \$3,000 withheld under the old tax laws. This year, the winner got the entire \$12,000. This keeps more money in the horseplayer's pocket and that is one of the reasons – along with the 15 per cent takeout and bigger payouts – that you see these pools getting huge again at the Meadowlands."

Communicators Hall of Famer Bob "Hollywood" Heyden will be in his usual role, giving out handicapping tips and conducting interviews.

Dusty H. Forbes inducted into Wisconsin Harness Horse Hall of Fame

Dusty H. Forbes was foaled in 1958 in Slinger, WI. His eligibility papers identified Slinger Creamery Company as breeder and owner. Preceding the name of the sire and dam, the USTA inserted the phrase, "Said to Be." Mr. Peter Pauly, the owner of Slinger Creamery, stood a couple stallions. Grattan Forbes was the "Said To Be" sire and one of his many broodmares, Dusty Hazel, was the "Said to Be" dam. Mr. Pauly could not prove beyond reasonable doubt who the sire and dam was, hence the little light bay would begin life with an identity problem. He looked like a Grattan Forbes with a wide front and powerful back end. You could find Grattan Forbes' offspring on most county fair race programs.

At three, the little bay was still a stud and still running free with the boys. Just another pasture ornament living the dream. Les Zahn of nearby Cedarburg was racing Dusty L. Forbes and decided he wanted another Grattan Forbes. Not wishing to tackle a semi-wild stud, Zahn hired Bob Searle Jr. out of Plymouth, WI to go to Slinger and pick him up. It was a frigid December day, a day when your face would burn, your fingers were numb, and the snow would crunch under your feet. The engine on the old '40s-something horse van slowly turned over before finally starting. The trip to Slinger was uneventful, baring a few necessary stops to add anti-freeze due to a cracked head gasket. Before he could load the horse. Searle had to catch him. He had to chase him into a barn, shut the door, get a rope around his neck, then a halter, lead him and hopefully get him up the ramp of the horse van. Dusty walked up the ramp without hesitation, ready to move on to what would be a delayed but very successful career.

Searle had to get him cut due to the "Said to Be." He broke him, jogged and trained him, and had him in his first race in July at a matinee in Plymouth. His next start was at the Outagamie County Fair in Seymour, WI. He didn't win but he had a lot of pace. Searle thought he would do at the Michigan fairs. Purses in Michigan were pretty good and overnights were open to horses from out of state. Dusty H. Forbes quickly found the winners circle at the fairs and moved on to Michigan's Jackson Raceway. Searle said, "He was the easiest horse he ever drove." No need for a whip, just talk to him and he found another gear. At the season's end, Zahn wanted to sell him and was asking \$4,000. Searle could

not come up with the money saying, "Hell, I didn't have forty cents." The reigning top driver on the Chicago scene, Bob Farrington, jumped on the opportunity. He had a big stable but could always find room for a promising green pacer with little money on his card. He shipped him home to Richwood, OH and prepped him for the '63 campaign.

His first start was in a N.W. \$3,500 at Maywood in April. By November he was racing in invitational and open paces all over the East Coast, in California, Canada, and of course Chicago. He was Bob Farrington's first sub-2:00 horse. He had 325 lifetime starts; he was one, two, or three in over 50 per cent of his starts. The \$4,000 purchase earned \$246,000. He retired to Ohio after his 14-year-old season. Thirteen years later, at the age of 27, Farrington shipped him to Sportsman's Park to lead the post parade for the Dusty H. Forbes Invitational. He told a friend "he grabbed on" when he turned him. As the story goes, another friend of Farrington's stopped in for a visit at the farm and found Farrington having a morning cup of coffee and staring out the window. The friend asked him what he was looking at and Farrington responded, "Just watching Dusty. I could sit here the rest of my life and watch him."

We can't watch him now but we can celebrate his story and his career with his rightful induction into the Wisconsin Harness Horse Hall of Fame.
