Katz speaks out against Gural Rule

The prominent owner and breeder said the rule has cost him millions and he wants Gural to drop it.

Owner and breeder Marvin Katz said he has lost millions due to the Gural Rule.

Marvin Katz said he and George Segal likely have lost millions of dollars due to the Gural Rule and they are asking Jeff Gural to scrap the rule entirely.

"We have paid an enormous price for the Gural Rule and we have no mechanism to ever be made whole," Katz said. "To continue asking us to support this misguided and inappropriate rule is wrong and I want Jeff to seriously reconsider the rule. It's wrong."

Monday, a day after Harness Racing Update (HRU) published a story about the Gural Rule (click here for full story), Katz, a Toronto-based owner and breeder, phoned and requested HRU publish his thoughts on the rule that bans

the first crop of offspring of stallions that went to stud at age four — and did not receive a medical exemption — from racing or qualifying at three tracks owned by Jeff Gural: the Meadowlands, Tioga and Vernon Downs.

"I don't speak out very often, but I feel we've reached a point where someone has to set the record straight and provide the industry with a different perspective than just Jeff's. I hope Jeff pays attention to this," Katz said.

On Tuesday, Gural issued a statement (see story on page 4) softening the rule to bar the first crop of the affected stallions only from stakes at the three tracks and lifting the ban on racing in overnights and qualifiers, but Katz requested his thoughts on the rule still be published.

"I believe that I can fairly say that myself and probably George Segal have been the two biggest victims of the Gural Rule," Katz said. "George Segal and myself were both partners in Captaintreacherous, Father Patrick, Artspeak and now, myself, I'm a partner in Bar Hopping, which George is not."

The Gural Rule has impacted all of those stallions, Katz said. Artspeak and Bar Hopping have gone to stud at the end of their three-year-old seasons and, currently, their first crops will be banned from racing in stakes owned and operated by Gural's tracks (this excludes stakes run by the Hambletonian Society, such as the Hambletonian). Father Patrick raced at four while also breeding a book of mares and Captaintreacherous returned to the races at four partly at Gural's request to keep star horses on the track longer in an attempt to draw new fans to the sport.

Segal said in the Feb. 5 article that both Father Patrick and Captaintreacherous had four-year-old campaigns that did not equal what they accomplished on the track at three and, subsequently, both lost value as stallions.

"Captaintreacherous raced at four, a big mistake. Father Patrick raced at four, a big mistake. It hurt him, even though he bred at four — raced and bred. It was a bad idea and he got half the number of mares and many less involved. Thank goodness the next year he did well, but it could hurt him. All the owners of these horses put money back into it," Segal said.


Katz said he and Segal, "have a special, unique view on this because we are the two who have suffered the greatest financial burden of anybody in the industry. Who else in any industry would have footed the bill, the millions of dollars of losses that this rule has caused us, and been silent this long? Let me stress that it is millions of dollars that will never be recovered."

Both the Hambletonian Society and the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) initially supported the Gural Rule. Gural has been critical of both organizations for dropping support of the rule after two years.

Katz said he was bothered by Gural's criticism of WEG, "and, by extension, the other racetracks in the industry that don't support the rule. Specific to WEG, they are among the best racetrack operators in North America. They have a long and firm commitment to horse racing, both standardbred and thoroughbred racing and, in fact, with the most honorable intentions possible. (WEG) has been a beacon during the turbulent times over the past five years in Ontario and the industry owes them the respect and the appreciation they richly deserve. Criticizing them for not being on the same page as Jeff Gural only tells me how inappropriate his comments are and how misguided his rule is because I believe they are among the best, if not the best, racetrack operators in North America."

Katz said that by sticking to the rule when both WEG and Hambletonian Society no longer support it suggests Gural is being a "point-prover" trying to show that "everyone else is wrong and you're right. That doesn't make a lot of sense to me on any level... When he's the only operator in North America who believes this is right and everyone else is wrong, I think it's time to step back and look at what you're doing.

"I consider Jeff Gural a friend. I have owned horses with him in the past and I have no question that he has a great love for our sport. What he did in saving the Meadowlands deserves unquestioned acclaim and acknowledgment. I am the first to do that. It was a great thing and it was important. The Meadowlands has acted as a magnet and the core of our business for over a quarter of a century now and it would be a horrific loss if we didn't have the Meadowlands going



forward in the future. Jeff Gural deserves full credit for that."

Katz said both he and Segal are investors in the Meadowlands.

"I'm a partner with Jeff because it's the right thing to do and because ultimately it will prove to be a good investment," Katz said.

But he also points out that Gural has consistently asked people to support the Meadowlands and "race their horses there for lesser purses because of the importance of the Meadowlands" and that both he and Segal are two of the biggest supporters, "because we believe it is the right thing to do for our horses and the right thing to do for the industry.

"(Yet, Gural) always wants people to think about the lack of horses available to race at the Meadowlands and the increasing lack of horses throughout the industry. Now you are going to have some of the great horses over the last half dozen years being barred from racing (in stakes) at his racetracks... when you're short of horses? That makes no sense. And, as an investor at the Meadowlands, that even makes less sense to me. I think it's bad business."

Katz said it is interesting to look at the Gural Rule from a thoroughbred perspective.

"Do you believe that the thoroughbred American Pharoah was one of the great stars that we've had in the last 25 years?" Katz asked. "I think it's unquestioned in the last quarter century. Well, he retired at the end of his three-year-old year because that was the appropriate business decision made by the ownership of the horse. There was no criticism or recrimination from the thoroughbred industry. I put this question to Jeff Gural: Will he not permit any offspring from American Pharoah to ever race at the two races at the Meadowlands? If he did, the thoroughbred industry would think it was bizarre, the most outrageous commentary ever made. No one is going to bar an offspring of American Pharaoh when his first crop comes to the races. It's ridiculous to contemplate that... Then why are these (standardbreds) being held to a different standard than American Pharoah would be? If he says that he is not going to allow American Pharoah's offspring to race at the Meadowlands, which I doubt very much he would say that, the thoroughbred industry would think it was scandalous, outrageous, and unthinkable. And no other racetrack in the world would ever even suggest that."

That said, Katz said he agrees with Gural that the sport needs stars on the track to attract new fans.

"I'm in full agreement," Katz said. "We do need stars and they are a great marketing attraction... "We engaged in racing Captaintreacherous (at three) in an aged race. We did it again this year with Bar Hopping to provide some excitement and marketing opportunities at the Meadowlands."

But, Katz said, standardbreds that only race through their three-year-old seasons still provide plenty of opportunities to draw new fans based on the frequency in which they typically race.

"By the time a horse of Captaintreacherous or Father Patrick or Artspeak reach their level of achievement, it's the end of his three-year-old year and they probably raced close to 30 times. They have been to numerous racetracks, in some cases raced in heat racing and have 30-plus races on their cards. Most thoroughbreds don't get 30 races in a five or seven-year career," Katz said. "Our very elite three-year-olds race a tremendous number of difficult races in their two and three-year-old years and how much gas do they really have left in the tank? They are living, breathing things and we have to respect that."

Katz said he has little to lose in speaking out against the Gural Rule.

"What's (Gural) going to do... bar me and my horses from the Meadowlands?" Katz asked.



Gural's statement on Gural Rule

The Gural Rule has been tweaked to allow offspring of restricted stallions to race in overnights.

Over the weekend it became clear to me that most people had assumed that the Stallion Restriction Condition, "Gural Rule", only applied to stakes races at the Meadowlands, Vernon and Tioga, when in fact the intent was to apply them to stakes, qualifiers, baby races and overnights.

To be honest, I really thought in the long run this would help the breeders because, in my mind, we have to create new younger people to replace those of us, including myself, who are not going to live forever. Having said that, obviously most breeders do not agree and the last thing I want to do is fight with my friends in the industry who stepped up with sponsorships to help keep our stakes program in place while we wait for common sense to prevail in New Jersey and allow us to have expanded gambling. I realized it was important for all of us to work together and I have instructed Nick (Salvi) to revise the conditions so that the restriction only applies to stakes races at the three tracks and not anything else.

While I recognize that the rivalry last year between Always B Miki, Wiggle it Jiggleit and Freaky Feet Pete was not a direct result of the rule, it did show, in my mind, how important it is to have major races contested with horses that people have an allegiance to and recognize the names as opposed to our two-year-old stakes and some of our three-year-old stakes where the participants are mostly known only in the industry.

On a separate note, I want to thank the industry for stepping up to help support Sam McKee and his family during this difficult time. I understand to date the GoFund Me page raised over \$126,000 which is truly amazing (the total was up to nearly \$136,000 as of Thursday evening).

Sam's illness was a shock to everyone as he is probably the best liked person and the most talented announcer out there. He has worked tirelessly for the industry and especially the Meadowlands and our thoughts and prayers are with him and his family while he embarks on the long road to recovery.

For our part we have advised the family that Sam will be on the payroll for the foreseeable future and that anything that the family needs we are there for them.

Live drives and Pompano Pick 5

One of the things that makes harness racing unique from thoroughbred racing is the manner in which the races are run. More specifically, the racing style and greater levels of influence in the outcome of a race that drivers have over their jockey counterparts.

In thoroughbred racing, the best horse typically wins. You can define 'best' as subjective as you like, but, in general, you know what you're getting and each horse is able to run its own race in a thoroughbred event. In harness racing, this isn't the case, and it's one of the things that can sometimes be maddening for bettors.

In a harness race, the success of all horses is to some degree dependent on their driver. No matter how well you handicap a race, it's ultimately the driver who will decide to leave or take back at the start of a race, tuck or press on, yield or park, go first over or sit in, and so forth.

As a bettor, I realize that the very nature of a race doesn't lend itself for every horse to be second over or sit a pocket trip every race, so I largely rely on the drivers to put seemingly contending horses in positions to compete. All I ask when backing a horse is that it's given a chance to compete honestly. If a horse I back isn't good enough or fast enough when given the chance then so be it, but at least I'll feel better knowing that a fair try was given.

Fewer things are more frustrating than seeing your horse get a no-shot trip; either by never leaving the wood or by being hopelessly far back. For handicappers, we need to determine not only a horse's capability, but also what the driver's intent will be with that capability on a given night given the circumstances.

Spotting situations where a driver is willing to be uncharacteristically aggressive with a horse are generally strong wagering opportunities. This occurs when horses are live, and the drivers know it. As one would reasonably suspect, horses are more likely to be given a strong try when paired with a driver known for that type of style as opposed to one who isn't. At Yonkers for example, a horse is more likely to be put up front early in a race by Jason Bartlett than it would be by the more patient Steve Smith. Especially at the smaller sized tracks such as Yonkers, eventual race winners are found on or close to the front in many more races than not.

There are other times when instead of a top catch driver, any catch driver may indicate that a horse is in line for live drive. Driver changes have always been popular angles and rarely are they as profound when the driver change involves the trainer of a horse or a lesser known commodity to one of the tracks standard catch drivers. These instances squarely



represent positive intent from the connections and a horse in these situations can be expected to be driven as such.

More often than not, horses are logically driven a more aggressive steer when they rate favorably on paper against the rest of the field. With the exception of a small number of one-move type horses who truly race better when coming from off a helmet, most all other horses are versatile enough that they can show a new speed dimension whenever the driver wants it. I'm never hesitant to back a horse that looks to be lacking early speed in the program if I feel he's one of the best horses in a given race. Drivers know this and have a way of inventing speed; they'll always find ways to get live horses into play.

In some cases, a horse may need to prove itself first, prior to a driver giving him an optimal drive. Such was the case at Woodbine on Jan. 30 in a N/W 1 Pace. In the race, newly turned three-year-old Talbot Romeo debuted three week's prior as a 20-1 longshot from post 9, driven by Mike Saftic. Finding himself 15 lengths back halfway through the race, he closed with a flurry in :27:1 (very fast relative to the condition) to finish fifth beaten by only four lengths. On this night, knowing what he now had, Saftic was back aboard and took no chances and gunned to the front, re-took and jogged en route to an eight-length victory all while being hammered down to 7-2 from a 15-1 morning line.

On the other hand, drivers tend to tread lightly when it comes to horses making their first start off layoffs, off scratches, driving for low percentage stables or while driving a horse in elimination race where there is no incentive to win. As with anything, each race is its own puzzle and needs to be looked at individually.

Sometimes as a bettor in this sport you need to create your own luck and that will happen as horses wind up in favorable positions throughout a race. Being on the side of an honest drive is half the battle.

Horse to Watch:

Lightly raced Ava N Ella debuted last week at the Meadowlands and crushed her foes, winning in 1:53:2 by eight lengths for the connections of driver Corey Callahan and trainer Mike Russo. Previously trained in Canada by Tony O'Sullivan, this four-year-old gray Western Terror mare has the look of a pretty good one and is back in-to-go Friday night in race 11 at the Meadowlands.

Race 1: ZORGWIJK IMPACT drops down a notch and lands a driver who is familiar in these amateur races; can easily win with that end of December form. A CROWN FOR LINDY has jogged in her last pair but now it's the outside post and a provisional driver; won't be as easy. HANRAHAN enters in for a tag and looks to fit on paper; won at the Meadowlands last year and that should count for something against this group. CREAMPUFF MACDADDY is a half million dollar career earner but recent form hasn't been kind; makes second start over the track.

Race 2: STRIKE A CORD is one of two 3-year-olds in here and was most recently in a qualifier won by former world champion McWicked (who makes his return to the races at Pompano on Sunday). This McArdle filly showed some promise early in the 2-year-old season as a freshman and if anything, maybe that 1:51:2 Q she was involved in will have her ready to go in first start since September. CAITLIN'S ROMANCE is the other obvious choice in this race. She's done no wrong in her two races since returning and her and the top choice should have it to themselves.

Race 3: What a field. CHIP CHIP PAGE was actually half decent last out when he ended up going first over in a race where he started from post 7. He was involved in noticeably fast mile four back and it's hard no not see him being up close in this one; must include. ILLUSIONSNDREAMS used to pretty good but it looks like time is catching up to this gelding. Bound to show speed but hasn't been able to carry it of late. only need to be close enough.

Race 4: REVENANT had no shot last out from the outside and now catches a soft looking field while moving inside; bound to figure. TROTTIME DIAMONDS exits the same race as #2 but wasn't exactly stellar and his career record is now 0 for 21. TERROIFICVELOCITY gets Lasix for his debut and may need not be much to threaten against these at first asking; it's hard to make a case for anyone else.

Race 5: It's been one thing or another since arriving in South Florida for TWO DAYS FINALE but I think he can go with these. He had late trot in his Pompano debut two back and then was favored next out against slightly lesser when he broke; can win this. SAVIN ROCK has raced good enough to win in his few recent tries but hasn't been able to break through yet; needs the ideal setup. THUNDERCREST might end up odds-on despite starting from the outside; had the pole in his most recent and still may need to go a tick faster. SUMMIT CITY FRANK could be any type as a newcomer from Hoosier; might be a longshot surprise.

Pine Tab snaps 0-for-108 streak

The lovable loser found the winner's circle Monday at Yonkers for the first time in nearly four years.

Pine Tab possesses many desirable qualities as a trotter. The 8-year-old gelding is sound and can be counted on to make scheduled starts. He eats heartily and trains vigorously, showing every sign that he enjoys stretching his aging legs each morning at Yonkers Raceway.

The bay son of Cantab Hall out of Pine Career is so well-mannered that those entrusted with his care view him as a pet. If he has character flaws, it would be that, according to trainer Doug Rothlein, he is "a bit of a ham" and "a bit of a spoiled boy."

Then again, his human connections may be to blame. They have been known to overindulge him with his favorite treats, green apples and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.

According to Scott Zeron, who started driving him recently, Pine Tab is an old pro in many regards. He starts well and can be relied on for a strong, dependable gait – for a time. Yet, when the race is there to be won, Pine Tab does not win. Well, hardly ever.

How rare have his visits to the winner's circle become?

He snapped a 108-race losing streak when he clipped heavily-favored Madhatter Bluechip by a neck in the second race on Monday night at Yonkers. Not only did he earn his first win since April Fool's Day of 2013, but he lowered his lifetime mark to 1:57.2, two seconds faster than he had gone as a three-year-old at The Meadows.

Joel Rothlein, Doug's 88-year-old father who owns Pine Tab under the Domino Stables banner with partners Arthur Monaco and Luigi Errico, describes the outcome as a "major

miracle."

Pine Tab rewarded his relatively few backers by returning \$19 for a \$2 win wager. The odds would have been dramatically higher if bettors could have seen beyond the program page. After the April Fool's Day celebration in 2013, he dropped his last 22 starts that year, was winless in 32 starts in 2014, came up empty 20 times in 2015 and went 0-for-31 last

season.

He was 0-for-3 this year before Monday's startling turnaround in an optional claiming allowance for non-winners of \$5,000 the last five starts or a \$12,500 claiming price. Pine Tab was in for the tag. Not surprisingly, there were no takers.

No sooner had the breakthrough occurred than the phone calls started. Joel, accustomed to telling family members and friends Pine Tab's latest tale of woe, began each conversation, "If you are standing, please sit down."

Joel said of previous discussions, "It got to the point where it was a funny story. He'll never win. He'll never win. He'll never win."

Pine Tab's recent breakthrough represented only his seventh victory in 152 lifetime starts with 27 second-place finishes and 24 third-place showings. The winner's \$5,750 share of the \$11,500 purse increased his career earnings to \$167,850, including \$27,689 last year.

Doug views Pine Tab as a classic underachiever, for his bankroll points to some talent.

"The will to win," he said, "that's tough to give a horse."

According to Doug, Pine Tab responds eagerly when asked to take off after the pace-setter. Then, just as suddenly, he is not so aggressive.

"He'll race right up to a horse that has the lead," he said, and kind of be happy just being out there with him." Doug pointed to Zeron's skillful driving as making a difference. Zeron, though, credited the horse.

"He was very enthused going down the lane," he said of the victory that had been so elusive. Pine Tab had finished sixth, second, and fifth in his previous three starts this year.

Pine Tab has been full of himself since Monday. Joel said he was so stirred up that he took him for an extended walk the next day. "It was like he was king of the hill," the father said. Doug said the trotter resumed training with "a bit of an attitude."

Joel worries now that Pine Tab might be claimed. His son severely doubts that. One for the last 109 is hardly compelling.

"Pretty much everybody has driven him. Every trainer has watched him. If they thought they could move him up, they would have claimed him by now," Doug said. "So he's left to us."

And they are only too happy to have their lovable loser.

Who will be the next game-changing stallion?

A look at the new stallions whose progeny will soon be flooding racetracks across North America.

Prices at the 2016 yearling sales were through the roof; Lexington Selected topped its all-time high by almost 25 per cent, while Harrisburg beat 2015 by 25 per cent. Still, it wasn't a very exciting year when it comes to new blood at the sales. The same goes for stallions racing their first crops, and newly retired stallions. This year should offer fireworks on all three fronts.

Last year, **Chapter Seven**, the sire of Walner, was the only notable addition on the track. There weren't any high-profile new faces at the sales, and **Sebastian K**, **He's Watching**, **Artspeak** and **Bolt The Duer** were the best of the newly retired.

Hambletonian winner **Trixton**, an exquisitely-bred son of Muscle Hill, who sells his first crop this year, is held in high regard. He stands in New Jersey, a breeding desert of late, for the relatively hefty — considering his location — sum of \$12,000. He bred a full book of mares both years and, considering his own and his sire's accomplishments, will command high prices from those wishing to compete on the Grand Circuit.

Trixton's paternal brothers, the first-year sires **Southwind Frank** and **Bar Hopping**, will be viewed thorough a similar lens, while **E L Titan**, who now resides in New York but sells his first Ontario crop this year, will be cut some slack and given the benefit of the doubt by many buyers. The quest for Muscle Hill's extender(s) will be relentless.

A new stallion that lacks Trixton's top line pedigree is the highly-decorated pacer **Sweet Lou**, who stands in Pennsylvania for \$7,500 and, like Trixton, sells his first crop this year. While Trixton only raced 19 times and saw his sophomore season limited to 11 starts by injury, Lou made 74 starts, was a world record holder at two and five, and is the only pacer to win his division as a freshman and again at age five. He was fast early and late, tough and long lasting; Lou had it all.

The difference is that Sweet Lou needs to outdo his sire by quite a bit. Yankee Cruiser, who spent four years in Ohio, six in Pennsylvania and is currently back in the Buckeye State, is no Muscle Hill. Lou is essentially a one-off. Dancin Yankee is the only other millionaire by 17-year-old Yankee Cruiser, and the Gerrity is his only open stakes win. Darena Hanover won the Jugette, while Marty Party, Hare Craft and Yankee Bounty are other solid pacers by Yankee Cruiser.

Grandpa Artiscape gave us Rainbow Blue, Maltese Artist and Escape The News, but Yankee Cruiser is his only siring son worth mentioning. Sweet Lou, the Great White Blaze and a half-brother to Bettor Sweet, will have his work cut out for him in that respect.

Father Patrick, the two and three-year-old champion who stands in Pennsylvania for \$20,000, will sell his first abbreviated crop of New Jersey eligible yearlings in 2017. I don't imagine his connections would be upset if this full brother to Pastor Stephen matches his sire Cantab Hall's output, but the latter is having some issues right now and it may be up to Patrick to extend him. **Uncle Peter**, who bred full books in Ohio his first two years and sells his first crop in 2017, is another possibility for that role, as is Explosive Matter. But it looks like the burden will be on Patrick.

The same burden may fall on Andover Hall's double millionaire son **Creatine**, who has been retired to stud in Pennsylvania for a \$6,000 fee. Creatine's paternal brother Donato Hanover has been a terrific filly sire but Andover Hall needs a top tier grandson to carry him forward. Perhaps the winner of the Kentucky Futurity and Breeders Crown will make that happen.

First year stallion **Betting Line** is by Bettor's Delight, who led the all-pacer money list for several years, until Somebeachsomewhere pushed him back to second in 2016. A very successful son of Cam's Card Shark, Bettor's Delight's progeny has excelled on the Grand Circuit, in restricted programs in New York, Ontario and Pennsylvania and with aged stock on all levels.



The thing is, for all his success 19-year-old Bettor's Delight has not been a sire of sires in North America; the cupboard is surprisingly empty. **Betterthancheddar's** first New York crop races this year, and that may change the perception of his daddy, but for now, Betting Line, who stands in the demanding Pennsylvania market for \$10,000, must prove that Bettor's Delight is a sire of sires and extend him.

Breeders Crown, Tattersalls, Messenger and Adios winner **Racing Hil**, from the first crop of Bettor's Delight's full brother Roll With Joe, will be looking to outdo and extend his daddy as a rookie stallion in Ohio.

First year stallion **Always B Miki** is a one-off in the mold of Yankee Cruiser. His daddy, Always A Virgin, is a successful regional stallion in the Indiana program, but Miki, who did most of his Grand Circuit damage in his aged form, and Color's A Virgin, who won the Jugette and Nadia Lobell, accounted for almost all of his open success. Was that due to lack of opportunity, since most owners are content to stay within the sire stakes program? Maybe. A big plus is that Miki's sire is by Western Ideal, and hence he's a paternal brother to Rocknroll Hanover. And his grand sire is the great Western Hanover.

Regardless, Miki, the fastest pacer ever, who stands for \$12,500 - \$8,500 more than his sire - in Pennsylvania, and has filled his first book, will be selling to Grand Circuit buyers and must be successful on the big stage in North America to justify his high profile status. If he can produce some that mirror his spectacular coming from ninth at the half, second-place finish in the Pace he'll be all set.

First crop racetrack star **Rock N Roll Heaven** was a very logical extender for the ill-fated Rocknroll Hanover, but it just hasn't happened. He has produced some nice fillies, but nothing resembling an extender on the colt side. He's back in New York this year.

So, it's up to double millionaire **A Rocknroll Dance**, who set multiple world records and won the Governor's Cup, Pace and CPD, or almost millionaire and multiple world record holder **Pet Rock**. Both of them race first crops in 2017. Ten-year-old veteran Rockin Image, the sire of Freaky Feet Pete, is another possibility. Panther Hanover also races a single digit first crop from New York and Rockin Amadeus is standing in Ohio.


ARNRD and Pet Rock both bred close to 140 mares in each of their first two years, with the latter having a better success rate. Dance has 69 in this year's initial racing crop, while Pet Rock has 99. Rocknroll will have an opportunity to carry on through his sons, but it's a chancy proposition at this point.

Hambletonian winner **Royalty For Life** is another member of the most exciting first crop sale class in many years. His sire, the 14-year-old Credit Winner behemoth RC Royalty, has been successful in the NYSS – second among three-year-olds and fifth among two-year-olds in 2016 – but RFL has proven to be a one-off when it comes to the open realm. Like so many others, the Ontario stallion will be attempting to outdo and extend his daddy. And it will be up to him, Dejarmbro, Archangel, Crazed — somebody — to keep 20-year-old Credit Winner from dead-ending.

First year Ontario stallion **Control The Moment**, the winner of the Metro and Meadowlands Pace, will attempt to redeem the reputation of his daddy, Well Said, a high volume disappointment who has relocated to Ohio. Also, paternal brother **Tellitlikeitis** sells his first Indiana crop this year.

So Surreal, who was retired due to injury at two, will present us with the first crop by a son of SBSW to race. He bred 130 mares in New York in 2014 and generated 60 registered foals from that group. And paternal brother **Captaintreacherous** will create lots of excitement when he sells his first crop in the fall. He's the only superstar by his sire to this point and may challenge daddy in that regard. Perhaps Huntsville or Downbytheseaside will become sophomore stars. Also, Sunshine Beach will sell a large first crop of Ontario breds in 2017.

This should be a great year for the progeny of the agents of new blood on the track and at the sales.

OR, which oversees the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program among other industry programs, has added three additional director positions to the board as the organization's governance continues to evolve. One of these positions has been assigned to a regional racetrack representative and as such, OR has reached out to Kawartha Downs, Hiawatha Horse Park, Leamington Raceway and Dresden Raceway to request that they nominate representatives to be considered for this role. Two additional director at large positions have been approved and a process to select candidates is being developed. A full list of current directors can be found here.

In addition to these changes to board composition, OR is pleased to announce further strengthening of the governing framework of the board of directors. A Code of Conduct for directors has been approved. It can be found here.

In addition, three board committees have been formalized including an executive committee, a governance and nominations committee and a strategic planning committee. The board of directors will also be supported by three advisory groups: one representing horseplayers and customers, one representing equine welfare and one representing standardbred horsepersons.

Representatives from industry associations will be invited to participate in the advisory group structure, including those not represented at the board of directors' level. 
