New York announces Glaucine positives

A year-long investigation produced 55 positive tests for Glaucine — including 11 horses from seven trainers that forced disqualifications that require purse money to be returned — but Richard Johnson is the only trainer with a horse that tested positive at a high enough level to trigger a fine and suspension.

The New York State Gaming Commission

(NYSGC) announced Thursday (Feb. 16) results of a year-long investigation into a rash of Glaucine positives at some of its

racetracks. In all, there were 55 positive tests for alkaloid Glaucine in the urine and plasma of racehorses exceeding 100 pg/ml between Jan. 16, 2016 and Jan. 12, 2017.

Twenty-six trainers had at least one positive test for Glaucine above that threshold — 37 positives came at Yonkers Raceway, nine at Monticello, three at Buffalo and six at thoroughbred track Finger Lakes — but just one trainer, **Richard Johnson**, was given a fine and suspension.


Johnson twice raced the horse Rubber Duck at Yonkers Raceway with Glaucine levels far greater than 1 ng/ml. In addition to the disqualification and purses of \$61,660 to be returned, Johnson was handed a 45-day suspension and \$1,500 fine.

The NYSGC found nine other horses with Glaucine levels higher than 500 pg/ml, but less than 1 ng/ml. For these cases, the Commission ordered that the horses be disqualified from the applicable races and any purses won by the owners of those horses be returned, totaling \$103,530.

The trainers with horses testing positive for Glaucine between 500 pg/ml and 1 ng/ml are: Johnson (World Cup and Canbec Kingkazimir); Ron Burke (Journeyman and Allbeef N Nobull), Mark Ford (Journeyman, two weeks after Burke had a Glaucine positive with the same horse), Julie Miller (FrankandJoanne), Gilbert Garcia-Herrera

A NYSGC press release said, "as is standard practice, all 55 impacted horses were immediately put on the Stewards List, which prevents a horse from entering any future races until the horse is tested and found negative for the presence of any illegal substance.

"Glaucine, also known as Boldine Dimethyl Ether or 1,2,9,10-Tetramethoxyaporphine, is a potent drug with the potential to affect race performance by means of its anti-inflammatory, antitussive, bronchodilatory and hallucinogenic properties. Glaucine has not been approved as a drug for any use by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. The Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) does not include Glaucine in its Uniform Classification Guidelines for Foreign Substances."

The release said the NYSGC began finding elevated Glaucine levels in January 2016, but reserved issuing rulings pending further investigation. Over the last 12 months, the NYSGC and the New York Drug Testing and Research Laboratory have collaborated with other jurisdictions and national racing organizations to conduct research on Glaucine, which may be naturally found in wood shavings used to line horses' stalls.

New research conducted by New York and Pennsylvania officials substantiate that Glaucine levels of 500 pg/ml or greater in a horse on race day indicate that the horse was introduced to a potentially efficacious dose of the substance on race day. Therefore, the Commission's Rule 4120.2(n) applies, which states that no drugs or medications – other than those specifically exempted — may be administered by any means within one week of the scheduled post time of the race in which the horse is to compete and that it is the trainer's responsibility to prevent such ingestion within such one-week period.

Most recently, the Racing Medication & Testing
Consortium's (RMTC) Glaucine Task Force and Science
Advisory Committee – both of which include New York State
Equine Medical Director Scott E. Palmer, VMD –
recommended applying two thresholds for the presence of
Glaucine in a racehorse. The Commission's actions now – and
going forward – are based on these standards and
disqualifying a horse that violates such thresholds.

The Commission will continue to place horses that test in excess of 100 pg/ml for Glaucine on the Stewards List and require those horses to test below such concentration before being permitted to race again. Horses testing in excess of


500 pg/ml will incur penalties as described above.

"New York is once again leading the way when it comes to preserving integrity in horse racing," said NYSGC executive director Robert Williams. "The Commission took deliberative action based upon solid research to hold trainers accountable for substances found in horses under their care. We call on other jurisdictions around the country to follow suit to send a clear message: we will tolerate nothing short of fair and safe horse racing."

Equine medical director Dr. Palmer said environmental contamination is avoidable by the adoption of simple stable management practices:

- Stalls should not be bedded with bulk wood shavings that may contain tulip poplar material on a chronic basis or during the week that a horse races.
- Do not administer any product or plant material, whether purchased online, compounded or otherwise, that may contain Glaucine.

Joining Forces in Ontario

For many years, the Forest City Yearling Sale and Canadian Yearling Sale competed over Canada's top yearling market. Now the two sales are coming together to present one sale in the hope of providing the best possible buyer and seller experience.

A new spirit of cooperation between Canada's two biggest yearling sales has resulted in the Forest City Yearling Sale (FCYS) joining forces with Standardbred Canada's Canadian Yearling Sale to produce a single, two-day select sale. An agreement in principle was, fittingly, announced on Valentine's Day (Feb. 14).

Principals from both sales say consignors and buyers should benefit from a combined auction to be called The London Selected Yearling Sale that will held Oct. 14-15 at The Western Fair District's Metroland Media Agriplex in London, ON.

For many years, the two held competing yearling sales on different weekends in different locations — FCYS at the Agriplex and the Canadian Yearling Sale at Flamboro Downs

in Hamilton.

"The question has always been: 'Why are there two sales?'
That was a hard one for people to really answer," said Dan
Gall, CEO of Standardbred Canada. "What we're trying to do is
offer opportunity to showcase the best of the yearlings
under one roof and at one sale."

FCYS president Ann Straatman said declining yearling numbers in Ontario in recent years means a single, strong sale is the best way to go for all parties.

"Customers have been asking for this for awhile now. I'm hoping the consignors will be as on board as the customers are," Straatman said, adding the division of duties between the two companies will play to each other's strengths.

Straatman will oversee site management — coordinating setup, stalls, the auction block, hiring local help, etc. — while Standardbred Canada, led by sales manager Heather Reid, will handle the administration — taking in sale entries, coordinating the inspections, creating the catalog and running the sale office on the sale days.

"I think it's a true partnership where we've delegated and compartmentalized our roles and have some true savings and efficiencies by doing so," Straatman said.

Gall called the partnership, "a win-win not only being able to partner with Ann (Straatman) and her team, but also for those that now only have to go to one sale to do their shopping. It's almost like a one-stop shop."

The sale will be the same weekend the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Finals will be held on Oct. 14 at Mohawk Racetrack.

"Hopefully, that will attract people who wouldn't necessarily come into the province for that weekend,"

Straatman said. "We will accommodate those wanting to attend the races as well as those actually participating in the races. We'll make sure everyone is able to get away in time and there will not be an interruption from the sale. It will likely create a longer day — depending on the entries — on the Sunday."

Straatman said the combined sale will benefit from the fact that both sales were already similar in structure.

"Standardbred Canada runs their sale much like ours and very efficiently," Straatman said. "I think Heather Reid has done a great job over the years and has a great staff support behind her... I have complete faith in their abilities to run the sale efficiency. There's nothing major that still needs to be decided."

Both Gall and Straatman said having the sale in London was the obvious choice.

"The airport is right there, there's many hotels very, very close. There is lots of restaurants, the racetrack has Friday night racing," Straatman said. "There were so many reasons why the Western Fair District is a one-stop place for sales and shows. The Agriplex itself has just undergone a huge renovation and it is a state-of-the-art facility with everything we could ask for."

Straatman said the deal to run a joint sale is just a one-year agreement for now to see how the arrangement works before deciding whether to enter into a longer-term

contract.

"So far, it has been moving along very smoothly," Straatman said, though both she and Gall admitted there's a lot of work to do.

"We really do have to roll up our sleeves and say, 'What's best for the sale? What's best for the industry?' We have to keep that focus on our customer," Gall said. "This is a very customer-focused decision."

In a press release announcing the merger, Reid said she was "looking forward to working with our sellers and Forest City Sales to present a best in class Yearling Sale."

Gall said he liked Reid's comment and hopes the new partnership will prove to be, "something that we can all be proud of, we can all promote and rally around... We want to create an event that's going to get not only the horse-buying public excited, but, hopefully, the general public excited about what our sport is all about and get some interest in generating outside of the norm of those horse buyers."

Bring back winter series racing

From the perspective of nothing else other than a fan of the sport, the winter months in harness racing aren't exactly kind. With nearly all stakes horses on the shelf until the spring, week to week racing in the winter months becomes a tireless grind of watching the same overnight horses race each other week in and week out. And the quality of racing is less than what we see in months later in the year.

This wasn't always the case, however.

For many years, up until just recently, the premier winter tracks in the U.S. and Canada — the Meadowlands and Woodbine — had established a long series of late-closing events that always managed to keep the emerging and current stars of the sport on the racetrack through the winter months. And in the process, it kept fans of these tracks engaged through an otherwise slow time of the year.

Though now a distant memory, Meadowlands winter stakes such as the Presidential, Complex, Cape & Cutter, Clyde Hirt and Exit 16W, just to name a few, were always fan favorites. Similarly, on the Woodbine front, winter stakes that included the Glory's Comet, Lifetime Dream and the General Brock produced top trotting stars that often would go onto bigger things. At one point, the Meadowlands had 10 different winter series alone between January and February, and this year they had none. Woodbine only had two small series in January this year and then has nothing on its stakes calendar until May.


As a fan, these winter series races created a real sense of excitement with ongoing compelling storylines. It allowed us to see marquee matchups, watch developing rivalries and gave us a reason to root for horses in addition to also betting on them.

My earliest memory of winter racing at the Meadowlands was Red Bow Tie winning the Presidential back to back in 1998 and 1999. From there, I recall Gallo Blue Chip racing in the dead of winter as an older horse along with other

Presidential winners such as

the enigmatic Nuclear Breeze and back to back 1:49-type wins by Golden Receiver. Other winter series races that first come to mind through the years at the Meadowlands were storylines such as St. Elmo Hero winning 23 in a row in the 2011 Complex and the unbeaten Iowa-bred Panaramic Art coming to the Meadowlands in the 2008 Exit 16W series. Today, it's impossible for these story lines to be replicated because the racing doesn't allow for it.

While the quality of racing at the Meadowlands has been decimated by higher purses at surrounding racetracks, Woodbine still boasts an impressive overnight program and because of that, the winter series of days past aren't as noticeably missed. That said, we're still not witnessing the



likes of trotters such as Mister Herbie and San Pail racing in the Glory's Comet that we had seen previously.

Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural previewed back in 2015 that the remaining late closers would likely be dropped and the reason he gave at that time was that the races were producing a disproportionate number of heavy betting favorites, thus making the races unappealing. It's a fair point that if certain series aren't attracting enough horses where full fields can be compiled or if those series tend to produce one or two superior horses that the viability of those series should be examined, but this wasn't typical across the board.

I recall many of the Non-Winners of 2 series such as the Super Bowl or Junior Trendsetter boasting the occasional overwhelming favorite (see Wiggle it Jiggleit in 2015), but many of the other series were found to be highly competitive and full of drama; certainly nothing less than anything of what we see today.

In addition to how a fan or enthusiast views the winter races today, the implications of dropping the late closing events are felt by owners.

The way that the Meadowlands winter series was structured directly encouraged ownership in the sport, especially in the case of smaller owners. I remember 10 years ago for example, an owner could buy a lightly raced or unproven 2-year-old at the annual Harrisburg sale in November and then quickly have a chance for an immediate return on their investment by nominating their new purchase to a number of the upcoming winter series.

This enabled owners not only a chance to recover some of their initial purchase, but provided a chance for an owner to compete for decent purse money without having to spend thousands or tens of thousands of dollars in staking fees or having to spend \$50,000 on a yearling.

For these reasons, winter series racing always seemed like a win for everyone; the track, the owners and the fans. The track gets to fill cards with enticing matchups during the slow months until the better horses come back, owners get a chance to race their horses for good money and fans get to watch and bet on a far higher quality product.

We always say that harness racing need stars, but it needs them all year round. Especially in the winter where they are few and far between.

Race 3: LIFE STRIKES is a hunch play for the night and I'd expect him to offer somewhere at or most likely even higher than his 5-1 programmed line. This one faltered last week and he's simply a better horse than that; his race from here three back would be more than good enough and I'm encouraged that trainer Budd has him right back in to go. GROUPIE DOLL folded last out without any real excuse; was the step up in class really that substantial? MANWITHAMISSION won first off the bench since September last out as the 2-1 favorite; seems logical to go forward off that. SWEET ROYALTY is puzzling; seems due for something more. ONE TOO MANY is likely to be going forward early and but I'd be surprised if she reached, even with the top barn.

Race 6: MAJOR HILL scored at 11-1 last week in his second start with Moreau after going off at 2-1 in his race prior; go figure. AWESOMENESS makes his first start since overwhelming rivals in the Snowshoe series (see above column on winter series) and those recent winning margins he racked up were impressive; eight out of 14 lifetime. THE ROCKINATOR invades from Miami Valley and lands in the Allard barn; owns a fast clocking from Hoosier last year and early speed might be coming. SIR GALAHAD was super three back but has lacked the same punch in his last pair when he had tough trips; HIGHLANDBEACHYCOVE was great upon debut here two back and then had no shot last out against Domethatagain.

Race 8: In the race of the night, JINS SHARK goes for two out of three in the preferred and proved that his win two back at 27-1 odds was no fluke. Menary trainee makes his third start back following the November layoff and had to endure a very long first over march last week; deserves respect. AMERICAN VIRGIN was able to win last week after getting off fairly cheap on the front end; the likely favorite once again. NICKLE BAG hasn't been able to deliver the goods of late although he's been close on occasion and the move inside will help. ALEXAS JACKPOT will be firing early as usual; FINE DIAMOND lands the rail but rode cover of the top choice last week and couldn't quicken off it.

Brett Miller wins four at Big M

Brett Miller stole the show on a cold, windy night at the Meadowlands on Thursday (Feb. 16), winning four of the night's nine races including both Dash For the G-Notes series finals.

Miller kicked off the "Meadowlands Harness Live" broadcast on SNY with a Dash win with the mare Never Ever Clever, who defeated the boys in the \$15,000 final.

Never Ever Clever, a six-year-old Muscle Hill—Clever Catch mare trained by Jonas Czernyson, held off the late charge of the favored Harmon Stable entry of Montalbano Bi and Detroit Rapper. Never Ever Clever won in 1:55 for her 11th lifetime victory.

One race later, Miller survived an adventurous final quarter mile to score in another G-Notes final with I Found My Beach. After following race favorite Mr. Big Load from the pocket, Miller first attempted to go outside in the stretch only to swerve back towards the pylons. That was the winning move as the eight-year-old Mach Three—Ohio Annie gelding sprinted away to score in by a length in 1:53 in the \$12,500 event.

The four wins give Miller 83 for the current season, 31 more than second-place Jim Marohn, Jr.

Total handle was \$1,347,906 for the nine-race program.

Blooded Horse Winter Sale posts strong numbers

The 54th Annual Blooded Horse Winter Sale held Feb 13-14 at the Delaware County Fairgrounds in Delaware, OH was the strongest in recent history. The mild winter had horsepeople eager to restock stables and breeders clamoring for mares.

Burke Racing Stable LLC brought a powerful consignment that contained co-sale topper Pretty Real Desire at \$30,000. A solid conditioned pacer at The Meadows, the daughter of Real Desire was purchased by Brian Carsey of Indiana to race at Hoosier Park. Other stars in the Burke consignment were Man He Can Skoot, a consistent eight-year old pacer at Northfield Park purchased by Harla Renae Loney for \$27,000 and Oh My Magic, a classy five-year-old daughter of Kadabra with dual racing/breeding potential, purchased by Glen Miller of Indiana for \$22,000.

Yonkers competitor Windsun Stetson was the other co-sale topper at \$30,000. The upper level conditioned pacer was one of several nice horses from the Richard Johnson consignment. He was joined by nine-year old trotter Walltocousins, fresh off a win at Yonkers, purchased by Harla Renae Loney for 25,000 and 10-year-old \$1 million earner Code Word who was purchased by Rene Allard, agent for \$20,000. Bidding was spirited for the handsome Indiana Sires Stakes winner Man of Excess. Brian Downing of Michigan signed the ticket for \$26,000 on the three-year-old son of Real Desire.

The Emerald Highlands consignment with its well-bred fillies and mares is always popular with both trainers and breeders. The four-year-old stakes placed Sportswriter mare Golden Idol, from the family of Ball and Chain p,6,1:49 (\$1,435,390), was purchased by Tyler Raymer of Delaware for 23,000. Big White Pearl from the family of Always A Virgin and racing competitively at Miami Valley went to Cory Stratton of NY for \$18,000, while Grand Circuit winning broodmare Lightning Glory p,2,1:51.2 (\$193,523) in foal to Always A Virgin sold for \$19,000 to Willis Miller of Indiana.

Canadian hits Super Hi-5 at Pompano for \$107,247

Pompano Park's Super Hi-5 finale was hit on Tuesday night (Feb. 14) when the only winning ticket with the 4-5-10-3-1 purchased in Canada worth \$107,247.64 (\$81,978 U.S. funds).

College Major, an eight year-old gelded son of Art Major, came from dead last at the stretch call to post a one-length win for Matt Romano at odds of 42-1 — his first win of the season for owner/trainer Jason MacDougall.

Surge Seelster, the 2-1 second choice, finished second for Corey Braden, while River Valley and Kevin Wallis teamed up to be third at odds of 8-1. The 3-2 favorite, Thumpem, finished fourth while McGreat closed out the Super Hi-5 finale ticket with a fifth-place finish at 61-1.

The unidentified bettor paid \$64.80 for the ticket on the 20-cent based wager, which proved to be the highest payoff of the season at Pompano Park.

The third annual Goshen Yearling Sale has been scheduled for Sunday, Sept. 10 at the Mark Ford Training Center in Middletown, NY.

Veterinarian charged with plot to drug thoroughbreds before races

An article by Michael Kunzelman of the Associated Press (full story here) published this week reported that a Louisiana veterinarian has been charged with engaging in a scheme to influence the outcome of horse races by illegally treating the animals with a synthetic version of a drug known as "frog juice."

The federal indictment accuses the veterinarian, Kyle James Hebert, of providing trainers with syringes of dermorphin to inject the painkiller in at least four horses that competed at Louisiana racetracks. The indictment returned Thursday by a grand jury in the Western District of Louisiana says Hebert told trainers that the mislabeled drug would make the horses "focus" and run faster.

Dermorphin, an opioid roughly 30 times more potent than morphine, is naturally secreted by tree frogs native to South America. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration hasn't approved any drug containing dermorphin for use in humans or animals.

In 2012, the commission sanctioned nine trainers whose horses tested positive for dermorphin.

Steven Barker, a professor emeritus from Louisiana State University's School of Veterinary Medicine, oversaw lab tests for dermorphin on samples collected for racing regulators in both Louisiana and Oklahoma.

Barker said the use and concealment of performing-enhancing drugs has always been a "cat and mouse game" in the horse racing industry. But its rate of positive drug tests is low compared to "human athletic endeavors," he said.

"The actual number of cases where there appears to be an obvious attempt to gain an advantage is very small," he said.


