Breeders say Opportunities Abound in New York

Principals from some of the state's top breeding farms believe those that breed in the state and take advantage of important changes to the resident mare program stand to collect lucrative rewards.

Mike Kimelman, Jr. said those that breed in New York — and do it wisely — are poised to reap tremendous benefits from changes made in recent years to the Residency Bonus Awards program that is part of the New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund.

Kimelman, the director of equine operations for Majestic View Farms in Gardiner, NY — his family founded Blue Chip Farms in nearby Walkkill, NY in 1969 — said he already is hearing stories of breeders getting large checks in the mail and it's only the beginning.

"I have a friend who has a very mom and pop shop. He got \$25,000 in breeders awards last year. I'm sure he's never spent \$25,000 in any given year on stallion feeds in total. That really helps a guy," Kimelman said.

"The thing a lot of people don't realize is that in 2013 I think we had a \$600,000 breeders awards pool. In 2014, that went to \$750,000. In 2015, they paid out \$950,000 in breeders awards, which is a pretty good increase. This year, they're looking to pay out, I would say, right at a million dollars and the interesting thing is, not a lot of people are really aware the foals of 2015 are 100 per cent residency. Everything forward will continue to be 100 per cent residency.

"The people that were paid out breeders awards in 2015 were half-residency plus performance. When those foals race in 2017 from that crop that was foaled in 2015, if somebody has a mare that was a non-resident and the resulting foal makes \$200,000 in the New York Sires Stakes program, that breeder will get zero dollars in

Tom Grossman said New York-breds should be in high demand this year and for a few years to come due to lower foal numbers.

After looking carefully at the changes to the residency program and realizing there was a declining number of New York-breds produced in recent years, Blue Chip owner Tom Grossman said he changed some of his initial mating decisions in order to take advantage of supply and demand economics.

“When I looked at the number of eligible foals in New York, I rebooked a lot of mares that I had booked out of New York back in New York,” Grossman said.

Kimelman said Steve Jones from Cameo Hills farm of Montgomery, NY is

applying similar logic. “Steve said, ‘Look Mike, I make money a lot of ways. I sell a lot of breedings to people. I board mares for people and send bills out to board mares. I sell a lot of horses. But I really believe in the New York program. So much so, that as much as I like horses like Captaintreacherous and Somebeachsomewhere, I’m going to probably breed Glowing Report and Must See to American Ideal this year because I think compared to the horses that I’ll be selling against, I’m going to really get paid for those two.”

Grossman concedes there may be more “home run potential” for a Pennsylvania-bred, “but by breeding a bunch of mares in New York, your expected return on the residency awards I think is as high or higher than Pennsylvania when you look at how many foals that money is going to be spread over.”

Joe Thomson, owner of Winbak Farms that operates a stallion station in Walden, NY, said the real benefit of breeding in New York is that the New York Sires Stakes program is one of the most lucrative programs in the sport.

“The main thing I like is they have a terrific sires stakes program for the offspring in New York,” Thomson said. “They have several levels to it that allow people to participate.”

He remains, however, a detractor of the state’s policy banning shipped semen outside New York, particularly since Winbak keeps most of its mares at its main farm in Maryland.

“It may be a benefit to people that race there, but I wish they had semen transport because we drive up there two, three times a week and all we do is burn up the roads and take a health risk on travel and spend a lot of money on trucks and trailers,” Thomson said.

Grossman said he understands Thomson’s criticism of the policy restricting shipped semen, but said changing that policy would open a Pandora’s box with the state’s politicians.

“I fear we would lose support for the program very quickly if we went to shipped semen. The politicians all are well versed in what the economic and environmental impact is of having true breeding farms there,” Grossman said. “The New York Sires Stakes, like most

sires stakes programs, really gets its political capital from being an agricultural pursuit. A lot of people in the industry don’t realize that. I don’t want to pick fights, but horsemen getting rich in overnight races doesn’t really do anything for the politicians that protect us.”

Kimelman agreed. “It’s not free money. It’s money designed to drive a giant agricultural business. It’s important for people to take advantage of it,” he said. “One of the three people that sit on that board is the Commissioner of Agriculture. He’s looking for people to get rewarded the most that participate in New York State the most.”

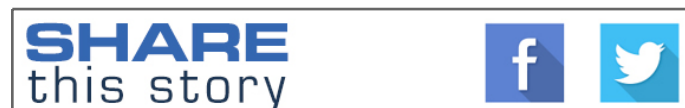
Grossman said the benefits of the program likely offset recent defections of top stallions Rock N Roll Heaven and Muscle Mass from New York and the likelihood of short-term losses from standing stallions at Blue Chip that are at a competitive disadvantage without shipped semen.

“I have a diversified business,” Grossman said. “Either I’m going to sell more bookings this year to my stallions, or I’m going to get that premium in my yearlings two years from now. It’s one or the other. If my stallions don’t start booking a little bit better this year, yes, short term it’s a pain, but I know there’s going to be that many fewer foals out there and I’ll get it back in the premium of the 40 or 50 New York-bred yearlings that I sell every year.”

Grossman said he’s not surprised more breeders haven’t taken advantage of changes to the residency program. “I’m constantly reminded that people don’t realize it until the checks actually hit their mailbox. Way back when, when we first got VLTs approved in New York... you didn’t really see the premium come to New York-breds until they actually saw the first New York Sires Stakes purse check hit their bank account.

“I do think the (New York-bred) yearlings will sell at a bigger premium and I do think it should spur our boarding business, as well.”

Increased bonus money for those that take full advantage of the residency program is, well, a bonus.



“This land has been so good to us”

Staff at Brittany Farms is awash with memories and emotion as the iconic Kentucky farm prepares to move to a new location.

For 30 years Art Zubrod and Leah Cheverie have lived in this house at Brittany Farm where they raised their daughters Deveau and Renee.

Leah Cheverie was crying — and not for the first time this week — as she talked about the emotional bond between Brittany Farms and those closest to the famed standardbred nursery in Versailles, KY that was sold a little more than a week ago.

“There’s lots of memories there, but it’s not about stuff or things. We’ve been so fortunate that we’ve been supported by so many loyal employees and people that have been here for us,” said Cheverie, Brittany’s office manager and the wife of general manager Art Zubrod.

“This land has been so good to us.”

It goes far beyond the numerous champions Brittany has raised over three decades and right down to the rolling bluegrass that deeply nurtured a number of human souls.

For all 30 years Brittany has been operating, Zubrod has been running the show for owner George Segal of Chicago. For all but the first two years, farm manager Dale Logan and his wife, Patty, have also been a key part of the team.

Brittany will retain 150 acres of pasture at its current property. The rest was purchased by Irish thoroughbred breeder Maurice Regan. He takes possession of the farm on Pisgah Pike in mid-June. A new, smaller Brittany will soon begin to take shape on a 121-acre parcel of land a few miles south.

“It’s sad, but it’s something I’ve got to do. I don’t go on forever and neither does the farm. My family is not interested,” said Segal, 77, a twinge of emotion in his voice. “Why pay to keep up 700-plus acres when you only need 200-plus?”

As the Zubrods and Logans prepare for the move, they are awash with memories. Both families raised their kids at Brittany — Zubrod and Cheverie’s oldest daughter, Deveau, was four when they moved to the farm in January of 1986; her sister, Renee, was born just four

months later. The Logans’ daughter, Nicole, also was raised at Brittany.

“It was really nice to be able to raise my daughter there and I’m sure Art feels the same way about raising his daughters there on the farm,” Dale said.

All three girls had fairytale weddings on the farm.

“I always envisioned just walking out the front door of our house and having (my wedding) in the circle in front of our house because it is just so picturesque,” Deveau said. “It was just one of those things. I never even hesitated. I knew from the very beginning that’s what I wanted.”

Her memories of a childhood spent with the run of the farm, are just as vivid.

“What more could you ask for to grow up on all of that land? We had a barn like a big shed for hay and we would play in there and build forts and we would be gone for hours and hours at a time. We built tree houses and everything. There’s a lot of good memories from that and having horses there of our own... We pretty much had free range. We had beautiful creeks there and we could go play in

Trixton is by Muscle Hill, considered the greatest trotting colt of the generation and in turn a son of the Hambletonian sire Muscles Yankee responsible for consecutive Hambletonian winners Deweycheatumnhowe (2008), Muscle Hill (2009), and Muscle Massive (2010). Muscles Yankee in turn is the foremost son of the foundation sire Valley Victory. Trixton is thus link number four in the leading stallion line of this era.

Trixton's dam Emilie Cas El 2,1:59.2f; 3,1:57.1f (\$245,199) was 2-year-old filly champion of her year and is a FULL SISTER to three extraordinary trotting sires in Andover Hall, Conway Hall and Angus Hall. the creek. We rode our bikes everywhere.”

But the strongest memories invariably involve horses. Deveau was 13 and Renee was nine when champion mare Three Diamonds dropped dead in front of the entire Brittany farm crew.

“I had a hold of her when she passed away,” Dale said. “At the time, the entire farm crew was there in the barn, including the secretaries and Art and Leah both... I was trying to do the best I could do and not let everybody get so upset seeing what was getting ready to happen. When she finally collapsed, it was really hard.”

It was about to get harder. Cheverie can laugh at it now, but the tears were flowing in 1995 when everyone gathered to watch Three Diamonds be buried.

“We were all a wreck,” Cheverie said. “We had a backhoe driver here that had dug the hole and everything. The girls had flowers that they were throwing in the grave and the poor backhoe driver was crying. He was a mess by the time he got done with this burial, because we were all crying.”

It was similarly emotional — and, in hindsight, comical — the night Leah Almahurst had an aneurysm and Zubrod and Dale Logan had to use brute force to get her onto a trailer to rush her to the vet clinic.

“She couldn’t stand, but we got her stabilized a little bit. Dale Logan and I were probably there three, four hours until about two o’clock in the morning. On the way home I said, ‘Man, I need a beer.’ So, we stopped at the gas station convenience store and I got a six pack of beer and the woman said, ‘You know, we can’t sell beer after one o’clock. I put \$5 down and I said, ‘Well, you’ve two choices here: You can pick up that \$5 and not call the cops or you can leave it down there and call the cops, but this beer is leaving with me.’ She said, ‘Have a nice night’ and I walked on out,” Zubrod said, laughing.

He said he’s cherished being greeted by yearlings each morning as he walked out his front door and made the short walk to the office next door.

Though Segal didn’t visit often, when he did, Zubrod would invariably see Segal, “just by himself driving around looking at the fields. He liked it. He really liked it.”

Segal said Brittany is, simply, “a great piece of ground. It’s produced a lot of top horses. It’s a sad time, but we move on. I’m still involved in breeding good horses and I’m sure I’ll get over it.”

It seems Segal was destined to own the farm.

“When I used to go there with Gene Riegler to look at horses, he said, ‘Of all the farms, this is the one you should buy when you’re ready to buy a farm,’” Segal said.

“The funny thing is, I loved this farm, too,” Zubrod said. “I worked at Kentuckiana and we started leasing it when I worked at Kentuckiana. I’d bring horses back and forth and I could tell this was a place to raise a good horse. It’s not a farm that you can drive by and see what’s going on. It’s quiet. It’s handy to town, handy to the airport. It’s just been a great place and I’ve had a hell of a lot of fun developing it.”

It’s been a lot of work and a lot of long hours, too, but Dale said the quality of life he and his family have had at Brittany is unmatched.

“There’s like five miles of road on the farm and you can kind of get around and look around and see what’s going on at a lot of different places. Instead of sitting in a stuffy office, I can sit in my truck and do some paperwork and figure things out. I’ll pull up around back around one of the fields where there’s horses hanging out and just sit there and do it right there instead of sitting and looking at four walls,” Dale said.

He said everyone owes a tremendous debt of gratitude to Segal.

“George is a great guy to work for... He puts the horse first and the people. He took very good care of several of us here on the farm,” Dale said.

Zubrod said he’s been flooded with a million memories this week, but the predominant feeling is that he has been blessed at Brittany.

Segal said, “it’s just an evolution like Castleton, Almahurst, Kentuckiana, Peninsula and now Brittany. They all moved to different locations. That land has produced a lot of champions and the new one will produce more champions,” Segal said.

“You never know, but things could get a lot better,” Dale said. “That’s something you never know when you’re changing soil. The soil that we’re moving to could be as fertile or more fertile. It’s something you never know until you give it a try.”

For her part, Cheverie may be emotional about the move, but she is up for a new adventure building the new Brittany Farms.

“It’s exciting to think that we’re going to have the chance to start over in a way. That part’s exciting,” Cheverie said. “The hard part is leaving all this behind. It’s been 30 years.

“Anyone that knows me knows I wear my emotion on my sleeve. I was a wreck last week, but by the time this is all over with, I should be really good — sometime between now and June.”

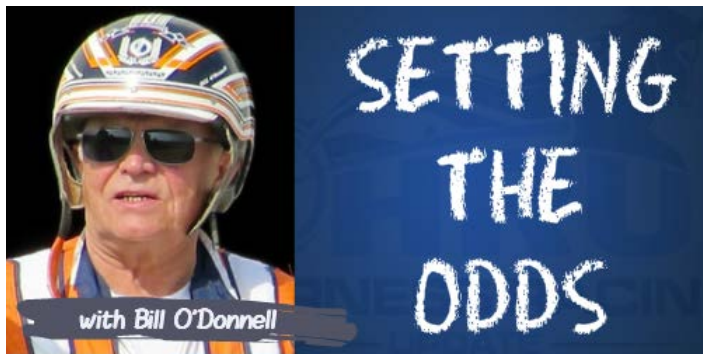

Handicap the chances the following will occur:

COSA's Classy Lane GoFundMe account will exceed \$750,000 (fund was around \$640,000 at press time) — **BO: 10-1**

In the next five years, COSA will voluntarily join forces with OHHA and other standardbred groups representing horsepeople in Ontario to form one group representing horsepeople — **BO: 20-1**

In the next five years, Ontario's standardbred horsepeople will join forces with their thoroughbred and quarter horse counterparts to form one group representing horsepeople of all breeds — **BO: 50-1**

Standardbred horsepeople will have representation on the board of Ontario Racing — **BO: even money**

COSA, specifically, will have a seat on the board of Ontario Racing — **BO: 2-1**

You will return to the sulky on a semi-regular basis and reach \$100 million lifetime (by Standardbred Canada accounting O'Donnell is at just over \$99 million now) — **BO: 99-1 (Setting The Odds Longshot)**

The Ontario government will continue to directly fund the industry after the current five-year, \$500 million deal runs out in April of 2019 — **BO: even money**

If there is funding from the government beyond 2019, the announcement of further funding will come sometime this year — **BO: 5-1**

In the next five years, total Ontario Sires Stakes purses will be at or more than current levels — **BO: even money**

In the next three years, the OLG will roll out a gaming product in which the horse racing industry will receive a direct cut of revenue — **BO: 5-1**

Total handle on WEG's standardbred product will continue the upward trend and be up in 2016 over 2015 — **BO: 4-5 (Setting The Odds Best Bet)**

Standardbred purses at WEG will rise in the next three years — **BO: 10-1**

In the next three years, the purse level will be increased at the signature (middle) level tracks included in the Standardbred Alliance — **BO: 3-1**

In the next three years, one or more Ontario racetracks will close — **BO: 5-1**

One or more of the 10 biggest harness racetracks in North America will close in the next three years — **BO: 15-1**

Short horse supply will have a serious impact on filling races at WEG sometime this year — **BO: 3-1**

The low Canadian dollar will lead to a decrease in the number of U.S.-based horses being kept eligible to this year's major stakes at WEG — **BO: 15-1**

The OLG will grant Mohawk a full-fledged casino **in the next three years** — **BO: even money**

Much Adoo is something in Ontario Girls final

Much Adoo overcame post 10 to capture the \$44,600 Ontario Girls Series final Saturday night at Woodbine Racetrack.

A field of 10 Ontario-sired four-year-old pacing mares competed in the finale of the three-week series event.

Much Adoo was made the even-money favorite despite the outside post. Debuting for trainer Nick Gallucci, Much Adoo captured a first leg division before skipping round two.

Driven by Doug McNair, Much Adoo sprinted off the wings of the gate from the extreme outside and got the lead ahead of leg two winner Ainsleynoelle. The aggressive tactics forced the favorite to pace a :26.1 opening-quarter.

After reaching the half in :55.1, Much Adoo was confronted around the final turn by a first-over Mach Magic. The public's choice carried a narrow lead at the three-quarter pole in 1:24.2.

In the stretch, McNair called upon his charge for all she had and the four-year-old pacing mare responded. Much Adoo held off her challengers to win by a length in 1:53.2.

Show Some Leg, who was fourth turning for home, got up for second, while Ainsleynoelle's pocket journey ended in a third-place finish. Double Olives, who won the Blizzard Series final in January, rallied from tenth at the top of the stretch to finish fourth.

A daughter of Classic Card Shark out of Michiko, Much Adoo extended her current win streak to three Saturday. She is owned by Aaron Waxman and Alan Alber.

With Saturday's win, Much Adoo now has eight career victories and \$119,746 in earnings. This season, she has won three of five starts and banked over \$45,000.

Much Adoo paid \$4.10 to win.

The Ontario Boys second leg was also contested Saturday night. The second round was delayed a week after last Saturday's card was cancelled due to extreme cold temperatures.

Leg one winner Cajon Lightning was sent off as the even-money favorite, while stablemate Rafa was a close second choice. The Richard Moreau trainees controlled the front-end throughout the mile.

Rafa posted an opening-quarter of :27.3, but Cajon Lightning, who was parked to the quarter, swept by to grab command entering the backstretch. Sylvain Filion was not content to sit the pocket and retook the lead with Rafa at the half in :55.2.

Around the final turn, Sports Lightning came first-up to within a length of the leader, while Half A Billion, who originally got

away last, sat second-over and Cajon Lightning backed away in the two-hole. Rafa kept the tempo honest by posting a three-quarter time of 1:23.2.

In the stretch, Rafa dug in trying to maintain the lead, but he could not fight off Half A Billion, who surged by late for driver Jody Jamieson at odds of 21-1. The upset winner stopped the clock in a career-best 1:52.3 for a half length victory.

Rafa finished second, while Cajon Lightning came back on in the stretch to grab third.

A son of Sportswriter—Racey Date, Half A Billion is trained by Corey Giles for owners Michel and Francois Letarte, Jean Allaire and Germain Chabot. The four-year-old came into the second leg off a third-place finish in round one.

Seventh straight \$3 million handle at Big M

The odds-on favorite kicked on to a decisive win over All Week (John Campbell), who rallied up the pegs to narrowly take second at 41-1 in a photograph with Aslan (Andy McCarthy) and 2014 Little Brown Jug winner Limelight Beach (Yannick Gingras).

Steve Elliott trains Rockeyed Optimist, now a 16-time winner, for the partnership of Perretti, Berkner, the A & B Stable, and Battaglia. For Tetrack, the win was one of two on the card. Brett Miller led all drivers with a hat trick, while Joe Bongiorno, Corey Callahan, and Jim Marohn, Jr. joined Tetrack with driving doubles.

While one individual captured the seventh-race 20¢ Jackpot High 5 for \$39,302, the final-race High 5 saw multiple winners.

Thus, \$106,314 will carry into next Friday evening's final-race Jackpot High 5.

Earlier in the day, a trio of horseplayers punched their tickets to the 2017 National Handicapping Championship in Las Vegas, as Lucas Van Zandt (first place, \$10,240 prize winnings), Paul Vinges (second, \$5,120), and Bart Fooden (third, \$2,560) took top honors in the NHC qualifying event at The Meadowlands.

Emmy-winning writer, producer blows fortune at track

The Hollywood Reporter is reporting four-time Emmy winning writer and producer David Milch has gambled away much of an estimated \$100 million fortune on horse racing.

Milch, who created HBO's horse racing drama *Luck*, as well as HBO's Western series *Deadwood* and ABC's *NYPD Blue*, is a four-time Emmy-winning writer and producer who helped shape television.

Though it's not known precisely how much money Milch has earned during his 30-year Hollywood career, colleagues estimate the creator made over \$100 million. A lawsuit filed last year indicates Milch lost \$25 million from gambling at horse tracks between 2000 and 2011. The suit also reveals Milch owes \$17 million in debts (\$5 million in unpaid taxes and penalties, \$10 million on mortgages, \$2 million in fees to NKSFB and others). Today, Milch is given a \$40 per week allowance from his wife.

"He was crazy. He'd bet thousands and thousands of dollars. He'd bet every race," an acquaintance told the *Hollywood Reporter*.

Mr. Perry, Once again I ask of you what is Ronnie Burke to do?

You chastise him for winning an inordinate number of races at The Meadowlands in previous years. You chastise him for not winning at the same rate this year.

What is he to do?

You conveniently neglect to mention why this amounts to cheating. As I said in my initial post, there are a multitude of factors that COULD be involved in this discrepancy.

I'll give you an example told to me by my long time mentor John Simpson Sr.

In 1957, Mr. Simpson had a year that very few horsemen previously or since have enjoyed.

He won the Hambletonian with Hickory Smoke. He won the Little Brown Jug with Torpid. He trained both the two-year-old pacing and trotting fillies of the year. He had at least one and likely more other head of their class division winners.

He was voted the 1957 Harness Horseman of the Year. His picture appeared on the cover of most of the leading trade publications.

Heading into the 1958 racing season he held the harness racing world in his hands.

He had a roster of owners unmatched in the industry at the time. His buying budget was enormous, if not unlimited. He could buy any yearling being sold. Owners and breeders were clamoring at his door. The sky was the limit as for his prospects in 1958.

What happened?

What happened was that as he described it he had the worst year of his career. Horses went lame. Horses got sick. The high-priced yearlings he had purchased the previous Fall were disappointments.

That's part of horse racing. We are not dealing primarily with the Internet and computers. We are dealing with flesh and blood, both in the magnificent steeds that we are so lucky to have and those entrusted to take care of and race them. Stuff happens. People make mistakes. People sometimes have unrealistic expectations. The dice throw different numbers.

As for your insinuation that I am sticking up for Burke because somehow, I really don't know how, we are collaborators in the breeding business. Only one word describes that. That word is:

NONSENSE!

With regard to the evolving situation with the alleged positives at Yonkers, let's see how that plays out. As I write this letter (on Feb. 14), no one has been charged with anything. The FACTS are largely unknown.

I am not a member of the "Hang Them First and Try Them Later Club". I've also heard that there may be as many as 30 or more other trainers who may be alleged to have shown positive to this substance. Let's let it play out and see what happens. If in fact there are a multitude of positives, or far less likely that they involve only the two names heretofore mentioned, the truth should come out. I realize that there are such things as trainer responsibility and zero tolerance rules. We have yet to hear the entire story. Right now all we have is a scurrilous story by a sensationalist website saying likely INCORRECTLY that these two people have been charged. Other publications have chosen to let justice prevail and tread lightly.

Apparently Mr. Perry has already judged them of malfeasance before, to the best of anybody's knowledge anybody has been charged, let alone convicted of anything.

We shall see.
