In the more than half a century that I've been in this business I've been privileged to have seen thousands of drivers and most certainly a lot more horses.

I've chosen a baker's dozen of those drivers who I believe at their best were the greatest that I've ever seen. Obviously this is a purely subjective topic with which I

am sure there will be a significant degree of disagreement.

Before I get to the main topic, I think I should address two other categories.


Those who may not necessarily have been the very best in the driver categories, but were nonetheless very good and had an undue influence on the sport and those who followed them:

- **Keith Waples** The teacher of several of those who are on the main list. Waples did not teach as a teacher might to his students, but many of them studied him and learned from watching.
- **Stanley Dancer** Maybe the first driver to realize the shortest way to get around a racetrack was to go to the front and have others come and get you. This was especially effective on the New York half-mile tracks.
- **Hughie Bell** The first catch driver that I am aware of. He could make speed like no one else in his era and invariably improved a horse he was driving for a trainer driver.

The next category consists of those who are missing from the main list but may have the credentials to be on it. If anybody put up a strong argument saying that they deserve to be ranked among the very best, I couldn't say that they were wrong.

"The Magic Man" Bill O'Donnell

1. Bill O'Donnell – At his best, albeit in a relatively short time frame of maybe four or five years, O'Donnell was the very best these eyes have ever seen. In his prime, he was truly "The Magic Man". The amazing thing about Billy as opposed to all of the others on this list is that he did not become what I feel was a truly professional driver until he turned 30 or thereabouts. Prior to that, when he had his own stable at Foxboro, he used Teddy Wing as his catch driver. When Wing went to the Meadowlands, Billy O moved his stable to Saratoga where he first seriously began to drive. One night when he won seven of eight starts, he decided it was to move to The Meadowlands and try his luck in the big time.

- 2. John Campbell What else can be said about J. C. Superstar? He is the all time leading money winner. He has won more classic events than any man in the history of the sport. He is great beyond great. Now in his sixties, he is still one of the fiercest competitors to ever sit behind a horse. If I had my choice between O'Donnell and Campbell at their best, I'd be more than happy to get second pick.
- 3. Herve Filion I could be accused of being a tiny bit prejudiced here. Growing up, he was my idol. I thought he was a harness racing God. I believed he was half horse. He could speak horse before he learned English. Great soft hands and one always had a horse after he handed the lines back to you. A pupil who learned from Keith Waples. As my late friend Andy Grant would say of him, "He was likely born in a feed bucket."
- 4. Michel Lachance Iron Mike. Maybe the toughest competitor I've ever known, both in and out of harness racing. He was always prepared, a true professional. If he told you something about a horse, he would be invariably right. I think that if I wanted a driver's opinion about a young horse's potential, he would be the person I'd go to. Another graduate of the Keith Waples school.

- 5. Brian Sears One of the greatest that these eyes have ever seen. Even in the days when he raced at The Meadows, invariably finishing second to Dave Palone, I thought he was fantastic. As great as his accomplishments have been, I've always felt he could have been better, if he had the fire and ambition of a John Campbell or Mike Lachance.
- 6. Tim Tetrick The future is now. Although still quite young, he is already one of our sport's greatest drivers ever. Timmy has it all. Great hands, a great head, excellent judge of pace and everything else that a great driver requires. As one of the sport's most accomplished gamblers recently said on Facebook "one of the best bets in harness racing today is first time Tetrick." Who am I to disagree?
- 7. Carmine Abbatiello In my opinion, it's a push between Abbatiello and Walter Case as the greatest half-mile track driver ever. First time Carmine was always a great bet. In his time, he could make more speed than any driver I had previously seen. It seemed to these unknowing eyes that for the most part, he was quite content to more or less restrict his driving to the New York metropolitan area. Thus, the largest number of his wins came aboard overnight and fast class horses.
- 8. Ron Pierce The greatest instinctive driver ever. He could and often would do things on the track that one might question only to see his actions confirmed with another trip to the winner's circle. More than any other driver that I can think of, as he got older, he got better, much better. He was in my opinion the only driver who could possibly have defeated Somebeachsomewhere in The Meadowlands Pace as he did with Art Official.
- Buddy Gilmour Great, soft hands. A great mind. He was half-horse in the bike. Not only a great driver but a great horseman as well. Another Keith Waples school graduate.
- 10. David Miller Although it seems somewhat inane to refer to a Hall of Famer as being under rated, I believe that term very much applies to Dave Miller. Perhaps it's his quiet demeanor, but, in my opinion, he rarely gets the respect he deserves. Instead of being the forth or fifth choice in many of the top events, I believe he is every bit as competent as the first or second picks.
- **11. George Sholty** In his prime he could make a horse

go as fast as anybody I've ever seen. It was pure poetry seeing his movements in the bike in perfect sync with those of the horse he was steering. His racing of Sonsam and Bengazi Hanover really stand out in my mind. A great driver, but quite possibly a better all around horseman.

- 12. Benny Webster Speed should have been his nickname instead of "The Whip". He could make it as well as anybody that ever lived. Another great driver who's horsemanship is sometimes forgotten. He played a great part in the success of No Nukes and Flak Bait.
- 13. Yannick Gingras The most aggressive driver of today's youth core. If you are a gambler and want to get the most for your money when making a bet, Yannick is probably your best shot. He keeps getting better. In my opinion, he isn't near as good as he will one day be.
- Also Eligible Walter Case Jr. Likely the most purely-talented driver to ever sit behind a horse. His worst enemy was himself and he has only himself to blame for all his misfortunes and those he caused to others. What a terrible loss to himself and the sport.

USTA approves \$250,000 for social media, forms advisory committee

with files from the USTA

Following the conclusion of the U.S. Trotting Association Board of Directors' Annual Meeting on Monday (Feb. 29), USTA President Phil Langley announced the formation of a Social Media Advisory Committee to assist in the industry's social media initiative.

The USTA is in the third year of its partnership with **Converseon**, an award-winning, national social media agency located in New York City.

"We are entering a pivotal year in our social media campaign," said Langley. "I think most of the people in our industry understand that social media is our best chance to reach a new audience and grow the interest in harness racing.

"It is time for more involvement from the people and organizations in our sport," added Langley. "We are counting on this committee to assist us in taking the important next steps."

Following are the members named by Langley for the new USTA Social Media Committee:

Allison Conte (Chairperson–USTA social media and publicity manager)

Tony Alagna (trainer, more than \$25 million in lifetime purses)

Emily Gaskin (Hoosier Park Racing Publicist)

Nick Salvi (Gural Racetracks Stakes Consultant)

Ashley Tetrick (operator of www.tetrickracing.com)

Gabe Wand (USTA director, chairman District 4)

Heather Wilder (Meadows Standardbred Owners Association Marketing Director)

USTA Director of Marketing and Communications Dan Leary will act as staff liaison between Converseon and the committee.

"We suggested that a steering committee could help us get greater involvement throughout the industry and help us identify the most important priorities at this critical time," said Converseon founder and CEO Rob Key. "There are exciting opportunities and some significant challenges ahead and we are pleased to have this impressive group to assist us. We need everyone to get involved and paddle in the same direction." Plans for the first meeting of the Social Media Committee are underway.

Columbus, OH - Funding for the social media, digital marketing initiative as well as monetary support for major-race television broadcasts were approved at the final general session of the USTA Board of Directors annual meeting Monday (Feb. 29).

A lengthy and emotional discussion preceded the votes for both spending measures. Directors presented their cases for and against allocating \$250,000 of USTA money to work in partnership with Converseon Inc., a nationally-acclaimed New York City social marketing agency founded by Rob Key. The program will enter its third year in 2016, with goals including increasing online engagement by 80 percent and generating 2,000 leads to target for potential ownership of harness racehorses.

The final general session of the USTA Board of Directors annual meeting was held on Monday.

Some directors -- who prefaced their statements by saying that they ultimately supported the project and voted as such -- voiced their concerns about not seeing specific results from the first two years of the partnership with Converseon.

"This is something we've got to build upon and continue to impress upon Converseon as well over the next year that if we want certain metrics from them, then let's get that information to Mike Tanner, to Dan Leary, so they can present it to Rob (Key). That way, he knows exactly what we are looking for in 2016," said Jason Settlemoir (District 8, New York).

Gabe Wand (District 4, Wisconsin) echoed those concerns, calling for more accountability from Converseon and the USTA in the next year.

"They are really giving us no concrete metrics," he said. "I want to know how many non-horse racing people are we reaching? Or are we just building a platform for ourselves?

"If we continue to go forward with this, if by this time next year can directors be guaranteed some type of a score sheet on how we're doing -- and if we have a plan B?"

Those who voted against the funding raised questions

about spending money when the 2016 budget approved by the board shows a projected deficit in 2016. The 2015 budget projected a deficit of \$108,947, but finished with a surplus of \$348,357 due to decreases in office expenses and unused budgeted funds allocated to such projects as television production, Save Our Standardbreds, investigative services and Strategic Wagering shortages.

"I don't think there is any question that we need to be in social media," said John Brennan (District 12, New Jersey). "I think the question is: Can this be done in-house? I just don't think that with the deficit that we have, that we are in a position to be spending this money."

USTA Executive Vice President and CEO Mike Tanner explained that the USTA did not have the resources to go from managing to monetizing social media.

"There seems to be a fundamental misunderstanding as to what the social media initiative is," said Tanner. "The social media is not Allison Conte and Dan Leary and Ken Weingartner just tweeting a whole lot and posting things on Facebook. The social media initiative is doing those things while having the infrastructure to read where those messages are going, to determine who is receiving those messages, to get the demographics and build content for them so we can branch out into a CRM (customer relationship management) initiative, just like the casinos do to build customers."

Before a roll-call vote was cast for the social media and television spending, Brennan made a motion to instead conduct a secret-ballot vote. The motion needed approval of two-thirds of the directors in attendance, but the roll call vote for that motion was defeated with 23 voting "yes" and 21 voting "no."

The roll-call vote to approve the funding for social media passed by a measure of 36-4. (Editor's Note: A previous version of this story listed the results as 36-3.)

Prior to the social media vote, a roll-call vote to approve a \$120,000 fund to help support harness racing television broadcasts passed by a measure of 39-3. The monies in the fund would be made available to any racetrack or group that applied to coordinate the production and broadcast of one or more of their major races.

Members of the USTA Finance Committee met in the morning.

In order to address the deficit questions outlined in brief above, a price increase for selected USTA services was approved by a voice vote in both the general session and the Finance Committee meeting prior. Starting in 2018, fees for individual USTA memberships would increase from \$50 to \$75; and from \$140 to \$200 for three-year memberships. Member racetrack dues would be increased according to a scaled amount based on purses; and eTrack services would rise from \$168 per day to \$200 per day for most tracks. According to Chairman Ivan Axelrod, the measures would increase revenue some \$600,000 per year after the third year of implementation.

The price increase was met with concerns from some directors in the Finance Committee.

"Do you think that instead of raising fees -- especially in the membership category -- that we could maybe go back and pick through the budget and 'trim the fat?'" asked Mark Ford (District 8, New York). "Regardless of how you put it, a rate increase at this point in time is not going to be well-taken."

Tanner responded by reminding directors that employee count has reduced from 60 to 49 in the past few years and any cuts to the budget would result in the elimination of the myriad sponsorships and staff support that the USTA provides across the industry.

"You can always get leaner, but you are going to lose services by doing that," he said. "The rest of the industry is shrinking and the expectations put on the USTA are greater than ever. We jump in and we jump in quietly to provide support, doing things that 20 years ago we were never expected to do."

Where Rob Key has it wrong

The USTA has approved customer relationship and marketing spending, but what happens next is the big industry question

It was a whirlwind weekend at the annual USTA member meetings. A number of items were talked about, but the main discussion seemed to be centered on the industry's customer relationship management and digital marketing initiative, implemented by Rob Key of Converseon.

For a couple of years now, Key seems to enter the building, cap in hand, asking for \$250,000. 250 large is quite a bit of money - a well-bred trotter at a yearling sale, 25 per cent of the purse for the North America Cup (maybe less, because the Canadian dollar's getting whacked), a decent house in New York City, check that, upstate New York.

But just how much is \$250,000?

\$250,000 is 0.016 per cent of the amount wagered on harness racing in the U.S. in 2015.

\$250,000 is 0.055 per cent of the amount of purses for harness racing distributed in the U.S. 2015

In fact, \$250,000 is only 0.76 per cent of the purses offered so far this year.


In contrast, \$250,000 is a drop (a teeny, tiny drop) in the bucket when compared to the \$26.5 million of marketing revenue the Swedish harness racing industry employs. Sweden's population is about 20 per cent smaller than the state of Pennsylvania.

Overall, in the entire sport of harness racing in North America (worth billions), marketing and CRM spend remember this includes everything in every sector; every alphabet, every track, every wagering company - are estimated by Robert Scarpelli of HLT advisory, at 1.7 per cent of revenues.

Compare that to your neighborhood Bingo which spends up to 30 per cent of revenue on outreach; casinos are right around 20 per cent.

What about for other industries and companies? Well,

there's generally a rule of thumb that you might've heard in business class: 10 per cent of revenues should be spent on some sort of marketing, or customer relationship management. That's the magic number, and the magic number is close. According to a Gartner Research study in 2015, the average marketing spend per company in business to consumer was about 13 per cent. All sectors ranged from a low of 10.1 per cent to a high of 16.3 per cent.




Rob Key – God bless him – comes to industry meetings asking harness racing the wrong question. He should not be asking for \$250,000, he should be asking for a couple of million. Two million would not get the sport anywhere near where it probably needs to be when compared to your neighborhood casino, and that ask from the industry might be akin to pulling teeth from non-sedated giraffe without a ladder. But, one would think if the sport checks a few boxes it would be something worth working towards.

First, you need backing from the people who pay the bills; the people who allow governments to hand over slot money, the people who supply the horses to race for

According to a survey, yes you read this right, 77 per cent of USTA members agree the sport should invest more in digital. I don't know about you, but I can't remember the last time 77 per cent of the members of any harness racing alphabet group agreed on anything. The rank and file want to spend money – **their money** – to do this. Why does their leadership find this so difficult?

Second up, something we as marketers work through each day is infiltrating new markets. New users are tough to find, tough to engage, and very difficult to reach. Well, apparently we're seeing some decent numbers here too from Key's work.



I don't particularly buy the point that somehow this has to be "new people". The Pittsburgh Steelers spend oodles of money on engaging fans that already are a part of "Steeler Nation". Energizing the harness fan and participant base for meet-ups, watching races, betting on races, working social media through word-of-mouth, or banding together to fight decoupling (or other industry items) is good spend in itself. However, if you are one of the people who are worried about too much overlap, three in four Fan Zone fans are outside the industry. 62% of the Fan Zone's Facebook followers are not fans of the USTA or the Meadowlands. Those are the most impressive numbers I've seen in this sport when it comes to outreach, and I've been at this awhile. Next, harness racing itself participants, fans and bettors – are not getting any younger. I think everyone agrees the sport has to reach those demographics. How's that been going?

Thirty-four per cent of the reach is under the age of 44 and they're seeing almost equal numbers of men and women participating. Remember the last time you were at the OTB? Did one of three people in the joint look like that?



We can keep going with these metrics, but you get the picture. Next year at this time, Rob Key will be going back to the USTA and arguing "his" case. Frankly, the arguments made have nothing to do with the story. Harness racing complains that it's getting overtaken by lotteries, sports betting, casinos, bingo, and thoroughbred racing. That's fair. However, ask yourself why. One of reasons is that lotteries, bingo, thoroughbred racing et al, have been doing what Rob wants to do, and have done so for many, many years. This isn't new, or additional spend, this is basic spend the industry should've done long ago to just keep pace with competitors.

CRM spend, marketing spend, database management, community outreach, sponsorship cultivation, and inside-industry engagement is not radical; it's not something to argue about. It's something that needs to be done as a matter of course. This is wrapping a horse's legs for a long van trip; it's staking the two-year-old colt who just went 2:04 under a hold; it's what needs to be done.

No, next year Rob Key should not have to ask the \$250,000 question. He should not have to ask an industry to come on board for 0.03% of industry revenue; 0.03% of revenue for an average family in the USA is less than \$2 per year, not even the price of a cup of Starbucks coffee. The industry – horsemen, racetracks, alphabets, racinos – should be lining up right this minute with a plan to at least quadruple that figure. The future of harness racing is worth more than a cup of coffee. If you don't believe that, hang up the harness, sell the racebikes, put all the horses into claimers and dust off the resume. Everyone might as well all go home.

HOLLYWOOD'S HITS

Meadow Skipper's first crop of two-year-olds was in 1969 and yielded a Triple Crown winner in 1970 (Most Happy Fella) and very nearly two in a row when Albatross just fell short in 1971 in the Jug.

In 1977, the Woodrow Wilson debuted for a purse \$280,000 (won by No No Yankee). Thirty-nine horses were in the elims, and only two were Meadow Skippers, and neither made the final. But Meadow Skipper would soon make up for his inauspicious start in a very big way. He sired the winners in 1978 (Scarlet Skipper) and 1980 (Land Grant), was the grandsire of the 1979 champ (Niatross) and the great-grandsire of the 1981 winner (McKinzie Almahurst).

But let's go back to 1980 for what I consider the greatest siring feat of all time. Remember, in 1977, Meadow Skipper did not have a single finalist, nor did his sons. In 1980, for the sport's first \$2 million race, the entire 12-horse field was comprised of Meadow Skipper sons or grandsons — every single finalist.

Dazzling dozen

A little known fact on each of a dozen of history's most famous horses:

- Nevele Pride, the only three-time trotting Horse of the Year, won 57 times in his award-winning seasons of 1967-1969 – and not once was any rival within a length in any victory.
- Foiled Again, the richest performer of all-time is now 12. The last time a 12-year-old finished in the top five in balloting for Horse of the Year was in 1968 when Cardigan Bay was fourth.
- Bee A Magician (17-for-17 in 2013) is one of two undefeated Horses Of The Year driven by Brian Sears, who also drove Muscle Hill to a perfect 12-for-12 record in 2009. No other driver has ever had a pair of unblemished HOYs.
- 4. Moni Maker's fastest Meadowlands race was her last one (1:52.1) at age seven in 2000 in the Nat Ray. It was her third win in that classic
- 5. Artsplace, the 1992 undefeated Horse Of The Year made more money in the previous two years than he did in his HOY year.

- Eternal Camnation was from the last crop of Cam Fella and turned out to be his richest performer with earnings exceeding \$3.7 million. Cam Fella also had a double millionaire from his very first crop (Camtastic -1987-1989).
- 7. Fools Goal made \$3,057,070 in his career, but \$2.3 million of it at ages six, seven and eight.
- 8. Bonefish, the 1975 Hambletonian winner, is the only winner of that race never to race again.
- 9. Wesgate Crown banked \$2,574,045 in his career without winning a race as a sophomore. He is the richest horse ever to be blanked as a sophomore.
- 10. Su Mac Lad w as the last Horse of the Year to miss a complete season prior to winning the award. He won it in 1962 at age eight. He missed his entire three-year-old season in 1957 due to a broken bone.
- 11. No Sex Please banked \$1,884,392 in his career from 1987-1993. He was the only three-year-old to appear in the March Of Dimes Trot in 1998 won by Sugarcane Hanover over Ourasi and Mack Lobell.
- 12. Kramer Boy made \$2,055,735 in his career. He was the 1997 Horse Of The Year in Sweden. Jimmy Takter also had the 1997 Horse Of The Year in the U.S. (Malabar Man) making him the only trainer to have the HOY on two continents in the same year.



Koch says Meadowlands facing tough stretch

Normally, winter slowly transitioning to spring is a joyous time. The heavy coats get packed away, out come the shorts and t-shirts. Ice and snow melt, giving way to green grass and flowers in bloom.

But amid all of this euphoria comes the reality of racing at the Meadowlands, and the challenges the track faces in the coming months.

With the warm weather, tracks start opening up, which heats up competition for horse flesh throughout the industry. Saratoga Harness, Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs and Harrah's Philadelphia are either already racing or will be within the month. All three of those tracks, plus Yonkers Raceway – which pretty much races year round – all have slot-machine bloated purse accounts ready to burst, which will now put Big M racing secretary Peter Koch to the test.

"I was feeling pretty good until yesterday," joked Koch Tuesday afternoon, referring to the results of his double draw on Monday. "The reality of the situation now in racing is, we are good for horses in the winter, and when the other tracks start opening up, it becomes a struggle."

The Meadowlands publicity department sent out a release late Wednesday afternoon telling of a fabulous February, one that featured a nightly increase in handle of nearly \$500,000 over the same period the year before.

Exacta pools that averaged \$66,000 continued to be the backbone of the wagering, while a low winning favorites percentage of 30 helped create an average Pick 5 payout of \$21,594 for a 50-cent ticket. Total handle exceeded \$3 million on every February card, and the track has topped that magic betting figure on nine straight occasions.

Extending that streak to 10 might prove difficult.

The Meadowlands' formula for cold-weather success has been field size. There have not been many open handicap events. High-priced claimers? About as common as a Halley's Comet sighting.

No, Koch kept the racing going, and the handle flowing, by carding lower-class racing with 10-horse fields. And it worked to perfection. Betting was just over \$6.5 million for last weekend's racing programs despite 13 of the 28 races carded being for non-winners of two races lifetime, non-winners of \$5,000 in their last five starts, or \$10,000 claimers. The masses have spoken: Give them full fields, and they will bet. With verve.

March isn't starting as Koch might have hoped, but things aren't that bad. At least for now. The Big M will have 26 races this weekend (down from the normal 28) and there will be some short fields (there will be six races with seven starters). "We lost 20 per cent of the horses that were entered from last week to this week," said Koch. "We are not leaving horses out, we just don't have access to as many."

On top of the horse population problem, the Big M is also playing catch-up with its purses.

"We are in a purse overpayment situation," said Koch. "Which is part of the reason we dropped the late closers (such as the Exit 16W and Clyde Hirt Series). We paid out more in purses than we were contractually obligated to over the last two years and so we've had to lower purses to make up for that overpayment. Part of it was to stay competitive. We were paying more than we were generating to try and keep horses here. It's just a situation where we kind of have to dig ourselves out of a hole."

So where does that leave Koch moving forward?

"There are adjustments done to get horses raced," said Koch of the necessity of altering conditions. "It's all about making adjustments. You have to get horses raced and put them in a spot where they can land and be competitive.

"You also have to get them raced to keep them. If a horse doesn't get in for a couple of weeks, they then are going to look for someplace else to go and we may never get that horse back. Basically, right now, if you enter here, you are going to get in, and hopefully the horse will be in a spot where he can make some money. And, if a horse is in a bit steep this week, maybe we can take of them down the road where they can make some money."

But when you are putting races together, sometimes you have to look big picture.

"Field size is definitely important," said Koch. "But in order to get a 10-horse field, take a non-winners of two that doesn't have 10 starters, for instance. Since no trainer races at just one track nowadays, he might see that race go, and then hopefully, he can plan on coming here for the following week.

"You can never really look at one week. You have to look at the week after and the week after that. I put out a new

condition sheet (Tuesday), and included on the sheet was a \$7,500 claimer and a non-winners of \$3,500 in their last five starts. Obviously, for the fans, it'd be nice if I was writing a non-winners of \$25,000, but that's unrealistic, I'm not going to get those horses."

Once April 1 hits, things will get even tougher, since both Pennsylvania tracks will be up and racing.

"We're going to be up against it," said Koch. "Our purses are just okay, they're not great. It's hard racing here, thank God for the people who do support us. I think the one reality is, I've got to go a little cheaper and try and race the cheaper ones."

Koch is hopeful of being able to card 24 races each weekend after the Pennsylvania tracks open and plans on doing what he must to make that happen.

"If we can get eight horses in a field, and that's the difference between us having 12 races or 11, it's clearly in our best interest to go with the eight horses," he said.

After a difficult two-month stretch, things figure to pick up some as stakes season rolls into East Rutherford. When the Big M has two or three stakes events on a given night, that's two or three fewer overnight races that need to be filled, which will clearly help. Freehold closes in June, and those horses will have some Meadowlands races written for them.

"It's frustrating," said Koch. "The rules have changed.

Forever in horse racing, handle generated purses and whoever handled the most had the best purses, and that's not the case anymore. I've always made the analogy that we're trying to play poker and have no wild cards while the other people at the table do."

58 nominated to the Pepsi North America Cup

The Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) announced Wednesday (March 2) that 58 three-year-old pacers have been nominated to the 33rd edition of the Pepsi North America Cup.

The \$1 million (Cdn) Pepsi North America Cup, the richest race in Canadian harness racing, will be contested on Saturday, June 18 at Mohawk Racetrack.

The group of 58 eligible three-year-olds is led by O'Brien Award winner Control The Moment. The Brad Maxwell trainee won eight of nine starts as a rookie, including the \$685,000 Metro Pace.

Control The Moment sports a 1:49.4 mark set while winning the Metro Pace.

Dan Patch Award winner Boston Red Rocks also headlines the list of nominees. The Steve Elliott trainee finished off his two-year-old campaign with victories in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine and the Governor's Cup at The Meadowlands.
