One year ago, we lost the incomparable Sam McKee (interviewing Christina Takter after Pinkman won the 2015 Hambletonian).

We've reached one year since the passing of Sam McKee. Born March 24, 1962, Sam just missed making it to his 55th birthday by a touch over two weeks. I'd be lying if I said I've moved on, that a whole truckload of things didn't remind me of Sam, that I didn't feel cheated or shorted in some way. Like many in the past 365 days, I've asked, "Why him?" It felt like Sam was snatched from our collective arms too soon. But I won't allow myself to go there for one very simple reason: Sam wouldn't allow it. You see, he's still with me. This past year, under his guidance — kind of a conscience sitting on my shoulder — we together put out the John Campbell retirement video.

I've done the math and I am proud to announce that I believe I may have worked more with Sam McKee than anyone else. Eighteen years at the Meadowlands and 16 years at Harrisburg. If this seems a bit childish that I'd be doing this kind of arithmetic — and that it would matter at all — so be it. Fifty four years just wasn't enough for me, nor his treasured girls. Safe to say, we all wanted more. But, because Sam would have insisted that our focus be elsewhere, I'll take my own selfishness out of it and tell you some more about the man, the friend, the father, the confidant, the person.

There's a saying that goes, "Life is not measured by the numbers of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away." It is imperative for me, and I would think better for us all who cared and admired Sam, to realize how fortunate we were to have had him for 54 plus years. To unify and continue on — just as he would like — to better ourselves, help the sport we care for the most and simply become the best that we can be. Sam had a certain calmness, a kindness, and a welcoming way that was simply part of his DNA. He could be folksy, he could be corporate. It was the very same guy who had the sturdiness to tell the truth and then the compassion to lead a handful of kids over to the Big Bounce for the first time.

I remember 1999, when Sam and his family first moved here. We were taping the "Inside Track"-and Sam made the smoothest of transitions fitting right in. That was also a Hambletonian record-setting season — Self Possessed in 1:51.3. By that summer, he already belonged. He made an immediate impression. He worked, he cared, he mentored and he excelled. Upon first looks, you might have thought and you'd have been right — that his man was boundlessly unselfish. It seemed like he came into this world with an extended hand — one to help one along, to lift you up, or maybe to help you find your way. In the 52 weeks since his passing, I'm still hearing anecdotes about the artist where Sam went out of his way to get his display out front and center, or the administrative assistant who was trying to find out how to do something and then realized, "Oh, that's right, Sam did that, too."

Though the new guy on the block in 1999, Sam was quickly bringing plenty to the table and established himself as reliable — something of a Go-To Guy right from the start. It wasn't long before I found out that trying to keep up with Sam was like trying to stuff a marshmallow into a piggy bank. But it was a good thing. Hey, we were all on the same side with a common purpose and Sam was as vital a Meadowlands employee as there ever was. Just more versatile. All hats seemed to fit.

Allow me to ramble on with some word associations, or two, concerning Sam: Smooth, caring, interested, total recall, range of topics, versatility, tireless, wanna-be driver, "big move", Jug Day, Red Mile, generosity, Michigan Wolverines, Starbucks, "The Man-The Myth-The Legend", Martin Truex, Nascar, undeniable efficiency, family, Harness Horse Youth Foundation.

They say you are judged by the amount of lives you've touched.

I am also reminded about something I didn't think that much about until recently. David Miller and Sam McKee. Great friends. Both moved east in 1999 to give it a go at the Meadowlands. It was not an experiment, they were both all in. Both had only daughters, both were already established in the field, just not on a national level. Though on the quieter side, they both rose to the top of their profession and you can hardly think of Jug Day without either of them in the picture. Both made the Hall Of Fame — back-to-back years (2012-2013). Fittingly, Sam's last signature call was of Always B Miki setting the world standard of 1:46 in a race with David Miller driving.

I cannot help but be saddened that Sam didn't get to see the first overtime Super Bowl, or the first disqualification from first in the Hambletonian. He didn't get to chat about why the Mets and the Detroit Tigers had off seasons in 2017. But his race calls live on, his teachings echo every day in our ears and his handshake forever extended. You know THAT handshake, right? I used to think only ambassadors at the United Nations got those.

In 2012-2013, Sam and I entered the Communicators Hall Of Fame together. Put simply, it couldn't possibly get any better than that.

I have often felt that somebody, likely a school principal or a grandparent, pointed a young Sam McKee in the right direction a whole bunch of years ago. Like when he was in early grade school. They told him to go out into the world, make it a better place, always help others, be polite and respectful and don't look for accolades. I'd like to thank that person or persons who did this. Many, many thanks.

I also remember Sam as a man for all age groups. On the board of the Harness Horse Youth Foundation, he was equally at home with the teens as he was with the 70-somethings that would stop by the TV set. There were no boundaries of any sort. Ever.

We're in 2018. Think about how many people you currently know who are happiest when they are taking their daughter to practice, shovelling, out a neighbor, bringing coffee to a co-worker, checking to see if your flight was on time. Outside

of a husband or wife, this is a bygone era. Sam was a throwback guy, one who found that 24 hours in the day simply wasn't enough for his girls. Melissa McKee told me last year, "If you think my father was a great person to work with, you wouldn't believe what he was like as a father." Somehow, I did.

I hope I speak for the many thousands of lives that Sam touched. Not everybody has a forum to speak through. I am so proud to know his family, so happy to have had the opportunity to have worked side by side, myself Ken Warkentin and Sam made for an great team.

There's a saying: "They were men before they were monuments." Think about this, say in 30-40 years. I want to be a fly on the wall for the person who looks at the bronze statue of Sam McKee and is explaining Sam to his/her children. Or students.

Finally, there's an expression that says, "Service to others is the rent you pay for your room in heaven." There can be little doubt that Sam's suite is second to none.

# The winner of my dream race of elite trotters is...

As promised last week (**full promise here**) here's how my dream race of trotters would turn out:

The field for the first, and most likely last, version of the Red Mile Elite Trot is about ready to go to the gate. The entries from the rail out are Mission Brief, Moni Maker, Continentalvictory, Hannelore Hanover, Self Possessed, Sebastian K, Varenne, and Muscle Hill.

The field is in the hands of the starter.

The field is on gait.

As the Preferred Equine Marketing starting gate passes mid stretch, where the famed tunnel used to be, all the horses look great and we are primed for a perfect start.

They're off and trotting.

Continental victory and Sebastian K are first off the wings with Muscle Hill and the White Knight in close pursuit. Mission Brief, Moni Maker, Hannelore Hanover, Self Possessed and Varenne elected to remain out of the early fray, but remain in a fairly tight pack.

Iron Mike and Continentalvictory relinquish the lead to Sebastian K albeit grudgingly and as the quarter comes up in a swift :25.4 Muscle Hill finds a spot at the rail third with Mission Brief gapping slightly.


Heading down the backstretch toward the half-mile pole, Sebastian K is on an easy lead followed by Continentalvictory who looks a bit uncomfortable in the hole followed by Muscle Hill, Mission Brief, Moni Maker, Hannelore Hanover, Self Possessed and Varenne.

As they reach the 3/8 Iron Mike pulls the pockets with Continentalvictory and goes right by Sebastian K to take the lead also on the move is Minnucci with Varenne not satisfied to sit last and he is looking for cover. Continentallvictory hits the half in :53.1, a ridiculous number. It looks like the

\$100,000 bonus that was offered by the Red Mile for breaking the world record is definitely coming into play.

Heading toward the three quarters, the action really starts to develop. Sears and Muscle Hill are first to pull, followed by Yannick and Mission Brief. Ake was satisfied to sit in with Sebastian K, thus causing a four-in-four out situation at the 3/4 in 1:20.2, a truly blistering pace. Continentalvictory basically responsible for all the fractions thus far maintains a half-length lead with Muscle Hill breathing down her throat. Sebastian K third on the rail looks to have a ton of trot as does Mission Brief right to his outside. Hennessey with Moni Maker is in a real tight spot fifth on the rail with plenty of horse as well as Hannelore Hanover with nowhere to go and Self Possessed will be forced to go three deep in that treacherous last turn to get around the floundering Varenne who has spent the entire mile in the middle of the track.

They have a quarter of a mile to trot and they turn for home. Continentalvictory still looks strong but after these fractions how strong could she be? Muscle Hill is still at her stride for stride, Mission Brief looms a danger as does Self Possessed who Campbell now tips three deep to get around Varenne and looks loaded with trot. Sebastian K, Moni Maker and Hannelore Hanover are all trapped on the rail and behind what looks like a faltering Continentalvictory. By mid stretch trotters are coming from everywhere. Muscle Hill has



now taken a slight lead, Mission Brief can't keep up to him. Hennessey somehow magically escapes the rail and launches a last ditch effort with Moni Maker while Campbell after his three wide move with Self Possessed is still coming hard down the center of the track. Self Possessed looks to be going by Muscle Hill but the tough colt fights back and they are fighting for every inch nose to nose to the wire As they hit the finish line it's too close to call and it doesn't matter as the crowd is applauding wildly for the new world record — 1:48.3. But to whom will it belong?

After a 20-minute wait it was announced that the record belonged to both of them as the photo was deemed a dead heat. A fabulous finish to a fabulous horse race. Moni Maker who raced well late was third, Hannelore Hanover finished fourth and Mission Brief received the fifth and last check,

The question now is does each winner receive the \$100,000 bonus or is it split? Better ask Joe Costa.

The open house party for all involved will be at 8 pm at Le Deauville Restaurant where Angelo Cardin will be the invited chef and Murray Brown will supply the Screaming Eagle, Bob Waxman the Petrus, Bill Perretti the Caymus Special Select and Marty Granoff the Chateau d'Yquem. Angelo is keeping the entire menu a secret.

Back to the questions at hand.

# Dave Briggs asks: What is the dumbest rule currently in harness racing and why?

"I wish I could narrow it down to one but there are so, so many that come to mind. First and most important is the trainer responsibility rule. In my opinion, for every bad guy trainer caught, three innocents suffer. There are far too many ways for a horse to have a positive without human intervention, this in itself negates the favorability of the trainer responsibility rule. I myself have been a victim of this frivolous rule on two separate occasions. I had a Lasix positive. Truly an act of god. Where in hell could a horse in my barn get Lasix? Maybe she called the pharmacy for an outgoing order. Please don't be ridiculous after training horses for the better part of half a century. I find it ludicrous that I could be fined for such a dumb circumstance. I wish I had another solution to the problem but I do not.

The next inane rule is interfering with the post parade while warming up. First, they limit your available time on the track by taking blood in a less than timely fashion and they almost force you commit this treasonous act.

And lastly, no speaking during the post parade or scoring down. This could be okay if they didn't make the score five

minutes or more longer than every race. The reason for the rule is that it looks like collusion on the track. If drivers are going to play games they will do it at lunch not in front of an entire audience. Where do these ideas come from?

# Bill Peters asks: What is your best advice for anyone wanting to win the Hambletonian?

That's simple: go buy a lottery ticket. It's cheaper.

No, of course I am kidding. If you have a lot of money, and a lot of patience it can be done but you must have a lot of time, as well.

Since the Hambletonian has moved from DuQuoin IL in 1981 to the Meadowlands, almost every famed trotting horse trainer that trains 20 or more colts has won the race at least once and a few have won it multiple times.

Partnerships have made what was once a monumental task a whole lot easier.

To begin with, you need a good trainer before you consider a horse. Pick a guy or girl that has a good reputation and has been to the big show before. It's like the Final Four, the been-there-done-that coaches end up in the winner's circle. The same with horse racing.

I am not saying to eliminate those who have not won from consideration. You may as well include a few that have been



knocking on the door.

Now that you have a trainer and money to spend, go buy a horse or two or more.

I have exhausted myself on yearling selection in this column so I will carry this no further. But remember, winning isn't everything. If you find yourself finishing second, to quote Michel Lachance, "you will be crying out of one eye."

#### Peter Cummins asks: What is your biggest fault?

Great question, it would probably take a novel to answer it properly. Peter, to be honest, I have a myriad of faults, many of which I would rather not discuss in an open forum. To be very candid now that I have started to answer you, I am a bit sorry I selected this question, but as someone once said, never look back, always look forward.

I am going to give you an equine related answer rather than a totally personal one.

I think my greatest fault is that I look at horses the same way I look at women. I can find something I like in all of them. This can prove extremely expensive, and often a total waste of physical and mental energy.

I have always believed that if a colt can be 100 percent perfect for a quarter of a mile there is no reason why I can't

get the other three quarters correct. Most times it's not as easy as I think it will be. However, in the long run it does work, but it becomes a matter of time and money. As expensive as it is to train today it would be good advice to put projects behind us and start with something fresh. Frank Antonacci has said of me, "Gurfein is great at fixing colts but if he doesn't do it in a minute it's most likely not going to happen." Maybe my dwelling is a major fault but it also provides me with mental entertainment.

Thanks again to all my readers. I hope you enjoyed this column as much as I did writing it. The horse race was a new challenge to me. My editor asks what was the best and worst thing about growing up in New York City? The answer next week.

# In Ontario, AGCO takes steps towards driver integrity

Last week concluded the first series of what's being described as paddock meetings across Ontario, in which Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) officials met with respective driver colonies at tracks across the province. In these meetings, discussed was a step-up in the expectations and enforcement rules already on the books.

The paddock meetings were the result of a series of consultation and workshop groups for over the past year, and the timing of these meetings now couldn't be any more appropriate as the items discussed in the meetings have never been more prevalent on the racetrack.

From consultation on rules and regulations over the past year with different internal and external AGCO stakeholders across the province, there were consistent things noted throughout the roundtable and reform meetings. Most notably, the consistent enforcement of common rule violations.

From there, AGCO Director of Racing Brent Stone describes how those findings came to be and how they led to the paddock meetings taking place today.

"At the same time we were going through our AGCO consultation period, the USTA with John Campbell leading the charge started up a rule review process as well to get consistent rules across not just the States but also into Canada," Stone said. "When you take that along with the concurrent rules review by (Standardbred Canada president) Dan Gall, we saw a bit of a common theme in the need for greater consistency in enforcing those rules identified.

"One of our senior race officials, Tom Miller, attended the USTA meetings and was briefed on the Standardbred Canada updates. He was able to sit down with other managers and supervisors and we were able to come up with a list of things that we wanted to go out and having paddock meetings with the drivers throughout Ontario and bring some of these rules to their attention to educate them and ask for compliance with these rules."

The areas of the rules targeted by AGCO for these paddock meetings will be of no surprise to anyone who follows

harness racing.

Detailed by Stone, these items include keeping post parades in order, correcting the optics of drivers talking to one another on the track, ensuring all horses are on the gate and having good starts, the issue of keeping racing competitive with regards to not giving up holes and keeping holes closed, drivers pulling horses to the outside and then intentionally not advancing, slow fractional times, allowing horses to needlessly pass up the inside, and consistency in the enforcement of urging rules.



There are dual purposes to the paddock meetings. On one hand, they are designed to educate drivers of the rules, but they also serve as a warning and put drivers on notice that judges will be taking a harder line with regards to questionable actions and tactics that had been somewhat more tolerated in the past.

While the paddock meetings are a necessary and positive result from the series of working groups, one only needs to look at racing on a daily basis to see the need for the enforcement of rules.

Using the WEG tracks of Mohawk and Woodbine as examples, since they're the most high-profile tracks in Ontario, it's clear that drivers have taken liberties with the rules. The lax enforcement of rules has allowed a culture of buddy systems and unwritten gentlemen's agreements to take form and as a result, the racing product suffers.

To this point, this past week on social media, two-time Hambletonian winning trainer and Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee Blair Burgess got into it a bit with two top WEG drivers over the relationship amongst drivers during a race. What Burgess did was essentially raise the point that drivers selectively pick and choose with other drivers they elect to give holes to, so that drivers from outside post positions can leave knowing that there will be a hole waiting for them. Burgess also addressed the issue of horses pulling to the outside and not advancing as a detriment; not coincidentally one of the topics that Stone also described.

One of the many issues with rules not being enforced is that it naturally lends itself to questionable drives. Stone acknowledged this concern.

"We want our officials to make sure there is a compliance with the rules, but also at the same time they have to be able to read a race," Stone said. "And to understand the natural flow of a race and heavy favorites that are driven a certain way should be in their mindset when they see something that looks out of the norm, so to speak."

In fact, AGCO judges did call into question a drive from Louis Philippe Roy from Feb. 9, as noted on that night's AGCO Senior Judges Report.

In this race [race can be seen here], Roy drove even money favorite Bettim Jackie and made the front easily. On the lead, Roy was approached by Jody Jamieson on an 18-1 longshot attempting to quarter move. Jamieson's horse is under all sorts of urging to try to clear while the track announcer's call goes "Bettim Jackie taken under a hard hold here by Roy." Roy did everything he could to let Jamieson's longshot go by and predictably, Jamieson's horse came to an immediate stop taking Roy's even money horse out of the race. The kicker in this is that Roy did all he could to let Jamieson go while restraining his mount through a second quarter fraction of just :29:3.

In the AGCO judges report six days later from Feb. 15, Roy was assessed a \$300 penalty for driving in an unsatisfactory

manner. Interestingly, this same Feb. 15 card featured a race with a suspect drive perhaps even worse than Roy's, but no mention was made on the night's report about a driver being called in for review. In race 8 from this night [race can be seen here], Sylvain Filion was driving even money favorite Beachin Lindy. Filion sat the pocket while being wrangled throughout the mile to not run over the horse in front of him. With every chance to pull around the final turn, Filion elected to stay in and it was obvious enough to the point where the track announcer flatly commented "Filion failed to pull." Amidst the confusion, Beachin Lindy broke, came back on and somehow still just missed in a race where he was 10 lengths the best.

These two races present instances where if judges are going to take a sterner approach in enforcing the rules, that there is consistency in holding drivers accountable in races that look similar.

AGCO's paddock meetings and making a more concentrated effort to enforce existing rules is a step in the right direction. It will remain to be seen, however, if simply enforcing the rules will be enough to promote further integrity, or if new rules and tougher measures need to be taken.



# Statistics suggest Haughton is on the right path at Yonkers

Cammie Haughton was ecstatic as he drove over the George Washington Bridge on his way home from the track around midnight Monday, Feb. 26. Bettors pumped \$927,279 through the windows on that evening's 12-race program, signaling to Haughton the changes he's made since assuming the role of director of racing are paying off.

"When I went over the G.W. Bridge the other night doing almost \$1 million, I was like, 'Yeah man, this is great! We're almost there," Haughton said. "I was so happy, just thrilled to death. Who else does that? Who else is happy to do that for racing? I'm happy with the position I got and I'm happy to help. Things are working."

In his new role, Haughton's primary mission is to increase handle on the track's races. His daily routine that involves working with the broadcast department, executive office, race office, and the horsemen before presiding over the scheduling of races in the evening means he has a hand in nearly everything that goes on at the track.

"When I leave there at night, my head is spinning. But here it is on my day off and I'm thinking about all this, but you have to," Haughton said. "That's the thing, I do care. I'm not the guy to just sit around and not do anything. I'm on it, I'm on it big time."

Thus far, his initiatives are producing results. Domestic and international commingled handle at Yonkers from Jan. 1 through Feb. 28 topped \$29.2 million on 424 races, a 64.2 per cent increase from the \$17.8 million bet on 419 contests over the same period last year.

Just over two months into his tenure in his new role, Haughton is already making a reputation for himself as someone who gets things done. He cited the driver's room at the track as an example. The room was in disrepair when he found it, but will soon get a needed facelift.

"The tiles are coming up off the floor, it needs to be painted, the lockers all need to be emptied and cleaned. So, guess what? I got it done," Haughton said. "I got the brand-new floor ordered, I got the painters, I talked to the horseman, we're ready to get the lockers emptied and moved. We're going to have a new locker room here in a couple weeks. You have to do those things, you have to."

While it may seem arbitrary to the racing product, completing projects like this are part of Haughton's mission to leave no stone unturned. He describes his strategy as a back to basics approach that focuses on making common-sense improvements to deliver the best racing product possible to the gambling public. He formed his strategy in the months leading up to commencing his term as director of racing when he put himself in the customers' shoes.

"Before I got my job, I sat and observed the races for two

months. I knew I was going to be director of racing, but I didn't have the job yet," Haughton said. "So, I was observing and writing down all these things that needed to be done on a pad and a piece of paper."

Haughton noted a lack of racing action, poor scheduling of post times, and the live broadcast as areas in need of major improvement. Beyond simply identifying the problems, he began working to solve them immediately. His first stop was a meeting with the drivers where he laid out his plans and sought their support.

"I told them the wolves will be at our door if we don't start turning this thing around," Haughton said. "I told them basically, 'look, if you don't like what I'm going to be doing, first of all, it's for your benefit – the drivers and the trainers and the horsemen, it's for everybody's benefit. If you don't like what I'm doing here, go race somewhere else.' All the drivers are cooperating 100 per cent with what's going on."

Haughton cites the support of the Yonkers horsepeople and the Standardbred Owners Association of New York as a critical component of his ability to make changes at the track. He sees them as partners in his mission to improve the racing, not as resistors who want to keep the status quo.

"They want change, I can see, and they want a better product," Haughton said. "I feel that when they see me walk in the paddock and I'm dressed in a tie and a jacket, very professional, that's how I was brought up in my family, I think they kind of like that, that somebody's watching the ship now.

"They're willing to do whatever it takes and it's working. I'm very thrilled with the cooperation of the SOA, the cooperation of the management, and everybody around me wants to help."

With the horsemen on his side and aware of his expectations, Haughton stunned the harness racing world

when he announced his next move: the removal of the passing lane from Yonkers' half-mile racetrack.

"They either pull or they get locked in. It's called racing," Haughton said. "With the passing lane, the first five horses would go around the track and they would know that when you get to the stretch, it's a lot easier. So, they sit, and they sit, and they sit. That's not racing to me. They're racing now."

Without the passing lane, the percentage of winning favorites at Yonkers through the end of February was 37.7 per cent, a 10.2 percent decrease from the 42 per cent strike rate of favorites over the same period in 2017.

While detractors protested the move, citing concerns that bettors would lose chances to cash if their horses lacked racing room in the stretch, Haughton takes another argument. When he considered the point from the bettors' perspective, he saw increased opportunities for trip handicappers to find value.

"I saw a horse locked in the other night that had all kinds of pace in the stretch and obviously, he couldn't get through," Haughton said. "Here's a gambler who's playing Yonkers Raceway, that puts it in his mind that number four was locked in last week and couldn't get out. He's going to bet that horse the following week. He's going to follow that horse and know that he had pace in the stretch and couldn't get out."

Although the removal of the passing lane is the most glaring change Haughton has made, he thinks other initiatives have been just as important in increasing handle. Proper scheduling of post times has had the biggest impact on betting volume than any other change, he said.

"Scheduling the times is very, very important. That is the most important," Haughton said.

The scheduling of post times involves two components. First, he ensures post parades are scheduled to give bettors



ample time to evaluate the horses as a physical specimen before placing a wager. Second, Haughton aims to make sure Yonkers' races go off between other major racetracks to avoid conflicts.

"It was blowing my mind, the horses coming out onto the racetrack for two minutes and going right to the gate," he said. "How do you get money in the pools if they're out there for two minutes and go right to the gate? You can't do it. It's impossible."

Haughton's efforts to coordinate post times has already spurred increased communication and cooperation from other racetracks, the historical lack of which has been a constant gripe of gamblers playing multiple racetracks for years.

"The other racetracks, they're even calling me now. 'Can you slow down a little bit because we have 15 races, you have 12 and we're trying to go in between and it's getting late for us.' Then I have to make a decision," Haughton said.

Haughton's choice to keep horses on the track longer before the start plays off one of his other initiatives, to improve the quality of Yonkers' simulcast presentation. One of his primary areas of focus thus far has been to ensure each horse gets a clear, close up camera shot before the race. Haughton understands the vast majority of his customers aren't at the track. Rather than fight this, he is catering to these players' needs.

"It's not like it was years ago when 20,000 people were coming out for racing. There's basically nobody at the tracks now, it's all coming in from simulcast," he said. "I told every operator that runs these cameras, 'I want close ups on these guys. I don't want these horses looking like ants on a screen.' It's better for the people who are sitting home watching the races."

Haughton isn't finished tweaking the product at Yonkers. As the year goes on, he will look to make more changes. He teased increased improvements to the broadcast as one of the changes to look out for.

"The good weather is coming. I'm going to throw a camera on top of the paddock, on the roof. We've got that in motion," he said. "As soon as the good weather comes on a Friday or Saturday night, I'm going to have a camera up there. Close up shots as they come around the final turn. Like NASCAR, they have cameras everywhere. You've got to change it up."

Haughton has also been pleased with the initiative of offering free full card past performances on Monday evenings, an initiative undertaken in cooperation with the SOA of NY. He hopes to see that promotion expanded to

include additional nights in the future.


"That's fantastic. That's another thing that we have to get up on our broadcast and show," he said. "Here's the thing, if you don't promote it and get on it and get it out there, nothing's going to happen."

Other possible future initiatives include increased field sizes, a reworking of the racing classifications and the racing schedule, and a slanted starting gate to aid the chances of outside horses. While these are still in the early planning phases, Haughton notes he has plenty of time to forge ahead with them.

"I love the starting gate idea, I love it," he said. "I think it's going to happen. Right now, our handle is up, racing is never better, the track seems to be very, very good as far as the surface. Things are good. Now if they keep going in the good way, maybe that starting gate will come.

"Here's the thing. We've got the eyes on us now at Yonkers Raceway and I want to keep that. Now I just need to keep the interest in what we're doing."

Yonkers Raceway races on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday basis with a first post time of 6:50 p.m.

# Healthy Anthony Napolitano leading the Big M driving colony

A year after sitting out the winter racing to recover from an accident, Napolitano is on a roll at the Meadowlands.

After sitting out last winter to recuperate from the lingering effects of a racing accident, Anthony Napolitano is happy with his results so far this winter. Napolitano is the leading driver at the Meadowlands in 2018, with 26 wins, and hoping for continued success throughout the year.

Napolitano, who notched 175 of his 200 wins in 2017 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, plans to continue racing at the Meadowlands on Fridays even after Pocono opens March 17. He also plans to race once a week at Yonkers, where he has picked up 15 wins this season.

This Friday, Napolitano has 10 drives on the Meadowlands' 13-race card. "Meadowlands Harness Live" airs from 9-10 p.m. on SNY (SportsNet New York) and features races seven through nine.

"I feel good," Napolitano said. "I feel like I'm just getting started. Things are looking good for the future; hopefully we can keep it going."

Napolitano was injured in an accident May 31, 2016 at Pocono. He was sidelined for nearly two months, returning to action at the end of July, but decided in November to take additional time away from the track. In March 2017, Napolitano returned to the sulky and recorded 200 wins and \$2.64 million in purses the rest of the way.

"I rushed it back," Napolitano said. "It was a struggle for me. I had to make a decision, whether to shut down shop and regroup, or continue the way I was going. It wasn't good for me. I wasn't comfortable in the bike and I couldn't get horses up on the bit. I wanted to be a hundred per cent.

"Last year I took off to rest my back. I was happy I was able to take off the winter and heal the right way because if I had kept pushing myself the injury could have lingered throughout the rest of my career. It definitely worked."

The 36-year-old Napolitano, the younger brother of perennial Pocono driving champ George Napolitano Jr., has won 2,491 races in his career and earned at least \$2 million in purses the past three years.

Until recently, Napolitano spent the winters driving at Florida's Pompano Park. He started driving at the Meadowlands during the winters in 2015. In his first winter, November 2015-March 2016, he won 48 races — second best

among all drivers during that time frame — and produced a positive 20 per cent return on investment (ROI) for his backers.

Overall at the Meadowlands since November 2015, Napolitano has won 15 per cent of his races, 94 of 625, and produced a positive 23 per cent ROI. His ROI is the best among all drivers during that time span.

"I'm just happy to be in the mix of things," Napolitano said.
"I'm going to try to stay at Yonkers on Thursday and
Meadowlands on Friday throughout the year instead of
quitting them completely. I'm going to try to keep my foot in
the door this year and see how it goes. I'm just thankful I can
go to these tracks and people are willing to use me."

He also is thankful to feel completely healthy.

"It makes you appreciate what you've got," he said.



# Conversation with Marcus Melander

In only his third full season as a trainer, Marcus Melander enjoyed a memorable year that culminated with Fourth Dimension being named the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter.

Melander, who turned 26 in January, came to the U.S. from Sweden less than five years ago and worked for trainer Jimmy Takter before starting his own stable in late 2014. He is based in New Egypt, NJ at a farm that was home previously to the legendary Stanley Dancer and Continental Farms stables.

Last year, Melander's horses won 38 races and \$1.31 million in purses, nearly tripling his earnings from the previous season. His victories in 2017 included the Valley Victory Stakes with Fourth Dimension, a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial with Long Tom, and an elimination of the Hambletonian Stakes with Enterprise, who later was fourth-placed-third in the final.

Melander's stable this year numbers 40 horses, with the majority being 2-year-olds. He recently took time to talk with Ken Weingartner, the U.S. Trotting Association's media relations manager.

**KW**: First of all, congratulations on Fourth Dimension receiving the Dan Patch Award. What does that mean to you, especially at such a young age?

**MM**: That meant a lot. There are so many good horses and so many good trainers. To have the best one, it means a lot, especially in my third year as a trainer. Like you said, I'm young, and it's not easy to get those awards. I'm very happy with it.

**KW**: What's it been like getting settled here in the States and how have you seen your stable change?

MM: The first year when I was here, we only had about six babies (2-year-olds). We had a couple that were okay. But after that, I got a horse (Clifton Beach) from (owner) Courant. He was a 3-year-old gelding that made breaks, but I did good with him. After that, I got some more horses from them and we did well. That's when I started to pick owners up. You need to have good owners to have good horses. I'm very thankful to all my owners.

**KW:** What have you learned over the first couple years?

**MM**: First of all, I learned a lot when I worked for Jimmy Takter my first year here. Then I went on my own. You've got to put horses in the right condition, you have to figure out

travel, there is always stuff you look at and maybe change. Last year with Enterprise for the Goodtimes we went back and forth (to Canada) and he was no good in the final because he had a problem with ulcers. Maybe we should have stayed up there. You're always learning things. I'm only 26. I've got a lot to learn still. But I'm feeling more comfortable every season.

**KW**: Have you done anything different training wise? Changed your approach?

**MM**: Maybe a little bit. Last year we had a really good year with both the 2- and 3-year-olds. But you always look to improve things. You think about things as you're out there driving.

**KW:** With the experience you gained last year does that help you going forward?

**MM**: Oh yeah absolutely. With Long Tom and Enterprise, they started early very good and I think maybe I topped them

a little too early. They raced great until the (Hambletonian) and after that they flattened out a little bit and we had some bad racing luck. That's stuff you learn too. Maybe we won't qualify as early. But it was a little different because Enterprise only made one start as a 2-year-old so you had to be going a little earlier.

**KW**: How are your 2-year-olds coming along?

**MM**: They're good. I'm very happy with all of them. It's a good group. I can't pick anyone out right now, but I'm looking forward to seeing them race.

KW: Are they all trotters?

**MM**: I've got three pacers. I've got 25 trotters and three pacers. It's fun. They're really nice. I've got one Captaintreacherous colt (Sundown Showdown) and one Sweet Lou filly (Sweet Body) and a Roll With Joe colt (Quickcallblue Chip). They pace very good. I'm happy with them. We'll see how they do.

**KW**: Do you see much difference with the pacers?

**MM**: No, like I said, I learned a lot the first year I was here working with Jimmy. We had a lot of pacers there. You maybe do some things differently, but it's not much different.

KW: Has it been an adjustment living in the States?

**MM**: I've loved it here from the day I got here. This will be my fifth year here. I'm happy. My whole family is here and there are a lot of Swedes around, friends and stuff, so it's good.

KW: What do you most like about living here?

**MM**: I like the racing here. In Sweden it's very good too, but it's a little bit different here. I just like it here.

**KW**: What do you most enjoy about working with the horses?

**MM**: We have really good horses this year. I'm looking forward to the season. Hopefully we can have a great year again. Hopefully everything goes well and we have a good year.

KW: Do you feel more pressure because of last year?

MM: Not really. It's not pressure. I have good owners that stand behind me. I'm feeling confident in what I do and I think that's the most important thing. You can't feel nervous about it. You have to train the horses the way you want and if it doesn't go well, maybe because of sickness or something else, then that is it. But you can't go around and feel pressure. I feel more excited and looking forward to the racing season getting started. It will be fun.

**KW:** This is the position you want to be in, with stakes horses.

**MM**: Oh yeah, absolutely. Thirty-seven of 40 (horses) are 2-and 3-year-olds. That's what we're looking for, for sure.

KW: What do you like to do when you're not working?

**MM:** I like to be on the farm. There is always work on a farm when you own it. I like to be on the farm. I never leave the farm much if I'm not going racing.

#### Huge Big M handle thanks to 'perfect storm'

Everything was in proper alignment Saturday night at the Meadowlands, as harness racing's handle leader had its biggest non-Meadowlands Pace or Hambletonian in two years, when the track saw \$3,454,633 pushed through the windows.

The handle was the highest since the track played host to the Breeders Crown on Oct. 29, 2016 (excluding the 2017 Meadowlands Pace and Hambletonian), when \$3,461,457 was wagered, only \$7,000 more than what was bet Saturday. Both cards had 13 races.

"The combination of a Pick-5 carryover, the World Harness Handicapping Championship tournaments, a \$90,000 Pick-4 pool, a \$120,000 Jackpot Super High Five carryover along with the cancellation of Friday's card created the perfect storm for a big handle night," said Jason Settlemoir, the track's chief operating officer and general manager.

"The night was great and the fact we almost handled what we did hosting the Breeders Crown Finals in 2016 is amazing. The Meadowlands players supported the Saturday card with incredible enthusiasm from start to finish. The last race went at 11:27 p.m., yet did almost a quarter of a million dollars, and all 13 races handled more than \$200,000."

Saturday's handle crushed the previous 2018 best of \$2,790,201 (established on Jan. 27) by 24 per cent while the per race average of \$265,741 was a little over \$50,000 more than the previous best of \$214,630 (also Jan. 27).

**PICKY, PICKY:** The \$30,000 carryover in the Pick-5 led to \$230,199 in "new money" for a final pool of \$260,401... Race 3, which is the first leg of the Pick-5, saw \$422,271 in wagers... The Pick-5 sequence (Races 3 through 7) handled \$1,430,565... The Pick-4 pool saw \$90,666 in play and served as the catalyst for that sequence (Races 8 through 11), which saw \$1,132,218 in play.

**SUPER JACKPOT:** This Friday, players will be waiting around until the end of the night for a shot at a big pot. The Late 20-Cent Jackpot Super High Five (Race 13) has a carryover of \$126,952. The bet requires one be the only ticket holder of the winning combination to rake the pot.

Even when the jackpot isn't hit, cashing a ticket can still be lucrative. On Saturday, those who had winning tickets cashed

in for \$1,600 for a 20-cent wager, that in a race where the Exacta paid only \$10.40.

Brodhurst estimates that he has owned more than 150 horses over the years but there is absolutely no doubt which one tops the list.

"He (Bridge Street) is why I've stayed in the game as long as I have," said Brodhurst. "He just never threw in a bad race and made all of his money the hard way while never winning a stake race. He means so much to our entire ownership group. I laugh when I think back to the circumstances of when we purchased him and I am glad it all worked out the way it did."

In fact it was the late George Griffin who urged the group to consider buying the yearling even though Brodhurst wasn't looking for another horse at the time. When the bidding reached \$10,000 Brodhurst had no intentions of raising his hand again. Fortunately, he didn't have to and rest as they say is history.

"It was George who first got me into the game in 1964 when we worked in the insurance business together," said Brodhurst. "His wife Shirley has remained partners and we've always had our horses with Scott and Kim McNiven. We've been fortunate to have a lot of nice racehorses and being inducted into the Wall Of Fame is truly and unexpected and special honour for all of us."

Bridge Street will be honoured during a special trackside ceremony and is expected to be on hand himself in the winner's circle and lead a post parade during the program.

"Bridge Street was the epitome of that iron-tough raceway horse," said The Raceway's director of racing Greg Blanchard. "His consistency for such a long period of time at such a high level is amazing. He just showed up week in and week out and loved his job. He was definitely the type of horse that both casual fans and horseplayers alike really appreciated and we are very pleased to induct him to our Wall Of Fame."

Wall Of Fame night will be part of a very busy month of May at The Raceway which also includes a special Mother's Day program on May 13, the Ontario Regional Driver's Championship on May 16 and the first ever Camluck Classic on closing day, Saturday, May 26.

# Plainridge Park preparing for 2018 season

The 2018 racing season gets underway at Plainridge Park Casino on April 16 with a projected purse range from \$4,000 to \$18,000 for overnight events. Plainridge Park Casino and the Harness Horsemen's Association of New England have developed a number of special events designed to enhance participation at the Massachusetts track during the upcoming meet.

An integral part of the package will feature a return to the variety of claiming series that were a staple at Plainridge during the early 2000's. Ten different claiming events are planned, each three weeks in length. Starting with a series for \$5,000 claimers in early May and escalating in price throughout the season, the finals for these events will range from \$7,500 up to \$25,000. There will also be two separate claiming series each for pacing mares and for trotters.

Recognizing the substantial investment in young horses, at least three different series for Non-Winners of 2 Races or \$15,000 Lifetime will be conducted during the month of May. Contested for legs of \$12,500 and \$20,000 finals these events will be written for 3 and 4-year-old pacing horses, mares and trotters. Should sufficient entries allow, the trotters will be divided by gender. There are also a pair of open events for two-year-old pacers and trotters planned during the late summer which will each compete for a \$20,000 final.

Three more series are scheduled for aged pacing horses,

pacing mares and trotters that were Non-Winners of \$35,000 in 2017. Contested over a period of three weeks, these events will race for \$10,000 in each of the legs and \$20,000 in each final.

There are no nominations or fees required for any of these series. Each will close with the draw for the first leg of the respective series. A fully detailed schedule of these events will be posted on the Plainridge website in the near future.

Plainridge Park will race Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays in April with a 4:00PM post time.
