Odds On Equuleus comes to Indiana for the 2018 breeding season after a distinguished racing career. The third fastest son of Art Major brings a solid record of production and desirable bloodlines to the Hoosier State. On the track, Odds On Equuleus battled the best on the Grand Circuit over multiple seasons. Some of his highlights include:

Won his \$87,550 International Stallion Stake division in a time of 1:50

Finished a neck behind Captaintreacherous in the \$1,000,000 Metro Final

Raced second in the \$635,750 Meadowlands Pace with a 1:48.4 effort

Paced second in the \$100,000 Meadowlands Maturity in a time of 1:49.3

At two, Odds On Equuleus banked over \$400,000 in earnings and hit the board in eight of nine seasonal starts, registering five wins. He captured his \$109,206 division of the Nassagaweya at Mohawk in 1:52.3, his fourth career start, before claiming a Metro elimination and racing a close second to Captaintreacherous in the final. The colt finished his freshman campaign with a victory at The Red Mile in the International Stallion Stake.

As a sophomore, Odds On Equuleus finished second five times in some of the sport's biggest races. He was second in a North America Cup elimination, runner-up in the Meadowlands Pace, and second in a Little Brown Jug heat, clocking a 1:50.3 mile before pacing in 1:51.2 later that afternoon in the Jug final. Odds On Equuleus finished in the money in the Empire Breeders Classic, Messenger Stake and American National.

Competing in the open ranks for four seasons, Odds On Equuleus continued to reach the winner's circle and log fast miles. He took his 1:47.3 mark at age five and paced in 1:48.4 as a seven year old in 2017, turning in miles in 1:51 or lower six times in his final season of racing. Driver Matt Kakaley suffered injuries to his face and collarbone in an accident during Yonkers Raceway's 10th race Tuesday night (March 13), but was discharged from hospital Thursday evening. He will see an eye specialist next week and get bone surgery under his eye.

Harnessracing.com reported on Thursday ([full story here](#)) that Kakaley suffered a broken nose and collarbone and facial fractures.

Fellow driver Mark MacDonald relayed an update on Kakaley's condition to Yonkers Raceway on Thursday at the request of Kakaley's girlfriend, Annie Larrabee.

Kakaley, driving Lawgiver Hanover, and Jim Marohn Jr., driving Big Jer, were at the rear of the field moving into the third turn of the \$15,000 pacing event. Lawgiver Hanover took a bad step, went down and threw Kakaley. Big Jer unseated Marohn Jr and ran off.

Kakaley, who turns 30 this coming Monday (March 19), was originally taken to Lawrence Hospital in nearby Bronxville, NY, then subsequently moved north to Westchester Medical Center (Valhalla, NY), where facial plastic surgery was performed.

MacDonald, who visiting Kakaley Thursday afternoon, said, "considering what he went through, he was in very good spirits, laughing and joking."

It was MacDonald's understanding that Kakaley is to be discharged from Westchester Medical sooner rather than later, returning sometime next week to have more work performed on his collarbone.

"I don't know if it's the best-case scenario, but it seems to be close," MacDonald said. "The doctors see no reason he won't recover and get back driving, maybe within five or six weeks."

Does Kakaley have any recollection of the accident?

"Not much," MacDonald said.

Lawgiver Hanover was euthanized. The 9-year-old son of Art Major had won 28-of-202 career starts with earnings of \$623,179.

Marohn Jr. and Big Jer both escaped injury, the former taking his final two scheduled Tuesday drives and with a full complement of Yonkers' Thursday assignments.

Further updates shall be provided as available. Kakaley has won 4,169 races and more than \$61.1 million in purse in a career that began in 2006.

Kakaley's mother, Linda Kakaley, told harnessracing.com that she is grateful for all the support Matt has received and wants to thank everyone that reached out to the family.

"Matt had surgery yesterday but will need two more surgeries later to repair the collarbone and some other facial injuries," Linda said. "But we're hopeful the doctors will be able to release him to go home as soon as today."

AGCO reviewing questionable Woodbine drive

After a number of readers contacted HRU questioning the drive of Louis Philippe Roy in the **8th race on March 8 at Woodbine**, we reached out to Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario's (AGCO) Director of Racing Brent Stone to ask if the race was being reviewed.

Stone responded promptly to an HRU email inquiry with the following: "I can advise you that AGCO Race Officials are currently reviewing the drive of Mr. Roy from race 8 on March 8th 2018 at Woodbine Racetrack."

Stone asked that HRU follow up directly with Senior Judge Don Lawrence and his panel. HRU will be reaching out to Lawrence and his team soon to get their direct assessment of Roy's drive in that race.

Growing up in NYC, one thing I would do over and how to know which horses are stakes worthy

My thoughts and prayers go out to my dear friends Matt Kakaley and Annie Larrabee. Matt was involved in a horrific accident at Yonkers on Tuesday night, and sustained some serious injuries. Matty, get well soon. Annie and the baby need you, and the sport needs you, as well.

On a personal note, this week has started with wonderful news. My daughter Lauren gave birth at 3 a.m. Monday to Oliver Zumbi Ferreira Cardoso a seven-and-a-half pound beautiful baby boy, my second grandson in a four-month period. The first was also my son Blake's first child, Lucas Dean Gurfein. Oddly enough, they were both born on the 12th — Oliver in March and Lucas in November. Lauren's husband, Cauam, and Blake's wife, Elizabeth, are all doing well.

Now to the question at hand from my friend and editor Dave Briggs: What was the best thing and the worst thing about growing up in New York City?

On the morning of Oct. 30, 1940 Ronald Stuart Gurfein entered the world at Woman Hospital on Fifth Avenue and 112th Street. To be perfectly honest, there was little that went wrong from there.

All areas have culture, it appears in various forms, but few places have a total lack of it. Some place are flooded with culture as is New York City, Paris, London etc. Places with a lot of history and a lot of people. Just the enormity of the population in an area as small as Manhattan Island creates opportunity for a plethora of learning experiences. I am sure I could write about many that would bore you to tears so I will only include a few that the city provided me with.

I lived on Fifth Avenue on the second floor and my bedroom window looked out on the avenue and Central Park. When the war ended, there was a parade up Fifth Avenue and then General Dwight David Eisenhower went right by my

window, I was five years old and was waving and totally awestruck. Just days before, my grandmother was walking me in the park and by chance she got in a conversation with a nicely dressed gentleman who turned out to be Admiral Robert Perry who discovered the South Pole. He either thought I was cute or had a crush on my grandma, because he autographed my baby picture. That photo is one of maybe four that remain in my home today.

The Audubon Society was next door to my house, the Metropolitan Museum of Art 10 blocks south, The Museum of Natural History and the Planetarium were just across the park and Public School 6, regarded still today as the finest first to eighth grade school in the country, walking distance

from my front door. Add to these the Public Library, the Metropolitan Opera, the Guggenheim Museum, the Museum of Modern Art, and Broadway all walking distance. This wasn't Kansas.

There are different modes of culture; food, as one example, rates high on my importance scale. As a child, I did eat home a lot but as I became older I ate out 100 per cent of the time. My parents divorced and I moved in with my dad in a small apartment on 62nd street and Park Avenue a wonderful neighborhood close to everything. My dad was a creature of habit, as am I. We both had a routine of places to go. There are 30,000 restaurants in Manhattan, but we would eat at four. Drinks at the Sherry Netherlands bar at 4:30. Today, it is restaurant Chipriani. Then dinner at Dino's, Valois, Voisin, or Le Cirque. Once in a while, he would break up the sequence with a visit to a local deli like the Stage or The Madison.


Although you walk most places in the city when I was a kid, we had a bicycle club that met every Saturday morning and we would either bike to Wall Street and take a ride on the ferry or go north to the Cloisters for a magnificent view of the Hudson, once again not Kansas.


I am not trying to demean other places just point out the vast opportunity that the city affords you. I lived happily in upstate New York where my kids grew up and they got a

more earthy culture not available in New York — swimming, horses, and skiing (downhill racing), boating, etc.; all things not available in the city.

Opportunity abounds and the closeness of everything and everyone opens doors, I had a school buddy Fred Fox, his father did the musical arrangement for the Sid Ceaser Show of Shows with Imogene Coca and I was periodically invited to see the show live. The cameras were so large in those days you couldn't see very much, but it was exciting meeting all the stars. Speaking of which, my dad had a custom tailoring shop on Madison Avenue and he made most of the clothes for the Rat Pack. One horribly rainy night, my wife and I came out of a Broadway show and it was impossible to find a cab. We were standing on the corner of 6th Avenue and 45th street a few feet from the famed Peppermint Lounge, in the downpour and a limousine pulls up, Sammy Davis sticks his head out and says, 'Ronnie get in the car.' We enter the limo to find Sammy and his wife Mai Britt (gorgeous) drinking champagne welcoming us like we were old friends. My wife was awestruck. Not in Ohio.

As recently as 10 years ago on a Monday night, my wife and I sat at a table in Balthazar and a few minutes later Ellen Degeneres and Anne Heche sat down next to us. The next night we are dining at Nello and then minutes later the

same two sit down. Not Ohio.

What can I fault with growing up in New York, only that it spoils you. With the exception of Paris and maybe Milan there is no place comparable. I could fault the traffic, but it's almost as bad in Boca Raton today.

The kids I went to school with ended up famous doctors, attorneys (my best friend Eric Kronfeld was the lawyer for The Rolling Stones for 20 years).

I attended The Bronx High School Of Science and only God knows the amount of genius that flowed from those hallways. It's been a marvelous ride and the moral of the story is if you have the opportunity to raise your kids in Manhattan, do it.

There have been other city boys in the standardbred business — Andy Grant, Charlie Karp, Jeff Gural, who was my neighbor for a while, and Mike Kimmelman, along with David Sharf, Bobbi Boni and the baron of Pine Hollow Stud Morton Finder. I would be remiss if I didn't mention Michal Klau of Muscle Hill fame, and I can't leave out the newbie to the group Murray Brown via Montreal and Hanover, PA, and his lovely wife Carol Stein.

Russell Crawford after being extremely complimentary asks: If you could do any one thing over, what would it be and what would the desired outcome?

My initial reaction was to say not marrying the first two times and then I thought that was definitely not a good answer. The first two experiences into the world of holy matrimony were not great, but fun, and in their own way, rewarding. Instead, I will give a more horse-related answer.

Once again the answer involves my good friend Frank "the elder" Antonacci.

It was the first Sunday in August, 1991. Frank and I were standing in front of MB Felty's stall. This was the colt that finished second in the Hambletonian the day before. He was laying down, listless, with his head hanging. Frank turned to me and said he looks dead tired, let's turn him out for a week. I said, 'Great idea,' but in the back of my mind I knew it was not a great idea because sometimes when you change the schedule on a racehorse it can backfire.

Sure enough, the colt was out for a half-hour, got hung up in a fence and was never the same colt. He was too sore for the World Trotting Derby, The Kentucky Futurity and the Breeders Crown. Major disappointment.

Experience Victory, the \$650,000 colt, was the same scenario. He was racing really well and one day I said to Emma, his caretaker, 'He looks tired to me,' so we turned him out at Brittany Farm for a week. When he returned to the barn he was a totally different horse, so mean he tried to kick

Emma's head off, and pulling so hard I had to put a snake bit in his mouth. Week after week he got worse flipping a palate, and noisy as hell. He went from being the perfect colt to a unmanageable, choking, beast.

I am not going to tell you don't be kind to animals. That would be ridiculous. However, breaking the routine of a top racehorse can bite you in the butt.

If I didn't go out of the way to give extra time to those horses, they may have been names we would talk about today.

Joel Kravet asks: When should a trainer know or start to realize which of his colts are stake worthy and which he can cull to smaller horizons? I realize that it's hard as some horses find themselves late in training.

When dealing with pacing horses, this is far more difficult than trotters. With pacing horses going great on March 15, go with pedigree that seems to me to be a great filter. Trotters on the other hand are a totally different story. The great ones show up in December, by January you are saving their speed to such an extent that you always feel you have 20 seconds in reserve after you training miles. That's five seconds per quarter, and is quite meaningful.

If you have trained great horses you know what they feel like. Experience will make it easier as time goes on.

I do however have a method that will definitely work. Although not foolproof — nothing is — it will help young trainers a lot. Train your colt a good quarter without carrying a watch, and have some one timing you. If you think you went a quarter in 30 seconds and you were timed in 36 the colt is working too hard and most likely not a candidate for a successful two-year-old campaign. If you think the colt went a quarter in 36 seconds and he actually went 30 seconds you have the makings of a good horse that gets over the ground with little effort.

Don't get me wrong I am not saying that pedigree is not important in trotters I just feel it is of less importance than with the pacing horse.

Committee approves microchipping; new eSales portal at USTA annual meeting

The USTA Registration Committee approved a proposal that will require all standardbreds, starting with foals born in 2019, to be implanted with a microchip for identification during the USTA Board of Directors meeting Sunday (March 11) at the Hilton-Easton in Columbus, OH.

The microchips, which are manufactured by Merck/HomeAgain, will be implanted in the horse's nuchal ligament, which is high on the neck between the poll and the withers. When scanned with a special reader, the reader will display a number which will correspond to the horse's USTA identification number. The reader will also display the horse's body temperature.

"The chips are 'passive,' which means that when scanned, they give us the identification number and the horse's temperature," said TC Lane, USTA director of registry and member services. "However, that number could then be tied to software that could display pertinent medical records, vaccination records, or even eligibility data."

Microchips will replace freeze brands and lip tattoos as means of standardbred identification. USTA ID technicians will be trained to implant the microchips for members. During the same visit, they will also collect a DNA sample from the horse for testing.

In the proposal approved by the committee, all racehorses would be required to have a microchip implanted by 2021.

In his 2018 USTA Statistical Report, Lane showed the directors that mares bred was up again for the second straight year. In 2015, 12,325 mares were bred. In 2016, 13,441 mares were bred. In 2017, 13,525 mares were bred. Foal numbers are also up, with 7,210 registered from the 2016 crop, 7,309 from the 2017 crop, and 7,980 projected to be registered in 2018 (based on a conception rate of 59 per cent of the 13,525 mares bred).

Also in the registration committee, the USTA's new eSales portal was introduced by Aimee Hock, USTA assistant registrar, and Jessica Schroeder, USTA member enrichment and outreach coordinator.

The portal will benefit sales companies by allowing them to authorize a transfer of a horse without the need of a hard-copy registration when the horse has a paperless registration. The first phase of the project is currently being tested and is projected to launch this summer.



"By helping sales companies conduct their business, we are also streamlining processes for our members," said Hock. "Moving into the digital age of electronically authorizing transfers of ownership is an exciting step forward as we work to improve our Online Services capabilities for our members."

The Registration Committee heard presentations from Dr. Molly McCue of the University of Minnesota, who covered advances in equine genetics and genomics, and Lisa Pfister, CEO and founder of PFERA Inc., a cutting-edge equine reproductive biotechnology company based in Canada.

During the meeting of the Racing Committee, which is comprised of the regulatory, driver/trainer, pari-mutuel, and fairs subcommittees, Michele Kopiec, USTA racetrack operations and licensing manager, showed the committee the new online driver/trainer license application portal through USTA online services. Benefits of the online service include quicker approval process for applicants and automated eligibility checking for references.

Jeff Gregory (District 12), chairman of the driver/trainer committee, told the board that he will be doing a review of the questions of the USTA driver/trainer licensing test.

Joe Faraldo (District 8A), chair of the regulatory committee, told the committee about the uniform racing rules subcommittee, which is working on creating a set of standardbred-specific model medication rules that it can then take to regulators for adoption.

"We want to use RCI (Racing Commissioners International) the same way that RMTC (Racing Medication Testing Consortium) is using RCI—take our medication recommendations to RCI and they can apply them to the various racing commissions."

Also in the Racing Committee, Sherry Antion-Mohr, USTA director of information technology, responded to concerns from horsemen that the random draw feature of eTrack could

be tampered with. She explained that the process was completely random with little human involvement and generated completely random numbers and random outcomes.

“It’s an automated process – it’s a ‘black box’ that is fairly simple, but in no part of the process can you predict what numbers are going to come out or who is going to get what,” said Antion-Mohr.

Annual meeting concludes

The annual meeting concluded Monday (March 12) with approval of the 2018 USTA budget, final decisions on the USTA rule and bylaw change proposals, and the formation of two new committees to further USTA projects.

The finance committee approved the 2018 budget, which projects a surplus of some \$256,000 over projected expenses.

The rules committees approved, rejected, or amended the 24 proposed changes to the USTA rules and bylaws. Highlights include installation of a fair start pole at each track, the prohibition of head numbers at pari-mutuel racetracks, expansion of pleasure horse registration, and the adoption of a whipping policy adopted from consensus at the 2017 World Trotting Conference.

In the closing session, president Russell Williams announced the creation of two new subcommittees to further two new USTA projects. He announced that directors Don Marean (District 9), Jacqueline Ingrassia (District 12), and Fred Nichols (District 9) will begin work on the Standardbred Transition Alliance. He also said that Gabe Wand (District 4B), Marilyn Breuer-Bertera (District 2), and Marean will move forward with the USTA youth delegate initiative as the youth leadership development subcommittee.

Also in the closing session, Jason Settlemaier (District 8) asked the board to consider polling USTA members as to

whether or not they would approve of five per cent of purse funds from tracks with expanded gaming to be placed in a nationwide marketing fund.

Ivan Axelrod, USTA chairman of the board, responded that yes, he thinks that if posed this question, most members would say yes to “spending other people’s money” to market the sport. What comes next would be the challenge, since determining the means of obtaining the money, then determining who deployed the money and how the money would be utilized remained as questions too big to be answered, regardless of the results of a survey.

“We know what the answer is going to be, so I think that would make our members more upset with us because we couldn’t do it, than by not asking at all.”

Breaking down the Levy field

The long-awaited Levy series is finally upon us and with it brings the unofficial end to winter overnight races, although weather in the New York metropolitan area continues to remain cold and blustery. The series begins Saturday with five divisions, all containing seven horses and there are more newcomers and fresh faces this year than in recent years. In looking through the program, here are observations on some of the things that stood out.

Best first leg matchup: Australian import Waikiki Beach A goes head to head with the defending Levy champion and last year's older pacer of the year, Keystone Velocity. Once exceptionally regarded Down Under, Waikiki Beach A may be one of the best imports we've seen in North America in some time if he can come back to that early career form. Unbeaten in two starts in North America this winter, he prepped at Pompano after first arriving here in January to wins in 1:51.4 and then 1:50.2. Trained by Ross Croghan, he's reportedly been staked to most of the main events this year and I can't wait to see what he does against the Levy FFAs. Keystone Velocity wasn't much more than a nice high-level conditioned horse when he won the Levy final last year, but this series was the springboard he used to then capture the rich Ben Franklin final and other stakes, before closing out last year emphatically with a 1:47.3 win at Rosecroft. Trained by Rene Allard, he draws the outside post 7 while making his first start back since November. Christen Me N actually lands the role of morning line favoritism as 2-1 although he hasn't hit his top gear yet, coming up a bit short in all three of his starts coming following the layoff.

Trainer and horse to watch: Jennifer Bongiorno and Evenin of Pleasure. The phenom trainer sports a seasonal .415 UTRS at Yonkers, an even more gaudy .458 UTRS at the Meadowlands, and it will be intriguing to see what the barn can do with fresh acquisition Evenin of Pleasure in race 7. Bongiorno has won 16 times from 49 starts at Yonkers, with many coming in the stable's first try with new horses. As for Evenin of Pleasure, the 8-year-old Dragon Again horse has been one of the most recognized FFA horses over the past few seasons in Canada and while I normally think of him as a big-track WEG-type horse, don't forget that he won an open over this very track last year, and also won last year's Molson Pace over the tight Western Fair half-mile oval. He crushed

much lesser in his recent qualifier at Freehold and looks set to respond well in his favorable surroundings throughout the series; the assigned 12-1 morning line for Saturday seems preposterous to me. The barn has another entrant in race 11 with Franco Rayner N, although this one comes off his first win in a lesser condition and would be more of a surprise.

Setting the seeds: In NCAA tournament style, the four #1 seeds – or horses with the best chance to win – should be Rockin Ron, Bit Of A Legend N, All Bets Off and Keystone Velocity. Rockin Ron is one of four Burke entries in the Levy and took his 1:47.2 mark last year in an elimination of the Canadian Pacing Derby. He did well for himself in this series last year as a 5-year-old and as long as his race at Yonkers from 3/3 was a hiccup, he'll be one of the ones to beat throughout the series. Bit Of A Legend won the Levy final in thrilling fashion two years ago and is just a tremendous half-mile horse. You don't see too many horses these days with a lifetime mark taken on a half, but that's what this horse has from when he won a wild Gerrity memorial last year at Saratoga in 1:50.3. All Bets Off is another iron tough horse and shows up almost every race no matter the condition. Another Burke entry, he'll have to go without regular driver Matt Kakaley who was injured in a spill at Yonkers earlier this week; get well Matt! Keystone Velocity has a lot to measure up to from last year but there isn't a reason to think he won't be up for the challenge; looks to continue his late career resurgence at the age of 10.

Not to be overlooked: This is one of the more highly contentious Levy series from top to bottom that I can recall. In addition, the horses just mentioned, you could make a completely logical case for a number of others including (with my projected odds to win the series) Mach It So (6-1), Western Fame (8-1), Dr J Hanover (10-1), Somewhere in L A (12-1) and even Missile J (15-1) who looked unbeatable at the beginning of this series last year, only to not fire in the final. Along with these, previously discussed horses Waikiki Beach A (5-1) and Evenin of Pleasure (10-1) are ones that wouldn't be a shock either.

Down Under invaders: The first weekend of last year's Levy series featured just five horses with New Zealand or Australia breeding. This year, that number has more than doubled to 12 imports. And all but one are new shooters to this year's Levy, the lone exception being Bit Of A Legend N.

Foiled Again thoughts: It's hard to think of the Levy and not think of Foiled Again. This year is only the second time in forever that Foiled Again won't be in the Levy (with last year being the first). As the 14-year-old remains at 99 career wins, maybe Yonkers can put together a race for him on one of these Levy nights as that would only be fitting. Perhaps a condition along the lines of N/W \$7,500 L5 with an also eligible for N/W 100 races lifetime.

Stratton primed for Levy success

Jordan Stratton is no stranger to success in the Blue Chip Matchmaker and George Morton Levy Memorial pacing series at Yonkers Raceway and the 30-year-old driver will have two past champions among his hopefuls when those events get underway this week at Yonkers Raceway.

First up is the Matchmaker, which begins Friday (March 16). Stratton's drives in the series for older female pacers will include Australian-bred defending champion Mackenzie. On Saturday (March 17) in the Levy, for older male pacers, Stratton's drives include New Zealand-bred 2016 winner Bit Of A Legend.

The Matchmaker and Levy both feature five preliminary rounds followed by added-money finals April 21. A horse receives 25 points each time he or she races in the preliminary rounds. Points are also awarded based on finish, with 50 points for a win, 25 for second, 12 for third, eight for fourth, and five for fifth.

"I love the series," said Stratton, who also won the Matchmaker in 2009 with Panceleefandarpels. "You have to race every week almost because of the 25 points, and they're good horses, so it's a hard series. At the same time, you want to have something left for the final, too.

"It's tough, but at the end of it you get to see who the iron horse is."

The opening round of the Matchmaker features four \$40,000 divisions. Stratton will drive New Zealand-bred Elliesjet in the first division, New Zealand-bred Sell A Bit in the second, and Mackenzie in the fourth.

Mackenzie and Sell A Bit are trained by Peter Tritton, who also conditions Bit Of A Legend on the Levy side.

Sell A Bit was the runner-up in the 2016 Matchmaker championship, but failed to advance to last year's final. Sell A Bit heads to this season's event with three wins in her past four starts, all in the open handicap for fillies and mares. Mackenzie, who won four of her last five races of 2017, is making her seasonal debut.

The Matchmaker fields also include multiple-award-winners L A Delight and Lady Shadow, 2017 championship runner-up Medusa, millionaires Call Me Queen Be and Regil Elektra, and near-millionaire Safe From Terror, whose brother Foiled Again won two Levy titles.

Saturday's Levy action will be spread over five \$50,000 divisions. Bit Of A Legend, who is making his seasonal debut in the fifth division, made history by going unbeaten in the

2016 Levy. He finished fourth in last year's championship, but counted the Molson, Gerrity, and Quillen among his victories.

"The run Bit Of A Legend went on (in 2016) was unbelievable," Stratton said. "I don't know whatever stars aligned, but it seemed like he never got used

and he was always pacing forward at the wire. Hopefully he can do it again. He qualified last week and he seems to be really good. I was a hundred percent happy with him."

There is no shortage of big names or familiar faces in the Levy, with defending champion and Dan Patch Award-winner Keystone Velocity leading the group. Others ready for the opening round include stakes-winners such as All Bets Off, Dr J Hanover, Evenin Of Pleasure, Great Vintage, Mach It So, Missile J, Rockin Ron, Somewhere In L A (a half-brother to L A Delight), and Western Fame.

Stratton is the leading driver at Yonkers this year and tops North America with \$1.36 million in purses. He finished second to Jason Bartlett in last year's Yonkers standings.

"I think toward the end of last year I was doing really well," said Stratton, who has won 3,505 races in his career. "Now the numbers kind of reflect it a little more. I'm getting excited (for stakes season). Mackenzie is staked and I'll go on the road with her. Hopefully she stays healthy and has some luck on the bigger tracks and that will launch me to the next step."

Bold Eagle back on the winning road with win in Cagnes-sur-Mer

French superstar Bold Eagle (Ready Cash) came to the mile race Criterium de Vitesse in Cagnes-sur-Mer with six second-places to look back on from the winter meeting in Paris.

From post number one, driver Franck Nivard could take it easy during the race's first quarter and later attack for the lead, where stablemate Billie de Montfort was placed. When in front, Bold Eagle more or less jogged the mile in new record for the race – 1:50.4 – which also is the fastest time noted in Europe so far 2018.

Trainer Sébastien Guarato got his acknowledgement that his horse hasn't lost morale when he races. Bold Eagle is still one of the most interesting horses among elite trotters in the world and soon after winning Sunday's race in the French Riviera, the entourage around the 7-year-old Ready Cash son got their invitation for the Elitloppet at Solvalla in May.

In 2017, Bold Eagle crushed his opponents in the elimination at Solvalla and came home in a strong 1:50 mile. In the final, he was never close to challenge leader Timoko and finished fourth, beaten also by Propulsion and Resolve.

It seemed like Guarato and owner Pierre Pilarski were happy about the invitation and most probably Bold Eagle will participate in Elitloppet.

Bird Parker (Ready Cash), who had a successful meeting in Paris, was out of luck in the Criterium de Vitesse. Driver Jean-Philippe Monclin never managed to put Bird Parker closer to the rail than three wide throughout the whole race and the 7-year-old Ready Cash son kept his pace strong to finish fourth place.

Billie de Montfort was second and Dijon third.

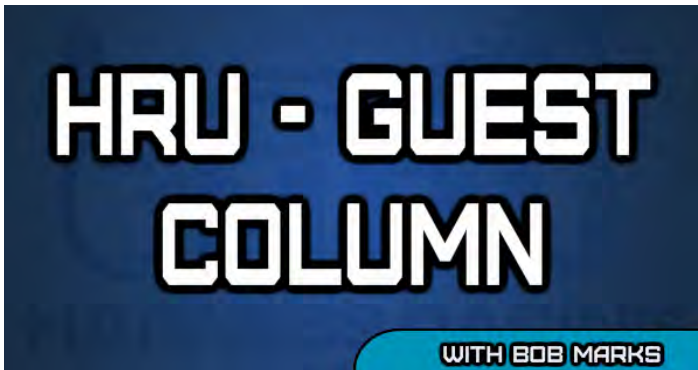

More questions and some answers not everyone wants to hear

Imitation is a sincere sign of flattery. So it has been said and again we'll continue a salute to Clyde Hirt's Impertinent Questions Columns that graced Harness Eye's patriarch newspaper Sports Eye for so many years.

Why don't they cover us? Meaning the non-trade journals as our own sites sometimes seem almost too redundantly competitive trying to outdo each other covering what are basically the same stories. Way back before my Boardwalk days, in the early 80's, I wanted to keep my press box privileges at Roosevelt so I submitted a racing column free of charge to my hometown Long Beach weekly. After carrying the column for a month, the editor asked when Roosevelt would advertise as it was hard to allocate space to non advertising entities regardless of readership. Roosevelt never advertised. The column was dropped. I'd imagine a similar scenario applies to most daily newspapers in racing areas.

Why don't we have sponsors? Companies spend mega-millions promoting all sorts of products and the media mavens are well aware of what the cost per thousand in terms of viewership turns out to be. We no longer have significant on track attendance to qualify as a potential viewership audience. Cadillac sponsored the Breeders Crown for a while. They no longer do. Most of our sponsorship has gravitated to in-house breeding farms etc.

Why don't they watch us? Oh they did-in droves, they no longer do except perhaps for our in-house audience via simulcast or TVG etc. Think about that every time you race one easy for whatever the reason. Not that long ago, two well known promotional sports mavens Vince McMahon and Dick Ebersole created this XFL spring football league with half naked cheerleaders, all sorts of glittering camera angles and whatever other tidbits they could devise on network television no less. When all the hoopla finally ceased, what

remained was lousy football. It failed. Therefore, it's not enough to just televise "the product" it must be exciting and meaningful. That said, if we were to somehow able implement a "harness racing channel" similar to TVG we would at least "be eligible to be watched".

Why don't they show our races? They did. Remember the American Championship Harness Series on ESPN in which the producers opted to make harness racing the sport of the "MTV" generation featuring the odds and evens wager? The very first program highlighted filly trotters at I believe The Meadows in which predictably half of each field went off stride. Not overly compelling viewing. Prior to that, Stan Bergstein and Spencer Ross for years did the racing from Yonkers or Roosevelt show on Thursday and Saturday nights on the WOR network that aired in many cities. In the '60s, the legendary Marty Glickman used to host a racing show from Yonkers on Saturday nights before the 11 pm news. Every night 1010 Wins, one of the leading radio stations in New York would broadcast the feature race from either Roosevelt or Yonkers, whichever was open. Not sure what they did in California, but judging from the crowds and celebrity attendees, the word was out. The world knew about harness racing back then — big time.

Why don't they wager on us? They did indeed! On a typical New York Saturday in the '60s, Aqueduct might handle \$3.2 million or thereabouts in the afternoon while Roosevelt or Yonkers, whichever was open, might handle \$2.7 or \$2.8 million that evening. Thus, the difference was a mere plurality not the massive differential between thoroughbred and harness handle today. Why don't they wager on us anymore? That's obviously a very complex question with no single answer but it does appear thoroughbred bettors are more inclined to believe they're getting a more ethical run for their money than do the harness bettors we no longer have.

Why do they charge me admission and for programs when they're already making a percentage of my handle via often prohibitive takeout? There are those aware of what might be termed betting inertia in which the body in betting motion tends to sustain itself until the money runs out but there are those who don't think that way. Perhaps they should. This is worthy of further study.

Who judges the judges? Ultimately the betting public by their action or lack of it, though it wouldn't hurt if racing officialdom as those in other sports are subject to some form of performance review.

Should racing results ever be changed after the fact? They don't change Super Bowl's regardless of blown calls.

Baseball never credited the “no-hitter” even after it was obvious the umpire blew the call. That said, change results but only if you honor ALL tickets on the posthumously declared winner.

If casino’s never happened, would harness be as popular as it was? Personally, I doubt it. For example, I stopped doing the Orange Horse tip sheet at The Meadowlands in the late-’80s – not that I couldn’t still pick winners but the nightly attendance had so dwindled that sales became non-existent. And that was when casinos were only located in Vegas and Atlantic City.

Why can’t we maintain high purses? Every boss I ever worked for preached “If I don’t make money, I can’t pay you.” That said, if there’s no appreciative handle income and but limited subsidization casino or otherwise, where precisely will the purse money come from other than what may be accrued via nominations, sustaining payments and entry fees?

SOA of NY optimistic about French import program

Two weeks after announcing an ambitious program that would see 24 French-bred trotters flown to North America to compete at Yonkers Raceway, Standardbred Owners’ Association of New York (SOANY) executive director Alex Dadoyan’s initial nerves have transformed to cautious optimism. With several of the spaces already filled, the program is attracting significant interest from local horsepeople.

“We did bounce the idea off some people, but it was a big unknown how it was going to be received,” Dadoyan said. “Right away when we announced it, there was a lot of positive interest, which is really rare in this game. The owners, trainers, and horsepeople who called looking for more information all seemed genuinely interested in it, intrigued by it, and wanting to learn more about it.

“The reception has been very positive. We have a bunch of people who are already lined up and have made their deposits and we have a bunch of people who say they are going to participate and we hope to fill the number that we’re looking for.”

The SOA of NY’s pioneering program to import two-dozen French trotters was formed with several goals in mind. It serves to strengthen the relationship between Yonkers and the French trotting association LeTrot, entice French bettors to increase their handle on Yonkers’ races simulcast to France, and address a shortage of trotters competing at the track. The program will also give local horsepeople a chance to buy a horse at a relatively low price point who will be eligible to race in a rich series restricted to French-bred trotters.

“There’s multiple things going on. We simulcast the races

over to France and if people are betting on races from Yonkers, obviously races that have French horses that they know are going to be more attractive, more interesting to their bettors than horses they’ve never heard of,” Dadoyan explained.

“If we were going to do this, we wanted to be able to card races that we could then send back over there. Those races are normally larger fields that we send over, so we weren’t going to do it and just bring back eight horses; that wasn’t going to achieve all of the goals, so we said, we’ll try to see if 24 people are going to be interested and ideally come back and card two full fields of races to send back there in the series for these horses that we bring over.”

Organizing the sale of a large number of trotters to a foreign country isn’t a new endeavor for LeTrot. The organization routinely offers sales of promising high-steppers to developing trotting countries, such as Ireland. In this case, LeTrot will prepare a group of geldings 4-years-old and up who compete at a similar level for inspection by highly-experienced Yonkers horsemen. The team who selects the horses will be independent from those participating in the program and the horses selected will be randomly distributed to the 24 owners and trainers who commit to the program.

“The thing that excites me, gives me a level of confidence is we’re taking over several trainers with us. The French are accustomed to holding these sales for other countries. They organize a bunch of horses and then people can come out and look at the horses,” Dadoyan said. “We’re going to get to go training trips with all of the horses and we’re going to have experienced trotting guys with us to make an educated assessment as to which of the bunch might have the best chance of having some success back home.”

Each trotter selected will sell for \$25,000 with an additional \$3,000 shipping charge, meaning the total

expenditure to buy into the program is \$28,000. The trotters who make the cut will be eligible to race in a multi-leg series with a final to be held at Yonkers a few months after the horses arrive stateside. In addition to the purse money contributed by the track and the SOA, LeTrot will also add to the purses for these races. Specific details and purse-levels for the series will be announced in the coming weeks.

“This gives the participants a chance to recoup their investment before they move to the local competition at whatever level they might end up racing at,” Dadoyan said. “We thought it was important to give an opportunity for these horses to just be in against themselves and it gives everyone a fair chance to make back some or all of their investment immediately.

“When we card races exclusively for French-bred horses, the French Trotting Association will contribute money for the purses for those races, so we would have an amount of money contributed from over there for these races that are

exclusively for French-bred trotters,” Dadoyan said. “It’s not a small amount of money. We’re going to make the races meaningful enough anyway, but it’s just a little something extra that we can offer everyone.”

To participate in the program, a non-refundable deposit of \$10,000 is required by March 26. The balance of \$18,000 will be due by Thursday April 26. If the program is not fully subscribed by March 26, those making an initial deposit will be refunded. The selection of horses is scheduled in France during the period of the Yonkers shutdown at the end of May.

“With all the big meets starting up, and purses strong as ever, buyers will be searching high and low for quality racehorses ready to drop in the box. Sellers should be extremely well rewarded if they’re willing to step forward with that quality,” Reid said.

Last year's Spring Mixed posted the highest average in the sale's history and was led by top-seller Rock N Roll World (\$165,000), who went on to win invitationals and compete in FFA classics like the Breeders Crown, Ben Franklin and William Haughton Memorial.

Consignors are reminded that Tattersalls has adjusted its entry deadlines much closer to sale time, to lessen outs and to publish a more accurate and up-to-date main catalog. With that said, Reid urges consignors not to delay in submitting their entries.

Hoosier Park readies for 2018 season

With the return of live harness racing at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino just a few weeks away, final preparations for the 2018 season are well underway throughout the property. Opening day of the 160-day meet is set for Friday, March 30. With a daily post time of 6:30 p.m., the live racing season will be conducted through Nov. 10.

Live racing at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino will follow a Friday, Saturday schedule the opening week, a Thursday, Friday, Saturday schedule the second week and then commence a Tuesday through Saturday schedule throughout the remainder of the season.

The barn area officially opened on Saturday, March 10 for those horsemen allotted stalls to begin moving in horses and equipment. The track opened for training on Monday, March 12 from the hours of 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. and will remain open during these hours until live racing begins. Once racing begins, training hours will be from 6 a.m. to noon throughout the duration of the season. The track will be

closed on Sundays and all days of training will be subject to weather permitting. The paddock and ship-in area will also be open for those horsemen wishing to ship in and train. All horses entering the grounds must have all valid paperwork required before being allowed entry to the grounds.

The first round of qualifiers is slated for Wednesday, March 14 with an estimated start time of 10 a.m. Qualifiers will continue to follow a Wednesday and Saturday schedule throughout the entirety of the season. The entry box closes for qualifiers one day prior at 10 a.m. until March 27 and then the box will close at 1 p.m. going forward. The annual night-time dress rehearsal qualifying program is still slated for Wednesday, March 28 and will begin at 5:30 p.m. The evening round of qualifiers will allow horsemen, racing officials, and racing fans to watch qualifiers under the lights prior to the opening night program.

Condition sheets and stakes schedules will be posted on Hoosier Park's website as soon as they are made available. Hoosier Park recently announced several overnight and late closing events to be contested in early April and May along with a variety of overnight series for Indiana-sired horses. All of the overnight series will be on Hoosier Park's condition sheets and more information can be found on Hoosier Park's website by clicking [here](#).

The opening of the backside and beginning of the live racing season will be the official unveiling of a number of facility enhancements as well. During the off season, Hoosier Park began, and is currently in the final stages of, installing a new metal roof on the paddock. In addition, the dormitories are also undergoing improvements in preparation for the upcoming season. New restrooms and facility upgrades are in the works and expected to be completed in early spring. Construction is expected to begin soon on new a state-of-the-art track maintenance building that will house the track equipment, employee offices and restrooms. Completion date is expected by late fall.

Building upon the successes of the 2017 live race meet, Hoosier Park's 25th season of live harness racing will offer a very lucrative stakes program throughout the season highlighted by the 25th anniversary of the \$300,000 Dan Patch Stakes on Aug. 10.

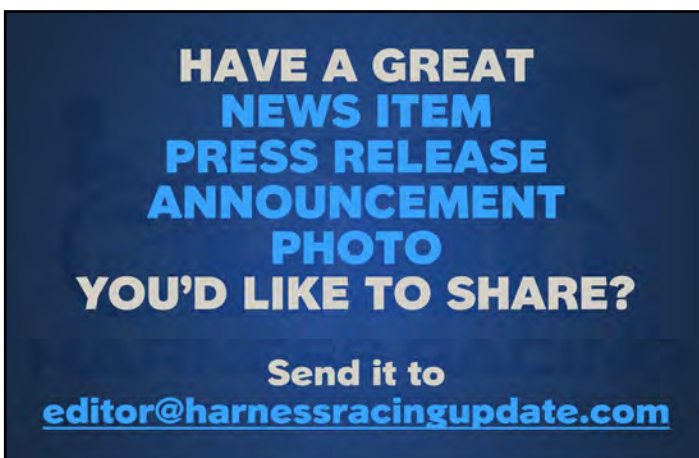
