# Campbell to retire from driving, take helm of Hambletonian Society

Harness racing's all-time money-leading driver John Campbell will replace Tom Charters as the president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society / Breeders Crown on July 1.



Campbell will turn 62 on April 8. He said Thursday afternoon — shortly after the official announcement that he would cease active driving at the end of June to take over from Tom Charters at the Hambletonian Society on July 1 — that he looks forward to the challenge of the new job and isn't, yet, viewing the end of his driving career with any melancholy.

"It's exciting. (My wife) Paula and my daughters are very excited and happy for me... and they don't have to worry about me getting hurt anymore," Campbell said. "I was very fortunate. As a kid, all I dreamt about was driving horses and racing and I got to do that for a living. I think I've pushed the age limit and being successful for a long time, but I'd rather be stopping too early than too late."

Stopping too early may mean Campbell may not hit \$300 million in lifetime earnings. As of Thursday before that night's races, Campbell was \$656,182 from \$300 million in his career. He has earned \$257,392 through the first 74 days of 2017. If he maintains that pace for the 106 days between March 16 and June 30, he will fall about \$300,000 short of \$300 million. But, with other tracks opening up soon and some stakes events in June — most notably those on the

Pepsi North America Cup card at Mohawk — he still might just get to \$300 million. He already is some \$85 million ahead of the next closest driver — Ron Pierce — on the top of the all-time list and is second behind only jockey John Velazquez when drivers and jockeys are combined.


True to form for one of the classiest men to ever don a set of colors, Campbell said he doesn't care much about hitting \$300 million.

"I've never been one to look back at goals or numbers too much. I don't think I'm going to get to \$300 million and that doesn't bother me one bit," he said. "I don't know just how many opportunities I'm going to get between now and the first of July. I'm going to be a lame-duck driver and probably not in-demand, so to speak, so we'll just see what comes and weigh my options as I go along."

Campbell, currently the president of the Grand Circuit, said he relishes the opportunity to lead the Hambletonian Society / Breeders Crown.

"It's a new chapter, but it's exciting and I'm looking forward to the challenge," Campbell said.

What does he bring to the society besides 25 years as a director?

"Experience. I've seen so much," Campbell said. "This is 45 years of driving, at every level. I've experienced harness racing at every level, from the bottom to the top. I've been (a director at the) Hambletonian Society since '92 and on the Breeders Crown committee... I've got an idea what management goes through trying to make money putting on harness races. All of that factors into a good education for going forward with this position."

Campbell was elected president and CEO of the Society in a unanimous vote of the board of directors at the winter board meeting held Sunday (March 12) in Boca Raton, FL.

Charters informed the board last August of his intent to cut back on his schedule. He will step down as president, a position he has held since 1998. He will remain on staff through the Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park in October and on the Society board as a director.

"I don't want to walk around like a doddering fool, with people conspiring to get me out of here," Charters said Thursday afternoon. "So, last year, I told some of the officers and then I announced it to the full board that I wasn't going to re-sign my full-time contract. I just wanted to have longer weekends to spend with my wife, do some traveling and whatever. I said I'd be glad to work part-time. My contract runs out in June and, although I've worked without a contract before, I think they want to keep a full-time president and CEO. I'm sure John is going to be in the office, and a lot of it (for me) is going to be part-time here and part-time there."

Charters said the future is in good hands with Campbell taking the helm.

"We've worked on things before and I've reached out to him, not just for advice, but to ask him to intervene with racetracks because John Campbell's name carries a lot more currency than Tom Charters'. Once John made it clear... that he wanted to cut back and quit driving or was willing to do this full-time, the executive search committee started focusing on him.

"I got a call asking what I thought of it and I said that I wholeheartedly endorse it. John has done a good job as president of Grand Circuit, which can be kind of a token position. And he takes it seriously."

Charters said he was proudest of maintaining and growing the Society's two biggest events — the Hambletonian and Breeders Crown.


"We've managed and maintained them, grown them and adjusted when we had to and kept them on track through a

lot of partnerships and changes," Charters said.

"I think the Society stepped up with issues like international racing. We were able to adapt the Breeders Crown to bring some of the European stars in to the event from time to time. That's challenging, just given guarantine and other considerations. I think we took a very forward position in terms of medication. Out-of-competition testing is news lately, but we've been doing it with the Hambletonian and Breeders Crown for about a decade. We were doing it before it was in the rule books in any jurisdiction. We took a position on whipping, and the perception of it. That's one thing John and I talked about. I guess those are a few (of the things I'm proud of)... I've got a great staff and a board that has always supported me and we've been able to address things. We've been able to work with the USTA, Standardbred Canada and the American Horse Councils. We've been pretty good citizens of the industry, I think."

Campbell said Charters has made an outstanding contribution.

"I have so much respect for what Tom has done over the years," Campbell said. "He's just worked tirelessly on behalf of the industry and I've seen that firsthand from my time on the



Breeders Crown committee. I've seen that since the first or second year that I was on the Hambletonian Society and, also, with the Grand Circuit. Tom has done so much work behind the scenes that he's never gotten credit for... I'm looking to learn a lot from Tom and (director of publicity) Moira (Fanning) before the first of July, then getting together with the executive committee of the Hambletonian Society and running some things by them. I really serve at the pleasure of the Hambletonian Society. I can have my own ideas, but, at the same time, it has to be in sync with the members of the Hambletonian Society."

Charters said there are some similarities between himself and Campbell.

"I do think I respected the industry and have a good network of contacts among track owners and horse owners. I can walk into any paddock and know many people. John has that same kind of network and familiarity and, like I said, I've asked him to reach out to racetrack operators when I needed a little help getting something done. He also has a very good perspective on the limitations of the industry, but he sees the real value in the industry as far as the gambling and entertainment medium," Charters said. "I'm not comparing myself to John, but I said to someone the other day that I'm flattered that it took a John Campbell to replace me. That's a pretty high bar.

"I think (Campbell will) just approach things a little bit differently and sometimes you need fresh eyes, a fresh perspective on things. As long as he's got the underpinnings and support, I expect big things."

Campbell said he was happy to be staying in the industry after his driving career ends.


"There's going to be days when I'm frustrated, no question about that, but there's going to be lots of days when I feel good about what we accomplish as well," he said.

# **Handicapping the Levy Series**

You wouldn't know it with the amount of snow in the mid-Atlantic region this past week, but the Levy series at Yonkers beginning Saturday (March 18) marks the unofficial start of spring in many harness racing circles. The free-for-all series has been typically known to deliver a parade of short priced favorites, but this year's edition seems more evenly matched than in years past. With that, let's take a look at the main contenders along with my estimation of their odds to win the series final in April.

McWicked (5-2): It's hard to believe that prior to winning his comeback race at Pompano a month ago, the last time we saw McWicked win a race was back in December of 2014. That was the same year he won Dan Patch and O'Brien awards for wins that included the Breeders Crown and a separate 1:47:3 world record in the Hempt and he's looked no worse for the wear so far in 2017 following surgery to correct his breathing. He cruised over this track last week as a prep for this series and looked very much like the McWicked of old; the one to beat in my opinion for Elliott and Zeron.

Bit of a Legend N (7-2): Was a model of perfection in this series last year when the Down Under import swept all Levy preliminary legs (dead-heating in one of them) and then captured the rich final over All Bets Off for the training and driving combination of Tritton and Stratton. Prepped nicely for this series with two off-the-pace tries in the open handicap where he closed with crisp pace; no reason to think he won't be one of the top contenders once again this year in search of a repeat.

Mach It So (5-1): Won three out of five preliminary legs in this series last year before being doomed in the final with an outside post. A winner here in 1:50:2 last season, he was second in the Breeders Crown at the Meadowlands to Always B Miki. Looks to have returned fresh for trainer Bamond Jr and Tetrick knows this one well; has an affinity for these

half-mile tracks and is a true FFA type when at his best.

All Bets Off (6-1): This is one tough horse that probably has never gotten the respect he deserves despite being a lifetime earner at nearly \$2.2 million. He was a game runner up in this series final last year to Bit Of A Legend and closed out 2016 with a career best 1:48:2; regular pilot Kakaley will be aboard.

Caviart Luca (8-1): One of four Burke entries to this series, this one has already won five of seven on the year while racing exclusively in the Yonkers opens, good for \$113,000. The six-year-old has never been better and Brennan fits him well; could be the series the pacer makes a name for himself.

Missile J (10-1): Moved from Toscano to DiDomenico at the start of this year and has responded by winning four of five, including a 1:49:1 romp at Dover two back. Won eight of 19 and over \$300,000 as a sophomore last year and lures Tetrick off Our Sky Major N in Saturday's opening leg; intriguing upstart to this series.

Bettor's Edge (10-1): No stranger to this series and the eight-year-old qualified mightily two back at the Meadowlands when he beat similar FFA types by open lengths; lands the fortune of drawing the rail in his opening leg Saturday. Inching toward the \$2 million career earnings mark and only knock is that listed trainer Kokinos is 1 for 50 at Yonkers this season; had raced in years past for Burke.

**Rockin Ron (15-1):** Beat Wiggle It Jiggleit twice last year in Canada including the Confederation Cup over the half-mile oval at Flamboro Downs. He was an excellent addition to the Burke barn last year and jogged at Yonkers two back before cruising at the Meadowlands last week; figures to make a good showing for himself as the series progresses.

**Foiled Again (N/A):** This year marks the first time since 2008 that the near \$7.5 million lifetime earner won't be participating in the series. While being a non-factor over the last two years in this series, Foiled Again had at least hit the board in the series final going back to 2009, including 2009

and 2010 when he won the Levy final in back to back years. He's given us many thrills in past Levy editions and will be missed this year; races Saturday in the Yonkers nightcap for N/W \$25,000 in last 5 starts.

**Provacativeprince N (20-1):** Not a bad stablemate to Bit Of A Legend for Tritton and this one shot himself right up the class ladder at Yonkers so far in 2017 setting himself up with a perfect three-for-three record heading into this series. Stratton gets the call on this guy too and that was impressive last week when this Grinfromeartoear gelding swept from seventh off a :58:1 middle half; you don't see that too often here and he deserves a shot against these.

Field (10-1): Our Sky Major N is a former Kiwi star and makes his US debut after prepping twice at Woodbine; had the look of a killer in his NA debut when he crushed lesser in 1:50:2. Keystone Velocity is one of two Allard entrants and the combination of Dube and Allard won this series final two years ago with Domethatagain. Santa Fe Beachboy won a leg of the series last year and is still consistent enough that he can accumulate valuable points in each leg; should be respected coming from Banca. Wakizashi Hanover was a popular standout at age three when he won the North America Cup but struggled last year as an older horses winning only twice in 12 starts; seems to be in line for something more this year. Soto won a Yonkers Open two back and isn't terribly outclassed against these; capable of holding his own.

Race 7: PROVACATIVEPRINCE N aims for four straight and catches a favorable post in his first preliminary leg of the Levy series. He was able to win last out despite trailing all but one horse after a pedestrian half mile and he's never been this good since arriving in these parts. Lands the post edge on his main rival; worth a swing if the price is fair. MACH IT SO is the class of the field but make just his first start back since SOMETIME. He was one of the top contenders in this series last year and looms a serious overall threat once again; rallies. ROCKIN RON has been superb in his last pair and versatile type can do it either way; Yannick might look to take an early shot. BETTOR'S EDGE lands the rail in his second start since the qualifier and might actually go overlooked in here; wouldn't be too quick to dismiss at the expected square price.

# \$20 Win 2 \$4 Exacta Box 2/1,3

Race 11: ROCK ABSORBER was never a threat last out against winners over types from post 7 but prior to that he fired in a big way first start off the claim for Banca when he won by 5 in 1:51. This is a more reasonable spot and he'll figure more prominently in here. HILLBILLY HANOVER did well for himself to chase home McWicked last out and the obvious problem now is the post; 7/1 morning line looks enticing. WINDS OF CHANGE qualified well for Takter against stablemate and Levy entrant Great Vintage; might need a start to re-acclimate while making first start since December. FOILED AGAIN will be a sentimental choice on Levy night but this level is where the waters have gotten too deep for him of late; will likely be coming from off the pace. STATESMAN N has looked like his old self since the barn change from Remmen to Ruiz; the step up though combined with the outside post might be asking too much now.

# Joe Lee hitting it out of the park at the racetrack

The assistant equipment manager for the New York Yankees is one of the hottest amateur drivers in harness racing with 17 wins since 2015.

Joe Lee has worn the uniform of the New York Yankees, but he's never had a base hit, struck out an opposing batter or made a diving catch. He can only be found behind the scenes. Lee has been with the Yankees since 1995, first as a bat boy and currently as the assistant equipment manager.

There may not be much glory in that, but Lee has found a side job that gives him his thrills, his equivalent of teeing off on a fat fastball over the middle of the plate and sending it into the bleachers. The 37-year-old Yankee employee is among the hottest amateur drivers in North America, having won 17 races (as of March 15) since the start of 2015.

"For me, it's the thrill of going behind the gate," Lee said.
"Every time the wings of the gate open and the starter says,
'Okay, you can get them together,' that's the biggest rush ever.
It never gets old. Winning never gets old, either."

Lee, who moved to Yonkers as a teenager, has been going to the racetrack for as long as he can remember. For a time, his parents owned a few horses and even when they didn't the family would make frequent visits to all the area harness tracks. Lee was also into show jumping. Horses were a huge part of his life.

But so was baseball, at least when he went to work with the Yankees. He later added a job as a financial advisor to his resume, which didn't give him a whole lot of time for anything else. Still, he wanted to know what it felt like to drive a horse. A friend, owner Sandy Goldfarb, told him to see one of his trainers, Buzzy Sholty, and promised him that Sholty would tutor him.

"I was in my twenties and had watched a bazillion races," Lee said. "I started to think I have to find out what it feels like to sit behind one."


Lee got bit by the bug. He said he went to Sholty's stable every Saturday morning for two years, no matter the weather or how late he had worked the prior night, to learn the craft.

"Buzzy knew I had a horse background and that I had been around horses and jumping, so he was very trusting of me. He started letting me jog and train horses right away, especially in bad weather. He didn't want to go out there."

Lee continued to progress and made his driving debut in 2010. Juggling all his jobs, he won only five career races through 2014, but something started to click in 2015. He drove 63 races that year, winning five. The following year was even better. He had 72 drives and won 10 races.

Lee says that as his own skills started to improve trainers took notice.

"The last two years, I've done pretty well on the track," Lee said. "People see that I'm safe and that I try to put the horses in a position where they have a shot to do the best they can. I think a lot of trainers have noticed that. I'm starting to get

phone calls, people saying 'I have one that fits the amateur series race, are you available? Could you drive him?' A couple of trainers I never even met before put me down on horses. I didn't think I was driving on that night and then I look at the entries and see that in fact I am down to drive. I've been very lucky with that and I really appreciate the way the trainers have supported me."

His success has continued this year as he has a record of 2-1-1 from seven drives.

Once the baseball season starts, Lee will limit his drives to nights when the Yankees do not have home games. He hasn't found anyone on the current team that shares his passion for the sport, but fondly remembers talking horses with former manager Joe Torre and bench coach Don Zimmer. Lee is also involved in the sport as an owner and currently has pieces of three horses. Torre is often a partner in his small stable, but it was Zimmer who became his racetrack buddy.

"Nobody loved the horses more than Zimmer," he said. "He mostly bet the thoroughbreds, but he liked the trotters, too. Any time we had a day game we'd go together to the Meadowlands after the game. He'd bet on anything — trotters, thoroughbreds. He loved the action."

Lee said he has no designs on becoming a professional full-time driver, that he's too busy with his "real" jobs and that he's content to focus on the amateur races.

"I'm having a lot of fun and there's no real pressure when you're out there," he said. "I'm already living out a dream, going behind the gate and driving in these races. I've driven in some qualifiers at Yonkers and I can look to the left of me or the right of me and see Jason Bartlett, George Brennan, Brian Sears. You're talking about guys who have won thousands and thousands of races combined. It's amazing being on the same playing field as these guys. This is the one sport where an average guy can get in the game and

compete against the best. I could have practiced every day my whole life and I never would have been the second baseman for the Yankees."

# **Foiling the Beards**

Joe Faraldo outlines his proposal for stopping bearded trainers

Let's face it — our industry loves to demean itself and is often the victim of self-inflicted wounds and so, let's acknowledge that we will have difficulty drawing any new people to harness racing unless we address ongoing rumors and innuendo and start tackling issues — or even supposed issues — in a fact-based, structured manner. A perfect example is the issue of "beard" trainers and I would like to suggest action is needed immediately by industry stakeholders to clarify exactly what the scope and scale of the problem is and then root it out entirely.

The issue of "beard" trainers is one of those things we all believe to be true, despite lacking the type of details and data that would either substantiate or disprove the many industry pronouncements we often hear (and the tendency to feed upon these pronouncements like piranhas doesn't serve anyone's interest). So why don't the Commissions proactively put this to bed and take concrete steps to end the careers of "beards" and those who utilize them with a coordinated, thoughtful industry initiative?

The Standardbred Owners Association of New York has taken a first step to do just that and has sent an open letter to the Executive Branch, the New York Gaming Commission, formally requesting that they incorporate the following proposed procedure to weed out any and all so called "beard" trainers. And since this is not a unique problem to New York harness racing, but also seems to be endemic at a number of tracks, I would offer an invitation to all concerned industry participants especially horsemen's to join with the SOA of NY and support this initiative in other jurisdictions as well.

The intended purpose is to seek a regulatory procedure to expose factually, not anecdotally, "beard" trainers. To follow, will be a similar recommended course regarding undisclosed owners or "beard" owners seeking either the avoidance of race conflicts or as a consequence of some impediment to their identity being revealed on the racing program.

The Commissions having this jurisdiction should incorporate a number of suggested protocols as soon as possible. And the presiding judges, under their broad powers to regulate racing, can and should delegate to an associate judge the following directives to ferret out these this serious problem:

### **FOR TRAINERS**

- At each track in your state or commonwealth, the presiding judge should assign to one or more of his/her associate judges the task of asking in writing to any trainer, at any time to supply the following information:
- The number and names of all horses in your care for whom you are listed as trainer.
- The name/s of all help employed or working as an independent contractor directly in the day to day care of horses under your control.
- The location of any and all horses under your care, including the farm, training center and the name/s of any other trainers with who you share a barn during the relevant period.
- The names and addresses of any and all veterinarians, farriers, and suppliers of feed and/or tack that are utilized for the care of those horses. Include the names of the contact person you communicate instructions to when requesting care, service or supplies.
- Copies of proof of payment to the daily employees or independent contractors including vets, farriers and suppliers of feed and tack.
- Copies of the last Worker's Compensation quarterly filing listing your covered employees.
- Copies of any and all bills sent to the owners of the horses for which you are the programmed trainer.
- Copies of any and all deposit slips demonstrating payment related to the care your horses for which you are the programmed trainer.
- Copies of evidence of proof of payment, if any is made to the farm or training center where your horses are trained or turned out, and if you are not the payer, indicate who is and their address.
- Copies of payments, if any, made by you, to any other person or persons who now hold or have held a trainer's license in this or any other jurisdiction within the last ten years in this or any other jurisdiction.
- Copies of evidence of proof of payment, if any that is made to the farm or training center where said horse/s are trained or turned out, and if you are not the payer, indicate who is and their address.
- Copies of proof of payment received from any other person or entity that either holds a license issued by the Commission, or not, for any services related to your care of horses for which you are the programmed trainer.
- Copies of payments made to any other person or persons, licensees or non licensees of the Commission, which in

whole or in part represent a distribution of earned purse money less driver/trainer fees and cost of care.

- The name and address of your billing agent or accountant.
- The associate judge will, upon making the request, immediately inform the Commission in writing that said request was made, to whom it was made, and the date thereof. If the trainer is not in attendance at the track, the designated trainer shall be so notified and asked to acknowledge the notice. In the event of the non-appearance at the track of the programmed trainer, a writing shall be sent to the trainer at the address appearing on his license application, certified mail with return receipt requested.
- All records hereby requested shall be for the period encompassing the last completed quarter of the year or quarter in the prior year preceding the request. Said records are to be provided pursuant to this request within forty five (45) days from the date of the writing and or acknowledgement by the trainer or his/ her designated substitute.
- Notice of failure to provide this information within the time set forth will be sent to the Commission with a request to issue a subpoena for those documents along with a request by the presiding judge to the Commission to commence a formal investigation.
- Individuals would not be the subject of multiple requests

from each track raced at, as once an associate judge informs the Commission of the request that will constitute the sole request that needs to be complied with for that period. In no calendar year will a trainer be requested to supply thus information more than for two quarters.

• The judges shall keep a listing of any and all information received regarding suspected "beards" whether the judges in their discretion, act upon the same or not.

Once again, the idea behind this thoughtful, substantive and fact-based initiative is to stop once-and-for-all the rumor mongering undertaken by too many individuals in this business and that, frankly, too many of us simply accept as true. Let's finally get all of the actual facts on the table and then either honestly or transparently resolve the problem we all "believe" exists and ferret out "beards" or stop accusing people of something unproven. I am fully confident it can be done the right way and all it takes is the resources currently possessed by the regulatory agency. While this is not perfect by any means, the thought process is to have the Commissions undertake without tremendous cost the necessary regulatory function of addressing this problem.

# **Nothing But Trotters**

There was no room for pacers on the March 12 card at Yonkers Raceway, which made history when it carded 11 trotting races as part of a matinee program sent to France's PMU.

Racing secretary Steve Starr did not intend to write what is believed to be a historic all-trotting card last Sunday (March 12) at Yonkers Raceway. It just sort of happened.

Starr focused on attracting as many trotters as possible going a mile-and-a-quarter for races three through nine as part of a matinee aimed at appealing to those wagering overseas through Pari Mutuel Urbain (PMU), a French simulcasting hub.

Starr initially contemplated two races for pacers, one for \$20,000 claimers and the other at the \$12,500 level. When those did not fill, he had what he and other Yonkers officials believe is the first all-trotting card since the track was established in 1899 as the Empire City Trotting Club.

As inadvertent as it was, Starr was encouraged enough by the results that he might have landed on a helpful approach moving forward.

"I don't believe it will be a one-time deal," he said. "We'd like to do it again."

The action proved to be rewarding for non-chalk players. Favorites, often difficult to beat at Yonkers' half-mile oval, were unable to deliver in eight races. The winners of six races produced double-digit payoffs.

The New York-New York double, a wager Yonkers is attempting to build in conjunction with the New York Racing Association, also generated an encouraging result. Those able to combine the winner of the third race at Aqueduct Racetrack with the winner of the sixth race at Yonkers were rewarded with \$82 for a \$1 wager.

"From a gambling point of view," Starr said, "it was a better Sunday than most."

Joe Faraldo, president of the Standardbred Owners Association of New York, also liked what he saw.

"I think it's a great step at the right time for the industry, especially when you consider the interest of the French and Europeans in American trotting," Faraldo said.

Yonkers had also been sending races to the PMU on Tuesdays. But that ended with the new year, when it was

decided to focus on the greater interest that Sunday draws overseas.

Starr estimates that he puts together as many as 18 trotting races a week, which represents a significant departure from the past.

"It used to be that we tried to avoid trotting races," he said. "I'd say in the past 10 years we're putting out more trotting races than most tracks in the country."

Purses, boosted by casino revenue, continue to be robust. Yonkers recently announced a purse increase ranging from \$3,000 to \$5,000 for all overnight events, beginning the week of March 19. That improved the range in purse structure from \$11,500 to \$14,500 and, at the top end, from \$50,000 to \$55,000.

Starr said he hopes that will help to attract even more trotters. "There is every reason for people to come to Yonkers to race their trotters," he said. "There is a lot of opportunity."

Starr said that domestic handicappers are more comfortable wagering on trotters than ever before.

"They did make breaks in the past, but today's horsemen are sharper than they were," he said. "They have different equipment, trotting hobbles, and they are shoeing differently. People aren't afraid to bet on them as much as they used to."

The time difference will always be an obstacle when simulcasting overseas. Faraldo hopes the all-trotting card indicates that perhaps a bit more can be done.

"I think it is very important to at least demonstrate to them that Yonkers has the ability to give them more product than they currently receive," Faraldo said.

# Court agrees with Big M's decision to cancel Classics

The New Jersey Superior Court in Monmouth County rejected an effort by an owner of a New Jersey bred horse to force New Meadowlands to host and race the New Jersey Classic and the Miss New Jersey Classic this year.

New Meadowlands determined in December 2016 to cancel this event for a variety of reasons, among them the cost of the purse and an insufficient field of eligible horses.

Agreeing with the host track, the Court refused to enjoin the New Meadowlands' decision to cancel the races. Consequently New Meadowlands' original cancellation notice stands as was previously announced.

# Meadowlands Spring Mixed sale set for May 7

Tattersalls announced today that its annual Meadowlands Spring Mixed Sale will be held on Sunday, May 7 in the racetrack's back paddock.

This year's sale is scheduled almost a month earlier than last year's Spring Mixed, and according to sale manager David Reid, the decision to conduct the sale on the new date was made with both sellers and buyers in mind.

"Selling in early May — right about the time the summer race meets get started — should help our consignors, as with the racehorse shortage, demand is going to be extremely high for quality horses," Reid said.

"We also have the big stables migrating north to their home base at that time of year, and we already have some nice horses consigned from the outfits that need to trim their size a bit to accommodate their summer stall space. "For buyers, early May is a perfect time to reload and take advantage of all the racing opportunities and big purses that lie just ahead."

Reid also mentioned that while 2-year-olds in training would of course be welcomed at the Spring Mixed, he feels the Meadowlands Summer Mixed Sale might be a better fit for many of those youngsters.

"By early July, horsemen will have had a chance to baby race a few times, and promising 2-year-olds should have a lot more appeal to buyers then," he said.

# **Rule changes for Ontario in 2017**

The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) has engaged with more than 150 people over the last nine months from across Ontario's horse racing industry to achieve the following changes to its rules of racing for the 2017 racing season that will go into effect on April 1 (standardbred rule changes only listed):

# **Standardbred Race Coupling**

**Rule 17.12.01**, along with other rules, will be modified so that owners and trainers with two (2) horses drawn in the same race will no longer be required to couple the horses for pari-mutuel purposes.

**Objective:** This change recognizes the importance of having full fields for Ontario standardbred races and providing participants with expanded economic opportunities as more horses may be added onto race cards.

Effective Date: April 1, 2017

# **Eliminate Directives for Triactor and Superfecta Field Size**

**General Directives No. 2 and No. 3 – 2009** will be removed, providing racetracks with more flexibility to set their own field sizes.

**Objective:** This supports AGCO's modern regulatory approach, which allows for more flexibility in making business decisions in those areas that do not pose a risk to integrity, public safety or the public interest.

# **Human Alcohol and Drug Program Changes**

Based on evidence-based research, the AGCO is revising and clarifying definitions for the Human Alcohol and Drug Program under the Rules of Racing. These include changes regarding what is deemed a prohibited substance, which includes cannabis and cannabis products, and the development of on-site screening for prohibited and impairing substances.

In addition, a number of rule changes are being made to establish "Safety Sensitive Positions" and a protocol for what positions may be considered "safety sensitive" in the future. Further communications and engagement with industry on these rule changes will occur in the weeks ahead to support implementation.

Objective: These rule changes enhance the AGCO's commitment to participant health and safety in Ontario's horse racing industry.

# AGCO Official Race Reports and Twitter - Pilot Project

As part of the AGCO's commitment to transparency and enhanced communication, the Commission will pilot the release of race reports after a day / evening of racing. Additionally, real time communication for critical in-race calls will be enhanced with the use of Twitter.

The AGCO race reports will be available online and will include details on the calls made by Race Officials during each race and other insights impacting each race card. Daily Race reports are common in other racing jurisdictions and have been advocated for by the betting public for additional wagering insights and by participants for improving consistency.

The pilot is being launched at Western Fair Raceway in April 2017. The intent of the pilot is to get the right processes in place before potentially expanding the initiative to other racetracks. The AGCO hopes to be able to share the results of the pilot and potential next steps for expanding the service across the province in July.

# Clarifying and Aligning Rules across all Breeds

As part of the AGCO's commitment to simplifying regulatory processes for racing participants, the AGCO will be streamlining and simplifying licensing rules for multi-owner

arrangements, with a focus on fractional ownership arrangements.

The licensing rules will be reviewed, rewritten and simplified to provide consistency across all three breeds. The AGCO will also develop a guidebook for best practices. This educational approach will provide insight to new and returning members on the licensing process and best practices for multi- owner arrangements.

By making improvements to the multi-ownership licensing process, AGCO hopes to support greater opportunities for racing participants. The AGCO will continue to engage with the industry as it delivers on this commitment.

Targeting: Fall 2017

### **Extreme Weather Standard for Race Cancellations**

As it moves to a risk and outcomes-based regulatory approach, the AGCO is developing an extreme weather standard. The standard will address racetrack cancellation policies associated with extreme temperatures. The AGCO is collaborating with industry researchers to establish scientifically determined temperatures that, if met or exceeded, would necessitate race card cancellations. The extreme weather standard will help ensure that the health and welfare of equine athletes and racing participants is safeguarded while providing tracks with the operational flexibility to work with horsepeople to cancel races when needed, so racing participants do not incur unnecessary hardship. The AGCO will be working with racetracks and industry participants on this reform.

Targeting: Fall 2017

# **Racetrack Concussion Protocol Standard**

In 2017 the AGCO will begin work to establish a regulatory standard requiring racetracks to implement a concussion protocol for jockeys and drivers. With an increasing awareness of the danger of head injuries in sports, and reflecting steps taken in other horse racing jurisdictions and sporting leagues, the AGCO is continuing to ensure racing participants have appropriate health and safety protections.

The AGCO will work collaboratively with racetracks, industry associations, and other industry stakeholders on the development and introduction of a concussion protocol, for implementation at racetracks across Ontario.

Throughout this policy development process, the AGCO will provide industry with quarterly updates on the progress of the initiative.

# **Drivers for WDC confirmed**

The field of 11 harness racing drivers has now been confirmed for the 2017 World Driving Championship (WDC), to be hosted by Standardbred Canada this August.

Brandon Campbell of Calgary is Canada's representative in the WDC and earned his spot in the international competition by winning the 2016 National Driving Championship at The Raceway at the Western Fair District in London, Ontario last October.

Dexter Dunn of New Zealand is the defending champion of the WDC following his victory in the 2015 WDC hosted in Australia. New Zealand, who also has the opportunity to send a second driver because they have the defending champion, has named Mark Purdon as their other competitor.

Last summer, the European Driving Championship was held to determine their six drivers for the 2017 WDC. The event was won by Finland's Mika Forss with Bjorn Goop from Sweden finishing second and The Netherlands' Rick Ebbinge completing the top three.

Eirik Hoitomt from Norway, Austria's Gerhard Mayr and Germany's Michael Nimczyk also qualified.

Recently Ebbinge advised that he was unable to take part in the WDC so an offer was extended to Rik Depuydt of Belgium, who confirmed his participation late last week.

based on their finishing position and the top point earner at the end of the 22 races will be declared the 2017 World Driving Champion and win \$25,000 USD in prize money.

The first leg kicks off at Century Downs Racetrack and Casino in Balzac, AB on Saturday, Aug. 12.

Following the first leg in Alberta, the drivers will then head to Ontario for the next two legs. Mohawk Racetrack in Campbellville will play host to the second leg on Monday, Aug. 14, and that will be followed by the third leg at

Georgian Downs in Innisfil on Aug. 15.

The action then moves to Trois-Rivières, QC on Wednesday, Aug. 16, where Hippodrome 3R will play host the fourth leg of the WDC before the drivers head to Prince Edward Island and Red Shores Racetrack and Casino at Charlottetown Driving Park for the fifth and final leg of the Championship on Friday, Aug. 18, one of the highlights of Old Home Week.

This event, along with the 25th anniversary edition of the World Trotting Conference, hosted in Charlottetown, PEI, are both held every two years and will coincide with the 250th Anniversary of horse racing in Canada, and Canada 150 celebrations.

Canadians have won the WDC on four occasions. Hervé Filion won the inaugural edition in 1970, his nephew Sylvain Filion won in 1999 and Jody Jamieson won the 2001 and 2011 editions of the WDC. A Canadian driver has yet to win at home.

# Pocono opens 52nd season on Tuesday

The standardbred trotters and pacers will begin their 52nd season of pari-mutuel harness racing in northeast Pennsylvania this Tuesday evening (March 21), as The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono will present the first of 135 cards of the sulky sport scheduled for 2017, with Tuesday's first race marked for 6:30 p.m.

The racing was set to begin on Saturday night the 18th, but two feet of snow at the mountain oval this past Tuesday and Wednesday, followed by high winds that caused considerable drifting in places, put paid to that idea, as for the safety of the horses and horsemen it was imperative to do a thorough job of track preparation, and thus the opener was pushed back until Tuesday.

The highlight of the 2017 Pocono season will come on Saturday, July 1, with the \$2 million+ Sun Stakes Saturday card, which annually draws the sport's best horses over several of the major categories. It was recently announced that Wiggle It Jiggleit, 2015 Harness Horse of the Year at age three and the fierce season-long rival of 2016 Horse of the Year Always B Miki, will make his debut for the year in the Franklin Pace eliminations, to be held on Saturday, June 24.

And speaking of Wiggle It Jiggleit – the very first race of

the 2017 racing season at Pocono, a \$14,000 pace for "non-winners of three races or \$30,000 lifetime," is likely to have as its chalk, starting from post three, a stablemate to "Wiggle," from the Bergstein/Proximity Award-winning Team Teague of owner George, driver Montrell, and trainer Clyde Francis. This three-year-old Delmarvalous gelding – who is three-for-four in his brief career – is named Nine Ways (nine is of course three times three), and his fastest win is in 1:53. (That's a lot of coincidental numerology.)

Pocono's all-time driving champion George Napolitano Jr. will be on the scene from opening night, coming up from Florida, where he already has shown himself in "midseason form" with a 27 per cent win rate; his brother Anthony, second in the standings last year, will also have a full driving schedule from the word "go."

The basic racing schedule at Pocono follows a Saturday through Tuesday basis, with first post at 6:30 except on Sundays, when the action starts an hour later. After Tuesday the 21st, Pocono is scheduled to race on Saturday-Sunday-Tuesday of the "following racing week" (March 25-28), with Mondays joining the mix on April 10.
