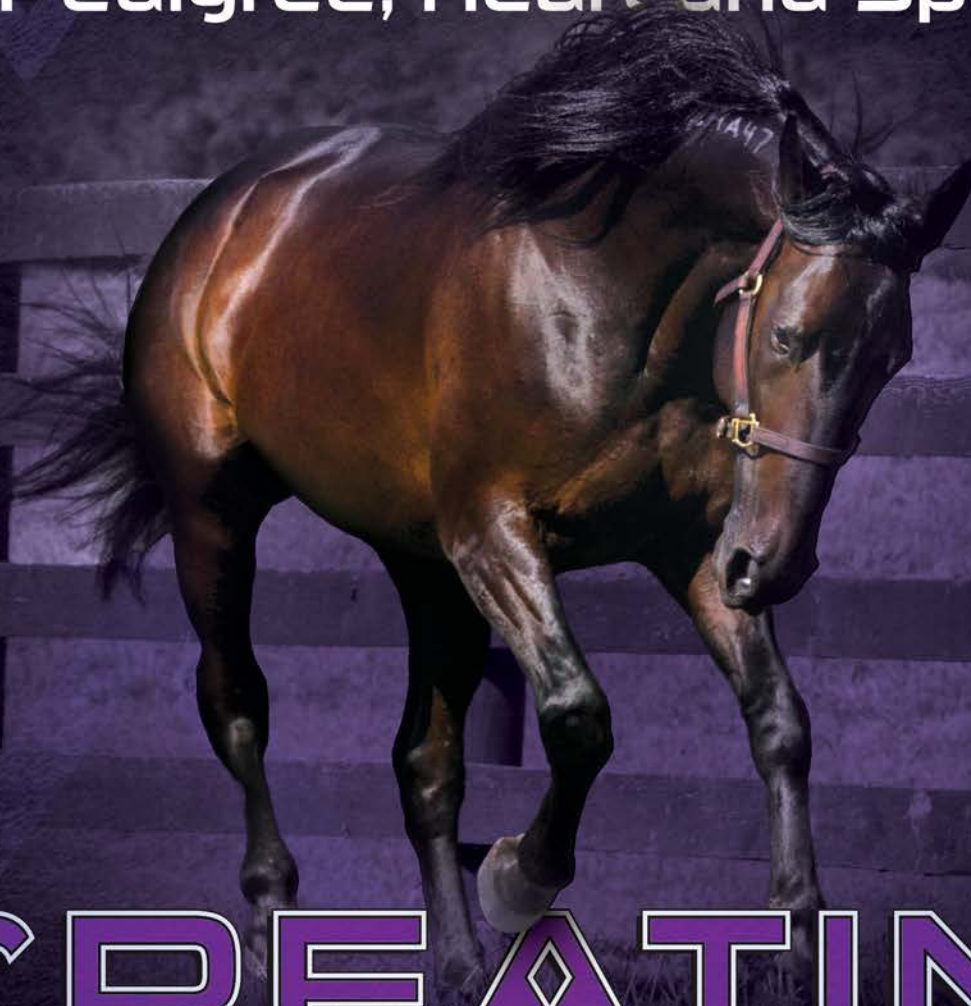

Campbell's last drive will come in the Legends Day Trot on the idyllic half-mile track.

The legend's last drive will be on Legends Day.

John Campbell confirmed Saturday that the last official drive of his career will come at Clinton Raceway in Ontario on July 30 during the track's biennial Legends Day card.

"I'm going to end up where I started. Ontario has been big part of my life," said Campbell, who is a native of Nairn, ON, northwest of the city of London and about 40 miles south of Clinton. "Although I've spent most of my life in New Jersey, I still consider Ontario home for a huge part of my life. It's coming full-circle and I'm very comfortable with that."

On Thursday, it was announced ([full story here](#)) that Campbell will become president and chief executive officer of The Hambletonian Society as of July 1. That means Campbell's last active day as a driver will be June 30, with two exceptions — Hall of Fame Day at Goshen Historic Track on July 2 and Legends Day, which was created by Clinton Raceway general manager Ian Fleming and is an event Campbell has never missed since it began in 2001.

"I had talked to Ian about the date earlier in the winter and I had a commitment to go to Clinton and I didn't want to change that. Contractually, (the Hambletonian Society) wanted me to stop driving the first of July, obviously, and

that's been reported, but I also told Mr. Ebby Gerry, who is very involved with the harness museum up in Goshen, that I'd like to drive on the Hall of Fame Day there and then I also had a commitment to race at Clinton. So, (the Society) talked to their insurance company and those are my two last dates (as a driver)."

Fleming said he is deeply honored Campbell's last drive will come at Clinton Raceway.

"It's great," Fleming said. "Legends Day has always been our biggest day since we started it. So, it was a big day for us to start with and now with it being the last drive for John, it makes it even more exciting. We're honored he's decided to make Clinton his last stop."

Legends Day features a bevy of Hall of Fame horsemen signing autographs, racing against each other in the Legends Day Trot and then joining in on a popular banquet that in 2015 fed more than 1,000 people in a trackside tent.

All eight previous editions of Legends Day have been held on the Labor Day weekend, but a conflict this year with the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championships caused Fleming to move the event to July 30 in hopes of drawing the greatest number of Hall of Fame horsemen.

"Also, a lot of fans can't come on the long weekend. So, we think it's going to be a good idea to try it at the end of July."

The event is a fundraiser for charities in Clinton. In 2015, Legends Day raised \$30,000 for the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation, which will be the charity again this year.

"It's an event that seems to be picking up speed. So, we're going to hope for even better things this year," Fleming said.

"I'm such a huge fan of Legends Day and the whole concept Ian (Fleming) came up with and how he puts it on,"

Campbell said. "The crowd there each and every time has just been remarkable. I feel very honored and lucky to have my last go-around in front of those people."

Legends Day was also a favorite of Campbell's late father, Jack. "(My wife) Paula said, 'Give your dad one more day and I know what day he would pick,'" Campbell said, adding that if his last driving appearance does draw more people, all the better to help the hospital.

"If the crowd is bigger and there's more benefit to the community from this, that's just an added bonus and, obviously, makes me feel very good. That's just great if that's the case," he said.

Campbell said he's received a "tremendously positive" reaction to Thursday's news that he was quitting driving on his terms and taking over the helm of the Hambletonian Society. He will replace Tom Charters who is reducing his work schedule as he edges toward retirement.

"Everybody has been wishing me well and been very happy for me and very supportive of my decision," Campbell said. "I will say there was a lot of people kind of surprised and some people that are shocked that I'm retiring (from driving). That surprised me a bit, but it's been overwhelmingly positive.

"As I said to some people, 'You can't drive horses forever.'"

Campbell said ending his career at Clinton is about taking his career full-circle and reconnecting with family such as his great nephew Tyler McLinchey (shown together at Clinton in 2013).

Campbell, who will turn 62 on April 8, said he likely would have retired before now if he hadn't been able to still compete at the highest level of the sport.

"I'm proud of the fact that even in 2016 I got opportunities in the big races all year long," Campbell said. "That's one thing I'm really proud of and that's why I really kept going like I did. I was still getting opportunities in big races. There's lots of guys out there that are very, very good drivers and they're looking to get in those and I was still in them."

He said he would love one more shot in a major stakes race and the most notable one on the schedule is the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup on June 17 at Mohawk Racetrack. Campbell is the NA Cup's all-time leading driver with six victories.

"I would love to have one more kick at the can in the North America Cup for sure," he said. "I really didn't have a top two-year-old pacing colt last year, but you never know what's going to come out and you never know how things work out. I've gotten drives in every conceivable way imaginable over the years. It would be great just to have one more run at the North America Cup."

Lifetime, Campbell has won just about every major stakes races in the game multiple times, visited the winner's circle on 10,636 occasions and collected purses of more than \$299 million, \$85 million more than the next closest man – retired driver Ron Pierce – and more than every jockey in the thoroughbred game except John Velazquez.

Fleming said more details about Legends Day will be released in the weeks ahead, but, above all, Campbell's retirement is an opportunity for one of the greatest drivers to ever sit in a sulky to close out his career in a manner

befitting his incredible credentials.

"He'll be driving against a bunch of other Hall of Famers for his last drive," Fleming said. "It's a great day for us, anyway, but I think we can make it even bigger. We're certainly excited about the chance to do this."

Missile J (Tim Tetrick) won the first of four Levy Series opening legs Saturday at Yonkers for trainer Scott DiDomenico and Indiana-based owners John McGill and Brian Carsey.

Levy Series begins at Yonkers

Yonkers Raceway's George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series for free-for-allers began Saturday night (March 18), with a quartet of \$50,000 divisions over a 'sloppy' surface.

The opening event saw 3-2 choice Missile J (Tim Tetrick, \$5) charge from sixth in the lane to win going away in 1:54.1. Unhurried from post position two, he rolled late, whipping a pocketed Blood Brother (Jason Bartlett) by a length-and-a-half. Third went to a rallying Guantanamo Bay (Scott Zeron), with 78-1 Burning N (Ron Cushing) and a pace-setting Keystone Velocity (Dan Dube) settling for the remainder.

For Missile J, a 4-year-old American Ideal—Cantor's Daughter gelding trained by Scott DiDomenico for Hoosierland co-owners John McGill and Brian Carsey, it was his fifth win in six seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$22, with the triple returning \$76.50.

The second Levy grouping saw Long Live Rock (Dube, \$38.60) author a decisive, first-over upset. Moving from fourth (from post two), he dismissed 1-2 favorite McWicked (Zeron), then drew off to win by three lengths in 1:54.1. Season-debuting All Bets Off (Matt Kakaley) couldn't match

the winner's tow but finished second, with 62-1 shot Mattamerican (Mark MacDonald) third.

Santa Fe Beachboy (Jordan Stratton) and Melmerby Beach (Tetrick) grabbed the minors. McWicked, caught three-deep early, wound up a badly-beaten seventh.

For fifth choice Long Live Rock, an eight-year-old Rocknroll Hanover—Perfect Gesture gelding owned and trained by Rene Allard, it was his first win in six seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$232, with the triple returning \$3,014.

The evening's third series soiree saw Provocativeprincen (Stratton, \$5.70) — from post two — prevail in a blanket finish. Away third, he engaged Bettor's Edge (Brett Miller), then outgamed a pocketed, 8-5 fave Rockin' Ron (Yannick Gingras) by a head in 1:54.2.

Mach it So (Tetrick) in his first seasonal start, was third, beaten a neck, with Bettor's Edge and 77-1 Texas Terror N (MacDonald) earning the lesser loot.

For second choice Provocativeprincen, an 8-year-old Down Under Grinfromeartoe—Catherine Zeta gelding owned by Harry von Knoblauch and trained by Peter Tritton, he's now four-for-four to begin the season. The exacta paid \$16.60, with the triple returning \$62.50.

"He's done nothing wrong since I've sat behind him," Stratton said.

The first round's final foray offered the fastest feet as Soto (Kakaley, \$14) from the pocket was able to get 'first run' against defending series champion Bit of a Legend N (Stratton). The former, from post three, whipped the latter by a half-length in 1:53.3.

Bit of a Legend N, as the 2-5 choice, was second-up and may have waited a tad too long. Pace-setting Somewhere in L A (Bartlett), Wakizashi Hanover (Tetrick) and a Always at My Place (Gingras) rounded out the payees.

For third choice Soto, a 5-year-old son of Rock N Roll Heaven—Incredible Beauty trained by Eric Ell for co-owners

Kenneth Wood, William Dittmar Jr. and Stephen Iaquina, it was his fifth win in nine '17 starts. The exacta paid \$23, the triple returned \$55 and the superfecta paid \$198.

"He's just a versatile horse," Kakaley said. "I would have been happy either cutting the mile or sitting second. It may have been different had Bit of a Legend N been first-up, but my horse was very good."

The Saturday night Pick 5, buoyed by a carryover in excess of \$3,100, was taken down by one bettor. A winning combination of 2/3/8/7/3 returned \$13,468.25 for that 50-cent wager.

A reminder that today's live all-trot 'French' card begins at 12:30 p.m. and is the final Sunday card until the end of May.

Millenium Wheel upsets at Big M

Millenium Wheel made a winning Meadowlands debut last week as a 7-1 outsider. Making a double jump up in class Saturday (March 18), the Joe Hundertpfund, Jr. trainee won again in the \$18,000 featured pace as an 11-1 long shot.

Andy Miller positioned Millenium Wheel in the pocket while Tyler Buter put The Rock on the front end through swift fractions of :26.4 and :55.1 for the half. After three quarters in 1:24.1, The Rock began to tire from those earlier efforts. Millenium Wheel was able to mount his rally up the pylons while Jacksruckytoo and Chevals Clivesdale launched powerful rallies from the back of the six-horse field.

Millenium Wheel held them off to win his second straight and 19th career race in 1:52. Even money favorite Jacksruckytoo was second with Chevals Clivesdale third.

Millenium Wheel is an eight-year-old Bettor's Delight—London Eye gelding shared in ownership by William Sartin and Mark Salerno.

Hundertpfund and Miller teamed up to win again in the 11th race with Special T Rocks, another Dover invader. Special T Rocks won the 2012 Clyde Hirt Series final at the Meadowlands when trained by Daryl Bier.

Marcus Miller led all drivers with three wins including a \$56.80 upset in the nightcap with Ooh Bad Boy.

Tyler and Amber Buter teamed up to win a pair of races with the Meadowlands-loving City Hall and Vorst. City Hall has won seven of his last eight Big M races dating back to last fall.

Total handle on the 12-race card was \$2,570,693.

Sossy's King Kong crushes in Williams Memorial

Sossy's King Kong was gorilla-like in the \$22,500 championship final of the George Williams Memorial Series on Saturday night (March 18) at Miami Valley Raceway.

Following a pair of runner-up finishes to Control Tower (Dan Noble) in preliminary legs, driver Tyler Smith decided to play hardball in the early stages of the final after drawing two spots closer to the pylons than his daunted adversary. Smith and Sossy's King Kong did eventually allow odds-on favorite Control Tower to clear to the front, but not before pacing past the quarter-mile marker in :26.3.

Content to ride the pocket until the head of the stretch, the winning 4-year-old **Dragon Again**—Daughterofortune gelding roared to victory when angled out for the stretch drive. Control Tower tripped the middle teletimer beams in :54.2 and 1:23.3 before Sossy's King Kong stopped the clock in 1:53.1.

Kris Hinchcliff trains the series winner for Hinchcliff Racing. He paid \$11.40 as the third choice in the wagering.

Driver Trace Tetrick visited the winner's circle five times on Saturday night to become the first reinsman to reach 100 wins during the 2017 meet.

Tetrick, who will be returning to Hoosier Park on April 1, but plans to continue racing at Miami Valley two days a week during the final five weeks of the southwest Ohio meet, currently has a 17-win lead over Kayne Kauffman (83 wins). Tyler Smith (58) and Chris Page (56) are next in the dash derby.

Glengate Farms making a comeback

Some 10 years after one of Ontario's biggest commercial breeding operations closed its doors, its proprietor, Jim Bullock, is rebuilding an elite trotting broodmare band at a new location in the province.

Jim Bullock couldn't sound more pleased to be carefully building a top-notch standardbred broodmare band in Ontario and to be completely renovating a thoroughbred farm he purchased last June near the town of Erin to provide a home for his mares.

"I would say it is two-thirds passion and one-third business," Bullock said when reached at his Florida winter home. "I think we can cover our costs and make a little money if we have some luck. I enjoy it very much."

About 10 years ago, Bullock shut down Glengate Farms as commercial breeding operation that was one of the largest in Ontario and home to stallions Balanced Image, Apaches Fame and Angus Hall, among others. At its peak, Glengate had some 70 mares. Coupled with the closure of Armstrong Bros. farm in 2004, the loss of Glengate — located just down the road from Mohawk Racetrack in Campbellville — was a huge blow to the province's breeding industry.

Bullock, 72, has kept his hand in the game since then, but now Glengate is making something of a comeback as a breeding operation in a new location near Erin, ON.

Bullock said he's enjoying trying to build a select band of trotting broodmares.

"I'm not up to Katz and Libfeld," Bullock said of Ontario breeders Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, who have, arguably, the best broodmare band in the province and were named the breeders of the year in both Canada and the United States in 2016. "But I thought (with trotters) there was a niche in the market when so many people either downsized or got out.

"We've got room on the farm for a total of 37 or 38 broodmares. I've upped mine to just over 20... Close to 90 per cent are horses that we bought as yearlings. (Trainer) John Bax and I, we raced them and then retired them to the broodmare band. Even going back to when I was operating a large commercial farm, I found the best broodmares I had were those I bought as well-bred yearlings, raced them and had some success with them and then converted them to broodmares. That's the Pepi Lavecs and Gramolas of the world."

Bax said few people in Ontario have a trotting broodmare band as nice as the one Bullock has assembled.

"He's very good at finding a pedigree that will work and that has value. That's his expertise," Bax said of Bullock. "He leaves it up to me to do the conformation or work with him on the conformation, but he's very good at finding pedigrees that are 'alive' or 'hot', I guess 'current' is the word.

"He sold one for \$190,000 last fall and that was pretty special to him."

Courant Inc. of Florida purchased Superior Class, a Muscle Hill colt out of Bullock's Angus Hall mare Ruling Class, for \$190,000 out of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. Preferred Equine Marketing consigned the colt.

"The bulk of us agree that if you are going to be a breeder in Ontario, and raising between 10 and 20 yearlings, you're going to hope to get a sale topper that's at least a six-figure yearling. And those are hard to produce in Ontario for Ontario buyers. The sale toppers are usually in the \$70,000

to \$80,000 range. There's nothing wrong with that, but it's a game of averages, as you know. For every \$190,000 one we sell, we sell one with a big hock for \$8,000. It's an average thing," Bullock said.

"Initially, I thought I would just raise my own yearlings (to race), but I think it's better to raise and sell them and buy what you want. Then you can diversify your band."

Bullock credited Susan Zammit for doing a "great job" looking after the broodmares and raising the young horses.

"We had a very successful season last year and I've got a great arrangement and partnership with Sue," he said.

He has similar kind things to say about his partnership with Bax. Bullock said he and Bax have campaigned horses together for nearly 25 years.

"I've had horses with other trainers and, not taking anything away from anyone else, but I probably wouldn't have the substantial involvement in the business that I have today if it wasn't for John Bax," Bullock said. "I just really enjoy being in business together and we're great friends. He's

a wonderful individual."

Bax said he would dearly love to win a Hambletonian or Breeders Crown with Bullock (he won the 2001 two-year-old trotting colt Crown with Duke Of York for Katz, Libfeld and Sam Goldband).

"His goal is the same. Jim wants to be the best and have the best, so that part is really nice that we are both aiming for the same thing," Bax said. "It's one thing to make a living in the business, but once you get a little taste of playing in the big leagues, you thirst for that again. Just to go through the motions and get a monthly bill, it isn't enough for me. It would be like running up and down the road five nights a week to have overnights and claimers, it's not where I want to be and it's not where Jim wants to be. So, in that aspect, it's been a great marriage because our philosophies are very similar."

Bullock was president and CEO of Cadillac Fairview Corporation between 1987 and 1993 and held the same title at Laidlaw Inc. from 1993 to 1999. He is also a former board member at the Woodbine Entertainment Group and has been an instrumental behind-the-scenes liaison between the province's standardbred breeders and the government. Bax said Bullock's business prowess has helped the two of them chase those big stakes dreams.

"It certainly allows for, when I go to the sale, having a little more firepower," Bax said. "We're on the same page as far as wanting to buy quality, but still getting value. With his end game being quality fillies, whenever we see a filly that he thinks has the pedigree, I will look at the conformation. I don't have the resources, but he certainly can step up if I deem it to be a can't-miss prospect. So, it works well."

Bullock said the secret is going with the best quality mares he can get.

"We've always had the historical issue of people trying to buy a \$5,000 broodmare and breeding it to a \$15,000 stud fee and wonder why they can't get \$50,000 for the yearling," he said.

When Bullock began to rebuild his broodmare band, he looked near where he lives on a 120-acre hardwood bush property on Fourth Line near Erin, ON. He found a former thoroughbred breeding farm about 10 minutes away.

"We spent last summer and fall renovating the barns. The property didn't have a house on it, so I built a house, as well. Sue has relocated there, but kept her other farm. My farm is

her broodmare facility, which she leases from me. The other farm in Rockwood is being used as a turnout facility,” Bullock said. “It’s a pretty nice farm. We’ve got 87 acres and, unlike a lot of farms, it’s high-rolling land and it is also mostly open. There’s a treed section in the back corner, but we’ve probably got 75 clear acres to use so we’ve got lots of room for horses. We’ve re-fenced most of it and rebuilt the barns from scratch and built the house.

“Like all construction projects, it got a little over budget and behind schedule, but we’re pretty happy with the results. I think the barns are very nice. They are 15-foot stalls, so you aren’t going to get a mare stepping on a yearling.”

Fittingly, the old Glengate location is now owned by Bax, who left his native Peterborough in 2015 to move closer to Mohawk and the majority of Ontario’s harness tracks.

“John said to me one day that he was interested in moving down closer to Mohawk and he’d looked at a couple of farms and didn’t see any that he liked,” Bullock said. “So, I said, ‘if you’re looking, why don’t you buy this place? We had about three conversation and we did the deal sitting in my car one day and shook hands on it. It was a pleasure to do the deal with him and I was delighted that it worked out so well for

Bullock’s partnership with trainer John Bax (above) has been beneficial to both parties and Bax even purchased the original

him and it was a happy solution for me as well. I kept my office there for a year or so afterwards, because John didn’t have an immediate need for the office.”

Bax said he wouldn’t have made the move without his 27-year-old son, Matt, becoming involved in the business as his second trainer. Now, the elder Bax is thrilled he made the move. The 115-mile drive back and forth through Toronto from Peterborough most nights had exacted a toll.

John is currently training eight horses in Florida. Matt is working with 28 horses that are based at the old Glengate Farms. As for the new farm, Bullock said the Glengate name would live on as the breeder of the horses it produces.

“The one we are kind of waiting with bated breath for at the moment is Juanitas Fury, who made just over \$400,000 for John and I. She’s in foal to Muscle Hill and due in about 10 days. She’s going back to Father Patrick,” Bullock said, the excitement palpable in his voice.

John Bax said it’s good to hear his old friend enjoying the business so much again.

“He’s at a point in his life where he deserves to be able to enjoy it,” Bax said. “Good for him that he can do that and it’s great for me and it’s great for the industry that he’s that passionate about it and gets a thrill out of it. It gives his life meaning, I’m sure, and it rubs off.”

Seeing Seth Rosenfeld's name on the program again is wonderful. Can anyone remember the richest two-year-old he campaigned way back when? No not Beach Towel, who was the sport's richest ever three-year-old in 1990 at \$2,091,860. The answer would be Halcyon, who made \$734,370 as a freshman in 1986.

Big money past 50

With John Campbell announcing this week that his retirement will be at the end of the June, it is worth noting that the two drivers who are also members of the \$200 million club — Ron Pierce and David Miller — both took their seasonal bests in earnings past their 50th birthdays. Pierce in 2006 while 50 (\$14,739,087) and just last year for Miller at 52 (\$12.5 million plus).

Youth movement

A Meadowlands card recently had four drivers under the age of 25. A look at the top 60 drivers at the Meadowlands in 1993 shows zero drivers on the list were not yet 25. Speaking of drivers not yet 25, Peter Haughton drove in five Hambletonians prior to his 25th birthday, starting at age 19 with Journalist in 1974.

Speaking of Peter Haughton and trotters, it was he who drove the first ever Meadowlands trotter to victory on Sept. 2, 1976. He drove Savoir, the defending Horse of the Year to a four-length score in a \$17,500 open and paid 7-5.

Young Chuck

Early Chuck Sylvester — like 1976, long before his Hall Of Fame career kicked into overdrive — he competed at the Meadowlands with a pacer called Perkys Kid, sophomore gelding by Egyptian Dancer; and a five-year-old trotting mare he co-owned with Gil Short by the name of Sunnys Dream.

Meadowlands missing

Is Betting Line the first stallion in four decades to stand at Hanover Shoe Farms not having ever raced at the Meadowlands?

Takter's Triple

Jimmy Takter's first Triple Crown drive came in the 1984 Yonkers Trot with Bold Vigil as part of the entry with winner Baltic Speed. Bold Vigil was impeded on the backstretch the first time and lost any chance. It is interesting to note who else was in that race: fellow Swede Per Eriksson had won his elim, from post 8 no less, with Socrates Lobell. For those keeping score, it was a pair of 23-year-old Swedes who would win seven Hambletonians between them up to and including 2016.

One tough mare

You gotta love Armbro Regina. Not only is she the last filly to go four heats in the Hambletonian (in 1976), when she won the third heat it was in 1:56.3, which was the fastest for a female to that point in the half-century history of the Hambletonian. Plus, winning heat three guaranteed a fourth heat, which went to Steve Lobell

Lesser-known world records

Two of the lesser known all-time world record setters are Warm Breeze and Jade Prince. Here's a little bit of a closer look:

Jade Prince was just two when he set a world mark of 1:54.1 on Oct. 5, 1976 in the second heat at The Red Mile. He had won in 1:55.1 earlier in the day and is the last freshman to hold the all-age mark. He lowered it two-fifths from Albatross.

Warm Breeze set a 1:53.1 world mark in Sacramento on June 26, 1977 in a \$15,000 free-for-all with Richard Farrington in the sulky. Warm Breeze won by 18-and-a-quarter lengths to improve to four-for-six on the season.

A look at the 1987 Hambletonian Day card

Mack Lobell won and was the first of John Campbell's six Hambletonians and the first of four for trainer Chuck Sylvester. Sylvester also had Dragons Lair on that card, as well as Time Well Spent and Waikiki Beach.

This Hambletonian came eight days after Campbell had seized the all-time earnings mark from Herve Filion — a record he has built on ever since and never relinquished.

That same year, Jimmy Takter made his Hambletonian debut with Sir Taurus, who was six. Varenne's sire, Waikiki Beach, was in the race, too. Joe Hogan was the driver of Go Get Lost. Joe Holloway was also on the card and would become the first trainer to win 100 races in a single meet that year.

Ulf Thoresen, the defending Hambletonian-winning driver from 1986, drove Beseiged.

Timoko dominates Criterium de Vitesse again

The French trotter won the French race for the third year in a row and fourth time in five years.

For the fourth time in five years, Timoko has won Europe's initial big mile race of the season.

With the Swedish driver Björn Goop at the controls, Timoko won the €200,000 Criterium de Vitesse on Sunday (March 12) at Cagnes-sur-Mer in France in 1:51.4.

Over the mile, Timoko has been hard to beat, especially in Cagnes-sur-Mer.

Goop was aware of how some of the opponents were thinking and did not sacrifice too much to get in a fight over the lead in the beginning of the race. Instead, the 41-year-old Swedish champion driver waited until after the first turn before he let Timoko pass the early leader Oasis Bi. When he is in front, Timoko fights and even if Un Mec d'Heripre and Jean-Michel Bazire tried to challenge on the home stretch, there were never any discussion about who would win Criterium de Vitesse this year.

It was the third Criterium de Vitesse victory in a row for Timoko, who crossed the line with a new stakes record of 1:51.4 for the mile. The son of Imoko out of the And Arifant mare Kiss Me Coulonces made history by equaling the great Ourasi's exploit of winning Criterium de Vitesse four times. Un Mec d'Heripre finished second and Red Rose America took the third place.

"I was more stressed today compared to the last time Timoko raced," Timoko's trainer Richard Westerink said after

the victory. "Maybe I felt like that because the horse in unbeaten on this track. We saw a great race and I knew that my horse wouldn't let anyone pass him when he was in front. If Timoko continues like this, it will be wonderful to go to the Elitlopp in May."

The next big target for the 10-year old champion likely will be The Elitlopp at Solvalla – a race where Timoko has one victory in five starts.

Timoko is a unique horse. The trotter, generally speaking, competed on the highest of levels since he started his career as a two-year old in August, 2009.

Westerink, from The Netherlands, took care of the reigns in the horse's debut years and during 2010 the duo had some great moments on the track.

Timoko won the two Group I races – the €240,000 Criterium des 3 ans and the €200,000 Prix Albert View – and followed up by winning the five first races as a four-year old, including two group I races – the €240,000 Prix de Selection and €240,000 Criterium des 4 ans.

On Track Piraten tough in Sweden

On Track Piraten was defeated at Yonkers Raceway in October last year, but since then, the Swedish nine-year old gelding has never lost a race in Sweden.

Last Saturday (March 11), the son of Kool du Caux won his ninth race in a row with driver Johnny Takter in the "Gold division" at Bollnäs racetrack. It was the 104th start of On Track Piraten's career.

The trotter finished fourth in the Yonkers International Trot in October 2016 and the charismatic gelding seems to go towards a new great season, a season that already has started with five wins in five attempts.

We are talking about a complete racehorse and so far this year, On Track Piraten has been winning over the distances of a mile, two 5/8ths and 2.5 5/8ths of a mile. His seasonal record is 1:53.4 and he's earned a little more than \$100,000 in 2017.

In total, On Track Piraten has \$1,595,000 in earnings and 36 victories.
