"I'm leaning towards buying a sailboat and sailing around the world for a few months or a year or two or three," Pierce

Ron Pierce on winning the pacing Triple Crown with Blissfull Hall

said this week. "I've sailed before, but never on my own boat. So, I figured, if I get my own boat that would be pretty cool."

It's been more than a year since the 59-year-old Hall of Famer last drove a horse. Sidelined by surgery to his neck and back since March of last year, he said he's not even thinking about returning to the bike. Today, the avid outdoorsman is just concentrating on getting healthy to restore a normal life.

Pierce said he is relishing being away from the track because it has given him the opportunity to do a number of things he's wanted to do his whole life, but couldn't because he was always racing horses.

Apart from fishing, diving and swimming in the Keys, Pierce said he is riding 25 to 30 miles a day on his bicycle. If he's up to it, he plans to do some climbing with his brother, Artie, in Alaska this summer.

"He's kind of like a goat. He's much better at it than I am, he's much more skilled, but I'm going to try as best I can to keep up with him. He's got a couple of mountains he wants to climb," Pierce said of Artie. "In Alaska, I want to get my legs in really good shape, my body in really good shape — as good a shape as I can get it in."

This winter has been mostly uneventful, but Pierce said he had one close call in the ocean.

"I was fighting this barracuda out at Molasses Key and just as I got him to the boat, this huge bull shark — I mean, this thing was big — came up so quickly. I didn't even see him come until he was up. They come at you like 50 miles an hour... About half his body came out of the water and he was only about three, four feet from the boat.

"He had to be about eight feet long, nine feet long. It kind of woke me up, but it was a rush. There are so many sharks down here that they definitely make you look over your shoulder when you're diving. It's definitely something you keep in mind."

This week, Blissfull Hall was also on Pierce's mind when the announcement came that the 1999 pacing Triple Crown winner had made the ballot for the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame's class of 2016.

"Racing Blissfull Hall was one of the most pleasurable experiences I've ever had in my life for (owner) Daniel Plouffe and (trainer) Ben Wallace," Pierce said. "I loved racing that horse for those guys. They never put any pressure on me. They never second-guessed me. They were just a couple of the classiest guys you could drive for. I felt that way when I was racing that horse. It was just a pleasurable experience.

The times he got beat, believe it or not, that was my fault.

"He got beat in the Adios because he got a little too hot, which was my fault. I stirred him up a little bit

before the race and that was a big mistake. He got to kicking the bike. I still blame myself for getting him fired up. I guess you could say Blissfull Hall and I were just getting to know each other when that happened."



Mark Ford appeals for help

The new president of the SBOA of New Jersey said everyone in the industry in the state needs to pitch in to help the casino vote get passed.

New SBOANJ president Mark Ford has his hands full trying to help get the casino vote passed in New Jersey.

These are exciting times for the New Jersey harness racing industry. Maybe nerve-racking is a better description. Would you believe terrifying?

And if the Standardbred Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ) is to march toward a successful campaign to get casino gaming, which, in all likelihood, will save the sport in the Garden State, it will do so with a new man at the helm.

After a stormy end to the prior administration —which he preferred not to address — veteran trainer Mark Ford, an SBOANJ director for the past decade, was recently elected president of the embattled group, which is gearing up for what they hope will be success in November, in the form of voters saying 'yes' to casino gaming in Northern New Jersey (hopefully, at the Meadowlands).

Never known for holding back his opinions, Ford, who races his horses at just about every harness venue in the Northeast, is frustrated with the current state of affairs.

"It's mind boggling that we can have an amateur race at the Meadowlands that they bet \$300,000 (actually \$297,000 on the Friday, March 18 card) on, but we can go to Yonkers and race non-winners of \$12,000 racing for a purse of \$18,000 and the total handle is \$20,000 (to be fair, likely closer to \$50,000).

It's just unbelievable the amount of money that's around. For the life of me, I can't understand, no one is going to refuse the money, but no one is worried about our own product. We might have differences of opinion with (Meadowlands owner) Jeff Gural, but at least he's trying to do something about the horrible product we are putting out industry wide. Nothing's perfect, everybody has their own ideas, but at least he stopped some of the bull----. You know, the 1-5 shots every race, the cheating, at least he's trying to

do something."

Even though the current meting has seen more mid- and low-range stock on the track, Ford says winning at the Meadowlands is still as sweet as a chocolate bunny on Easter Sunday.

"I consider myself the youngest of the old crew," he said. "I raced under (then Big M director of racing) Joe DeFrank in the mid-1990s. The Meadowlands was a magical type of place. When you were a little kid, your whole goal was to race at the Meadowlands. I was so proud of the fact that I got to go there and be one of the horsemen in the better days. And it's still like that. There's nothing like the feeling of winning a race at the Meadowlands. But the other night, (Chicago horseman) Kyle Husted was here, and he set Meadowlands history when he won a race for a purse of \$5,500. I never thought that I'd see the day come when the Meadowlands would race for \$5,500."

While trying to build something special at the Big M, Gural has asked his horsemen to support the track at the entry box, but sometimes, that's a tough thing to do from a practical standpoint.

"It's unbelievable, the purses at Yonkers and the purses at Pocono. For the blue-collar horsemen, they have to go where the money is," said Ford. "I have to race at Pocono, I have to race at Yonkers, I have to pay the bills. It's great to have a product with 10-horse fields with big pools at the Meadowlands for betting. On the other hand, if you can go to Yonkers or (Harrah's) Philadelphia in an eight-horse field, it's a big difference to the blue-collar horseman as far as being able to cash a good check for a bigger purse. I've always considered myself a Jersey guy, a Meadowlands guy. There is nothing I enjoy more than racing at the Meadowlands. But it's just plain and simple, I have to follow the money."

Given the horse shortage, one thing Gural is going to try is approach officials at the United States Trotting Association to see if all of the tracks that open at this time of year can schedule race dates in a way so the lack of horses doesn't create short fields and bad betting opportunities. Ford says good luck with that.

"I know everybody involved. It's not going to work," he said. "Pocono is going to do what they want. Philadelphia will do what they want. Yonkers is definitely going to do what they want. And Jeff is going to come out of it angry and frustrated. I don't know exactly what the answer is. But it's something we are going to have to talk about."

So what lies ahead?

"Without some form of gaming, we cannot survive," said Ford. "We cannot survive on the wagering alone with the competition that we have. Without gaming, there will be no Jeff Gural, and there will be no Meadowlands. We are going to do what we can to push to get this through. It's pretty much all or nothing now. There's just nothing left in New Jersey. There's no sire stakes, no breeding farms. We are all on our last life line now."

"We both want the same thing, I'll take my hat off to him,

at least he's trying," said Ford of Gural. "The product at Yonkers and the product at other tracks...no one cares, they just don't want any problems. I think we have a healthy working attitude."

Ford expects Gural and whichever Atlantic City hotel he partners up with to spend somewhere between \$30-50 million to get the word out to voters as to why New Jersey's harness industry needs this casino gaming measure to pass in November. "We'll be there to support the Meadowlands, to support Freehold, and do everything we can for the cause," said Ford. "We need to educate the people, keeping the farmland preserved is a key in this whole situation. There is a lot of work to be done, but how much can you do with no money? That's about all we can do."

"We were here originally, the only form of gaming," said Leo MacNamara, the SBOANJ's executive administrator. "Then they came in with lotteries and casinos. They robbed from us. Now, they don't think we should be able to extend options to those same people."

So how much green can the horsemen expect, should the measure pass?

"No less than two per cent (is the language being used), that's not a lot of money," said MacNamara. "But there is to be enabling legislation which will allow for a significant

amount of money to go over to support horse racing. That's a promise that's been made."

Translation: If voters say yes, those in racing in New Jersey can expect to be taken care of.

"The idea of having 16 races a night and 150-200 race dates a year, I don't know if that needs to part of our master plan," said MacNamara. "Especially when you consider the horse shortage."

MacNamara doesn't know what the industry's cut will turn out to be. \$50 million? At this point, it's hard to say. "I doubt we'll get that much. In some ways, if you have too much, the legislature comes after it."

"There's an old saying that pigs get fed and hogs get slaughtered," said MacNamara. "Sometimes, when you ask for too much, you end up without nearly enough. I think they are going to be fair with us."

At this point, everyone in the harness industry is hoping for a 'yes' from the voters. They'll be time to worry about how the big the pie is and how to cut it up down the road.

Letters to the Editor roundup: Marketing, passing lanes and video

My favorite day of the week at Harness Racing Update is always Sunday, because it's letter to the editor day. Most of the letters are well-thought out and come from both the everyday folks like me and you, to the movers and shakers, and I always find them interesting. The only thing I don't like is we don't get enough of them.

Last Sunday was a pretty good day, though, with letters from Joe Faraldo and Phil Langley about – in part – marketing, along with Alan and Bob's thoughts regarding free track video and a passing lane being added at Hoosier Park.

I'd like to spend some time discussing them.

Joe and Phil's encompassing back and forth about the USTA, transparency, TV, social media and several other issues had a lot of inside baseball, but was quite eye-opening. During the marketing portion of the discussion they did make some good points, but as a marketer I did disagree with some of the premises.

"Marketing" is a word that sends shivers down the back of anyone who works in the ad or marketing industry, because it's a word that really has no meaning. Or even worse, it has about 10,000 meanings.

I am sure you've all heard of the ride sharing service called "Uber". It has disrupted the taxi industry in dozens of cities worldwide and is getting more and more press (some negative, some positive). Uber is in a unique position. It's a nascent company that needs to do what every other business has to do (promote itself to customers) while navigating political foes, existing business laws and regulations, along with entrenched forces.

Uber's weapon of choice is "marketing" of the 10,000 meaning variety.

Uber is not allowed to serve Calgary, AB, due to local laws. So they offered free rides to Calgary residents for a \$5 local charity donation.

When launching in Australia, Uber was being attacked by some politicians and the complaints were resonating with the general public. They decided some good PR was in order,

so they created #uberkitten day on social media, where shelter kittens were transported to potential adopters by Uber drivers for free.

They've offered Pedi-Uber, for peddle cars, which they lost money on, but generated some buzz

They've injected themselves into popular culture, paying to play on shows like Jimmy Kimmel Live.

Notice what the above is, and isn't. It is not television ads, or digital marketing, or billboards to solely attract customers. It is public relations, grassroots marketing and reputation management. Their audience is not only the customer, but governments, politicians and others who hold their survival in the palms of their hands. They are trying to get everyone on side, because they are going to need everyone in their quest to succeed.

You can't measure that marketing with fancy metrics or high-priced software. You can't say the \$50,000 cost of free rides in Calgary brought in revenue, because it didn't. But, according to Uber it's all good.

Harness racing needs "marketing" but perhaps not in the sense people think of the word. Harness racing in many ways is Uber, because it depends on more than customers to survive.

We might hear complaints about face painting, pony rides and wiener dog day at the races; we often hear spending marketing money on Twitter or Facebook is impossible to measure and wasteful. But, in my view, it is not.

I have personally heard how a government employee who has some pull said, "it was neat to see that horse trend on Twitter." I have heard one high-up official go giddy over "bouncy pony races" when he was at the track, seeing where slot money he has a say in, was going.

People having fun on Facebook or Twitter talking harness racing, slot money looking like it is doing something positive, is all marketing. It does not have a return, or an ROI, but like with Uber, it does something.

It's similar with television. Sure we know that it doesn't bring in revenue, but someone somewhere that will make a decision regarding the sport might see it. John Kasich might be running for President, but he's also Governor of Ohio, and when he sees 40,000 people jam-packed into the State Fair with the CBS Sports Network televising an Ohio horse racing, it means something. It means, "hey, that slot money seems to be working."

I am in no way saying marketing spend in this sport will all be perfectly effective, that money should be just thrown against the wall, or that measuring it properly isn't something the sport needs to be very good at. I am in no way saying this replaces the outreach the sport needs to do, to attract new owners and new bettors. What I am saying is that harness racing marketing is public relations, government relations, relationship management, PR, digital and just about everything else. All together it means something for the future of the sport, from the shedrows, to the grandstand, to the state houses. It is not unimportant and it needs to be invested in.

Bob Emery of Florida is not a fan of the passing lane, and made that abundantly clear in his letter last week. Bob, you are not alone. I could not agree more.

Passing lanes were, in my view, created from someone in power walking across the grandstand hearing people complain that their horses get boxed in too much. To make them happy, a passing lane was invented. Guess what, like most policies adopted this way, it didn't work, and even worse, people still complain.

Passing lanes encourage less movement in a sport that demands more movement. They encourage lower mutuel prices in a sport that demands higher mutuel prices. They might be okay on half mile tracks, but for all others, they tend to do the opposite of what's intended.

At the end of his letter Bob asks if it's not too late for Hoosier to reverse the decision. I hope so Bob, I hope so.

Allan Gatto of Jersey really took issue with the Meadowlands eliminating free video from its website come May 15th or so. He believes the sport should offer free 24/7 video of harness racing, because the sport needs all the help it can get.

I understand what you're saying Allan, but I find myself disagreeing.

At one time, like Allan, I think this was important, because advance deposit wagering companies were not yet fully melded into the landscape; a lot of people still would make bets at the track or off-track venue, and go home and watch. Free website video was important. It's not that way anymore. Most tracks have an ADW arm, and all ADW's have free video for anyone who wants to watch at home. It's a different world.

I think it's much more important for the Big M to position itself with HD, because only one other major harness track — Woodbine – has HD. As well, this ensures the Meadowlands a spot on the racetrack television network, which (I believe) will make them the only harness signal broadcasting on RTN in HD. In addition, the Big M will be able to stream big races in HD for everyone, right on their website, including all of Hambletonian Day. In the past it has only been streamed in standard definition.

So, I understand the complaints, and in an ideal world where satellite time, etc is owned by this industry, full HD, free, streamed 24/7 would be great. As far as the Big M – or any harness track – goes, that time is not here yet.

Switlyk: South Florida fire is like "lightning struck me twice"

Owner is grateful one of his two homebreds was rescued, but the barn fire that killed his two-year-old Somebeachsomewhere filly is the second tragedy in that family.

Jim Switlyk said losing his beloved homebred two-year-old Somebeachsomewhere filly Selfie Onthe Beach in the barn fire that killed 12 horses March 16 at the South Florida Training Centre, is like "lightning struck me twice."

Just last month, Jim Switlyk took this selfie with Selfie Onthe Beach. On March 16, the two-year-old filly died in the barn fire at the South Florida Training Center.

It was the second Somebeachsomewhere filly out of Switlyk's mare Done Being Nice that died tragically at two. Just three years ago, Banner Beach Day – the first foal out of

Done Being Nice – won three of her first five starts, including a \$114,000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes race. The she contracted Potomac Horse Fever, developed laminitis and had to be euthanized.

"I had to beg Hanover Farms because at the time Somebeach was a hot stallion and I'm just a small breeder. I'm an individual. I'm not a big farm," Switlyk said. "I actually wrote a letter to Jim Simpson and begged for a breeding because I said, 'That first one was going to be a superstar.

She was three-for-five. She was going to be a top horse. So, they gave me another breeding and this is the one I just lost (in the fire).

"I lost two Beach fillies out of the same dam at two. It's hard to make this up."

Fortunately, the other horse Switlyk had in trainer Roman Lopez's barn — Selfie Onthe Beach's three-year-old half-brother, Jimmy — was rescued by Lopez, who was living in the barn.

While Switlyk said he's thrilled the Big Jim colt is alive and recovering from burns and "lung issues" related to the smoke, he said he's "a little stressed" about the mounting vet bills bills the Berkeley Height, NJ-based owner said are not being covered by Sam Stathis, contrary to some reports saying Stathis was paying the vet bills for all the horses injured in the fire.

"I'm going to do right by the horse. I bred this horse, I care very much about this horse. I told the vet, 'Do whatever you've got to do to try to nurse him back.' But there's obviously a big cost involved here. Everybody suffered losses, Roman, (trainer Tom Haughton), all the owners involved. But I'd like to raise a little awareness about the cost of the bills at the clinic. I think that's important.

"There were 11 horses that were saved – four got out right away, but there's seven remaining at the clinic and it's very costlv."

Switlyk said Jimmy "raced twice at two and he got some splints that were bothering the heck out of him. So, Roman said, 'Let's shut him down, we'll take care of him. We'll bring him back and we'll try to race in the sires stakes next year.' He was looking tremendous. He was very skinny. He didn't have a lot of weight on him, but he was tall and lanky last year. He just filled out beautifully. What a beautiful horse."

The owner said the community at the South Florida Training Center is "heartbroken," but some incredible stories are beginning to trickle out.

"I spoke with a lawyer this morning and he told me about an incredible rescue of one of the horses," Switlyk said. "The way the fire ended up happening, I guess there's an overhang on the barn and the roof collapsed. Then as the roof collapsed, the overhang on the barn folded over the gates of

the stalls, almost like a garage door going down. The horses were just completely trapped in there. That added to the loss, obviously, just the whole mechanics of the fire. That's the reason the horses perished... But one of the horses was trapped and had some structure that landed and he could not move either way and this guy lifted it up and the horse got out."

It's too early to know if Jimmy will ever make it back to the track, but Switlyk is holding out hope. After all, Done Being Nice and a few of her offspring, are all the horses has left in the game.

Southwind Frank leads Hambletonian eligibles for 2016

Mega-trainer Ron Burke has the top-rated trotter in the experimental ratings two years in row. Last year his filly Mission Brief was ranked number one and finished second in the Hambletonian to Pinkman. This year's dazzling colt Southwind Frank, who lost just once in 12 starts last year and racked up \$786,419 in earnings, is also the winter-book favorite for America's Trotting Classic.

The 91st edition of the Hambletonian will go to post Saturday, Aug. 6 at the Meadowlands Racetrack in East Rutherford, NJ in same-day heats and carry a purse of \$1 million.

"He is training great," Burke said of Southwind Frank. "He's been in 2:20 and looks great. I kept him up here this winter at Gaitway (Training Center, Manalapan, NJ) because I figured

if Takter wins Hambletonians by staying up here in the North, I'm staying up here. If you can't beat 'em, join 'em.

"You have to be ready by August and even with Mission Brief last year I always felt I was chasing, chasing, and needed one more week. Keeping Southwind Frank and Make Or Miss — who is also coming along unbelievably well — up here means they are on schedule, and will be ready."

Eighty-four horses have been paid into the Hambletonian and 102 three-year-old trotting fillies have been paid into its companion race, the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks to also be raced Aug. 6. Oaks eliminations, if necessary, will be raced the prior week, Saturday, July 30.

Dan Patch Trainer of the Year Jimmy Takter annexed a fourth Hambletonian title in 2015 with Pinkman, becoming just the fifth trainer to win consecutive Hambletonians since 1926. No trainer has won three in a row, and another win by a Takter-trainee would place him in the rarefied company of five-time Hambletonian winners and immortals of the sport Ben White, Bill Haughton and Stanley Dancer.

The Takter stable has 10 trotters eligible to the Hambletonian, with the \$324,405 earner Lagerfeld leading the parade.

"Lagerfeld is good but I have a few maybe a little better," said Taker. "So many of them were sick last year – I think Bar Hopping, Love Matters and the brother to Shake It Cerry (Jimmy William) who is just training fantastic now, may be my sleepers."

Jimmy William is a son of the Takter-owned and trained Solveig, who not only earned more than \$800,000 herself, but subsequently produced six foals whose current winnings top \$4.3 million.

Other eligibles include: Valley Victory winner Dog Gone Lucky from the Chuck Sylvester stable; Derivative, a son of 2003 Hambletonian winner Amigo Hall who has already made his first start this year for trainer Blair Burgess; Speed It, a son of pacing sire Cam's Rocket who produced the blazingly fast Googoo Gaagaa for trainer Richard Hans, and the foreign owned, bred and trained Ulisse Kronos, an unraced but highly regarded three-quarter brother to Going Kronos.

The Hambletonian has been hosted by the Meadowlands Racetrack since 1981. There are no supplemental entries permitted in the Hambletonian and Oaks, nor are participants in those events or the Hambletonian Maturity (July 18), permitted the use of Lasix or Butazolidin.

The Hambletonian race is also the longest-running live broadcast in harness racing. This year's event will be broadcast live on CBS Sport Network from 4:00-5:30 p.m. [EDT]
