
Mike Keeling (with wife and co-trainer Paula Wellwood after winning the 2016 Hambletonian) said Marion Marauder is prepping well in Pinehurst, NC for his four-year-old season.

About three weeks into preparations for Marion Marauder's four-year-old season, his co-trainer, Mike Keeling, likes what he sees.

"He looks great," Keeling said of the 2016 Trotter of the Year and trotting Triple Crown winner being prepped in Pinehurst, NC. "He's thickened up. He looks more like an aged horse than a three-year-old now, and I'm really pleased with that. He's a solid, solid animal now. Not that he wasn't before, but now he looks more like an NFL player than a college player. We're hoping that helps him take on the workload that's involved with taking on those older, tough horses."

Keeling, who shares Marion Marauder's training duties with his wife, Paula Wellwood, said the trotter's mental state appears to be just as sharp as his physical appearance. Marion Marauder returned to the track at the beginning of March after a long turnout.

"He's happy... He's really in a good frame of mind. He's happy to be back to work. I think he really enjoys it, so he's back in his old stall here. I've turned him three times now and we are going to slowly work ourselves into shape here," Keeling said.

Marion Marauder's driver, Scott Zeron, came to Pinehurst for a visit recently, but Keeling said Zeron wasn't given the chance to sit behind Marion Marauder.

"I told him, 'Nope, you're not going with him. When you're there, we know there's money on the line.' He only gets to go behind him when going behind the gate for real money."

Zeron who shares ownership with Keeling and Wellwood in a two-year-old, three-quarter brother to Marion Marauder, did like what he saw when he sat behind Chocolate Ganache, a Muscle Hill colt that's out of Marion Marauder's Chocolatier-sired sister Mariongotchocolate.

"He got to train him yesterday," Keeling said Friday, "and he was pleased with him. He's a May foal, so he's a couple of months younger than Marauder even, so we'll take our time

with him."

Chocolate Ganache was purchased by the group for \$75,000 at last fall's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. The colt was bred by Marion Marauder's breeder, William Mulligan, and consigned by Hunterton Sales Agency Inc.

Keeling said he and Wellwood are training 13 horses in Pinehurst this winter besides Marion Marauder — seven two-year-olds and six three-year-olds. All are trotters except for one Sportswriter colt.

The plan is to head home to Cambridge, ON on Good Friday (April 14), qualify Marion Marauder some time in June at Mohawk Racetrack and then ease into the season.

"The Hambletonian Maturity (on July 15 at the Meadowlands) would be a race that we would like to key on, if all goes well, because it is against four-year-olds and it would be nice not to have to go into the open, all-age class right away. We'll see. He'll tell us where he's at and when he's ready," Keeling said. "When he goes behind the gate, we'll know a whole lot more."

The son of Muscle Hill out of Spellbound Hanover is owned by Wellwood and Keeling's 20-year-old son, Devin Keeling and Wellwood's mother, Jean Wellwood, the widow of Hall of Famer Bill Wellwood.

Mike said if all goes well this year he'd like Marion Marauder to race in the Maple Leaf Trot at Mohawk, at Lexington on the way to the Breeders Crown at Hoosier Park and maybe even in the \$1 million Yonkers International Trot.

"If he shows that he's (International) caliber we'd like to take (Yonkers) up on their invitation from last year and see if we can't get an invitation this year," Mike said.

Even after winning the Hambletonian, the Triple Crown and the Trotter of the Year title, Mike said he hopes there are more big things in Marion Marauder's future.

"I'd like to be competitive for 10 starts and not hurt him and then look towards the five-year-old year. That's the ultimate goal, to be able to look like we compete and belong

in that class and protect him as much as we can and then look towards the five-year-old year. Then we would love to go to Europe. He's the horse of a lifetime," Mike said.

In 1995, Bill Wellwood raced Armbro Marshall in the Elitlopp, finishing seventh in their heat and failing to advance. Paula and Jean were on that trip, but Mike was not.

"I've never been across the Atlantic, but I'd like to go and maybe Marauder will be the one to take us there," he said.

Missile J two-for-two in Levy action at Yonkers

Yonkers Raceway's George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series for free-for-allers continued Saturday night (March 25), with another quartet of \$50,000 divisions.

Second choice Missile J (Tim Tetrick, \$4.40) enjoyed his off-the-pace antics so much in round one, he parlayed the performance this time around.

From post three in the third division, he was fourth as Somewhere in L A (Jason Bartlett) cleared his six inside rivals with the aplomb of a hurdler. After a :27.3 opening quarter-mile and moving toward a 56-second intermission, even-money fave Provocativeprincen (Jordan Stratton) moved from third.

It appeared Bartlett was fighting with his charge to let Stratton and his ride go, but the latter duo could not seize the initiative. Somewhere in L A then threw in a :27.1 backside number (1:23.1) to dispose of Provocativeprincen, taking a length-and-a-quarter lead into the lane.

As this was transpiring, Missile J was closing ranks. He rallied from fourth in the lane, beating a solid 'L A' by a length in 1:51.3. Third went to 51-1 P H Supercam (Brett Miller), with 98-1 Texas Terror N (Mack MacDonald) and Take it Back Terry (George Brennan) rounding out the payees.

Provocativeprincen backpedaled to last, his first blemish after a 4-for-4 start to his U.S. career.

For Missile J, a 4-year-old American Ideal—Cantor's Daughter gelding trained by Scott DiDomenico for

Hoosierland co-owners John McGill and Brian Carsey, it was his sixth win in seven seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$40.60, with the triple returning \$505.

Saturday night's first Levy grouping was a private stretch battle between 3-2 choice Bettor's Edge (Miller) and an uncovered Keystone Velocity (Dan Dube). The latter whipped the pace-setting (:27.3, :56.2, 1:24) former by half-length in 1:51.3.

First leader Dr. J Hanover (Scott Zeron) held third – beaten three-and-a-half lengths—with Santa Fe Beachboy (Stratton) and Burning N (Ron Cushing) settling for the remainder.

For Keystone Velocity, a 9-year-old son of Western Hanover—Venus Killeen co-owned (as Allard Racing) by trainer Rene Allard, Kapildeo Singh, Earl Hill Jr and VIP Internet Stable, it was his first win in three seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$30, with the triple returning \$185.

The evening's second series soiree had slight 7-5 choice Rockin' Ron (Yannick Gingras, \$4.90) take it the distance from the pole while matching (1:51.1) the fastest local mile of the season.

Defending series champ Bit of a Legend N (Stratton) actually poked about a neck in front entering the lane from first-up, but a resurgent 'Ron' won by three-quarters of a length. Soto (Matt Kakaley) was a pocket third, with Mach it So (Tetrick) and Guantanamo Bay (Miller) settling for the minors.

For Rockin' Ron, a 5-year-old Real Desire—Im All A Roan gelding co-owned (as Burke Racing) by (trainer) Ron Burke, Weaver Brussemi and RTC Stables, he's now three-for-five to begin the season. The exacta paid \$15.20, with the triple (three wagering choices in order) returning \$25.

"I was worried on the final turn and wanted to save something for the stretch," Gingras said. "I had Bit of a Legend N challenging and Soto in the pocket. He's very easy on himself and he can really sprint home."

The second round's final foray offered a 12-1 upset as Melmerby Beach (Bartlett, \$26.60) pick off both 3-10 shot All Bets Off (Kakaley) and second choice Wakizashi Hanover (Tetrick). The former set seemingly-sensible fractions (:28, 57, 1:24), but gave way readily in the lane.

Melmerby Beach, apparently not bothered by a 27-second third quarter, defeated 'Wakizashi' by a length-and-a-quarter in 1:52, with All Bets Off beaten three lengths. Artistic Major (Zeron) and Great Vintage (MacDonald) wound up with the leftovers.

For third choice Melmerby Beach, a 6-year-old son of Somebeachsomewhere—DB Blue Chip owned and trained by Ettore Annunziata, it was his first win in three '17 starts. The exacta paid \$132, the triple returned \$237.50 and the superfecta paid \$464.

"He's had his moments," Bartlett said of Melmerby Beach. "I remember last season when he beat Foiled Again in this series last season. I was surprised the leaders came back to me, but my horse finished very well."

Blue Chip Matchmaker

On Friday night (March 24) Yonkers offered up Round 2 of the Blue Chip Matchmaker series with another trio of \$40,000 divisions for top-flight pacing mares.


The opening event saw Empress Deo (Matt Kakaley, \$25) get encouraged to leave the gate, then trip out from the pocket to pick off Shesjustadelight N (Ron Cushing) at the wire in 1:54. Diva's Image (Joe Bongiorno), as the just-over-even-money favorite, was third.

From post position five, Empress Deo left to an immediate lead, then relented to pole-sitting Shesjustadelight N at a :27.2 opening quarter-mile.

After a soft :56.4 half, series-debuting Sandbetweenurtoes (Brett Miller) tried it first-up from fifth. She didn't threaten as 'Delight' led comfortably in and out of a 1:26 three-quarters, up a length-and-a-quarter entering the lane.

A week ago, it was Empress Deo cutting the fractions and Shesjustadelight N beating her from behind. It was turnabout and fair play this time around, with Empress Deo ducking inside and getting the decision by a head.

Diva's Image was beaten a length, with Lispatty (Mark MacDonald) and Sandbetweenurtoes rounding out the payees.

Rockin Ron (Yannick Gingras) matched the fastest Yonkers mile of the season with a 1:51.1 Levy score.

For fourth choice Empress Deo, a 6-year-old daughter of Rocknroll Hanover—Little Miss K owned by Legacy Racing of Delaware and trained by Wayne Givens, it was her first win in 10 seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$71, with the triple returning \$146.

The second Matchmaker grouping saw Mackenzie A (Jordan Stratton, \$6.80) win in 1:53.2.

Giving it up early to Wrangler Magic (Dube), Mackenzie A then played a game of Ladies Leapfrog, making the lead just after a :28.2 opening quarter-mile. It was an equally-time

second substation (:56.4 intermission), then Betabcool N (Mark MacDonald) moved from fifth.

Mackenzie A was comfy through a 1:24.4 three-quarters as the miss opened a couple of lengths into the lane. She held off a good effort from Wrangler Magic, winning by a half-length. Betabcool N held third, with a from-last, 79-1 Medusa (Kakaley) and a never-in-it, 9-10 fave Mach it a Par (Jason Bartlett) settling for the minors.

For Mackenzie A, a 5-year-old Down Under daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven—Kept For Pleasure co-owned by Harry von Knoblauch and Ellen Kinser and trained by Peter Tritton, it was her first win in four seasonal/North American starts. The exacta paid \$36.40, with the triple returning \$205.

The second round's final foray offered the fastest female, as it did a week ago. This time, it was odds-on Bedroomconfessions (Scott Zeron, \$2.90) giving nothing else a shot (:27.3, :57, 1:25.2, 1:52.3).

Leaving from the pylons, Bedroomconfessions toured the terrain with the ease of a qualifier. She stuffed Krispy Apple (Miller) in behind at the outset, then did as she pleased. The lead was three lengths in and out of the final turn and three-and-a-quarter lengths at the wire.

Regil Elektra (Bartlett) was a solid, two-move second, with Kiwis Sell a Bit N (Stratton) and Change the Rulz N (George Brennan) earning the rest of the reward money.

For Bedroomconfessions, a 5-year-old state-bred daughter of American Ideal—Turnoffthelights co-owned (as Alagna Racing) by (trainer) Tony Alagna and Riverview Racing, it was her third win in six '17 starts. The exacta paid \$6.20, with the triple (three wagering favorites in order) returning \$12.40.

"She's a big horse, but she gets around a half (-mile track) so well," Zeron said. "They never tried her much on the small tracks before this season, but she's faster in these turns than she is in the straightaway.

"The race couldn't have been easier. Everyone else was happy to line up behind us. Never showed her the whip, never pulled the plugs."

Sky Major wins Big M debut

Our Sky Major brought a pretty big resume from Down Under as a multiple top-class stakes winner when he made his North American debut in February.

After another eye-catching win on Saturday (March 25) in the Meadowlands pacing feature, his first ever start at the New Jersey oval, Our Sky Major has stamped himself as a horse to watch in the free-for-all ranks this season.

Joe Bongiorno worked out a textbook second-over trip for the 6-5 favorite in the field of eight and stormed down the stretch in :26.4 to win by two widening lengths in 1:51.2 over the sharp Millenium Wheel, who had won two in a row at the Big M.

"He was as nice a horse to drive as you ever can imagine," said Bongiorno. "He was two fingers to drive and can do anything I ask of him. He paced that mile well in hand."

Our Sky Major is expected to return to the Levy Series at Yonkers. He finished seventh in round one last week after drawing an outside post, but closing good ground late.

One race earlier, Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace eligible Highalator continued his rapid development with an impressive win in a conditioned pace in 1:52.2 with a :26.3 last quarter. It was his fifth straight for driver Victor Kirby and owners Daryl Bier and Charles Dombeck. The homebred son of Somebeachsomewhere—Higher And Higher is headed to the Weiss at Pocono before a start on May 6 in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes.

Corey Callahan and Vincent Fusco, Jr. combined to win a pair of races. Jim Marohn, Jr. and Pat Lachance also posted driving doubles.

Total handle was \$2,551,089.

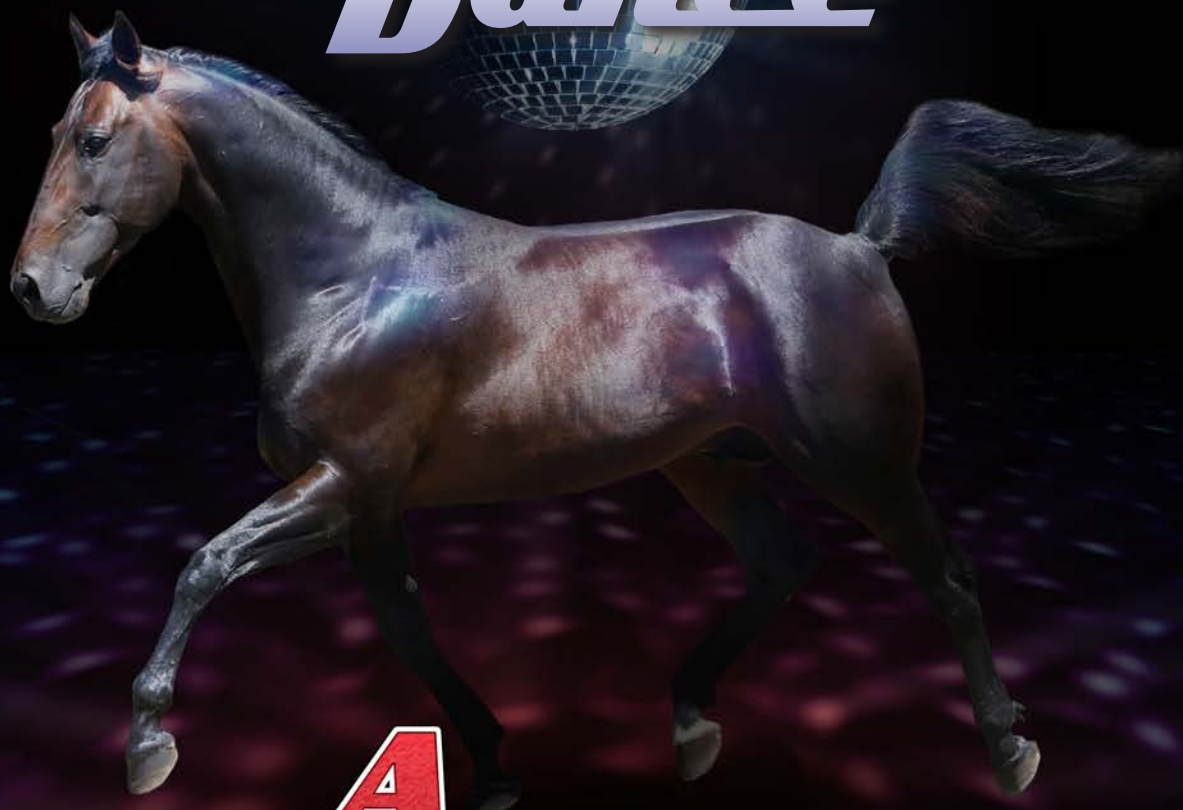

Niatross at 40

Making the case that he was greatest ever.

He's the greatest horse I've ever seen.

Niatross was foaled on March 30 four decades ago. Can it be that long ago? Indeed it can.

I realize that others will have conflicting thoughts on the "greatest ever." There are no right answers, and no wrong answers. Only opinions. And I am always available to sit around for hours and discuss this subject — as long as someone else is buying the drinks.

Is Niatross the fastest ever? No. Is he the richest ever? No. His speed records have all been eclipsed. Yet for those of us fortunate enough to see him, his greatness will never be eclipsed.

Are there other candidates for the throne of the ultimate standardbred? Of course! Based only on the ones I've seen I must consider pacers such as Somebeachsomewhere, Bret Hanover, Albatross, Cam Fella, Nihilator, etc.

Among trotters I was always wowed by what Nevele Pride accomplished. Ditto for Muscle Hill. And I admired Mack Lobell and Moni Maker, too. (This excludes the European stars I've seen, such as Ourasi of France and Varenne of Italy.)

But when I compare them to Niatross, they all come up a little short.

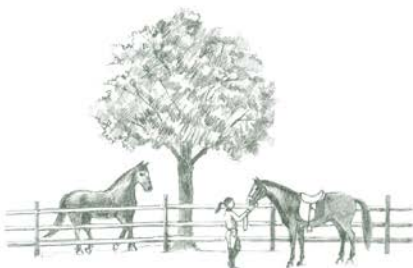
I will make my case:

- He won 37 of his 39 starts. His two losses were anomalies. In the first loss, he fell over the hub rail at Saratoga. In his second, he hit the sulky with his hocks in an elim for the

Meadowlands Pace and made a break. He was never beaten by a horse that simply outpaced him. (To be honest, however, his trainer/driver Clint Galbraith told me that Niatross was a beaten horse at Saratoga prior to his swam dive into the centerfield. His groom Marie Gill, now a veterinarian in Pennsylvania, says that Trenton Time was going past Niatross and her colt's left sulky wheel caught the inside rail and pulled him over the low rail.)

- When he set his 1:49.1 record, he lowered the existing world record by two-and-four-fifth seconds. Horses simply don't do that. Always B Miki is now the fastest standardbred ever, but he earned that title by chipping one tick off the previous record. Extreme speed records are usually broken that way. Niatross took a chain saw to the existing speed mark and made mincemeat out of it.
- He raced on every size track. Today, so many horses can — and do — avoid half-mile tracks. Post position is so critical on smaller tracks and often a race is decided in large measure by the draw. Clint Galbraith never worried about such things. He just dropped Niatross in the box, put him behind the starting gate, and let Niatross do the rest. Track size didn't affect him.
- Niatross never beat up on soft foes in sires stakes. I don't know how often, if at all, he raced in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes, but it cannot be very many times. Nothing wrong with a horse competing in restricted events, but they don't hold the same merit for me as open events. To me it's like a major league baseball player getting credit for his batting average while in the minor leagues. Restricted competition simply does not and should not carry the weight as open competition. (Alas, harness racing has never been able to develop a graded stakes system.)
- There was never a whiff of scandal or teamwork with Niatross. The accomplishments of some sulky stars have been sullied by the reputations of their trainers. Others may have benefitted by some stablemates that provided assistance.
- Niatross beat older horses as a 3-year-old. That's not so easy for a sophomore to do, and it raises him in my esteem. It's well known that Clint Galbraith did not pay Niatross into the American Classics at Hollywood Park, but track

impresario Pres Jenuine made certain he was paid in and made certain to lure Niatross to southern California. And Niatross did what he always did – destroyed his foes.

- He started 39 times over two seasons. Clint did not duck opportunities to race. He raced Niatross 13 times as a 2-year-old, which seemed light compared to Bret's 24 wins at age two and Nevele Pride's 29 starts as a freshman. Thirteen proved lucky for Niatross. That was enough. Wisely, Clint refused to step on the gas at Lexington in the fall of 1979 just to see how fast Niatross could pace. I recall seeing him win that year at Lexington and he was on cruise control. Clint was smart enough to know that showboating at age two could affect him at age three. And when Niatross came back to Lexington as a 3-year-old, Clint did step on the gas and the epic 1:49.1 mile resulted.

This tribute to Niatross on the 40th anniversary of his foaling wouldn't be complete without noting that his first two crops, sired at Castleton Farm in Kentucky, were astonishing. Consider the results: Nihilator, Pershing Square, Semalou D'Amour, Flight Of Fire, Handsome Sum, Niafirst, Steal The Show.

The second crop had Barberry Spur, Caressable, Smartest Remark, Cash Asset, Freight Saver, Masquerade, and King Charles.

After the first two crops, Niatross was moved to New York and the wheels seemed to come off his breeding prowess. We can debate why until the end of eternity and still not know why.

There is a memorial marker at the front of the Harness Racing Museum for Niatross, which says, "He was perfect."

And I agree.

Fifteenth straight win for Nuncio, Delicious back on track

Two superstars showed this week that European harness racing fans may be in for something special in the spring.

Nuncio, second behind Trixton in the 2014 Hambletonian, doesn't want to lose and Wednesday (March 22) the son of Andover Hall kept his undefeated streak intact. Nuncio, with Örjan Kihlström in the bike, started fast and was in the lead the whole mile at Solvalla.

Nuncio easily sprinted to the 1:56.1 victory and will probably continue racing at Solvalla in April. The six-year-old son of Andover Hall out of the Lindy Lane mare Nicole Isabelle now has had 15 starts since his last defeat in October of 2015.

The big target is Elitloppet at the end of May, where the big duel with French superstar Bold Eagle may take place.

Another American-bred horse impressed the spectators on Friday night (March 24) at Romme in Sweden. Delicious (Cantab Hall), also with Örjan Kihlström, had her first start for the year over the distance 2 5/8ths and was seen in the lead after a fast first quarter. Delicious, with 10 straight wins, is a three-time world record holder (1:50.2 over the mile in Sweden 2015) and looked really good in the cold spring night at Romme.

The Cantab Hall filly had many problems in 2016. She raced five times last year, but could never reach the same high level as the year before.

"Now we'll see how she reacts after this race," said her trainer Daniel Redén. "Of course it looks good when she wants to race again and I feel that she's back in great shape."

Delicious came home in an approximate mile time of 1:59.

This time Campbell will, at the very least, participate in a speed race (640 metres) on Elitlopp Day, but Swedes are already buzzing about possibly seeing him drive again in the biggest race in Scandinavia. Campbell was the driver of Nuncio in the U.S.

Obrigado, the Older Trotter of the Year, had a truly amazing season in 2016. The Maine-bred had seven wins on the year and all seven came at different tracks:

The open handicap at Yonkers (paying \$8.20), the Maxie Lee at Philly (\$8.00), the Hill Memorial at Scioto (\$8.20), the Cleveland Classic at Northfield (\$3.40, the only time he was favored in any of his seven wins), the Crawford Farms at Vernon (\$14.80), the Dayton Derby at Miami Valley (\$5.40, second choice) and the TVG at the Meadowlands (\$19.80).

Get this, counting three victorious qualifiers, Obrigado won 10 times last year and, in all 10, a different horse was the runnerup, in order: Second Sister, Wind Of The North, Luminoisty, Il Sognos Dream, Natural Herbie, Muscle Up The Goal, Resolve, Centurion ATM, I C Caviar and Crazy Wow.

Miller moments

David Miller returns to the regular driving wars in 2017 as the:

1. Two-time reigning Driver Of The Year.

3. Man who did not lose a race with last year's sophomore pacer of the year Betting Line in nine starts.
4. Driver who owns the all-time fastest mile in two countries – 1:46 in the U.S. and 1:47 in Canada.

Bee A Magician retired from racing, bred to Muscle Hill

Standardbred Canada reported Friday that Bee A Magician, the 2013 Horse of the Year in the U.S. and Canada, has been retired from racing after suffering a soft-tissue injury to her right front leg. The seven-year-old daughter of Kadabra out of the Balanced Image mare Beehive has already been bred to Muscle Hill.

Bee A Magician — owned by Mel Hartman of Ottawa, ON, Quebec native Herb Liverman and David McDuffee of Delray Beach, FL and trained by Richard 'Nifty' Norman — retires with earnings of \$4,055,865 that makes her the second richest Canadian-sired horse of all time behind Balanced Image-sired gelding Arch Madness who earned \$4,289,981.

"It's a shame because (Bee A Magician) was really training back great. And everybody that saw her and that's around her, we all thought she was going to have a really big year," said Norman. "It was just the timing more than anything... last year (when she suffered a soft tissue injury to her left front leg it) didn't happen until May so it was too late to breed her and we said 'we'll get her back and we'll race her.' She came back good, but with this timing I said to the guys, 'you're going to miss four months: that's the guts of the season.' And

they all agreed maybe it's just time to breed her. She's been good to us, she doesn't owe anybody anything."

Crafty Master scores at Pocono

Crafty Master, a son of Mister Big shipping to The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono from Canada's capital city track, Rideau Carleton, couldn't have been more impressive in his "return" to the Downs, winning Saturday night's top purse event, an \$18,000 claiming handicap pace, in 1:52 to complete a consecutive triple for Team Allard, driver Simon and trainer Rene.

Overcoming post eight, Crafty Master spotted fourth early, then was rushed to the front just before the half in 55.3. From there "Crafty" was the master of this domain, pulling away to win by two-and-three-quarter lengths for Allard Racing Inc., VIP Internet Stable LLC, and Lynn Denesha.

The six-year-old Crafty Master had had only one career Stateside purse start before this triumph, and that race was at Pocono — a 2013 elimination of the Breeders Crown for freshman pacing colts where Crafty Master, coming off a second in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final, went off as the second choice, but ruined his chances with an early break.

There was a pair of \$15,500 co-featured conditioned events Saturday, with the pace going to the hot City Hall, a Metropolitan gelding who now sports a 4 3-1-0 recent record after a 1:52.1 victory. George Napolitano Jr. got the winner, who started outside all his rivals in post eight, safely around late first turn trouble by going three-wide, brushed to the top in front of the stands, then held his advantage to the finish for trainer Amber Buter and the partnership of Gene Oldford Farms LLC and Tyler Buter.

On the trotting side, the millionaire DW'S NY Yank was glad to escape the likes of bearcats Melady's Monet and Opulent Yankee, winning in 1:53.3 although being yet another disadvantaged with the outermost post eight. Driver Eric Goodell made two speed moves with the Dilbert Hanover gelding, then held off pocket-sitting Skates N Plates for his first win of the year for trainer Ron Burke and owners who turn up in more than a few programs — Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Brussemi LLC, and Howard Taylor.

In addition to the Allard brothers, driver Simon and trainer Rene, teaming for three wins, the team of driver Eric Goodell and trainer Ron Burke had a triple. Also with three wins was driver George Napolitano Jr., for three different trainers.

56 remain eligible to Pepsi North America Cup

The connections of 56 three-year-old pacers have made the first sustaining payment to remain eligible to the 34th Pepsi North America Cup.

The \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup is Canada's richest harness race and will take place on Saturday, June 17 at Mohawk Racetrack.

A total of 60 three-year-olds were originally nominated and all but four have been kept eligible through the first sustaining payment.

Ray Schnittker trainee Huntsville and Brian Brown trainee Downbytheseaside headline the group of eligible three-year-olds. Both colts are sired by 2008 Pepsi North America Cup champion Somebeachsomewhere and both set world records during their rookie campaigns.

The 2016 Metro Pace winner Beyond Delight, who is trained by Tony O'Sullivan, is another notable pacer on the list eligible three-year-olds. The son of Bettors Delight won the O'Brien Award as Canada's top two-year-old pacing colt in 2016.

The eliminations for this year's Pepsi North America Cup will take place on Saturday, June 10. The \$1 million final will take place the following week.

The next sustaining payment for the Pepsi North America Cup is due April 15. The fee is \$1,000 CAD or \$715 USD.

Basket of thoughts

First and foremost I wanted to send my deepest and heartfelt condolences to the family of Sam McKee. His passing was a terrible reminder of just how fragile life can really be. As someone who lost a father in a similar way four years ago, I know the pain and numbness that accompanies a tragedy such as Sam McKee's. It's been wonderful, however, to see the support that the fans and the industry have shown his family. My best wishes to his family as they continue onward. I believe it was the old host of the NYRA Thoroughbred replay show, Harvey Pack, who said, "May the horse be with you....."

As for racing, I don't need to say anything about Mr. Faraldo's "beard" letter ([full story here](#)) since, as usual, Vic Dante said it perfectly in last Sunday's edition ([full story here](#)). Again, I could not agree with him more.

Happily and joyously, I was glad to read that Howard Taylor and his partners lost their frivolous lawsuit re: the NJ Classic. Although Darin Zoccali's opinion could be seen as skewed because of his ties to Mr. Gural and the Meadowlands, his article in last week's DRF newsletter was absolutely correct. A victory by Mr. Taylor would've set a dangerous precedent. However, and most importantly, Zoccali pointed out that this game is a business. Tracks have to do what's best for business and horse owners have to assume risk every time they purchase a horse. Buying a horse with the idea of centering his campaign around one race to take advantage of the NJ horse shortage was dangerous considering the possibility the race would not fill anyway.

Speaking of horse shortages, I found it a little weird on Saturday night to hear the advertisement for the May horse sale at the Meadowlands being announced by Ken Warkentin use the horse shortage as a reason to go to the sale. With the way things are in the Ohio and Indiana it's possible that buyers from that area will take more horses from here leaving even shorter fields. Also, is it just my imagination, or is the horse shortage confined to a handful of tracks? When perusing the entries, the tracks are always same. NJ tracks,

Monticello (biggest decline), Woodbine/Mohawk (10-race Saturday cards?), and, when open, Mr. Gural's other two NY tracks seem consistently lacking horses. It seems, Delaware, Ohio, Indiana, Pennsylvania, and Yonkers have no problem attracting horses.

To Mr. Gural, I continue to root for his success. Not as much for him personally, but for the Meadowlands. The track is vital to the future and continuation of the sport. How long he intends to hold on for a casino is the real question. At his age, I worry about the future of the Meadowlands if he is unable to continue. Also, I wish he would bring back the ABC racing classification system. It seemed to me that the races were better and the fields fuller. However, I know the horsemen hated it and its return is doubtful. Finally, not that it's any secret, but the key to Meadowlands is full fields. Currently, when you factor in purses, the Gural Rule, and most importantly Mr. Gural's rightful, but fruitless, quest to keep the worst cheats out I can't see how much longer the Meadowlands can continue. Last year, the winter racing was good, but this year it has really been lacking and now the racing is only going to get worse each week as the other tracks open. It might be time to just run three meets with bigger purses. I would suggest Jan and Feb, July-Hambletonian Day, and then November-Christmas. Boost the purses and hope for really good racing. Mid-March through the Super Sunday program at Pocono in July is just an awful time for the Meadowlands.
