## Is Bob McIntosh primed for a big year?

The Hall of Fame trainer sports a .540 training average already this year — and that's before the return of such stars as L A Delight and Tony Soprano and some other promising youngsters hit full stride.

With two months to go before the major stakes season begins, trainer Bob McIntosh already has his LaSalle, ON-based operation firing on all cylinders. In addition to supervising the preparations for L A Delight and Tony Soprano's sophomore seasons and readying this year's two-year-olds for their racing careers, McIntosh and his staff have been racking up wins at Woodbine Racetrack, The Raceway at Western Fair District and Flamboro Downs.

"I've been pretty happy so far, the way things have been racing and the way they're coming back. It's been a pretty good start to the year, that's for sure," said McIntosh. "Just got to keep it up, that's all; keep the nose to the grindstone."

McIntosh horses have made 45 starts through March 25, posting 18 wins, six seconds and nine thirds for earnings of \$120,745. The Hall of Fame horseman sports a sharp .540 training average and has horses such as Mach Power and Thoughtyoudlikeit to thank.

Through six starts, Mach Power, a three-year-old son of Mach Three, has posted five wins and one third, winning his March 10 start at Woodbine Racetrack in a personal best 1:53.2. Four-year-old Ponder son Thoughtyoudlikeit had strung together six straight wins over The Raceway at Western Fair District oval before injuring himself in a third-place effort at Flamboro Downs on March 13.

Both colts had been pleasant surprises to McIntosh, especially Mach Power, who was not among his favorites as a two-year-old.

"I've had some surprises, like Mach Power. I would have given him away last fall as a two-year-old and he's just totally one of those nice surprises, where you can't believe how good he is, because he trained down okay and then he got to racing and he blew me away," McIntosh said. "And I

think I got another nice colt — he didn't race at all last year, hardly — called Emperor, he's a Ponder. He's in the Youthful on Saturday night (March 26), and I won't say he'll do it Saturday night, but he's going to work into a pretty nice horse."

A half-sibling to three \$100,000-plus winners, Emperor finished third in his March 13 debut at Flamboro Downs in spite of broken equipment. McIntosh shares ownership of Mach Power with Dave Boyle of Bowmanville, ON and Emperor with his cousin Al McIntosh of Leamington, ON and Gordon Wright of Charlotte, MI.

While Mach Power and Emperor are attempting to make their mark on the local stakes circuit, stable stars L A Delight and Tony Soprano continue to prep for their return to major stakes competition, and McIntosh said both horses are right on track.

"We're 2:18 now and we'll be in 2:15 next week. She couldn't be training any better," said the trainer of O'Brien award winner L A Delight. "We've let her hopples out a couple inches longer and she's put some muscle on -1wouldn't say she grew a whole lot, but she got a lot thicker - and her attitude is just tremendous. She's right where I want her to be."

Staked only in Ontario as a two-year-old, L A Delight will have an opportunity to race across North America if her sophomore efforts match her freshman exploits. The daughter of Bettors Delight and West of L A went 11 for 12 at two, earning just over \$533,000 for McIntosh and his partners C S X Stables of Liberty Center, OH and the trainer's cousin, Al.

The filly's first sophomore start could come in the WEG-SBOA Stake Eliminations at Mohawk Racetrack on May 21 or the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series season opener June 4 at Mohawk.

"That SBOA, it's May 21st, and we might be ready, but I'm sure as hell not going to press a panic button to get her ready for it," the trainer said. "But I'm hoping she's ready for that. It would be a great place to start. We'll just have to see how it plays out. If not that, she'll start in a Sires Stake."

Like L A Delight, Tony Soprano has been in 2:18 as of March 25 and McIntosh is expecting another strong year from the OSS champion, who tallied four wins, one second, two thirds and \$225.094 in 11 starts last season.

"He's coming great too," says McIntosh, who owns the son of Kadabra and Windsong Soprano with Mardon Stables of

Loretto, ON, Paradox Farm Inc. of Caledon East, ON and Dave Boyle. "I actually measured his height after the Breeders Crown and he was like 15.2hh, and I sent him down to Carter Duer's for a while, and when I brought him back I measured him and he's 16.2hh now. So, he grew longer and taller. I think he's going to have a good year if nothing goes wrong."

McIntosh said he hopes to see Tony Soprano make his 2016 debut in the Goodtimes Stake at Mohawk on June 10 where he'll be reunited with Hall of Fame reinsman John Campbell.

"I just got off the phone with John actually a few minutes ago and we were talking about him," McIntosh said. "I talk to him every couple weeks, every two or three weeks. We touch base and talk shop of course a lot of the times, but about a lot of things too going on in the business, not just my horses. Beyond anything else he's been a great friend for more years than I care to admit."

Among the other horses that come up in McIntosh and Campbell's conversations is Mach Three colt New Talent. Out of You See L A, a half-sister to L A Delight's dam, New Talent made 11 starts last season, scoring one win, three seconds and \$65,258 for McIntosh, C S X Stables and Al McIntosh. The colt showed flashes of potential at two, and both trainer and driver are hoping some added maturity translates into greater success this season.

"That horse has a big motor and a big set of lungs. And John, that's one he always asks about. He is very high on his potential, John is. Last year, training him as a two-year-old, he wasn't too smart," McIntosh said. "I think he's mentally matured quite a bit, so if he can do that I think he'll be a force to be reckoned with."

McIntosh said he is also hoping for a strong sophomore season from Ponder colt Think On It, who ranked among the trainer's favorites last season before injury cut his campaign short after just five starts.

"I thought he was the best colt I had last year. If you look back at his early lines, I think he won his maiden in 1:54, and then he raced in a Gold and was locked in tight and paced in 1:52 and a bit, with loads of pace, and then he popped a curb," McIntosh said. "I trained him in 2:01 on Monday."

McIntosh owns Think On It with Dave Boyle and James Walker of Port Perry, ON. "He's a big gorgeous animal. He's staked up good; right or wrong I staked him to everything. He showed he's got a lot of ability, lots of ability."

Among the other horses McIntosh expects strong a strong

effort from this season is trotting filly Tough Affair, the runner-up in the Grassroots Championship last fall.

"She was always kind of a slight filly last year, not a lot of muscle mass, and this year she's thickened up," said McIntosh of the Muscle Mass daughter he owns with C S X Stables. "Where she'll fit in I don't know. It would be nice to be a Gold, but if she's not a Gold she'll be a top Grassrooter, I think, anyway."

As for two-year-olds McIntosh is training a sizeable contingent, as usual, but is reluctant to point to any future stars at this stage in their education.


"I'd just say I'm pretty pleased with the way things are going. This time of year you know the ones you hate. The ones you like, you don't know how good they are, but you do know the ones you hate," said the horseman with a laugh. "That's about the best way I could put it — I've got more that I like than I hate — that's my way of summing up my two-year-olds."

## Jason Bartlett's Secret Weapon

Pushed by his grandfather to always strive to do better, driver Jason Bartlett is soaring at Yonkers thanks to preparation and hard work.

Whenever Jason Bartlett reaches the winner's circle at Yonkers Raceway, something he is accomplishing with remarkable frequency as the runaway leader in the driver standings, he always makes sure to wave. The gesture acknowledges his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Kobe, 9, and Karter, 5. And it salutes Richard Bartlett, a grandfather so loving and devoted that Jason refers to him as "dad."

"He taught me everything I know," said Bartlett, 34. "If it wasn't for him, I would certainly not be in the position I am in today."

Through March 21, Bartlett had more than doubled the victory total of highly-regarded Brian Sears with 148 victories from 516 starts as he pursued a sixth driving title at Yonkers. Sears owned 73 wins in 368 starts. Bartlett also

had 93 second-place finishes and 58 third-place showings for earnings of \$1,600,634. Sears' earnings stood at \$1,013,363.

When Jason reflects on his rise to prominence, his thoughts invariably circle back to his grandfather. Richard, who continues to train standardbreds in Windsor, ME at age 76, played a larger role of necessity because Jason's mother, Sonia, was a single parent.

Jason was always around the barn at a young age and said he learned the business "in the trenches" by cleaning stalls and grooming horses. Richard pushed him to excel, no matter what he was doing.

"He was, and still is, my biggest fan," Jason said. "He was there to tell me when I did something wrong, which was

good. He's been like that my whole life, whether it was playing basketball or driving racehorses. You can always be better."

As much as Richard cared for his grandson, he also served as his sternest critic when Jason began his driving career.

"I could win five in a day and the other one would get beat and we'd talk about that one," Jason said. "At the time, I thought it was kind of harsh, but he pushed me to get better. You're only as good as your last drive."

When Jason left Maine and began driving at Yonkers' half-mile oval in the autumn of 2007, Richard had a satellite dish installed and would scrutinize every race.

"I had him call me between races," Richard said. "He'd say, 'Dad, I've got 15 minutes. Tell me what I'm doing wrong. Tell me quick."

That process became extremely beneficial over time. Much of Jason's success can be traced to his development into an outstanding student of the game.

"It amazes me what he knows about other horses on the track," Kristen said. "He remembers everything."

Trainers appreciate Jason's preparedness. He is keenly aware of the racing style of opposing horses and the tendencies of his fellow drivers. He does not need extensive pre-race instructions. Very little surprises him.

"I think the main thing he brings is he really does his homework. He always thinks about how a race sets up," said Jeff Bamond, a trainer who often turns to Jason with his best stock. "The gate doesn't open and he wings it."

Jason has seemingly replaced his grandfather as his harshest critic. "I'm the first one to say, 'I messed up. I made a mistake and I apologize," said Jason. "I guess you've got to own it when you make a mistake. That's the way I look at it. Trainers don't want to hear excuses when you come off the track."

Kristen and Jason have been married for 12 years. She said he has gotten better at controlling his emotions. He no longer allows one bad trip to turn into another; he no longer takes his frustrations home.

"He's learned to let it go and turn the page," she said. "He's gotten more mature about it, I guess. There is another race to be had. Dwell on the last one and you're not going to do any good."

Jason is building on an exceptional year in 2015, when he

won 514 of 2,653 starts. He was second 468 times and third on 364 occasions for \$9.8 million in earnings.

He said he is focused on the bottom line to the exclusion of almost everything else.

"For me, it's not about (being viewed as) elite or Hall of Fame," he said. "I just want to make a good living for my family. I want to be happy."

He has been criticized for not venturing outside of his Yonkers Raceway comfort zone with any regularity.

"I've always dreamed about winning the Meadowlands Pace," he said. "But I don't put myself out there to get those horses. I'm not at the Meadowlands."

But he said he could not feel more at home than he does at Yonkers. "I love it here. I grew up on a half," he said, referring to the half-mile oval. "I make a great living for my family. Maybe I should go hunt for more, but to me it's a great living. I guess you can't have everything."

Then again, perhaps he does. He has the woman of his dreams, having met Kristen in the winner's circle at Plainridge Racecourse near Plainville, MA. She knew the business as the daughter of a trainer, Diane Bryant. She, too, was raised by a single-parent mother.

When they spoke of their future together, it was always with the determination that their children's lives would be dramatically different from their own. They would provide a traditional family structure.

"That's what we wanted for our kids, the mother and father there," Kristen said.

Jason has been there for Kobe by coaching his fourth-grade basketball team in their hometown of Goshen, NY. Jason and Kristen will coach Karter's T-ball team. Karter so idolizes his father that he has a makeshift sulky set up in his bedroom behind a stuffed horse.

"Sometimes I think Karter's shouting is carrying Jason home in the stretch," Kristen said.

And whenever Bartlett reaches the winner's circle, his wife, his children, and his proud grandfather will look for the wave that says everything.





# Do more to prevent barn fires; interesting numbers in Ontario; NY preparing for casino battle

Tragic and disheartening doesn't even begin to cover a rash of barn fires that have killed horses in recent months, most notably in Ontario and Florida. I try not to think about how the horses suffered. I won't pretend to comprehend the emotional toll on those people closest to them.

But I do know most of us have to do a better job on fire safety to decrease the number and severity of such fires.

I'm not naïve. I realize barns are particularly susceptible to fires due to combustible materials such as wood and hay. It doesn't help that many barns are old and have outdated electrical wiring, or that the dusty environment makes it difficult to install effective sprinkler systems and smoke or heat detectors.

That is all the more reason to take whatever steps possible to decrease the risk of fire.

Experts say professionally installed barn sprinklers are the best way to prevent fires, but such systems can be cost prohibitive for many.

In 2003, in the aftermath of a barn fire that killed 34 thoroughbreds in the backstretch at Woodbine Racetrack, the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) spent some \$12 million on enhanced fire safety, with about \$7 million of that used to install sprinkler systems in its 40 barns. The other \$5 million was used to upgrade electrical wiring, install fireproof walls and strobe-light alarms to avoid spooking horses with loud alarms. The average cost per barn to improve fire safety was \$300,000, and that was 13 years ago.

By all means, if you have the money, go that route. The animals are worth it, but the reality is not everyone can afford those kinds of upgrades. Fortunately there are some less expensive ideas for keeping horses safe. There is a lot of great information on the Internet, including the Equine Guelph website, which has a number of articles and a series of fire tips from barn fire safety expert Laurie Loveman (click here).

Preventing fires by being vigilant against smokers, keeping

barns as clean as possible, making sure there are working fire extinguishers, having annual fire and electrical inspections, storing hay in a separate building and keeping cats around to deal with electrical-wire-chewing mice should not be a great expense. Neither is it particularly expensive to hire someone to be on night patrol.

The sad reality is, once a barn fire starts, experts say you may have no more than five minutes to get the horses out.

Yes, insuring every horse can be cost prohibitive, but owner David McDuffee has a more cost-effective way to protect the financial part of the investment — fire insurance (see Feedback section for more).

Simply put, most of us can and should do more to prevent further barn fires and the tragedy that goes with them.

## Interesting numbers in Ontario

A few years ago, in the wake of the cancellation of Ontario's Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP), even the provincial government that killed the program grudgingly agreed there were some 30,000 full-time equivalent jobs tied to horse racing in the province. Truth is, the economic studies were all over the map, and skeptics found 30,000 to be on the high side.

## **Harness Racing Update**

Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) released the results of a survey of the industry it conducted last fall and the numbers seem to be in line with previous studies. The report concludes that the horse racing industry supports 41,329 unique jobs divided by full-time, part-time and seasonal. That translates into an estimate of 26,418 full-time equivalent jobs. That's pretty much bang on with the earlier 30,000 estimate, especially given the contraction of the industry since SARP was cancelled.

Keep in mind, the OMAFRA numbers are the result of a survey completed by 403 of the approximately 6,300 licensed owners, breeders and trainers in the province (about half of the respondents reported they race on the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) circuit). That's about a six per cent response rate. Still, in an industry lacking concrete numbers, it's a good start to provide the essential data necessary to prove the economic importance of the industry. The tie to jobs is a critical political argument.

Other interesting numbers from the survey include:

The industry's economic impact in Ontario is \$494 million directly tied to horses and an additional \$583 million in "other" direct expenditures for a total of just over \$1 billion.

The average survey respondent spent just under \$170,000 each on horse racing, with the average expenditure on horses alone coming in at just under \$78,000.

There are more than 34,000 racehorses in the province — 20,894 are standardbreds, 12,660 are thoroughbreds and 547 are quarter horses.

Active standardbred racehorses cost \$27,485 per year to maintain, compared with \$31,277 for thoroughbred racehorses.

## NY gearing up for a fight over NJ

In the no surprise department, the New York Gaming Association (NYGA) appears to be gearing up for a fight to stop New Jersey voters from approving casinos in the north of the state.

An article by Tom Precious in the *Blood Horse* on March 24, included a quote from an NYGA statement that said, "New casinos in northern New Jersey would present a significant threat to New York's gaming industry, risking hundreds of millions of dollars in critical education revenue and jeopardizing thousands of family-sustaining jobs. New York must ensure that its successful casinos can continue to compete on a level playing field."

While the NYGA has not said whether it is developing a plan to try to encourage New Jersey citizens to vote no, those sound like fighting words to me.

## **Steve Elliott Has Quiet Confidence** in Boston Red Rocks

The trainer said he hasn't seen the reigning Dan Patch freshman pacing colt of the year, yet, but reports from trainer Peter Blood have been positive. The news on Doo Wop Hanover isn't as good.

Trainer Steve Elliott isn't the least bit curious, or worried about how Boston Red Rocks is coming back at three. After all, the 2015 Dan Patch winner as two-year-old pacing colt of the year is in good hands with his part-owner, trainer Peter Blood.

"(Blood) says (Boston Red Rocks) is good, so that's fine," Elliott said this week. Though Elliott has spent the winter training young horses at Sunshine Meadows Training Center and Blood and Boston Red Rocks are not too far away at Pompano Park, Elliott has not popped in to see the colt.

"I'll get him about the middle of next month." Elliott said. "Peter will do what he does and when we get him we'll do what we do. You hate to seem to be looking over somebody's shoulder."

Last year, Boston Red Rocks closed out the season with a flourish, winning the \$600,000 Breeders Crown and the \$413,000 Governor's Cup to end the year with earnings just shy of \$580,000. Elliott said he was high on the Rocknroll Hanover-McGibson colt from the beginning.

"I liked him from the get-go when he came in. I really liked the colt. He was my kind of horse. He was kind of a lazy colt, but he did everything he was supposed to do. He was really good early," Elliott said. "After he won the two sires stakes (in July), he got sick at the final. We didn't really know it. He just got beaten by a head, but he wasn't himself. I scoped him, he was sick and I gave him a month off and treated him.

"We got him over it, we thought. We brought him back, trained him a little bit, but he wasn't over it, yet. So, we quit with him again and brought him back and that might have been what helped him for the year. It gave him time to fill out and grow a little bit and mature a little bit. He got really good at the end of the year, but he was good early on.

"I told Peter early that he was a better colt than Doo Wop Hanover was at two. Of course, Peter told me I was nuts."

Speaking of Doo Wop Hanover - the older pacer that earned over \$450,000 and set a mark of 1:47.4 in 18 starts at four in 2015 - Elliott said the son of

Rocknroll Hanover out of Deer Valley Miss recently suffered a setback. The pacer, owned by the

same connections as Boston Red Rocks — Blood and Rick Berks of Boca Raton, FL - recently kicked a wall and broke a coffin bone behind while in Blood's barn.

"He'll miss pretty much through the middle part of this year, anyway. Hopefully, he'll be ready toward the end of the year," Elliott said. "He's kind of a good-feeling, dumb son of a gun. He's always had ability, but things happen."

Elliott said he's not sure, yet, how some of his other three-year-olds will fare this year on the track.

"I've got a filly (named Soulmate Hanover) I kind of liked last year and she was sick all year. She's a sister to Sassa Hanover. Hopefully she comes back as good as I think she will, but you never know after they've had a year of being

off-and-on sick. She acts like a nice filly," Elliott said. "Talk Show is very, very fast, but he's just not very smart. It's hard to count on one that you never really know what he's going to do... Fast and good are two different things."

Two of Elliott's promising three-year-olds from last year are coming back well, so far at four, the trainer said

"Stacia Hanover and Artistic Major are coming back well, but they've only been in 2:10," he said. "We're aiming them for the middle to the end of the year and will pick our spots with them. I've got a whole barn full of really nice horses. Are there any great ones? Only time will tell. But I've got a bunch of really nice ones."

Elliott also has a new training base in New Jersey after 37 years at Showplace Farms, which was sold in July of 2015.

"It was kind of a tough deal to find a place to go. At the time we had almost 40 horses and nobody had 40 stalls," Elliott said. "We ended up turning some out and waiting for stalls here and there. They got me into White Birch, thank God. At least I had a place to go.

"(Joe) Holloway and I were talking. We'd been (at Showplace) damn near since it opened. That's a lot of years when you look back. They opened, I think, in '78 and I think I had been there since '79. It was like home. I was comfortable there. You go to a new place and now you've got to figure out the track, figure out the differences in the track that relate to what your horses are doing. It takes a little bit of getting used to."



## Wiggle It Jiggleit returns Monday, may race in Quebec

Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit will make his 2016 debut Monday (March 28) at Dover Downs in a \$60,000 invitational / handicap.

The \$2.2-million winner owned by George Teague, Jr. of Harrington, DE, trained by Clyde Francis and driven by Montrell Teague, will square off against Steve Elliott trainee Rockeyed Optimist — riding a four-race winning streak — plus Dapper Dude and Bushwacker in a seven-horse field.

On March 16, Wiggle It Jiggleit recorded the fastest qualifying mile in Dover Downs history, a 1:50.1 victory in a morning qualifying race.

Meanwhile, there was word this week that Wiggle It Jiggleit headlines the list of 24 four-year-old pacers that have been nominated for the \$200,000 Prix D'Ete Grand Circuit Stake Aug. 21 at Hippodrome 3R in Trois-Rivieres, QC.

It will mark the third annual revival of one of the most prestigious races in the history of Canada.

"The Prix D'Ete fit perfectly into our race schedule planning," Teague, Jr. said. "And we hope the season goes well and that we will be in Quebec in August. It would be great to show Wiggle It Jiggleit to the fans at 3R."

In the past two editions of the Prix D'Ete at 3R, the all-age track record was set and then tied as both Sunfire Blue Chip (2014) and All Bets Off (2015) both won in 1:50.3.

"With a possible Wiggle It Jiggleit coming to 3R this summer, the track record will be broken," said a confident 3R general manager, Vincent Trudel. "I have seen him race last year and he was sensational and super-fast. He will love speeding around our banked turns at 3R.

"We are very pleased with the quality of the horses that have nominated to this year's Prix D'Ete."

Like any business, racetrack ownership is a competitive business and all these surrounding racinos have certainly tried to put the squeeze on the Meadowlands. If and when the Meadowlands gets a casino (or casino money) management has to make a concerted effort to attract horses from these other racino tracks. Do whatever it takes. These guys were laughing when they had the upper hand, but as we know, that does not last forever.

I say that even though many of these owners and horseman did nada to support the Meadowlands which is crucial to the sport. They care only about themselves and certainly have no vision.

## USTA should promote existing fractional ownership partnerships

I can't get the Tom Cruise line from Jerry Maguire, "Help Me Help You" out of my mind as I write this.

My name is Tom Janes and I'm one of the managing partners of VIP Internet Stable. We're the largest public harness racing syndication in the U.S. (and perhaps in North America). VIP was established in 1999 (by my partner Ed O'Connor) and is still rolling along today. We currently have

horses racing and stabled in NJ, NY, PA, Ohio and Indiana. Our goal has been to introduce as many potential owners to racehorse ownership as possible via fractional ownership.

Recently, HRU interviewed Mike Tanner in your "Setting The Odds" article. He indicated that the USTA (within the next two years) would be getting involved in establishing fractional ownership opportunities. What the USTA, breeders and racetracks should be doing is promoting the fractional ownership partnerships that are already established. Syndications (such as VIP) already have the infrastructure, experience, connections and trust of the industry, yet we're not promoted by the industry (unless we pay for advertising).

VIP Stable isn't our livelihood, but simply a passion. While we hope "to turn horse racing fans into racehorse owners" we also strive to make the racing experience just that "an experience." We encourage our members to visit their horses at the stable and to attend wonderful events such as the Lexington Select Yearling Sale (where they can see their potential purchases up close). We also typically have a VIP Stable Day down in Sorrento, FL (at Southern Oaks Training Center) where members can get into the sulky (with trainer John Butenschoen) and go around the track with their new two-year-old. Racehorse ownership can be a frustrating as well as an expensive business, but it can also be a very rewarding experience. It's the one sport where most anyone can be the GM of their own professional franchise. We try to make that dream of racehorse ownership come true.

Owning a racehorse isn't cheap and it's certainly not for everyone. However, we make it possible for many to get started and to use this as a springboard into individual ownership (as one gets familiar with the business). We also make it clear to potential members that this isn't an investment that you should expect to make a return on. On the other hand, it could be an exciting experience that you'll never forget.

Fractional ownership opportunities are clearly the way to introduce potential new owners to the game. However, there's no need to wait two years for the USTA to establish a program. Let those that already have the experience lead the way. If the industry would simply promote what's already available to the game, it would lead to new owners almost immediately.

If Jerry Maguire managed a racing syndication, he would certainly say to the harness racing industry, "Help Me Help You."
