# Wiggle It Jiggleit epic in defeat

The reigning Horse of the Year came from dead last in his Levy test to finish just one length back of winner All Bets Off.

Wiggle It Jiggleit and Montrell Teague (shown at Mohawk in this file photo from 2015) were impressive finishing second Saturday in the Levy at Yonkers despite an outside post and tough trip.

Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit was epic in defeat Saturday night at Yonkers Raceway, coming from way, way off the pace to finish second in his debut in the George Morton Levy Series.

"He was huge. He was definitely huge. You don't see too many horses on this track do what he did tonight and even struggle to finish second," Wiggle It Jiggleit's owner, George Teague, Jr., said minutes after All Bets Off won by one length in 1:51.3.

"It was a huge mile. We knew the seven hole was going to be an issue when he drew it."

Sent off as the overwhelming favorite in a race where show betting was banned, Wiggle It Jiggleit and his regular driver Montrell Teague did not fire out of the outside post and sat last through the half. The pair was then forced to go three wide to get around some dead flow. At the top of the

stretch, the tandem sat sixth in the seven-horse field, six lengths back. Thanks to a :27.3 final quarter, Wiggle It Jiggleit rocketed home and edged Forty Five Red by a nose hair.

"I couldn't be happier with (Wiggle It Jiggleit). He paced the back half huge," George said. "Tonight, he just didn't get a trip."

Despite it being his Levy debut, the series was in the third of five preliminary weeks. George said he wasn't concerned about the fact a second-place finish will make it more difficult for Wiggle It Jiggleit to make the April 23 \$200,000 Levy final.

"Where else am I going to race?... They aren't going to write opens for me all over the place. You take what you can get and if I don't make it to the final, I'm all right with that. If I make it to the consolation, I'm all right with that. If I don't make it to either one, I'm all right with that. I'm not that hard to please," George said. "This guy doesn't owe me anything. I won't pressure him into things he's not capable of doing... I'm trying to manage him until November, not manage him through April. I'm not saying these races aren't important, but I want to hit the pavement for a good six, seven, eight months. I don't want to just hit it now and be done. Montrell will take care of him the best he can and we'll just take what comes to us on this half-mile racetrack that's notorious for post position."

The four-year-old gelded son of Mr Wiggles—Mozzi Hanover, trained by Clyde Francis, is now 1-1-0 in two starts this year, good for \$42,500 of a career total of more than \$2.23 million.

# Always B Miki impressive at Big M

The older pacer quietly put up a 1:51 mile in a training session Saturday afternoon at the Meadowlands with his trainer, Jimmy Takter, in the bike.

After training Always B Miki in virtual secret at the Meadowlands Saturday afternoon, trainer Jimmy Takter had just one word to describe the uber-talented older pacer – scary.

As in scary good.

Takter figures the five-year-old son of Always A Virgin out of Artstopper went a training mile in 1:51, with a :54 last half and a final quarter in :26.

"He was very good. He was very strong. He felt like he's ready," said Takter, who was in the bike.

"He's been super all winter. He's been getting better and better. Knock on wood, we hope he's going to stay like this. If so, it's going to be very interesting.

"I can't praise a horse more than I praise this horse. He's in a caliber to be one of the best pacers ever. One of the more powerful horses I ever saw was Somebeachsomewhere and this horse has that kind of power. He makes it look easy. He's definitely in a class with the best that ever lived. I know that for sure. If I can keep him good and healthy and sound I think he's going to make a big impact in the sport. I'm sure about that."

Last fall, Always B Miki rebounded from his second serious career injury to storm through his only four races of the year in epic style after posting a 1:48.2 qualifier at Red Mile that equaled the world record for a qualifier.

The winner of more than \$1.2 million lifetime was

dominant in the \$300,000 Breeders Crown open pace final at Woodbine in October — defeating a tough older group by five-and-a-half lengths in the slop in 1:49.3. He then ended the year with a 1:49.1 victory in the \$136,500 American-National at Balmoral to cap a perfect campaign with earnings of \$301,210 for owners Bluewood Stable (William Jones, Jillian Luff, Mitchel Skolnick, Bluestone Farms and Kitty Hawk Stable (Bob Boni and Stuart Hankin)), Roll The Dice Stable (Joseph Hurley) and Christina Takter.

In 2014, Always B Miki was scratched out of the \$531,250 Breeders Crown final for sophomore pacers on Nov. 22 at the Meadowlands mere minutes before going to post with what was later found to be a broken left hind long (P-1) pastern.

Veterinarian Dr. Patty Hogan repaired the damage surgically and Always B Miki trained a mile in :53 at the Meadowlands last May. A few days later, Takter informed the owners that Always B Miki had suffered a broken bone in the

right hind P-1 pastern. The horse had surgery and returned to the races later in the year in tremendous form.

If he stays healthy, some pundits believe Always B Miki could put up some jaw-dropping world record miles this year.

"Believe it or not, when you sit behind him you don't feel like you're going that fast," Takter said. "You can drive a :55 pacer and feel like you're going a million miles an hour. But this horse, you can do in one stride what would take four strides for a normal horse. He's very efficient in how he goes."

Takter said Always B Miki will likely qualify in two weeks, "so he gets two weeks to absorb this training and then we'll go from there. It's not that easy to find races for him right now. So, it will buy me two weeks anyway.

"I'm going to try to keep him at the Meadowlands as much as possible for awhile and then, hopefully, we can find some races for him here. Right now, they're racing those Levy races at Yonkers and there's not that many open pacers around."

Earlier Saturday, Takter trainee JK Endofanera won his qualifier in 1:51.4 at the Meadowlands.

"John Campbell drove him and he was very happy with him," said Takter, who also was impressed by a qualifying victory by three-year-old Brittany Farms homebred Western Fame (Western Ideal—Shyaway).

"He was a very lazy, laid-back colt last year that didn't do all that much, but he won his qualifier in 1:53.2 and looked really good. So, I had a good afternoon here."

# **Hopping at Hoosier**

Despite some last-second hiccups that caused a late start to the card, Opening Night at Hoosier Park was deemed a success particularly at the betting windows where handle approached \$1 million, up 65 per cent over the 2014 opener.

Live racing returned to Indiana Friday (April 1) at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino, and while the first night of the 160-day schedule provided some challenges for management, it was a tremendous success.

For fans that traveled to the Anderson oval or tuned in around the country, it might have appeared that Hoosier Park was serving up an April Fool's Day hoax. Advertising a 5:45 p.m. first post, the field of trotters slated for the season's opener didn't line up behind the gate for another 45 minutes after the prescribed time.

Murphy's Law was in full effect Friday evening. The EMT service with which the track has contracted for many years failed to send an ambulance to the facility, leaving management to scramble to find a solution until they arrived. By law, racing cannot be conducted without an ambulance on hand. To top it off, the starting car, which has performed flawlessly in qualifiers leading up to opening night, was a late scratch due to technical issues, forcing a move to the back-up car.

Despite those initial obstacles, a full clubhouse and 14-race program packed with full fields reflected the buzz and excitement surrounding the 2016 season. Once the field for the first race was set in motion, fans also showed their enthusiasm for the Indiana product, producing a banner opening night for the track. All-sources handle for the evening totaled \$948,734, a 65 per cent increase and the strongest opening night in the 23-year history of the track. By comparison, the 2015 opener, also a 14-race card, yielded \$572,161 followed by a Saturday night program that generated handle of \$480,096 over 14 races.

"I'm a big believer in momentum," said Rick Moore, Hoosier Park's vice president and general manager of racing. "I always worry about the entry box, especially this early in the year. We had an overwhelming response at the entry box. Seeing the building full and the energy in the air; it's nice to have live racing back."

Fans of Hoosier Park will notice several changes during the 2016 race meet, starting with the simulcast product. Races will be broadcast in high definition, making this signal one of only four harness racing products in North America distributed in HD. Hoosier Park also invested in a new graphics package in hopes of making the product "pop" in

#### the marketplace.

"Have we perfected everything? No," said Moore. "We're trying to up our game and be the best there is in harness racing. There's a lot of shelf space and a lot of products out there. We're trying to stand out."

Add to the visual changes the installation of a passing lane, the addition of new water trucks and the hiring of former Meadowlands track man Gary Wolff, and it is clear that Hoosier Park parent Centaur is committed to harness racing in Indiana. The racing community has taken notice of the investment being made and the push to promote Hoosier Park as an entertainment destination with a racing product second to none.

"This has been an ongoing project for the last five or six years," said Joe Putnam, a trainer and director for the local horseman's association. "It really is a team effort, a mutual collaboration. We keep trying to build a better product for today as well as the future. The staff here at Hoosier Park is always looking to be better, to become better. They're really pro-racing, and I think we're very fortunate."

The passing lane may not have played a factor in the outcome of each race Friday night, but as the meet goes on, leading driver Trace Tetrick feels it will have an impact.

"I didn't have a chance to use it," said Tetrick, a winner of three races on the card to start his title defense. "It's a great thing to have, it gives you another option, and it will be used more and more. If you're racing along the inside, now you have a chance to get loose."

Putnam was one that used the passing lane to his advantage on opening night. Driving Nice N Easy Street in the 12th race, the duo found themselves fifth along the rail in the stretch. Edging down to the inside, Putnam advanced the trotter, sent off at 17-1 odds, to second as the field closed on the wire.

"Any kind of significant improvement is a positive," he added of the change. "It's just another win-win for everybody."

#### The Freak qualifies at HoP

Millionaire and Breeders Crown champion Freaky Feet Pete kicked off his four-year-old campaign Saturday morning, April 2 with a qualifier at Hoosier Park. One of four pacers to go to the post in the second race of the morning, Pete was easily rated by regular driver Tetrick, who guided him through fractions of :27.2, :56.1 and 1:24.3 before coming home in :27.4 to wrap up a 1:52.2 mile. With the temperature hovering just under 40 and a strong wind to contend with, Tetrick liked what he saw from the Larry Rheinheimer-trained homebred son of Rockin Image, a winner by more than nine lengths.

"He came back really good, as good as when he was put away last fall," the driver said. "He grew up a little bit, but he filled out more than anything else."

Rheinheimer will look to get Freaky Feet Pete a few starts at Hoosier Park before pointing him to the \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie on May 21 at Northfield Park. Tetrick hopes to once again sit behind the champion pacer as often as possible. Owned by Mary Jo Rheinheimer and Marty Rheinheimer, the pacer has been staked more heavily than in previous campaigns, opening the door to increased starts outside Indiana.

"I'd really like to stay with him, but that's up to Larry and Marty," Tetrick said. "I'd like to take every opportunity I have to stay with him. I'm hoping for a smooth transition for him from three to four."

#### **Harness Racing Update**



#### USA! USA! USA!

#### American trotting bloodlines dominate the world.

That's the inescapable conclusion after looking at a list of leading trotting sires around the world as all the leading sires trace back to the Michigan-born Peter The Great, a foal of 1895.

The top sires from three continents descend from three grandsons of Peter The Great foaled in the 1920s. They are:

• Sam Williams (1922), who was exported to France after racing in the USA and established himself as an influential sire.

• **Scotland (1925)**, a top colt and older trotter in the late 1920s who later achieved fame as a stallion at Walnut Hall Farm.

• Volomite (1926), although he played second fiddle to his stablemate Walter Dear (a half-brother to Sam Williams) in the colt stakes of 1928-29 and enjoyed a resplendent stud career at Walnut Hall Farm.

The stats on stallions around the world were compiled by Nikolaus Matzka, an Austrian pedigree buff who operates the **www.breedingtrotters.com** website. Let's take a look at his compilation:

#### FRANCE

Since France has the strongest harness racing program in the world, that's a good place to start our international survey. France has long been justifiably proud of its breed of *trotteur Francais* and for decades after World War II eschewed the use of outside bloodlines.

Two American expatriates, Sam Williams and The Great McKinney (both foals of 1922) had extraordinary influence before the French basically slammed the door on outside blood. That door was opened briefly in the 1980s and the prophet who crept in was Jean-Pierre Dubois. He saw value in American bloodlines when no other French breeders did and his prescience has resulted in an extraordinary impact on French pedigrees. Many of the top stallions have "Made by J-P Dubois" tattooed on them.

The leading French stallion in 2015 was Love You, and his

dominance spreads to other countries by virtue of his semen being shipped widely. Now 17, Love You is usually at the top or near the top of the French trotting stallions. His male line goes back to Sam Williams and if you look elsewhere in his pedigree you find such American stallions as Speedy Somolli, Super Bowl, Speedy Count, and Victory Song.

Second on the French sires list is Ganymede, who topped the list in 2014. He is a grandson of Royal Prestige (Speedy Crown).

Moving up to third place is the 13-year-old Prodigous, a son of Goetmals Wood, who is basically the product of blending the male lines of Victory Song and Nevele Pride. Prodigious is out of a granddaughter of Royal Prestige.

(Goetmals Wood himself, a foal of 1994, ranked fifth on the French sire list in 2015.)

Fourth on the French list and rising quickly is Ready Cash, the 11-year-old rising star who is line-bred to Star's Pride through Nevele Pride and the Franco-American star Florestan.

#### SWEDEN

Trotting is enormously important in Sweden, as anyone lucky enough to travel there knows.

By virtue of shipped semen, Love You was the leading stallion there in 2015 as he was in 2014.

Ranking second to the champ was the Swedish native son From Above, a son of Zoot Suit by Nevele Pride. Zoot Suit won a heat in the 1976 Hambletonian and is the son of pacing (yes, pacing!) queen Glad Rags by Greentree Adios.

Ranking third and fourth in Sweden last year were Andover Hall and Muscle Hill, two names familiar to breeders in North America.

Coming just after them were two sons of Pine Chip — the 2001 Hambletonian winner Scarlet Knight and the exported Dream Vacation.

#### NORTH AMERICA

In 2015, it was a case of "Round up the usual suspects" among trotting stallions as the top three were Donato Hanover, Kadabra, and Cantab Hall. That same trio of stallions had ranked 1-2-3, but in reverse order in 2014.

The upstart who is trying to muscle them out of the way is Muscle Hill, now 10, who is clearly a hot property. Andover Hall, always among the leaders in North America, rounded out the top five.

#### ITALY

The trotting sport has endured some difficult years in southern Europe, but the King remains on the throne.

#### **Dean's List continued**

Varenne, surely one of the greatest international stars of recent decades, once again swamped his rivals among Italian stallions.

Varenne is a grandson of Speedy Somolli and picks up an additional Speedy Crown blood through his second dam Baree (dam: Spree Hanover by Star's Pride).

Ganymede and Love You, both based in France, ranked second and third to Varenne last year, as they had in 2014.

Toss Out, the Supergill son that raced against American Winner and Pine Chip in the '93 Hambletonian, ranked fourth again in 2015 while Pine Chip himself was fifth in the 2015 Italian sires list.

#### NORWAY

At the top of Europe, we find the French stallion Coktail Jet (out of a Super Bowl mare) as the leading stallion in 2015 with his son Look de Star second.

The American export SJ's Photo, a huge star in Scandinavia as a result of his races there two decades ago, ranked third last year.

Dream Vacation and Kadabra, who had been 1-2 in the Norwegian rankings in 2014, finished fourth and fifth, respectively, in 2015.

#### NEW ZEALAND AND AUSTRALIA

Sundon may have an all-American pedigree but trotting devotees Down Under have adopted him as their trotting monarch as he led the trotting lists in both New Zealand and Australia once again. Sundon has been a fixture at the top of the trotting sires list there since... well, forever.

Sundon is a son of the meteorically fast Arndon, a trotter that Delvin Miller told me could probably go head-to-head with the great pacer Niatross. Sundon is out of a B.F. Coaltown mare whose dam is a half-sister to Songcan and Songflori, American stars of the 1970s.

After the dominant Sundon, New Zealand's top trotting stallions last year were Monarchy (Balanced Image), Pegasus Spur (SI's Photo), Majestic Son (Angus Hall), and the ubiquitous Love You.

In the Land of Oz, the top five were Earl (Balanced Image), Bacardi Lindy (SJ's Photo), Dream Vacation (Pine Chip), and the Canadian star Majestic Son.

#### DENMARK

As mentioned earlier, SJ's Photo made a lasting impression on horsemen in Scandinavia with his races there two decades ago, and he was an impressive winner of the Copenhagen Cup. So it's no surprise that the top sire in Denmark in 2015 was his son ENS Snapshot.

Following him were Great Challenger (Conway Hall), Love

You, Dream Vacation, and Trophy Catch. The latter horse is a Pine Chip half-brother to Moni Maker that showed so much early promise for Jimmy Takter.

#### FINLAND

SJ's Photo made a lot of Finnish fans when he won the Finlandia race there and his son Classic Photo, the 1-2 favorite in the 2005 Hambletonian, was the top sire there in 2015.

Love You was second, followed by Like A Prayer (Lindy Lane), Diesel Don (a brother to Muscle Hill), and Classic Response (Yankee Glide).

#### THE NETHERLANDS

Love You showed up on top in Holland in 2015 for the second straight year.

Trailing him on the leading sires list are Virgil Boko (Express Ride) and Offshore Dream (a two-time Prix d'Amerique winner in France).

#### AUSTRIA

Edu's Speedy was easily the top sire here after ranking second in 2014. He is a son of Speedy Bandito (Speedy Somolli).

#### **SLOVENIA and SERBIA**

In the eastern Europe nation of Slovenia, Allison Hollow, a son of Supergill best known for upsetting Malabar Man as a juvenile, ranks at the top.

In Serbia the French-bred Gros Grain, from the male line of Royal Prestige (Speedy Crown) just edged Tony Oaks (Supergill) for top honors.

#### MALE LINES

We began this discussion with reference to a trio of grandsons of Peter The Great, so let's see how their influence is felt in the world of trotting.

The stallion champs tracing in their male line to Sam Williams are the French stars Love You and his sire Coktail Jet.

The leaders tracing to Scotland are Sundon, Edu's Speedy, Varenne, and Gros Grain.

Those tracing to Volomite are Donato Hanover, Classic Photo, Allison Hollow, and ENS Snapshot.

## Wire at Yonkers contributed to George Brennan's spill

Fortunately, the driver wasn't seriously injured when Lucan Hanover dumped him. Even better, the track has asked the regulator for permission to more the wire further from the turn.

There is a compelling YouTube video (click here to watch) of driver George Brennan bringing a loose Lucan Hanover to a stop after the older pacer dumped the driver just past the wire on March 26 after a Levy division at Yonkers Raceway.

On Friday (April 1), Brennan said the closeness of the wire to the first turn played a role in the spill. Fortunately, the driver wasn't seriously injured.

"It's tough where the wire is. The wire is practically into the turn and it makes it really tough to drive a horse to the wire there," Brennan said. "That being said, Yonkers has definitely taken a stance on that and they have the wire moved back. Not yet. It's not moved back, yet, but they have the lights up and they have everything ready to go. We're just waiting on the New York State Gaming Commission to give us the okay. Yonkers has definitely taken a stance to make it safer for us. Right now it gets a little hairy right now, especially after a race.

"In that race with Lucan Hanover, Jordan Stratton was behind me (driving Texican N), there was another horse inside in the passing lane (Te Kawu N), so there was three of us going into the turn together. So, it definitely makes it very difficult and it won't happen soon enough when the Gaming Commission approves, if they do, the new wire."

Lucan Hanover improved his 2016 record to a perfect four-for-four with that victory for Casie Coleman's top assistant Andrew Harris, before finishing last in his third round Levy test last night (April 2) with Brett Miller driving. Brennan drove Take It Back Terry to victory in that race for Ron Burke.

"Burke has so many horses, you never know when he's going to bring in something new. It's exciting," Brennan said. "It's a great relationship. I hardly ever talk to him. I don't talk to him before, I don't talk to him after. We have a wonderful relationship and we're really good friends, too. He doesn't bother me with nonsense and I don't bother him with nonsense."

Brennan, who sits sixth in the nation in money so far in 2016 with over \$1.2 million made, has won more than 9,100 races in his career and nearly \$154 million.


"No complaints," said Brennan, who will turn 49 on April 20. "I'm staying healthy. As long as I stay healthy I could be okay. The Levy's been going well."

A full casino will come to Mohawk in the next five years – JJ: 10/1 "It may come, but will it stay?"

After the current WEG contract with the Central Ontario Standardbred Association (COSA) expires, the Ontario Harness Horse Association (OHHA) will sign the next contract with WEG – **JJ: 100/1 "COSA isn't going anywhere."** 

You will become president of OHHA in the next five years – JJ: 5/1 "I believe in helping horsepeople and if that is how I can help, then I'd be happy to serve."

In five years, there will be one group representing all the harness horsepeople in Ontario – JJ: 50/1 "If there's a will, there's a way. We are talking together about the best interest of horsepeople and marketing so I hope we can at least work together to benefit all horsepeople. That said, COSA is the rep at WEG tracks and OHHA reps the Alliance tracks."

Horsepeople will be able to see the commissions on wagering from all Ontario Standardbred Alliance racetracks in 2016 – JJ: 100/1... "At this rate. There is no information sharing at this moment."

One or more harness tracks in Ontario will close in the next five years – JJ: 100/1... "under my guidance. I don't think it would help the industry, but I'm not sure how much say I'll have in it."

The total number of race dates in Ontario will continue to decline in the next three years – JJ: 100/1... "if I can help it. But if the horse shortage isn't fixed it's much lower, 3/1."

Standardbred Canada will get out of the horse sale business in the next five years — JJ: 1/1... "if it makes fiscal sense. There has to be a net gain financially for us as an association." You will become president of Standardbred Canada in the next five years – JJ: 100/1

In the next three years, the OLG will develop a new game with some of the proceeds going directly to the horse racing industry — JJ: 100/1... "if you believe that 'they' don't have any more money for this industry. But, I hope the OLG will fully embrace our game and make something like that happen."

Wagering in Canada will continue to increase over the next three years – JJ: 1/1 "Fingers crossed."

Purses on the WEG circuit will increase over the next three years – JJ: 100/1

An entertainment district will open on the Woodbine property in the next three years – JJ: 50/1

The number of foals produced in Ontario will increase in each of the next three years – JJ: 10/1

You will win the 2016 National Driving Championship – JJ: 1/1... "If I get the best horses!"

You will win the 2017 World Driving Championship (being held in Canada) – JJ: 2/1

In 2016, you will win your fourth O'Brien Award as Canada's Driver of the Year — **JJ: 5/1** 

Blair Burgess — with whom you teamed up on NA Cup and Jug winner Tell All — will be inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame this year

- JJ: 1/1 Setting The Odds Best Bet

You will win the Gold Cup and Saucer in the next three years – JJ: "I'm not putting odds on that in case I jinx myself."

You will win the Pepsi North America Cup in the next three years – JJ: 5/1

You will win the Hambletonian in the next five years – JJ: 25/1 "Tough one."

You will top 10,000 career wins before you retire (currently at 7,277) – JJ: 5/1 "It's definitely my goal."

You will surpass \$200 million before you retire (currently at \$114 million) – JJ: 100/1

One day you will leave Ontario to drive in the United States – JJ: 8/1

You will join your father as an inductee in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame one day

– JJ: 50/1 "That's not up to me, but it would be a great honor."



# Busy Saturday at Woodbine as meet winding down

The Youthful, Preferred pace and a milestone highlighted the final Saturday night card of the 2015-16 Woodbine Fall/Winter meet.

The action-packed 10-race card was contested under chilly temperatures and a light snowfall.

Easy Lover Hanover extended his win-streak to six in a row with a 1:53.1 score in the \$17,000 second leg of the Youthful for three-year-old pacers.

Driven by Jody Jamieson, Easy Lover Hanover sprinted out from post-seven and cleared to the front just after a :27 opening-quarter.

After posting middle-fractions of :56 and 1:24.1, Easy Lover Hanover extended his lead to more than three-lengths with an eighth of a mile to go. The Catamount Kid, who was a 2/1 co-favorite, turned in a solid stretch-rally to close in on the leader, but the Ben Wallace trainee didn't fold and won by head.

Sporty Mercedes finished third, while Flaherty, the other 2/1 choice, rallied from seventh at the half to finish fourth.

A son of Somebeachsomewhere—Easy Go Go, Easy Lover Hanover is now a perfect six for six since joining the Wallace barn earlier this year. Saturday's victory was the colt's seventh career victory.

Easy Lover Hanover was one of three horses owner Brad Grant purchased at the January Mixed Sale at the Meadowlands on Jan. 18 to help replace some of the horses Wallace lost in the barn fire at Classy Lane Stables. Grant purchased Easy Lover Hanover for \$70,000 at the sale. The pacer has now earned \$55,000 this season. He paid \$7.20 to win.

Earlier on the card, Boomboom Ballykeel scored a 5/1 mild-upset in the \$34,000 Preferred pace.

A five-year-old son of Mach Three, Boomboom Ballykeel now has four wins this season for trainer Richard Moreau and owners Ballykeel Racing Inc. Saturday's victory was the first career WEG Preferred victory for the Moreau trainee, who won the 2013 Metro Pace.

Filion's winning drive behind Boomboom Ballykeel was one of four victories on the evening for Woodbine's leading driver.

Also on Saturday's card, driver Jonathan Drury surpassed \$10 million in career earnings.

The young reinsman reached the career milestone by guiding six-year-old pacing mare D Gs Pesquero to victory in the evening's opening race for trainer Carmen Auciello.

Drury, who won 142 races last year, has driven 34 winners this season for earnings nearing \$600,000. Last season was a career best for Drury, as he drove the winners of over \$2.1 million.

The next milestone on the horizon for Drury is the 1,000 win mark. He currently sits at 928 career wins.

The 2015-16 Woodbine Winter/Fall meet wraps up Monday night with a 10-race card. Post time is 7:30 p.m.

# Steady numbers for NA Cup and other WEG stakes

Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) has released updated lists of eligible horses to its stakes program.

The March 15 stakes deadline featured sustaining payments for several events, including the Pepsi North America Cup, and nomination payments for many big events, including the Metro Pace and Canadian Pacing Derby.

The Pepsi North America Cup, Canada's richest harness race, has 53 horses remaining eligible following March's sustaining payment. Originally, 58 three-year-old pacers were nominated to the \$1 million event.

The \$700,000 Canadian Trotting Classic, \$400,000 Fan Hanover, \$400,000 Elegantimage and \$250,000 Goodtimes all had a sustaining payment due on March 15. Each event saw at least 88 per cent of their nominees make the first sustaining payment.

A total of 168 two-year-old pacers have been nominated to

the Metro Pace. The \$685,000 event is the richest race for two-year-olds and has been captured by many greats including Artsplace, Rocknroll Hanover, Somebeachsomewhere and Captaintreacherous.

The \$685,000 Canadian Pacing Derby, Canada's oldest stakes race, has attracted 47 nominees. The list of older pacers nominated to the 'Derby' includes last year's champion and Canadian Horse of the Year State Treasurer, U.S Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit, 2015 Pepsi North America Cup champion Wakizashi Hanover and Breeders Crown champion Always B Miki.

Foiled Again, the richest Standardbred of all-time, is also nominated to the Canadian Pacing Derby. The winner of over \$7.3 million has appeared in the 'Pacing Derby' five-times, including winning the event in 2012.

A group of 36 older trotters have been nominated to the \$680,000 Maple Leaf Trot. Last year's winner Bee A Magician has once again been made eligible to the event and is one of four mares (D One, Mission Brief, Shake It Cerry) nominated.

A trio of WEG's signature events for two-year-olds all featured a close number of nominees. The \$455,000 Shes A Great Lady for pacing fillies has 161 nominees, while the \$370,000 William Wellwood for rookie trotters and the \$410,000 Peaceful Way for trotting fillies attracted 162 and 164 nominees, respectively.



Two of those horses were (ranked higher) on the Curmudgeon's list.

I was up at Roosevelt when he ran in a mile-and-a-half race parked out the entire time against the best around including Cardigan Bay and won. Unfortunately he got hurt in California and had to be euthanized. This was a beautiful black gelding (NY Times Article).

Probably one of the reasons (most people have) never heard of him is because he was a gelding and not a horse and was only around for a shot period of time.

To the honorable mention list I would add Overcall.


