Grande expectations for Ariana G

Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld's homebred trotting filly is poised to be the toast of a sophomore class that also includes Magic Presto, Fine Tuned Lady and Princess Aurora.

Heading into her sophomore season, the 2016 Dan Patch and O'Brien Award winner Ariana G (Yannick Gingras) is the one to beat in the three-year-old trotting filly class.

Pop star Ariana Grande's most recent release was called 'Dangerous Woman'. The album title describes her trotting filly namesake perfectly.

Ariana G (Muscle Hill—Cantab It All—Cantab Hall) won nine-of-11 races a year ago, slicing through the two-year-old filly trotting division like Tom Brady through the Jets defense.


Sure, trainer Jimmy Takter has plenty of top horses in his barn. He has some three-year-old trotting colts that figure to make noise on the Hambletonian trail and his Idyllic Beach is the top sophomore filly pacer heading into the season. But his most impressive student of all sits atop the three-year-old trotting filly class.

"If she is like she is right now," said Takter. "No one in her division is as good as she is. She is a very special horse."

During 2016, Ariana G won the Peaceful Way, Doherty Memorial, New Jersey Sire Stakes Final and Breeders Crown.

Her \$743,967 in earnings were \$300,000 more than her closest divisional pursuer. Her season's mark of 1:51.4 was only one-fifth-of-a-second slower than the fastest of any two-year-old trotter a year ago, a mark set by the colt Walner, who enters 2017 as a heavy Hambletonian favorite.

"She had a good winter and is coming back really nice," said Takter. "She'll qualify (a week from tomorrow) at the Meadowlands and her first start will be in the sire stakes in early May and then we will go from there."

The division features a handful of major stakes: the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks (Aug. 5), \$400,000 Elegantimage (Sept. 16), \$300,000 Kentucky Filly Futurity (Oct. 8) and \$500,000 Breeders Crown (Oct. 27).

There's little doubt that Takter would love to take all of those stakes, but there could be a detour along the way.

"I nominated her to the (\$500,000) Beal, which is against the boys (on July 1)," he said. "But I did that because she had six weeks of no races between the sire stakes and Delvin Miller (slated for July 15). I nominated her just in case I need the race."

With a filly this good, might she be heading for the Hambletonian?

"No," said Takter. "It's too early to speculate on that. But who knows? The plan is for the Hambletonian Oaks and all of the other major filly stakes."

Princess Aurora (Cantab Hall–Vulcanize–Muscles Yankee), another Takter trainee, won three-of-11 starts last year and banked \$287,102, mostly on the strength of a pair of



second-place finishes.

She was second to Magic Presto in the Goldsmith Maid as the 3-5 favorite and was the place horse in Ariana G's Breeders Crown victory. "She's not as good as Ariana G," said Takter. "But her second in the Breeders Crown was her best race of the year. In the Goldsmith Maid, she got beat by a horse who got a better trip than she did."

"She has the ability to pick up some decent money this year," said Takter. "She qualified okay at the Meadowlands last week (and she's in tomorrow's second qualifier at the Big M) and her first start will be in the Lady Suffolk in early May. But I don't know how she'll do on a half-mile track."

Magic Presto (Kadabra—In The Mean Time—Muscles Yankee) earned more than half of her nearly \$300,000 bankroll by taking the Goldsmith Maid in her final 2016 start in mid-November, and trainer Nifty Norman is high on his filly for this year.

"We'd been pretty hard on the filly all year," said Norman.
"For the (Ontario Sires Stakes) Super Final in Canada she got sick and we had to scratch her. We tried to get her back for the Breeders Crown and raced her, but she wasn't healthy enough and she didn't make the final. But going into the Goldsmith Maid, she got herself healthy and she was in good shape. I had to convince Brian (Sears) to come up and drive her. Brian said to me, 'Do you think she's good enough?' I said, 'She's worth the trip, you'll have a lot better horse this time,' and he did."

Norman wants to go in all of the major stakes, and is also looking for a big year on the Ontario Sire Stakes circuit. "She's a big filly, she filled out," said Norman. "She kind of dominated in the Ontario races (last year) and I think we have the top filly on the circuit. We'll qualify at the Meadowlands (tomorrow, qualifier three) and her first start will be in the first week of May in the Ontario Breeders."

What about Ariana G? "She was a class above them last year," said Norman. "She's the one to beat going into it, but I'm sure they'll be some other fillies who'll pop up and be pretty good, so we'll see."

Fine Tuned Lady (Cantab Hall—Poster Princess—Pine Chip) used big talent and several opportunities to put up some big numbers a year ago, as the John Butenschoen-trained lass was first or second in 11-of-12 starts, good for earnings of \$438,340, second in the division.

"She was always a good training filly and she's a real smart filly," said Butenschoen. "She took advantage of the break of Ariana G (in the Kentuckiana) and took advantage of Chezatter's break in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship. Things kind of went her way."

Maybe they did. Good racing luck is always appreciated by horsemen. But this filly did win half of her starts a year ago, and figures to win a handful more during 2017.

"We put out a schedule this year where we could take advantage of how handy she is and what she can do," said Butenschoen. "So far she filled out some, we qualified her down here in Florida last Friday. She landed in Pennsylvania (Monday) morning, so we'll try to figure out our game plan between now and the 13th of May, which is the first sire stake."

The filly is staked to all of the major events, and Butenschoen knows that means getting behind the gate alongside Ariana G. "Many aren't as good as her."

An understatement of grand, make that Grande, proportion.









It's prime time for racing innovation

The competition is being handcuffed and the sport should prepare to take advantage of it.

In the 1860's in the UK, innovators were working on a device that could propel a carriage without the use of a horse. It was the beginning stages of one of the most influential and important inventions in modern times — the motorized vehicle.

In the early days, though, these UK inventors came across a roadblock. There were people who liked things the way they were; because they owned the horses and the stagecoaches; shod the horses and built and serviced the stagecoaches. To push back against this new device, they used their connections to lobby for legislation to help their legacy businesses. In 1865, they were rewarded when 'The Red Flag Traffic Laws' were passed.

These laws put penal restrictions on powered devices:

- They could go no more than four miles per hour in the country, or two miles per hour in the city.
- Three people had to travel with the car. One had to drive, another had to walk in front of it waving a red flag to warn people they were coming, and the other had to, well, no one is really sure, but he had to be there.
- A whistle had to be affixed on the car, even though the



whistle (curiously) "shall not be sounded for any reason whatsoever." The vehicles had to have lights (not easy in the day), and the owner's name and address had to be prominently displayed

These new rules worked as intended. The development and testing of this new vehicle wilted.

Meanwhile, in the relatively new and individualist country across the pond, Uncle Sam saw no reason to pass such laws. In 1896, when England repealed the Red Flag Laws, the combustion engine had already arrived. By 1915, Henry Ford's new **assembly line innovation** allowed for a motor vehicle to be put together in 90 minutes flat. The rest, as they say, is history.

What do car laws in 1865 have to do with harness racing? I think, in this day and age, quite a bit. Allow me to explain.

Harness racing as a gambling game has been afforded some generous protections. In 2006, the **Unlawful Internet Gaming Enforcement Act** (UIGEA) was passed, which prohibited "gambling businesses from knowingly accepting payments in connection with the participation of another person in a bet or wager that involves the use of the Internet." This law killed a lot of Internet gambling (especially online poker sites), but, as we all know, it left horse racing free to take bets over the web.

Since that time, harness racing (along with their thoroughbred cousins) has used this edge — Internet wagering has allowed us to wager and enjoy the sport from home, with 100 per cent legality. But far too often it has



simply reshuffled the deck and market share has not increased.

Meanwhile, Daily Fantasy Sports – with demographics that hits racing right between the eyes – has boomed. It too had a grey area carve-out, and enterprising entrepreneurs took advantage of it. Back in 2010, the letters "DFS" were foreign to almost everyone. In 2016, these sites took in \$3.4B in bets.

More recently, handle is growing leaps and bounds on something called 'e-sports'. This may surprise some of you (I'm still having trouble getting my mind around it), but this involves wagering money on teams who play in video game tournaments. Yes, I typed that right. By 2020, some are predicting this wagering will reach upwards of \$36B – about 300 per cent more than is currently wagered on all breeds of horse racing in North America. At the present time, most of this betting takes place offshore.

Maybe at this point you're getting depressed. It seems there's more competition for harness race wagering over the web, not less, despite the UIGEA. No, I'd argue that's not the case, because we're in the process of seeing more and more gambling regulation.

First, Attorney General Jeff Sessions appears to be leaning towards banning much of the Internet wagering we see today.

"Sessions indicated that as attorney general he would revisit and likely overturn a 2011 opinion by the agency that restored federal gambling law to Congress' original intent and returned power to regulate intrastate gambling to the states," an opinion piece in The Hill noted.

If this comes to fruition, it may mean that not only new betting games (like e-sports) will not be approved for wagering, but old ones will likely be curtailed, as well. The many states that run online bingo, online slots, or Internet poker could be prohibited from offering them. In addition, sports betting over the Internet (something pushed for by many of late) would not see the light of day. As we all know, rulings of this nature can get watered down, but I am certain

racing won't be affected, while others could be hampered, in at least some way.


If Mr. Sessions' signalling is legitimate, more protection for harness racing wagering will be happening soon. But for some of the sports' main competitors, they're already in the throes of a similar fate, no matter what the Attorney General's office does.

Ronald Reagan once said, "if you invent a better mousetrap, the government comes along with a better mouse," and those words are prescient when it comes to Daily Fantasy Sports. State taxes and regulation have helped stop the DFS beast right in its tracks. Just two short years ago there were 118 companies in the space; now 81 have left, leaving only a select few. The list is likely to grow smaller because states have begun to ask for hefty fees which smaller companies cannot afford.

Ryan Huss, co-founder of Syde Fantasy Sports, told the **Denver Post** when announcing his company was folding its tent, "the fees seem like more of a deterrent than anything else. Only the largest operators can truly afford to pay them."

In the DFS world, takeout has gone up while customer choice has gone down. The two main DFS behemoths, Draft Kings and Fanduel, (in what the *Economist* described as "a deal borne more out of weakness than strength") have begun to merge. This once vibrant Internet business that was detrimentally affecting state lottery revenue in 2015 is turning into an old life cycle oligopoly. Any way you slice it, its hyper-growth days are clearly in the past.





Internet gambling in the early 21st century is right in the middle of their very own Red Flag Laws. Betting racing over the Internet, however, hums along, with little interference. It's the stagecoach operator, the farrier, the old, protected guard.

This is why, in my view, there's no better time to create a harness racing web business that can take advantage of this serendipitous edge.

What new bets and mediums can be offered, and what new avenues to wager can be exploited?

Because harness racing is protected, can it use its edge and partner to legally offer games that others can't?

What investment can be made that can propel the sport into the gambling mainstream, to attract a skill game market, itching to play a gambling game over the net?

What can the sport do with its data to make the game more attractive to bettors who love models and statistics, like esports gamblers do? Or like blackjack players who use sophisticated analyzers to enjoy their craft?

What can the sport do to its rules to make it more palatable to bettors by creating a better on-track product?

What do harness racing destination sites say to a willing gambler? How can web properties across the sport (along

with new ones created) be improved to speak their language?

What can harness racing do to differentiate itself from thoroughbred racing, to attract value conscious Internet bettors?


Betfair may be under pressure with new legislation and racing is a friend to them; what type of partnership can benefit both parties?

Is there anything that can be leveraged with international partners?

Back in 1865, stagecoach builders in the UK were in the catbird seat. They had a product people had to buy, and the government was taking care of the competition for them. They didn't take advantage of it by partnering to build bumpers and fenders and oil pans, changing to a dealership model, moving from servicing large coaches to servicing engines. They just wanted to muddle along, hiding behind a set of laws; laws which would inevitably change. When that change came 30 years later, their fate was sealed.

Harness racing could choose that same path with the current and perhaps future protections it possesses; after all, the slot machines are spinning, and Twinspires and TVG are carrying the races from Northfield tomorrow. In the meantime, there may be a \$500 billion skill game gambling market looking for something to patronize over the web. In my view it's a perfect time for harness racing to modernize and modify their offering to provide them with a welcome place to land.

Missile J primed and ready for \$529,000 Levy final

It's one thing to stand out against many of the finest older pacers in training. It's quite another to do it as a young'un.

Missile J, a relative toddler at the age of four, finds himself worthy of a seat at Saturday night's (Apr. 22) adult table for Yonkers Raceway's \$529,000 final of the George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series. This race, and its companion, the \$310,600 Blue Chip Matchmaker for female pacers, are the sport's two richest of the season to date.

Missile J, the son of American Ideal out of Cantor's Daughter, already won last season's Art Rooney Pace at Yonkers (for then owner Ken Jacobs and then trainer Linda Toscano). The pacer was the leader in the Levy clubhouse after winning his first three series starts.

With his place in the final thus secured, he took the fourth week off before a 'just don't get hurt' fifth-place effort in last Saturday's (April 15) final prelim leg to wind up third in the standings.

According to the USTA's Anne Chunko, just four of the previous 29 winners of this race have been 4-year-olds.

Though Missile J won the Rooney flashing eight-hole speed, his success in the Levy has been the result of some eye-popping closes.

"He's a bit of a hothead," trainer Scott DiDomenico said.

"Once you start him up, it's hard to throttle him back down."

DiDomenico took over training after the horse changed hands for \$115,000 at the Meadowlands sale this past January.

This season's early results (in seven wins in nine starts) came on the hooves of a very poor end to 2016 when Missile J finished seventh in the final of the Empire Breeders (at Tioga) and eighth (last) in the final of the New York Sire Stakes (Yonkers).

DiDomenico said he and co-owners John McGill and Brian Carsey, "just wanted a good Yonkers Saturday night horse.

There was no thinking he'd be in the Levy.

"I knew he was a high-speed horse who could sprint and was raced hard. He seemed a bit tired at the end of last season, but the first few times we raced him this season (at the Meadowlands), he was so good that we decided to take a shot and nominate him."

In winning his first three series legs, Missile J rallied from sixth, fourth and sixth, snatching victories from venues not usually associated with Westchester, NY win photos.

"He wants to chase horses, but even he surprised me a couple of times," said DiDomenico, who added an open bridle to the horse's wardrobe. "What that allowed us to do was given him a week (round 4) off, and that was big. This is a grueling series, and not having to race every Saturday was a big plus.

DiDomenico said having Tim Tetrick in Missile J's sulky each week has been great. The pair leave from post three in the Levy final.

"I have one of the best drivers in the sport and I love the draw," DiDomenico said. "There's speed inside and outside and he (Tetrick) can just watch things unfold. Now, Missile J just has to execute."

For all of Tetrick's accomplishments, he has never won the Levey final.

The 34-year-old DiDomenico, an Illinois expatriate who earlier this season earned his 1,000th career training victory, has enjoyed his greatest success with the \$1.4 million pacing lass, Handsoffmycookie.

"Personally, it would be special to win this race, especially here (Yonkers). It's where I've mainly raced the past number of years, and it's where I always prefer to race."

Apparently, his charge feels the same way.

The Levy, which honors the memory of the Hall of Fame founder of Roosevelt Raceway, goes as the 10th of 12 races (first post 7:10 p.m., with the Levy at approximately 10:15 p.m.)

The Levy field is: 1-McWicked (Matt Kakaley, 3-1), 2-Blood Brother (Brian Sears, 12-1), 3-Missile J (Tim Tetrick, 4-1), 4-Keystone Velocity (Dan Dube, 9-1), 5-Somewhere in L A (Jason Bartlett, 2-1), 6-Bit of a Legend N (Jordan Stratton, 5-1), 7-Provocativeprincen (Yannick Gingras, 20-1), 8-Soto (Brett Miller, 12-1).

The ninth edition of the Matchmaker is listed as the eighth race (approx.. 9:35 p.m.). The ladies shook out as such: 1-Lispatty (Sears), 2-Shesjustadelight N (Ron Cushing), 3-Mach it a Par (Bartlett), 4-Mackenzie A (Stratton), 5-Regil Elektra (Gingras), 6-Medusa (Kakaley), 7-Bedroomconfessions (Scott Zeron), 8-Empress Deo (Tetrick).

Ontario judges begin tweeting decisions

It's a good first step, but further transparency is needed.

On April 10, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) launched a new pilot project in which the live tweeting of race officials' calls is posted to the AGCO Racing's Twitter page in real time, as the decisions are made. The intent of the initiative is to provide transparency with regards to judges' calls made during a race, pursuant to the AGCO press release announcing the project. Currently, the pilot project is only running at The Raceway at Western Fair District, a half-mile track in London, ON.

A review of @AGCO_Racing account on Twitter shows what all tweets consist of since the project began on April 10. For example, from Wednesday April 19 there are a series of tweets from Race 5 on the card and they are as follows: LON, R5: Inquiry posted. LON, R5: All horses received a fair start. LON, R5: No. 6 was inside 2 pylons and not lapped, no violations.

The AGCO Racing initiative looks like an honest gesture and has a nice feel about it, but it illustrates just how far away harness racing is from real transparency. The information provided in these tweets are largely the type of minimal information already provided through a track's in-house simulcast feed.

The project, though, does begin to address the oft-overlooked issue of accountability and transparency of judges. At most harness tracks, when a disqualification or non-disqualification is made following an inquiry, rarely do we ever hear an explanation from the judges themselves. Most often that duty is oddly left to the track announcer, or to another, sometimes hapless person, left with the unenviable task of explaining a controversial decision, that wasn't even that person's own decision to begin with. Judges shouldn't be above reproach, and not only should the

stewards themselves be the ones to explain the decision and the rules that were broken, but they should also have to walk through the rationale being their decision.

In harness racing almost all inquiries are largely subjective. What might be a pylon violation in one race might not be a violation in the next race. Similarly, there is often little rhyme or reason when it comes to the re-placing a horse to another position that went on a break at some point during a race. How about some of those highly controversial disqualifications where the winner was DQ'd for racing "too slow" on the front end? Because current processes today lack transparency, judge's decisions naturally bring on speculation.

Albeit at a much slower rate than it should be, transparency is still evolving. It was only a couple of decades ago in thoroughbred racing when a steward's video feed was introduced to the general public. But what is amazing in harness racing is that while most of the top tier harness tracks in North America such as WEG and the Meadowlands will show repeated video from various camera angles as an inquiry is ongoing, most harness tracks still don't show anything during an inquiry. All we're left with is either video staring at a tote board with an 'x' next to a number, or an inquiry graphic on a grainy simulcast feed. And while this is going on, we are left in the dark with no idea as to what is being discussed and in some cases with the alleged infractions even is.

Although the AGCO is replicating on Twitter what should easily be communicated through the track's simulcast feed, trying to use social media as an additional medium in today's age is commendable. However, I have a much better idea in terms of what should be done if we're talking about an online presence. What should be done as a pilot, is to utilize something such as Facebook Live. In this case, there would be a camera directly in the judges' room that would broadcast live so that anyone following a track's Facebook page could watch the discussions and deliberations live as

they occur.

It probably sounds like a radical idea, but racing jurisdictions in other parts of the world already have cameras in the judges rooms and it goes to show that we are truly light years behind others in terms of transparency.

In Great Britain thoroughbred racing, as one example, live video can be seen on simulcast feeds that show the entire process play out from the steward's room. In the video included in this column, both jockeys make their case in front of the judges, as we're able to hear the complete discussion and questions being posed. Now I don't expect this to become the norm in North American harness racing overnight, but it does show what could be possible if racing commissions want to strive for total and open transparency.



Another part of the AGCO pilot is that there will be a Race Official's Race Report detailing the events of each race card and it will be posted to both the Standardbred Canada and Western Fair websites. This too is an important step in moving forward with accountability. It mirrors what we see in other parts of the world where racing and gambling is taken seriously, in which daily written reports from the stewards are mandated.

The concept of judges being forced to explain themselves in these reports is a welcomed measure that will help lead to ensuring the integrity of racing and the racing commissions themselves, which is the primary reason they exist in the first place. Instead of decisions being shrouded in secrecy, judges should now have to explain what, specifically, they observed that led to decisions that they made. Their decisions impact not only bettors where there could be hundreds of thousands of dollars bet into a race that hangs

in the balance, but it also impacts all drivers, trainers and owners of horses involved in these decisions.

The AGCO initiative is addressing an issue that clearly needs to be modernized. Following the conclusion of the Western Fair meet, the project will be reviewed as to determine if it should move forward, expand, or be discontinued. For the sake of transparency, I hope this project is only the very first step.

Haughton teamed up with son Tommy to win with Speed Bowl. The following year, John Campbell debuted in the Hambletonian and won his first heat with Joe De Vie the same year Stanley Dancer won his last Hambletonian (Dancer drove Duenna to victory).
- **3.** That the first ever Down Under horse to win in sub-1:50 was Smart Son N (Aug. 10, 1996 in 1:49.3) with Jimmy Morrill, Jr. at the lines?
- **4.** That the Goldsmith Maid in 1976 was an open for all trotters, and in 1977 was for three-year-old trotting fillies only and then re-appeared at Garden State Park in 1990 for the freshman trotting ladies?

Nine horses on the plane to the Elitlopp?

At the end of May, Solvalla in Stockholm, Sweden opens the doors and welcomes trotting fans from around the world for the Elitlopp. And, like last year, there is a plane available for North American horses coming to race that popular weekend.

Markus Myron, racing secretary of Solvalla, recently released the details about how the trip will be arranged from the United States.

"We're going to use Qatar Airways and the plane leaves from JFK, New York, in the afternoon on May 22nd. It lands on Landvetter airport in Gothenburg, Sweden, in the morning on May 23rd and there's place for nine horses," Myron said.

Åke Svanstedt is one of the trainers that has shown interest in coming to Sweden for Elitlopp weekend. In 2016, his trainee Resolve finished second behind Nuncio in the Elitlopp.

"And we saw that Resolve managed to make the trip to Sweden without any problems since he won the Cutler Memorial shortly after," Myron said.

What does Myron hope for this year, regarding North American horses racing at Solvalla?

"I've got some contact with people in USA and we're trying



to get the puzzle together. We sure hope that more trainers show interest in coming, and not just for the Elitlopp," Myron said. "Last year, Pinkman won a big race for four-year-old horses and we offer great races even on the Saturday, with the Sweden Cup the biggest of them," Myron said.

There will be no stress for those who want to make the trip overseas this year. The plane back to America will leave from Gothenburg on the night between May 31 and first of June.

Un Mec d'Heripre in Italy

French horse Un Mec d'Heripre was the winner of the 2017 edition of Italian Group I race Gran Premio Costa Azzurra (\$175.000) in Torino last Sunday (April 16).

The son of Orlando Vici took the lead in the mile race and together with Belgian top driver Jos Verbeeck, the Philppe Billard-trained horse kept his opponents away by a head in 1:55.3.

Un Mec d'Heripre has had a successful career in Europe and this was his fifth Group I victory so far.

On the nine-years-old trotter's account already is victories in Criterium Continental, Prix Rene Balliere (both in France), St Michel-Race (Finland) and Åby Stora Pris (Sweden).

Last year, Un Mec d'Heripre took one of the elimination heats of the Elitlopp and finished third behind Nuncio and Resolve in the final, but was later disqualified after it was found out that the son of Orlando Vici had competed with abnormally high levels of Cobolt in Stockholm.

Final field of Olympiatravet takes the shape

Saturday, April 29 is the day of \$308,000 Olympiatravet in Sweden. During the early spring, eliminations have been held across the northern country and last Sunday (April 16) saw an impressive winner in Reijo Liljendahl-trained Nadal Broline, who made his first start of the year in Rommes elimination over 2 5/8ths of mile.

The seven-year-old son of Yankee Glide out of the American Winner mare Aimee's Promise climbed quickly on the ladder of career during 2016 and had only 26 lifetime starts before the race last Sunday. From position in second lane behind the gate, Nadal Broline should have had it tough to reach the top spot, but an incredibly strong finish from fourth over was enough to beat Volsted and D.D.'s Hitman short before the finish line.

The approximate mile time over the distance was 1:55.3.

Belina Josselyn finished second behind Bold Eagle in Prix d'Amerique in January and has \$1,178,350 in her bank account.

April Rose paying off at Mohawk

Monday night's (April 17) fifth race at Mohawk (above) produced a thrilling finish when 5-year-old trotting mare April Rose reached up right on the shadow of the wire to nail pacesetter Finish Line. In addition to the consistent mare providing a juicy \$22 payoff to her backers, there were a few factors that made this race buzzworthy. First, the \$13,500 in earnings represented the biggest payday yet for the SJs Caviar—Show Me The Bling mare, who was racing as low as

the \$10,000 claiming level (and not winning) last July at Harrah's Philly. Second, it was the 11th straight check earned by the mare since a sixth-place finish in her first start for new connections Ed and Ashley Hensley, who claimed her for \$25,000 on Dec. 26 from the Rene Allard stable. Third, the improving mare has done all of the earning in the conditioned ranks, having not been tagged once by the Hensleys since the claim. Clearly, April Rose is one to watch for in the coming weeks and she won't be hard to spot with her purple and pink rigging! She's in to go Monday (April 24) in the \$34,000 preferred (race nine) at Mohawk.



Dragon Again euthanized

Dragon Again, a winner of more than \$2.3 million on the racetrack and the sire of the winners of more than \$122.7 million, including the \$7.5 million-winner Foiled Again, the sport's all-time richest racehorse, was euthanized Wednesday afternoon (April 19), at Sugar Valley Farm in Ohio, where he had stood stallion duty since 2014.

Dragon Again's death comes one week after Sugar Valley Farm announced the retirement of the 22-year-old son of Dragons Lair. In making that announcement, Sugar Valley Farm co-owner Joe McLead said Dragon Again had a fused right ankle that was ailing him.

"He's had that fused right ankle the last 14 years and in the last day or so the ankle became just too much for him to deal with. It had begun to take its toll on the rest of his body," McLead said on Thursday morning (April 20).

Dragon Again was bred by Andray Farm and was purchased as a yearling for \$40,000 by Ohioan Ed Mullinax. Mullinax owned Dragon Again his entire **racing career** and is still the majority shareholder in the Dragon Again Syndicate.

"I consulted with Mr. Mullinax and we made the decision to euthanize together," said McLead. "We did not want the horse to suffer."

Dragon Again won 29 of 70 starts, with his biggest victory coming in the \$450,000 Hoosier Cup in 1998 at Hoosier Park. Other big wins for Dragon Again included the \$350,000 Canadian Pacing Derby at Mohawk and the \$250,000 Prix d'Autumn at Hippodrome de Montreal in 1999, and the \$150,000 Battle of Lake Erie in '99 at Northfield Park.

Dragon Again's career best of 1:48.3 came on June 17, 2000, when he won the \$87,600 Pacing Classic at Woodbine. At the time, the mile was the fastest ever in Canada.

Dragon Again was retired following his five-year-old season in 2000, going on to a stud career at Hanover Shoe Farms in Pennsylvania. He stood at Hanover for 13 years before moving to Sugar Valley in 2014, where the size of his books were 116, 107 and 82 in years 2014-16. Dragon Again bred some mares this season, with a few already pronounced in foal.

In addition to Foiled Again, Dragon Again's other \$1 million-plus performers include My Little Dragon (\$2.3 million); Atochia (\$1.8 million); Aracache Hanover (\$1.7 million); Wakizashi Hanover (\$1.3 million); Versado (\$1.2 million); and Tidewaterdragonfly (\$1 million).

Overall, **Dragon Again** sired 334 lifetime \$100,000 winners from 940 performers. From those performers, 562 took marks of 1:55 or better. His fastest progeny were 1:48 winners Foiled Again, Wakizashi Hanover and Vlos.

McLead said Dragon Again was buried on the farm near his paddock by the Sugar Valley office.

"We have a pond near his paddock and there are two oak trees at the back of the pond, and we buried him between those two trees so he can see all the broodmares and his paddock," said McLead.

Downbytheseaside impressive in qualifier at Miami Valley

World champion pacing colt Downbytheseaside, the 2016 Governor's Cup champion, made his first appearance on the track as a 3-year-old with a 1:53.1 qualifying victory Wednesday afternoon (April 19) at Miami Valley Raceway.

With Chris Page in the bike for trainer Brian Brown,the son of **Somebeachsomewhere**-Sprig Hanover got away fifth at the opening quarter in :27.3, then brushed to the lead at the half which was clocked in :57.1. Downbytheseaside took the field to the three-quarters in 1:25.2 and came home in :27.4 to reach the wire in 1:53.1.

Owned by Country Club Acres Inc., Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and Diamond Creek Racing, Downbytheseaside equaled the world record for a 2-year-old pacing colt on a mile track when he won his International Stallion Stakes division in 1:49 last October at Red Mile. His 1:50 performance in the Standardbred at Delaware was a world record for a 2-year-old pacing colt on a half-mile oval. He won eight of 13 starts as a freshman, with earnings of \$577.106.

Beback, Jr. records 2,000th win

"The way things went several times in my career, I never thought I'd be able to reach 2,000 wins," driver Ron Beback Jr. said after reaching that milestone on Wednesday night (April 19) steering Ergo Hanover (\$3.60) to victory in the sixth race at Buffalo Raceway.

The 52-year-old Beback Jr. has had to overcome two

serious medical issues, but has bounced back each time with a clean bill of health to help grow his win total.

"Back in May of 1999, I was involved in an on-track accident," he said. "After about two weeks, I developed a pair of blood clots that went to my heart which gave me a heart attack. My heart nearly exploded. The doctor told me he didn't want me drive again but I recovered well. Driving is something I love to do."

But then in 2012, Beback Jr. said he developed some dizzy spells and after battery of tests were taken, he found out he had vertigo. "The doctors straightened things out so I was able to get back to racing."

In a four-year span from 2007 through 2010, Beback Jr. was able to find the winner's circle 603 times with 2009 his top season of all-time with 189 victories. Then after the vertigo issue, he returned to get 467 wins from 2013 through 2015. He has over \$8.1 million in career purse earnings with most coming on the Western New York circuit.

He also trains horses but has seen this stable go from nearly 30 during his peak to just a handful now. "The owners I used to have just aren't around anymore," Beback Jr. said. Besides his own, he gets regular duties from trainers Mark Laidlaw and Mihajlo Zdjelar Jr. Beback Jr. said he prefer the trotters with two of his favorites to drive now being Lutetium and Kahoku.

And for the future, Beback Jr. said he plans to continue on racing as long as possible. "I'm going to take it year by year but I have no plans of stopping any time soon."
