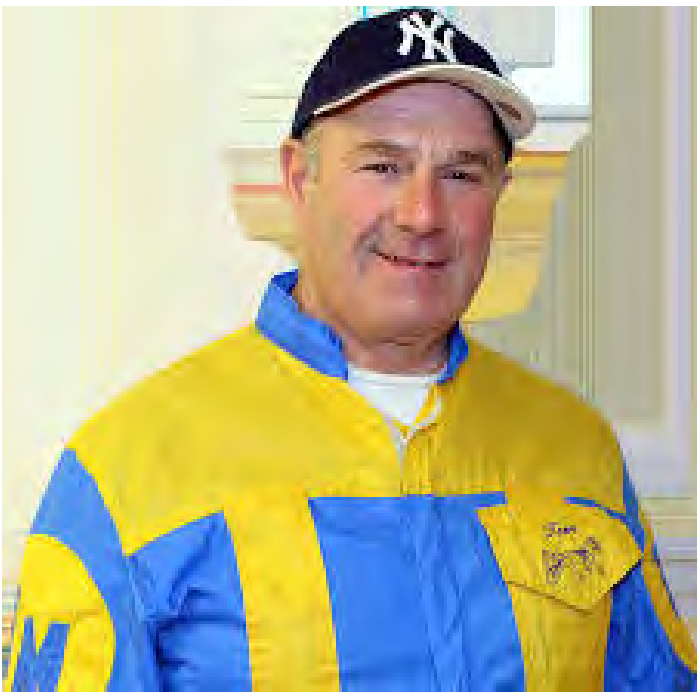

Breaking “the grip of the devil”

Substance abuse and a suspension of his racing license nearly ended the career of Thomas Milici, but sobriety has played a role in the 61-year-old's jump to the top of the Yonkers trainer standings.

Thomas Milici said sobriety has led to his eye-opening results at Yonkers.


Thomas Milici has freed himself from what he describes as “the grip of the devil” to become one of Yonkers Raceway’s leading trainers at the unlikely age of 61.

Milici’s reference to the devil is his way of describing the ruinous hold alcohol and substance abuse had on him, leading to the indefinite suspension of his license on June 1, 2008 after he tested positive for cocaine. He said he has maintained his sobriety since Aug. 4, 2010, and is now taking his career to heights that were once unthinkable.




As of April 21, he had already set a career high for victories (60) – more than doubling last year’s total of 27 – and

earnings (\$5834,670). His previous mark for wins was 44 in 2005. He shattered his personal best for earnings of \$304,020, set in 2015.

To Milici, entering the twilight of his career does not have to mean the downturn that occurs with many trainers. In his case, he is doing everything he can to make up for lost time.

"The body is getting there," he said of his senior years. "But in my mind, I still feel like a kid."

Milici said his eye-opening results reflect the mental clarity he has enjoyed since he put down his final drink and did his last line of cocaine. He said his years of abuse involved alcohol much more often than drugs. Whatever the case, the combination took a staggering toll on his personal life and his career.

"It's a lifestyle where you are not the person you can be or should be," he said. "You might show up to work, but you're not there. You're there physically, but not mentally."

To Milici's credit, he was the first to raise the issue of his personal misconduct during an interview, perhaps demonstrating how far he has come. His license was revoked in New Jersey in 1991 for "financial irresponsibility." He was convicted of driving while intoxicated in 1998 and 2005. Delaware denied his application for a license in 2002 after one of his horses recorded a post-race positive. He was fined and suspended for 105 days for attempting to treat a horse on race day.

He points to his indefinite suspension in 2008 as a critical juncture in his personal turnaround. "The best thing that happened was coming up positive," he said.

Without his daily trips to the barn and his involvement in the sport he loved, he had little choice but to focus on the damage he had done to himself, to his wife, Kathy Tufano, from whom he is now estranged, and his two stepchildren.

Milici recalled his days as a student at Holy Cross High School in Queens, NY when peer pressure would lead him to buy a six-pack with friends but then empty many of the cans when no one was looking because he did not care for the taste of beer. He eventually graduated to vodka and said his alcoholism escalated after he turned 50.

"Vodka kicked me to the curb," he said. "It changed my personality. You hurt the people you love."

Mal Burroughs, owner and driver of 1997 Hambletonian champion Malabar Man, is Milici's brother-in-law. Milici introduced Burroughs to his sister, Janet. Burroughs describes Milici as being "as caring as you can get."

As damning as Milici's background is, his softer, gentler side was not lost on others. It led high-powered trainer Jimmy Takter to hire him as an assistant in 2011 following his emotional plea to racing officials to end his suspension and permit his return.

Milici has advised racing authorities in New York, New Jersey and other nearby states that he is available to speak to others who are involved with alcohol or substance abuse with the hope of pointing them in the right direction. He said he has, in fact, mentored others.

The native of Brooklyn, NY remains devoted to Alcoholics Anonymous and deeply appreciative of what the program provides for him. "It teaches you really how to live," he said, "and it's a great way of living. One day at a time."

Milici feels well-equipped to deal with any temptation to relapse. Help is a phone call or meeting away.

"Relapses happen, but they say it's not a requirement," he said. "You think it through. What do I have to do that for?"

According to Burroughs, Milici had long been his own worst enemy, a seemingly helpless cause. "I helped him out a lot and I was upset with him, to say the least," he said. "I probably didn't talk to him for a year."

Burroughs is convinced Milici's sobriety will be lasting. "I feel confident he's on the straight and narrow in his personal life and in his training life," he said.

Neal Rosenberg teamed with Milici to enjoy a successful run with Happy Gennaro in the early 1980's. He was much more than a client, however. He describes himself as the "Jewish member" of Milici's family. When Milici needed to confide in someone, he was there to listen.

"He was self-destructive," Rosenberg said. "I don't know all of his demons, but I believe he's defeated his demons. His current success reflects that."

Milici's horsemanship has never been questioned, and Takter's willingness to hire him surely serves as a testament to that. Milici urges his assistant, Kevin Efimetz, and other members of his staff to speak the language of those under their care in a 25- to 30-horse stable built primarily on claiming horses. Major Athens, a six-year-old trotter who represents a shrewd \$65,000 purchase at the Meadowlands sale last January, leads the contingent.

Howard Taylor, an attorney based in Philadelphia, sent horses he owned to Milici 15 years ago. He decided to give him another chance once Milici left Takter to resume his own operation.

"I was expecting good," Taylor said of the results. "But not nearly this good."

Other than to attempt to mend fences with loved ones wherever possible, Milici tries not to look back.

"Of course, I have regrets. I do think about it," he said. "There are consequences for our decisions. There are rewards for our decisions."

He is ecstatic to finally reap rewards from the right decisions. As of April 21, he led all Yonkers trainers with a 37 winning percentage and a UDRS of .500. He admits to being astounded by his soaring comeback.

"This is against the odds," he said. "It's not supposed to happen."

But it is happening. One day at a time.

Exchange wagering to debut in New Jersey May 10, on hold for now at Meadowlands

Officials of Betfair and the thoroughbred track Monmouth Park announced Thursday (April 21) in a joint press conference that exchange wagering will begin May 10 in New Jersey. Betfair, popular in many parts of the rest of the world, will be accepting its first ever U.S. customers when launching next month. New Jersey is the only state that has officially approved the form of wagering and only residents of the state will be allowed to bet.

However, Meadowlands owner Jeff Gural said he has yet to come to an agreement with Betfair and that Meadowlands races may not be available to U.S. exchange customers when Betfair launches in New Jersey. Gural said there were some issues to be resolved concerning sponsorships agreements between the track and Betfair. He said he also has issues with Betfair's subsidiary 4njbets.com that he would like to resolve. Gural contends that many fans are wagering over that ADW platform from inside the Meadowlands and he believes he's not being fairly compensated for those bets. Gural did not attend the press conference.

Betfair, which is the firm that created the concept of

exchange wagering and remains the leader in the industry, has long sought a foothold in the U.S. The hope is U.S. gamblers will gravitate to exchange wagering with the same enthusiasm British punters have. In exchange wagering, bets are matched between players who want to bet on a horse and those who are willing to book or lay the bet at a certain price. Betfair takes a commission on winning wagers.

"We've been actively engaged in trying to bring to our consumers new ways to be entertained," said Dennis Drazin, the president of Darby Development, which manages Monmouth Park. "We've been a leader in sports betting, been a leader in many other areas, and we believe exchange wagering is huge for our future. We want the fan who wants to come in and have a different, fun experience. That's the goal here, to try to offer our consumers other opportunities besides the traditional pari-mutuel bet. This is entertainment."

Betfair customers elsewhere in the world are charged a commission ranging from two to five per cent on winning bets. New Jersey customers will be charged 12 per cent. The higher rate is needed so that Betfair can give a reasonable amount of money back to the tracks, something it is not required to do in the U.K.

"I think we struck the right balance," Betfair U.S. CEO Kip Levin said of the 12 per cent take and the need to compensate the tracks.

Betfair's focus is primarily on Monmouth, but it is also eager to break into the standardbred market. New Jersey customers are not limited to making exchange bets on New Jersey tracks; they can bet on any track that has an agreement with Betfair. Levin said he is working with numerous tracks and said it is likely Betfair will take betting on, among others, races from Mohawk and Woodbine. He said no agreement had been reached yet with Freehold.

When it comes to exchange wagering on harness racing the problem could be the amount of liquidity in the pools. Overseas customers, the bulk of which are in the U.K., have been betting on U.S. thoroughbred races through Betfair for years and are comfortable with the runners. With the U.K. money, the pools for U.S. thoroughbred races can sometimes top the \$100,000 mark. But Betfair has yet to offer any betting on North American harness racing and it's possible its U.K. base will show little interest in wagering on a sport that they have no familiarity with. If that turns out to be the case, the Betfair harness racing pools could be quite small, which would be a turnoff to bettors.

Exchange customers will also be able to place bets "in running," a concept pioneered by Betfair. During in-running wagering, betting does not close until the horses have crossed the wire, giving customers a chance to bet on horses that appear to be in a position to win or bet against horses that seem to be struggling.

"If you can play while a race is going on your attention is much more focused on what's going on during the race," Drazin said. "With the typical player, you make a bet, it's over. If doing the in-play, there's excitement the whole way. I think people will be motivated to try this."

The prevailing sentiment is that harness races will lend themselves to in-running wagering better than thoroughbred races because they generally last longer.

Gural said he was confident his issues with Betfair and 4njbets could be resolved but he would not predict when. He also wouldn't venture a guess as to how successful exchange wagering on harness racing might prove to be.

"I have no idea," he said when asked his expectations for exchange wagering. "I asked that question to the people from Betfair when I met with them a week or two ago. I asked what their expectations were and they said 'we don't know.' If they don't know I certainly don't know. It appears to

be successful in England and other places and I think harness racing lends itself better to the in-race wagering than thoroughbred racing does.”

Gural clearly wants to get a bigger cut from bets made inside his building on 4nbets.com than ones made elsewhere. That appears to be an obstacle to getting exchange wagering up and running at the Meadowlands.

“People come here and bet on 4nbets on their phone or iPad and they’re sitting inside the Meadowlands,” he said. “Everybody agrees that that should be treated as an on-track wager and our cut should be higher because of that. They can’t seem to be able to come up with the technology to see whether or not the bet was made from within the Meadowlands. I’m tired of that excuse. It’s unfair.”

Much accomplished, more to come

Scott Zeron leads the Meadowlands driver standings, but truly craves Grand Circuit success.

Scott Zeron has packed an awful lot into his 26 years. And if you ask him, there's still plenty left to do.

New York/New Jersey racing fans may only know Zeron from the last three years as a regular driver at both Yonkers and the Meadowlands, but a look at the back of his baseball card might make one wonder why he left his native Ontario.

For two years in a row (2010-11), Zeron led all Canadian drivers in wins, tallying 1,145 winner's circle visits over that span while driving at some of the smaller Ontario tracks. A year later, he was named the sport's Rising Star Award winner before becoming the leading driver on the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) circuit in 2013.

Zeron's hunger for more success is what brought him to the United States.

"In 2012, I had \$8.8 million in earnings," said Zeron. "The next year, I felt like I had, if not an equal year, at least a year close to the year before, and I made \$5.5 million. I felt the decline (in Ontario). (If you are in the New York/New Jersey area) you push yourself. You can make \$20 million, like Tetrick did (actually \$19.7 million, in 2008). It's unlimited down here. I wanted to at least try it."

Zeron currently sits atop the driver standings at the Meadowlands with 60 wins. And has no intention of giving up his lead on the field. "No, I'm not really surprised," said Zeron of his Big M success. "It's been really good. It's my third meeting at the Meadowlands and it gets better each and every year. Obviously, (my success) might be inflated a little bit when you consider all of the guys (Tim Tetrick, Yannick Gingras, etc.) are over at the Levy (at Yonkers on Saturday nights), but things are picking up, I'm driving for good

people.”

Zeron drives at both the Meadowlands and Yonkers consistently. He’s at the Big M on Friday and Saturday nights. He’s at Yonkers on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. He is one of the few who can speak to the differences in racing between the two tracks.

“At the Meadowlands, there are a lot of surprises leaving the gate,” said Zeron. “You can’t really anticipate too much of how some people are going to drive. At Yonkers, I want to say you look at the program and you know how things are going to unfold, so not too many surprises at Yonkers. At the Meadowlands, you have to be ready for the audibles.”

Zeron had some interesting thoughts as to how he views the drivers – and how he goes about his craft – at the two tracks. For the time being, with the Levy and Matchmaker Blue Chip Series sitting atop the marquee every weekend, the driver colony at Yonkers is clearly tops in the game.

“Any time you drive against the top guys (at Yonkers), I feel like some people have predictability. I feel like there’s always an overwhelming favorite,” said Zeron. “And where there is something like that on a half-mile track, that kind of horse gets a lot of respect and people line up to a horse like that. At the Meadowlands, that horse might have to make two or three moves to get to the front by the half.

“It’s easier to drive against the best drivers, because when they move first up, they advance. They go forward. They know how to get speed out of a horse. When some guys that are coming from other tracks drive, they get anxious. They make quick moves. They are maybe not as patient.”

The purse structure at Yonkers is stronger than the one at the Meadowlands. Casino gaming revenues have seen to that. But does racing for a higher purse mean as much to others who follow the game?

“You could win four races at Yonkers and nobody will message you to congratulate you on your night,” said Zeron. “But you win two maidens at the Meadowlands and people will say, ‘Wow, things are really going well for you at the Meadowlands, we’ve been watching.’ Everybody watches the Meadowlands, that’s the thing.

“Purses don’t make better racing. The Meadowlands, it is so iconic, it would take a lot of years for the racing to be polluted there to say that it’s not glorious to win a race there. It’s really tough to win there, even though the Meadowlands hasn’t been going with great racing. There are \$7,500 claimers. They’re doing what they can to fill the box. They have non-winners of \$3,500 in their last five starts. But it’s

tough – \$7,500 claimers can go 1:51. Those kinds of things are unheard of.”

Zeron takes a practical approach to where he races, and knows where one races and why is a personal decision.

“To me, business is business, you hate to tell the actual truth, but you have to race where you can make money,” said Zeron. “I don’t blame anybody if they don’t race their horses at the Meadowlands. You have to race where owners will keep horses in your barn. A lot of people are opposed to racing at the Meadowlands. Not just because of the purses but because they have to race the race of their lives to win. You could go someplace else, draw well, go four seconds slower and win, and preserve your horse for weeks to come. I support the Meadowlands and I could be racing full-time at Yonkers, but for my clientele, I wait for the spring meet at the Meadowlands.”

Zeron has the pedigree to be a great harness driver. His father, Rick, was the dominant driving force at Hippodrome Blue Bonnets in the 1980s before becoming a perennial presence on the leading drivers and trainers lists on the WEG circuit for the last two decades. He also had some good fatherly advice when Scott wanted to leave the smaller tracks for Woodbine and Mohawk.

"My dad told me, 'Make sure you are ready to do it.' I think I waited until I was 22 before I went to WEG," said Zeron. "I only started watching racing when I was 12 years old. I loved watching my dad win, but I didn't train my first horse until I was 16. My family never pushed me to go into the business. They pushed me to go to college, just in case. I was prepared for anything. I went to college for accounting. That was the fallback."

Racing at Yonkers? All good. The Meadowlands? All good. Zeron's doing well at those venues. But Grand Circuit success is what he craves. And he's tasted some success already.

In 2012, he won a race that every horseman dreams of winning.

"It was a thrill to win the Little Brown Jug," said Zeron of the stake he won with Michaels Power, becoming the youngest driver ever, at 21, to win it. "It wasn't like I tried 20 times and finally won it. It was the first time I drove in it, so I was ignorant to the significance of it, which was probably the best thing for me."

With the casino issue to be decided in November, Zeron, fueled by his accounting expertise, thinks that even if the voters say 'yes' to casino gaming in Northern New Jersey, it's no slam dunk for racing's life line. "Kudos to Joe Faraldo on getting his horsemen 10 per cent in New York," said Zeron. "That's a huge deal. Getting contracts with a duration of 10 years. Those are huge numbers for horsemen. The way it looks like it's written now in New Jersey, a casino means two per cent for horsemen. Does that change the game? Absolutely not. We have to advocate for a higher percentage. I highly doubt we can get up to 10 per cent, but if we can get anywhere near eight per cent, that would be the difference. That would bring the Meadowlands back to \$50,000 purses for the open class. Sustainability and a high percentage. That's the positive outlook. No casino? I don't even want to talk about no casino."

Zeron likes where he's at. And knows where he wants to go. "I want to be that Grand Circuit driver," said Zeron. "People ask me, 'Why don't you drive at Yonkers full time?' And I say, 'Because it takes you away from being a Grand Circuit driver.' Not to take anything away from Yonkers, but I like changing things. If I were to race at the same track five days a week, it would almost feel like a desk job. But to race different tracks every day and to get a new batch of two-year-olds in every year and to develop horses, it feels like you accomplish something. That is what makes it a great game for me. It's when somebody puts their horse in a million-dollar race and says, 'I want Scott Zeron to drive my horse.'"

Big weekend on tap from the Levy to Always B Miki and the Queen Bee

Always B Miki makes his much-anticipated debut at the Meadowlands Saturday in the \$25,000 open handicapping after a four-for-four four-year-old season and a bruising Breeders Crown score.

Bee A Magician is on the Meadowlands card Friday with the horse to beat the only other mare in the race – Shake It Cerry. If the latter wins, it will be the first time two females will have appeared in the same race with earnings exceeding \$2.5 million.

Brian Sears handles the \$3.7 million earner Bee A Magician the 17-for-17 Horse Of The Year in 2013. Sears is the only driver in the sport's history to have had two different undefeated Horses Of The Year. He also drove Muscle Hill, who was 12-for-12 in 2009. He's also driven Rocknroll Hanover, the 2005 HOY. No driver in history has piloted three Horses of the Year and not been elected to the Hall of Fame.

With Wiggle It Jiggleit going in the consolation for the Levy, that means that two former Horses of the Year are in action in the same calendar year. Bunny Lake (2001) and Gallo Blue Chip (2000) did it for three straight years in 2002-2004.

A little Levy-ty

Looking back on the George Morton Levy in honor of Saturday's final:

1978 – In the Levy kickoff, Sirota Anderson won it for Stormin' Norman Dauplaise.

1985 – On The Road Again takes the Levy in year eight en route to a near \$3 million career.

1995 – Riyadh wins the Levy on the fast track to a sterling \$2.7 million career.

The Down Under Factor. Yonkers has 24 horses on its Saturday night card bred Down Under, three are in the Levy final. Bit Of A Legend N post 2, Texas Terror N has post four and Texican N had post six. No Down Under horse has won this final, and if they do it this year, they will have selected the right year. The final goes for an all-time best \$609,000.

Bit Of A Legend N, now seven, is attempting to sweep the series coming in off the dead heat score with Wiggle It Jiggleit. It counts as a win, though, just like it did for Cam Fella in 1983 when he won his final 28 career starts, and yes, one of them was a dead heat. It was June 23, 1983 against 83-1 Walt Hanover and the time of 1:53.1 stood as Cam Fella's career best.

Wiggle It Jiggleit is one of just two horses in history who have made \$2 million in a single season without winning a million-dollar race. The other was Rock N Roll Heaven in 2010, who missed the board in the North America Cup and was just edged out in the \$1 million Meadowlands Pace, yet still banked \$2.156 million.

Wiggle It Jiggleit has four sub-1:50 miles on the half – none of the Levy legs, or any mile in Yonkers history has gone in faster than 1:50.

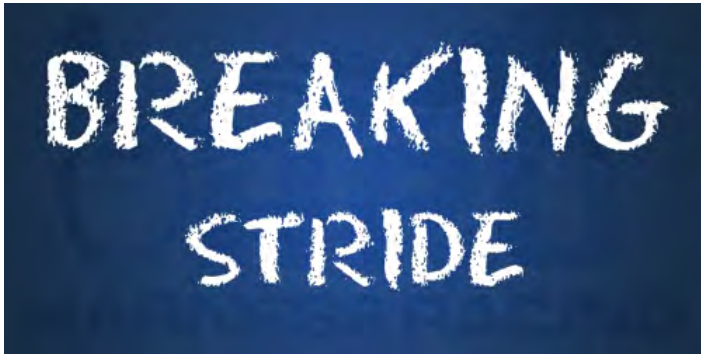
Three trainers in the Levy have two horses entered – Ron Burke, Jeffrey Bamond and Peter Tritton – while Team Bamond also has a pair in the Matchmaker. Burke will have an entry of All Bets Off and Take It Back Terry. Burke won this final back to back in 2009 and 2010 with Foiled Again at age five and six.

She needs to increase her racing stock and add an owner, which is where my pacing gelding and I entered the scene.

When Helen saw me roll up to her barn in a 12-year old car with the front bumper fastened with duct tape, I doubt if she saw the answer to her prayers. However, I was alive and brought along a feasible young racehorse.

Last week, in spite of the fact that I am always fiscally challenged, I just could not pass up purchasing Not So Great Expectations, a 3YO NW1, for a thousand bucks. The horse fell into my lap from an acquaintance named Slick Davis, a fellow with several bad habits that led him to money problems so dire that he makes me look like Warren Buffett.

I needed a trainer. Helen needed an owner. Negotiations began.

Helen took the stance that, "I could not train and race a goldfish for that kind of money."

I countered with, "That's all I can afford, at the moment. I barely have enough disposable income to buy my daily lottery ticket."

Helen asked, "I'm not sure you should own a racehorse."

"I'm sure that I shouldn't. Owning one is sort of therapy. I need a break from losing money betting on horses. One more thing Helen, no vets or vet bills within one hundred yards of this horse, even if it takes a restraining order."

Desperation makes strange bedfellows. Helen took over



Expectations and guided him in his first three starts which were, oddly enough, all sixth-place finishes. Sixth place is not fun; it is like driving to the beach on a sunny morning and discovering they ran out of sand and ocean.

Still, Helen proved to be very nice, very organized, and keeps my spirits up after each race with helpful insights like, "Expectations is starting to grow up," "He's learning some valuable lessons" and "He might just have a bit of a cold."

Finally, on his fourth start, Not So Great Expectations lumbered home for a third-place finish. I was so happy that I offered to spring for a celebratory pizza. Helen mentioned that she had a menu with the telephone number of The Pie is the Limit Pizza Emporium on the front seat of her truck. I scurried out to retrieve the menu and stumbled across a troubling sheet of paper attached to a clipboard on the floor of the truck.

Classy Lane fire fund concludes with over \$710,000 raised and distributed

After receiving 1,950 donations totaling over \$710,000 (Cdn) to aid those impacted by the Jan. 4 barn fire at Classy Lane Stables in Puslinch, ON, the Central Ontario Standardbred Association (COSA) has concluded its GoFundMe campaign.

COSA president Bill O'Donnell said he has been overwhelmed by the generosity and can't begin to properly thank everyone who donated to the fund.

"The whole thing has been astonishing," O'Donnell said. "In the beginning, when we first put it up, we were hoping to get \$80,000 and set \$100,000 as a goal hoping just to help people replace equipment. It hit \$112,000 in about 10 hours. It was wild."

Trainers Ben Wallace, Roger Mayotte, Chantal Mitchell, Kris Di Cenzo, Dan Lagace and Floyd Amos lost virtually every horse they train and most of their equipment in the blaze, throwing them and their staff out of work.

COSA's GoFundMe campaign was so successful O'Donnell said every person connected to the tragedy that gutted Barn 1 and killed all 43 horses received financial reimbursement thanks to the generosity of people from around the world, but particularly the horse racing community far and wide.

"I was flabbergasted how many people came to everybody's rescue," O'Donnell said, adding there were a number of heartwarming donations. "We had a group of preschoolers in Belleville, from Little Rascals Child Care, who sent in a check with a note that said, 'our children have been doing fundraisers, bake sales, pizza and workshop sale items to give donations to an organization of their choice. When they read and talked about the fire it was a unanimous decision.'"

Wallace, who lost all 17 horses he had in Barn 1 at Classy Lane, said he and all those affected are tremendously grateful to everyone who donated to help them and to COSA for organizing the fundraiser.

"Not one of my caretakers — or anybody's caretaker, for that matter — was financially challenged due to the fire. They got paid right through," Wallace said. "There isn't one caretaker that could say that they were left out of the mix. I feel very, very good about that."

COSA established a seven-member committee to decide how best to allocate the money. Joining O'Donnell on the

committee was Woodbine Entertainment Group executive vice-president Jamie Martin, Clinton Raceway general manager Ian Fleming, Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association president Sue Leslie, Karen Breen owner of Tackmaster and horsemen Jim Wellwood and Dave Drew. Breen was on a committee that helped determine how best to allocate money after a fire in 1992 at Mohawk that killed 69 horses and destroyed Barn 3. Leslie sat on a similar committee after a fire in 2002 at Woodbine that killed 31 thoroughbreds.

"The group was more than helpful with their guidance about how to distribute the money in a fair way," O'Donnell said, adding, "the committee recommended that we start by getting professional appraisals" O'Donnell contacted Bob Boni, David Reid and Brian Webster about the value of the horses lost at Classy Lane.

"You couldn't get three better guys to do it," O'Donnell said. "We took the three appraisals, added them all up and divided by three to get an average per horse."

The owners of the three ponies killed in the blaze were compensated, as were the owners of the 35 standardbreds that were not insured.

"The money is all gone. It's been distributed between grooms, trainers and owners," O'Donnell said, "with the exception of the funds that will be collected next year from the stallion auction that raised approximately \$75,000 on live foals."

O'Donnell gave thanks to the media for covering the story and made special mention of Standardbred Canada for keeping the GoFundMe campaign near the top of its website news items for weeks.

"They did a great job of leaving that story up at the top. It could have slid down to the bottom of the page and people would never have seen it," O'Donnell said.

Superstar broodmare Hattie dies

Hattie, one of the greatest producers in the history of the breed, died Wednesday (April 20) at Hanover Shoe Farms. The daughter of Abercrombie and the Albatross mare Albaquel was 24 years old. She was a terrific race filly that took a two-year-old record of 1:55.3 and earned \$266,323, when both those achievements were relatively exceptional. She was bred and trained by Doug Ackerman.

Ironically, she was scheduled to be retired after her 2016 foaling.

She delivered a healthy Bettors Delight colt the day before she died, seemingly without complication. Unfortunately, she hemorrhaged a day later and died.

Hattie left a huge legacy. From 14 living foals older than two, she is the dam of four in 1:50, 11 in 1:55, one \$2 million dollar winner, two million-dollar winners and four \$500,000 plus winners. All 14 of her living foals raced, took records and earned money.

The best known of her foals are Meadowlands Pace winner Holborn Hanover p,2,1:58, 3,1:49, 1:46.4(\$2,070,648), Hyperion Hanover p,3,1:52f, 1:49.1(\$1,187,755), Hillbilly Hanover p,2,1:52.2f, 3,1:50.1f and Haverford Hanover p,2,2:01.1, 3,1:53.2, 1:49(\$510,295).

Hattie was laid to rest at the Hanover Shoe Farms equine cemetery, where the ashes of her most notable son Holborn Hanover lay.

Freaky Feet Pete makes '16 debut Saturday at Hoosier

Freaky Feet Pete, the winner of the 2015 Breeders Crown final for three-year-old pacing colts, will make his much anticipated seasonal debut Saturday (April 23) at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

The four-year-old son of Rockin Image—Skyway Lori will look to tackle five other rivals in the featured event of the evening, a \$21,000 Invitational Pace, and has been installed as the 2-5 morning line favorite in the evening's 11th race. Trained by Larry Rheinheimer, Freaky Feet Pete will be driven by his regular pilot, Trace Tetrick.

A winner of over \$1.1 million in lifetime earnings and the architect of a storybook three-year-old campaign, Freaky Feet Pete has had two qualifying outings at Hoosier Park in 2016. In his first qualifier, Freaky Feet Pete cruised through

fractions of :27.2, :56.1 and 1:24.3 before kicking home in :27.4 to win by nine and a quarter lengths in 1:52.2 in less than favorable weather conditions. His second qualifier came last weekend at Hoosier Park where he finished 13 lengths in front of his next closest competitor and stopped the timer in 1:51.4.

"He was very strong," Tetrick said after his qualifier. "I think he's grown up some, he is definitely ready to get back to work; he loves his job and seems as strong as ever."

Rich Pocono stakes set to debut

The inaugural edition of a pair of important stakes events for Pennsylvania-sired three-year-old pacers — purses of \$800,000-added combined — will take place on April 30 (eliminations) and Kentucky Derby Day May 7 (finals) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono when the \$500,000A Pennsylvania Classic Pace for males and its companion \$300,000A Miss Pennsylvania Pace go to post.

A restructuring of the funding added by the introduction of money from slot and table gaming in Pennsylvania, totaling some \$1.6 million, helped bring about this instant early-season classic. Half of that total went towards beefing up purses for the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championships, which at \$350,000 are the richest in North America, and their consolations, and half the money was devoted to staging these showcase events for the best of the state's produce, an early-season barometer of the horses to beat during 2016's summer season.

Both of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champions in these divisions at two, Ideal Jimmy among the colts and national champion filly Pure Country (also voted Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Horse of the Year by the local chapter of the U.S. Harness Writers Association), are in line to make their 2016 seasonal debuts in the elimination races, which will be drawn on Monday (the top nine in the elims will come back to race in their open-draw championships). Here's a look at some of the major contenders in both races:

Pennsylvania Classic

- Ideal Jimmy, from the barn of Erv Miller, won five of 10 starts as a freshman, taking a mark of 1:51f, and earned the bulk of his \$293G bankroll in capturing his Sire Stakes Championship.
- Check Six comes to the PA Classic elims off a qualifying victory at The Meadowlands last Saturday in a withering

1:52, his own last quarter in :26.2.

- JJ Flynn, a colt under the tutelage of trainer Chris Ryder, has an advantage that the first two horses mentioned don't – he has raced three times this year, winning twice, fastest in 1:51.3 this past Tuesday, and in his second-place finish he was beaten a head while race-timed in 1:50.2.

Miss Pennsylvania

- Pure Country was pure perfection in her two-year-old form for Jimmy Takter, winning all 10 of her starts, including the Breeders Crown, and bankrolling just shy of \$690,000. She swept all four legs of her Sire Stakes races and the Championship, earning the most money ever in a single Sire Stakes campaign by any one horse, \$286,918. At press time Takter planned to qualify her again at The Meadowlands on Saturday, and then come to Pocono if his filly comes out of the race properly.
- Ava N Ella was unraced at two, then won her first two starts at The Meadows for locally-based trainer Linda Schadel. After those victories, she was sold to the famous Bellino family interests, and for new trainer Tony O'Sullivan she has added two more, and comes off a sharp qualifying win at Pocono last week.
- Call Me Queen Be, a winner of over \$278G at two, was second to Pure Country in both the Sire Stakes Championship and divisional Sires money earned (over \$177,000). She won a qualifier in her return at Pompano Park, and she's in to qualify at The Meadowlands Saturday – where she can look to her left from PP8 and see arch-nemesis Pure Country right next to her.

Both the Pennsylvania Classic and Miss Pennsylvania will be raced during the latter portion of a "brunch-evening" doubleheader of action on Derby Day at The Downs, with the first card starting at 11 a.m. and ending in time to give a break until the Run For The Roses. The evening portion of the day's harness racing will start immediately after the Bluegrass clash, with the Pennsylvania Classic and Miss Pennsylvania joined on the second card by the \$50,000 Van Rose Invitational Pace, honoring the memory of the longtime area standardbred journalist.

The Chuck Connor Stable at Goshen (NY) Historic Track is conditioning nineteen-year-old goodwill ambassador Sweet Karen when they can keep the staff of the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame from doing the work for them. She will be featured on June 5 at the foundation's 40th Anniversary Brunch.

This year, four Trottingbreds have been shipped to Delaware. CD's Miss M is with Bobby Clark Stable; Ima's Hit is with the George Teague Stable; Royal Attire returns to the Eddie Dennis Stable; and the Andrew Stafford Stable is again putting LR Trixie through her paces.

In New Jersey, the Chris Ryder Stable is prepping I Want Another as he starts his second year with HHYF, while newcomer Sonny is being readied in Springfield, IL by the Nick Giberson (and family) stable. The Gibersons won the HHYF Service To Youth Award in 2014 for their work with Sweet Karen.

"Just like racehorse, our horses can't just show up at camps and be expected to work," said HHYF executive director Ellen Taylor. "They need to be legged up, to be in condition. We could not possibly do the outreach we do without the voluntary work of our trainers each year. We are especially appreciative of Brittany Farms for annually providing an off-season home for our Trottingbreds."

The trainers will work with the horses for about two months before the HHYF camp season begins at the home of the Little Brown Jug, the Delaware County Fair from June 18-22. From there the HHYF move on to North Carolina, Maryland, New York and New Jersey before returning to Ohio for programs at Scioto Downs and the Van Wert Fairgrounds in August.
