Keystone Velocity takes \$529,000 Levy final

Mackenzie A wins the \$310,600 Matchmaker companion race in career best 1:53.1

Dan Dube drove Keystone Velocity to a 1:51.2 victory in the \$529,000 final of the 30th edition of the George Morton Levy at Yonkers.

Keystone Velocity (Dan Dube, \$24.80) was hard-used early and hard-headed late Saturday night (April 22), winning Yonkers Raceway's \$529,000 final of the George Morton Levy Memorial Pacing Series.

The sport's richest race of the season to date again honored the memory of the Hall of Fame founder of Roosevelt Raceway.


At the outset of the 30th Levy, pole-sitting McWicked (Matt Kakaley) was — not surprisingly — put into play. He was joined by Keystone Velocity, who from post four, forged to the lead just after a spiffy :26.1, opening quarter-mile.

Somewhere in L A (Jason Bartlett), leaving right outside of Keystone Velocity, was caught three-wide and forced to wrangle back to fourth.

McWicked, who had retaken the lead in the second turn, found a :54.4 intermission before longshot Blood Brother

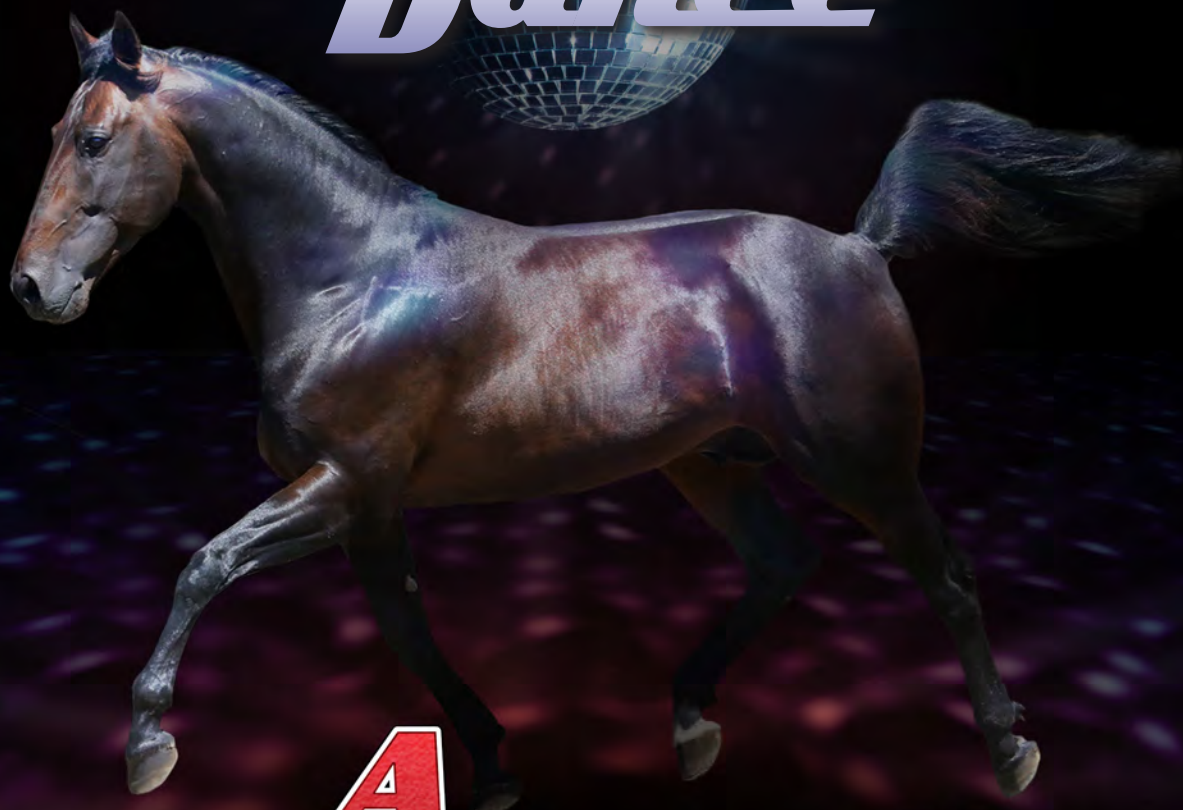

(Brian Sears) moved from third. He uncoupled stablemate Somewhere in L A latched from second-over, with even-money choice Missile J (Tim Tetrick) and last season's champion, Bit Of A Legend N (Jordan Stratton), at the back of that train.

McWicked maintained his advantage through a 1:22.3 intermission three-quarters (:27.4 third station), taking a tenuous lead into the lane.

However, his night was about to come to an unsatisfying conclusion. McWicked was done early off the final turn, but not before taking Keystone Velocity to the promised land of the passing lane. It was Keystone Velocity fighting off the

race's other tough mile, beating Somewhere in L A by a head in 1:51.2.

Missile J settled for third, beaten a length, with a very-wide Bit Of A Legend N fourth and 107-1 proposition Soto (Brett Miller) grabbing the final pay envelope. .

Blood Brother, Pcovocativeprincen (Yannick Gingras) and McWicked completed the order.

For Keystone Velocity, a 9-year-old son of Western Hanover—Venus Killeen co-owned (as Allard Racing) by trainer Rene Allard, Kapildeo Singh, Earl Hill Jr and VIP Internet Stable, it was his third win (as the fifth choice) in seven seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$135.50, the triple returned \$593 and the superfecta paid \$2,406.

"Rene (Allard) and I talked before the race and we decided we had to leave the gate," Dube said. "I was just hoping Matt (Kakaley, with McWicked) could get me to the lane. My horse felt very strong, but I did see the other one (Somewhere in L A) coming."

The driver/trainer combination was this race two seasons ago with Domethatagain, also with a two-hole trip.

A \$100,000 series consolation was won by Clear Vision (Miller, \$8.40) in 1:51.3.

Matchmaker to Mackenzie A

Good thing Mackenzie A (Jordan Stratton, \$12.80) held up her end of the bargain Saturday night (Apr. 22), winning

Sitting chilly from post four, Mackenzie A watched as Lispatty (Brian Sears) left hard from the pylons, with Shesjustadelight N (Ron Cushing) second and 9-10 choice Mach it a Par (Jason Bartlett) third... all three away in post position order.

Meanwhile, Regil Elektra (Yannick Gingras) and Bedroomconfessions (Scott Zeron) tried to leave, only to get parked for their troubles (the latter badly compromised by the former).

It was Lispatty leading at the :26.4 opening quarter-mile before Mach It A Par moved to take the baton approaching the :55.1 intermission. Down the backside, Shesjustadelight N took out of third, with Mackenzie A third and Medusa (Matt Kakaley) staying in.

Mach it a Par was seemingly in control in and out of a 1:23.4 three-quarters, with the uncovered rival pacing in place, forcing Mackenzie A wide.

It was Mach it a Par owning a length-and-half lead into the lane, but company was coming. Mackenzie A blew on by, widening to win the ninth Matchmaker by two-and-three-quarter lengths in a life-best 1:53.1. Medusa, who had left the cones, failed to match strides with the winner, but was a rallying second, with 81-1 rank outsider Diva's Image (Joe Bongiorno) a closing third.

That one found her way into the final after original

eight-holer Empress Deo came up ill. Mach It A Par faded to fourth, with Shesjustadelight N fifth and Lispatty, Regil Elektra and Bedroomconfessions bringing up the rear.

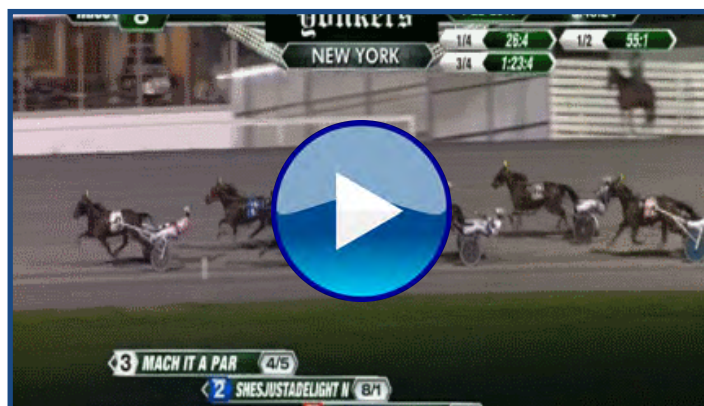
For co-second choice Mackenzie A, a 5-year-old Down Under daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven—Kept For Pleasure co-owned by the nonagenarian Harry von Knoblauch (a fine TV interview) and his daughter, Ellen Kinser, and trained by Peter Tritton, it was her second win in eight seasonal starts. The exacta paid \$167, the triple returned \$6,251 the superfecta paid \$19,960 (base \$2 payout).

"I thought I have to race her from off the pace," Stratton said. "The trip worked out perfect for us. I knew there were horses behind and I wanted to move."

Stratton won the inaugural edition of the race in 2009 with Panceleefandarpels.

A \$75,000 series consolation was won by Hidden Land (Bartlett, \$9.50) in 1:54.1.

Enterprise gets Hambletonian buzz with big Big M win

Friday night's fourth race at The Meadowlands looked like an interesting race on paper, with seemingly three strong contenders in the conditioned trot for 3 to 5-year-olds non-winners of 2/3 lifetime. The Burke Brigade was sending out Southwind Cobra – who took a mark of 1:53.3 in the International Stallion Stakes at Red Mile as a freshman in 2016. The son of Muscle Hill out of the Broadway Hall mare Caerphilly earned back all but \$17,000 of his \$120,000 purchase price as a rookie trotter and he produced a final quarter of :27.2 in his 1:57 qualifying win on April 15.

Top Flight Angel, from the first crop of Archangel, out of the SJs Photo mare Top Photo, took his only two wins of his rookie campaign at the end of the season, finishing off his rookie campaign with victories in the Excel A at Batavia and the New York Sires Stakes Consolation at Batavia. His 1:56.2 qualifying win at the Meadowlands on April 15 signalled he was ready to start his sophomore season.

Neither of these promising colts were favored, however, and it was a colt making only his second start that took went off as a slight 6-5 favorite to Southwind Cobra's 8-5 odds, and this colt, Enterprise, caused a buzz on social media with his 3-year-old debut performance in this race. Enterprise was initially bought for \$100,000 at the Lexington Select sale, but he was bought privately by current owners Courant Inc. of Florida in January off his lone win in December at Harrah's Philly – a nine-and-a-half-length score in 1:58.1.

In Friday night's race, after blasting to the front early, Enterprise was overtaken just past the :28.3 first quarter by Southwind Cobra. Within a few strides of relinquishing

command, it appeared that Enterprise was getting doubled up in the pocket, so driver Tim Tetrick re-took the lead the guided Enterprise through a :57.3 half and 1:26.2 three-quarters. With Top Flight Angel attempting a first-over challenge and Southwind Cobra gapping the pocket, Enterprise easily maintained a two-and-a-quarter length advantage to the wire, trotting the fastest quarter (:28) of the race with Tetrick never lifting his whip off his right shoulder.

Enterprise – by Chapter Seven out of the SJs Caviar mare Shes Gone Again – reached the wire in 1:54.2 which is a national season's mark for 3-year-old trotters and he started the social media population buzzing to the point where some were predicting he would win the Hambletonian after having won only two races from two starts.

While Walner and others are sure to have something to say about that, the buzz surrounding this promising colt seems deserved based on the manner in which he won Friday night and the obvious upside he has, being so lightly-raced. Keep your eye on Enterprise!

Jamie Macomber on the move

After 10 years managing Ron Burke's Indiana stable, Jamie Macomber has struck out on her own with her husband, Ricky.

As a child, Jamie Macomber had no interest in pursuing a career in harness racing. While some dreamed of growing up to be trainers or drivers, she dreamed of a corner office in a big high rise somewhere. The middle child of Ohio-based trainer Tim Rucker and his wife, Debbie, now finds herself at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino with a barn of 29 racehorses with more to follow. In her first season operating a public stable with her husband, Ricky, Macomber is loving the challenge of forging out on her own.

Many may know Macomber for her work with the Burke Stable's Indiana string. For 10 years she supervised Ron Burke's Hoosier Park and Indiana Downs stock, managing a barn of top-flight horses that included millionaire pacing mare Go On BB, Rose Run Parker, Indiana Sires Stakes champion and Trotter of the Year in the state, and the much-heralded Hannelore Hanover, Indiana Sires Stakes champion before earning the Dan Patch Award as the sport's top older trotter last season. After a six-year absence, Burke

had to talk her into getting back in the barn. With a marketing degree from Ohio University, she had first worked at Indiana Downs before taking a role as outreach coordinator at the USTA. Her older sister, Kelly, and younger brother, Adam, always showed an interest in training horses. Macomber had other plans.

"I said from an early age I didn't want to do it," she explained of her career path. "I worked at the barn every summer. I enjoyed it, but when it was time for school, I was excited to go back."

Along the way, that corner office of her youth became a shed row full of pacers and trotters. It started with the invitation from Burke, whom she counted as a friend before he became her employer. She credits her parents with teaching horsemanship skills that she applies today, but under Burke's guidance she gained "priceless" experience with top open and stakes horses.

"When I came back I learned his way from the ground up," she said. "With Ronnie there's not much grey area; most things are black and white. I cannot tell you how much I learned."

During her time spearheading the Indiana extension of the Burke Brigade, the stable racked up training titles at Indiana

Downs and Hoosier Park, the latest coming last season at the Anderson track. From time to time, others would inquire if Macomber had entertained going out on her own. She was quick to shoot those conversations down. She loved her job, and she loved the horses with which she had been entrusted. Conversations two years ago, however, set events in motion that led to the new endeavor.

Trainer Wilbur Eash looked to slow down a bit. While he enjoyed developing young horses, the grind of travelling up and down the roads from northern Indiana in order to race were less appealing. He asked if the Macomers would be

interested in keeping the horses and racing them at Hoosier Park during the season. When the Hoosier Park meet concluded, Macomber took Eash's homebreds, Indiana Sires Stakes champion Bluehourpower and his sister, Sandysgoldenhour, to Pompano to race over the winter. They also picked up older trotting mare Wild Wanda, trained and co-owned in partnership by the late Larry Rheinheimer. The winter of 2015 was productive for Macomber as she sent out 23 winners in 78 starts. Upon returning to Hoosier Park in spring 2016, she kept Wild Wanda, campaigning her to a victory last fall in the \$50,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final and

over \$160,000 in earnings.

“Wanda was a huge stepping stone. She opened up a lot of doors for me,” the 37-year-old trainer offered. “You don’t get to start with open horses very often.”

As last season at Hoosier Park unfolded, Macomber began to entertain going out on her own. Eash was still interested in making a change. Being able to count on horses owned by Eash (Indy Lane Stable) and Z Tam Stable, and picking up another Indiana outfit, Eleven Star Stables, it was time to have the tough conversation with Burke, which she did in October. The talk was a friend-to-friend chat as much as it was an employer-employee exchange.

“He was very supportive. When I first told him he said, ‘We’ll talk about this later. You’re not going to charge enough to make it.’ It was a typical Type A response,” she said, laughing. “We reviewed the horses, the owners, everything. He wanted to make sure I was setting myself up for success. That’s exactly the way I took it and that’s how he meant it.”

Returning to Pompano for the winter, the pieces quickly came together in November and December. Macomber picked up horses over the winter while having another successful meet. Sending out 141 starters, the stable won 37 races and finished in the money 55 percent of the time. Now at Hoosier Park, Macomber’s stable is tied for second in the standings just a few weeks into the 2017 meet with seven wins and nearly \$65,000 in earnings through Friday, April 21. One of her early winners is the sophomore pacing colt Beckham’s Z Tam, a North America Cup hopeful that Eash developed. The son of Always A Virgin is two-for-two with a 1:52.1 clocking to his credit.

“Right now he’s doing it on his own,” she said. “Wilbur deserves all the credit for getting him to this point.”

The challenge of opening a public stable may be daunting on its own, but it’s made tougher with two small children at home. The Macomers have a four-year-old son, Nate, and two-year-old daughter, Aubrey. In the morning while Macomber is at the barn working with four grooms and an assistant trainer, Ricky gets up with the kids and gets them ready. In the evenings she stays at home and follows the program while Ricky catch drives and helps with the horses scheduled to race that night. If they have several racing, Macomber will be in the paddock, but her children won’t be far away.

“It’s a good thing I don’t like TV and I don’t need a ton of sleep,” Macomber said. “It also helps that I have an awesome

husband!”

Macomber was apprehensive to step out on her own. Now that she has left the Burke nest, she is spreading her wings and soaring. The trainer is quick to credit those that have placed their trust, and horses, in her hands. She’s a long way from that corner office she once dreamed about, but Macomber wouldn’t have it any other way.

“I hope they all know how appreciative I am,” she said. “I’m super excited!”

Does Richard Hans have another hybrid like Googoo Gaagaa?

He's bred his pacing stallion to a trotting mare and came up with a trotter named Ei Ei O.

The breeder, owner and trainer that bred a pacing stallion to a trotting mare and came up with one of the fastest trotters in recent times is at it again. Richard Hans, the Maryland horseman behind Googoo Gaagaa, who won 15 career starts, earned \$665,339 and set a lifetime mark of 1:50.4F as a 3-year-old in the 2012 Beal Memorial at Pocono, has a new hybrid horse he thinks might be just as good as his former star.

On Wednesday night (April 18) at Rosecroft, Hans' Ei Ei O won his second career start on the trot, defeating his overmatched rivals by 11-and-a-half lengths in 1:55. He went the final quarter in 28.1. Like Googoo Gaagaa, he is by the pacing stallion Cam's Rocket and is out of a trotting mare. His dam is My Baby Momma, a nine-year-old pacing mare who made \$50,761 on the track while winning six of 19 starts.

When asked if Ei Ei O could prove to be as good as Googoo Gaagaa, Hans, a man of few words, said: "He's good. I hope so. He did go in 1:55 in his second lifetime start."

Hans said Ei Ei O missed his two-year-old season after suffering a minor fracture to his left hind leg. He debuted April 5 at Rosecroft, winning a non-winners of two lifetime race worth \$4,500 by three-and-a-half lengths in 1:57.

Hans said the colt's next start will be in the April 29 Dexter Cup at Freehold. While top driver Corey Callahan eventually picked up the assignment on Googoo Gaagaa, Hans said he plans to stick with local Maryland driver Brian Burton. Ei Ei O is eligible for the Hambletonian.

"I like this horse," Hans said. "He's unbelievably gaited."

Googoo Gaagaa was conceived in 2008. The Hans family owns Cam's Rocket and was, more or less, the only ones breeding to him. They had a mare named Kora's Trotter, who, Hans said, was lame and skinny. She didn't get into foal that year to a trotting stallion, the name of which Hans has never disclosed. It was getting late in the breeding season and rather than let a year go to waste with Kora's Trotter, Hans decided to breed her to Cam's Rocket.

Despite Googoo Gaagaa's success, Cam's Rocket has never

caught on as a commercial stallion and few outside the Hans family breed to him. Having seen what Cam's Rocket achieved with Googoo, Hans doesn't seem to care what type of mare – totter or pacer – he breeds to him. Cam's Rocket has had 50 foals that have raced and nine of them are trotters.

When asked if Googoo's success is why he has repeatedly bred Cam's Rocket to trotting mares, Hans said: "I really don't know. I guess. Maybe it is in the back of my mind."

You can't argue with the results. The Cam's Rocket pacing-trotting cross has also yielded Speed It, who had won 18 of 24 lifetime and earned \$200,682 going into Friday night's second race at Yonkers. There's also Hybrid Henry, a winner of nine of 10. A regular on the Maryland circuit, his only loss came when he broke stride. Still another Cam's Rocket trotter, Rock The Game has won 12 of 34 starts and earned \$151,968.

"What I've noticed is that these (Cam's Rocket trotters) just look better than any other trotting colts out there," Hans said.

Perhaps Hans should only breed Cam's Rocket to trotting mares. The 41 pacers by the stallion that have raced are averaging \$60,883 in career earnings. The nine Cam's Rocket trotters to make it to the racetrack have average earnings of \$133,859. And with his 1:50.4F career best race, Googoo Gaagaa has a faster lifetime mark than any Cam's Rocket pacer. His fastest pacer is Rocket Rosy, whose lifetime mark is a full second slower at 1:51.4.

Cam's Rocket is so versatile that he was named both Maryland's leading pacing and trotting stallion in 2016.

Ei Ei O has a long way to go until he can be compared to Googoo Gaagaa or even be considered a top Hambletonian prospect. That doesn't mean it can't or won't happen. He certainly has potential.

It might seem strange to keep breeding a pacing stallion to cheap trotting mares, with all of the foals being converted to trotters and not pacers. But it's working, and that's all that matters.

The Kentucky breeders are passionate about a racing industry with fewer drugs and greater integrity.

Meadowlands, Tioga and Vernon Downs owner Jeff Gural has been an active supporter of the Water Hay Oats Alliance (WHOA) since 2012. Now noted Paris, KY standardbred breeders Steve and Cindy Stewart have joined the cause aiming for greater integrity via fewer drugs.

"We spend virtually every waking hour on the farm making sure the mares and foals we raise are as healthy as they can be and we want them to stay healthy, happy, and successful for the rest of their lives, on and off the track," the Stewarts said in a WHOA release. "Over the decades of working toward that goal, we've come to believe that horse racing needs fewer drugs, period. We applaud the efforts of WHOA to stop the administration of race-day drugs and hope its well-meaning efforts spread more quickly to the standardbred industry, which has suffered long enough from suspicions that not every race is run on the level."

WHOA ([link here](#)) is a grassroots movement of like-minded individuals who support the passage of federal legislation to prohibit the use of performance-enhancing drugs in the sport of horse racing. The appointment of an independent anti-doping program run by the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) will solve the problem of widespread drug use in American racing and put U.S. racing jurisdictions in step with international standards.

Founded in 2012, WHOA is a group of owners, breeders, trainers, jockeys, equine practitioners, industry professionals, handicappers and racing fans who stand against the permissive use of performance enhancing drugs in American horse racing.

Though most of WHOA's members are from the thoroughbred industry, the group currently has 30 standardbred members, including Gural and the Stewarts, and is hoping to add more.

Walner, Huntsville, Hannelore Hanover all in the spotlight

The big guns are beginning to show up at The Meadowlands for qualifiers and there were more than a few Grand Circuit stars of last year sprinkled throughout Saturday morning's (April 22) card. Under overcast skies at 54f with a slight headwind facing them in the stretch, things got underway right on time at 10 a.m.

Hambletonian winter book favorite **Walner** got things off to a grand beginning by looking good in a training mile around 2:00 before the races with his driver Tim Tetrick in the bike. He certainly is an imposing presence.

Last year's top pacing colt **Huntsville** (Tetrick) made his return to racing and was a workman like 1:53.2 / :26.3 winner from just off the pace in race 10. Tetrick held him in third through comfortable fractions, followed up when Brett Miller moved The Wall from the pocket to engage, then put away the leader and required minimal encouragement to edge by that willing rival late. Ray Schnittker trains Huntsville and owns the colt in partnership with Gewertz, Iannozzo and Arnold.

Hannelore Hanover (Gingras) looked as good as a horse can look for the second time this spring, trotting away from JL Cruze and Broadway Donna in a :27.1 final stanza on the end of a 1:54 flat mile in race six for older trotters. As fantastic as her 2016 season was, Hannelore may be even better this year.

She was also Ron Burke's fifth consecutive winner of the morning.

Sophomore trotting fillies opened the day with **Myammie Drama** (Tim Tetrick/Ron Burke) holding Princess Aurora (Yannick Gingras) at bay through a :27.4 end to a mile in 1:58.2 in the second race.

Several GC winners met in the third and **Sianna Hanover** (Gingras) was an easy front-end winner for Ron Burke's barn in 1:55.2 / :28, her second impressive effort of the spring. Amber Ella (John Campbell) another nice looking Chapter Seven from Linda Toscano's barn, was a comfortable second and Goldsmith Maid winner Magic Presto (Brian Sears) was a closing third after being reserved toward the rear for much of the race in her first appearance of the season.

Trotting colts came around in the fourth and last year's NJSS champ **What The Hill** (David Miller) scored a closing win in 1:55.3 / :28.3 in his second solid showing of the young season. Explosive Ridge (Marcus Johansson) went well,

cutting the mile before giving way to the winner just near the wire.

Both Sianna Hanover and What The Hill are owned by Burke Racing with partners Our Horse Cents and J&T Silva. Deo Volente joins the group on What The Hill.

After a training break, three-year-old filly pacers came on to the track and last year's Breeders Crown and Kindergarten final winner **Someomensomewhere** made her first appearance for new connections. Adam Bowden's Diamond Creek Farms and Bob Boni have possession and placed her in Jimmy Takter's barn. On this day, Someomensomewhere followed another Takter trainee, Somesleazetoplease (Brett Miller) around the racetrack to be second with something in reserve for Tim Tetrick in 1:54.4 / :27.1.

Last year's Dan Patch division winner **Idyllic Beach** (Gingras) and her Three Diamonds conqueror **That's The Ticket** (D. Miller) met in the eighth race. Both were reserved off the early pace and finished strong into a :27.4 final quarter with That's The Ticket getting a bit of a jump on her chief rival and prevailing in 1:54.4. Chris Ryder trains the winner.

Boogie Shuffle (Scott Zeron) was not a marquee name among pacing colts last season, but he was second in Downbytheseaside's world record equaling 1:49 at Red Mile and was stakes placed on several other occasions. He has returned well for trainer Mark Harder, cutting the 1:51.4 / :26.4 mile while drawing away from some pretty good colts.

Blood Line (Mark MacDonald) was a winner for the Takter stable closing stoutly into a :26.4 end to a 1:53.1 mile to nip Western Joe (Gingras) and Summer Side (Schnittker).

The day's fastest mile came when a really good bunch of four-year-old pacing horses gathered for race 11. **Lyon's Snyder** flashed his customary aggressive style and speed dragging Dave Miller to the front and setting lively fractions while being tracked by the undefeated scourge of the Maine state-bred program Seely Man (Brett Miller) and major stakes winner Western Fame (MacDonald). As they straightened up for home off the 1:22.2 three quarters, Boston Red Rocks (Tetrick) joined the fray from mid-pack and was charging the widest as Western Fame moved inside Lyons Snyder and that pair hit the wire together.

The four-year-old mares were the last to go with last season's bitter rivals **Pure Country** and **Darlinonthebeach** picking up just where they left off, right next to each other in posts five and six. On this occasion however, it was **Blue Moon Stride**, emerging from the considerable shadow of the

forementioned mares to cut the mile and hold that pair off in 1:51.4 / :26.4 for driver Andy McCarthy and trainer Mark Harder. Pure Country, Darlinonthebeach and Rock Me Baby followed her in.

With major Grand Circuit stakes such as the Cutler Memorial FFA trot and Graduate four-year-old pace now on the horizon the fun is just getting started.

McRaven wins Hackett final in fourth career start

McRaven, the hard-luck colt that was sidelined after just two starts — both Ohio Sires Stakes victories — as a 2-year-old, is back bigger and better than ever. The son of McArdle—Scooch captured the championship of the 46th annual edition of the James K. Hackett Memorial for Buckeye-bred sophomore pacers on Saturday (April 22) at Miami Valley Raceway, stopping the timer in 1:51.4 despite significant winds and chilly 48-degree temperatures.

Following a third-place finish in his initial 2017 outing, which was an elimination heat of the Hackett a week ago, trainer Brian Brown had McRaven primed for a big effort in his first major test of this season. Driver Ronnie Wrenn Jr. settled the winner third at the pylons well before the quarter-mile marker was reached and saved ground inside all the way to the head of the stretch before swinging three-wide for the stretch drive.

Despite drifting a couple lanes in the lane, McRaven paced four lengths faster than any of his rivals in the final furlong to edge Barley Up (Peter Wrenn, Ronnie's uncle) by a half-length in 1:51.4. Heracer (Josh Sutton) also finished strong to claim the show money. Pacesetter Major Nemesis (Tony Hall), who had established a local track record of 1:51.2 in his elimination, made an untimely break in midstretch after cutting fractions of :26.2, :55.1 and 1:23.2.

The Findlay, OH partnership of Country Club Acres Inc. and L & H Management Services own McRaven. His next start is expected to be in the first leg of the 2017 Ohio Sires Stakes series on Tuesday (May 2). If all goes well, he has an invitation to the new \$50,000 Scarlet and Gray Invitational for Ohio-sired 3-year-olds on Miami Valley's closing day program Monday (May 8).

Campbell receives Canadian colors

Brandon Campbell was presented with the official Canadian driving colors and helmet for the upcoming 2017 World Driving Championship (WDC) in the winner's circle at Fraser Downs on Friday (April 21). The 33-year-old Calgary resident will represent Canada in this year's WDC, presented by Standardbred Canada from August 12-18.

Dan Gall, president and CEO of Standardbred Canada, along with Donna Scrannage, president of Harness Racing BC, Carla Robin, executive director of Harness Racing B.C., and Darren MacDonald, director of racing for Great Canadian Gaming, made the presentation prior to the evening's first race.

Campbell is the first Western-based harness driver to represent Canada in the WDC and was named the Canadian rep after winning the National Driving Championship last October at The Raceway at the Western Fair District in London, ON.

The WDC will showcase drivers from 11 countries and consist of 22 races spanning five different racetracks in four provinces. Drivers will earn points based on their finishing position and the top point-earner will be declared the 2017 World Driving Champion and win \$25,000 in prize money.

"I've had a lot of thoughts about it, but I try not to think about it too much because I get pretty excited and worked up, and it's a long ways away yet," said Campbell, who has driven over 1,300 winners and horses to earnings in excess of \$8 million during his career, which started in 2003. "There's been a lot of thoughts and a lot of dreams as I go to bed at night. It's just a dream come true to do this and I'm just very excited."

The first leg will kick off at Century Downs on Saturday, Aug. 12. The drivers will then head to Ontario for the next two legs at Mohawk Racetrack in Campbellville on Aug. 14 and Georgian Downs in Innisfil on Aug. 15. The action then moves to Trois-Rivières, Que. on Aug. 16, where Hippodrome 3R will play host to the fourth leg before the drivers head to Prince Edward Island's Red Shores Racetrack and Casino at Charlottetown Driving Park for the fifth and final leg of the Championship on Aug. 18, one of the major highlights of Old Home Week.

"I think I've got a huge advantage," said Campbell of the 2017 WDC being contested on his home turf. "I've driven on all the tracks other than Quebec, and Quebec is built the same as CDP. Our racing style is different, our rules are different, everything's a little different. It's going to be a little bit to adjust to the way these guys drive, but like I said, I think I really do have a big advantage, and I'm going to take the red and the white all the way."

The WDC, along with the 25th anniversary edition of the World Trotting Conference, to be hosted in Charlottetown, are both held every two years and will coincide with the 250th Anniversary of horse racing in Canada, and Canada 150 celebrations.

Simard home for Hippodrome 3R meet

His nickname is 'The Black Cat' and many horse racing fans know him that way or as driver/trainer Richard Simard and he is ready for plenty of action this season as the Hippodrome 3R opens for live harness racing on Sunday.

Simard is a household name in Canadian harness racing. The native of Montreal has had a superb career in the industry. Currently he has 5,695 career wins and earnings as a driver with the horses he has driven at just over \$29 million.

And this season he is planning on being at the

Hippodrome 3R every live race day. Simard has been driving mainly at Rideau Carlton and a few winters at Pompano Park, but announced earlier he will be at H3R this year.

"It is a beautiful half mile track," Simard says. "It was on the old track in the '80s when I first started my career. I won my first race in 1982."

Already there is a demand at H3R for Simard's services as he has drives in eight of the nine races on today's (April 23) opening day program. One of Simard's drives, is with Joel's Legacy from post four in the fourth race. Simard also trains and owns the pacer.

Usually a "catch-driver", Simard has been training and owning horses off and on throughout his career. While his driving statistics are very impressive, he has only 77 career wins as a trainer.

"I remember once coming to H3R" in my younger days," Simard recalled. "It was with a really bad horse that kicked all the time. I can't remember its name but I knew he was no good. I remember the trainer was Denis Labelle and I trucked him, paddocked him and drove him. I started in first place and finished last, but made it home alive!" Simard said, laughing.

"Later on down the road I did have a lot of success at H3R driving for the Tourigny Stable," Simard said. "I think it will be very good to be back at Trois-Rivieres full time this season. I showed up some days last year, but I think with the support of some owners and trainers I will do well this summer."

Simard once said in an interview that his nickname 'The Black Cat' (Le Chat Noir in his birth province in Quebec) dates to when he would volunteer to drive ill-gaited or aggressive horses, and later, for his driving suit colors dominated by black.

Over the years, Simard has overcome some serious accidents on the racetrack and even a ruptured appendicitis and always makes a triumphant return to racing again. Perhaps he is very well-suited to the nickname 'The Black Cat.'

Grave concerns over change in stewardship of NYSS

As standardbred horsemen that participate in the New York Sire Stakes (NYSS) program we have very real reason for concern.

The Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund, which oversees monies used to administer the NYSS, is on the verge of replacing the Harness Horse Breeders of New York (HHBNYS) with the Albany based firm, Capitol Hill Management Services Inc. The President of Capitol Hill Management Services Inc. is John Graziano Jr., a politically appointed trustee on the New York Thoroughbred Breeding Development Fund as well as a registered lobbyist.

For the past 50 years, since 1967 and the inception of the New York Sire Stakes program, the HHBNYS have been the administrative arm of the program. Handling the processing of NYSS eligibility payments, eligibility lists, the residency mare program, stallion registry, breeders rewards program, mares bred reports, shipped semen records, NYSS points records and purse breakdowns. The HHBNYS also provides for representation at NYSS race draws and representation at most NYSS racing events, as well as management of an industry website which tracks daily changes in the points based system for all divisions of Sire Stakes, Excelsior and County Fair events. The HHBNYS provides this service with a staff headed by Betty Holt and two office employees. Their projected budget for 2017 was to be \$157,500.

Conversely, Capitol Hill Management Services Inc. has submitted a working budget of \$48,500 to administer this same program for 2017. With this bid, the New York Sire Stakes program will be one of 300 clients of this firm.

As horsemen that are invested and interested in the future welfare of the New York program, we have several grave concerns with the direction in which the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund is steering us.

Prior to this year, the bylaws governing the administration of the management and integrity of the NYSS program has always contained a "lobbying clause" in each and every



contract between the HHBNYS and the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding Development Fund.

Specifically:

1. Political Activity. Funds provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not be used for any partisan political activity, or for activities that may influence legislation or the election or defeat of any candidate for public office.

Based on Capitol Hill Management Services Inc. connection with political lobbying, we find it very curious that this language was removed from the contract this year. Further, we feel this proposed arrangement with Capitol Hill Management Services should not proceed until its officers and the officers of the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund explain, publicly under oath, why the so called "lobbying clause" in the agreement was deleted this year after being a part of the contract for so many previous years. Did Capitol Hill Management Services lobby for the change in the contract knowing that it would benefit from it? Did the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund members who approved the change receive some sort of benefit for deleting the clause? At a minimum the timing of the change in the proposed agreement and a lobbyist's push for the work, raise profound questions of ethics and propriety that must be answered for industry participants- owners, trainers, drivers, breeders, etc. – to have any measure of confidence that the proposed new agreement isn't some sort of "sweetheart" deal.

Another requirement clause in the contract calls for the successful bidder to have a minimum of two years of experience in the scope of work required. The successful bidder must have demonstrated knowledge of competitive equine racing programs that include point standings.

While John Graziano Jr. may have some knowledge of thoroughbred racing, we argue it doesn't make him necessarily experienced in tracking and administering a NYSS points-based system program that involves multiple categories of sex and gait. NY thoroughbred racing does not have a like format. In fact, no argument can be made that Capitol Hill Management Services has the requisite training under the rules. Nor has Capitol Hill Management Services publicly explained how it is going to do the same job or a better job of administering the program for one-third the cost, a difference that is so great as to raise questions about whether it is even possible for the scope of work to be performed at a level to which the industry has become accustomed. At a minimum, Capitol Hill Management Services should be required to publicly and precisely disclose how it intends to do the work. Which people, specifically, will be involved and what is their knowledge? What will be the scope of their work?

As experienced horsemen that have worked for years with

the HHBNYS, we know full well the depth of work involved and hours of commitment needed to provide the excellence in service required to fulfil the needs of this program.

Each day, there are a myriad of issues, be it breeding, racing or otherwise that must be addressed by experienced and confident personnel.

Race draw oversight, coupled entries and eligibility issues are regular issues that need professional and seasoned people to oversee and implement a successful and orderly program. As participants in the New York Sire Stakes program we rely on the ease of communication between horsemen and the HHBNYS to help answer and sort sometimes difficult interpretations of bylaws. Often times needing answers at odd hours of the day, weekday or weekend. These are circumstances that are often unpredictable but in need of immediate attention and direction. These are issues that we have historically relied upon the HHBNYS to respond to and handle with confidence.

Everyone wants to keep costs down, but the suspicious manner in which the contract was changed and they way in which the new group seeks to proceed, raises fundamental questions that must be cleared before the HHBNYS is replaced. We realize that the HHBNYS has not always perfectly administered the program but it has done so consistently in a way that has earned it the trust and respect of virtually every participant in the NYSS program. The HHBNYS deserves better than to be cast aside in this manner.

As investors and participants in the New York Sire Stakes program we are outraged and dismayed with the current direction of the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund. This is not the type of leadership we can endorse or accept.

The Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund has a planned meeting scheduled for April 27, at which time they are expected to "rubber stamp" their approval of Capitol Hill Management Services Inc. as the new administrative arm of OUR New York Sire Stakes program.

We suggest that fellow horseman that feel similarly with us, contact the members of the Agriculture and New York State Horse Breeding and Development Fund directly to express your like disdain.

Harness racing has much to learn from W.W.E.

A couple of weeks ago Steve Ross referred to there being 100,000 people that attended Wrestlemania, known as a "fake" production ([2017-04-09 Feedback](#)).

He then stated that the fans cannot be concerned too

much about "integrity" since the product is "fake." He also compared takeout to the overpriced refreshments sold at Wrestlemania.

First and foremost, there is no integrity issue with the W.W.E., because they are very open that the outcomes of the matches are pre-determined. They are very open that everything is a part of a story line and that their product is sports "entertainment." There is not a single W.W.E. fan that is being "duped" because they believe the wrestling matches are real from a result-standpoint. But, if you believe it to be a fake, I would suggest trying some of the moves these athletes perform and find out just how fake it is.

Secondly, when a W.W.E. superstar has a positive test for a performance enhancing substance that superstar is suspended for an extended period of time and his/her contract is terminated upon the third offense. The W.W.E. drug testing policies are available for all to see and all aspects of the program are laid out extensively ([full details here](#)). There is no grey-area.

Lastly, the W.W.E. has built an effective brand and has six million viewers watch its content on a weekly basis. So they aren't nearly as concerned about spending a few extra dollars at a live event. To compare this to a takeout rate is faulty, when all W.W.E. fans are looking for in return is entertainment, while the gambler is trying to make money.

More thoughts on Sorella's Solutions

Regarding Sorella's Solutions ([full story here](#)) concerning increasing the overall exposure of the general public to harness racing with the ultimate goal of increasing on-track attendance.

If that could truly enable us to succeed and thrive then I think his ideas and points are valid. I agree with everything he says except the goal he's trying to obtain. The days of us succeeding as an industry by depending upon on track attendance are long gone. We obtain purse revenues from just two avenues. One of course is through handle and the

second through welfare/slot money.

Since it would be short-sighted to depend on slot revenue ad infinitum we must find ways to raise the handle. We should possibly utilize his approach on funding although it can be argued that when purses escalate more money flows into horse purchase and acquisition. That said, we definitely need to allocate more money to green younger horses versus older claimers who sometimes race for their actual price tag, but that's been bandied about

forever. Increasing horse population can be another article. (LOL)

Thus the goal first must be getting more dollars into the betting windows instead of just more bodies to the track. If you want the younger generations and even us baby boomers to wager more, then concentrate on promoting more wagering not just more attendance.

That said. Mobile and online wagering IS the solution. We need to go after economic adrenaline junkies. The same thing that drives traders in the stock market is the same factor in play in a horse race with excitement of watching the race in action. When we founded the national race line 900 numbers 25 years ago, long before the Internet era, we discovered that only a handful of callers pressed three to hear just results. The majority of callers pressed one to hear the actual race call. They needed to feel the rush of participation via hearing winning the actual call instead of just recording the result. That feeling remains alive today and we as an industry must constantly let the general public know it not only exists but is there for the taking. Betting must be accessible from anywhere as the technology exists.

Therefore, it's imperative to adapt to contemporary times and to those generations that are the future of the industry if we are to survive. Think about it.

This generation knows nothing about payphones, cassette recorders, electric typewriters or any of a zillion things fondly familiar to us more seasoned folk. Since they are not capable of marching to our somewhat archaic drummer, it's mandatory we learn how to march to their specific drummer.

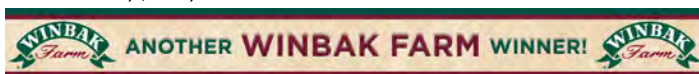

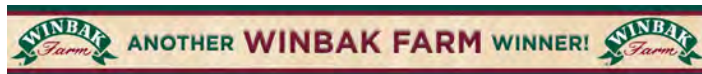
