The Legend Grows

Down Under import Bit Of A Legend N swept all five legs and Saturday's \$609,000 final of the George Morton Levy series at Yonkers to extend his winning streak to six races for trainer Peter Tritton.

Trainer Peter Tritton said he's had a few good horses over his career, but none have compared to Bit Of A Legend N who won Saturday's \$609,000 final of the George Morton Levy Series at Yonkers in 1:51 to run his undefeated streak to six after sweeping all five preliminary legs of the series.

Favored pacer Bit Of A Legend N (Jordan Stratton) completed a six-race sweep of the Levy Series with this 1:51 score in the \$609,000 final Saturday at Yonkers.

"He's the best. He's so consistent," Tritton said of the New Zealand bred son of Bettor's Delight out of the Sokys Atom mare Soky's Legend. "He's very strong. He won't let horses get past him. He wouldn't let Wiggle It Jiggleit get past him last weekend, and he's a champion. We're very proud of him."

A week ago, Bit Of A Legend N and his driver, Jordan Stratton, dead-heated for win with 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit, who didn't earn enough points to compete in the final and had to settle for a dominant 1:51 victory in the \$100,000 Levy consolation at odds of 1/9 out of the seven-hole — a starting spot he's been saddled with three of the four weeks in Levy action on the half-miler.

"If we were going for \$600,000 instead of \$100,000, it definitely would have been better," said Wiggle It Jiggleit's driver, Montrell Teague. "Maybe I would have popped the

earplugs and gone a bigger mile. I was trying to be conservative because we've got so many big races left."

Sent off as the favorite in the final, Bit Of A Legend N got away third in the early going behind Take It Back Terry and George Brennan. After All Bets Off (Matt Kakaley) took the lead through the :27 opening quarter, but Stratton soon zoomed Bit Of A Legend N to the front before reaching the half in :55.2. The seven-year-old Legend maintained an open lead through the 1:23.1 three-quarter marker and held a length-and-a-half advantage at the top of the lane.

Despite being under pressure in the stretch from All Bets Off, Bit Of A Legend N prevailed by one length.

"Last week, he fought Wiggle It Jiggle it to the wire. Tonight, I wasn't worried about it," said Stratton, who felt he had the hot horse since the Levy started six weeks ago. "He's been phenomenal from Day One. These races, anything can happen, but it was in our favor tonight."

Tritton's other finalist, Texican N (Yannick Gingras) was two lengths back in third, just edging P H Supercam (Jason Bartlett). Take It Back Terry grabbed the final check in the 29th and richest edition of the Levy that honors the memory of the Harness Hall of Famer and founder of Roosevelt Raceway. The final was also the richest race of 2016, so far, and the 1:51 mile matched the stakes record Maltese Artist and Greg Grismore set in 2007 when the series returned after an 11-year hiatus.

Bit Of A Legend N, the first from Down Under to win the Levy, now sports an 8-2-0 record in 10 starts in 2016 and leads all horses in North America, so far, with earnings exceeding \$450,000 for 90-year-old owner Harry Von Knoblauch of San Diego, CA.

"(Von Knoblauch is) on a cruise with his daughter right now," Tritton said. "He said, 'I wish I could get off this boat and be there.' I told him he'd feel a lot better when he got the check."

Tritton said Bit Of A Legend N will get some time off and hope for invitations for stakes at The Raceway at The Western Fair District, Harrington and Northfield Park.

Yaggonakissmeornot wins Matchmaker

Trainer Rene Allard was so excited to win the \$309,800 final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series, he rushed onto the track and lifted winning driver Daniel Dube in the air moments after Dube piloted Yaggonakissmeornot to a 1:51.4 victory that was two lengths better than Sell A Bit N.

Daniel Dube drove Yaggonakissmeornot to victory in the \$309,800 final of the Blue Chip Matchmaker Series Saturday at Yonkers.

"I expected a big performance. She's just a phenomenal mare," Allard said. "People around the barn say she can't be a mare. She's got to be a horse. She's long. She's wide. She looks phenomenal."

The victory improved the seven-year-old daughter of The Panderosa—Artstopper to 4-0-1 in seven starts in 2016, pushed her seasonal bankroll over \$220,000 and her lifetime haul to more than \$1.35 million for Allard Racing Inc and Yves Sarrazin of Quebec and Kapildeo Singh of Yorktown Heights, NY.

"She was real good and strong today," Dube said. "She didn't stop turning or home. She kept going. Right now, you need a real good one to go around."

Can Canterbury's bold plan be copied in Pennsylvania?

Big ideas, interesting racing, and a massive takeout decrease is Canterbury's big push to stand out in the crowded landscape.

Canterbury Park is a thoroughbred racetrack in Shakopee, MN. It has its history, some of it good and some of it not so good, but over the last couple of racing seasons it has been pulling out all the stops to promote itself, and its product. Canterbury doesn't just want to survive in an area of the world that's not exactly well-known for horse racing, it wants to thrive.

Back in 2012, a deal was struck with the Shakopee Sioux Community, which were operating the Mystic Lake Casino. The deal would provide \$75 million in purses and marketing to the racetrack over a decade long period. Immediately the track, long owned by the Sampson family, sprang into action.

Horsemen were encouraged to work with the track; to be partners in putting on the best show possible. The Canterbury Racing Club was created, which encouraged horse ownership, on a stand-alone basis or (for a small investment) with partnerships. Players clubs, horseplayer contests and top-notch customer service was made a major focus. Special days were created to bring in as many people as possible. If there was something to be tried, the management team open-mindedly tried it.

"We try very hard to be a racing and entertainment destination and be as customer friendly as possible. We don't take ourselves so seriously that it limits the things that we try," vice-president of racing Eric Halstrom told the [Horseplayer Monthly magazine](#).

It appears things have worked pretty well.

In 2015, the track averaged nearly 7,000 patrons per card. No, that's not a misprint, it was 7,000. On a day that was created to showcase the sport in a fun way, there was a battle of the surfaces (a turf race and a dirt race going off

simultaneously), and they drew almost 20,000 patrons. Handle has risen appreciably since the compact was signed. It's gold stars all around.

That success was not quite enough for Canterbury, however, because just this week they decided to try and capture even more of the market. They implemented the largest takeout decrease in North American wagering history. Canterbury slashed the win, place show (WPS) rake to 15 per cent, and all other wagers to 18 per cent. They rose from the 30th ranked track in North America (as rated by the Horseplayers Association of North America) to sixth.

Halstrom: "We feel that for racing to thrive at Canterbury Park in the long run we need to attract horseplayers and gamblers from all over the world and expose them to our racetrack. I guess we want to earn the business of horseplayers that just haven't had Canterbury Park on their radar in the past. We're also not afraid to try new things around here, whereas I think sometimes racing people are afraid to move off of longstanding ideas and traditions. In the end, we want to rise to new levels in the racing industry and catering to those that make our business go – the horseplayers – is where we think our long-term success will come from."

The buzz this week about Canterbury is palpable, with coverage from all thoroughbred major media outlets. The little track (with subsidized purses that one day might not be there) has gone “all in” to try and build its business.

Meanwhile, [there was another headline this week in The Blood-Horse](#); this one about Pennsylvania horse racing: “PA Report: Slots Provide Almost 90% of Purses”

“More than \$228 million was accrued for purses at six Pennsylvania racetracks in 2015 with 89.6 per cent of the funds derived from slot machine revenue, according to an annual report that analyzes the racetrack gaming industry in the state,” wrote Tom LaMarra.

This cash windfall was not overly well-received by customers.

“As for pari-mutuel handle, the report notes that on-track handle on live races at the six tracks totalled \$30.6 million last year, down from \$38.2 million in 2011. Handle at off-track wagering facilities — at least six have closed over the past five years — was \$8.4 million, down from \$15 million five years ago.”

With \$228 million, you’d think Pennsylvania might be able to do more, don’t you?

Pennsylvania tracks have some of the highest takeout, not only in America, but the world. At Harrah’s Philly, the superfecta takeout is 32 per cent. At Pocono, the trifecta juice is 30 per cent. These are similar bites to the Massachusetts state lottery, not a racetrack. They are almost double what Canterbury Park’s blended takeout rate offers, and frankly, they have no place in the game.

A trifecta at Pocono that pays \$700, will pay \$820 at Canterbury. That’s a whopping difference for customers. That’s \$120 they will be rebetting in Canterbury pools that will not be rebet into Pocono pools.


Betting into 30 per cent takeout is horseplayer bankroll suicide, and Pennsylvania racing is handing its customers a noose.

Slashing takeout alone will not cure all of Pennsylvania’s problems, of course. Smaller tracks, with smaller pools, have a tough time being noticed in the landscape, as witnessed not long ago with the Tioga Downs takeout reduction. But it does help put the track, and the state back on the horseplayer radar. For Pennsylvania, this could start with a takeout reduction, and move on from there, just as Canterbury has done. The money is there to experiment, is there an impetus to?

Canterbury Park has created a blue-print; a roadmap that focuses on using \$75 million in the best way possible. It started by creating a racetrack that horsepeople and horse owners want to race at. It moved into customer service, to ensure the stands are full, and customers are happy and coming back. After that, the plan moved into the simulcast market, by lowering takeout so bettors all over the world will notice you; and notice you are trying for their business.

That folks is a plan, and in my view, it’s something that Pennsylvania racing should look long and hard at copying. We know Pennsylvania has tried some things they should be commended for, mostly on the harness side. The Meadows has dropped some takeouts and the horsemen have tried to promote the harness product. But formulating and sticking to a long-term plan that has shown promise certainly can’t hurt can it?

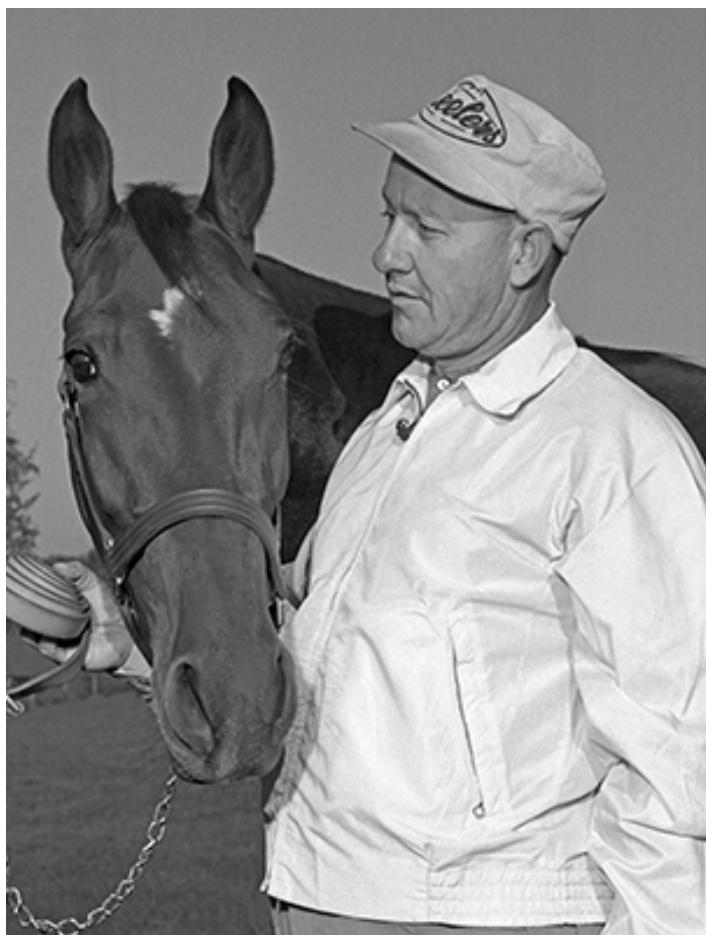

The Curmudgeon's Baker's Dozen: greatest female pacers

My list of the greatest female pacers I've ever seen race.

Before I get to the list, I think I should establish some ground rules.

I think any female pacer who was consistently competitive with the top boys automatically deserves a spot.

There may be, although I doubt it, some who I may not have seen race who are deserving of a spot. However this list as all of my other ones are limited to only horses that I have actually seen.

I believe that of all the categories, this one is likely the most highly competitive and the one that is likely to draw the greatest amount of disagreement.

Of all the females listed, there have been a few who have

come close, but in my not so humble opinion, only two, Three Diamonds and Town Pro, have produced a horse commensurate with their greatness on the racetrack, Three Diamonds with Life Sign and Town Pro with Darlins Delight. Rainbow Blue comes close with Somewhereoverarainbow.

Here in alphabetical are the honorable mentions: **American Jewel, Armbr Feather, Burning Point, Darlin's Delight, Delinquent Account, Dottie's Pick, Galleria, Green with Envy, Hazel Hanover, Immortality, JK Shesalady, Loyal Opposition, Put On A Show, Roses Are Red, See You at Peelers, Shady Daisy, Shes A Great Lady, Stienam, Town Pro, Worldly Beauty.**

1. Countess Adios — The only pacing filly I've seen who was consistently able to handle the boys. She did this quite easily and did so racing free legged. The boys she beat were a very good group. She won both the Cane and the Messenger when these were truly among the greatest races for three year olds. She likely would have also won the Jug if she had been eligible and were in it, thus becoming the only female Triple Crown winner. The only thing that kept her from being the Horse of the Year was a boy named Adios Butler.

2. Eternal Camnation — The all-time, money-winning pacing female. Arguably, the most consistently great of all of them. She came back year after year. If not at the top, she was invariably close to it. Winner of multiple Breeders Crowns.

3. Miss Easy — Big, tough, strong and most importantly fast and game would be among the words I would use to describe this amazon. I recall Lou Guida making a statement to the effect that she could take on and defeat the boys. Mickey Chasanoff took him up on his boast and suggested that the owners of his Die Laughing and Guida put up a significant amount of money and have a match race between the two. Guida declined the offer.

4. Rainbow Blue – Another amazon. Big, tough, strong and, of course, incredibly fast. Horse of the Year in 2004. Except for the one race at The Meadowlands where she made a break, none of her contemporaries could even smell her. I believe that if she had the opportunity, she could have competed with the boys on occasion.

5. Bunny Lake – Yet another amazon. Horse of the Year in 2001. Remarkably consistent and dominated her foes.

6. Fan Hanover – Horse of the Year in 1981. The only filly to ever win the

Little Brown Jug. Diminutive in size, but she thought that she was 10 feet tall. I recall her as a yearling as being mild mannered and easy to get along with. My understanding is that she grew into somewhat of a witch and was not the easiest mare to get along with.

7. Anndrovette – Talk about consistency. This mare exemplifies it. She is the second leading money-winning pacing mare of all time. She is a multiple Breeders Crown winner. Just when one might think she has seen her best days, she keeps coming back.

8. Belle Acton – Maybe the first of Bill Haughton's "bargain basement" buys. He bought her for Georges Landers of Maine for \$1,500. I recall Apples Thomas once telling me that the owner never paid a single bill on this mare beyond her initial purchase price. He was behind from the very beginning. Once she started earning money they took what he owed and sent him the balance. A truly great mare that raced consistently against the top boys and occasionally beat them.

9. Handle With Care – A great filly at both two and three. I believe that at one time she won 28 races in a row. The day she took her time trial record as the fastest filly ever, she won the first heat of the stakes she was in at Lexington. Then, instead of going in the second heat, Billy Haughton chose to time trial her and she proceeded to break the world record. If I didn't have her on this list, my friend Fred Grant would likely never speak to me again.

10. Silk Stockings – An awesome filly that was almost interchangeable with her paternal half-sister Tarport Hap. I think Silk Stockings might have been slightly better at two and as an early three-year-old. But from that point, Tarport Hap became arguably the better mare.

11. Tarport Hap – See above. The arch foe of Silk Stockings. Silky was better at two while Hap took over at three and four.

12. Town Pro – Consistently outstanding throughout her racing career. A member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. Together with Three Diamonds, the only mare listed in the Baker's Dozen and honorable mentions that was able to reproduce herself in Darlins Delight.

13. Three Diamonds – One would have had to have seen her to realize how great a filly she was. Her stats are very good, but in my opinion not as good as she herself was. The only one of those listed above who produced a horse even better than what she herself was, being the dam of Life Sign.

Will They Stay Or Will They Go?

With the inaugural Mack Lobell Elitlopp Playoff two weeks away at the Meadowlands, some of the eligibles discuss whether they would accept the invitation to race in the Elitlopp that goes to the winner of the Playoff.

Trainer Paul Kelley said the unknown isn't whether his six-year-old gelded trotter Obrigado will race in the Mack Lobell Elitlopp Playoff on May 8 at the Meadowlands — if he's ready to go, he will — the big question is whether he would take Obrigado to Stockholm to race in the Elitlopp if the trotter wins the Elitlopp Playoff.

The winner of the Mother's Day race, to be held on a special afternoon card at the Big M, receives an invitation to race at Solvalla on May 29 in the Elitlopp.

"That's a big decision right there to accept that and go," Kelley said. "The truth is the matter is, I've been to the race and it's a fantastic event, but there's so much money to race for here in this country. You've got to think about how much you've given up on the flipside coming back with the recovery and all that to make it really worth your while to go over there."

Kelley is one of about a dozen trainers who are mulling over that exact same question from the 14 horses that remain eligible to the Elitlopp Playoff.



Bee A Magician (Brian Sears) handily won her 2016 pari-mutuel debut Friday at the Meadowlands, but will she race in the Elitlopp if she wins the Mack Lobell Elitlopp Playoff on May 8?

Bee A Magician's connections said more than a month ago that they are wary about taking their magnificent mare to the Elitlopp for the same reason Kelley expressed. Reached Friday at the Meadowlands shortly before Bee A Magician made short work of the \$25,000 open-handicap field,

winning in 1:52, the mare's trainer, "Nifty" Norman said that if the daughter of Kadabra—Beehive won the Elitlopp Playoff, the owners would make the final decision whether to send her overseas.

But recent serious injuries to star trotters Mission Brief, Maven and Creatine give them all pause that racing at the sport's top level is fleeting and making money while you can is critical.

In early March, Bee A Magician's part-owner David McDuffee said, "I would have said a couple of years ago that we definitely have to go to Europe, but to be honest with you, they've got so many good races here now. You can make so much money here and the horses that have gone over there haven't done that well when they've come back. It's tough running them back and forth and getting them out of their routine. We can get 15 good races for her between here and Canada. My guess is we'll probably stay right here. If she was lucky enough to win that race at the Meadowlands, I know we'd consider (the Elitlopp), we just have to. We just have to wait and see after that."

McDuffee said the issue isn't whether Bee A Magician is up to the task.

"She's good enough to go. The problem is the timing of it. It's really the beginning of our season here. You go over there and you lose two or three months here by the time you get re-acclimated," he said.

Trainer Ron Burke has three trotters still in the mix for the Elitlopp Playoff, including Gural Hanover, who finished three-quarters-of-a-length behind Bee A Magician in Friday's race, just ahead of fellow Elitlopp Playoff eligible Shake It Cerry. Burke also has Crazy Wow and DW's NY Yank still pointed toward the Playoff.

"I would almost say for sure for everyone except for maybe Crazy Wow (would go to Sweden)," Burke said Friday afternoon. "Crazy Wow has more races here that he would have to give up. It's hard to give them up with him, but if I thought he had a chance to win, yes I'd go. To me, (winning the Elitlopp) is the greatest achievement you can have as a

harness person.”

“It’s funny, (three-year-old Hambletonian favorite Southwind) Frank, I want to race him at four, but I think I’m going to end up being voted down and not race him at four. That’s the reason I want to win (the Elitlopp). It’s hard if your best horses are retired after three or four. You’re not going to win that race at four. You need to keep a horse almost until he’s five. I hope people still buy into trying to keep horses going by racing and breeding them.”

All the trainers contacted said they could deal with the special Elitlopp Playoff rules that mirror some of the Elitlopp restrictions — namely, no Lasix and no trotting hobbles. Burke said he’s not thrilled Gural Hanover will have to race without Lasix, “but for a week or two, it’s not going to bother him.”

He said the bigger problem was finding races for his trotters to get them in shape to contest the Elitlopp Playoff.

“That’s the biggest thing. I can’t get them raced to get a feel for where they’re at,” Burke said.

Assessing the field, Burke said he felt like he had a good shot.

“I don’t think anybody other than JL Cruze has been outstanding and it was only his last start where I thought he was outstanding. Maybe Shake It Cerry, but the rest of them have not been,” Burke said before Bee A Magician’s 2016 pari-mutuel debut on Friday. “Crazy Wow I expect he’ll be really good in his next qualifier and then he’ll get a start and that should tell us if he’s ready to go.”

Whether not he, or any others, will go to Sweden if they win the Elitlopp Playoff is another matter.

What were the Pocono judges thinking?

This past Tuesday night (April 19) at Pocono Downs, there was a race that requires an explanation from the judges. However, before we discuss the issue, here are a couple of screen captures worth looking at.

Here is a picture of the starting gate going around the first turn before the start of the race in Race 5.



Starting gate approaching the first turn prior to a start at Pocono Downs in their 5th race on April 19, 2016.

Notice how the starting gate is fully deployed, waiting for the horses to catch up with the gate. Now, let’s look at a picture of the starting gate from the next race.



Starting gate approaching the first turn prior to a start at Pocono Downs in their 6th race on April 19, 2016.

In the 6th race, something is clearly wrong as the starting gate wing for the outside posts didn’t fully extend. For all practical purposes, this is the way the gate was when the field was released on the backstretch.

Why was a recall not called before the field was released and failing that, why wasn’t the race declared ‘no-contest’? Clearly the outside horses had an unfair advantage if they decided to leave once the gate opened as it was never fully deployed.

A conversation from a trusted source with the judges the following day indicated the judges in the stand noticed the problem and attempted to communicate to the starter presumably so a recall would be sounded. However, the starter was supposedly busy with I Wonder Why, who hit the gate in the later run up to the race so the judges’ call was never acknowledged, prior to the start.

According to the judge, they let the results stand because they felt it didn't provide anyone an advantage. Well, two of the outside horses left (#8 I Wonder Why and #6 Art Frenzy) and I Wonder Why ran out of the money after cutting the first half of the mile, with Art Frenzy tracking the leader to take the lead when I Wonder Why quit and went on to win the race.

My question is: if the judges saw something they felt was necessary to communicate with the starting judge about a possible recall, why was it not significant enough to call a 'no contest' when the race went off without the gate being fixed? It should be noted there was no inquiry. Sounds like inconsistent judging to me.

The judges are responsible for protecting the wagering public. Whether or not it impacted the final outcome of the race, the fact is the outside horses had an unfair advantage. If this was a thoroughbred race and the six, seven, and eight got released a little earlier than the others at the start, something would have been done about it, likely in the name of the horses being scratched.

The bettors who support Pocono Downs are entitled to an explanation. Something like this should never happen again.

Freaky Feet Pete wins '16 debut in 1:49.4 at Hoosier

Freaky Feet Pete, the 2015 Breeders Crown Champion for three-year-old pacing colts, was a dominant winner in his 2016 debut on Saturday, April 23 at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino in the featured event on the card, a \$21,000 Invitational Pace. Driven by regular pilot Trace Tetrick, Freaky Feet Pete finished two lengths in front of his next closest competitor, stopping the timer in 1:49.4.

The Larry Rheinheimer trainee wasted no time as he came

away from the gate firing to reach the front in an uncontested opening panel of :27. Nitro and John DeLong benefitted from a pocket trip while Bluehourpower and Ricky Macomber Jr. were next in line, third.

Freaky Feet Pete leisurely strolled down the backside to reach the second panel in :55.2 while the rest of the field remained in single file line approaching the final turn. With a three-quarter clocking a 1:23, Freaky Feet Pete again showed the flashes of speed that has made the pacer so popular.

Under no urging from Tetrick, Freaky Feet Pete found another gear and utilized a :26.4 closing quarter to pace away from the field. Nitro maintained his position to finish second while Bluehourpower rounded out the trifecta. As the overwhelming favorite, Freaky Feet Pete returned \$2.10 to his backers at the betting window.

"We are glad to have that one out of the way," Rheinheimer said in the winner's circle. "There's a lot of pressure, especially with his first start, but he qualified well and he seems to be as good as ever and that's all we can ask for."

"I told Trace (Tetrick) good luck and be safe, that's it, that's all I ever tell him. I felt good about things tonight, he (Freaky Feet Pete) felt really good warming up. He was a little aggressive but he was ready to get back to work."

With the win, Freaky Feet Pete notched the first win of his four-year-old campaign and 25th career victory from 28 lifetime outings. The homebred son of Rockin Image—Skyway Lori has now earned \$1,126,224 lifetime for his owners Mary Jo Rheinheimer and Marty Rheinheimer. Rheinheimer's star pupil will look to make another start at his home track before being pointed to Northfield Park for his first major stakes engagement of the season, the \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie on May 21 at Northfield Park.

"As far as the rest of the season, we will see how it goes," Rheinheimer said. "He will be in all the stakes races around here and we will take him to a few other places, Toronto and the Meadowlands, if all goes well. We are going to take it week by week with him."

Musical Rhythm a perfect 10 in Don Mills final

Musical Rhythm scored his 10th consecutive victory winning the \$42,600 Don Mills Trotting Series final Saturday (April 23) at Mohawk Racetrack.

The Ben Baillargeon trainee crushed his five rivals with a five-and-a-half length victory in 1:52.4 to easily sweep the three-week Don Mills Series.

Driven by Mario Baillargeon, Musical Rhythm got away third before brushing to the front in the second quarter. The 1-9 favorite posted fractions of :56.2 and 1:25.3 before trotting home confidently in :27.1 for his eighth victory of 2016.

Hillsonator finished second, while Musical Rhythm's stablemate Grana Padanno was third.

Musical Rhythm was purchased for \$33,000 last November at the Harrisburg Mixed Sale and has since won 11 of 12 starts and earned \$152,300 for owners Santo & Nunzio Vena, Claude Hamel and Ben Baillargeon.

A four-year-old son of Cantab Hall—Musical Victory, Musical Rhythm improved his career totals to 17 wins and over \$200,000 earned with his Don Mills Series final victory.

Following Saturday's race, Ben Baillargeon explained what his initial expectations were for Musical Rhythm,

"I liked about him that he fit the non-winners of three or \$75,000 and the General Brock Series," Ben said. "I thought he was a nice horse, a fast horse and he showed a quarter in :26.4 as a two-year-old, so that's what I look for at the sale, I like when they have speed.

"For some reason this year he has put it together and he has been nothing but good for me. The hopple broke the one time he ran at the gate or else he would be perfect."

While Musical Rhythm has exceeded expectations, his

connections are enjoying the pleasant surprise and have staked him heavily to top events this season.

"We put him in the Graduate Series starting in a month at The Meadowlands, so he will probably race one time before we go there," Ben said. "But this week he is going to hit the field."

Musical Rhythm's victory gives Ben his second consecutive Don Mills Series final win. Last year, Etruscan Hanover won the series finale in a record 1:52.2.

Musical Rhythm has quickly made a name for himself in 2016 and Baillargeon noted he isn't sure just how good the four-year-old can be.

"I know he's a better horse off a helmet because he wants to go when you pull on the right line, but time will tell."

Four and five-year-old trotters, who were non-winners of \$150,000 lifetime as of December 31, 2015, were eligible to the Don Mills Trotting Series.

Rockeyed Optimist worked out an ideal close-to-the-action trip, wore down the leader in deep stretch and held on despite the explosive late charge of Always B Miki to take the \$25,000 open handicap pace at the Meadowlands Saturday (April 23). McCardles Lightning was third.

Driver Tim Tetrick hustled the five-year-old gelded son of Rocknroll Hanover into the three hole early behind McCardles Lightning and Atta Boy Dan. After an opening quarter of :27.2, Rockeyed Optimist, the 6-5 second choice, moved to the outside and began to grind away at the leader's advantage at the half in :55.2.

By the time the stellar field reached three-quarters, Rockeyed Optimist was up to the wheel of McCardles Lightning while 4-5 favorite Always B Miki, who had raced in a fourth-over flow, was dead last in the field of seven.

Rockeyed Optimist continued to inch his way closer to the top and finally got past the pacesetter with a sixteenth of a mile to go.

Up on the far outside came the airborne Always B Miki, who won all four of his starts a year ago in sub-1:50, pacing a sensational final quarter of :25.4 only to come up half a length short to Rockeyed Optimist in what was a superb seasonal debut.

The winner returned \$4.40 to his backers, scoring for the sixth time in eight starts this year and went the mile in 1:50

for trainer Steve Elliott and owners Perretti, Berkner, A&B Stable and Battaglia.

Still Climbing

Those hoping to hit the big one will have their chance on the next live race card as the 12th race 20 cent Jackpot Super High Five did not get hit again, upping the carryover to \$194,741.03.

Total wagering on the program was \$2,589,150.

Racing resumes at the Big M Friday. Post time for the first race is 7:15 p.m.

The purpose of preserving the umbilical cord is to enable the stem cells to be available for future treatment of injuries. The stem cells are used to treat potential career-ending injuries of tendons, bones, ligaments, etc. This treatment has been researched to promote healing of the injury without inflicting scar tissue on the horse.

“We at Winbak feel fortunate to partner with Equi-Stem and look forward to our horses being the beneficiaries of this important medical advancement,” said Joe Thomson.

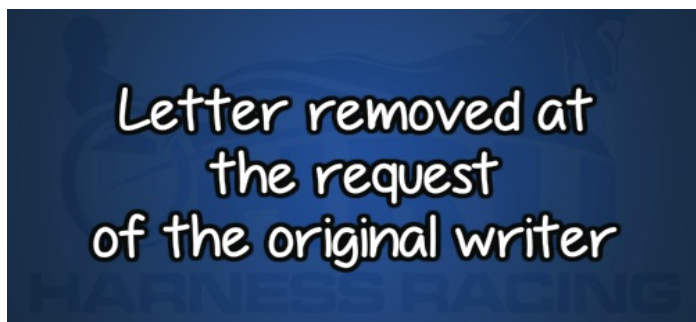

Gural: Odds on our future not looking good

In reading the highlights of your Setting the Odds column last Sunday, there was one constant theme from almost all of the participants. Unfortunately, that theme was that the industry would never work together to accomplish much of anything.

John Campbell thought the odds were 50 to 1 that the

jurisdictions with slots would devote a percentage of the industry's share to a national harness racing marketing plan. Joe Faraldo thought it was 30 to 1 that the harness tracks in New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware would work together to coordinate schedules to address the declining horse numbers. Mike Tanner thought it was 15 to 1 that the industry would pool money for a marketing program. I made the odds at 20 to 1 and Myron Bell made the odds of 10 to 1 that the industry would devote some revenue to recruit new owners. I think we could all agree that those odds are quite realistic based on what has happened since the slot subsidy began. The amazing thing is that over the last 10 years we probably received at least \$4 billion from the slots, which is a staggering number. One would think that would have certainly helped to revitalize the industry, but instead, the exact opposite seems to have happened.

Looking at the number of North American foals we see a decline from 15,225 in 2004 to 7,830 in 2014. Looking at the average yearling price, we see that in 2000 the average price was almost \$21,000 which then declined slightly, bounced back up again in 2007 to \$22,382, again declined slightly and bounced back up again in 2014 to \$21,372. It increased slightly in 2015 as well. Basically we have seen that the average yearling price today is about the same as it was 15 years ago and I think everyone knows that you cannot sell yearlings profitably for \$20,000 unless it was raised in your backyard.

Last night, the top category was a n/w \$18000 last 4, that's just plain not acceptable for a Saturday and I'm sure the racing secretary and marketing (department) both know better. The difference to the bettors is as follows: Higher class race horses are far easier to handicap primarily because they are more consistent and generally the classification of the horses is the same week to week and finally the best horses draw the best drivers. Contrast this to horses moving up or down that may or may not be 100 per cent healthy and/or drawing “B” level drivers.

If last night's program was an example of things to come sadly I see a downward spiral ahead. I believe bettors will take their dollars to better purse/horse tracks like the one just across the river, you know, the half-mile one.

Mr. Gural has spent much time and money to rebuild the Meadowlands and it would be a shame for the “M” to backslide in the wrong direction. One thing I'm sure of is that it is much easier to maintain a customer level than to win them back after they have left.
