Pennsylvania Power

Ron Burke trainees won both eliminations for the inaugural \$561,500 Pennsylvania Classic at Pocono, while Dan Patch winner Pure Country had her career undefeated streak snapped in one of three eliminations for the \$318,300 Miss Pennsylvania.

JK Will Power (1:51.1) and Check Six (1:50.4) both posted new lifetime marks Saturday (April 30) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono while winning the two \$25,000 elimination races for next Saturday's inaugural \$561,500 Pennsylvania Classic for PA-sired three-year-old colts and geldings.

JK Will Power (Yannick Gingras) edged The Catamount Kid (Jody Jamieson) by a neck in the first Pennsylvania Classic elimination, won by trainer Ron Burke.

The winning duo also contributed to give trainer Ron Burke a familiar position of domination, as he sent out both winners, a second-place finisher, and a third-place finisher from four starters. The Classic Championship is to be held during the evening portion of the Kentucky Derby Day doubleheader next Saturday at the mountain oval.

The Burke Stable had the two favorites in the first Classic elim in JK Will Power (1/2) and Manhattan Beach (9/5), and they finished 1-3 respectively, split by Canadian invader The Catamount Kid. JK Will Power, off a strong 2016 bow at Philly, went by his stablemate early, briefly gave up the lead to the parked The Catamount Kid at the :26.4 quarter, but was quickly in the move to reclaim the front. Explained driver Yannick Gingras, "I wasn't sure, with my driving the favorite, that Jody (Jamieson) and his horse were the ones to sit behind from the program, but as it turned out I could have gone either way."

JK Will Power got a real rest during panel and hit the half in :56.2, continued on with a tailwind to put up a 1:23.3 three-quarter split then sprinted home in :27.3 – and needed all of that dash through the lane as The Catamount Kid tried hard to emulate the three "pocket rocket" winners of the Miss Pennsylvania elims. His Pocono Pike late effort, at 11/1, came up a neck shy, with Manhattan Beach holding his third spot ahead of Western Dynasty. Burke conditions the victorious Somebeachsomewhere—What's New Pussycat colt for the 3 Brothers Stable.

In the other elim, Check Six and Big Top Hanover were coupled in the betting as the 3/5 favorite, and they finished a nose apart on the money, just ahead of Lyons Snyder. These three had been in the thick of the action throughout – Lyons Snyder claimed the front, yielded to Easy Lover Hanover before the :26.3 opener, then was quarter-mover number one to the lead in front of the stands, yielding to quarter-mover number two Big Top Hanover, who took the field to the half in :55.

Check Six and driver Yannick Gingras, completing the Classic elim sweep along with Burke, came up first-over and made a bold backstretch brush to clear his stablemate by the 1:22.1 three-quarters, then stayed game late as Big Top Hanover came outside from the pocket for the drive and lost by the smallest possible amount, with Lyons Shadow only a half-length off the win; Duke Of Delray was fourth, and from this division JJ Flynn had the faster clocking of the two

fifth-place finishers and thus was the last horse advancing to the final.

Somebeachsomewhere picked up his fourth sire credit in the five stakes elims, two at each sex, with the victory of Check Six, who is out of Southwind Vanna and owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, William Switala and James Martin.

Gingras said that he would await the results of Monday's open draw before finalizing a selection of whom he'll guide in the final. Matt Kakaley guided the other two Burke qualifiers.

Trainer Chris Ryder will have three in the final, Western Dynasty, Duke Of Delray. and JJ Flynn. Owner Geoffrey Lyons

Mound is in the interesting position of having two horses in the final with different trainers: Manhattan Beach (Burke) and Lyons Snyder (Mark Silva).

Earlier, three \$20,000 eliminations for next Saturday's inaugural \$313,800 Miss Pennsylvania Pace for PA-sired three-year-old pacing fillies were held, with the pocket the racing position to be in. All three winners rallied from the two-hole – one outside, the other two inside up the famed "Pocono Pike."

In the first elimination, Pure Country, undefeated in 10 starts at two and national divisional champion, fell from the ranks of the unbeaten, as in a :54.3 sprint home she couldn't go enough in her seasonal bow. She had to settle for third, and a position in the Miss Pennsylvania, behind the victorious Darlinonthebeach, a 1:50.4 winner, and Pocono Pike-shooting second-place finisher Newborn Sassy.

Driver David Miller sent the Somebeachsomewhere—Darlin's Delight filly Darlinonthebeach directly to the front, ceding the lead at the :26.3 quarter to the 50-cent favorite Pure Country, with Newport Sassy sitting third. Pure Country got a breather into the second quarter headwind and hit the half in 56.1, picking up the tempo to reach the three-quarter pole in 1:23.3.

Turning for home, Miller pulled Darlinonthebeach (second choice at 2-1) outside and sailed right on by, with Miller sitting chilly in the bike. Newport Sassy came up the Pike to grab second, a length behind the winner and a neck ahead of Pure Country. Nancy Johansson had the winning filly ready for a 1:51.3 seasonal bow victory here, and now the fast miss is two-for-two in 2016 and possessor of a new speed badge for owner/breeder White Birch Farm.

"She was really strong all through the mile," Miller noted after the race. When reminded that a win in the Miss Pennsylvania would put Miller in the \$200 Million Club in driving earnings, joining John Campbell and Ron Pierce, Miller gave the thumbs up and said, "Something to aim for!"

The two-hole was again the place to be in the second Miss Pennsylvania elimination, as the Well Said—Silksndiamonds filly I Said Diamonds, parked to the :26.1 quarter for the top then yielded to sit behind Sail To The Beach through :54.2 and 1:22.3 middle splits. I Said Diamonds used the inside route to get the decision in a personal best of 1:51. I Said Please, uncovered from late backstretch, stayed game for second, a length back and completing the "I Said" Exacta, with Sail To The Beach hanging in for third, another half-length behind the victorious 3/5 favorite.

Matt Kakaley handled the sulky duties for Little Bapa LLC and trainer Matias Ruiz, who got the filly to train in the offseason and enjoyed victory with her at first asking. "She is by far the best horse I have ever trained," said Ruiz after the race with a smile. "She was good last year, and she's a little bigger, a little stronger this year."

Driver Scott Zeron watched the first two elims and settled on a winning strategy in the third elim, sailing up the Pocono Pike to an easy two-and-a-quarter length triumph in 1:51.3 with the Somebeachsomewhere—Preppy Party Girl filly Call Me Queen Be, an even-money choice in her first start of the year. Zeron and the "Queen" parked main rival Ivy League to a :26.1 opener, and even when the pacesetter got a breather to the 56 half, Zeron was not worried: "This filly has great speed, and can do anything on the racetrack," he said after the race.

And sure enough, after a 1:23.3 three-quarter, Call Me Queen Be waited for the inside lane to open, then darted through with lightning quickness to go by with ease; Save The Treasure was along from third-inside position to get second, one-and-a-half lengths ahead of Ivy League, who held for third. Ross Croghan trains the winner, who also took a new mark, for the Let It Ride Stables Inc. and Dana Parham.

These top three fillies for each division will return for the Miss Pennsylvania Championship during the evening card of a Kentucky Derby doubleheader next Saturday at The Downs. David Miller has the only driving decision to make, as he guided Darlinonthebeach and Ivy League; Ivy League's trainer Jimmy Takter, who also handles Pure Country, was the only conditioner to land two in the rich event.

Stronach Group to take over Rosecroft Raceway

The Stronach Group, best known for its ownership of some of the top thoroughbred tracks in the U.S., is in the process of purchasing Rosecroft Raceway and will take over operation at the conclusion of the current harness meet.

Penn National Gaming currently owns the track. The current meet ends June 11.

The Fort Washington, MD track will be operated by the team at the Stronach-owned Maryland Jockey Club tracks, Pimlico and Laurel. MJC general manager Sal Sinatra said the purchase of Rosecroft was made because it would give the Stronach Group wider control of the Maryland OTB network.

"All tracks control the OTBs within a 35-mile radius of where they are located," Sinatra said. "This gives us control of OTBs in the Washington, D.C. area and also the chance to get an OTB into the new MGM casino, which opens in the fall."

Sinatra said the Stronach Group paid \$11 million for Rosecroft. Penn National, which re-opened the track in 2011, after it had shut down the year before, purchased Rosecroft for \$10.25 million. The transfer from Penn National to Stronach is likely to be a positive for the track as the Stronach company is widely viewed as a racing operator that believes in racing and is willing to invest in it. Penn National's reputation is that of a casino-centric company that doesn't particularly like horse racing.

"We're not going to try to blow up anything, but we'll fix it up a bit," Sinatra said. "They average about \$17,000, \$19,000 a day in handle with no effort. I think I can get it up to \$25,000 a day."

Rosecroft opened in 1949 and has had several owners in its history. When Penn National purchased the track it made no secret of the fact it was motivated primarily by the desire to open a casino there. When it was passed over for a casino license, its interest in operating a racetrack only, waned.

The Stronach Group owns Gulfstream Park, Santa Anita, Golden Gate Fields, Portland Meadows and the two Maryland thoroughbred tracks. This is its first foray into harness racing, but the company's predecessor, Magna Entertainment, leased The Meadows and ran it from 2001 to 2006 and owned Flamboro Downs in Hamilton, ON from 2002 to 2005.

Better Together

Ontario's Standardbred Alliance made great strides in its second year — including a nearly 10 per cent increase in all-sources wagering — indicating working together may just be key to harness racing's survival.

Ontario racing is on the rise thanks, in part, to the early success of the Standardbred Alliance

Gural, the owner of the Meadowlands, Vernon and Tioga Downs, has long preached the need for tracks to work together on a major marketing plan and better coordinate schedules to combat the horse shortage problem.

"I think Ontario has a major advantage over the tracks in the U.S. because Ontario tracks do work together," Gural said of the Alliance, a consortium of eight Ontario racetracks — Mohawk and Woodbine at the premier level; Flamboro, Georgian Grand River and Western Fair at the middle signature level and Clinton and Hanover at the grassroots level. The Alliance was created in April of 2014 to work together to coordinate schedules, promote wagering and stakes opportunities for all and provide a more consistent customer experience across the group.

Wagering numbers seem to indicate that working together has distinct benefits over the old system where the province's tracks operated in fiefdoms and competed against each other for customers, horses and wagering dollars.

In its second full year of existence, the Alliance saw all-sources wagering increase 9.63 per cent from just over \$394 million in its first year to more than \$432 million through March 31, 2016.

Dr. Ted Clarke, general manager of Grand River Raceway in Elora, ON, said, "we have succeeded in reversing the trend in

wager, which is, for sure, a first step and a necessary first step."

Clarke said the elimination of rancor between racetracks is key to that wagering growth.

The Alliance is managed by the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG), which helps coordinate schedules, promote the Alliance racing product in its vast simulcast network and even manages smaller tracks' stakes programs, which has also increased exposure for those stakes.

"The wager last year on Industry Day when we ran the two stakes that we run was the highest it has been anytime since we came to Elora. So, the promotion, awareness and delivery all have something to say about that," said Clarke, referring to Grand River's stakes-rich card featuring the Battle of Waterloo and Battle of the Belles races.

Clarke said the smaller tracks in the Alliance have benefited from WEG's exposure on TVG. Often, early races at Grand River and The Raceway at The Western Fair District appear on TVG prior to the start of a card at Mohawk or Woodbine.

"We start a bit earlier than Mohawk and because TVG is going to carry Mohawk, they take us for the first two races because they can do it without having to change their supplier network chain. We would never gain that exposure without the Alliance," Clarke said.

Jamie Martin, chair of the Alliance, said the export market has flourished for the Standardbred Alliance.

"We have also seen the coordinated racing model, competitive racing and increased distribution into markets outside of Ontario contributing nicely to our wagering handle and fan interest metrics," Martin said.

Home Market Area (HMA) wagering, which includes live and simulcast betting at the Alliance tracks, WEG's on-track, HPIbet.com and Champions Off-Track operations, was some \$836 million in 2015-16. That is an increase of about \$28 million over the \$808 million bet in 2014-15.

"We are pleased to see our customer-focused model working for the Standardbred Alliance," Martin said. "The Champions Off-Track brand has expanded its footprint to all

corners of the province and betting on horse racing is available and convenient to many Ontarians within their neighborhoods. This coordinated effort proves the key factions within the horse racing industry can work together to offer an outstanding product for our current fan base and potential new long term customers."

Clarke said challenges still abound both in terms of horse supply and purse levels at the middle (signature) and lower (grassroots) tiers of racing in the province.

"I don't think there's anybody in the horse business in Ontario that doesn't know that there isn't enough purse money at a good number of racetracks. The cloud that hangs over racing is that," Clarke said. "We need to pick up the slack and find purse money so people can participate."

As for horse supply, the number of mares bred in Ontario dropped precipitously from some 2,897 to 1,817 (37 per cent) between 2012 and 2013, the year the province announced the cancellation of the Slots at Racetracks Program (SARP). The number went down to 1,724 in 2014, which is contributing to the horse supply problem.

Fortunately, the breeding industry in the province seems to have rebounded thanks, in part, to new breeders awards and an annual \$100 million funding agreement from the province that runs through 2021.

The number of mares bred in Ontario increased 22 per cent in 2015 to 2,111 and word is the number is expected to be up marginally in 2016, as well.

"I don't know that we can say that we have solved the problem of horse supply," Clarke said. "But we certainly have more mares bred last year.

"The increase in foals born in Ontario in the face of a negative response everywhere else is, I think, something worth commenting on as a point of success."

Martin said, "going forward it may be difficult to keep field size up. We intend to work with government, Ontario's horsepeople and other industry influencers to ensure we are able to avoid detracting from the great strides we have made to deliver an outstanding customer experience."

For the time being, Ontario's Standardbred Alliance is proving working together has a number of benefits.

Top western Canadian horseman Bill Davis dead at 54

Standardbred Canada reported Saturday that longtime horseman Bill Davis of Langley, BC has died at the age of 54. The cause of death was not reported prior to press time.

Davis was a two-time O'Brien Award winner, receiving the O'Brien Award of Horsemanship in 2003 as the inaugural recipient and again in 2014.

Perennially a top trainer and driver in British Columbia, Davis won 5,477 races and nearly \$20 million as a driver. He had 3,466 wins and earnings of more than \$13 million as a trainer. Fifteen times since trainer statistics were first kept in 1991 Davis posted a UTRS of more than .400, including 11 straight years from 1998 through 2008.

Davis is the father of Ontario-based driver Billy Davis, Jr., who has more than 2,000 wins and \$16.5 million to his credit.

State Treasurer fourth in '16 debut

State Treasurer, Canada's 2015 Horse of the Year, finished fourth in his 2016 debut Saturday (April 30) in the \$34,000 preferred handicap at Mohawk Racetrack dominated by Bill Robinson trainee Nickel Bag.

Trevor Henry drove Nickel Bag to a four-and-three-quarter length victory over Mohawk Warrior and The Rev in a career best 1:49.

State Treasurer, trained by Dr. Ian Moore and driven by Chris Christoforou, started from the nine-hole in the field of nine and finished five lengths back. The seven-year-old son of Real Desire—Ideal Treasure has earned \$1.8 million on the track for Sally and Allan MacDonald of Prince Edward Island and their nephew Paul MacDonald of Toronto.

In 2015, State Treasurer won nine of 19 starts and \$865,807 and was named the Older Pacer of the Year in both Canada and the United States.

8th straight for Freaky Feet Pete

On a chilly night in Indiana, odds-on favorites were hot at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Saturday (April 30) as both of the heavy favorites delivered in the \$21,000 featured trot and pace. Each of the featured events saw familiar faces in

the winner's circle as both races produced repeat winners from the previous week.

Freaky Feet Pete, the 2015 Breeders Crown Champion for three-year-old pacing colts, turned in another dominant performance to score his second consecutive Hoosier Park victory in the \$21,000 invitational pace and his eighth straight pari-mutuel win going back to Oct. 3, 2015. With regular driver Trace Tetrick at the lines, Freaky Feet Pete stopped the timer in 1:50.2 over a sloppy rated track.

Using the same front-running tactics as the previous week, Freaky Feet Pete dictated first half fractions of :27.1 :55.2 while Fearless Diablo and LeWayne Miller benefitted from a pocket trip. With the heavy betting favorite calling the shots on the front, the rest of the field remained in single file line down the backside.

Bluehourpower and Ricky Macomber Jr. were the first to commit to the outer flow but Freaky Feet Pete began to inch away from the field with every stride. With a three-quarter clocking in 1:23, Freaky Feet Pete began to put his talent on display as the rest of the field struggled to stay within striking distance.

Freaky Feet Pete cruised to the wire under a hand drive from Tetrick finishing six-and-a-half lengths in front of Fearless Diablo. SF Donttellonme and Joey Casagranda used a late closing kick to round out the trifecta.

With the win, Freaky Feet Pete notched the second win of his four-year-old campaign and 26th career victory from 29 lifetime outings. The homebred son of Rockin Image—Skyway Lori has now earned \$1,136,724 lifetime for his owners Mary Jo Rheinheimer and Marty Rheinheimer.

In much the same fashion on the trotting side of things, Hannelore Hanover and Ricky Macomber Jr. extended their winning streak as they easily handled an abbreviated field of six in the \$21,000 invitational trot in 1:52.4 over a track rated good. Hannelore Hanover was unhurried from the gate and settled along the rail in third behind Churita and Trace Tetrick who reached the first quarter mark in :28. Macomber Jr. gave Hannelore Hanover the green light down the backside and the Ron Burke trainee easily reached the front to dictate middle fractions of :57 and 1:24.4.

As the field turned for home, Hannelore Hanover was two lengths in front of her next closest competitor and used a :28 final panel to coast home three lengths to the good. Churita maintained her position to finish second while Rever Ever rallied nicely to finish third. As the heavy betting favorite, Hannelore Hanover returned \$3.20 at the betting window.

The four-year-old daughter of Swan For All—High Sobriety

notched her fourth consecutive victory and remains undefeated in four starts in 2016. Owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, and F. Baldachino, Hannelore Hanover has now amassed \$345,324 lifetime.

Triple Crown winner No Pan Intended has died

Triple Crown winner, No Pan Intended, died Friday (April 29) after a freak accident at Oakwood Stud in Ireland.

He was 16.

Derek Delaney reported the son of Pacific Fella—Classic Wish had exercised earlier in the day as he always does and then when being led to the breeding shed, No Pan Intended had reared up, flipped over backwards and landed on his head and was dead.

"It was the same routine we did with him all the time," Delaney said. "He is always feeling good, full of himself, so we exercise him in the paddock or hook him up to a jog cart and go a few miles to take some sting out of him before going to the breeding shed. It was just a freak accident, nothing more. We sent his body to the equine hospital for an autopsy."

Bred by Winbak Farms of Maryland and purchased as a yearling by Robert Glazer of the Peter Pan Stables, No Pan Intended was trained by Ivan Sugg.

As a two-year-old he showed speed and ability, taking a record of 1:55 and earning \$115,883 in 13 starts. At three, No Pan Intended crushed nearly every foe he faced.

No Pan Intended became only the 10th horse in history to win the pacing Triple Crown back in 2003. As a three-year-old, he won 17 of 21 starts with earnings of \$1.46 million.

His Triple Crown victories came in the Cane Pace, Little Brown Jug and Messenger Pace. That year he also won the Breeders Crown, James B Dancer Memorial, Tattersalls Pace and the Art Rooney Pace, ending the season with a lifetime mark of 1:50.3. He was driven exclusively during his three-year-old season by David Miller.

As a stallion, No Pan Intended has had 551 registered foals with 424 of those foals racing and sporting combined earnings of more than \$35,150,000.

He was voted the 2003 Harness Horse of the Year by the U.S. Harness Writers' Association.

No Pan Intended is a brother to two other world champion million dollar plus performers, Hall of Fame inductee Bettor's

Delight (\$2.5 million) and Roll With Joe (\$1.8 million).

"We are just sick over this," Delany said. "He was set to be the best stallion in all of Ireland and the UK with a full book this season and then in June he was to fly to Australia and stand the season there."

Gotmoneyinmypocket wins Hackett at Miami Valley

Gotmoneyinmypocket put money in owners Jerry Zosel and Kathy Ratcliff's pockets on Saturday night (April 30) at Miami Valley Raceway, capturing the \$35,000 James K. Hackett Memorial championship in impressive fashion.

The three-year-old Ohio-sired son of Feelin Friskie set sail immediately for driver Kayne Kauffman, settling in briefly in fourth despite drawing an outside post position. Realizing the fractions were relatively soft, Kauffman moved Gotmoneyinmypocket to the outside shortly after the :28.2 opening quarter and was lapped on to the leader at the :58.2 halfway point.

Immediately after crossing over to the lead, a host of other Buckeye-breds mounted challenges that looked promising, but in the end the winner pulled away to a three-and-a-half length triumph in 1:53.1, including a final panel in :28 flat. Bill Dailey trains Gotmoneyinmypocket, who now sports an \$88,600 bankroll in just a dozen lifetime starts.

Friskie Cruiser (Ryan Stahl), the runner-up in last year's \$225,000 Ohio Sires Stakes championship for freshman pacers, finished second with Whataboy (Chris Page) completing the Hackett final trifecta.

Dominion Beach, a son of Muscle Hill out of Windylane Hanover is trained by Johansson's wife, Nancy, for Courant AB of Stockholm, Sweden.

Callahan wins six at Big M

With many of the regulars racing at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, driver Corey Callahan took full advantage and won six races on the 12-race program Saturday (April 30) at the Meadowlands.

A win behind Mel Mara in the featured \$17,500 conditioned pace were among Callahan's half-dozen.

Callahan's six pack came with Amped Up (\$3.60 to win) in the second race, Backdraft Hanover (\$3.20) in the fourth, Mel Mara (\$3.80) in the seventh, Alexie Mattosie (\$4) in the ninth, Calvin B (\$13.20) in the 10th and Ourea Nourrir (\$13.80) in the 11th.

SUPER JACKPOT: The 12th race 20 cent Jackpot Super High Five did not get hit again, upping the carryover for the next program to \$204,233.16.

Total wagering on the card was \$2,887,281.

Next week, the Meadowlands will alter its schedule. The track will go dark for live racing Friday and then race Saturday (May 7) at the usual 7:15 p.m. before a special Mother's Day program on Sunday, May 8, which has a special early post time of 12:40 p.m.

Cheaper fees for fractional groups in Canada

On Wednesday (April 27), Standardbred Canada's Board of Directors approved a fee change that will make it easier, and more cost effective, for new owners to become involved in harness racing through fractional stables and partnerships.

Effective immediately, new members, or returning members out for a full period of two or more years, who enter the industry in a stable with a minimum of eight people, will receive two years of full Standardbred Canada membership for \$45 plus applicable taxes (to their birthday in 2018). The Stable registration fee remains the standard rate of \$130.

New members involved in fractional stables will have the same privileges as all other paid members, plus they will receive a one-week free trial to Trackit.

"Management has worked in consultation with industry

stakeholders and the Board to develop this program," said Linda Bedard, Standardbred Canada's Registrar and Manager of Member Services. "We recognize with large syndicate groups that new people may enter the business owning as little as one per cent of a horse. It is our goal to help transition these new owners into a full membership over a period of time."

Buyer for Balmoral?

Loeb Winternitz, the Chicago, IL-based company in charge of the Balmoral and Maywood Park auctions, has posted a legal notice on their website (click here to go to that site) stating that they have received an offer to purchase Balmoral Park and have temporarily suspended the auction for the Crete, IL racetrack. The offer will be presented to the Bankruptcy Court on May 3.

The notice does not identify the potential buyer and notes that this offer doesn't have any effect on the Maywood Park auction.

The following is the legal notice posted on the Loeb Winternitz website:

The Debtors have advised us that, on April 27, they received an offer to purchase Balmoral Racing Clubs' real estate and all tangible personal property in Bulk. After consideration of the offer with its primary creditors, advisors and other parties in interest, the Debtors have determined to present the Bulk Offer with regard to the Balmoral Assets to the Bankruptcy Court on Tuesday, May 3rd at 9:30 a.m., and to seek authority to proceed with the Bulk Offer as being in the best interests of the Debtors' Estates. As a result of this offer, the Debtors have instructed us to temporarily adjourn the auction, and take no further action until the results of that Court Hearing are announced. Accordingly, we will update our website upon notification after the hearing, anticipated to conclude on May 3rd.

** The Bulk Offer does not include any property of Maywood Park, and the auction of the Maywood property remains unaffected.

More on Milici: NY Commission "a failure in protecting the wagering public"

When the New York State Racing and Wagering Board (RWB) was funded by money generated by racing, it would never license Mr. Milici.

It is great to hear Tom Milici has got his life sober and in now a happy man. But, as for the integrity of racing, he belongs nowhere near a racehorse.

Tom did do things the way he was supposed to. He got professional help and is maintaining sobriety.

He has documented proof of his employment and on-going treatment for drugs and alcohol.

This is what the board wants to see, when making decisions on who gets another chance and, who does not. His employment with Jimmy Takter sure did enhance his chances too, as the old RWB always put a great deal of stock in the company you keep.

Their mandate to police the game is hampered by their lack of commitment from the state and opposition from racing interests.

This is what you get when your entity is a liability and not a revenue generating portion of the operating budget. It has no political power or will.

So, as long as 90 per cent of money in racing is generated by entities other than racing, you will get a New York State Gaming Commission, giving you a 10 per cent effort.

Unlike the aforementioned 1950's when paper trails with betting were impossible, today it's all one big paper trail." Well, to quote Ace Ventura, "Oh, re-he-heally." The gathering of statistical information and then having the knowledge to apply it properly are not one and the same.

Referring back to Dave Briggs' article on reporting foul deeds to those who can do something about it he said, "I appreciate the frustration of those that want to report wrongdoing, but decide against it because they don't expect the racing commission or track in their jurisdiction to act."

Let me relay a recent experience of mine on trusting the powers that be being able to correctly analyze data. I reported an unsatisfactory drive to the NJ racing commission where the driver refused to tip his horse for clearance despite having no horse blocking him. Elitlopp a "once-in-a-lifetime adventure"

Regarding the connections comments, about the upcoming The Mack Lobell Elitlopp Playoff, and whether they would actually go to The Elitlopp or not, if invited (HRU — April 24): Two things:

- 1. The connections are worried about missing out on some U.S. races if accepting the invite. There is a difference this year to keep in mind. A sponsorship has made it possible for the Swedish track Solvalla to charter a plane for the horses and fly them in to an airport close to Stockholm. Previous years, horses have flown to Holland/Belgium and been trucked up. Some horses where traveling 70+ hours each way. Not easy to perform well and, of course, many horses needed a recovery time when back home. With this direct flight, horses can fly a few days out, race and fly back home a day or two after the race. This will improve the horses chances to perform on top and it will shorten the recovery time when back home.
- 2. The connections say that there are so many races for their horses over here and so much money to race for and earn here in the US. True, and that is good thing. My question is: Do you only have your horses to earn money? If you do, then I understand. But... what about taking your horse on a once-in-a-lifetime adventure? Experience the top of the world in harness racing? Ron Burke has it right, it is an extraordinary experience and if you can win, you will never forget that day, or copy it.

With the chartered plane there is a chance that other horses could be invited to race in other races during that weekend. They have three-year-old Elite (Open and fillies), four-year-old Elite (Open and fillies), Elite mares, Sweden Cup (Heat racing for the class just below The Elitlopp horses) and Harper Hanover, which is a longer race and may not be suited for most U.S. horses, but maybe some.

To go and race in the Elitlopp, you need a very good horse and in excellent form. It is a tough race, tough horses and a different way of racing. The "regular" top of the line FFA trotters will usually not do. You need the top, like Bee A Magician, Shake It Cerry, JL Cruze or that level. If you have a horse of that caliber and in form, take the chance! It is a once in a lifetime experience. Ask John Campbell or other people that have raced there!!

The Curmudgeon's list of the greatest mares he has seen was pretty comprehensive. I can't imagine there are many great horses over the last 50-plus years that he hasn't seen. Of course, he has helped sell many of them.

There were only five horses on his list, including the honorable mentions, that I didn't see myself. There is one largely forgotten mare The Curmudgeon fails to mention that definitely belongs with all the great mares that he did. I'm talking about Brooklet's Pride and anyone who followed Chicago racing in the mid-80s would be hard-pressed not to agree. This was a time when racing circuits were much more self-contained than they are today. The purses in Chicago at the time were good enough that there was no real reason for Homer Hochstetler to take her out East to take on horses like Green With Envy and May Wine. If he had, I'm sure she would have at least given a good account of herself, if not crushing them at a nice mutuel price.

Brooklet's Pride regularly took on and easily defeated the free-for-all colts in Chicago, usually in wire-to-wire fashion. She simply laid over all the locals mares, and there were plenty of good ones in that era. At the time, she took her record of 1:54.1 at Sportsman's Park, I believe only Cam Fella and Albatross had ever paced that five-eighths-mile oval faster. It was just an unbelievable mile. So here's to Brooklet's Pride, a great race mare that deserves to be remembered.
