# **BREAKING STRIDE**



when I say that.

So, why does the entire world suddenly know all about Patch and his sentimentally cycloptic road to the Derby? I mean, look at me. I'm a guy who breeds morning glory vines for Pete's sake, yet somehow I know all about this equine pirate in spite of the fact that my head is buried so deeply up in harness racing? Ironically, because my head is buried up in harness racing and not buried up in some other places, I am merrily unencumbered when I write things about harness racing. In other words, I'm not beholden to anyone, and today I am free to write non-glowingly about the nonstop promotion of the Kentucky Derby that comes from within the disloyal harness racing community itself. 

Anyway, I know all about Patch and his missing eye, because the story is all over the news and in my social media. Let's face it, we live in a thoroughbred world. Heck, I even know that we won't be seeing Bob Baffert's breezy forelock this year because, according to USA Today, "he will be watching the Derby from his couch." See what I mean? A trainer who isn't even in the freaking race, makes headlines in a major newspaper.

What's the deal with that? Why has Dan Patch, a colossal horse who attracted millions of fans from hundreds and hundreds of miles around, been replaced by a 50-1 shot named Patch? Why will Patch be a household name for perhaps seven weeks, when very few people have given Dan



Patch a sustained thought in over 100 years?

Seriously, have any of you folks out there in Harness Racing Land taken a gander at your social media or the online racetrack promotions in the past few weeks? I mean, it's the Merry, Merry Month of May, people. There's this invigorating standardbred springtime blooming up all around us, but all you see are ads and social media postings about Kentucky Derby horses that arise from within the ranks of standardbred racing itself.

Did some of you folks forget about all of those awesome yearlings from Harrisburg and Lexington and everywhere else that we've been waiting on since October? These seedlings are sprouting now, and if you don't pay careful attention you might have missed the beauty of it all whilst favoring the Derby or the Preakness or the Belmont.

To be fair, there are many people in the harness racing world who go out of their way to glorify the young ones in which they've invested a lot of time and money and devotion. I know because I interact with them in social media. They know who they are. Then, however, I sometimes stumble upon this alien cadre of harness people who do nothing but glorify the runners. I don't know, maybe they

# Tattersalls Spring Mixed Sale Preview

Sunday's sale at the Meadowlands offers a huge number of horses currently racing

Of the more than 90 horses set to sell at the Tattersalls Spring Mixed Sale on Sunday (May 7) in the paddock at the Meadowlands Racetrack, 83 have raced recently, or are in to go tonight or tomorrow before hitting the auction ring.

"I can't stress enough for the public to check the updated racelines on http://www.tattersallsredmile.com, because 56 horses have raced in the last seven days and there's 27 horses that are in to race from today through Saturday," sale manager David Reid said Thursday. "It's not a big sale. As far as numbers are concerned, we're down a little bit from last year, but the number of horses racing is, I think, the highest percentage we've had in a mixed sale in a long time."

More than 93 standardbreds — about 80 in the main catalogue minus the outs, plus 13 in the supplement — are expected to go through the ring beginning at noon, sharp.

Last year, the Tattersalls Spring Mixed Sale was held a month later to try to take advantage of those wishing to sell or buy two-year-olds.

"With the two-year-old market, the buyers seem to want to have horses racing," Reid said. "The training aspect of it just didn't seem to take off. But we do feel there's going to be a market for the two-year-olds that have baby raced and/or raced. So, we have a proposed date to have the sale at the Meadowlands on July 16 with the hope that by shifting the

two-year-olds that would normally be in this sale to the mixed sale in July that the two-year-olds would be qualified or baby raced and racing by then. I'm quite excited about that. The timing for Sunday's sale is you've got a lot of stables coming north from Florida. Sometimes those people want to focus on their stakes operations and it gives the owner and trainer an opportunity to create some cash flow and stall space to focus on the upcoming stakes season. That's the reason I moved it up this year."

Reid will have the largest consignment at the sale through his company Preferred Equine Marketing, which will send 56 horses into the ring. He pointed out a few notable horses.

"Our consignment is led by a 15-horse reduction from the Ron Burke and Partners stable. It is led by hip #78, Rock N Roll World. He's a well-bred horse from a deep family and the horse is racing and winning," Reid said. "He's in to go Saturday night at the Meadowlands. The one thing that gets overlooked a little bit is the Burke and Partners Stable, they started buying younger horses a few years ago and they've been having these semi-reductions at Mixed Sales and the graduates have gone on for the new owners, including the runnerup from this year's Levy and the Matchmaker finals, Somewhere in L A. He was a graduate of one of the reductions and Medusa. She was second in the final of the Matchmaker. So, they have life in them, they have races left to



go. Most of them are racing in conditioned events. I think there's a number of horses there that are racing at many venues and get around all size tracks and are useful racehorses."

Northwood Bloodstock's Bob Boni will sell 28 horses Sunday. He pointed out a number of horses, most notably, "hip 103, Bend In The River. He's in the supplement and he's going to be entered in the final of the Weiss. He's won a couple of legs, he's been second in a couple of legs, he was second two nights ago. He's a legit horse that's going to be eligible right away for a \$30,000 race. It will be drawn by sale time. He's a horse that you're going to know where he's going to be. That race is Tuesday night at Pocono. He was second the other night. He's won a couple of legs. He'll be one of the favorites in the race. That makes him an ideal horse for somebody and he's been a decent horse before that. I would definitely look to him.

"Something a little more proven, one of the nicer pacing mares in the sale is Vintage Babe #62. A nice update is Shady McCoy. Another nice horse that qualified well at Harrington the other day, Bad Gamer, 34. He's a horse that's made \$100,000-some odd lifetime, a horse that can go on any kind of racetrack. He went a good mile at Harrington and he'll fit anywhere. He' going to find a spot in almost any racetrack you take him to. One of the nicer trotting mares in the sale, would be Alvarez, #31, an Andover Hall, a stakes winner. She's shown she can win at Yonkers. That's pretty good money when you're racing at Yonkers."

Reid said Preferred is also selling some nice three-year-old prospects.

"Hip #6 (Aplomb Hanover), he's been racing very well. He's a green trotter. He was just second on May 2 at Pocono in :56.3. He's a nice prospect. Hip #11 (Iminurblindspot) is a Bettor's Delight that has been racing over at Pocono and last week he was timed in :52 and change. He's a nice prospect. Hip #25 (Town Speaker), he had five wins in 11 starts. He's a horse that I think is going to go on. Hip #27 (Twist Of Fate), a very nice, well-bred New York-eligible filly and well-staked. She was just third in the Weiss final the other night racing against older horses. There again, it's a filly that's well-staked, well-bred and racing very well. Then for four-year-old prospects, I have a liking to hip #35, Blaise MM Hanover. He has four wins this year and been 1-2-3 in nine of 10 starts and a proven winner over all size tracks. Raced very well at Yonkers and raced very well the last two starts at Harrah's (Philadelphia). Hip #40, Home James, a horse that came in from Canada. He was just third last week at Pocono in 1:51.4. Hip #75, Parnu Hanover, he was a recent winner at Yonkers in :52.4 and, obviously, Rock N Roll World, who was a

winner last week at Harrah's."

Boni added that he's selling, "a good horse in the supplement, a legit horse. He's in to go the night before the sale, Winds Of Change. Here's a horse that won that won in :50.4 at Yonkers last year and two weeks ago won in :53 at Yonkers and he's just starting back this year. He made 33 starts last year and he's just making his fifth start here on Saturday night at Yonkers. He's an open pacer. He won an open at Yonkers last year. He's racing just below that now, but he's shown that he can race with top horses. He's a six-year-old American Ideal and he's made almost half-a-million lifetime."

Both Reid and Boni stressed the "cliché line" that there is something for everybody.

"These are horses that have proven to get around all size tracks. With all the racetracks open and racing right now, I really think we have a nice offering of horses for multiple venues," Reid said.

## So, it begins...

Top freshmen Huntsville and Downbytheseaside will launch their sophomore campaigns in Saturday's \$151,280 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes event at The Meadows.

Huntsville and Downbytheseaside, harness racing's top 2-year-old colt pacers in 2016, will launch their sophomore campaigns — and quest for divisional and Horse of the Year honors — in Saturday's \$151,280 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) at The Meadows.

The Kentucky Derby Day card at The Meadows marks the kickoff of the spring/summer meeting after a two-week hiatus and also features an \$80,000 PA Stallion Series event for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers. Special post time is 11:25 a.m..

Huntsville won the Dan Patch Award as the best 2-year-old male pacer, sealing the deal with an impressive victory in the Breeders Crown final. Pennsylvania's 2016 champion, Huntsville is the fastest freshman ever at The Meadows with a 1:50 clocking in an August PASS split. Trained by Ray Schnittker, the son of Somebeachsomewhere-Wild West Show earned \$689,814 — and never finished worse than second in 11 outings — for his owners, Ted Gewertz, Charles lanazzo, Steven Arnold and Schnittker.

Schnittker indicated he was pleased with Huntsville's two qualifiers to prep for the PASS, which included a 1:51.3 mile at the Meadowlands. He said he's switched Huntsville to an open bridle this year but won't tinker much with his rigging.

"With the good ones, you usually don't want to screw them up," he said. "Right now everything looks good.

"I hope he gets a good trip. As long as he's closing at the wire, I'll be happy. I hope he wins, but horses like him are racing hard week after week."

Huntsville goes from the rail in race eight with Tim Tetrick aboard. The champ must contend with a new shooter, Highalator, who, after a two-race freshman season, has won nine straight this year, including the championship of the Weiss series. Highalator leaves from post 3 with Vic Kirby.

Brian Brown, conditioner of Downbytheseaside, made what could be a significant change when he added Lasix for the colt's two recent qualifiers. The son of Somebeachsomewhere—Sprig Hanover, who races for Country Club Acres, Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and Diamond Creek Racing, will use the medication Saturday.

"Last year, there was a hint of bleeding after training one day, just a spot," Brown said. "Just to be on the safe side, we went ahead and did it."

Lasix seemed to settle the horse in his qualifiers, when he raced off the pace — at least for a while.

"He's not two fingers to drive, so we were very happy that he could sit that long," Brown said. "And when he moved he went right by."

Brown indicated he's pleased that Downbytheseaside and Huntsville didn't draw into the same division.

"That's not to say Huntsville is the only horse to beat  $-\mathsf{I}$  have six horses to beat. They'll meet eventually;  $\mathsf{I}$  just didn't want it to be in their first race."

Downbytheseaside last year set world records on half-mile and mile tracks. He was runner-up to Huntsville in the Dan Patch Award voting but got a measure of revenge by defeating his archrival in the Governor's Cup. He leaves from post 3, with Chris Page in the sulky, in race 9.

### **Cutler features field of 12**

Crazy Wow and JL Cruze highlight the first big stake of 2017 for open trotters that goes Saturday at The Meadowlands.

Crazy Wow and JL Cruze didn't have the best of luck last year, but their connections are hoping for better fortunes this season. The two horses are among a dozen ready for Grand Circuit action in Saturday's \$200,000 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial for older trotters at the Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey.

The Cutler attracted 13 horses, with European newcomer Tuonoblu Rex eliminated from the 12-horse field based on 2016-17 earnings. Tuonoblu Rex will race Sunday at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

The size of the field will require two horses to start in the second tier — Windsun Revenge and Muscle Diamond — which means the race will be contested at 1-1/8 miles.

JL Cruze, the 2015 Dan Patch Award winner for best older male trotter, won five of 18 races in 2016 and earned \$231,355 in purses. He battled issues with dehydration and synchronous diaphragmatic flutter, more commonly referred to as thumps, throughout the season.

"He wouldn't drink away from home very well," trainer Eric Ell said. "We fought that most of the year. It was an issue with a little bit of dehydration. We finally did get him straightened out at the end of the year. As far as soundness, he was fine. He had an okay year. He probably should have made double or three times what he made if he didn't have the thumps. But it is what it is. We hope this year is going to be better."

JL Cruze failed to win on the Grand Circuit last year. He

finished third in the Breeders Crown Open Trot, Cashman Memorial, and Allerage Farms Open Trot.

"He was in the hunt a lot, but he was always like fourth or fifth best," Ell said. "He's come back really well. He's carrying his weight better than he ever has, he feels better than he ever has. He's had a little bit of foot issues, which he's had in the past and they're still with him. But other than that he's fantastic. If I could ever get him a hundred percent I think he could go with most any of them out there."

In 2015, JL Cruze won the Hambletonian Maturity at 1-1/8 miles in a world-record 2:04.2 at the Meadowlands. He also won the Graduate Series championship at the Big M in a world-record 1:49.4 and captured the Sun Invitational at Pocono in a world-record-equaling 1:51.

JL Cruze began this year with a third-place finish behind Rock Of Cashel and Opulent Yankee last Friday at the Meadowlands. He was beaten by a nose in 1:51.3.

"He was tremendous," Ell said. "He lost a little bit of ground in the last turn and that's the only thing that got him beat."

David Miller drove JL Cruze in his seasonal debut, but will be unavailable Saturday because of his daughter's college graduation, Ell said. Corey Callahan will get the assignment in the sulky. JL Cruze will start from post seven.



Crazy Wow, who won \$1.02 million in 2015 at age three and banked \$280,524 last season, will start the Cutler from post six with Yannick Gingras driving for trainer Ron Burke.

Last year, Crazy Wow won one of 14 races, but he finished the campaign strongly with a second-place finish by a nose to Obrigado in the TVG Free For All Series championship at the Meadowlands. He also was second in the Allerage and fifth (beaten by 2-1/4 lengths) in the Breeders Crown.

"He started to turn it around at the end of last year," Burke said. "I was happy with the way he finished. Anything that could go wrong did go wrong earlier in the year. Finally things started to go better for him. Maybe mentally he matured too. They have to get tougher to race in that division against the older horses. Maybe he toughened himself up mentally.

"He has plenty of ability. He wasn't that far from the best ones last year. I definitely think he has the right to get even better this year."

Crazy Wow made his seasonal debut April 21 at the Meadowlands and finished second to Tuonoblu Rex in 1:52.1.

"I was very happy with his first start," Burke said. "He came back excellent."

Burke has two more starters in the Cutler, Rose Run Parker and Gural Hanover. Rose Run Parker will start from post eight and Gural Hanover from post nine.

"They're both working their way back," Burke said. "I think they're all right, but they drew the worst two spots. It's going to be a long road from out there. They're going to have to try to find a way to get in the flow without getting locked in and try to pick them up late. So we'll see."

Burke's Hannelore Hanover, who received the 2016 Dan Patch Award for best older female trotter and finished one vote behind Marion Marauder for Trotter of the Year, will skip the Cutler in favor of Sunday's \$86,000 Miami Valley Distaff for trotting mares.

"I had her in (the Cutler) and then I took her out of the second payment," Burke said. "She's going to race against the boys enough this year that I'm not going to do it starting off the year. Pretty much every other time there's a bigger race, with boys going for more money, if she's as sharp as I think she is I'll give her shots against the boys."

Following is the Cutler field in post order with listed drivers and trainers. The Cutler is race seven on Saturday's Meadowlands card, with a 9:15 p.m. estimated post time.

# Will Southwind Cobra strike in Dexter Cup?

The Ron Burke trainee is one of four Hambletonian-eligible trotters in the \$143,737 final at Freehold.

Ron Burke is unsure what to expect from Southwind Cobra. There is no question, the trainer says, the horse is talented. There remains question whether he will fulfill his potential.

Southwind Cobra might give Burke and his fellow owners some indication on Saturday when he faces seven rivals in the \$143,737 Dexter Cup for 3-year-old male trotters at Freehold Raceway. The Dexter Cup is the first Grand Circuit race on the road to August's \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes.

Four of the eight Dexter Cup finalists are eligible to the Hambletonian: Southwind Cobra, Another Chapter, Earl Variera, and Sir John F.

Another Chapter won one of last weekend's two Dexter Cup eliminations. Lord Cromwell won the other. Southwind Cobra did not compete in the elims because Burke elected to take a bye, based on career earnings, to the final.

"We thought at the beginning of last year he was our best 2-year-old," said Burke, who owns Southwind Cobra with Jack Piatt II, Larry Karr, and the partnership of Mark Weaver and Mike Bruscemi. "He was a disappointment. There were points where he would show some things, but then there were points where he would show nothing. It was inconsistency and a lack of, really, wanting to win.

"It's wait-and-see with him. He has all the talent in the world. He just needs to put it together."

Southwind Cobra is a son of Muscle Hill, the 2009

Hambletonian winner and Horse of the Year, out of the mare Caerphilly. He was purchased for \$120,000 at the 2015 Lexington Selected Sale and his family includes stakes-winner No Pan No Gain (the dam of Burke-trained millionaire Crazy Wow) and, more distantly, Hall of Famer Proximity.

Last year Southwind Cobra won two of 13 races and earned \$96,296. Both wins came on the Grand Circuit, in divisions of the International Stallion Stakes and Tompkins-Geers, and his mark of 1:53.3 was fifth best among all 2-year-old male trotters in 2016. But he went off stride in eliminations for the Peter Haughton Memorial, William Wellwood Memorial and Breeders Crown and failed to advance to any of those finals.

Southwind Cobra has raced once this season, finishing third in a conditioned race at the Meadowlands on April 21. Burke was happy the Dexter Cup attracted a number of starters (17) that required one horse to take a bye so the group could be divided into two eight-horse eliminations on Freehold's half-mile oval.

"I wanted the bye," said Burke, who won the 2015 Dexter Cup with Habitat. "I thought (Southwind Cobra's) first race was just all right. I wasn't thrilled with it. I was looking to give him a week off, but didn't think I would have the opportunity. Then when I got the bye it gave me a week to train him and get him ready.

"I trained him (Wednesday) on the half-mile track at Gaitway. I wasn't sure how he would handle the half, but he got around it perfect. It didn't seem like it affected him at all. I look for him to be sharp hopefully."

Southwind Cobra will start the Dexter Cup final from post No. 5. Elim winners Lord Cromwell will leave from post two and Another Chapter from post eight. Another Chapter, who broke his maiden with his elim victory, is a half-brother to stakes-winner Spider Blue Chip.

Sir John F, who won at Freehold the week prior to finishing third in the Dexter Cup elimination captured by Another Chapter, is from the stable of four-time Dexter Cup winner Jimmy Takter. Sir John F, who drew post one, is a half-brother to Ontario star Emoticon Hanover, who finished second to Broadway Donna in last season's Breeders Crown for 3-year-old female trotters.

Earl Variera, winless in six career races, will start from post three for trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt, who won last year's Dexter Cup with Dante.

Saturday's Freehold card also includes two \$36,850 divisions of the Lady Suffolk Stakes for 3-year-old female

trotters. Princess Aurora, a stakes-winner last season and runner-up to Ariana G in the Breeders Crown for 2-year-old filly trotters, leads a group of three Hambletonian Oaks eligibles (with Pennys N Dimes and Sparkle Plenty) in the first division. Romancing Rachel and Winter Sweet Frost are the Oaks eligible in the second division.

Following is the Dexter Cup field in post order with listed drivers and trainers. The Dexter is race 10, with a 3:30 p.m. estimated post time.




## 'Branding' our big events has more potential than you might think

As the Kentucky Derby shows, leveraging a brand's popularity opens doors for an entire sport in today's connected world



On Saturday, as everyone knows, the Kentucky Derby will be raced once again. The storied franchise has had its up and downs, but of late it's certainly on the upswing. In the year 2000, 9.1 million people in the U.S. tuned in to see Fusaichi Pegasus romp to victory. Sixteen years later, almost 16 million watched Nyquist cross the line first. Some things in horse racing are still very strong.



The Derby's success (in viewership, attendance and betting volume the last 10 or 15 years) did not just happen. From television, to partnerships, to futures betting, to media buys, to Internet properties and much more, Churchill Downs has invested heavily. This investment in the Derby brand opens doors, beyond the obvious key performance indicators.

An interesting recent phenomenon in our world is occurring right before our eyes – second screen searches. This is when you or I see an event, commercial or other stimulus on television and reach for our smart phones to research it. Google reported that last year, two thirds of smart phone users grabbed their phones for such a purpose.

What's especially intriguing about this is that the sport, or event, or commercial does not have to be a mainstream one. For example, last year at the **Rio Olympics**, second screen searches for more obscure sports spiked in what marketers


call "I want to do" moments. These are phrases such as, "rugby near me", "how do I make a balance beam", or "judo classes" typed directly into Google or Bing. These are very new fans of a sport, trying to find out more than just about the sport's rules; they're inquiring how they can be a part of something. This is high-funnel marketing at its finest.

Similarly, we see the exact same effects when it comes to the Derby.

Here are screenshots of monthly searches for several words that are very important to everyone who is concerned about the future of horse racing.


Searches for "horse betting":






Searches for "how to bet on horses":

This is about as clear as a driver change from William the Refrigerator Perry to Corey Callahan. In May, people are interested to learn more about horse racing – betting, watching, handicapping, or owning than any other month. And it's not even close. The Kentucky Derby might be only a two-minute race, but it's a storefront and a gateway for an entire industry.

The reason this can be so powerful is that the above searchers display intent at the first point of contact. They are reaching out to you; you are not trying to contact and sell to them. This is not running a social media campaign, or a banner ad or billboard advertising a tire sale for Michelin 250's and hoping someone who needs tires sees it. This is a customer saying she wants Michelin 250's and she's looking for you.

What an industry does with this potential customer is the next step (and not an unimportant step) of the journey.

For harness racing, in terms of scale this is apples to grapefruits, of course. The Derby is the Derby, and, well, our sport does not even have a Triple Crown of any discernable sort. But in my view, the principle is exactly the same.

Harness racing has three very good brands – The Hambletonian, Breeders Crown and the Little Brown Jug. Each of these unique events has worldwide appeal and some (but not nearly enough) following. To build these brands so they have value, I'd offer that they need to partner and follow the Kentucky Derby and Churchill Downs Inc. script.

Leaving aside the fact that an undertaking like this costs money (Churchill Downs didn't create the upswing in the Derby brand with rubles), the action plan would be fairly simple: to build each brand with infrastructure and tactics that maximizes the return on marketing spend. Then, as the new brand attracts potential fans, bettors and owners, an ecosystem has to be constructed that is able to convert them from high funnel to low funnel, and ultimately, to sales.

I've always believed this sport has boundless potential, but in my view, it doesn't take advantage of its very favorable

place in the market. Harness racing hasn't invested as it should; it has not built a product, event or brand that the market wants; it's, at times, paralyzed when it comes to big picture issues that the rest of the gambling and sport world deals with on an almost daily basis. It's troubling to many of

One way to bridge the gap, in my view, is to follow scripts that work, no matter what the industry; no matter if the

horses run, or trot. If harness racing wants to pack the car for a road trip, there are nuggets in what the Kentucky Derby does that provide it with a pretty good map.

# HOLDING STEADY

The Levy and Matchmaker series represent the best opportunity to build a bankroll during the first four months of the season, and **Ron Burke** has done just that, year after year. However, this time he had no finalist in either one and just a pair of starters in the Levy consolation; Caviart Luca was third and Rockin Ron fourth. Still, the presumptive Hall of Famer was able to work around that paucity of aged pacing talent and hit the \$3 million mark on the same day — April 28 — that he hit it last year. Burke is number one at The Meadows, where he wins better than 29 per cent of his starts and he's also on top at The Meadowlands. Burke is number five at Yonkers and Northfield and number three at the young Hoosier Park meet. His UTRS is a stellar 0.354. He gets around.

Rene Allard, who sports a UTRS of 0.357, is second once again. He made the same number of starts, but won 19 more races and upped his earnings by \$371,000. Allard formed a rewarding partnership with the popular young Quebec transplant Louis Philippe Roy at Woodbine; Allard won more than 27 per cent of his starts at the WEG track and was second to Canada's top trainer Richard Moreau on the money list. Allard ended the first four months of the year third overall in Canada. However, he hit an impediment when One Too Many came up positive for Codeine and Morphine and was suspended for 90 days. The trainer was not suspended, pending a hearing, but broke camp and headed for Pennsylvania, where he is number one at Pocono Downs, winning at a 30 per cent clip. He is also number four at Yonkers, where he won the Levy with Keystone Velocity, the

richest horse in North America.

Veteran trainer **Richard Banca**, who has established himself as the leader at Yonkers Raceway, is third, just as he was at this time last year. Banca has 17 fewer wins than he had then, but his money is up by more than \$724,000. Somewhere In LA has spent much of the season hovering around the top end of the all horse earnings list and is currently number two off a second place finish in the Levy. Banca is winning almost 19 per cent of his starts in the high-dollar environment at Yonkers Raceway; his UTRS is 0.348.

# TRENDING UP

**Scott D Domenico**, the trainer of early season ace Missile J, has moved up from number 11 a year ago to fourth. He has 15 more wins and his earnings increased by \$491,000. Missile J accounts for \$174,000 of that. Scott's UTRS of 0.314 is up marginally from this time last year.

Andrew Harris has risen from number 20 to fifth. His starts have increased by more than 60 per cent from 118 to 306. The 32-year-old Ontario native has 38 more wins and \$636,000 more dollars to his credit. He made most of his starts at Yonkers where cousin Mary swept the Petticoat, but he's also fourth at Pocono Downs, where the Camluck mare just swept the Weiss.

**Gilbert Garcia-Herrera** moved up from eight to six. He's sixth on the Yonkers money list and third at Pocono Downs. His starts are down but he has 11 more wins and has banked \$319,000 more than he had at the end of April last year.

**Rob Harmon**, a 47-year-old native of Albany, New York who raced in Michigan until things fell apart out there, moved from number 40 last year to number eight. He has 26 more wins and his earnings are up by 60 per cent. Most of his wins came at Yonkers, where he's seventh on the money list, while the rest were at Pompano Park. Harmon's UTRS jumped from 0.211 to 0.323.

**Nick Surick**, who occupied the three slot behind Burke and Allard on the dash list and is the leading trainer at Freehold, rose from a spot outside the top 50 last year to number 15 at the four-month mark in 2017. Surick, who recently turned 29, has won 110 races and showed earnings of \$498,000 through the end of April.

Matias Ruiz made a leap from number 47 last year to 10. He doubled his wins and more than doubled his earnings. He's tenth on the Yonkers money list. Ruiz was the trainer in the middle of the kerfuffle involving Lou Pena and the scratching of I Said Diamonds out of the Jugette.

**Richard Johnson**, who races at Yonkers, The Meadowlands and Freehold, moved up five spots to 19. His number of starts, wins and UTRS were all down, but his earnings rose by \$79,000 - 17 per cent.



**Richard Moreau**, the leading money winner in Canada, dropped a couple of spots to number seven. His wins are about the same but his money is off by \$52,000. Moreau's UTRS dropped from 0.348 to 0.312. Going head to head with the powerful Allard stable didn't help.

**Thomas Milici** rose up out of obscurity to capture the nine spot on the earnings list at the end of April, 2016. He had 66 wins, had earned more than \$647,000 and sported an out-of-this-world UTRS of 0.489—all of this at Yonkers Raceway. However, a positive test at the New York half-miler has served as a major roadblock to his meteoric rise: This year, Milici has 13 wins, earnings of \$164,000 and a UTRS of 0.309. That adds up to a 75 per cent drop in revenue.

**Tony O'Sullivan**, who was at 14 this time last year is outside the top 50. The New Zealand native's starts are off by 76 per cent; his wins are down 72 per cent and his money is 78 per cent short of what it was one year ago.

Through April of last year, while he was still plying his trade in Alberta, young **Travis Cullen** was number five on the trainer's dash list but didn't make the top 50 for money, although he did show an outstanding 0.588 UTRS. As of the end of April, 2017 he was number 17 on the North American money list and second in Canada. The racing is a little bit more competitive in Ontario than it is out West, so his UTRS dropped to 0.287. On the driving side, he failed to make the top 50 dash list but is number 43 on the earning's list.

**Jeff Bamond** drops from number four last year to 11. His horses made 33 per cent fewer starts, down to 195 from 293, and his wins and money were off by 47 per cent and 37 per cent, respectively. His UTRS fell from 0.280 to 0.239. Bamond made most of his starts at Yonkers where he was ninth on


the earnings list.

Australian native **Peter Tritton** went from number 48 in 2015 to six last year on the strength of, among others, Levy winner Bit Of A Legend N and Sell A Bit N, but despite winning the 2017 Matchmaker with MacKenzie N, he fell back to 12th. While his UTRS was about the same, he made 39 fewer starts, had 8 fewer wins and his money was off by \$322,000. He was eighth on the Yonkers earnings list.

Last year **Virgil Morgan Jr** dropped from fifth a third of the way into the 2015 season to number 15. His starts, wins and money were all way down. This time he has fallen further to 27. (He finished 2016 at 24). Morgan, who has been racing at Miami Valley, has made 132 fewer starts and has seen his earnings drop more than \$100,000-22 per cent.

Josh Green was number 21 a third of the way in last year, but he failed to crack the top 50 this time. He raced at Dover Downs and is currently at Harrington. His UTRS stepped up from 0.328 to 0.354 but his money dropped by \$165,000—more than 40 per cent.

Jay Hochsteler, who does double duty as a horseman and journalist, posted the video of the race with this introduction: Ladies and Gentlemen, welcome to Yonkers Raceway! We recently employed small children to operate our camera. We hope you are so excited to feast your eyes on the shaky camera and the illogical zooming. It's a fantastic viewing experience! We may have 50,000 dollar opens but our camera work is straight out of a World Star Hip Hop video!

Watching the race, it did appear as though there may have been a drunken sailor handling the camera for most of the race. Hochstetler – who is the co-host of the popular Trotcast internet radio show – received several comments in response to his post:

- "They must be using the Goodyear blimp." Allan Schott, View From the Grandstand blogger
- "Actually, Yonkers is a track that has made enormous upgrades to their TV signal and graphics package. I believe they are HD but often the problem lies in how or on what device you are watching. I don't know what caused the problem here but it is crazy." Moira Fanning, Director of Publicity The Hambletonian Society
- "I would like to see all of you experts operate the camera when the wind is blowing hard enough to blow down the grandstand. Of all the things wrong with harness racing, this one race I would think is minute." Rick Dane Jr. horseman

Dane Jr. is likely right in that this isn't one of the biggest issues facing harness racing, but, the others also have valid points. In 2017, with the quality of available technology, a production of this quality is likely to cause a buzz.





# Decoupling dead in Florida for 2017 legislative session

According to Jim Rosica, who covers State government from Tallahassee for Florida Politics (www.floridapolitics.com), a gambling legislation deal that included decoupling "went down the drain" on Tuesday (May 2), three days before the scheduled end of the legislative session.

The negotiators for the House and Senate "couldn't see eye-to-eye" on the proposed expansion of gaming in Florida.

FSBOA president Joe Pennacchio was elated with the news but warned that "we are never out of the woods on this issue, as it keeps creeping into discussion and bills year after year after year.

"We are safe for this year, but you can never let your guard down in a situation that is as important as this.

"I view decoupling as a cancer cell that could spread throughout our industry unchecked if it ever passes here in Florida. At some point down the road, we will have to face this threat again and the best scenario to put this to bed once and for all is to have a referendum for decoupling on the ballot for voters to decide.

"With the positive impact on the economy here in South Florida over the past 10 years, I would think it would be difficult to get the 60 per cent vote needed for decoupling and it would be rendered dead forever."
