## Finding His Gear

*Veteran Trevor Henry has gone from being the long-time king of Ontario's B-Tracks to the leading driver on the big-city Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) circuit.*

With four-and-a-half months of the 2016 season in the books, 45-year-old Trevor Henry currently leads the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) driver colony with 104 wins and earnings of \$1,588,450. Heading into just his second full season on the WEG circuit, the Arthur, ON resident can be found in almost every race and is often a go-to selection for handicappers.

"I drive for a lot of different (trainers)," Henry said. "I get drives in pretty near every race, so it's good. It keeps me out of trouble."

After dominating the 'B' track circuit for a decade, Henry made the switch to Mohawk/Woodbine in November of 2014 in hopes of scaling back his workload. Racing at Clinton, Hanover, Grand River, Georgian Downs and The Raceway at Western Fair Raceway, Henry led all Canadian drivers in total wins in 2012, 2013 and 2014, but criss-crossing the province

was taking a toll on more than just his truck's odometer.

"I actually wanted to slow down a bit. Instead of going six, seven days a week, I just wanted to go like four days," Henry said. "I was going too much and I was just getting tired of racing every night."

The reinsman found quick success on the WEG circuit. Trainers such as Richard Moreau and Anthony Montini, who had used Henry's services on the 'B' tracks, gave the driver quality mounts and he was quickly appearing in the majority of races on each card.

In 2015, Henry cemented his position in the WEG driver colony, picking up more clients and earning the regular drive on stakes colts such as Dr. Ian Moore's Rockin In Heaven, who captured a division of the Somebeachsomewhere and took Henry to the Little Brown Jug for the first time. Rockin In Heaven will start from post seven tonight (May 15) in the \$244,000 Confederation Cup final at Flamboro Downs and has been pegged at 7/1 in the morning line odds for the field of nine.

"Trevor is a great driver regardless of track size," said Ken

Middleton, Jr., who has watched Henry work from the announcer's booths at Elmira Raceway, Flamboro Downs and now Mohawk and Woodbine. "He can make speed with the best of them, but he can also finesse one that needs a bit of help. He can often hop on a horse for the first time and wake them up immediately. A good example is Nickle Bag — one of the most dominant preferred pacers on the WEG circuit."

Henry said Nickle Bag and preferred class pacing mare Waasmula have been key contributors to his success this season, but the reinsman has also found the winner's circle with young horses trained by his wife Shannon Henry. Sophomore trotting filly Wanaka won the Celas Counsel Final on April 28 and three-year-old trotting colt United BI scored a 1:55.4 overnight win on May 12 at Mohawk.

"I've only got four, but four decent ones," said Henry, who still spends his free mornings in the barn. "I have one two-year-old trotting filly; she's going pretty good too. I like her, so hopefully she makes it."

While keeping his focus firmly on the WEG circuit from November through May, Henry continues to travel for Ontario

Sires Stakes (OSS) engagements during the summer months. A two-time winner of the Lampman Cup as the leading driver on the OSS circuit – in 1996, driving almost exclusively for his father Ross Henry, and in 2007 for an expanded client roster – Henry came within 21 points of a third title in 2015.

The reinsman will also put his half-mile skills to the test in the Ontario Regional Driving Championship at Grand River Raceway on June 24 in an attempt to represent Canada for a second time. Henry was Canada's representative to the 2013 World Driving Championship in France.

While those career highlights in 1996, 2007 and 2013 may have seemed like more natural points at which to make the switch to the WEG circuit, Henry says the idea never crossed his mind until 2014.

"I never really even thought about it," said the father of two teenagers. "I was happy where I was at, anyways. I was making a good living doing that, so I had no reason to."

Now with 19 months under his belt on the WEG circuit, Henry says the reduced schedule may be one of the factors that have contributed to his success.

"I think it's helped me, because I'm more rested and I'm not as tired as I used to be. This is like a holiday really, it's not that hard. I get three days off a week. It's really nice."

The less frenetic pace may also be one of the factors that has kept Henry out of the judges' office in recent years. One of the criticisms leveled at him earlier in his career was that he could be too aggressive. In 2008, he sat on the sidelines for two months, and in 2009 he was suspended for four months for using his whip in an excessive manner. Later that year, the Ontario Racing Commission implemented new urging rules for all drivers, and in the years that followed Henry has achieved success with a more refined style.

"I'm not nearly as aggressive as I used to be. I've relaxed a lot I think," said Henry, noting a combination of experience and quality of mounts have also played a role in his current driving style.

"Either that or (the judges) learned to tolerate me, I don't know," Henry added, chuckling.

Looking ahead Henry is making no predictions about potential successes, but he has clearly found the perfect gear after spending his first two decades in the industry on overdrive.

# The Monday Night Monster

*On Monday nights, Northfield Park is the biggest little track in the land.*

When a harness track routinely has handle that reaches the \$1 million mark, it's difficult to call it an industry "best kept secret", but given the fact that Northfield Park (about a half-hour from Cleveland) doesn't even race on Fridays and gets lost in the shuffle on every-track-races Saturdays, that might just be the best way to describe it.

Except at the start of the work week, that is, when plenty of players get involved as the half-mile oval becomes the "Monday Night Monster".

Knowing full well getting noticed on the weekends will always be tough, Northfield races its strongest of four weekly race cards on Monday. And while they might not bet as much as whichever Woodbine Entertainment Group track is racing, they do bet more than every other North American track.

"It's on purpose," said Dave Bianconi, Northfield's executive vice-president of racing and simulcasting of racing his best card on Mondays. "We've been doing it for several years now. I figured I'd leave the best card on Monday because it gets the most eyes on it."

Northfield goes up against Yonkers Raceway (among others) on Mondays. Yonkers has better purses. Considerably better. Yonkers has the sport's best driver colony. George Brennan, Brian Sears, Jason Bartlett, David Miller, Daniel Dube, Scott Zeron and others all drove on Monday, May 9. So why do they come up short to Northfield in terms of wagering?

One explanation might be the best card on Monday protocol suggested by Bianconi, rather than the conventional-wisdom Saturdays. The track played host to an Open II, an Open Handicap Trot, an Open Handicap Pace and pair of non-winners of \$8,000 in their last five starts, which is the top conditioned class. These races would be invisible next to what would be offered at the Meadowlands, Yonkers and WEG on a Saturday. But on Mondays, they stand out.

By contrast, Yonkers offered a pair of non-winners of six pari-mutuel races lifetime as its co-features. The purses were bigger at Yonkers even though the conditions may have sounded inferior to the races at Northfield. Yonkers' two lowest purses of the night were \$12,500, Northfield's two highest were \$13,500. Obviously, the size of the purse is not what interests the Northfield fan.

"We have a very popular signal during the week," said Bianconi as to why his track does as well as it does taking on Yonkers and Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs on Monday evenings. "We have competitive racing on a half-mile track. We have a trailer in almost every race. We have a lot of movement in our races. I guess it's a combination of those factors."

On the May 9 program, total handle at the "Home of the Flying Turns" reached \$1,070,120 on the 15-race program. At Yonkers, \$636,243 was pushed through the windows over 12 races. Total purses at Northfield were \$115,400 (\$7,693 per race), while \$189,000 (\$15,750 per) was doled out at Yonkers. On harness racing's handle curve, Yonkers did well on Monday, yet Northfield still wagered 68 per cent more than what was bet at the Hilltop Oval.

Yes, Northfield Monday has its following. What that following gets is good racing with three marquee names that drive much of the power. Most harness fans know who Aaron Merriman and Ron Wrenn Jr. are. The duo finished 1-2 last year in the national dash-win chase, even though Wrenn was the leading driver at Northfield.

This year, a big name was added to the driver colony, as Meadowlands regular Joe Bongiorno now drives at Northfield on Mondays and Tuesdays. What's remarkable is, even though they have to go up each other in many of the same races, how each of the trio has giant stats.

Using the numbers published in Monday's program, Wrenn was leading the way with 224 wins from 781 starts, good for a win percentage of 29. Merriman was next with 178 wins in 748 starts (24 per cent) while Bongiorno's 87 wins were good for fifth place in the standings, but his win percentage of 21 trailed only the aforementioned dynamic duo.

Many tracks equate good handle to favorites not doing well. Management at the Meadowlands has long insisted that for them, it's a formula for success. But at Northfield, the numbers say the opposite is true, as over the past two Monday programs, precisely 50 per cent of the post-time chalks have won. Overall, favorites click at Northfield at a 45 per cent rate. Like many smaller tracks, winning favorites create churn, and the way to create churn is to have people cashing tickets. The way to have people cashing tickets is to have formful racing where favorites win.

"I would like to have less than 50 per cent winning favorites," said Bianconi. "But I don't think there's anything wrong with favorites, either. (Winning favorites) probably hurt our win pools a bit. But the gimmick pools? I think they actually help. I don't try to outdo other tracks. We go out and handle the most we can and let everybody else worry about themselves."

And that's clearly no secret.

# The Richest Horse Race in the World

*Frank Stronach says the \$12 million Pegasus World Cup for thoroughbreds – expected to debut next January at his company's Gulfstream Park – will offer a unique twist on stakes.*

**If Frank Stronach has his way, next January, Gulfstream Park could become home to the richest horse race in the world, the \$12 million Pegasus World Cup.**

Never shy about introducing new ideas for horse racing, Frank Stronach, whose company owns and operates Gulfstream Park and five other thoroughbred tracks around the country, announced on Wednesday (May 11) the creation of the \$12 million Pegasus World Cup scheduled for next Jan. 28 at Gulfstream.

Besides becoming the world's richest horse race, the Pegasus Cup will offer a new business model for all of horse racing to consider. The race will be restricted to 12 horses whose owners will be required to pony up \$1 million for a starter spot. In exchange, besides the purse money and the right to participate in future Pegasus World Cups, the owners will share equally in 100 per cent of the net income from pari-mutuel handle, media rights and sponsorships for the race. Additionally, owners can race, lease, contract or share a starter or sell their starting berth.

The Pegasus World Cup gained immediate credibility with the announcement that Jack Wolf, the founder and co-managing partner of Starlight Racing, will be the CEO of the Pegasus World Cup, and that Tom Ludt, a board member of the Breeders' Cup, will assist with the marketing and coordination of the race.

By choosing Jan. 28 for the race date, Stronach conspicuously avoided a conflict with the Breeders' Cup in the fall and the Dubai World Cup in the spring.

Stronach, now 82, has never been bashful about promoting his concept of racing, that a track should be part of a destination, not the lone attraction. That is why he built a village full of stores and restaurants around Gulfstream Park

and erected the magnificent 110-foot \$30 million statue of Pegasus slaying a dragon in Gulfstream Park's north parking lot.

"It's iconic," Gulfstream Park president and chief operating officer Tim Ritvo, a former trainer, said. "It's a brand. It's a legacy that Frank says, 'This is horse racing. This is the horse.' At first, everybody thought, 'What are they doing?' Now, people stop and take pictures. It's just a monumental thing not a lot of people would have done. Mr. Stronach is a long-term thinker and he thinks this is our brand."

It's a brand that continues to resonate within the thoroughbred racing industry. Gulfstream Park has been the home of the Eclipse Awards the last few years, has been the annual convention site of the Permanent Disabled Jockeys Fund and the this winter played host to the Thoroughbred Owner Conference.

Now Stronach is challenging the racing establishment with a new way to showcase racing and a striking new business model to fund it. Can it work? And, if it works, can it work for other racetracks? Could it work in harness racing?

In an interview with Tom LaMarra of *Blood-Horse*, Bob Elliston, the chief operating officer of the Breeders' Cup, said, "It's the first I've heard of it, but Frank Stronach has put a lot of money into the business. You'd be hard-pressed to find anyone who has put that cumulative amount of capital into the business. I'm excited he continues to put his ideas forward. The devil is in the details, but I'd love to hear about new capital and ways to get eyes on the sport."

In a welcome message on the first day of the Thoroughbred Owner Conference at Gulfstream Park, Jan. 12, Stronach introduced the concept of a Pegasus World Championship. "The basic idea is, how can racing compete with other great sports?" Stronach said. "We've got to make things exciting, things the press will write about. We want to tell people that love horse racing, 'Look, we want to establish a new business.' We would lease Gulfstream for one day and call it a new business."

If the Pegasus World Cup debuts as planned under the watchful eye of Pegasus, it will signal the birth of a new way to conduct business in horse racing as well as a significant new way of attracting horses, fans and media to a sport in desperate need of building on the national attention generated by American Pharoah's Triple Crown last year.

## **Catering to Owners**

*The Woodbine Entertainment Group hopes its newly-created Standardbred Concierge and Owner Development Associate will spur owners to come back to the track on race nights.*

Woodbine Entertainment Group's (WEG) new standardbred position is aiming to offer service with a smile, plus a whole lot more.

Bill McLinchey, WEG's manager of racing operations, said the newly-created Standardbred Concierge and Owner Development Associate job can help play a pivotal role in boosting the on-track presence of owners during live racing nights.

It's something WEG hopes is a game-changer, a way to reach out to horse owners across the board, so to speak, to enhance their overall racing experience.

Just how did it come to light?

"On our major stake nights, we have always put a high priority on ensuring participating owners receive top-notch seating and service," said McLinchey. "Now we want to put that same priority onto owners participating in any race. We also hope this encourages more owners to come to the track to watch their horse race live."

The role, which was posted on the WEG Corporate website, not only piqued the interest of potential candidates, but also within those in the standardbred fraternity, eliciting varying opinions on the position and its potential impact on seeing more faces at the races.

"We've heard from several people from inside the industry that it sounds like an exciting new role," McLinchey said. "We

had quite a few people apply."

Whether their horse wins or loses, McLinchey wants the owners that make the trip to Woodbine or Mohawk to come back again.

"Once an owner has a horse drawn into race we want them to know they can call, text, email our concierge, to make their reservations, and that our concierge will ensure their visit to our racetrack will be an enjoyable one," McLinchey said. "The successful candidate will also be at the track race nights following up with these owners to ensure their night is going as planned."

The main objective in the creation of the concierge job, according to McLinchey, is to see a larger presence in the number of owners at the racetrack, a chance to cheer on their horses in person.

"Most of all we want to let owners know that they are always appreciated," McLinchey said. "We hope that more owners will want to come watch their horse race live, and we want to make coming to the track as easy and enjoyable as possible for them."

"By adding this position to our department, we want to show owners and horsepeople we are grateful for the relationship we have, and that going forward we are committed to ensuring their experience at the track will be a positive one."

Whoever is hired will begin their role at the end of this month before the Grand Circuit races return to Mohawk.

"The most important aspect will be just being a face for the owners to connect with," McLinchey said. "Being someone that an owner or horseperson knows they can reach out to for any requests."

## Southwind Frank impressive in Saturday qualifiers

Conditions were perfect at The Meadowlands Saturday morning (May 14) for the weekly qualifiers with clear skies, no wind and temperatures in the 60's at go time.

Last year's top freshman colt **Southwind Frank** made his second appearance of the spring and was an easy 1:54 / :27 winner for Yannick Gingras. Settled third through the :29 opening quarter, Southwind Frank was moved to the front and set the balance of the fractions while finishing well within himself a few lengths in advance of Jack Vernon and Brooklyn Hill.

Friday's (May 20) New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) are a logical starting point for Southwind Frank who became the fastest two-year-old colt trotter ever with his 1:52.2 win at The Red Mile last fall and is the heavy winter book favorite for the 2016 Hambletonian. He is trained by Ron Burke on behalf of his Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi, Our Horse Cents Stable and J&T Silva Stable.

The top two trotting fillies of last season met in the opener and went to the wire together with Dan Patch two-year-old of the year **Broadway Donna** (Dave Miller) just getting up to nail Breeders Crown winner **All The Time** (Gingras) by an inch in 1:55.2. The pair sat third and fourth until the top of the stretch when All The Time rose up to challenge mile cutter Seaside Illusion with Broadway Donna following her cover then fanning off as they trotted home as a team in sub :27 last quarters. Both are homebreds. All The Time races from the Jimmy Takter barn for owner/breeders

Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld, while Broadway Donna is trained by Jim Campbell on behalf of Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms.

It's shaping up to be a fun season for the sophomore pacing colts as a few division leaders impressed the small but faithful legion of spectators this morning.

**Boston Red Rocks** looks like he's ready to defend his Dan Patch title with a 1:51 / :26.1 airing out for Tim Tetrick. He set the pace through a comfortable :57 half then took off, widening his margin as Tetrick pleased. Boston Red Rocks is an imposing presence on the track, tall and regal looking... and fast. Steve Elliott trains the NJSS eligible for Peter Blood and Rick Berks.

**American Passport** served notice that he'll have to be dealt with this season, blasting home in :25.4 in a 1:51.3 mile with Scott Zeron a statue in the sulky. He sat a pocket to **Katie's Rocker**, ripped out as they straightened up and was eager through the stretch. To Katie's Rocker's credit, he held well for second in his first seasonal appearance. Brittany Farms, Riverview Racing, Jodi Siamis and trainer Tony Alagna own the winner.

**Talk Show** looked really good today, as well. He showed flashes last season, battling the best colts but was often difficult to manage and wound up in the wrong spot a lot. After some tutelage at the Steve Elliott winter camp for the unruly and a critical change or two, Talk Show was a gentleman this morning for Zeron. He patiently sat a pocket to Racing Hill and when a seam developed between that one and the first over Ideal Rocky Talk Show zipped by in hand. He races for the Pegasis Investment Group, Team S Racing and W. Garofalo.

**Crazshana** sharpened up for the Graduate Series with an easy 1:53 / :27.2 win from the pocket for Dave Miller looking strong through the stretch. 2013 Hambletonian winner Market Share was out this morning for his second qualifier after a good long rest and acquitted himself well, setting solid fractions on the lead until Crazshana slipped past late. The winner is trained in the Jeff Bamond, Jr stable for Bamond Racing, LLC.

## **Milligans School fastest in PASS**

Milligans School thwarted the sustained bid of Hititoutofthepark and went on to score in 1:55.3, in the slop, to take the fastest division of Saturday's (May 14) \$167,303 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes at The Meadows.

The event for three-year-old colt and gelding trotters, known as the Super Bowl, was contested over four divisions, with Cufflink Hanover, Truemass Volo and Lagerfeld taking the other splits.

Milligans School earned over \$300,000 at two, but didn't reach the lead at any point in his final five starts of the year. But in his seasonal debut, that's where Andy Miller put him.

"I would just have soon sat in the pocket or up close somewhere and follow somebody, but that's where he ended up," Miller said. "The fractions weren't that tough, so he responded well. He's always been a very smart colt. Hopefully, he's on to bigger and better."

Hititoutofthepark, fresh off a PA All Stars victory, drew even down the backside, but the son of Yankee Glide—Tori Ann was up to the challenge, downing his rival by three-quarters of a length. Desert Runner rallied for show. July Miller trains Milligan's School for Stroy Inc.

Second in the Dexter Cup final a week ago, Cufflink Hanover found late racing room and kicked by early leader Love Matters to defeat him by half a length in 1:56, with Southern Cross third.

"I was hoping we would get room," said winning driver David Miller, who owns the Andover Hall—CR Savoie Faire gelding with the Enzed Racing Stable of the colt's trainer, Nifty Norman. "I thought the horse on the front end would take us where we had to go. So I took a shot and sat in. I didn't know about coming first over with my horse."

He said Cufflink Hanover is ticketed for next week's Currier & Ives at The Meadows and remains eligible for the Yonkers Trot later this season.

Truemass Volo zipped to the front in his seasonal debut and had little trouble prevailing in 1:56 for Eric Goodell, trainer Doug Hamilton and owners Jon Erdner and Martin Garey. Marion Gondolier finished second, four and three-quarter lengths back, while Hanks Tank completed the ticket.

"He's come back good for us, pretty fit," Hamilton said of the son of Muscle Massive—Tresbien Volo. "Last year, he was a little bit of a bully in letting horses go and getting a little temperamental. So we castrated him. Now he can do his

bully stuff and get away with it. He'll go to some of the bigger races if everything's okay. There's a feeling-out process before you take on the big boys."

Saturday's card also featured a \$100,000 Pennsylvania Stallion Series stake for sophomore colt and gelding trotters. The event provided a showcase for Elysium Lindy, who collected his fourth consecutive victory. That streak includes the \$30,000 final of the Bobby Weiss Series at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs. Also capturing \$20,000 splits were Will Self, Dominus Hanover, Meadowbranch Memo and Mr Right.

As is his custom, Elysium Lindy rushed to the front from post eight for Jim Pantaleano and held off Multitaskr Hanover by half a length in 1:57.2. Love To Glide was third.

"I kept everything the same because he's been racing very well," said Kelly Stackowicz, who trains the Cantab Hall—Olympic Lindy gelding locally for his regular conditioner, Donna Marshall. "You don't want to fix things that aren't broken."

Dominus Hanoer vacated the pocket at the three-quarters, put away Mosconi Hanover and triumphed in 1:56.2, half a length better than Iholdon. Mac Deeno finished third.

"I thought I'd got him far enough with some cover, with some help," said winning driver Dave Palone. "I was watching Andrew [McCarthy] intently, and when he chased Mosconi Hanover, I thought, better to give him a shot outside than try the Lightning Lane in these conditions."

Amber Buter trains the son of Muscle Massive—Dornello, who vaulted over \$100,000 in career earnings, for Lawrence Crawford.

Will Self endured a wide opening panel before reaching the point, but had enough left late to hold off Moneycounts De Vie, who was challenging in the Lightning Lane, by a neck in 1:58.2. Chips Halloffame finished third.

"He's been getting safer," said winning driver Ray Schnittker, who trains and owns the son of Donato Hanover—Falls For You with Ted Gewertz, Arden Homestead Stable and Bordogna Stable. "He's always put some steps in, but he warmed up very well, so I thought he'd be okay. He had a chance to get beat, and he hung tough."

## **Monstrous wins Bev Sears**

Warren Fuller's homebred three-year-old pacing filly Monstrous staged a big rally late to come from second-to-last and defeat the popular mare, Balinska Hanover, in a photo finish in the \$30,000 Bev Sears Stakes final on Saturday (May 14) at Century Downs near Calgary AB.

Monstrous caught Balinska Hanover on the wire to win by a head in a career-best clocking of 1:56.1 for driver J.F. Gagne and trainer Darryl Cutting. Sent postward as the 9-1 fourth choice in the field, she paid \$21.90 to win.

Overcoming an outside post eight start, four-year-old Balinska Hanover (Travis Cullen) drove on past a two-hole opening through a :27.3 first quarter and overtook Yellow Mustang (Phil Giesbrecht) on the lead. Balinska Hanover, the even-money favourite following a dominant elimination win, held a two-length advantage as she cruised through middle splits of :56.4 and 1:25 before the rest of the field began to fan out across the track for the stretch drive.

Balinska Hanover fought right down to the wire, but couldn't hold off the late 'Monstrous' attack of the sophomore filly. After following along in seventh-place throughout, Monstrous fanned widest of all and stormed home to edge out Balinska Hanover for her first victory of the year. You Name It (Gerry Hudon) finished one length behind in third after closing from third over. Mozelle Hanover (Jamie Gray) edged out Cenalta Artistry (Rene Goulet) for fourth-place after tracking her cover. P L Impressive (Mike Hennessy), the other elimination winner, was locked in sixth, with Credit The Shark (Keith Clark) and Yellow Mustang completing the order of finish.

Monstrous had kicked off her six-race debut season last year in an Alberta Sires Stakes event and went on to earn cheques in the rest of her starts to bank \$34,815. The Allamerican Navajo—Hoosier Pam filly was a runner-up in the season-ending Super Final and also started her sophomore campaign with two second-place finishes, which included her Bev Sears elimination effort behind Balinska Hanover. The victory in Sunday's final boosted her career earnings to \$52,939.

The Bev Sears Stakes was for three and four-year-old fillies and mares that are non-winners of \$35,000 lifetime as of December 31, 2015.

## **Wings Of Royalty flies past Pinkman at Big M**

Wings Of Royalty received a perfect drive from Tim Tetrick and the pair spoiled the four-year-old debut of Pinkman in the Friday (May 13) night feature at the Meadowlands, a \$20,000 conditioned event for trotters.

The race looked like an easy one for 3-5 favorite Pinkman, the winner of last year's Kentucky Futurity, Canadian Trotting Classic and Hambletonian. But Wings Of Royalty, who finished last in last year's Hambletonian, scored some revenge on his high-profile foe.

Pinkman worked his way to the top in :27.2, but was pressured by the first-over Bourbon Bay at the half in :55.4 and three-quarters in 1:23.4. Pinkman finally shrugged his challenger off to lead by two turning for home, while Tetrick was finding open road for Wings Of Royalty, who was third at the head of the stretch.

Pinkman still looked like a safe winner with a sixteenth of a mile to go, but Wings of Royalty found more in deep stretch and got up on the wire to win by a nose in a lifetime-best 1:51.4. Possessed Fashion was third.

As the fourth choice in the wagering, Wings Of Royalty paid \$27.40 to win for trainer George Ducharme and owner Raymond W J Campbell Jr. The four-year-old son of RC Royalty has now won 12-of-32 lifetime outings and earned just over \$417,000.

The Meadowlands desperately needs to get some level of consistency in their stewards' rulings concerning pylon violations. When I have inquired in the past, they have always told me that their standard was gaining an unfair advantage. In cases that were much more serious than Resolve's in (Sunday, May 8's) first race, they have told me that the driver will be fined, but there was no advantage gained, therefore no disqualification. Resolve won the race by half of the stretch. If there was EVER a case to let a pylon violation go this was it.

## Why was Resolve disqualified?

1) When they DQ'd Resolve from the 1st race Sunday (May 8 at the Meadowlands), I was surprised. When they showed replay of why he was disqualified, I was shocked. Since when did these slothful judges have the cojones to make a DQ of this magnitude? I am up there every night and I have seen multiple instances where a horse goes inside multiple pylons and is left up because, in the judges' decision, it did not effect the outcome. I am fine with that.

the outcome. I would think the owners are pissed and anybody that bet him were probably talking to themselves. Truly a very bad call.

2) Recently the morning line odds at the Meadowlands has been very weak to say the least. I could name many instances but will just name two: The line on Resolve was 10/1. The previous night, Art History was 6/1. Would not anybody love to have those horses at the morning line odds (even though Resolve was bittersweet)?

3) A few of the readers have been complaining about the lack of quality at the Meadowlands. I concur the cards have been horrible, but I'm not sure what they can do about it seeing as they have not got a casino subsidy.

A reader was also mentioning he might start betting Yonkers. I say to him good luck! Half and five-eighths mile racing is a joke. Plus, at Yonkers and the PA tracks they have all these guys that are persona non grata at the Meadowlands, for obvious reasons. I see Mr. Bresnahan has horses at Yonkers and PA along with the resurgence of Mr. Kesmodel at Yonkers.

Let's not forget all the other lepers whose animals have big form reversals and just keep going forward like Lou Pena's horses used to do. Bottom line, while these racing cards at the Meadowlands are horrible, at least you know races are on the up and up and because of the testing these guys are not going to give the "good stuff" in the feedbag.

4) I have heard nothing yet about the Miller/Burke situation at Yonkers. If I could bet on the outcome, I bet nothing will happen and it will be washed away like the sand on the beach. With that said, Burke's horses are much better when they do not race at the Meadowlands. Takeaway from that what you will.

### Gural answers Big M critics

I don't know why your readers continue to send in letters complaining about the quality of racing at the Big M. I would think by now everyone who follows the sport knows that we are well aware that the quality of racing is nowhere near what it was in the good old days. It is not rocket science that without slots at the Meadowlands we are at a huge disadvantage and we simply do not have enough purse

money to compete. We have to rely on the owners and trainers who are loyal and want to see us succeed and, to a certain extent, probably appreciate our stance on illegal meds and the fact that many of the trainers racing elsewhere are not allowed to race at the Meadowlands.

As far as commenting on the new clubhouse, the man must be an idiot. We intentionally downsized the facility to account for the fact that 90 per cent of handle is bet elsewhere. To describe the racing as terrible is also idiotic because with full fields before the Pennsylvania tracks opened we were averaging over \$3 million nightly, which was more than was wagered at all the other United States tracks combined. On some nights, even our amateur races handled over \$300,000 which was more than all the legs of the Levy — with top drivers and top horses — handled combined.

While I would agree that racing would be better and the closers would have a better chance if the drivers closed the holes, as much as I have tried to accomplish that, it has just been impossible. Having said that, comparing racing at the Meadowlands to half-mile style racing is lunacy. To imply that we do not care about our customers or who comes to the track is also insulting. Just this past Friday we had over 400 people in attendance for a charity event in our Victory Sports Bar and over 200 people in attendance for a political fundraiser.

We carefully survey our customers and they do like 10, 20 and 50-cent wagers. We would love to have international pools, but the time zones work against us. Although, it appears that Yonkers and France may have solved the problem of comingling.

As far as competing for the referendum I can assure Mr. Kaniuk we will be doing just that, but with the recent dispute with the Governor and the Senate President and the members of Assembly and the Mayor of Atlantic City on how to avoid bankruptcy, it would make no sense to start a campaign now.

I really hope you do not publish any more letters with people complaining about the quality of the racing at the Meadowlands. It should also be noted that in order to maintain the purses we do have and stakes races, I will have personally overpaid the purse account by the end of the year \$6 million. Without a casino it is impossible to continue on this path and I would expect to see our stakes program dramatically reduced next year.
