Update (full interview here); and as one never afraid to mince words (a characteristic of the modern disruptor), Brett let loose on a few topics.

"(Drivers) don't give anything to the sport. Very few of them actually invest in the sport." Brett said the fee structure should be changed to give trainers seven per cent of the purse and drivers three per cent.

Whoa, Nellie.

Let's examine that, from a business point of view, as dispassionately as we can.

Pelling is correct when he says trainers invest in the sport, and I think that's indisputable. Ron Burke owns pieces of virtually every horse in his barn. The Takter stable has pieces of almost every yearling. If we open the program for smaller tracks, from Maine to Alberta to Pompano to Cal Expo, almost every horse will have an owner/trainer.

If trainers get an extra two per cent, that's about \$10 million invested back into horseflesh, which props up the flailing foal crop and breeding end of the business. At the very least, Pelling is not 100 per cent wrong, is he?

Pelling's next shot across the harness racing bow centered on the use of super-fast sulkies, which have been the rage for about 15 years now.

"Someone asked me for one thing in the sport that I would roll back. I think every racetrack should have 10 Jerald (sulkies) in 10 different colors (that are coordinated with the post position color). Load them up and go. This whole thing with the bikes and the seats is just wrong and not good for horse racing."

Again, I don't think anyone can argue Pelling doesn't have a strong point.

Modern racebikes have transformed racing, and they've improved final times, but that doesn't mean it's been for the better. For our latest example, all we had to do was watch the stakes races at Chester this past weekend. First quarter position was paramount, because speed (especially on smaller tracks) carries, and carries and carries.

From a business and industry perspective, and looking at what Pelling said from 1,000 feet above, I think the vast majority agree that on principle, his words have merit. When we move from 1,000 feet to ground level and start to get to work on implementing them, though, the disruption breaks down.

"Drivers are my friends, so I don't want to see them hurt. They deserve five per cent."

"I paid \$7,500 for my racebike. I like leaning back in the bike, too. No one is going to take that away. And what about

the businesses who make these racebikes, what will they do?"

"Change is fine and I agree we need it. But I want the other guy to change first."

In the end we have the modern disruption problem, and why there are so few Apples and IBMs who enacted positive change from within, and so many Kodaks who did not. People want change, and they know they have to change, but they don't want to embrace it, because someone, somewhere, will inevitably lose.

This is not a harness racing problem, it's human nature.

Harness racing needs a disruptor to force change, yes. But it also needs an audience that realizes it's an absolute certainty that when change comes there will be winners and losers. And one of the losers might be them.

That, no matter who is doing the disrupting, has always been a very hard sell.

Drivers in unfamiliar territory

In last Friday's \$150,000 Molson Pace at Western Fair Raceway, driver Jordan Stratton won the track's signature race in his first ever visit to the London, ON oval (full story here).

I asked Stratton – who is currently in the midst of a career year sitting second in earnings amongst North American drivers – if he had a particular strategy while venturing to a new track for the first time. Stratton said that he prepped by watching all replays that he could find of past Molson Paces at Western Fair. He also said, "It definitely helps having the favorite and the rail, so it made my job kind of easy."

Bettors – like drivers – need to adapt in how a race is gauged when drivers race in new surroundings. Aside from the fact it was Stratton's first visit to the track, he was driving a former Levy champion and half-mile standout in Bit Of A Legend N and at a track where favorites win by a prohibitive percentage from the rail, the driver's strategy should have been obvious to anyone. In line with conventional wisdom, Stratton said "If we're shipping eight-to-nine hours and have the rail for \$150,000, then obviously I'm more likely to be aggressive than having an outside horse in an overnight race."

Bit Of A Legend's win in Friday's Molson Pace was a no-brainer, but what about when it isn't always that easy?



Drivers who excel at one track often struggle at others. An example of this is Stratton's closest neighbor in the Yonkers driver standings, leading driver Jason Bartlett.

Bartlett currently leads all Yonkers drivers with earnings just shy of \$5 million in earnings at that track alone, and has been the perennial leading driver at the track in recent years. Bartlett is a smart and aggressive driver, and an obvious go-to guy who works wonders when driving at Yonkers. But for whatever the reason, Bartlett's record isn't as impressive when venturing to tracks outside of New York, particularly at the Meadowlands in a more limited number of drives.

Drivers that are automatic plays at some tracks, can be difficult plays at others. It could have anything to do with not adapting to a different track size or track configuration, a different style of racing, or it could be as simple as not having the power horses for trainers that a driver might have the track he is more successful at. It could also be a matter of not being as established at a visiting track, and thus not getting the courtesy breaks on the track from other drivers that one might be accustomed to at home. This last point is also true in being part of the reason why driver changes on horses from a trainer to a top catch driver are often successful.

One race that comes to mind as part of these scenarios was in the 2008 Meadowlands Pace when Canadian driver Paul MacDonell got roughed up three-wide through a :51 half mile with Somebeachsomewhere. It was probably the only possible way the horse, beaten just that one time in his career, could have ever lost and you could argue whether it was even MacDonell's fault considering how the race unfolded, but you have to wonder had that same trip transpired with let's say a John Campbell driving. We'll never know, but the lesson is that drivers racing against a different driving colony may find it harder than while racing at home, and wagers should be based accordingly.

By and large though, a successful driver at any of the larger

tracks in the U.S. or Canada should be able to have their talents transfer while racing at other tracks. If anything, bettors more often than not will react favorably to seeing a Tim Tetrick or Yannick Gingras show up at their track rather than penalize them for being unfamiliar to local surroundings.

Saturday's \$200,000 Battle of Lake Erie at Northfield Park provides a good illustration of how to consider horses with the hometown drivers versus ones with the out-of-towners while approaching the race.

\$2.2 million career earner All Bets Off lands the role of 5-2 morning line favorite for driver Matt Kakaley while Luck Be Withyou starts immediately to that one's inside at programmed odds of 3-1 for the track's leading dash and earnings driver, Aaron Merriman. Despite Kakaley developing his craft at this track a number of years ago and actually winning this exact race three times already (most recently with Foiled Again in 2015), Merriman clearly has a tactical advantage by driving at the track nightly in my opinion.

Rockin Ron gets crushed with another poor position following his outside draw at Western Fair last week, but local driver Ryan Stahl knows his way around this track and the horse should be respected, particularly coming from the Ron Burke stable. Conversely, what will former top WEG and current Yonkers pilot Mark MacDonald do from post eight with Sunfire Blue Chip? Recent history shows he has the ability to fire early, but every single horse from post five and outward is capable of the time which would make for an impossible road to the top from anywhere near the outside.

Other drivers making the trip in for the race include Vinny Ginsburg and Art Stafford, although either winning would be a surprise despite starting from posts one and two respectively with Guantanamo Bay and Soto. Doug McNair has been in this race before but he's had stronger chances previously than with Mr. Wiggle Pants. That leaves longshot Night Pro that Ronnie Wrenn drove to a win here in the open back at the end of March.

Luck Be Withyou has come back around nicely in his last pair at Pocono for trainer Chris Oakes and being able to wire a field with a sub: 26 opening quarter mile is nothing new for him. Those last two speedy wins on the front end reflect the horse we have come to know in recent years and should set this one up nicely for tonight. He has the post edge on his main rival and I wouldn't be surprised to see Merriman take no prisoners in this one from the onset. Luck Be Withyou is the pick in this year's Battle.

USTA has reservations about Horse Racing Integrity Act

The Horse Racing Integrity Act (HRI), which has been kicking around the halls of Congress for years without gaining much momentum, has been reintroduced by Congressman Andy Barr (R-KY) and Congressman Paul Tonko (D-NY). However, this version comes with a new twist. While previous versions of the act covered thoroughbred racing only, the latest reincarnation also includes standardbred and quarter horse racing.

While the Jockey Club has been firmly behind HRI since its inception, its counterpart in harness racing, the United States Trotting Association (USTA), is not ready to commit one way or the other. However, USTA executive vice president Mike Tanner made it clear that the organization has some reservations about the legislation.

"Since the proposed legislation was introduced just last week and there hasn't been an opportunity to convene the USTA Board or even its executive committee, we have no official position on the bill at this time," Tanner said in an email response.

The main focus of HRI is to establish a central authority that would create and implement a national uniform medication policy. That authority would also oversee all drug testing across the nation. That role, should the act ever become a law, would fall to USADA, the United States Anti-Doping Agency.

"With growing momentum and support, the time has come for uniform medication rules in American horse racing," said Congressman Barr. "Uniform rules will ensure the integrity and competitiveness of American horse racing and lay the groundwork for the future success of this great American sport. I am grateful for Congressman Tonko and our coalition for their work over the last two years to improve this legislation which has broadened our base of support and will help us to pass this bill into law."

The latest version of HRI is even stronger than the prior version, released in 2015. The latest proposal calls for the elimination of all race-day medication. That, Tanner, said, is something the USTA is unlikely to get behind.

"I think that I'm safe in saying that the race day prohibition of Lasix would be very troubling to us," Tanner said. "In 2012, we came out strongly in favor of it as a being an effective and humane treatment. That's a position that's echoed by several other equine groups, including the American

Association of Equine Practitioners. It's not just us, and we're perplexed as to why this keeps coming around."

Tanner said the USTA has still more concerns about HRI.

"Beyond that, we have concerns about the makeup of the proposed board, the fact that more that several key industry groups, including ours, were not consulted in the drafting of the legislation, and about the potential governmental allocation of fees to pay for all of this. Moreover, while we have long been in favor of a uniform medication schedule on a breed-specific basis, this isn't that. This appears to be a "one-size fits all" proposition that treats standardbred racing, thoroughbred racing, and quarter horse racing as if they are one and the same, with the same issues and challenges — and that's just not the case.

"We will be closely following the course of Barr/Tonko. I'm sure that we'll have more to say about it in the coming months."

The 2015 version of HRI had more than 90 co-sponsors, including the Water Hay Oats Alliance, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, the Jockey Club, and Keeneland Association. The primary opponents on the thoroughbred side are horsepeople's groups.

The website **govtrack.us** estimated the chances that the 2015 HRI bill becoming law at only five per cent.

The next step in the process is to bill to a hearing in the House Energy and Commerce Committee.








Today marks a huge milestone in Campbell's career

John Campbell won his first race 45 years ago today in London, ON.

Today marks 45 years since John Campbell's first win in his third career drive at Western Fair Raceway with Noble Will.

Thirty-five years ago, Campbell twice was part of the biggest pari-mutuel return in Meadowlands history — and the records still stand.

In the Daily Double on July 13, 1982 in the 1st race Williams Arthurs drove Charlotte Newton to victory \$186.20. In the second race, Campbell won with Hustlers Boy \$71.60. The Daily Double was \$6,359.60 and it remains the high

water mark for the Meadowlands in 41 years of racing.

Earlier that same year, in an Exacta on Feb. 15, Herb Kamm won with Saunders Bret at 167-1, while Campbell is second with Night Mood at 10-1. The Exacta of \$5,299.40 is still tops — although it came close to being eclipsed a month ago.

Campbell and earnings

In the 20th Century, Campbell earned \$176 million. In the 21st Century, he has earned \$123 million.

The gap of \$85 million from Campbell to the second richest driver is the highest ever in the history of horse racing and will remain so until June 30, when Campbell's last day of driving occurs. Ron Pierce is in second place with \$215 million, David Miller a little more than a month away from taking over that slot.

In thoroughbreds, John Velazquez leads the way at \$366 million, with Pat Day second at \$297 million, a \$69 million difference. With Mike Smith just about to move into second at \$295 million, it is likely that gap won't hit \$85 million anytime soon.

Big money winner

It's been 38 years from Campbell's first \$100,000 win to his most recent.

In 1979 in the \$108,000 Oliver Wendell Holmes, Campbell won his first \$100,000 event with Merry Isle. In May of this year, Campbell won the six-figure Dexter Cup at Freehold.

Happy 70th birthday Ray Remmen

Ray Remmen, "The Chief" and the man who won the first ever Meadowlands race on Sept. 1, 1976 with Quick Baron in 1:57.2, celebrated his 70th birthday on Sunday (May 28).

Remmen piloted the very first Hambletonian winner in East Rutherford NJ (Shiaway St Pat) in 1981 over the sloppy surface to a national TV audience.

Remmen also won the first two Miss New Jerseys in 1984-1985, is the first trainer to have 1,000 and then 1,500 Big M wins and is the first trainer/driver to have a \$2 million single season earner (Beach Towel, \$2,091,860 in 1990).

Other Remmen accomplishments include the following: \$1.3 million was Remmen's biggest purse win getting his nose up on the wire with Grade One in the Woodrow Wilson of 1985.

English Tutor (1999), the brother to Cambest, was Remmen's first sub-1:50 winning drive. New Lew (1980) was his first sub-1:55 winner.

Keyser Lobell won the 1988 Peter Haughton for the Chief, valued at \$682,250.

Honorable Daughter was the 2008 Two-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year under the guidance of Ray and brother Larry Remmen.

Remmen's Duchess Faye was the 1983 Older Mare Trotter Of The Year.

Bardot Lobell, one of the filly standouts handled by Remmen, set a track record at Freehold.

Halcyon was Remmen's first Breeders Crown winner in 1986 and his richest two-year-old earner to that point.

In 2009-2010, Ray and Larry sent out perhaps their best performer, Shark Gesture, who won the Graduate and Haughton in back-to-back years. Each Haughton won in 1:48.2, just a tick off his lifetime best.

Other top performers include: Maracai, Astro Hill (1983 Hambletonian), Hug A Bear and pacing mare world record setter Yankee Mistress (1:53.4).

Little known Ray Remmen fact: In 1981, when he won the Hambletonian and had the richest sophomore trotter in the land, he also campaigned the fastest sophomore pacer the same year. Nordic Almahurst won in 1:54 in 1996 the same year Falcons Scooter won the NJ Classic.

Remmen entered the Hall Of Fame in 1998.

Brian Sears owned pacer Deerfield Beach getting notice

There were a few notable performances at Harrah's Philadelphia this Wednesday (May 31) as they raced six \$20,000 divisions of the Stallion Series for three-year-old colts and geldings.

One performance caught the eye of a couple of my Facebook friends was that of Somebeachsomewhere gelding Deerfield Beach in race 7.

The homebred – out of the Allamerican Native mare Native Bride – is owned by driver Brian Sears (Sundance Stable of New Jersey) and his father, Jay Sears. Deerfield Beach had an inauspicious two-year old season, winning only once in six starts. That win was taken in non-winners of two company at Harrah's Philly in his second start, a 1:54.4 score.

But after a slow start to his sophomore campaign in which Deerfield Beach failed to hit the board in his first three starts, he was shooting for his third straight win and fourth in his past five starts on Tuesday and he didn't disappoint.

Leaving from post position 4, Deerfield Beach took an early tuck in fourth and settled into stride for driver David Miller to a :28 opening quarter. Just past that marker, Miller pulled the 1-9 favorite and encouraged him to make front by pacing a :27.2 second quarter. Deerfield Beach didn't seek out a breather at that point as Miller let him rattle through a :27.1 third quarter and from there, there was only minimal early stretch urging needed as Deerfield Beach registered a new lifetime best clocking of 1:51.2. The new mark bettered his previous speed badge by more than a second.

Deerfield Beach is the second foal to race from \$707,000 earner Native Bride, who was remarkably consistent as a race mare, winning 25 of 39 starts and finishing out of the money only five times in a four-year campaign. The first foal, Heavenly Bride has won seven times from 57 starts and she has earned more than \$243,00 so far and the daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven is still racing as a five-year old.

While Deerfield Beach – who has now won five times in 14 starts and earned \$52,000 — is not staked to the upcoming North America Cup, he is still eligible to dance some of the big dances, being staked to the Meadowlands Pace and Breeders Crown. There's a good chance the blooming sophomore pacing gelding may create a buzz of his own sometime this summer or fall.

Three-year-old pacing filly Soiree Seelster earned the third Gold Series trophy of her career at Mohawk Racetrack on Thursday, cruising to a 1:52.2 win for driver Sylvain Filion of Milton, trainer Tony O'Sullivan of Cambridge and his partners Domenic Chiaravalle of Hamilton and Lorne Keller of Exeter. ON.

Soiree Seelster gives partners a pair of Gold Series trophies

With two Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series events for sophomore pacers in the books, trainer Tony O'Sullivan is batting .500, taking home two of four trophies awarded.

The Cambridge, ON resident earned his second piece of Gold Series hardware at Mohawk Racetrack on Thursday evening when three-year-old pacing filly Soiree Seelster slipped up the inside to an impressive two-length victory. Turning for home the fans' second choice appeared to be hemmed in on the rail, but pacesetter and favourite Windy Sport drifted out just enough to allow driver Sylvain Filion to urge Soiree Seelster home to the 1:52.2 triumph.

"I had to risk it," said Milton, ON resident Filion, who fired Soiree Seelster out of post six and dropped in behind the favorite. "I didn't want to overdrive her, and I was just hoping to get some room down the lane. I was lucky enough opened up."

Roselily closed hard to be second and Action Majesty finished third in the first of two \$95,600 Gold divisions, while Windy Sport faded to seventh.

Trainer O'Sullivan shares ownership of Soiree Seelster with Domenic Chiaravalle of Hamilton and Lorne Keller of Exeter, ON. The trio also share ownership of sophomore pacing colt Happy Trio, who was a Gold Series winner on May 26 at The Raceway at Western Fair District.

"It's a good group, Domenic and Lorne are easy to train for, and we all think the same," said O'Sullivan. "It's a good partnership."

Last season, the partners agreed to stop with Soiree Seelster after just four starts, in spite of a record of three wins, including two Gold Series victories, and one third. The daughter of Big Jim and Smilesplace was suffering a few growing pains and O'Sullivan, Chiaravalle and Keller felt her talent warranted caution and a focus on the big picture.

"We just decided that it would be better to put her away and let her regroup for this year," said O'Sullivan. "I would have been able to get her to the Super Final, but because I thought she was a good filly I didn't want to do anything that might hurt her for this year."

Soiree Seelster made her sophomore debut in the SBOA Stake eliminations at Mohawk on May 13, finishing fifth. In the May 20 final, she made a bobble behind the starting gate and was a dozen lengths behind the leaders at the quarter pole, but stormed home to earn second-place. Off that effort O'Sullivan was confident the filly was poised for success in Thursday's Gold Series opener.

"I was hoping she would race as well as she did last week, with no bad luck," said the trainer. "Sylvain said he just tried to get her into gear and get her attention a little bit and she just kind of goosed herself, got a little bit sideways behind the gate, and just made a little break."

If all goes according to plan, Soiree Seelster will make her next start in eliminations for the Fan Hanover stake at Mohawk on June 10, hoping to advance to the June 17 final on Pepsi North America Cup Night. The three-year-old pacing fillies return to Gold Series action on June 26 at Grand River Raceway and while O'Sullivan is not sure he can maintain his .500 average in the sophomore pacing division, he is optimistic about Soiree Seelster's ability to contend with Ontario's best this summer.

"We'll try," said the trainer with a laugh. "It's going to get hard, but we'll try. The colts it's going to get hard, but if Soiree stays good I think she'll be in good shape."

The second Gold Series trophy awarded on Thursday evening went home with Blameitonthenight, who powered up the outside to hit the finish in a personal best 1:52.3. Last year's Super Final winner Yaris Bayama was second and Dudesalady finished third.

Jonathan Drury of Guelph, ON engineered the win from Post 2 for trainer Tony Alagna of Manalapan, NJ and his partners Crawford Farms Racing of Syracuse, NY and Donna Lee of Manalapan.

"I was really hoping not to be first over, but they were rolling along pretty good and mine felt great, and I figured they might come back to me a little bit," said Drury from the winner's circle. "She's a real tough little filly and I've seen her grind it out first over before, and I was hoping she could do it again."

A daughter of Mach Three and What Could Be, Blameitonthenight was also a Gold Series winner at two and made her sophomore debut in the SBOA Stake, finishing fifth in her elimination and ninth in the final.

Next up on Mohawk Racetrack's action-packed Ontario Sires Stakes schedule are the three-year-old trotting colts, making their Grassroots debut on Tuesday, June 6.


