"There are only nine Trotting Triple Crown winners in history, and I can say that I am a man who bred one of them."

This statement is a source of satisfaction for veteran harness racing entrepreneur William (Bill) Mulligan. It is especially meaningful to him because most of his career his focus has been on the trotting horse, and now he is associated with the best – Marion Marauder, 2016 Trotter of the Year.

But this is not the last act for the 87-year-old Mulligan. Marion Marauder will make his four-year-old pari-mutuel debut Sunday in the Graduate leg at Tioga Downs. This year, he will be facing the top free-for-allers, to start with in North America, and then – who knows – maybe overseas at some point. Bill Mulligan is looking forward to adding to his personal "highlight reel" of harness racing memories – one that goes into its ninth decade this season.

"My dad Eugene always had horses to train," Mulligan said. "I started assisting him when I was age seven, and by age eight I was driving them myself. I got my first driver's license for the races in 1947. I'll always be grateful to two horsemen, for their patience with me and their advocacy with other horsemen that I should be granted a license: Carl Ernst, with whom I was associated for many years, and (Hall of Famer) Levi Harner. They were instrumental in getting me going in the right direction.

"I was looking at going into the harness racing business full time, but I ran into opposition from my mother. She thought that I should get myself an education, go to college. I listened to her, got a degree, then went to work for Ingersoll Rand for 44 years, retiring as executive vice president."

Bill's mother was named Marion. Thus was born a farm

name ("It's a shame she passed away just one year before I opened my farm"), and indirectly the name of a Triple Crown champion. (There would be one other "Marion" prominent in this tale; we'll meet her later.)

Ingersoll Rand is a world-class company in the basic fields of mining and engineering, the inventor of the jackhammer and the producer of the first diesel train locomotive engine. As a rising executive in the company, Mulligan was able to be a racehorse owner. He started a horse on the opening night card at Monticello Raceway in 1959 trained by Carl Ernst and one of his better racehorses was the Valley Victory stallion Party Party, a 1:54.3 winner of almost \$200,000 who would later go on to stand at stud at Marion Farms. (Party Party also has the distinction, in his last-save-one career start, to finish ahead of both Magician and Fool's Goal, and that's \$6.75 million worth of horseflesh right there.)

Mulligan then took the daring move in 1993, at age 63, to resume his sulky career, racing mostly in the Billings Series and other amateur events, although he fondly remembers beating a field of "professional drivers" at Freehold. He got a victory in his first year back with Spring Affair, posted a season's high of six wins in 2003 and made the Gold Cup of the Billings Series, the championship, and finished fourth in 2005. He retired from driving in '07, still a "young man" of 77.

In going to the yearling sales in 1999, Mulligan remembers that his trainer, "Bill Popfinger and I had picked out about

eight yearlings who were the ones we were going to focus on at the Harrisburg Sale. The first one that was going to sell was named Spellbound Hanover.”

Spellbound Hanover, lucky number 13 in the catalog, was a daughter of Donerail out of a Super Bowl mare named Sounds Swell, a winner of \$186,000 in her career. Spellbound was her second foal and first filly.

“Spellbound looked good to both Bill and me, maybe a little on the small side,” Mulligan said, and both were surprised when they were able to land her for \$35,000.

Once starting her racetrack career, Spellbound Hanover made an immediate and major impact, winning her first nine starts. Trainer Popfinger guided her in her first two wins, and Cat Manzi had the sulky seat for a NJSS elim and final victory at Garden State for wins eight and nine. John Campbell piloted her in the middle five, which included victories in another NJSS final, the Acorn Stakes, and the Merrie Annabelle final.

Campbell stayed with Spellbound Hanover for the mid-fall Breeders Crown and Goldsmith Maid Stakes. But a new shooter came on the scene: Syrinx Hanover, a daughter of Lindy Lane, who first won her Crown elim and final. In the Goldsmith Maid, it was again Syrinx Hanover over Spellbound Hanover, making it four straight. Spellbound did get back on the winning track at season’s end, winning the elim and final of the Matron Stake.

The awards for two-year-old trotting fillies were split between the two. Spellbound Hanover was voted a Nova Award by Harness Tracks of America’s racing secretaries, while Syrinx Hanover got the nod from the balloting of the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Mulligan did believe, and still believes, that his filly should have been the undisputed champion of her division. “Syrinx

Hanover did not win her (Pennsylvania) Sire Stakes final; Spellbound Hanover won two New Jersey Sire Stakes finals, as well as the Acorn, Merrie Annabelle, and the Matron Stakes. Spellbound had 11 victories to the other filly’s seven, and won more money, \$748,346 to \$680,191. Spellbound raced well from the beginning of the campaign to the end. It was basically those four weeks of the Breeders Crown and Goldsmith Maid that gave Syrinx a share in the spotlight.”

At three, Spellbound Hanover won her first three starts, including another NJSS final and the Coaching Club Trotting Oaks, the latter on June 27.

Two days later, Syrinx Hanover made her sophomore bow a winning one in an overnight. After the race, John Campbell went over to Mulligan and said, “Bill, I’m sorry, but I won’t be able to drive your filly anymore. I have a new mount.” That filly turned out to be Syrinx Hanover who, in 2001, was undefeated in 12 starts, won a million dollars and was named Trotter of the Year. Spellbound Hanover went off-form, winning only once more again (the Zweig Filly at Syracuse), and giving Mulligan the hope that she would be able to breed on her speed and ability for future generations.

Spellbound Hanover had a good if not spectacular start to her broodmare career. “Of her first eight foals, one died, and three were colts who were sold overseas,” Mulligan said. Of the other four, all fillies, three won over \$200,000 on the track: Spellyuptothebar (Malabar Man), Sweetspellofsuccess (Credit Winner), and Fifty Shades (Malabar Man). Among them, they produced a \$100,000 winner (UF Lindsey Lou Who) and a 1:54.3 winner (Tommy Bar).

Mulligan retained the next two foals, both mares. So far, a colt or filly out of Spellbound Hanover had not sold at auction for more than \$60,000. In contrast, after her own spectacular success at the raceways, Spellbound’s dam Sounds Swell saw four of her next five yearlings sell for \$100,000 or more, including a \$205,000 Self Possessed colt named Servage Hanover.

In the wake of Marion Marauder’s success in 2016, the story emerged about how trainer Paula Wellwood was at the 2014 Lexington sale and on the phone with her mother, Marion (there’s the other Marion in the tale), who usually goes by her middle name, Jean. The Wellwoods were determining how high to bid. They landed the horse for \$37,000, the most for a Spellbound foal since 2005. The fact that the colt was by super racehorse and supersire Muscle Hill – who stood at Marion Farms for the three years he was a Pennsylvania stallion – couldn’t have hurt the price. “But I still thought that was a low price for him. (He was) perhaps a trifle small, but a good-looking individual and good-gaited.”

Marion Marauder is trained by Paula and her husband, Mike Keeling and owned by their son, Devin Keeling and Jean

Wellwood.

When told about the daughter-mother conversation during the bidding on Marauder, Mulligan noted, "I hadn't heard that one, but I must say that (all the) people around Marion Marauder have been very good talking to me about the horse, giving me progress reports and sharing their thrills in the victories."

One race where there was a delay on the thrill-sharing was the Hambletonian, after which Mulligan, the Wellwoods, the Keelings and driver Scott Zeron had to wait to see if they got the headbob over Southwind Frank.

"That was a long wait, but worth it," Mulligan said, chuckling.

Marion Marauder didn't make the Triple Crown easy on any of his connections, winning the other two legs by a head each – which means if you were holding a yardstick, you would be holding a piece of wood longer than the combined three margins of victory for the Triple Crown winning Trotter of the Year.

Mulligan also tied with Spellbound Hanover's consignor, Hanover Shoe Farms, for the 2016 Pennsylvania Breeder of the Year title – Mulligan, of course, for Marion Marauder and Hanover for Hannelore Hanover.

Marion Marauder recently won two qualifiers at Mohawk

and has the rail Sunday in his \$50,000 Graduate test at Tioga Downs with regular pilot Scott Zeron in the bike. Of course, everybody connected with the horse, while confident in the qualities of speed and gameness showed last year, goes into the campaign knowing that nothing is guaranteed, but an optimistic attitude is always best.

This last fact may be true most of all for Marion Marauder's breeder, Bill Mulligan. These days he has to undergo a dialysis treatment of four hours, three times a week. But he is still "dead game," just like Marauder and Spellbound. He called back a reporter not long after undergoing one such grueling process.

The restorative powers of a person lie not only within the advancements over any physical maladies, but also in the mental status, too – in this case, perhaps best reflected in Winston Churchill's observation that "The outside of a horse is good for the inside of a man."

Bill Mulligan is looking forward to the racetrack return of Marion Marauder. With great optimism.

NA Cup Runneth Over

Saturday's Pepsi North America Cup eliminations will feature 25 three-year-old pacers in three eliminations – the highest number of entries in seven years.

The battle for a spot in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup will be intense, as 25 three-year-old pacing colts and geldings were entered to race in this Saturday's eliminations at Mohawk Racetrack.

Split into three \$50,000 eliminations, the top-three finishers from each division, plus a fourth-place finisher drawn by lot, will advance to the June 17 final.

It is the highest number of entries for the Pepsi North America Cup since 30 entered the 2010 edition.

The first elimination is headlined by Downbytheseaside (PP4, David Miller), who will be making his first start in Canada since winning the Governor's Cup last November at Woodbine Racetrack.

The Brian Brown trainee is undefeated in three starts this season and comes into the North America Cup elimination off a dominating victory in the \$300,000 Art Rooney on May 27 at Yonkers.

A son of Somebeachsomewhere out of Sprig Hanover, Downbytheseaside won eight of 13 starts as a rookie and equalled the world record of 1:49.

Downbytheseaside has earned \$188,910 this season to bring his career earnings to \$833,616 for owners Country

Club Acres Inc, Joe Sbrocco, Richard Lombardo and Diamond Creek Racing.

The first elimination will have a field of eight competing and is carded as Race 3.

The second division features Dan Patch Award winner Huntsville (PP2, Tim Tetrick). The Ray Schnittker trainee is two-for-three this season and is coming to Mohawk off a blowout 1:49 victory June 1 at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Huntsville stamped himself as the Winter-Book favourite after he won seven of 11 starts, including the Breeders Crown, during his two-year-old season. The son of Somebeachsomewhere—Wild West Show has tremendous speed and displayed it last season when he equaled the world record of 1:49.

Huntsville's only prior start on Canadian soil was a runner-up finish to Downbytheseaside in the Governor's Cup. He comes into his Cup elimination with career earnings of \$776,263 for owners Schnittker, Ted Gewertz, Charles Iannazzo and Steven Arnold.

A field of nine will be competing in the second elimination, which is carded as Race 8.

The final elimination stars another Brown trainee and the third member of harness racing's current "Big Three" in the three-year-old pacing colt division.

Fear The Dragon (PP7, David Miller) is undefeated in four starts this season and holds a victory over Huntsville from May 21 at Pocono Downs. The son of Dragon Again—Armbo Cinnamon had a tremendous rookie season, posting five wins

in 11 starts and hitting the board in 10.

Although Fear The Dragon gained plenty of attention last year, his stablemate Downbytheseaside grabbed most of the headlines. This season, Fear The Dragon has quickly put himself in the conversation of division leader and offers the Brown barn an outstanding one-two punch heading into the Cup.

Fear The Dragon is owned by Emerald Highlands Farm.

The final elimination also has both of last Saturday's Somebeachsomewhere division winners competing. Jim Campbell trainee Macs Jackpot (PP1, David Miller) and Luc Blais student Hurricane Beach (PP2, Louis Philippe Roy) will each look to build off last week's triumphs.

The third elimination has a field of eight and is carded as Race 9.

Winners of the eliminations will earn the right to select their post position for the \$1 million final. The post positions for the final will be drawn at a special Press Conference and Luncheon on Tuesday, June 13 at Mohawk.

Post time for Saturday night's card is 7:30 p.m.

Chock-Full of Stakes Elims

Mohawk will play host to eliminations for the Fan Hanover, Roses Are Red, Armbro Flight and Goodtimes tonight at Saturday to determine the finalists.

The Pepsi North America Cup eliminations may snag most of the headlines, but Friday and Saturday's cards of racing are flooded with stars of the sport competing in a variety of elimination races.

Saturday evening's card features the eliminations for the Fan Hanover Stakes and Roses Are Red.

A total of 19 three-year-old pacing fillies have been split into two \$35,000 eliminations for the Fan Hanover.

Idyllic Beach (PP7, Yannick Gingras), who won last year's Shes A Great Lady Stakes, will look to create more magic at Mohawk in the first elimination. The Jimmy Takter trained daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Idyllic won eight of 14 starts as a rookie and is one for one to start her three-year-old campaign.

The second elimination will see Tequila Monday (PP6, Brian Sears) make her Mohawk debut. The Chris Oakes trainee is coming into the Fan Hanover off victories in the \$140,770 Lismore at Yonkers and a division of the New York Sires Stakes at Saratoga.

The daughter of American Ideal—Margarita Monday won

four of five starts as a rookie and has a career record of six wins in nine starts.

A field of nine will battle in the first elimination (Race 5), while 10 pacing fillies will compete in the second split (Race 7). The top-five finishers from each elimination will advance to the \$440,000 Fan Hanover final.

The Roses Are Red Stakes will require three \$35,000 eliminations for the second year in a row, as 23 of the finest older pacing mares will display their talents at Mohawk.

Four-year-old Pure Country (PP7, Brett Miller) will look to continue her success at Mohawk and pick up her first victory of the season in the first elimination. The Takter trainee won the Fan Hanover final and the Simcoe Stakes last season at Mohawk.

The second elimination will see local star Sandbetweenurtoes (PP3, Doug McNair) attempt to protect her home track. The Richard Moreau trained six-year-old has won eight of 16 starts this season and has racked up the dollars in the WEG mares preferred.

Sandbetweenurtoes has banked over \$150,000 this season for owner Brad Grant and is less than \$70,000 away from reaching \$1 million in career earnings.

Division leader Lady Shadow (PP5, Yannick Gingras) highlights the third elimination. The Ron Adams trained five-year-old has picked right up where she left off at the end of last season, with victories in the Chip Noble Memorial

and Betsy Ross to sit two for two entering the Roses Are Red eliminations.

Lady Shadow won 12 of 20 starts last season and banked over \$900,000. Her career earnings currently sit at \$1.9 million.

The top-three finishers, plus a fourth-place finisher drawn by lot, will advance to the \$365,000 Roses Are Red final. The eliminations are carded as Races 2, 6 and 10.

The stakes action isn't limited to Saturday night this weekend at Mohawk, as tonight's evening's card will also have plenty of eliminations for Pepsi North America Cup night stakes.

The Armbro Flight for trotting mares and Goodtimes for three-year-old trotters will each have two eliminations tonight.

Superstar trotter Hannelore Hanover is back to defend her Armbro Flight crown in the first of two \$35,000 seven-horse eliminations. The Ron Burke trainee is one for two this season after winning 17 of 20 and banking over \$1.1 million last season.

Hannelore Hanover's most recent start was an easy-looking victory on May 22 in a division of the Miss Versatility.

The second split features last season's top-two three-year-old trotting fillies, as Broadway Donna (PP1, David Miller) and Caprice Hill (PP2, Doug McNair) will clash for the first-time in the older ranks.

Broadway Donna, a winner of over \$1.2 million, finished third against male counterparts in a division of the Graduate on Saturday at Mohawk, while Caprice Hill is coming in off a victory in her four-year-old debut last Friday at Mohawk.

The top-five finishers from each Armbro Flight split will advance to the \$253,000 final on Saturday, June 17.

A group of 17 three-year-old trotters have been divided into two \$30,000 Goodtimes eliminations.

Wellwood Memorial winner Seven And Seven (PP4, Tom Durand) will make his three-year-old debut in the nine-horse opening split. The son of Chapter Seven won four of eight starts and banked \$226,768 last season.

Snowstorm Hanover (PP3, Matt Kakaley), who won last year's Valley Victory at Woodbine, will hope a return to Canadian soil will help him get back into the winner's circle, as the Burke trainee is winless in three starts this season.

The second elimination, which has a field of eight, is headlined by Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final champ Mass Production (PP3, Rick Zeron). The gelded son of Muscle Mass—All Time Favorite made a break in his only start this season after winning five of nine and banking \$285,673 as a rookie.

The top-five finishers from each elimination will advance to the \$251,000 Goodtimes final on Saturday, June 17. The

eliminations are carded as Races 5 and 8 on Friday.

Total purses for Pepsi North America Cup night will exceed \$2.4 million.

Catching up with Ron Waples

The 72-year-old Hall of Famer is working for trainer Gregg McNair these days, but will soon be on the road seeking adventure in his motor home.

The Wisteria tree near Ron Waples' "office" by the pool is blooming for the first time since he and his wife, Liz, moved to the Guelph, ON farm.

"We've been here 20 years and that tree has never bloomed," the 72-year-old U.S. and Canadian Hall of Famer said Tuesday, staring out wistfully from his sun room. "There's 3,000 blooms on this tree this year and the most it ever had before maybe was 20."

Call it floral fireworks as something of a goodbye present. The popular couple recently sold their farm. The deal closes at the end of October, around the time they normally hit the road in their motor home headed for warmer climes for the winter. Ron admits he's a little melancholy about selling the farm.

"I love the place," he said.

Recently, Ron said he was "complaining that I'm homeless" to his 93-year-old cousin and fellow Hall of Famer Keith Waples, the elder statesman in one of racing's greatest families. Just like he used to do on the track, Keith dished out some perspective.

"Keith said, 'What the hell are you talking about? Your house is on wheels. You just get in the house and go.' We still have the motor home and we'll go to Florida. I'd like to travel for a couple years — go out west, go down east. I don't know what else. Whatever else life brings me as long as Liz and I are healthy and we have enough money to put gas in the tank, what more do you want, really?"

Over his storied 50-year career, Ron has been known for his crafty steers on the track in big stakes. He has won virtually all of the sport's premier events at least once, including the Hambletonian, Little Brown Jug, Meadowlands Pace, North America Cup, Breeders Crown, Canadian Pacing Derby, Maple Leaf Trot, Kentucky Futurity, Woodrow Wilson, Hambletonian Oaks, Prix d'Ete, Cane Pace, Messenger and Jugette.

He was the co-owner of Ralph Hanover, a horse he drove to the 1983 Pacing Triple Crown and earnings of \$1.7 million that was, at that time, a single-season record. He was also the pilot of No Sex Please, a gelding owned and trained by his son, Ron Waples, Jr., that won the Maple Leaf Trot three

times, the Breeders Crown twice and set two world records. Another son, Randy Waples, has long been a top driver on the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) circuit and sports \$115 million in career earnings.

The long list of champions Ron has driven includes: Presidential Ball, Dream Maker, Village Jiffy, Armbro Dallas, Sugarcane Hanover, Park Avenue Joe, Fake Left, Sportsmaster, Oaklea Count, Delphi's Lobell and JM Vangogh.

These days, Ron is working for trainer for Gregg McNair.

Ron no longer trains his own and hasn't driven since the Hall of Fame race at Goshen, NY on July 3, 2016.

"At Gregg's I don't know how much help I am, but he took me in off the street and gave me something to do," Ron said, laughing.

Ron may drive at Goshen again this summer and he's scheduled to be at Legends Day on July 30 at Clinton Raceway. It's the ninth edition of Legends Day and Ron has never missed the biennial event which will raise money for the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation while celebrating the last official drive of John Campbell's career. The sport's richest driver with nearly \$300 million in earnings, Campbell is retiring to become the president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society.

Ron said he is honored to be part of Campbell's final career drive. Like the Waples clan, the Campbells are one of the sport's greatest families. The patriarch, the late Dunc Campbell, is a Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee.

"It goes without saying that (Campbell's) been a class act all his life," Ron said. "His grandpa, Dunc, was always good to me. His father, Jack, and mom, Florence, were always good to me and John's always been good to me. It's sad, but I'm happy that he's probably going to go out without getting hurt again. I always worry about that."

Ron said his favourite John Campbell drive came off the track. Many years ago, when both were racing at Garden City Raceway in St. Catharines, Waples was walking along the busy QEW highway between his hotel and the track when Campbell pulled up alongside.

"This is going to sound like I'm taking a bit of the halo off his head here, but John was never noted to get up in the morning. He always told me he made his money at night, not in the morning, which I understood. But I had to get up in the morning and go to work," Ron said. "Something happened – and I can't remember what happened to my car – but I was walking on the side of the road at 7:30 in the morning on the QEW and lo and behold, who pulls up but John Campbell. He looks at me and just starts to grin. I said, 'You've never been up this early in your life. What the hell are you doing up this early?' He said, 'I stopped by to pick you up.' I always tell everybody that his claim to fame is he picked me up on the QEW on the way to Garden City."

Though he said he is a little surprised fans keep turning out every two years, en masse, for Legends Day, Ron credits the success of the event to its founder, Clinton Raceway general manager Ian Fleming, who always adds a new twist

to each edition. For example, this year David Miller is making his first Legends Day appearance.

"I think the crowd will like that... Dave will be a big asset. He's very good with the crowd and he's very accessible," Ron said.

Ron will be one of eight of the world's greatest harness drivers contesting the \$15,000 Legends Day Trot on the card. **Ron** (6,923 career wins and some \$75 million in lifetime earnings), **Campbell** (11,049, \$299 million) and **Miller** (12,100 wins, \$215 million) will face off against **Mike Lachance** (10,421, \$190 million), **Steve Condren** (6,845, \$114 million), **Bill O'Donnell** (5,743, \$99 million), **Doug Brown** (8,427, \$89 million) and **Dave Wall** (7,200, \$60 million).

Combined, the eight legends have earned over \$1.15 billion and won nearly 69,000 races.

Fellow legends **Bud Fritz** and **Keith Waples** – both of whom are retired from driving – will also be on hand for the autograph session.

"People love to reminisce," Ron said. "Sometimes I feel bad because they'll say, 'Remember that day you drove that horse?' I say, 'I think I do.' I learned that from Buddy Gilmour, you just have to say, 'I think I do.'"

Ron said Legends Day is popular because of a collegial group of legends that have a blast and the fact Clinton Raceway is a beloved Ontario B-track that always draws true grassroots harness racing fans.

"I hope everybody that's there enjoys it as much as (the legends) enjoy being there," Ron said.

Ramblin Storm's very interesting career

Ramblin Storm, a son of Storm Damage from the stallion's first crop, had an interesting career that started the same night — June 13, 1984 — at the Meadowlands where Nihilator also made his career debut.

Ramblin Storm was a nice younger horse, but never a star until later. Consider his year-by-year record:

At two: 11 4-2-1 \$76,576

At three: 25 8-5-3 \$122,193

At four: 34 9-7-7 \$147,320

At five, six and seven, he became a very tough weekly regular, and the first horse in harness history to twice be claimed for \$100,000.

At five: 28 8-6-5 \$156,200

At six: 32 15-5-2 \$296,950 1:50.1 (the sport's fastest mile at night)

At seven: 23 8-4-1 \$150,760

At eight, nine and 10 he made nine starts per year. What would you say the odds were at that point that he would still be looking at his two busiest seasons?

At eight: 9 2-1-1 \$42,450

At nine: 9 2-0-1 \$14,251

At 10: 9 4-1-2 \$5,691

At 11: 46 10-6-8 \$37,450

At 12: 39 1-7-8 \$18,222

For his career, Rambling Storm sported a record of: 265 71-44-39 \$1,068,063 1:50.1

Ervin's influence

Ornery and Special

Indiana-bred Beckham's Z Tam has been both a test and a delight for Wilbur Eash and Jamie Macomber. Saturday at Woodbine, the pair hopes the son of Always A Virgin qualifies for the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup final.

Over the last two decades, scores of horses have passed through Wilbur Eash's Topeka, IN barn. One, however, has separated himself from the group as particularly memorable to the owner and trainer. A conditioner who has developed multiple Indiana Sires Stakes champions, Eash considers sophomore pacing colt Beckham's Z Tam a special individual.

"He's like one of a kind. He was just something special," Eash says of the son of Always A Virgin. "He and I just got attached early on. I've never had a colt like him. I've enjoyed him every minute of the day."

It was Eash that picked him out of the Hoosier Classic sale in 2015, going to \$19,000 on behalf of New York based Z Tam Stables LLC. He had campaigned the dam, Sara's Lucky Charm, during her career, and he liked the cross of Always A Virgin with the Electric Yankee mare. The trainer brought him

home and began working with the colt for the 2016 racing season. The relationship wasn't always easy.

"We battled early on. He's like my little grandson; always ornery," said the trainer. "He was the kind of colt that would bite you, you'd slap him, and he'd come back and do it again to see if he could get away with it. I would walk him out of the barn and he'd stand up on his hind legs and look around. He loves to play."

Eash is accustomed to bringing horses home from the sales and gelding them right away. With Beckham's Z Tam, he resisted with the athletic colt. He just felt the pacer was different, and as a freshman, he showed he had ability. Making six trips behind the starting gate in 2016, Beckham's Z Tam registered three runner-up performances, two coming in \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes finals. The colt's fastest clocking was a 1:52.4 mile with a :26.2 last quarter. But Eash noticed something wasn't quite right with his charge and, after consulting the owner, decided to turn him out in late August with \$47,699 on his card.

"I could see there was something wrong with immaturity," the trainer said. "He raced fairly good, but he struggled in the turn. I could tell at high speed something was bugging him. I

had him scanned and they just couldn't find anything. I told the owner, 'Let's turn him out. We're going to have a lot of fun with him next year.'

Over the winter, Eash staked Beckham's Z Tam to open stakes at Hoosier Park including the Monument Circle and Jenna's Beach Boy. He also staked the colt to the Breeders Crown and Pepsi North America Cup. He also struck up an agreement with fellow trainer Jamie Macomber where Eash would prep babies and send them to her when ready. It also meant that Macomber would campaign Beckham's Z Tam this season. For Eash, it was tough to see the colt go, but he knew the pacer was in good hands.

"Wilbur would tell me, 'You've got a good three-year-old coming. He's special,'" said Macomber, "Wilbur always saw the speed. I didn't sit behind him, but I heard about him. When I talked to Wilbur, he was always talking about Beckham."

Macomber was warned of Beckham Z Tam's tactics, and early on, experienced them herself. Eash had spoken of "Beckham Talks" where he worked with his precocious charge. Over time, the two gained a mutual respect, and Macomber began working on the same.

"I quickly learned what these Beckham talks were all about. He tested me. He's still testing me," Macomber said after having the colt for a couple of weeks. "We love Beckham; he's a dream come true. We just hope he lives up to our expectations."

While he is spirited off the track, when he lines up for battle, Beckham Z Tam has been flawless in 2017. In four starts, the sophomore has accumulated four victories, each time pacing in under 1:53. His latest win, coming on June 2, was a 1:51 effort where he won by more than four lengths. He was steered to victory by Macomber's husband, Ricky, the colt's driver since his freshman season. The triumph came on the same night as the first \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes final, which the colt missed due to sickness in the elimination round. Beckham Z Tam's effort was comparable to that of final winner Rock N Tony (1:51.1) and consolation winner Meadowbrook Tiger (1:50.4).

"He was very impressive in his first start coming off sickness," Eash said. "We had already talked about not going. We would have liked to see a 1:50 mile, but he showed enough. He had to race like he did."

Macomber was set on not shipping north of the border after Beckham Z Tam missed the first leg of Indiana Sires Stakes action. Only racing in overnights against lesser

competition, she wanted a test for the colt to see how he would stack up against tougher horses. After his latest win, and how he trained in the days afterward, it was an easy choice.

"I wanted to see him fight. I wanted to see him look another colt in the eye. I had my mind made up we're not taking him," she explained. "We were walking back to the paddock and Ricky said, 'I think we should take him. He did that on his own tonight.'"

Beckham Z Tam was one of 25 sophomores entered, and he drew into the second of Saturday's three eliminations at Mohawk that includes Dan Patch Award winner Huntsville. It will be a step up for the Indiana-sired colt, but Eash is excited at the prospects. He's like a proud grandfather hoping for the best.

"I want to see him get to three quarters a little faster and then let him come home," Eash said. "He knows what to do after that."

Ricky will guide Beckham Z Tam from post three in the elimination. Huntsville starts to the inside in post two. Macomber likes the post position and the fact that Beckham Z Tam races on Hoosier Park's seven-eighths configuration, the same as Mohawk.

"I love the three hole. I don't think we could have asked for a better post position," Macomber said. "We'll learn a lot Saturday. Every time we've raced him, he's given 100 per cent. I don't think he'll disappoint us."

Breaking down Dr. J Hanover's Record Mile

Dr. J Hanover turned heads this past Saturday in the harness racing world and in the process served notice to the older pacing division when he windmill dunked his way to a 1:46:4 record mile in a leg of the Graduate series at Mohawk.

That mile was the fastest one ever paced anywhere in the world outside of the U.S., and at least on the surface it seemed to have come out of nowhere. Was the record time more a reflection of the developing 4-year-old or the Mohawk track conditions that evening?

As we all know, final times attributed to horses in harness racing can be spurious. A horse that recorded an individual race time under an ideal set of circumstances may never be able to replicate that under more normal race conditions, which is the reason that only the winning horse of a race gets assigned a "mark", or the time from that race assigned to its record.

This is part of a phenomenon that exists in harness racing but not thoroughbred racing where horses can be "sucked along" to produce misleadingly fast times. Examples of this are horses involved in fast races that never leave the rail and simply keep up, enabling them to tow along for a faster time than they could accomplish had they been forced to exert any of their own energy. Incidentally, these horses provide some of the best opportunities to play against as overbet horses in their next races out.

But this wasn't the case whatsoever in Dr. J Hanover's win. In the race, Dr. J Hanover left hard from post 5 into a fast enough :26:2 opening quarter and then seemed overloaded with pace when Doug McNair swung him off the cones around the three-quarter mark in 1:20. He came pacing home strongly to get the 1:46:4 score and there is no questioning that the win was legitimately earned. This makes the "how"

of the way the record was achieved that much more fascinating.

Not to be forgotten is the fact that while the Tony Alagna trainee paced his mile in 1:46:4, second place finisher Boston Red Rocks paced his mile in 1:47 – which also would have been good enough for an all-time Canadian record. For two horses who had never paced better than 1:49:3 in their careers (1:50:1 in the case of Dr. J Hanover) now pacing in 1:46:4 and 1:47 in the same race goes to prove that the result of the time was a result of the environment and track conditions far more-so than the horses themselves.

The fact that the race took place in the daylight as the second race carded on the evening likely contributed somewhat to the quicker than normal final time. Along these lines, the first and third races of the night also went in sub 1:50 times as mid-level conditioned races and then times slowed noticeably as races went on throughout the night. After race 3, the only races the rest of the evening that went sub 1:50 were by McWicked in 1:48:4 and Sintra in 1:49:3.

What this all points to is that for some inexplicable reason, the track played exceptionally fast during the early part of the card and in the second race in particular. Going by time alone, no one in their right mind would think that Dr. J Hanover is 10 lengths better than McWicked or 15 lengths better than Sintra or Western Fame.

One thing that is for sure is that no horse has ever gone a mile in the 1:46:4 vicinity without at least pacing to a previous sub-1:50 win, which was the case here. Horses at the top of the all-time Canadian speed marks such as Always B Miki, Modern Legend, A Rocknroll Dance, Won The West and all the way down the line had all been established as star horses prior to their record clockings. Even Primetime Bobcat who didn't have the Grand Circuit resume when he won in 1:47:2 at Mohawk, at least won in 1:48:1 in an open the week prior.

It's always a remote possibility in extraordinarily fast miles

such as this one that perhaps the race was flat out timed incorrectly. But considering that Trakus – the company that wirelessly tracks horses throughout the race – timed the race in 1:47:12 (1:47 flat in terms of fifths of a second), the race time as recorded by the track is accurate considering that Trakus often differs from the official race time by plus or minus a fifth of a second. And even if we accept the Trakus time, 1:47 would still be an all-time Canadian record.

Acknowledging the final win time as a freak anomaly, I actually think the better question is how did Dr J. Hanover improve enough in a short time to turn the tables on rivals that had beaten him rather soundly in recent races. Though

an accomplished horse last year as a sophomore by being stakes-placed in a number of the premier events for 3-year-olds, the Somebeachsomewhere—So Perfect gelding had been winless through nine starts this year including performances that wouldn't be regarded as anything special in the Levy series at Yonkers or in the Confederation Cup at Flamboro. Even in his prior leg of the Graduate series at the Meadowlands last month in May, Dr.J Hanover was a 34-1 longshot from the rail against comparable foes and could only manage a well-beaten, fifth-place finish.

On Saturday though, Dr.J Hanover was driven with a purpose. Driving the horse for the first time, it seemed like McNair knew he was sitting behind a good thing and drove him accordingly. All of the stars aligned and you can't fault the horse for shining in favorable race circumstances.

It'll be interesting to see if Dr.J Hanover is really this good against not only the clock but also his peers, and what is in store for him as the season moves forward. Time will tell.

Antonacci pumped about Hambletonian hopefuls

The trainer has both International Moni and Shake It Off Lindy in tonight's Goodtimes eliminations at Mohawk.

Frank M. Antonacci is excited about hitting the Hambletonian trail with two horses this weekend, but he figures he won't be alone in feeling enthused.

"There are a lot of good horses out there," said Antonacci, the trainer of International Moni and Shake It Off Lindy in tonight's eliminations of the Goodtimes Stakes for 3-year-old male trotters at Mohawk Racetrack. "Everybody only talked about (returning Dan Patch Award winner) Walner, but there are a lot of nice horses. This is a nice field.

"It'll be a fun year to be a racing fan."

The Goodtimes attracted 17 horses, which were split into two divisions. Last year's Wellwood Memorial winner, Seven And Seven, is the 5-2 morning line favorite in the first division and lightly raced but undefeated Enterprise is the 5-2 choice in the second. The top five finishers from each division will return June 17 for the C\$251,000 final.

Ten horses in the Goodtimes are eligible to the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes, which is Aug. 5 at the Meadowlands. The Hambletonian hopefuls in the first elimination are Jake, Snowstorm Hanover, Seven And Seven, Guardian Angel As, Southwind Woody, and International Moni. In the second they are Shake It Off Lindy, Enterprise, AWOL Hanover, and Southwind Cobra.

Tonight's card also includes two eliminations of the Armbro Flight Stakes for older female trotters. Returning Dan Patch Award winner Hannelore Hanover is the 1-2 morning line favorite in the first division followed by Emoticon Hanover at 4-1. The second group finds Broadway Donna at 8-5, Caprice Hill at 9-5 and Charmed Life at 2-1. The top five finishers advance to the \$253,000 Armbro Flight final June 17.

The June 17 card at Mohawk also will feature finals of the Pepsi North America Cup for 3-year-old male pacers, Fan Hanover Stakes for 3-year-old female pacers, and Roses Are Red Stakes for older female pacers. Eliminations for those events are Saturday.

Antonacci's International Moni and Shake It Off Lindy were stakes winners last season. International Moni won a division of the International Stallion Stakes in 1:53.1 at Lexington's Red Mile and Shake It Off Lindy captured a division of the

Bluegrass Stakes in 1:55 over the same track. International Moni's win time was tied for fourth best by a 2-year-old trotter while Shake It Off Lindy's was tied for 21st.

International Moni won one of 12 races last year, but earned a check 11 times on his way to \$154,387. He finished second in the Valley Victory Stakes and was third in the Wellwood. The colt is a son of successful French stallion Love You out of two-time U.S. Horse of the Year Moni Maker, who was a star for the Antonacci family and owned by its Moni Maker Stable until her passing in 2014.

"He was a very good horse last year and he's an even bigger, stronger, better version of that," Antonacci said about International Moni, who remains with the Moni Maker Stable, an amalgamation of members of the Antonacci family and David Reid. "He's come back very good. We're looking forward to a really good year with him."

gentleman. He's a professional. He's just an absolute pleasure."

Shake It Off Lindy is a son of stallion Crazyed out of the Love You-sired mare Nashville Lindy. Crazyed was co-owned by the Antonacci family's Lindy Racing Stable and trained by Antonacci. A multiple-stakes-winner, he finished second to Deweycheatumnhowe in the 2008 Hambletonian.

Last year, Shake It Off Lindy won two of nine races and earned \$53,976.

"He reminds me a tremendous amount of his dad," Antonacci said about Shake It Off Lindy, bred and owned by the Antonaccis' K R Breeding LLC. "He's got incredible quick speed. For a sixteenth of a mile he could skip off faster than most pacers. That's an exciting burst of speed he's got. He's got a lot of upside."

International Moni and Shake It Off Lindy both enter the Goodtimes off two qualifiers. In their most recent efforts, Shake It Off Lindy finished second by a head to older Dan Patch Award winner Obrigado in 1:54.1 while International Moni was fourth.

"They both qualified twice and both qualified really well," Antonacci said. "It's hard to game plan for these kinds of races this early in the year. You just have your horses ready to go and let the races come to them and don't force it. I think our horses, based on last year's performances and how they've qualified and trained going into the race, are good for this time of year."

"It's just hard to tell where everybody else is on their readiness scale. The only horses we can control are the ones in our shed row. They shipped up and should be there in good order. As long as they're healthy we're ready."

Post time is 7:30 for tonight's first race.

It will be a busy weekend for Hambletonian-eligible horses,

with a total of 31 in action at three different North American racetracks Besides the 10 Hambletonian-eligible horses in tonight's Goodtimes, seven horses in tonight's eliminations of Empire Breeders Classic at Vernon Downs are eligible. They are Bill's Man, Money Macintosh, Top Flight Angel, Such An Angel, and Another Chapter in the first division and Devious Man and Shivered in the second.

Bill's Man is the 6-5 morning line favorite in the first group while Devious Man is the 9-5 choice in the second.

On Saturday, three divisions of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes for 3-year-old male trotters will be contested at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, with a total of 14 Hambletonian eligibles going behind the starting gate.

They are Sortie, Di Oggi, Muscles Jared, Lucky Matter, and Rubio in the first; Thisguyisonfire, Dover Dan, Moonshiner Hanover, Meme Hanover, and Sir John F in the second; and President Lindy, Perfect Spirit, Giveitgasandgo, and Don Dream in the third.

Sortie (2-1) and President Lindy (5-2) are the morning line favorites in their divisions. Dover Dan is the 7-2 third choice in the remaining division, behind Meteoric (5-2) and Common Parlance (3-1).

Obrigado to return Saturday in Charlie Hill Memorial

The reigning Older Trotter of the Year and Charlie Hill Memorial champ is part of a strong field in the \$200,000 event

Obrigado might have a little Alfred E. Neuman in him. One gets the feeling after talking with the 7-year-old trotter's regular driver, Mark MacDonald, that an appropriate caption under the horse's photo would be "What -- me worry?" just the same as the cartooned Neuman on the cover of MAD magazine.

Going back to July 2014, Obrigado has won 18 races. Excluding one victory in which he was second-placed-first, the gelding has won 11 of the remaining 17 by a half-length or less. And the vast majority of those triumphs, nine to be exact, were by a neck or less.

Those 17 wins, by the way, were worth nearly \$1 million.

"He never overdoes it," MacDonald said with a laugh. "He takes care of himself. He makes you kind of sweat it out a

little bit. Me, not so much now, because I know him and I'm confident he's always going to give you that last little lunge at the end. But I'm sure for Paul and the other owners watching it probably makes them a little nervous."

Paul is trainer Paul Kelley, who owns Obrigado with Lennart Agren's SRF Stable, Linwood Higgins, and the multi-partner Stable 45. The group is preparing for more edge-of-your-seat excitement as Obrigado makes his seasonal debut in Saturday's \$200,000 Charlie Hill Memorial Trot at Eldorado Scioto Downs in central Ohio. Hill was the founder of Scioto Downs and president of the track from 1959-1989.

Obrigado, who received the 2016 Dan Patch Award for best older male trotter, is the 5-2 morning line favorite and will start from post one with MacDonald in the sulky. Maxie Lee Memorial Invitational winner Crazy Wow, starting from post eight with Chris Page at the lines for trainer Ron Burke, is the 4-1 second choice while 2015 Dan Patch Award honoree JL Cruze is 9-2 from post five with Ronnie Wrenn Jr. driving for Eric Ell.

"That's a pretty good group," MacDonald said. "It should be a good race."

Last year, Obrigado won eight of 17 races and earned \$873,300. He hit the board a total of 13 times and his victories included the Hill Memorial, TVG Free For All Series championship, Dayton Trotting Derby, Crawford Farms Trot, John Cashman Memorial, Cleveland Trotting Classic, and Maxie Lee Memorial.

For MacDonald, the win in the Crawford Farms Trot exemplified Obrigado's toughness and determination. Obrigado was in the outer flow in an opening quarter-mile of :26, cleared to the lead at the halfway point and then battled stride-for-stride with Resolve for nearly the final three-eighths of a mile before winning by a quarter-length in 1:51.2.

"I think that was the best race last year, maybe the best race of his life since I've been driving him," said MacDonald, who took over the driving duties behind Obrigado at the beginning of the horse's 5-year-old season. "Man, that was a great race. They fought all the way down the stretch. Getting down by the wire Obi came back on and won. That was just a crazy mile.

"He brings his lunch pail every night and goes to work. He's tough. He's got no quit in him. It's kind of hard to give him a bad trip; I've been parked with him, I've been in bad spots with him, but he always gives 120 per cent. He's just a good horse. You look forward to his races. He's always made a good account of himself."

MacDonald was happy to see Obrigado honored with a Dan Patch Award last year. Obrigado, who has won 42 of 79 career races and earned \$1.62 million, was a star in Maine at ages 2 and 3 before being sold to the New York-based Kelley and partners in November 2013.

"That was cool," MacDonald said. "I was really happy for Paul and the owners. He was so good all year. I think maybe winning the TVG at the end of the year put him over the top, but to me he had such a great year. He won so many big races and he showed up to work every night.

"You have to give Paul credit. I think he protected (Obrigado) a lot as a 4-year-old. He kept him out of the spotlight, away from the Grand Circuit horses. He kind of aimed for him to peak as an older horse and the patience paid off. He let him mature and grow into his own and he turned into a great aged racehorse."

Racing begins at 6:30 p.m. at Scioto Downs and the Hill Memorial is race eight, with a 8:50 p.m. estimated post time.
