Finals set for Armbro Flight and Goodtimes

Trotters took centre stage Friday at Mohawk with eliminations for two of the stakes on the Pepsi North America Cup undercard.

Hannelore Hanover won the fastest of the two Armbro Flight divisions when Yannick Gingras piloted her to a 1:52.2 victory.

Elimination weekend at Mohawk Racetrack kicked off Friday (June 10) with some impressive performances in the Armbro Flight and Goodtimes Stakes.

Both stakes events required two eliminations, with the Armbro Flight for trotting mares going for \$35,000 (all figures Cdn \$) and the Goodtimes for three-year-old trotters going for \$30,000 a split.

Following the eliminations, the finals for both the \$267,000 Armbro Flight and \$268,000 Goodtimes were drawn. The elimination winners earned the right to select their own post.

Hannelore Hanover was a dominant 1:52.2 winner in the first Armbro Flight elimination.

The Ron Burke trainee flashed early speed for driver Yannick Gingras to lead the field by the opening-quarter in :27.4. Shake It Cerry made a second-quarter move to the lead allowing Gingras to sit in the two-hole.

After fractions of :56.3 and 1:25.1, Shake It Cerry brought the field to the top of the lane, but was quickly overtaken by Hannelore Hanover. The Burke trainee angled out of the pocket at the three-quarter pole and powered home under wraps in :27 for a four-and-three-quarter length victory.

Rockin With Dewey got up for second, while Shake It Cerry dropped back to finish third. Charmed Life and Missys Ga Ga rounded out the top five to qualify for the final.



A four-year-old daughter of Swan For All—High Sobriety, Hannelore Hanover teamed up with Gingras for the first time Friday and made a big impression on her new driver.

"She's really impressive. She won as easy as a horse can do it," said Gingras. ":27 on the end of it and it was just a walk in the park. Ron (Burke) has been telling me how good she was since last year and he believed she was the third best trotting filly behind Mission Brief and Wild Honey."

Hannelore Hanover now has six wins in seven outings this season and 15 overall in her career for earnings of over \$417,000. She is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Bruscemi LLC and Frank Baldachino.

The clocking of 1:52.2 lowered Hannelore Hanover's career mark by a fifth of a second. She paid \$3.50 to win.

In the second elimination, Rules Of The Road went gate-to-wire for her third win of the season in 1:54.1.

Driven by David Miller, Rules Of The Road showed good early speed to leave out hard with Stormont Kate. Miller won the early battle and reached the opening-quarter in :27.3. Rules Of The Road got an easy middle-half of :58.1 and was able to capitalize off that with a :28.2 final-quarter to hold off her rivals for a length-and-a-quarter victory. Elegant Serenity finished second, while Stormont Kate was third.

The final two spots in the final were secured by Barn Doll and White Becomes Her.

A four-year-old daughter of Muscle Hill—Right On Renee, Rules Of The Road is trained by Charles Connor Jr. for owners Arden Homestead Stable and Janice Connor. She now has three wins in seven starts this season.

Rules Of The Road scored her ninth career victory Friday and pushed her career earnings to over \$278,000. She paid \$8.80 to win.

The Burke-Gingras combination struck again in the first elimination of the Goodtimes for sophomore trotters.

Dayson trotted up from fourth to first in the second-quarter and never looked back en route to a 1:53.2 victory.

Will Take Charge was the leader at the opening-quarter in :27.4, but was overtaken by a pocket-pulling Bar Hopping. Gingras followed the new leader and quickly moved up to take the lead at the half in :56.2. Dayson got a :29.1 third-quarter and finished off the victory with a :27.4 final-quarter to defeat Bar Hopping by one-and-three-quarter lengths.

Will Take Charge finished third, while Zagster, who was first

up around the final turn, was fourth. Goin To The Limit, who started from the second-tier, finished fifth to qualify for the final

A gelded son of Conway Hall—Nervey's Taurus, Dayson now has three wins in four starts this season after winning seven of eight as a rookie.

"He's really handy," said Gingras following the victory.

"When I raced him the first time this year at Chester he was a little bit grabby, but they changed a few things on him and tonight he was perfect, he drove great and he's got high speed."

Dayson raced last season for Howard Okusko and was a private purchase during the winter by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Our Horse Cents Stables, J And T Silva Stables and Rossie Smith.

The sophomore trotter now has \$54,950 banked this season to bring his career earnings to over \$237,000. Dayson paid \$3.10 to win.

Many eyes were on last year's Ontario Sires Stakes champion Tony Soprano in the second elimination, but his season debut was spoiled by Dia Monde and driver Randy Waples.



Tony Soprano got away fifth and came charging first up midway doing the backstretch to engage with the leader United Bi. Dia Monde was trotting along in sixth and Waples opted to try and follow the 7-5 favorite.

Tony Soprano ultimately cleared nearing the three-quarter pole and reached that marker in 1:25.1. In the stretch, Campbell asked his trotter to try and sprint away, while Waples dropped in behind Tony Soprano for a brief moment. Dia Monde came back to the outside and powered by the public's choice to score an 8-1 upset in a career-best 1:54.

Blenheim followed Dia Monde around the track to get up for second, while Tony Soprano was third in his season debut. Marion Marauder and Honor Above All secured the final two spots in next week's final.

A gelded son of Deweycheatumnhowe—Lady Bar, Dia Monde entered the Goodtimes elimination with a victory and runner-up finish in two starts this season. Friday's start was the first time Waples sat behind the Tom Durand trainee.

"Tom's been around a long time and I've seen him come out with really good horses year after year," said Waples. "Sometimes he hands the lines over and sometimes he wants to drive them himself.

"I had raced against him a couple of times when Tom had driven him and I think I even mentioned to him 'What a nice horse you got there' and it just worked out my way."

Dia Monde is owned by June and Tom Durand along with Allan Smith. The sophomore trotter now has \$26,500 earned this season after banking \$11,900 in three starts as a rookie. Dia Monde paid \$18.30 to win.

Man plans, God laughs

Five little words: "Man plans and God laughs."

It's crazy-brilliant because it's insanely true. In the life of a harness racing person, it's a truism that's even truer than true. We get up, get out of bed, drag a comb across our head, and set out to a special place where temperamental creatures sit and wait for us to do their bidding. That special place is a barn, and the godlike creatures we find therein are the horses we choose to idolize.

Sometimes we arrive to find a Garden of Eden, and other times we come upon Armageddon. All manner of a horseman's destiny are placed unto the decorated hooves of heavenly creatures who make hellish demands.

If human beings were forced to acknowledge and accept and resign themselves to one, and only one life lesson, the aforementioned Yiddish piece of wisdom is the cornerstone upon which one should set out to build all hopes and all dreams for what is to come.

Even if you don't believe in God, the rule still applies — it's just not as much fun. The idea of some greater power giggling behind your back while you struggle to achieve in life makes the achievements you actually achieve so much more gratifying. Sadly, it serves also to remind us that nothing ever turns out quite the way we planned.

Ultimately, in the world of the racehorse, the horse goes on to become the reigning deity who gets the last laugh. To the mortal folks who toil in racing, the horse is the rising sun and the misbegotten moon. And while many pray to other gods or stars or runes for health, wealth and happiness, the horse is ultimately the golden idol. The horse is a god, but

does HE too really laugh at our best laid plans? Does SHE, the gentle mare with her kind eye and delicate lashes, mock our best efforts like that other big guy who supposedly smites bad guys with lightening and locusts?

Those heavy stone tablets teach us that we should not place strange gods before us. In other words, it's wrong to worship a horse. Keep in mind that the Old Testament was written long before Wiggle it Jiggleit set foot on a racetrack, so you might want to reconsider that one rule and choose to love thy neighbor a little more, and covet his wife a little less. You know — balance it out.

Anyway, the racehorse giveth great riches and the racehorse taketh those riches away. Our cups runneth over — but not very often. The horse maketh us lie down in his green paddock when we cannot catch him and we are far too weary to keep trying. He leadeth us to gentle brown waters where he rolls and muddies himself, in spite of all human efforts to keep him clean and shiny and worthy of their worship. Still, come foul, come fair, the horse-god is praised in spite of the fact that he is indeed just a horse.

But do these horse gods return our dutiful favors and our labor? Are they good and merciful gods or are they vengeful? The answer depends on who's telling the story. In this instance you are forced to hear me, a discarded leper who has seen great and miraculous things. Like the martyred and sainted horsemen who came before me, and with just the clothes on my back and my horses for companionship, I wandered for an eternity with good intent throughout a great wasteland — a place the prophets called New Jersey — and that is where I prepared my gospel of many fantastic stories. Here is one:

Not so very long ago, a very talented trainer named Michael Russo, labored for hours and hours trying to find the best horse at a yearling sale. His plan was noble and his diligence was great. With his strange penchant for maroon and gray perfection, Michael inspected every single colt and filly until he decided that there was only one in their midst who was deserving of his bid. I know this to be true because I, a trusted and worthy friend, stood by his side as other meritorious horsemen, dressed in their little brief authority, dismissed and degraded that which Mike hath chosen. And, because he was in need of laughter and merriment, God watched as Mike purchased, for a mere \$10,000, a colt who would go forth to become the world champion pacer Riverboat King.

Yes, Mike planned and planned and planned, and for those efforts he found himself the rare camel who could walk

through the eye of a needle. But, there were still eight months ahead — plenty of time for godly laughter.

In the late spring, when there was new light and the creatures of the earth were reawakening and again stirring above the stone dust, Riverboat King had proven that he was perhaps a young Hercules; possessing of much merit, and a steed proving worthy of Mike's careful plan. But was this a trick? Was Riverboat King — a young god in the making — preparing still to mock Michael Russo as he too wandered through the same vast wasteland as !?

Soon — as word spread throughout the land about this inspiring colt who had shown nothing but great promise — other men came to marvel at Michael Russo's treasure for they too wanted to call that treasure their own. After much negotiation and the falsely polite bartering of wealthy gentlemen, Michael sold the precious colt that he hath chosen above all others. And though he came upon a healthy profit — an offer no mortal man could refuse — his profit was nowhere near as bountiful as the \$1.2 million dollars the chosen one went on to plunder for its new owners and trainer when it was sent into battle. Let's agree to say that Michael Russo planned while Riverboat King, a lesser god, had at least giggled.

Throughout my travels in the wasteland, and in search of truth, I was told by many wise men that there was much lunacy ahead of me. They told me about crazy people who said and did odd things whilst they fussed around with the horse gods. I was warned that I would be confronted with strange minds, and that I would scratch my head in wonder. The wise men were right.


Each time I am asked, and we sit by my campfire, I will tell you stories of these strange people. I will tell you about an owner who pretended to be blind to avoid filling out a blank check. Then there was the impostor who masqueraded as a veterinarian to impress me in hopes of a better deal. Although I am not a Buddhist, I can tell you that in Buddhism, there is a proverb in which mortals are warned about the importance of truth — something upon which I have rarely stumbled in racing.

Buddhists say: "There are but three things that cannot be long hidden; The sun, the moon and the truth." With that wisdom in mind, know that all these tales I tell will always be true as I have remembered them.





John Campbell's unique NA Cup daily double

John Campbell dominated the Pepsi North America Cup in the 1990s.

Four times driver John Campbell has won the North America Cup with a horse who won another million-dollar race. The first two -Precious Bunny in 1991 and Cams Card Shark in 1994 - were named Horse of the Year. The second two - Davids Pass in 1995 and The Panderosa in 1999 - did not even win their division. In '95 that honor went to Jennas Beach Boy. Four years later, Triple Crown winner Blissfull Hall was the champ.

Campbell's six NA Cups in the 1990s is a record for any driver in any million-dollar race in any decade.

The Panderosa was the first horse to win both the Meadowlands Pace and the North America Cup with sub-1:50 miles. He posted the first sub-1:50 NA Cup win with a 1:49.4 win. He won the Meadowlands Pace in 1:49.3 with a 26-second final quarter.

Not ready for prime time?

The first North America Cup was on a Monday afternoon at Greenwood in 1984. The first Meadowlands Pace was held on a Tuesday night in July, 1977 at the Meadowlands.

Third home

This year marks the third time a track has hosted the NA Cup at least 10 times.

Greenwood was home to the Cup from 1984 to 1993. Woodbine had the Cup from 1994 to 2006. Mohawk is now in its 10th year as the home of the Cup.

Cross-border rivalry

Had Mark O'Mara and Jate Lobell not gotten their nose up over Frugal Gourmet in 1987, it would have given Canadian-born drivers the first 19 editions of the NA Cup. Now, the times have changed. If a U.S.-born driver wins the Cup again this year, it would the second time that this has happened four times in a row.

Yankee Cruiser and Dean Magee won in 2003. Mantacular and Cat Manzi won in 2004. Rocknroll Hanover and Brian Sears won in 2005 and Total Truth and Ron Pierce took the Cup in 2006. The last three years have seen Captaintreacherous and Tim Tetrick win in 2013, J K Endofanera and Sears win in 2014 and Wakizashi Hanover and Tetrick took last year's edition.

NA Cup trivia

Q: Who is the richest three-year-old not to compete in either the North America or the Meadowlands Pace?

A: Art Major in 2002 (\$1,562,779)

Q: Who was the last Horse of the Year to win the NA Cup?

A: Somebeachsomewhere in 2008. Wiggle It Jiggleit, last year's Horse of the Year, was second in the NA Cup. Rocknroll Heaven, the Horse of the Year in 2010 was fourth in the NA Cup.

Q: Can you name the equine brothers that were both NA Cup champs?

A: Red River Hanover in 2002 and Rocknroll Hanover in 2005.



Odds-on favorites upended in Vernon EBC filly elims

Commanding favorite Non Stick was handed her first career defeat in her Empire Breeders Classic elimination on Friday (June 10) at Vernon Downs, while Fad Finance (\$22.60) and Earn Your Wings (\$18.20) copped minor upsets in the preliminaries for next week's marquee trotting event.

In the first \$12,500 elimination, trainer/driver Åke Svanstedt sprinted to the fore with 1-10 favorite Non Stick, and the pair were unchallenged through splits of :26.4, :56.4, and 1:25.3. At head-stretch, the then-undefeated daughter of Lucky Chucky—Meucci Madness faced pressure from the two who most directly tracked her, as Straight A Student (Mark MacDonald) emerged from the pocket and Fad Finance (Trond Smedshammer) fanned deeper yet. Fad Finance vaulted to a narrow lead in mid-stretch, battling to maintain a lead over Straight A Student for a 1:54.1 triumph. Non Stick and Lindylicious (Chris Lems) rounded out the top four in the

first elimination.

Smedshammer also trains Fad Finance, a three-year-old Credit Winner—Armbro Vanity filly, for the Purple Haze Stables, Marc Goldberg, and the Rojan Stables.

In the second elimination, Earn Your Wings (Jason Bartlett) took full advantage of a pocket trip, swinging out at head-stretch to duel clear of pacesetter Swinging Royalty (Lems) for a 1:54.4 win. Open Access (Matt Kakaley) rallied belatedly into third, while Goosebump Hanover (Jim Morrill, Jr.) held fourth.

Anette Lorentzon trains Earn Your Wings, also a three-year-old Credit Winner—Southwind Serena filly, for the SRF Stable.

Of the two fifth-place finishers in the eliminations, Dazzling Dollars draws into next week's \$234,375 final.

The following 10 three-year-old trotting colts and geldings advance directly to the \$222,975 Empire Breeders Classic final: Dante, Just For Today, Omaha Set Hut, Reve Royale, Sir Royson, Smalltownthrowdown, Southern Palms, Sweet Royalty, Thats a Bad Boy and The Royal Harry.

Both finals will be part of a special Sunday evening card at Vernon, on Father's Day, June 19.

Lovineveryminute wins by a nose at Big M

Lovineveryminute worked out a perfect cover trip and got up on the wire in a furious three-way battle to win the featured \$25,000 mares open on Friday (June 10) at the Meadowlands.

The Richard Johnson trainee picked up cover from Gweneeee J at the five-eighths, swung to the outside as soon as she straightened up in the stretch, and got up in a driving finish, nosing out Sheeza Shark N.

Inittowinafortune closed well along the rail at odds of 32-1, to finish a nose back in third. Totally Rusty was fourth. Lovineveryminute, driven by Joe Bongiorno, returned \$10.40 as the fourth choice in the wagering for owners Brian and Ira Ross Wallach. She paced the mile in a lifetime-best 1:50.3.

CARRYOVERS CARRY ON: The carryovers for the two 20 cent Jackpot Super High Five wagers continued to climb.

In the fifth race, the finish of 7-2-4-1-3 failed to yield a single-ticket winner, upping the carryover to \$14,017.39.

The 11th race combination of 5-10-3-6-1 also failed to yield a single-ticket winner, increasing that carryover to a whopping \$250,288.64 Both jackpots will be up for grabs on the next Big M card.
