Giving thanks for Obrigado

Paul Kelley's gelded trotter Obrigado – named after the Portuguese word for thank you – pushed his career earnings to the brink of \$1 million with a win Saturday in the \$210,000 Charlie Hill Memorial at Scioto Downs.

A few minutes after Obrigado won his second straight \$200,000 race to push his career earnings to the cusp of \$1 million, his trainer and part-owner Paul Kelley was giving thanks and deferring credit for the six-year-old gelded trotter's success to his team in the barn.

"I think a big part of it is my second trainer, his name is Kevin Constantine. He's also my blacksmith. Kevin and his girlfriend Jenna, literally, live with this horse day to day. They just do a fantastic job," Kelley said after Obrigado won Saturday's \$210,000 Charlie Hill Memorial at Scioto Downs in Columbus, OH. "I think a lot of it certainly is Jenna's work and Kevin's work with the shoeing. I think it's all of us putting our heads together and sorting it out. Some of the things that maybe kept us from doing a little better last year.

"This is our third year or racing him now and I think like everything else there's just been a little bit of a learning curve. Last year, he would get a little steppey. He'd never make a break, but he'd get a little funky at times. We needed to sort things out a little bit as to what was going on."

Obrigado held off a charging Natural Herbie by a head to win.

On May 29, Obrigado and driver Mark MacDonald edged Il Songo Dream by a neck in 1:52 in the \$200,000 Maxie Lee Memorial Invitational at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Last night at Scioto, MacDonald orchestrated a beautiful trip and then held off a charging Natural Herbie by a head in 1:53.3.

"I was really expecting Natural Herbie to start to go away a little bit coming off the last turn, but he really didn't. His last sixteenth of a mile he was just vicious," Kelley said. "We were fortunate we had room up the inside. My horse likes to pass horses and he saw Herbie coming on the very outside towards the end and was able to keep going and hold him off. Mark (MacDonald) gets along with this horse so well and the horse is just a very versatile type of horse. He gave him a fantastic trip... Mark did just a tremendous job putting our horse into play early and things just worked out great."

Kelley, who lives in Gansevoort, NY, shares ownership of the son of Boy Band out of Malimony with SRF Stable of Delray Beach, FL, Linwood Higgins of Scarborough, ME and Stable 45 of Boynton Beach, FL. Obrigado sports a record of 3-1-1 in five starts this year, and earnings of \$248,530. The gelding was 4-6-3 in 18 starts in 2015 for earnings of \$405,535.

"He's just a really nice horse. You never have to worry about him throwing in a clunker. He'll take any kind of trip you throw at him and he just has a real will to want to win and pass horses. We're just thrilled with the way things are going and we'll go to the Cutler next (June 24 at the Meadowlands) and then, hopefully, come back out (to Ohio) to Northfield for the Cleveland Classic (July 2). He finished second last year in it. I want that one back."

More important than that, Kelley said he's looking toward the early fall for one special race.

"I'm hoping we can manage the horse right and get him through the year nice and healthy because I'd love to get invited to that International Trot at Yonkers. The mile-and-a-quarter race is right up his alley. I would just love to take a crack at that. We'll see. I hope it works out," he said.

Million-Dollar Field Set

Eliminations for the 33rd edition of the Pepsi North America Cup at Mohawk Saturday featured wins by Betting Line and Boston Red Rocks.

Betting Line (David Miller) won what was believed to be the tougher of the two Pepsi North America Cup eliminations with a 1:49.1 effort Saturday at Mohawk.

Watching from home in New Jersey, trainer Steve Elliott said he was mildly surprised his talented pupil Boston Red Rocks won the second of two \$50,000 (Cdn) Pepsi North America Cup eliminations Saturday (June 11) at Mohawk so easily off a last quarter in :27.3.

"I thought there would be a lot more of them on the wire going those kind of fractions, but the other division seemed like it was a lot tougher," Elliott said. "Not to disrespect anybody's horses, but it looked like the other group was stacked."

Heavily favored Boston Red Rocks (3-5), the Dan Patch Award winner as the 2015 two-year-old pacing colt of the year, won his elimination by a half-length over Big Top Hanover in 1:50.3. Michaels Victory was third, Magnum J was fourth and Manhattan Beach grabbed the final ticket into next Saturday's (June 18) \$1 million final for sophomore pacing colts.

Boston Red Rocks, a son of Rocknroll Hanover—McGibson

bred by Andray Farm of Punxsutawney, PA, was driven to victory by Tim Tetrick for owners Peter Blood of Pompano Beach, FL and Rick Berks of Boca Raton, FL.

In the first elimination, 8-5 second betting choice Betting Line won by three-quarters of a length over Lyons Snyder in 1:49.1. A surging Racing Hill made a break in deep stretch,

but finished third and was kept up by the judges. Favorite Control The Moment was fourth and Beast Mode squeaked into the final with a fifth-place finish.

Betting Line, an unaltered son of Bettor's Delight out of Heather's Western bred by Fair Winds Farm Inc. of Cream Ridge, NJ, is trained and owned, in part, by Casie Coleman of Cambridge, ON. She shares the colt with Ross Warriner of Burlington, ON, Christine Calhoun of Chatham, ON and Mac Nichol of Burlington.

Coleman told WEG's Mark McKelvie that she changed Betting Line's shoes after he won his \$57,750 Somebeachsomewhere division last Saturday's (June 4) at Mohawk.

"He has one major problem. He has a splint that's bothered him ever since he was a baby. I put aluminum up front and I think it was stinging him more than anything (last week)," Coleman said. "Normally, you want aluminum on this track, but this horse needs steel. Sportswriter won (the 2010 Cup) with steel shoes, so we're going to try to do it again."

Betting Line was driven to victory by David Miller, who was sitting in the colt's sulky for the first time.

"I was really impressed with him. He went an awesome, first-over trip and never gave up until he got to the wire," Miller said. "I definitely didn't like our trip. I thought maybe I might be able to pick up some cover, but he felt strong the whole way and he kept digging through the stretch."

The Pepsi North America Cup is one of the few major races Miller has yet to win.

"I've been going after this for a long time and it looks like I've got a good shot here," he said.

Though Coleman changed Betting Line's shoes, Elliott said Boston Red Rocks is equipped "the same as he was last year. He got taller. He didn't fill out quite as much as we wanted him to, but he got taller and lankier. He's a bigger horse, but he's still growing into himself."

"I'm a firm believer in this horse," Tetrick said in the winner's circle. "I know he's a nice horse. Every time he got

beat, he got beat by a head, a nose. He got beat, but he raced good enough to win.

"He's a little lazy and he kind of loses focus sometimes and you got to stay after him, but he got the job done. He finds ways to win so that's what I like about him."

The connections of both Betting Line and Boston Red Rocks earned the right to pick their

post for the final. The rest of the field will be drawn at a press conference on Tuesday at Mohawk.

Saturday night, Tetrick will be looking for his third NA Cup victory and second straight. He won last year's Cup with Wakizashi Hanover and the 2013 edition with Captaintreacherous.

Elliott won the 2009 NA Cup with Well Said.

Boston Red Rocks has already raced four straight weeks having contested New Jersey Sires Stakes events at the Meadowlands on May 21 (first), May 28 (third) and June 4 (second).

"It concerns me with all these starts right in a row. You'd like to have a week off somewhere, but the schedule just didn't call for it," Elliott said.

"The one thing I know is he won't embarrass us. He's a nice horse and he won't embarrass us."

Is the same/old same/old the best we can offer?

Let's say that I'm a restaurateur and business is thriving. Profits are up about 10-15 per cent every year and I see a steady stream of customers, even on weekdays.

I can probably just keep on doing what I've been doing in my restaurant, right? Why mess with the menu?

Can I afford to become complacent? Not exactly. I still have to pay attention to the kitchen, to the staff, to all the details. But if your sales and profits are up substantially, you've got a winning formula.

But how many harness tracks do you know that have a winning formula with handle and overall income are up 10-15 per cent each year?

Everyone realizes what's happening in horse racing. By and large, the public isn't buying what racetracks — standardbred and thoroughbred — are selling. And yet many tracks keep selling the same product. They stick to the same old menu that the public has rejected. In some cases, they simply give larger portions — 12 races instead of 10.

Harness racing is a business rich in traditions: The Hambletonian, Little Brown Jug, The Red Mile. I love them all. But those traditions don't mean a thing to the general public.

I often wonder what a group of bright grad students in a sports administration program might say if they seriously studied the presentation of the "menu" at harness tracks. I'm talking about bright young people with no knowledge of the cherished harness racing traditions. They'd bring a fresh perspective to the challenge. And I bet that they'd suggest a lot of changes.

I suspect that they would find racing boring and predictable. Even people in the sport who know all the nuances say that.

But when you have a dozen races, all contested at the same

distance, over the same track, often with the same number of horses, often with many of the same drivers, the result is a bit like watching the same movie over and over again.

The fourth race is likely to unfold just like the third race and the fifth race.

From a handicapping perspective, perhaps that predictability is reassuring. From an entertainment perspective, it's a turn off. And shouldn't a night at the races be entertaining and fun — and a bit unpredictable at times? Shouldn't it offer the unexpected, the longshot winners? How exciting and unpredictable is racing at Yonkers when horses with the three inside posts win more than half the races?

I was in Europe earlier this year and met with trotting officials in a couple countries. They spoke about how France dominates trotting on the continent. Betting by French racing fans on races in other countries has been a godsend to countries where trotting has been in deep trouble. But these people emphasized that French officials will only take betting on races with large fields. The French are smart enough to know that nothing kills betting faster than fields with fewer than 10 horses.

How is this accomplished? Longer distances. Europeans are

not locked in to the one-mile monotony that is pervasive in North America. The formula is simple: the longer the races, the more horses can start.

Consider this year's Olympics: the 100-meter dash will likely have eight finalists while there will be more than a hundred in the marathon. The longer the race, the more starters.

The more starters in a horse race, the more movement and excitement in the race, and likely the more betting on the outcome. Conversely, short fields often yield short payoffs. Bettors don't find that very tempting.

As a cab driver told me years ago why he preferred betting on thoroughbreds to harness races. "Ya can't make no money bettin' on them trotters." And who ever disputes the wisdom of a cabbie?

We all recognize the problem, but who has the will to innovate?

I once suggested to a veteran race secretary at a five-eighths-mile track that he card races at one-and-a-quarter miles and start maybe a dozen horses in a race.

I was astonished when he asked, "Where would the race start?"

"Right in front of the public," I told him. I guess he simply never contemplated any deviation from harness racing's one-mile monotony.

At that time, racing was far more robust than it is now. Maybe he didn't see the need to experiment. But that was then; this is now.

I've had people question if horses would withstand racing extra distance. Would they simply collapse and die if asked to race beyond a mile? Would they soon go lame?

Au contraire, as the French might say.

One owner in Sweden told me years ago that young horses should never race at a mile and instead be given their introduction to racing at longer distances.

"Mile races are just sprints and the horse learns that it has to go like hell from the start," the owner told me. "I don't want to have my horses be headstrong pullers. I want them to relax in a race and be rated. That's why I insist that they start their careers at longer distances. They are trotting at a more moderate rate and they learn to trail horses and pass. They stay sane and they stay sound. It's the speed that kills, not the distance."

Of course, with larger fields, is it inevitable that more

horses will go back to the barn without a paycheck? Not necessarily. We traditionally pay five places in harness racing – even in races with five horses. But no one has ever explained why we pay five places and why tracks cannot pay more horses with larger fields.

I realize it's hard to break with tradition, but now seems like the perfect opportunity to try. The public isn't buying what we're selling, but we're still living in the Fool's Paradise provided by slots subsidies. Many tracks have significant purses and insignificant patronage. Why not experiment a little? We can't worry about chasing off fans because there are so few of them left in the grandstands.

Fan Hanover, Roses Are Red finals set



Darlinonthebeach (David Miller) defeated L A Delight by a length in 1:50.2.

While Good Will Hanover came from off-the pace, Darlinonthebeach set the pace to capture their respective \$35,000 Fan Hanover eliminations on Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack.

In the first elimination for three-year-old pacing fillies, Good Will Hanover was able to defeat the heavily-favored Pure Country by a neck.

From post five, driver Chris Christoforou and Good Will Hanover marched to the front after the wings on the gate folded and held command past the quarter pole in :27.2. Mayhem Seelster followed along in second with Bad As Leader sitting third.

Into the backstretch, Pure Country, who was undefeated in 10 starts as a rookie, made a bid for the lead from fourth, and cleared at the half in :54.4. When the fillies were in the final turn Mayhem Seelster advanced first-up from third and put pressure on driver Brett Miller and the front-stepping Somebeachsomewhere filly. Past the three-quarter pole in 1:23, Pure Country was able to pull away, but that left Good Will Hanover room to try and retake the lead from the pocket.

In deep stretch, Good Will Hanover was able to overcome Pure Country to capture the victory and stop the clock in 1:50.2. Mayhem Seelster finished third.

"That is a nice mare," said Christoforou about rival Pure

Country. "She's going to take you right to the wire so I had no problem letting (driver Brett Miller) go and sitting behind that mare. It's a real good mare so she carried me where I wanted to go and I was fortunate enough to have enough horse left to get there.

"It's a horse race that's for sure. But I wouldn't want to be driving any other one."

The daughter of Big Jim and Go For Best notched her seventh lifetime win and third of the season, which also includes trips to the winner's circle for her SBOA elim and the final. The filly pushed her career earnings to \$281,259 for trainer Dr. Ian Moore and owners BLB Stable. Good Will Hanover paid \$8.30 to win.

The top five finishers advanced to the \$438,000 Fan Hanover Final, which is set for Saturday, June 18 as part of the \$1-million Pepsi North America Cup undercard.

The Roses Are Red eliminations also took place on Saturday night's card.

A group of 23 older pacing mares were split into three \$35,000 eliminations.

Anndrovette, a three-time winner of the Roses Are Red, was able to get up in the final strides to prevail in a win photo over Sandbetweenurtoes. The Jeff Bamond Jr. trainee stopped the clock in 1:49.4 with driver Tim Tetrack handling the lines.

The elimination victory was the first win for the nine-year-old mare this season and her 45th overall.

Waasmula finished third to qualify for the final.

In the second split, Lady Shadow made a second-quarter move to the lead and never looked back en route to a 1:50.2 victory. Driven by Doug McNair, the five-year-old picked up her second win in eight outings Saturday.

The Ron Adams trainee hit the wire three-and-a-quarter lengths ahead of Yagonnakissmeornot and Wrangler Magic.

McNair was right back in the winner's circle in the final elimination with Solar Sister.

Trained by Gregg McNair, Solar Sister went gate-to-wire to score a 1:51 victory. The four-year-old pacing mare finished a length and a half ahead of Katie Said and two-lengths in front of Ms Mac N Cheese.

Solar Sister now has two wins in five starts this season.

Devil Child was the fourth-place finisher drawn by lot to qualify for next Saturday's \$370,000 final.

Breakfast with the Babies makes seasonal debut

Summer has officially arrived in New Jersey and brought with it Saturday morning's (June 11) edition of Breakfast With The Babies at The Meadowlands featuring more than \$4 million worth of horseflesh competing in the dozen two-year-old events. Things got underway at 9:30 on a partly cloudy morning with the track fast, temperatures in the low 70's and little wind to begin that gradually increased in force from the east as the day wore on...and on.

The fastest of the freshmen was pacing colt RJP who stormed home from well back with an individually timed :26.3 end to the 1:54.4 mile for driver Marcus Miller in the 11th race. He's a sharp looking Somebeachsomewhere colt from the freaky fast Vysoke Tatry who went through the

Lexington Selected Yearling Sale for \$40,000. Breeders David and John Prushnok have retained an interest in partnership with Dave Miller and Lawrence Means. The trainer is Erv Miller. Seriously Good set the fractions for Brett Miller and lasted for second over Whiskey Please and Ray Schnittker.

Trotting fillies opened the card and Ariana G, the baby sister to last season's Breeders Crown winning All The Time, started the day off on a high note with a spectacular 1:59 / :27.4 romp for Yannick Gingras. She's a homebred daughter of Muscle Hill trained by Jimmy Takter for Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld. Checkmate Time (Scott Zeron) rallied well into the fast final quarter to be second and One Class Act (Schnittker) hung in for third.

Ellerie Hanover converted a pocket trip provided by Dave Miller into an effortless 2:01.1 win, closing into the official 27.4 last quarter. Grand Idea set the fractions for Takter and held well to be second and Lexi Marie (Trond Smedshammer) third. Nancy Johansson trains the winner, a \$270,000 Harrisburg Cantab Hall filly, for Lennart Agren's SRF Stable of Sweden.

That same owner/trainer/driver combination came right back with the \$160,000 Lexington Select Sale Muscle Hill filly Southwind Avanti, who set all the fractions before sprinting home comfortably in 27.3 to complete the 1:59.3 mile. Takter was again second, this time with Star's Edge and Coolcreek Princess (Schnittker) third.

Rubio finally won something, unfortunately it was a baby race at The Meadowlands and not a presidential primary event. This Rubio is a Cantab Hall with French bloodlines on the dam's side and he looked sharp today, scoring from the pocket for Gingras and Takter in 1:57.3 with a :28.1 final quarter. He was a \$75,000 Lexington purchase Christina Takter, John and Jim Fielding and Brixton Medical. An

aggressive Southwind Segway (Tyler Raymer) cut the mile and held second while Zack's Zoomer (Marcus Miller) closed in the stretch for third.

The handsome and talented Lars Perry trotted home brilliantly in a sub-:28 final panel, winning the fifth race in 201.3 for Gingras and Takter. He sat kindly in the pocket until shown open road then went by willingly. The Muscle Hill colt from the accomplished race mare Southwind Wasabi was a \$150,000 Lexington purchase by Christina Takter, John Fielding, Melby Gard and Bud Hatfield Stables. Eternal Patrol (Marcus Melander) flashed good foot late to get up for second and Party Hard (John Campbell) settled for third after cutting the early fractions.

After the break, Phi Alpha impressed for the second consecutive week, winning as driver Andy Miller pleased in a front-stepping 1:59.4 mile. He sprinted to a large lead mid-stretch then coasted in with a final half of :57.2 and :28.3 quarter. This Cantab Hall colt is a Bob Key homebred, the first foal from his \$1.6 million champion mare Win Missy B. Trainer Andrew Harris has the Phi Alpha in good form as he embarks on his racing career. You Can't Habit (Gingras) closed nicely to be second and Monteverdi also rallied well late for Campbell who got him to settle and sit in after being a bit anxious early.

Love Love Me Do was the winner of race seven for filly pacers for driver Marcus Miller. She set slow fractions, opened a clear lead mid-stretch and held safe with a :27.2 end to the 1:59.3 mile. The Rocknroll Hanover lass was bought in for \$24,000 Lexington by trainer Erv Miller in partnership with Rocco Ruffalo and George Golemes. Perplexed (Zeron) had good late pace, closing the gap on the winner while World Apart and Planet Rock also flashed good late pace.

Linda Toscano has trained more than a few good horses for owner Ken Jacobs and Robin J is a filly that looks as though she may contribute to their roster of successes. Tim Tetrick settled her third along the rail as Lady Of Heaven took the field through three quarters in 1:32.1 then she flew through the stretch to get her nose on the wire first in 1:59.1 with her final quarter in :26.2. Ken bought the Roll With Joe filly at Harrisburg for \$60,000 last fall. Idyllic Beach (Gingras) had the lead between stretch calls to be second while Lady In Heaven (Campbell) held up well for third.

Pacing colts took over in the ninth and Air Strike cut the mile to win in 1:57 with a wicked :26.2 final quarter for Corey Callahan. He's another good looking Always A Virgin colt that trainer Joe Holloway paid \$75,000 for in the interests of long

time owners Val D'Or Farms and Ted Gewertz in Lexington. The Wall, a beautiful Somebeachsomewhere colt, was absolutely airborne in the stretch for Gingras into the fast last quarter while Richard Hill (Tetrick) was also in the fray late.

Very Special Agent (D. Miller) looked special indeed today as he rallied from a stalking position into a :26.2 final quarter tracking down Beach Pro for the 1:57 win. Relative bargain colt Hurrikane King Kong (\$10,000 Lex Select) closed along with the winner for Gingras to get up for second and Beach Pro (Tetrick) was a valiant third. Brian J (Tetrick) made a nice close to be third.

A couple of top trotting colts from last season officially embarked on their Hambletonian trail this morning with Waitlifter K winning easily in 1:54.4 and Dog Gone Lucky a good third behind the Goldsmith Maid winning filly of last year Double Exposure in a sharp 1:53.2.
