

With Wiggle It Jiggleit, the North America Cup Should Answer All the Questions

Wiggle It Jiggleit has been on a rampage this year, destroying everything that has stood in his way, be it in New Jersey, Delaware, Indiana or Ontario. No horse has come close to him and he gives the impression every night he hits the racetrack that he is indeed a special horse. There's just one thing that has been missing, a real test.

That won't be the case come late tomorrow night as, at last, the world of harness racing is going to find out how good Wiggle It Jiggleit is. He is the 9-5 morning line favorite in the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup at Mohawk where he'll face nine of the best

3-year-old male pacers in North America. He drew post three.

"Competition matters," said his owner George Teague Jr. "He really hasn't faced the top, top competition yet. This race matters a lot."

With a victory, Wiggle It Jiggleit will have left no doubt that he is the best in his class. With a loss, some will no doubt say he was over-hyped and not up to the challenge.

Teague certainly isn't expecting the latter. He has been so high on the Indiana-bred gelding by Mr. Wiggles from the start that his biggest worry has been that he has come across as cocky. Back when the horse was merely winning wintertime stakes races at the Meadowlands, Teague was telling the world this was the best horse he has ever trained, better than his Horse of the Year Rainbow Blue.

"I hope he continues to roll like he has done," Teague said. "Physically, it still seems like there's not a weakness in his arsenal. I think he will show the world that he should be considered the top 3-year-old in the country."

"If he can dominate Saturday night against this level of horses he'll start to build a legacy that he can continue to build and protect. I am fortunate to have the horse to do it with. I know I sounded cocky when people started asking me about this horse four months ago and I said what I said, but, look, he's backed up everything I said and more. He still surprises me. The things he does are breathtaking to me."

It's still too early to compare Wiggle It Jiggleit to the best ever, horses like Niatross and Somebeachsomewhere, but that day might come.

"Some people look at him and believe he's already proven to be as good as those horses," Teague said. "They are great horses. But I think to be considered at that level you have to do it in more than 11 starts. You have to do it over something like 20 lifetime starts."

Teague is living a dream. Not only does he have a once-in-a-lifetime horse but he owns it himself. That means he has no one to answer to, that he can put down his son, Montrell, to drive and there's no one demanding that he be replaced by a Yannick Gingras or a Tim Tetrick. He also lists his long-time assistant Clyde Francis as the official trainer because he wants to give Francis some exposure and reward him for his years of loyalty.

"It's a great learning experience for Montrell and will help him long term in this business and it gives Clyde great exposure in case some day he goes out on his own," Teague said. "There's no better owner than yourself. If you train a horse who makes \$1 million your cut is only \$50,000 and then you have to hear people asking are you the right trainer for this horse because he's a great horse? I never have to listen to that."

Wiggle It Jiggleit has been 1-10 in his last seven starts,

which is reflective not only of his ability but the level of competition he has been facing. He doesn't need another race like that, not when Teague is hoping to establish his gelding as one of the best ever. It's the right time for him to have some serious competition—and tomorrow night he figures to get it.

In the Arsenal will likely be the second choice. He's won five straight, including the Art Rooney and a North America Cup elim. Brian Sears will drive for trainer Kelvin Harrison and leave from the five post. Artspeak wasn't at his best when finishing second behind Wakizashi Hanover in the elims, but is a high quality horses who can easily rebound. The problem is that since he didn't win last week he went into the random draw for the race and wound up with the 10 post. Scott Zeron will drive for Tony Alagna. Wakizashi Hanover is thriving for trainer Joann Looney King and won his NA Cup elim in stylish fashion for Tetrack.

With Increasing Difficulty of Buying Top Race Horses in US, More and More Buyers Turning to Down Under

Joe Bellino needed race horses and his efforts to find them in the U.S. were leading to nothing but headaches and frustration.

"You try to buy a horse here that you think is worth

\$50,000 or \$60,000 and people are asking for \$100,000," Bellino said. "There's no meat left on the bone for anybody anymore."

What Bellino has discovered is simply a result of the forces of supply and demand. Purses, particularly at the East Coast tracks, have never been higher, yet the

foal crop keeps declining every year. That means the demand for quality race horses exceeds the supply, and that means that buyers can get away with jacking up their prices.

So Bellino decided to try something different. He's now doing much of his race horse shopping Down Under in

Australia and New Zealand. He's not alone. More and more owners are looking to the two Southern Hemisphere countries to fill their barns because they know they can find good horses there, often at bargain prices.

"I had never bought anything from there before," he said. "We have a very large stable. We breed and are involved in all aspects of the sport, but I need race horses. We want race horses. That's what keeps us busy and it's fun."

"I've been with my trainer Tony O'Sullivan for five or six years and he had been asking me to buy horses from the Southern Hemisphere. I was always scared; I always heard they don't adapt well, they don't do this, they don't do that. Tony, who is from down there, from New Zealand, said just treat them like a normal horse, not a Southern Hemisphere horse, and they'll be fine."

Bellino bought four Down Under horses and has already had major success with two of them. Polak A, who is currently sidelined with a minor illness, won two legs of the Levy Series plus a \$31,000 overnight at Yonkers. Reuben Brogden N is 2 for 4 since arriving here, winning \$31,000 and \$25,000 overnight races at Yonkers.

Bellino didn't want to divulge exactly what he paid for each horses but said he looks to spend between \$50,000 to \$60,000 when buying Southern Hemisphere horses, which includes the price of having them shipped here.

According to Matt Haug, the U.S. representative for IRT, the company the ships the majority of horses that come from Australia and New Zealand to the U.S., it costs

\$15,600 (US) to ship a horse from New Zealand to New York and \$12,900 (US) from Australia to New York. The prices go up and down as currency exchange rates fluctuate, but they are particularly low right now because the Australian and New Zealand dollars are weak.

"If someone wants to do this I suggest they need to find themselves a reputable agent down there to do the buying for them," he said. "The good thing is there are so many successful horsemen in the U.S. that began their careers down there and they all have good contacts. It's like anything else, find the right person, good people to do work for you."

Haug explained that in Australia many horses fall between the cracks. They will exhaust all their conditions but aren't quite good enough to compete in stakes company and are also a poor fit for claimers, which tend to be for cheap races for the lowest level horses. He said once a horse gets into that no-man's land trainers are often eager to sell them.

Darran Cassar, a native of Australia, is another who frequently brings horses in from Down Under, many of them for the Muscara Family. He recently brought over a horse named Caribbean Rose N, who won last week at Chester in a \$13,000 race. And he's still got Mr. Hasani N, who has made nearly \$300,000 since arriving here in 2012.

He looks to spend a little less money than Bellino does.

"I'm usually looking to get them here for 30 to \$40,000 landed," he said. "They don't have to be a star, as long as they can get around Yonkers they can make that money back no problem."

Cassar said it's become easier in recent years to get the Down Under horses to acclimate to U.S. racing and succeed because IRT has changed its shipping routes. The planes from Auckland or Sydney used to land in Los Angeles and the horses then had to be trucked across the U.S. or get on another plane. Cassar said the trip would take quite a bit out of him. The new routes fly straight into JFK Airport in New York and though they are a bit more expensive Cassar said it's well worth it.

"Once they get to me, I give them one day off and jog them and then start training them within a week," Cassar said.

One thing Cassar won't do is spend big money on a Down Under horse, one that could conceivably be a Grand Circuit horse here. He said it is too risky.

"If you pay \$200,000 for a horse here it is a known factor," he said. "It's proven and you know he can race over here and win. If you pay \$200,000 for a horse from there, you really don't know how they're going to do here. It's too big a risk. It's that unknown factor. You see so many come over and think they will do good and they don't. Others come over, don't look like much of anything on paper, go on Lasix and they are brand new horses."

Bellino said that Polak A's success has opened a lot of eyes and that he gets calls from people all the time looking for advice on how to buy New Zealand and Australian horses. But he and Cassar both agree there are still plenty of bargains to be found down there.

"I wait for a horse that is proven, has shown enough and

has nowhere else to go," Cassar said. "The right trainers from there, the really good ones, know when it's time to move them on. If the price is in my favor, I'll buy it. You have to wait for the right horse, but they certainly come along." | [share this story](#) |

International Trot—at \$1 Million—Set to Return Oct. 10 After 20 Year Absence (*press release*)

Yonkers Raceway, which last hosted the spectacle in 1995 (won by Sweden's His Majesty), is bringing it back, complete with a million-dollar purse.

It's scheduled for Saturday afternoon, Oct.

10, and the seven-figure purse would be Yonkers' second-ever million-dollar race (2007 Art Rooney Pace,

won by Southwind Lynx).

The return of the International Trot has been discussed for years, gaining momentum with the success of last season's International Trot Preview. That race, contested at a mile-and-a-quarter, was won by Natural Herbie (Verlin Yoder) in a world-record 2:24.4.

Here's what has been finalized so far...

--purse (\$1 million)

--distance (1¼ miles)

--horses invited (10)

--purse distribution (same as all events), winner-50 percent, 2nd-25 percent, 3rd-12 percent, 4th-8 percent, 5th-5 percent (non-cashing overseas entrants receive \$37,500 via a purse supplement, while non-cashing North American entrants receive \$10,000).

"It's our pleasure to bring back the International Trot," Raceway president Timothy J. Rooney said. "It's been a signature New York race since it debuted at Roosevelt Raceway back in 1959. We took over the race after Roosevelt closed, and it was very well received.

"With Yonkers now a major player in the overseas simulcast market, we feel this is the best time to showcase our track to the world by again inviting the best trotters in the world to race here. We have had tremendous cooperation from our horsemen, and all of us are looking forward to it."

Again, many of the details of the International Trot (invitees, post time, etc.) have yet to be finalized, so updates shall be sent when available.

Brennan to Drive in Ireland

DUBLIN, IRELAND - Harness racing great, driver George Brennan, has announced that he will be heading over to Ireland the first week of August to compete in the Ladbrokes Vincent Delaney Memorial weekend at Portmarnock Raceway.

The 48-year-old reinsman will be missing Hambletonian Day but that is OK with him.

"I really did not have a top three-year-old that I was committed to for the Hambo this year," Brennan said. "And I have heard so many great things about this weekend of racing in Ireland and met with the organizer, Derek Delaney, and I want to experience this."

Brothers Derek and James Delaney, after the tragic passing of their younger brother Vincent in 2011, developed the race weekend series in their brother's memory.

The race has grown to be the richest series in all of Ireland and the United Kingdom. It's for two-year-old pacers and features elimination races

Saturday, August 8 and the final on Sunday, August 9. There are also additional stakes races on both days.

"What a thrill this is to have someone of George's

prominence coming over for our race weekend," Said Derek Delaney. "We now have two Americans, George Brennan and trainer John McDermott coming over along with Hall of Famer, announcer Roger Huston. We also have Dexter Dunn, the 2015 World Driving Champion from New Zealand and the country's leading trainer, Cran Dalgety, coming over too. This is all too good to be true!"

Brennan is nearing his 9,000th career victory in harness racing. He has captured nearly every major stakes race in the sports history. In 2011 he was named the Harness Racing Driver of the Year and that season he won both the Hambletonian and the Oaks, only the second driver ever to win both on the same day.

And most befitting, George Brennan won this year's St. Patrick's Day race at Freehold Raceway, which was sponsored by Derek Delaney and the Ladbrokes Vincent Delaney Memorial weekend.

"It was Irish Joe Haney," explained Brennan, "who got the ball rolling about me coming over to Ireland. Joe asked me to go last year but I could not make it. Then this year I meet with Derek Delaney, I win the St. Patrick's Day race and after spending some time talking with Irish Joe and Derek, now I am going to Ireland.

"I do not know much about my Irish heritage," Brennan admits, "except that I was always told that we are from County Kilkenny in the south east region of Ireland. Who knows, I might even meet a distant relative. It will also be cool to drive horses in Ireland. I am told it will be an experience to remember and that the people in Ireland have great passion for harness racing."

"We want to invite everyone to come to the Vincent Delaney Weekend," Derek Delaney said. "We will have great racing, Irish music and dancing, good food and drink, activities for the children, betting with the bookies, a real Irish festival and top racing. It is a wonderful experience in the best of Irish tradition."

Elegant Serenity remains perfect this season following her 1:53.3 victory in the first division. Trained and driven by Roger Mayotte, the daughter of Kadabra-Elegantimage got away seventh

and remained there until the final quarter of the rich contest. Meadow Seelster and race favourite Youre Majestic took turns on the lead through fractions of :27.3, :56.1 and 1:25, but it was Elegant Serenity sailing by them all in the lane thanks to a :27.2 kicker. She won by three-quarters of a

length over Juanitas Fury, with third prize going to The Grand Filly.

Bred and owned by Doug Millard of Woodstock, Ontario, Elegant Serenity upped her lifetime earnings to \$99,518 with the win. She's now 3-for-3 this season after going 0-for-7 last year.

Muscle Baby Doll won as she pleased in the second division for the tandem of driver Doug McNair and trainer Tony O'Sullivan. The daughter of Muscle Mass-Have You Ever slid into the four-hole in the early going before pulling first-over on the way to the mid-way point. Tymal Signature led to the quarter in :27 before being overtaken by Second Sister who then took the field through middle panels of :56.3 and 1:25.1. Muscle Baby Doll pressed that leader all the way around the last turn before using a :28.2 closing quarter to win by 6-1/4 lengths over Second Sister in 1:53.3. Aspen California stick-handled through horses late and grabbed the third prize.

F Bellino And Sons LLC of Bronxville, New York owns the trotting lass who is now 3-for-4 this year. The seven-time winner has put more than \$75,000 on her card this year and more than \$223,000 to date.

There was a delay to start Thursday's card due to a pre-race mishap that took place prior to Race 1. A pair of horses – P L Icabod (James MacDonald) and Markets Up (Chris Christoforou) - collided while warming up.

Chris Christoforou got banged up in the mishap, and as a result opted to book off his Thursday evening drives. He's scheduled to drive in all 15 of Friday morning's two-year-old qualifiers at Mohawk Racetrack. The horse he was scheduled to drive, Markets Up, didn't suffer any serious injuries despite falling.

P L Icabod and driver James MacDonald came away from the incident unscathed. The trotter, however, made an early break and finished eighth.
