# Miller's Time

David Miller won his first Pepsi North America Cup and trainer Casie Coleman her second as Betting Line rallied from fifth to equal the 1:47.1 Canadian record in the \$1 million Mohawk event.

David Miller was ecstatic at the wire after Betting Line gave the driver his first Pepsi North America Cup triumph in his 16th attempt.

David Miller had tried 15 times before over 22 years to win this damn Pepsi North America Cup, so you can understand why the normally low-key driver was positively joyous after guiding favored Betting Line to the 1:47.4 victory Saturday night at Mohawk in the \$1 million (Cdn) event in front of a crowd estimated to exceed 15,000.

Miller celebrated his first NA Cup by thrusting his whip in the air at the wire and grinning his head off in the winner's circle.

"That was great. That was *great*," he said, shaking his head, his face a picture of bliss. "That was as awesome as I thought it was going to be."

Betting Line, an Ontario Sired son of Bettor's Delight out of Heather's Western was fifth, seven-and-a-half lengths out of it at the three-quarter pole, but rallied in the stretch to pass front-runner Control The Moment and hold off a surge by Racing Hill to defeat the latter by a length. The mile equaled

the track, stakes and Canadian record set by Thinking Out Loud in the 2012 NA Cup. Betting Line's win in the 33rd edition of the Cup is also 19th time that an elimination winner has also won the final.

"I was a little bit concerned around the last turn that I wasn't closer, but (Betting Line) really has as big gear to him when you ask him. I asked him halfway through the stretch and he just took right off," Miller said.

Control The Moment tired a bit after setting tough fractions of :26.4, :53.4 and 1:20.3 out of the nine-hole, but still hung on for third, five lengths back of the winner. Boston Red Rocks was fourth and Michael's Victory was fifth.

In his 15 previous NA Cup drives, Miller has finished second twice - with Sutter Hanover in 2007 and Twilight Bonfire in 2013 — and third three times — Cinderlane Sam in 1995, Buckeye Hanover in 1999 and Betting Exchange in '15.

"I finally got there," he said. "I was thinking, 'This ain't going to happen.' But (Betting Line) was my first favorite. I will say that. That was the first favourite I've ever had."

Miller said he owes it all to trainer Casie Coleman. "Believe me, I couldn't be more grateful to her giving me the opportunity to drive this horse. I'm very thankful," he said.

Coleman said she couldn't be happier to have played a role in Miller breaking his Cup maiden.

"Me and Dave have been partners. We've owned horses together. He's driven for me quite a long time and he had

never won the Cup, yet," she said. "I thought we had a chance with McWicked, but it just didn't work out. (Miller) has had lots of other chances and they just didn't work. We've been joking with him that he's never going to win this race. So, it's great for him to get it done. He's a Hall of Fame driver. He's a great guy and I'm really happy for him that he got this race under his belt."

It was the second Cup victory for Coleman, who won the 2010 edition with Sportswriter.

"It's phenomenal," said Coleman, who also owns a piece of Betting Line. "This is the biggest race. It's the only million-dollar pace race there is and it's on our home track in our backyard. I live 20 minutes from here (in Cambridge, ON). I don't know how to put it into words, but it's absolutely phenomenal just to race in it, let alone win it twice."

The victory comes after the five-time Canadian trainer of the year decreased the size of her stable substantially,

making the victory particularly sweet, said co-owner Steve Calhoun.

"Casie needed to get her stable to a more manageable number. The stress of the bigger stable was killing her, literally," Calhoun said. "Getting to a smaller stable and still being able to produce a champion like this is a testament to Casie's skill with horses, both selecting yearlings and also bringing them along."

Betting Line was bred by Fair Winds Farm of Cream Ridge, NJ and purchased for \$60,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's 2014 yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA by a group of some of Coleman's most loyal owners — Ross Warriner, Mac Nichol and Calhoun, all from Ontario.

"Ross Warriner, Mac (Nichol) and Steve have been with me probably 15, 16 years now," Coleman said. "They're great guys. I couldn't get a better bunch of owners. They've been my best owners and they finally got together. They always just owned by themselves with me. Now they've all joined together and it's a great combination. We all get along great and think the same way. You couldn't get a better group."

Warriner, who recently suffered a stroke and a heart attack, said winning the NA Cup was a good tonic, despite Betting Line testing the owner's heart with his late-race heroics.

"I feel like I'm flying around. I'm walking on the edge of the moon at the moment," Warriner said.

In was the 10th win in 17 career starts and fourth victory in five 2016 outings for Betting Line, who pushed his lifetime earnings to \$1,119,922 (Cdn).

"Casie (Coleman) told me when he was a baby when he was going in about 2:40 that he'd be a good colt, top of the line. She was right," Calhoun said.

"From day one when I broke him, this horse has always been sensational," Coleman said. "Training back, he trained back with (four-year-old) Reverend Hanover and there was actually a few times that I was a little bit worried about (Betting Line). He was training well, but not as well as I thought he might have been. Now saying that, I don't normally train a three-year-old with Reverend Hanover, but I didn't have any other three-year-olds of his caliber to train with him."

Coleman then deferred a lot of the credit to driver Jonathan Drury, who has driven Betting Line in three of five starts this year.

"(Drury) did an unbelievable job prepping this horse for me. He knew he wasn't going to get to keep driving the horse and he couldn't have driven the horse any better. Whenever he goes his training miles, he does the training on him for me. He talked to Dave (Miller), told him all about him. Jonathan will still drive him again in some (Ontario Sires Stakes) Golds when Dave can't make it."

As for what lies ahead for Betting Line, Coleman said she is giving the colt a week off and then he will compete in an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold event at Mohawk. She is not racing Betting Line at Pocono or in the Meadowlands Pace.

"I never paid him in. I've just had bad luck with (the Meadowlands Pace)," she said. "I'd love to win the race, no doubt. I'd love to win every race. But it was Sportswriter's last race ever. It was Art Colony's last race ever.



Betterthancheddar got beaten by 20 lengths and I couldn't explain why. We couldn't figure it out. It's just one of those things. I'm scared of it. I'm told my owners, 'I'm sorry if you want to win the Meadowlands Pace.' I would love to win it. The Meadowlands is a great place and I love racing there, but the Meadowlands Pace, I'm scared.

"We'll battle the big dogs in the Breeders Crown, the Jug, the Battle of Brandywine. I don't want to over-race him. So, I tried to plan his schedule out accordingly."



# NA Cup card sets handle record with \$5.2 million bet

A mandatory payout of its Jackpot Hi-5 wager helped the Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) set a new wagering record both for Mohawk Racetrack and Pepsi North America Cup Night on Saturday when bettors pushed \$5,241,508 through the windows.

The previous wagering high for North America Cup night was around \$4.3 million, said Jamie Martin, WEG's executive

vice-president of racing.

"The weather was perfect and we put attendance at around 15,000. That's as many as we've ever had here for a harness race," Martin said. "We're really pleased how the night turned

out."

The total handle fell shy of WEG's all-time record for standardbred racing of some \$5.7 million wagered on the 2015 Breeders Crown card at WEG's sister track, Woodbine.

A total of \$1,210,071 was wagered into the Jackpot Hi-5 for the mandatory payout. The carryover entering the night was \$484,912. The new money wagered into the Jackpot Hi-5 brought the total pool to \$1,694,983.

Those who connected with a winning ticket scored a return of \$6,538 for a \$1 ticket or \$1,307.60 for a \$0.20 ticket.

Martin said WEG invested heavily to make the Pepsi North America Cup card the premier event on the Canadian harness racing calendar and had numerous attractions for fans — bands, food trucks, ribs, contests — besides attractive wagering.

"You can't really gauge the benefit of people coming here for a great time and then deciding to come back over the summer. We hope that happens," Martin said.

### Always B Miki sets 1:47.1 Canadian record

Always B Miki set a 1:47.1 Canadian record when David Miller drove the older pacer to victory in the \$100,000 Mohawk Gold Cup invitational. Trainer Jimmy Takter said Always B Miki is just getting started. "I have not starting putting pressure on him, yet. I've been babying him along and keeping him maintained. The races have three weeks apart and two weeks apart. I don't train horses between. I do everything a little different. This horse hasn't had a mile stopwatch in two months," Takter said, adding that he's looking forward to a showdown between Always B Miki and Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit. "That's what we all love. We all love good horse racing and that is, for sure, going to be good for horse racing... I'm impressed with Wiggle It Jiggleit. How he's been racing this year, he's a fantastic horse and George (Teague) has done a great job to bring him back in the shape he is, but I love my horse."

# **Hannelore Hanover is Huge**

The four-year-old trotting mare set a track and Canadian record — and equaled the four-year-old world mark — while winning the \$267,000 (Cdn) Armbro Flight at Mohawk.

Hannelore Hanover and Yannick Gingras were flying in the Armbro Flight.

Her competitors may not have been aware of it, but Hannelore Hanover was in command of the \$267,000 (Cdn) Armbro Flight Final on Saturday night well before the Mohawk Racetrack starting gate pulled away from the field of 10.

"Heading to the gate she was pretty grabby, and so she decided what the race was going to be tonight, not me," said driver Yannick Gingras. "The first quarter I was definitely (along) for a ride. She was gone, that wasn't my decision."

Hannelore Hanover fired off the gate to a :27.2 opening quarter and never gave Gingras cause to glance over his shoulder. Through a :56 half and 1:24.1 three-quarters the mare maintained a comfortable lead, and when Gingras allowed her to trot on in the stretch she accelerated away to a six-and-a-half length win in a spectacular 1:51. The mile established a new stakes, track and Canadian record and equaled the four-year-old mare world record set by Mistery Woman at Lexington in 2014.

"When she got to the front she relaxed really nicely so the middle half I just let her do her thing," said Gingras. "I just tried to keep the pace honest — even though I was one to nine I didn't want to jam them all up behind me — and then I let her trot a little bit down the stretch. She could have gone faster than this."

The win was the Swan For All and High Sobriety daughter's seventh in a four-year-old season that has surpassed the expectations of her connections. Raced just twice at two, as a

three-year-old Hannelore Hanover posted a personal best 1:54 and amassed a record of eight wins, eight seconds and two thirds in 19 starts, earning \$295,574 for owners Burke Racing Stable LLC of Fredericktown, PA, Weaver Bruscemi LLC of Canonsburg, PA and Frank Baldachino of Clarksburg, NJ. This year the mare has only been bested once, finishing second in an open invitation at Hoosier Park on June 2.

"She's a little healthy filly and when we were training her back this year she just came in stronger and more, just heavier set, and her attitude has been absolutely great coming back," said trainer Mickey Burke. "We're kind of surprised, to be honest with you. I mean, we knew she was good and a nice filly, but we're seeing more with her than we were even expecting."

While they have been pleasantly surprised with Hannelore Hanover's transition to the aged mare ranks, Burke admitted that the trotter's record setting time in the Armbro Flight Final was not entirely unexpected.

"Actually, Yannick predicted it last week," said Burke. "After the race he goes, 'Mickey, I was wrapped up. She'll trot in 1:51 next week,' and sure enough..."

# **A** Pure Thing

Pure Country regained the divisional upper hand with late-closing win in the Fan Hanover.

Pure Country (Brett Miller) returned to form to win the Fan Hanover.

After a somewhat worrisome week and a definitely worrisome first-half trip, Pure Country wiped all those cares away in an instant with a late charge past her rivals to claim the \$438,000 (Cdn) Fan Hanover Final for sophomore pacing fillies on Saturday at Mohawk Racetrack.

Shuffled into the middle of the pack for most of the race while elimination winners Good Will Hanover and Darlinonthebeach fought for supremacy, Pure Country, driven by Brett Miller, fired out wide in the third quarter and stormed down the stretch to earn a one-length victory in a career-best 1:49.3.

"She was so far back and it's tough to do that here, especially against these top fillies," said trainer Jimmy Takter. "But she's just a champion. There's been two big races this year and she won them both. She's just that special.

The victory elevated Pure Country, last year's two-year-old pacing filly of the year after an undefeated 10-for-10 freshman campaign, to millionaire status and allowed her to re-establish herself as the alpha female in the division which had been called into question after two early losses in 2016.

"Last year she was so fantastic but, by the same token, the other fillies have gotten a bit better. She was better than most last year, but the competition always gets tougher at three. It's so tough to have two seasons at the top," said Takter, who scored the victory over second-place finisher Darlinonthebeach — a filly trained by Takter's daughter Nancy Johansson. Canadian champion L A Delight was third.

Despite unwavering confidence in his champion filly, owner Adam Bowden of Diamond Creek Racing had some cause for concern after last week's second-place finish in her elimination, which prompted him to text driver Brett Miller after the race and ask how she was, as she did not seem like herself to his eye.

"At first he said, 'You know, she can't be sharp for every, single race," said Bowden, with a laugh. "And then he texted me back less than an hour later and said, 'You're right, she scoped sick.'

"It made me feel better to know that there was something up last week and she was much, much better tonight."

In hindsight, Bowden admitted there is hardly ever a reason to doubt Pure Country, who pushed her 2016 record to 2-1-2 from in five starts.

"I know she shows up for the big races when the money is on the line. Jimmy always has her ready," said Bowden.

"Darlinonthebeach has beat her twice this year and that's a great filly, who was second again here tonight. Along with LA Delight, those are the top three fillies and I think they'll trade blows all year and it will be a great season. I'm looking forward to it."






# Gural hands Faraldo "lifetime ban"

Jeff Gural, the owner of the Meadowlands Racetrack, Vernon and Tioga Downs, said Standardbred Owners Association (SOA) of New York president Joe Faraldo is no longer welcome to race at the three tracks.

Jeff Gural said via email Saturday that he has handed Joe Faraldo a lifetime ban from racing at Gural's three racetracks — the Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey and Tioga and Vernon Downs in New York.

"(Faraldo) has a lifetime ban. Last night (Friday) he entered two horses in the Billings that were trained by Richie Banca who is not allowed to participate at my tracks," Gural wrote. "(Faraldo) put himself down as the trainer and looking at the program it was obvious that when he raced in New Jersey he put himself down as trainer and when the horse raced the next week in New York, Banca was back down (as trainer)... I thought this was a serious violation of our policies regarding drug trainers."

When contacted, Faraldo initially referred to an email he wrote to others and asked it be published verbatim. It reads as follows:

"The horse I own Lucky Fan, racing at Vernon, just had its entry refused. So now not only am I prohibited from racing there, but so are my horses or any I own in partnership. In addition, because Gural did not get the law passed to let him race his horses — which he and the directors at Vernon personally own — in overnights, the following edict was put in place: No horse will be permitted to race or qualify if said horse is stabled at any track where the state recognized horsemen's association joined in the opposition to that proposed law.

"The law prohibiting beneficial owners of a racetrack or race secretaries from racing horses they own at their tracks came about many years ago because of abuses by a New York track owner years ago. Some of those abuses are very subtle and almost impossible to pick up, even to the discerning eye."

Gural stressed the ban just applies to Faraldo, not others in New York that lobbied against a proposed New York State law that recently was not approved. The law, if passed, would have allowed Gural to race his horses in overnights at his own tracks (stakes are allowed).

"I can't race at either (Tioga or Vernon)," Gural said. "The law would have only affected Vernon and Tioga and was subject to having an agreement with the horsemen's association. It allowed them to revoke the privilege at any time. It was supported by the horsemen at both Vernon and Tioga and was opposed by the other horsemen's associations in New York on the grounds that integrity is very important.

"I breed in New York and own quite a few New York-breds. I have three trainers that I use that are stabled at Vernon and they have to ship two or three hours to race unless it is a stake... As a result, I no longer will allow horses stabled at other New York tracks to qualify at my three tracks. If they are at a training center or farm they are welcome and they are welcome to race at my three tracks if they are not on our list of banned trainers."

Faraldo later added to his initial comments on the matter in a follow-up email.

"When Mr. Gural makes all the decisions in this game as arbitrarily as his temper may dictate on any given day, we are

all in serious trouble," Faraldo wrote. "Mr. Gural has placed himself as judge and jury over people's rights in this game and has done so in a verv hypocritical fashion. That has been documented. My horses train via a swimming pool and many times when amateurs race at different venues sometimes the owner/amateur driver is down as trainer. I

didn't take the entry twice, the Meadowlands did. The truth is because Mr. Gural can't get away with some ethical breach by taking horsemen's money via racing his own horses some BS excuse must be found to justify further arbitrary action.

That justification came after the New York State Legislature would (not) enact a provision allowing him to race his own horses at his two New York tracks. A provision affecting (Yonkers owner) Tim Rooney and others without objection for many, many years."

Gural wrote that Faraldo, "had all of the leaders of the horsemen groups write a letter opposing (the law that would have allowed Gural to race in overnights at his tracks) on the grounds that it would threaten the integrity of the sport. Interesting since integrity doesn't seem all that important at Yonkers with all of the trainers (the Meadowlands has) banned racing there and doing quite well including Banca... (Faraldo) is lecturing me on integrity. Everyone is afraid of him."



### Hoffman's article "perfect"

Dean (Hoffman's) article in (the June 12) issue of HRU "same old, same old" regarding the continuing declining interest in harness racing, is perfect. 
