Living Up to the Hype

Always B Miki equaled the 1:47 world record and fought off both Wiggle It Jiggleit and Freaky Feet Pete in the \$500,000 Ben Franklin at Pocono in what was clearly the race of the year, so far, and perhaps a foreshadowing of more epic battles to come.

Earlier this week, George Teague was comparing the Ben Franklin to a typical pay-for-view fight big on the hype. He was just hoping aloud that the first meeting of his Wiggle It Jiggleit and Always B Miki — with nemesis Freaky Feet Pete thrown in for good measure — wasn't the equivalent of one of those over-in-30-seconds bouts.


Last night at Mohegan Sun Pocono, the \$500,000 Ben Franklin delivered on the hype when the Big 3 grabbed the top three. Second choice (8-5) Always B Miki (David Miller) prevailed over a dead game Freaky Feet Pete (Trace Tetrick) by three-quarters of a length in a 1:47 mile that equaled the world record on a five-eighths mile track. Favorite Wiggle It Jiggleit (Montrell Teague) was two lengths back in third.

Was it the greatest race ever? Well, no. But that was preposterous, especially so early in the year with so much money left in the season. But it was clearly the best race of the year, so far, with the trio battling at different points throughout the mile, including Wiggle It Jiggleit gunning for Always B Miki first over and Pete thundering up the inside in

the lane.

"It was a great race," Tetrick said. "The trip kind of worked out like I thought it would. I was hoping to press and land on the front and control it, or get moved on by either Montrell or David... David took me as long as I needed to go, I just needed a little longer stretch to beat him."

Wining training Jimmy Takter, who also won the James Lynch Memorial with Pure Country and cleared some \$550,000 on the night racing in various locations, agreed that the Ben Franklin "was a hell of a race and (Always B Miki) had a hell of a race. He never got any breather. He went hard from the beginning. When he took over the lead, here came Wiggle It Jiggleit going at him right away. (Always B Miki) was just fantastic."

George Teague, the principal owner of Wiggle It Jiggleit said the night "was nothing but exceptional... There was a hell of a buzz. People were really looking to see these three horses knock heads and it was good to be a part of it. I don't think anybody walked away too disappointed. I'm not even disappointed and I finished third. My horse has never embarrassed himself."

It was the third straight sub-1:48 mile for Always B Miki and Takter said all talk of breaking the 1:46.4 word record ended when the sun went down behind the mountains surrounding Wilkes-Barre, PA and a chill came to the air.

"I really don't care too much. If he stays healthy and sound, I'm pretty sure he will (set the world record) one day. He's just a special animal," Takter said of Always B Miki, a five-year-old son of Always Virgin—Artstopper who surpassed \$1.5 million lifetime with the victory. "This was his third week in a row racing. He is getting sharper and sharper now. He's starting to feel race tight now.

"I don't want to be bragging, but (Always B Miki) is just a little better than those two. They are very, very good horses Freaky Feet Pete and Wiggle It Jiggleit. They had a hell of race. They raced their hearts out. It was fantastic to see the three of them working at it, but I knew as soon as (Always B Miki) got to the front that he was going to be tough to beat. I know this horse and he doesn't give in, especially now that he started feeling so good. Last year, he grabbed the right

line a little bit for me and things like that, but he's getting better and better this guy."

Always B Miki has won five of seven races this year and nine of 11 since returning from injury last October. He is owned by Bluewood Stable, Roll The Dice Stable, and Christina Takter.

As exceptional as Always B Miki was and the race was, racing fans stand to benefit most from these ultra-talented older pacers going to war again in the future.

"They're going to face off again and I take off my hat to them," Takter said, referring to Freaky Feet Pete and Wiggle It Jiggleit. "They're only four-year-olds and they're driven by young kids. David (Miller) is a veteran in this game and I thought the kids drove a smart race, all of them."

Racing Hill takes Hempt

As fireworks popped overhead, Racing Hill made some fireworks of his own in winning the \$500,000 Max C. Hempt Memorial final in a rated 1:49, part of Sun Stakes Saturday (July 2) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

Sent off as the 3-5 favorite off a 1:49.1 elimination win last week, Racing Hill took the lead from Boston Red Rocks shortly before the quarter in :25.4. Driver Brett Miller then took the son of Roll With Joe—Chasing Ideals through a second quarter in :29.

"That's what makes this colt such a tremendous colt," said Miller. "He can go very fast and then the next quarter he can go very slow. Being that handy makes him very deadly."

No one was catching Racing Hill, as he led the field to the three-quarters in 1:22 and sprinted home to win by two-and-a-half lengths. JK Will Power was second with Boston Red Rocks third.

"I've got so much confidence in this colt, and every week he is giving me even more confidence," said Miller. "Coming down the stretch, I was saying to myself, 'I don't even need to pull the earplugs,' and he's the kind of colt that when I pull the earplugs, he just takes off. He's just sharp."

Tony Alagna trains Racing Hill for owner/breeder Tom Hill of the United Kingdom. The pacer now has two wins, three seconds and a third in six starts this year, good for \$450,340 in seasonal earnings. Alagna said the colt's next engagement will be the Meadowlands Pace.

"Hopefully we get another shot to go to the Meadowlands on his home track and have some luck there," he said.

Mr. Hempt was the man behind Hempt Farms in Mechanicsburg, Pa., whose horses with the "Keystone" moniker won nearly every major race in the sport. A Hall of

Fame inductee in 1980, Mr. Hempt was also a USTA director and president of the Hambletonian Society. He died in 1999 at age 79.

Formerly known as the William E. Miller Memorial at Rosecroft Raceway from 1955-1994 and the Joseph B. Banks Memorial from 1995-1999 at Pocono, the Hempt Memorial has been contested since 2000. Wiggle It Jiggleit won last year's edition in 1:48.2.

Southwind Frank back in Hambletonian form

Driver Yannick Gingras tucked his whip and breathed a sigh of relief at the wire as he and Southwind Frank won the \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial in 1:52.4, part of Sun Stakes Saturday (July 2) at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

After coming out of last week's elimination with a virus, Southwind Frank — Gingras' best hope for his first

Hambletonian win — was back to his championship form.

Last year's divisional champion got away fourth as Hollywood Highway took the lead from post 2. After a break by Hollywood Highway near the quarter pole, reached in :27.3, Southwind Frank took the lead the first time past the grandstand. Southwind Frank led the field through the half in :56.2 and three-quarters in 1:24.4 before holding off stablemate Dayson — who made a break —and coming home in :28 flat to win by two-and-a-quarter lengths. Trolley was second with Bar Hopping third. Southwind Frank paid \$2.40 to win.

A son of Muscle Hill out of Flawless Lindy, Southwind Frank is trained by Ron Burke for Southwind Frank Partners. The Gingras-Burke combo narrowly missed their respective first Hambletonian win last year when the filly Mission Brief was edged by Pinkman.

"I've been thinking about Hambo since the Peter Haughton last year," said Gingras. "We are aiming for that first Saturday in August. All these starts just build up to that. We want to win them all, but the main goal is Aug. 6."

Co-owner Jerry Silva of J&T Stables was part of the Muscle Hill ownership team when he won the 2009 Hambletonian, but is looking forward to another Hambletonian win with this colt.

"This is the 'Frank' that we had last year," he said.

Mr. Beal, a former owner, trainer and driver who died in 2009, served as president of the Pennsylvania Harness Horsemen's Association, where he was instrumental in bringing casino gaming to Pennsylvania racetracks, fought for increased simulcasting opportunities in the Keystone State, and ensured that county fair racing continued in Pennsylvania through tough times.

This is the sixth edition of the Beal Memorial, which was won last year by eventual Trotter of the Year Pinkman in 1:51.3.

Pure Country equals Lynch stakes record

Pure Country and driver Brett Miller made their way to the front near the midway point and never relinquished the lead from there, winning Saturday's (July 2) \$300,000 James M. Lynch Memorial for 3-year-old female pacers by a half-length over Blue Moon Stride in a stakes-record-equaling 1:49.2 at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

I Said Diamonds led the field to the opening quarter-mile in :27, but soon gave up the top spot to Darlinonthebeach. Pure Country was on the move ahead of Blue Moon Stride in the outside flow and made her way to the lead as the group reached the half in :54.2. Darlinonthebeach slowed on the backstretch and did not finish.

Pure Country reached three-quarters in 1:22.1 and paced home from there to win for the fourth time in seven starts this season. Blue Moon Stride was followed by Lindwood Beachgirl in third and I Said Diamonds in fourth.

It was Pure Country's third major victory of the campaign, having captured the Miss Pennsylvania and Fan Hanover

earlier this year.

"She's just classy," winning trainer Jimmy Takter said. "Brett didn't have any other choice than to go forward. I was a little worried. I know (Blue Moon Stride) is a pretty good horse sitting in the back there. We had to work very hard to go to our spot, but I know (Pure Country) is tough to get by."

A daughter of Somebeachsomewhere out of the mare Western Montana, Pure Country has won 14 of 17 career races and earned \$1.19 million. She is owned by Diamond Creek Racing.

Last year, Pure Country won all 10 of her races and was named the Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old female pacer.

"She's getting more professional," Takter said. "As a 2-year-old it's a little easier to be dominant. There are a lot of good fillies out there. They have to work for every race."

Pure Country, the 7-5 favorite, paid \$4.80 to win.

Darlinonthebeach's trainer Nancy Johansson told DRF Harness' Derick Giwner that her filly suffered from atrial fibrillation.

The Lynch Memorial is named in honor of the late James M. Lynch, who did some amateur driving and worked as a groom as a teenager, but made his mark years later as a race official, most notably as the director of racing at Liberty Bell for its entire 23-year existence. Lynch, who passed away in 2000 at the age of 78, also was a horse owner and director of the U.S. Trotting Association.

Obrigado loving Ohio; wins Cleveland Trotting Classic

Obrigado avenged last year's Cleveland Trotting Classic defeat with an impressive track record victory on Saturday (July 2). Last year's runner-up trotted like he had something to prove and bested his competition by five-and-three quarter lengths just three weeks after he posted another major victory in Ohio in the Charlie Hill Memorial at Scioto Downs.

At Northfield, Obrigado (\$3.40) started from the rail. He floated off the gate and two rivals were ahead of him at the eighth-pole. Once the field was set, driver Mark MacDonald quarter-moved Obrigado. He took the lead just past the :27.2 opening quarter and never experienced an anxious moment the rest of the mile. He led his rivals through times of :56, 1:25 and 1:53.2.

"He (Obrigado) is really sharp right now. I got him to the front and let things play out from there," said MacDonald. "Once this horse is near the lead, he does the rest."

The 1:53.2 clocking replaces the 1:54.1 time of Kirty Dream (Aaron Merriman) as the fastest mile ever on the Flying Turns for a 5-year-old and up gelded trotter. Kirty Dream's mark has held since 2014.

Saturday's win is Obrigado's fourth win this year and 38th lifetime score, increasing his bankroll to \$1,109,749 for owners Paul Kelley Racing Stable, SRF Stable, Linwood Higgins and Stable 45. Kelley does the training.

"The horse is just really good right now and it's fun because it really is a true team effort, and not just the

Favorites Betting Line and Magnum J golden at Mohawk

Betting Line returned to Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) action at Mohawk Racetrack on Saturday night and the North America Cup champion powered to a one and one-quarter length Gold Series victory in 1:49.4.

Two weeks after winning the S1 million Pepsi North America Cup, Betting Line (Jonathan Drury) won his Ontario Sires Stakes Gold test at Mohawk.

Starting from Post 4, driver Jonathan Drury of Guelph, ON eased Betting Line away from the starting gate and settled into fourth as Nocturnal Bluechip and Sintra sprinted out to a :26.3 opening quarter. Heading for the :55.1 half Drury and Betting Line advanced up the outside on Sintra and driver Jody Jamieson, but Jamieson put his foot on the accelerator and Drury opted to hold his position rather than battle for the front end.

Sintra led the field to the 1:22.3 three-quarters, but Betting Line was able to power by the pacesetter in the stretch, leaving Sintra to settle for second. War N Munn closed hard to be third in the \$105,000 contest.

"He raced good, as he always does," said trainer Casie Coleman of her star pupil. "JD (Drury) did a good job with him because he had a live splint bothering him and we were too close to the race to treat it."

Coleman added that Betting Line is scheduled for a visit to the veterinarian on Monday to treat the splint, which caused the colt to run in slightly in the stretch, and should be back in fine form for the July 23 Gold event at Mohawk.

"He's done that (run in) to me before with splint issues," noted the Cambridge, ON resident. "But we'll get it fixed up for the next Gold in three weeks' time."

Following the July 23 Gold Series event, the reigning

Ontario Sires Stakes champion heads south of the border for the Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park on Aug. 13 and the Battle of Brandywine at Pocono Downs on Aug. 20.

Saturday's victory extended Betting Line's win streak to five, with his only loss of the season coming in his May 14 debut, where he was second. The Bettors Delight—Heather's Western son has banked \$1,172,422 (Cdn) in his career to date for owners Coleman, Ross Warriner of Burlington, Christine Calhoun of Chatham and Mac Nichol of Burlington, ON.

Magnum J captured the other Gold Series division, controlling the tempo for much of the race before cruising home a two and three-quarter length winner in 1:51. The mile time was a new personal best for the Big Jim—Jamirotoy son. Nvestment Bluechip and Voracity finished second and third.

Doug McNair of Guelph, ON piloted Magnum J to the win for his father, trainer Gregg McNair of Guelph, and his partners Tony Lawrence and William Brown of Hanover. The partners also raised a Gold Series trophy in the season opener at The Raceway at Western Fair District on May 27.

With two Gold Series victories Magnum J has sole ownership of top spot in the division standings with 100 points and will look to pad that lead when the three-year-old pacing colts and geldings return to the Campbellville oval on July 23.

Reflections on the ultimate honor

The writer reflects on being inducted into the Communicators' Corner of the Harness Racing Hall of Fame.

(Editor's Note: Since Mr. Connors is primarily entering the Harness Racing Hall of Fame's Communicators' Corner as a writer, we thought it appropriate that he write about his thoughts on the weekend he will be officially enshrined. We will have thoughts from fellow Communicators' Corner inductee David Carr of the USTA in the next issue of HRU).

It's now been, what, over nine months since United States Harness Writers Association (USWHA) president Tim Bojarski called me and (six-and-a-half minutes into a 10-minute conversation) told me the good news from the voting tabulation.

So I've had some type to ponder the situation – and yet, even now, I find it very hard to even think about in the same sentence, the same thought, the two concepts of "Jerry Connors" and ... and ... you know, those couple of rooms, sorta in the back, on the second floor of the Harness Racing Museum, where they have the statues and the cartoons of the people who are in the two ...

... I just can't put the concepts together.

Hall Of Famers in harness racing are to me the people who were pivotal in the development of the sport: George Morton Levy as a track founder; Lawrence Sheppard as a breeder; and horsemen like Billy Haughton and Bob Farrington, who were running a modern-sized stable decades before the Internet, or Stanley Dancer, the leader of the "catch-me-if-you-can" school of driving.

And on our Communicators side, there is George Smallsreed, who could get more interesting angles out of life, especially through harness racing pictures, than you would think possible; and Roy Shudt, the golden-throated announcer who could probably have been a Hall of Famer just on the detail and grace of his writing abilities, which he translated to the microphone; and Allen Finkelson, the Don Rickles of harness racing, who could be even funnier if you were the focus of his blustering commentary, but who had a heart of gold underneath.

And of course, the only person who spans both sides: Stan Bergstein.

And maybe this is where my problem lies.

I was fortunate enough to come along at a time where I did have some contact with the three horsemen I list above (my first "Free For All" column of the many which ran over nearly a 20-year period for the USTA's Hoof Beats was

interviewing Haughton, typically hustling from the paddock to his car through the parking lot at The Red Mile). And I knew all three Communicators very well: worked with Roy Shudt at Brandywine; worked with George Smallsreed at the USTA; and worked with Allen Finkelson through the Publicists and Writers Associations. And if you worked in harness racing in the last 50 years, how could you help not being influenced by Stan Bergstein, eminence grise, running into him somewhere and talking with him (and I was much more privileged to be in positions to deal with him more than most).

You keep company with the greatness in these people, their natural abilities, with their particular talents of career speciality, but also their talents with people and (more important than you think) their abilities to handle any number of different, simultaneous tasks with aplomb and naturalness (maybe except for the night where Roy Shudt's suspenders came loose during a race and he ended his call with his trousers at his ankles).

And you pay attention. And you listen. And you think. And you ask questions – somehow the great ones always seem to have an extra moment to talk to a lower-level cog in the wheel like me, and will try to answer whatever question the person has.

And if you're smart, you take this immeasurably vast storehouse of information, and you absorb it, and gradually you make most of it part of yourself. And the person who is built, at least on the harness racing side, has bits and pieces of these pioneers that shine through every once in a blue moon, if a big mouth or conceit don't pull the shade down over their sparkle.

Sure, you make your own contributions along the way. I am an English major, a harness racing fan always learning more, and a person who would rather seek consensus – and even better, synergy – for bringing about, as John Stuart Mill said, "the greatest good for the greatest number of people."

But what's being applauded at Goshen is not me, but the hundreds and thousands of people with whom I have been fortunate to come in contact with and work with and learn some. If this is a situation of praise for me, it is a reflective one, rebounding the praise right back to them, who helped shape the person that will stand before a group of harness racing's best and brightest under the tent next to the Harness Racing Museum, where lucky me will be installed as a ...
