wasn't as fast as it can be. The final time for the Hempt was 1:48.2 and Wiggle It Jiggleit paid \$2.60.

Artspeak was second and In The Arsenal was third. Wakizashi Hanover was fourth.

The group will now move on to the Meadowlands for next week's elims for the Meadowlands Pace. Maybe Wiggle It Jiggleit won't win everything, but it looks like he's going to be the horse to beat every time he shows up.

"I felt good (about the Meadowlands Pace) when I first started talking about this horse in January," Teague said. "You know how cocky I was. I still think he one of the best 3-year-olds to come around in a while. But this is a very good group."

JL Cruze Slays Another Giant:

The race was worth just \$75,000, but the Mohegan Sun Pocono Invitational figured to be one of the highlights of the card, and it more than delivered on that promise.

The race was a two-horse race on paper between last year's older male trotter of the year Sebastian K and the red-hot JL Cruze. After battling an ulcer, Sebastian K was making his first start of the year while JL Cruze had been among the hottest horses in the game, winning 13 of 15 on the year.

The race was nothing short of a barn-burner. Sebastian K, the 9-year-old, took over from Gural Hanover and had the lead turning for home. Driven by John Campbell, JL Cruze took up the chase but Sebastian K spurted away briefly and looked like a definite winner. Instead, JL Cruze fought valiantly in the stretch, surged at the wire and won by a nose.

"My horse just keeps digging," Campbell said. "I didn't know how much Sebastian K had left, but my horse gives his all all the way to the wire, so I wasn't giving up. I knew my horse would give a great effort."

JL Cruze has been one of the great stories in harness racing in 2015. Trained by Eric Ell, the 4-year-old gelding by Crazed earned just \$26,297 last year, but came back this year to dominate a bunch of winter series races at the Meadowlands. Still, it figured he would have his comeuppance once the top horses got going in the spring. Instead, he has kept rolling and, in his last three starts, has now beaten Father Patrick twice and Sebastian K once.

Not that Sebastian K didn't race well. This was his first start of the year and he got beat by a nose by the hottest trotter on the planet.

"It was a tremendous first race back, especially after his problems with his ulcer," said co-owner Tristan Sjoberg. "He put in a great effort. I thought he had it won 100 meters out. I still thought he won it (at the wire), but that last step he just turned his head. He was a little but tired and he lost it on that."

Even Ell wondered what might have happened if this wasn't Sebastian K's first start of the year.

"That other horse was tremendous," he said. "If he had had another start beforehand it might have been a different story tonight."

This was the race in which Sebastian K trotted the fastest mile (1:49) in history last year. Last night, the winning time was 1:51.

Ell said JL Cruze will go next in the Graduate at the Meadowlands and then will be supplemented to the Meadowlands Maturity at a cost of \$50,000.

Holloway Wins Lynch With Longshot:

Joe Holloway was ready to give up on Bettor Be Steppin in the Lynch. His filly was buried on the rail and would have to pass a lot of horses to get to the wire first.

"At the half, I thought we were dead," Holloway said.

In fact, Holloway focused his attention on his other starter, Divine Caroline. But she would wind up getting a rough trip while Corey Callahan was able to get Bettor Be Steppin out of a jackpot, wheel to the outside and gun down the leaders to win by a nose over Single Me.

The winner paid \$33.60 and keyed an \$895.60 exacta.

"I knew we had to get a little lucky tonight and she did," Holloway said. "I thought she'd have to get a trip to win and she did."

Stacia Hanover, the even-money favorite, finished seventh after leading much of the way through fast fractions of 26, 54.1 and 1:21.4.

A "Lucky" Win in the Ben Franklin:

Trainer Chris Oakes admitted that his confidence took a hit when Luck Be Withyou drew post nine for the \$500,000 Ben Franklin. A week earlier, Luck Be Withyou scored a gate-to-wire win in the Franklin elims from post eight, but Oakes knew the task would be all that much tougher last night in the final.

"I was sitting back all week hoping we drew good," Oakes

said. "If we would have drawn good I would have been real confident. When I saw the nine I thought this isn't going to be easy. There were great horses in here. But we got it done."

Driven by George Napolitano Jr., the son of Western Ideal rocketed off the gate to take control of the race. He led by 1 1/4 lengths after a half in 55. Driven by Simon Allard, Domethatagain was second and would not go away. In the stretch it came down to Luck Be Withyou and Domethatagain and the two engaged in a take-no-prisoners fight to the wire, with Luck Be Withyou prevailing by a nose.

"There was a lot of stress after we drew the nine hole," Oakes said. "I knew we had a really good horse and I knew going in he was at his best, but I thought it was horrible getting the nine hole. I want to win every race and I was 0 for 3 on the night going into this race. At the end of day this was the biggest race and we got it done and that's what we do here."

Pinkman Best Stablemate in Takter Dominated Beal:

It was a race for 3-year-old male trotters, so of course Jimmy Takter had a say in the outcome. The Takter stable finished one-two in last night's Beal Memorial as Pinkman just held off a game Uncle Lasse. Pinkman won by a head in 1:51.3.

Pinkman suffered his first defeat of the year last week when second behind Wicker Hanover in the Beal elims, but Takter said the gelding had an excuse as he was sick.

"I was a little concerned because his blood was not as good as we hoped," Takter said. "Last week he was quite a bit anemic."

Pinkman's game is speed and last night he blasted off the blocks from the one post. Fortunately for the Takter gelding no one took much of a crack at him. He got to the quarter in 27.1 and the half in 56.2. Centurion ATM took a run at him, but he was able to put away that challenge. The real threat was Uncle Lasse, who was sitting chilly along the inside for Brett Miller. Uncle Lasse gave it a good fight in the stretch but Pinkman prevailed.

"I definitely can't complain with the trip and the fractions," winning driver Yannick Gingras said. "Everything went his

way. He has that intimidating speed. He can leave the gate so fast. Last week leaving the gate I knew he wasn't quite right because he didn't leave the gate like he can. Usually the first couple steps out of the gate he just snaps right out of there. Today he was back to himself and I don't think he was 100 percent. I'd say last week he was 50-60 percent and probably 90 percent today. I think Jimmy can have him even better than this."

It was a big showing from the Takter stable, which has experienced a few bumps in the road on the path to the Hambletonian. But after the Beal, Takter has every right to feel good about his chances in the sport's marquee trotting event.

"They both raced very good tonight," he said. "Lasse is a stallion, so maybe it's more important that he does well. He is out of Solveig, so his pedigree is incredible. I can't take anything away from him after how well he raced tonight. We have been battling a little sickness in the barn the last three weeks and that has hurt some of our horses. It was nothing too serious but enough that it has taken a little toll on them. I feel very good about our (Hambletonian) horses. They are a bunch of good horses. I am flattered to have all these guys. These two tonight, they are very good horses."

Roland N Rock Rolls at Goshen

The pride of Iowa, Roland N Rock, remained perfect in his career at 18 for 18 as he scored an easy win in yesterday's Landmark Stakes at Goshen. With John Campbell in to town to drive, the son of Rocknroll Hanover won by 10 1/4 lengths in 1:56.2.

"He feels like a really good horse," Campbell said afterward.

Owned by Duane Roland, a corn and soybean farmer from Grinnell, Iowa, Roland N Rock will try much stiffer company next out when he is aimed at the elims for the Meadowlands Pace. Can he handle the next level?

"Off today, I can't say for sure how he'll do in a race like the Meadowlands Pace," Campbell said. "It's still an unknown. But I can say he's a really good horse and I certainly think they did the right thing bringing him out here and putting him in there."

While many of the horse's races have come at some of the lowest levels of the sport, he did win an open stakes last year at two when capturing an American-National event at Balmoral. Before the Goshen race, his previous win came in a \$1,000 race at the Eldon fair in Eldon, Iowa.

One of Two Jackpot Super Hi-5 Carryovers Hit For Over \$173,000 at The Meadowlands

While fireworks filled the skies across the country on Saturday night, there were fireworks of a different kind around midnight as one lucky customer purchased the winning ticket in the last race jackpot super hi-5 which returned \$173,094.02. The lucky ticket was bought through the advance deposit wagering site, TVG.

The correct combination of 7-6-9-3-8 included a 45-1 winner over the 1/2 betting choice followed by a 15-1 longshot, the 7/2 second choice and the longest shot on the board finishing fifth.

This is the second highest payout in Meadowlands history, following a Jackpot Super Hi-5 that returned \$200,000 earlier in the meet.

The good news is there still is one Jackpot Super Hi-5 that is still alive at The Meadowlands, with a carryover now of \$175,602.

With major stakes races at The Meadowlands on the horizon, it was important for several of Ron Burke's contingent find their best stride. Rocklamation did her part

on Friday and on Saturday it was Bettor's Edge and Sayitall BB's turn.

Bettor's Edge won eight times in 2014 for earnings of over \$673,000. While 2015 has not brought the same amount of success, the gelding still oozes class and that class was on display Saturday night at The Meadowlands.

Sent off as the 4/5 favorite in a field of six in an upper-level condition pacing event, Bettor's Edge took no prisoners from the start of the race and was launched after Mister Virgin around the first turn and cleared the lead past the opening quarter in 26.3. From there, Bettor's Edge settled into his rhythmic stride and he would lead the charge to the half-mile in 55.1. At that point, a challenge came from Art History, who committed first over and tried to engage the favorite past three-quarters in 1:23, but Art History proved no match for Bettor's Edge. As the field turned for home, Joe Bongiorno called to his gelding for more speed and he responded, scampering three lengths clear. Melmerby Beach, who trailed throughout, was shown racetrack in the stretch and launched a relentless rally in the last eighth of a mile, but he came up just one-half of a length short as Bettor's Edge held on in 1:49.3. Mister Virgin was third.

Bettor's Edge is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi and M1 Stable. The win was the 23rd of his career and his earnings are rapidly approaching \$1.5 Million.


Sayitall BB also returned to her winning form, with an authoritative triumph in a condition event for fillies and

mares on Saturday night at The Meadowlands. On the heels of an excellent three year old campaign that included a Breeders Crown Championship, Sayitall BB has struggled while making her transition to her four year old season, winning just once in eleven starts in 2015 entering her Saturday night contest. She took a positive step tonight.

Sent off as the 6/5 choice, Sayitall BB went forward off the gate and allowed the speed to settle through an opening quarter of 26.4, before launching her bid for the lead as the field moved into the backstretch, where she would clear the front as the field straightened up. From there, the Breeders Crown champion reached the half-mile in 55-seconds before facing a challenge from All About Kisses who looked the favorite in the eye past three-quarters in 1:22.3. But, Sayitall BB had plenty left in the tank and when Joe Bongiorno called on his mare for pace, the response was instantaneous as Sayitall BB sprinted away from the field in the stretch to win going away in 1:50.1.

Sayitall BB is eligible to The Golden Girls at The Meadowlands, as is her stablemate Rocklamation who won on Friday night. The Final for that event is Meadowlands Pace night, Saturday July 18th, with eliminations on July 11th if necessary. She is owned by Burke Racing Stable and Weaver Brussemi LLC and is approaching \$600,000 in lifetime earnings.

Lady Winona, who could be making her next start in the Del Miller Memorial was an emphatic winner of a condition trotting event on Saturday night. Allowed to settled off the speed, Lady Winona launched a first over blitz into fractions of 27.4 and 56.2 before clearing the lead and drawing away impressively to win decisively in 1:54.1. The win was the second of the season for the Credit Winner filly for owner Stroy Inc and trainer Julie Miller. Steve Smith was at the lines.

Revenge Shark may have earned a berth in The Meadowlands Pace with a powerful stretch drive to score in a tough condition event in 1:50.2. Jim Marshall III guided the three year old colt to victory for trainer Tony Alagna in come-from-behind fashion. He defeated three other Meadowlands Pace eligible colts and a pair of talented New York Sire Stakes performers in the process. Revenge Shark is owned by Alagna Racing LLC and Bradley Grant.

The \$25,000 Dash For The "G" Notes Final went to Kingofthejungle who worked out a perfect second over trip and rallied boldly in the stretch to score his second victory of the season in a lifetime best 1:50.4 with Jim Pantaleano in the sulky. The winner is trained by Brandon Simpson, who co-owns the four year old gelding with Fox Racing Inc.

Untouchable One captured the \$20,000 Mini-Series Final for the \$10,000 claimers rallying into a frantic speed duel that included a 53.2 half-mile to win going away with Joe Bongiorno in 1:51.1. It was Bongiorno's second win on the card. The winner was trained by Bill Mac Kenzie for Anthony and Alma lafelice.

Racing returns on Friday, July 10th with a special post time of 5:30 P.M. Saturday's racing card, which is Meadowlands Pace night, also has a special 5:30 P.M. start time.

Singing In The Rain

In the early 60's, my pal Nick the Quick and I were regulars at the twice-around-the-oval contests at Yonkers.

Each Memorial Day all the normal citizens of New York headed out of town. But Nick The Quick and I were not normal. We were prisoners to the nightly action at the track. In our own way, however, we were seeking a change of venue. Yonkers was just 20 minutes away, so that sure wasn't a holiday weekend treat for us. We decided the solution was to hit Liberty Bell in Philadelphia on Saturday night.

On the drive down from New York to Philadelphia, Nick the

Quick lamented "No trotters racing on Sunday. What are we gonna do?"

Jokingly I replied, "Blue Bonnets races on Sundays!"

We both laughed. It was one thing to drive down to Philadelphia, but Montreal was a long way from New York City.

Nick the Quick and I always pooled our financial resources, like ammo before a battle. We got to Liberty Bell, perused the program, and---lo and behold---an old New York friend was racing there. It was a four-legged friend.

Yankee Mick was a reliable old gelding by Meadow Rice. Bill Popfinger had him and he was a Class AA at Yonkers and almost unbeatable in the mud. The morning line on him at Liberty Bell was 8-1.

I said, "If it rains, Mick can't lose!! If we bet out on him, we can fly to Montreal on Sunday morning, and watch trotters race."

Well, a few minutes later, the Standardbred gods heard my lament. It started to drizzle.

I told Nick the Quick, "Let's get some Indians to do a rain dance, count our bankroll, and hope."

Believe it or not, it began to pour. By the time Yankee Mick raced in the middle of the program, it was put up or shut up time for us. We counted out our dough to make sure we had gas and toll money, and went all in. That came to \$170, quite a plunge for two college kids in the early 1960s.

The race was off. Going by the grandstand the first time, Yankee Mick is sitting fifth. Fifth? Nick and I look at each other. For the very first time, it dawned on us that defeat was a possibility.

Then Popfinger pulled Mick and he made a move upon the outside. Down the backside, he challenged for command and got it.

Now two regular horseplayers became cheerleaders. We

were jumping up and down and yelling, "C'mon Mick! C'mon, Mick!"

He won easily.

We cashed big. Real big. I pretty sure we our payoff was over \$1,400. That's almost \$11,000 in today's money. I do know that the mutuel cashier had to go get more money to pay Nick. That gave us a sort of "break the bank" feeling. For an adult, it was like Santa fulfilling everything on our wish list even though we certainly hadn't been good.

The only downside was that we couldn't brag to our regular buddies and strut around to satisfy our egos. That's all part of hitting a big bet.

Instead we just stood in the subsiding rain at Liberty Bell and basked our own self glory.

Quickly we put Plan B---Montreal---into action. We planned to catch the first flight from LaGuardia at 7:30 a.m. We plotted our invasion of Canuck racing while celebrating over eggs and bacon at a 24-hour Greek diner misnamed the "Deluxe" in the Bronx. I remember this joint had booths with red leatherette seat backs and a radio blaring Greek music constantly. To me that Greek music sounded like the same three songs over and over.

There was absolutely no loitering at this restaurant. You ordered, ate, paid, and left. Loitering was reserved for the place next door that sold candy, cigarettes, and newspapers---three items not in much demand these days. But the candy store was the working man's psychiatrist's office. If you had a problem, two or three guys there were sure to have the answer---for free. You didn't have to undergo 40-minute question-and-answer sessions on the couch. The wise guys at the candy store solved your problems right on the spot.

After the races, we slowly retreated to our car, like a fighter surviving a bad round, and headed for a recommended steak house on the second floor somewhere in Montreal. The tip on that restaurant was a real winner.

We drove to the airport a bit battered, but we finished off the holiday weekend with a visit to beloved Belmont Park. professionally cautious of the complexities of these surroundings. We mentally recouped, and pinned some good adventure ribbons on our chests as memories on our battle.

It was back to the college classroom on Tuesday, but we sure had a whale of a story to tell our buddies in the school's snack bar.
