

At Nappanee Raceway, Little Horses Put On a Big Show

NAPPANEE, IN - It's a Monday night here in the heartland and all is quiet and peaceful, from the stillness of the cornstalks to the lonely, empty rural roads to the Amish buggies parked neatly in a row, the horses waiting patiently while the passengers tend to their business.

It's just what you'd expect from a place called Nappanee, Indiana, population 6,648, notable for being the home of Metzler's Shoes, opened in 1924, and the Nappanee Apple Festival. The festival, by the way, features a seven-foot wide apple pie that weighs 600 pounds.

"Nappanee's rich heritage has been built by good, hard-working people," the town's website boasts.

This is an unlikely place to find the most frenetic, balls-to-the-wall form of harness racing there is. But it is here, at Nappanee Raceway. Nappanee is part of a three-track circuit in Indiana where trottingbreds compete. Trottingbreds are smaller than standardbreds and the races are conducted at only a half-mile. But it is harness racing, with sulkies, drivers wearing colors, a mobile starting gate and fierce competitiveness on the track. With the races so short and the turns so tight (the smallest track of three is a quarter-mile), the horses whip around the track at what seems like mach speed, the drivers sometimes seeming to be doing everything they can to hold on and avoid mass mayhem. Nappanee Raceway's slogan is "No Speed Limit."

"I absolutely have great memories of driving at those places," said LeWayne Miller, now a top driver at Hoosier Park who drove trottingbreds from 2003 through 2008. "It was a blast. Quite a rush."

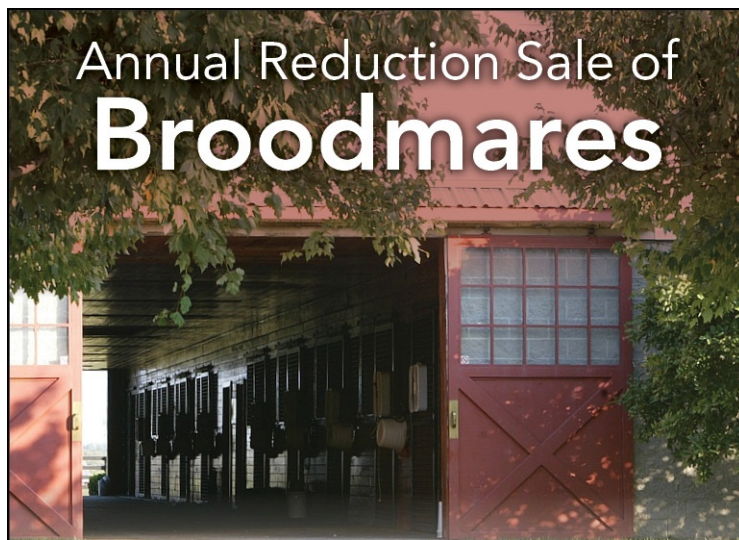
What is now trottingbred racing has its roots in rural communities where people would hitch up some sort of cart or rig to their ponies and race them against one another. By the early Sixties, in an attempt to develop a stronger, faster horse, people began to breed their Welsh, Hackney, and Shetland Ponies to standardbreds. That mix created the trottingbred, which was recognized by the American Horse Council in 1977 as an official breed. Only official trottingbreds are now allowed to compete in the races and they can only be a certain height in order to compete. The horses are first measured as 2-year-olds, and in order to be eligible to race they cannot be taller than 51 inches at their withers.

In the U.S., trottingbred races were held in Florida, New York, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan and Illinois but they've died out everywhere but in Indiana and at one small track in Florida called Sunshine Raceway. In Indiana, the racing is thriving, in large part due to the participation of the local Amish community, particularly among younger members.

The races are all contested at a half-mile. Nappanee is a five-sixteenths mile track. Lagrange is a quarter mile in

circumference and the third and largest track, Goshen, is a half-mile. There are trottingbred pacers and trotters and the fastest trottingbred race ever was turned in by a pacer who completed the half-mile at Goshen in 57.4. Currently, there are about 150 trottingbreds competing on the Indiana circuit.

A typical purse is around \$150, with the money coming from entry fees, the cost of admission (it was \$4 to get into Nappanee) and 50-50 raffles. Horses are classified by time and compete only against horses that are in the same neighborhood when it comes to how fast they can go. There is no betting. Races can include as many as eight horses with the first four on the gate and the second four going from the second tier.

Nathan Miller has been a fixture at Nappanee since 1994 when he filled in for the regular announcer, no one seeming to mind that he was just 12 at the time. He did so well that he was made the full-time announcer shortly thereafter. The sport so got into his blood that he now doubles as a trainer and has four horses. Get him started talking about trottingbred racing and it's hard to get him to stop. He doesn't make any money doing this, he's not famous and he's not looking to do anything else or move on. He's no different than most of them who compete at Nappanee Raceway. They compete for the purest of reasons, for the love of the sport.

"The Standardbred business is just that--a business," Miller said. "It's about making money. This is a hobby, even though our expenses sometimes are about as great

as those of the Standardbred people. We pretty much throw money away on this every year, but it's fun and it's competitive. Everybody here is competitive and they want to be the best. That's why everybody does it."

Mary Jo Stebbins is a 14-year-old driver and trainer who travels to Indiana from Illinois every summer with her

grandfather, Don. Last year, as a 13-year-old, she was named Trainer of the Year on the circuit. No one wrote about it, she didn't win any prize money for the honor and Google it all you want, you won't find any mention anywhere. To her, none of that matters.

"When I found out, I cried," she said. "I cried tears of joy. My grandpa

was so proud of me."

Does she want to be the next Casie Coleman? "Never heard of her," Stebbins said.

Stebbins and her grandfather were among only a handful of non-Amish competing on the card. Not only is the Amish community a big part of racing here, they are seen as the main reason trottingbred racing is doing well in Indiana while it has died out elsewhere.

"That's why we're thriving and they don't have this racing in the East anymore," Nathan Miller said. "They couldn't get younger people involved there and when the older people died, the sport died out with them. Here, the Amish kids love it."

An individual is not considered an official member of the Amish church until they are baptized, which does not happen until they are at least 18. Once that happens, they must follow traditional Amish customs, which does not allow them to compete in races, though they can still own and train horses. For that reason, the driving is largely left to their children, some of whom are as young as 12. One of the stars of the circuit is Dale Miller, who is LeWayne's brother. He appears to have the talent to follow in his brother's footsteps, but has yet to make the very personal decision as to whether he will leave the church to be a professional driver or give up driving.

For many of the young drivers, that's a decision that can wait. Several of those competing on this night at Nappanee were going through the Rumspringa period. Rumspringa typically starts around 14 and 15 and ends when the person either decides to join the church or leave it to lead an "English" lifestyle. Some of the teen drivers and many in the crowd looked no different than a typical suburban adolescent, driving their cars, chatting on their iPhones and, at least among the girls, wearing clothes that were, to put it mildly, on the inappropriate side. Every one of them seems to have a Facebook page.

Amy Miller, 16, is in the middle of Rumspringa. She drives for her father, Duane, who also breeds Standardbreds at his Legacy Lane Farm. John Gingerich is 14. He drove his first career winner Monday, guiding Init 2 Winit to victory in the seventh race.

"That was pretty awesome," the shy teen said after the win.

And will he miss driving if he commits to the church?

"I don't know," he said.

Amy Miller wears the exact colors of Andy Miller, who is no relation. Why?

"We just copied his colors," she said. "It's something different from everybody else, everybody has blue, red, green, so we decided we'll go with orange."

Another driver, Virgil Slabaugh, wears Tim Tetrick's colors and after his win on the night in the sixth with GV Kerhacious Nathan Miller the announcer called out, "A win for the Bionic Man."

After the seventh race there is a break, and that's when they hold races for the even younger kids. With ponies

hooked to just about everything imaginable, they careen around the track like bumper cars until someone gets to the wire first. Some fans cheered them on while others headed to the concession stand for a piece of homemade cherry pie.

The final race on the card, for pacers that have gone in 1:05 or faster, went to American Irish. He upset Rockn Roll Express, who was undefeated on the year at 8-for-8. It was a big win for the Sundown Stables and driver Myron Miller and meant that he might be good enough to compete at the end of the year-end championship stakes events, where the purses can reach as much as \$3,000.

But the competition gets tougher in those races as horses might come down from Quebec, the only other place on the continent to have trottingbred races, or even Bermuda. There's trottingbred racing there, too, and some of the Indiana drivers will go compete there during the winter. The Bermudian owners tend to be more wealthy than their Indiana counterparts and have been known to pay as much as \$5,000 for a trottingbred yearling at the sales. With purses being what they are, paying \$5,000 for one of these horses doesn't make much sense, but there's more involved than dollars and cents.

"When you see someone pay that much for a horse, it's sometimes the guys from Quebec, but it's usually someone from Bermuda," Don Stebbins said. "Some people don't care what they spend. It's bragging rights. They just want to be able to say they own the fastest horse."

Don Stebbins has been around the sport for 52 years,

about the time the first Nappanee Raceway opened in 1964, back when they used to just race ponies. He's seen the breed get much faster and seen a bunch of drivers like Lewayne Miller, Steve Cross and others move on to be successes in Standardbred racing. A lot has changed. A lot has stayed the same.

"I'm happy to make enough money to pay my gas bill and maybe have a little left over to pay for some of my feed," he said. "That's always the way it has been."



But trottingbred racing gives him something money can't buy--a chance to bond with his granddaughter Mary Jo, work with her and

watch her cry with joy when she was named Trainer of the Year. Stebbins won the second race with SH LaVeta. Mary Jo won the ninth. Their haul for the night was about \$300, less entry fees.

Racing resumes tonight at Nappanee. They have three in.

George Anthony Speaks Out on His Dismissal at Pocono

George (The King) Anthony said his firing from Pocono Downs as the track handicapper and the host of the simulcast production was a matter of "wrongful termination" and came about only because he was trying to help horsemen secure rooms at the hotel that is part of the casino and racetrack complex.

Anthony said he was fired in the middle of the June 30 card after an angry exchange with Pocono Vice President of racing Operations

Dale Rapson. Anthony said he had several run-ins with Rapson since he was hired by Pocono in the summer of 2011.

Anthony said his latest troubles began when he tried to help Brian Sears get a room at the hotel on the night of the elimination races for Pocono's stakes-laden card on July 4. Anthony said he never told anyone at the hotel what to charge Sears, who paid a discounted rate. Anthony said the charge was \$89. On Saturday nights in the summer, rooms at the hotel start at \$249. He said the decision to charge Sears \$89 was made by the hotel management.

"I have nothing to do with what they charge people," Anthony said. "It's none of my business. They could charge them \$1, they could charge \$1,000. I don't care. I would just say 'See what you can do for them, see if you can give them a rate. They are horsemen.' Instead of them going across the street, they are in our building and they'll be spending money. They might drink, they might have dinner they might gamble."

Anthony alleges that when Rapson found out what Sears was charged he blamed him and went into a tirade.

"He comes barreling into my studio in front of my crew, comes in like a giant fullback, running and pointing his finger and says, 'You know we don't give rooms away here for \$89,'" Anthony recalled. "He said, 'I'm sick and tired of you. I've had enough, get the (expletive) out of here and don't ever come back here again.' So I got up and said, 'with pleasure' and out the door I went."

Anthony said that earlier in the meet he had another fight with Rapson who demanded that he stop using nicknames as part of his presentation on his show.

"This man he doesn't like nicknames; for some reason it bothers him," Anthony said. "I tried to explain to him that nicknames have been in our business since the sixties. The 'Red Man' for Carmine Abbatiello. 'Storming Norman' Dauplaise. He hates that I call Matt Kakaley 'Special K.' He brought it to my attention and told me to stop but once in a blue moon I would stick a nickname in there. He gave me a couple of warnings and I said 'take it easy, you're getting upset over nothing.'

"On this one particular night I was giving out my best bet and said, 'I think this horse will get 'Simonized' tonight,'" Anthony continued, referring to driver Simon Allard. "He comes barging into my studio in front of my people and says 'If you (expletive) do it one more time I'm going to throw you the (expletive) out of here.'"

Anthony said Rapson also didn't like it when he made suggestions such as asking the judges to post the track condition earlier, which, Anthony claims, they sometimes wouldn't do until five or six minutes to post. He said Rapson also bristled when he said the simulcasting area was filthy.

"Here's a guy who is totally absentee management," Anthony said. "He is never there. He should've thought since I'm never there it's nice to have a guy who is my eyes and ears."

Anthony said he met with Pocono President and General Manager Michael Bean afterward to voice his complaints and argue for his job back but has yet to hear back from

Bean.

"I told him that this guy snaps and he abuses his power," Anthony said. "I told him this was a case of totally wrongful termination. Because of this incident he's ruined my reputation. I've been dragged through the mud on the Internet. There are people out there who don't the facts and don't know what happened and they're saying that I was fired for taking kickbacks for getting people cheap rooms. I don't need a \$25, \$50 payoff to get some guy a room. I'm way, way above that. That's absolute rubbish."

Anthony also alleges that his predecessor, Randy Castellani, was fired by Rapson in 2011 after an angry showdown with Rapson.

Rapson confirmed that Anthony had been fired.

"There's not much that I can say because we consider this an internal matter," Rapson said. "I can tell you that this was not the result of any one thing or just one incident."

Bruce Nickells Selected for Hall of Fame

Induction (*press release*)

GOSHEN, NY - Bruce Nickells, a trainer/driver who was associated with many top horses during his 70-year career in harness racing and who specialized in the developing of young pacing fillies into champions, was selected for induction into the Harness Racing Hall of Fame by the Screening Committee of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA), the sport's leading media organization, under a "Veterans" provision incorporated into the organization's by-laws earlier this year.

Nickells, 87, has developed champions for more than four decades, an impressive feat by any standard.

At the age of 13, Nickells got his start as a part-time groom with the late C.F. Rumley. He got his first drive and first win at Aurora Downs in 1949 and opened his own stable in 1953.

His career stats are incomplete since USTA record keeping began well after Nickells started his harness racing career, but he is still credited with more than \$6 million in purses as a driver and more than \$7 million in training earnings in the pre-slots racing era.

Nickells developed some outstanding horses, including the trotter Scribe Rodney, Combat Time, Batman, Kentucky, and Fast Clip.

Nickells' prowess soon caught the attention of Grand Circuit patrons, and his training of the great mare Follow My Star in 1985 resulted in a partnership with mega-owner Lou Guida – one that would rewrite the record books.

He trained six freshman divisional winners and/or the richest freshman filly of the year. Nickells broke his own single season earnings record set by Follow My Star in 1991 with the great Miss Easy, who won 25 of her 32 lifetime starts (including an 11-race win streak), with earnings of \$1,777,656. For his management of Miss Easy, Nickells was voted 1991 Glen Garnsey Trainer of the Year.

Miss Easy was a repeat divisional winner as a sophomore.

Other top horses for Nickells include Hambletonian Oaks winner Park Avenue Kathy, Central Park West, Hazleton

Kay, Immortality, Freedoms Friend, Bruce's Lady, Efishnc and six Breeders Crown champions. His Crown starters earned \$1.9 million, currently ranking him 15th in all-time

Crown earnings even though he's started just one horse in the series since 1999.

For the last 20 years Nickells has concentrated on the winter training and breaking of colts, and gave youngsters such as Cypress Creek (\$384,000) and Grinfromeartear (\$1.7 million) their early lessons. Nickells has turned his stable over to his daughter, Brooke, and is an active consultant and trainer in their rotation from Pompano Park in the winter to summers at

Hoosier Park.

Nickells will be inducted into the Hall of Fame on Sunday, July 3, 2016, going directly to the Hall under the Veterans provision. He will be joined on that day by candidates who receive 75 percent of the yes-no vote from eligible USHWA and Hall of Famers in late summer voting: Hall of Fame nominee Charles Keller III and Communicators Hall of Fame nominees David Carr and Jerry Connors.

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - The \$433,000E Hambletonian Maturity for four-year-old trotters will be raced on Saturday, July 18 at The Meadowlands.

Supplemental declarations for the Hambletonian Maturity must be accompanied by payment of the supplemental amount (\$50,000) and received in the Meadowlands Racing Office no later than 8:00 am on Monday, July 13, 2015 or at the Hambletonian Society's offices before the end of the business day on Friday, July 10 (5:00 pm).

Any supplement(s) will be announced via the Meadowlands text service.

Declarations for eligible horses must be in by 9:00am on Monday, July 13. The Hambletonian Maturity allows for 16 starters and will be contested at a mile and 1/8. All starters will receive money and like the Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks, no race day medication is permitted. A complete list of eligibles and conditions for the Hambletonian Maturity are available on the Hambletonian Society website.

Along with the above mentioned stake, the powerful July 18 card will include the finals for the Meadowlands Pace, Mistletoe Shalee and WR Haughton FFA. The Stanley Dancer and Delvin Miller Memorials for three-year-old trotters and the Golden Girls and Miss Versatility for older mares of both gaits are on the card as well. Declarations for these stakes are due by 9:00 am on July 13 as well.

The condition sheet for July 17 & 18 live racing contains all necessary information. All trainers must have a 2015 Racing Application on file with the Racing Office before entries may be accepted.

NEPTUNE TWP, NJ - July 9, 2015 - Shoes worn by See You At Peelers, honored as a divisional champion at two and three, are among the items that will be auctioned to benefit the horses in the care of the Standardbred Retirement Foundation.

More than 20 items of interest to fans of racing will be auctioned on eBay, starting July 12, 2015.

Suzanne D'Ambrose of Neptune, NJ, a volunteer with the SRF, will be conducting the 10-day auction for the second year. All the proceeds are used to buy grooming supplies, fly spray, horse care items and special treats for the retirees at the Cream Ridge, NJ farm.

"It will be like Christmas in July for the SRF horses," said D'Ambrose. "Thanks to horsemen and friends, I've been able to accumulate many treasures to auction, and 100 percent of what is raised will benefit the horses."

See You At Peelers, who was the Two-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year in 2010 and the Three-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year in 2011, retired with 26 wins in 31 starts and \$1.5 million in earnings.

"After her last race at Yonkers Raceway [in 2012], I asked trainer Jimmy Takter for two of her shoes, and he kindly donated them," D'Ambrose explained. "Her shoes come with a certificate of authenticity."

Among the items that will be auctioned are Hambletonian shirts and scarves. Autographed driving whips, which also have certificates of authenticity, will be included. The whips are signed by Hall of Famer John Campbell as well as Tony Alagna, Ron Burke, Casie Coleman, Jeff Gregory, and Brian Sears. One driving whip has four signatures on it: Cory Callahan, Nancy Johansson, Marcus Miller, and Scott Zeron.

Another special item is a 10 ½ x 13 ½ mounted photo of Niatross and driver-trainer Clint Galbraith, winning the 1980 James B. Dancer Memorial at Freehold Raceway.

"Many friends have donated the racing memorabilia for the benefit of the SRF horses," said D'Ambrose. "In particular, I'd like to thank Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey Public Relations Director Carol Hodes, who had many items collected during nearly 40 years as a racing journalist and publicist."
