Maxwell's Big Moment

Trainer Brad Maxwell scored the biggest win of his career when Control The Moment edged out Racing Hill in the \$732,050 Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace.

Control The Moment held off Racing Hill at the wire to win the 40th edition of the Meadowlands Pace for driver Brian Sears who celebrated his second Pace victory.

Trainer Brad Maxwell has gone from horse racing to hockey and back to horse racing. After a stint as an assistant coach in the Ontario Hockey League, he went back to harness racing five years ago. What drove the soft spoken trainer to make the change? Perhaps it was the dream of having another good horse.

Maxwell won the biggest race of his career Saturday night at the Meadowlands when his Control The Moment captured the \$732,050 Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace by a nose over Racing Hill.

“I was never disappointed in the driver or the horse,” Maxwell said. “He’s a once-in-a-lifetime horse. It’s a dream come true. This is why I left hockey.”

Control The Moment was an O'Brien Award champion last year as he reeled off eight wins from nine starts. But he didn't get off to a good start this year, losing four of his first five races. He was fourth on his home turf in the North America Cup elims and third in the \$780,000 NA Cup final. Going back to last year, he had lost seven of his last nine.

"He kept drawing badly," Maxwell said. "It was all the post positions. Simple as that."

Control The Moment drew the nine-hole in the NA Cup final, the eight for the Max Hempt final and the nine for the lone elimination of the Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace.

Yet, something clicked in the elims for the Meadowlands Pace. With new driver Brian Sears accepting the assignment, Control The Moment won by a length in 1:49.2, his best performance of the year.

The Meadowlands bettors were so impressed by that effort that they made Control The Moment the 7-10 favorite over morning line choice Racing Hill. Racing Hill had accepted a bye and missed the elims. Many players clearly saw it as a sign that Control The Moment, a son of Well Said—Life'sliltreasure, was back and they liked the fact Sears was the new pilot.

That Control the Moment was struggling with Randy Waples driving and is now two for two with Sears is hard to overlook. Maxwell said the change in drivers has not made a difference.

"Randy did a very good job with this horse," Maxwell said. Saturday night, Sears took charge right off the gate. He led by one-and-a-quarter lengths after a half in :53.2.

"I think :53 is pretty comfortable for these types of horses in a final like this so I wasn't too concerned," Sears said.

The Pace turned into a two-horse race. Racing Hill, trained by Tony Alagna and driven by Brett Miller, was coming off a win in the Hempt at Pocono and clearly had the ability to win a race of this stature. At the top of the stretch Control The Moment was two-and-a-half in front and looked to be in complete control. But Racing Hill closed with a flourish to just miss by a slim nose.

"It was great to get a spin with him last week and he raced great off the pace and finished up well," Sears said. "I was real happy with the spot we landed in the post draw (the three hole) and the trip worked out perfect. Brett's horse (Racing Hill) was getting a little rough around the last turn so I kind of let my horse out a little bit. We made it pretty exciting at the wire, but he raced great. I'm real happy."

Miller thought he might have had the best horse.

"My colt really responds when I pull the plugs on him," Miller said. "When I went to pull his plugs at the top of the stretch they didn't come out; they got stuck. I finally got him out in mid-stretch and he took off. Absolutely, it could have made the difference."

Check Six finished third. The time was 1:50.2 and Control The Moment paid \$3.40. Once one of the leaders of the division, Boston Red Rocks was seventh. It was his fifth straight loss.

The victory improved Control The Moment to 3-1-1 in seven starts in 2016 and pushed his seasonal bankroll over \$525,000 and his career balance to the brink of \$875,000. Lifetime, Control The Moment is now 11-1-1 in 16 starts for the Control The Moment Stable — Maxwell of Guelph, ON, Howard Taylor of Philadelphia, Ed Gold of Phoenixville, PA, Ben Mudry of Florida and Tara Hills Stud of Port Perry, ON. Maxwell said he wasn't sure where Control The Moment would race next but said the Adios was a possibility.

“Miki” wears the mantle of greatness

After winning the Haughton, trainer Jimmy Takter said Always B Miki “could be the greatest horse that ever lived.”

It was the third straight world record performance for Always B Miki and David Miller, this time a 2:01.1 mark for the 1 1/8th distance that was lowered later in the card by Lady Shadow in the Golden Girls.

Hyperbole? Perhaps. But you have no choice but to listen when a trainer of Jimmy Takter's stature makes such a bold statement. Minutes after Always B Miki won Saturday night's \$471,800 William Haughton Memorial at the Meadowlands with complete authority, Takter couldn't contain his enthusiasm.

“I think this could be the greatest horse that ever lived,” he said.

The connections of Somebeachsomewhere, Niatross, Nevele Pride, Bret Hanover and others might not agree, but this much is certain: Always B Miki is the best pacer in the sport today, hands down.

The Haughton was Round Three of harness racing's version of Ali-Frazier-Foreman and it included three of the biggest stars the older pacing ranks have seen in a long time. The other two were 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit and the talented Indiana-bred Freaky Feet Pete. Although Always B Miki had already defeated the other two in the Ben

Franklin at Pocono, there didn't seem to be any reason why one or the other couldn't turn the tables on him.

Leaving from post 10 in the mile-and-an-eighth race, Montrell Teague was aggressive off the gate and put Wiggle It Jiggleit on the lead. Trace Tetrick was quick to follow and settled into second. The quarter went in :25.3.

Knowing that he was driving the best horse, David Miller took no chances. From fifth, he made a brush down the backstretch and swept to the lead. He assumed command and waited for what he figured would be challenges to come from Freaky Feet and Wiggle It Jiggleit. It never happened.

“I just didn't want to get caught up in some :25 and :52 type thing trying to make the front,” Miller said. “I was really kind of searching for some cover. Leaving out of there, I was thinking of following behind (Scott) Zeron (the driver of Shamballa) because I figured he could take me where I had to go. As soon as Montrell crossed over he started grabbing up and as soon as I got to him he turned me loose.”

At 39-1, Shamballa finished second, three-quarters of a length behind Always B Miki.

"(Shamballa) kept grinding away at Miki," Zeron said. "When I got that close to Miki I thought I had a real shot. He made it exciting."

Always B Miki paid \$2.80 and covered the mile-and-an-eighth in 2:01.1. Wiggle It Jiggleit finished third. For the only second time in his 36-race career, Freaky Feet Pete finished off the board. He was fourth.

Takter said he wasn't sure where Always B Miki would race next and noted that he's not the kind of horse who can race week after week. But when he lines up the starting gate can anyone beat him?

"This horse is one of a kind," Takter said. "I've had quite a few nice pacers, but this horse, you don't do what he's doing. I'm always a big statement guy, but I think this could be the greatest horse who ever lived. I really think so. He didn't have an easy trip today. He won by a length and a half, maybe, but he's a lazy horse. He's not a grabby horse. But if somebody challenges him, he's got another gear."

Primary owner Mitchell Skolnick would not rule out racing the now five-year-old next year, but said he and his partners are leaning toward retiring him to stud at the end of the year.

Meadowlands Pace card wagering tops \$4.2 million; Super High Five pays \$3,269.52

Total wagering exceeded \$4.2 million Saturday during the 13-race Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace card at the East Rutherford, NJ track

The most highly anticipated wagering opportunity of the season, the mandatory payout of the Super High Five wager, returned \$3,269.52 for every 20¢ winning ticket in race 12, the Golden Girls for older pacing mares.

The total pool of \$1,015,660 included \$747,891 in new money wagered, in addition to the \$267,769 carryover amount. The wager had not been hit since the Meadowlands season began in November.

The 3-5 favorite Lady Shadow set a world record for 1 1/8 miles to win the Golden Girls in 2:00.3. The favorite was followed across the wire by 6-1 Solar Sister and 27-1 Inittowinafortune. Fourth place went to 42-1 Devil Child and 11-1 Katie Said rounded out the winning combination.

There was a total of 276 winning tickets that were rewarded thanks to the large carryover and low 15 per cent takeout rate.

Hannelore Hanover beats the boys in Hambletonian Maturity

Supplemented to the Hambletonian Maturity for \$50,000, Hannelore Hanover proved that faith in her was well founded.

Hannelore Hanover and driver Yannick Gingras took the lead on the far turn and was much the best, capturing the \$471,200 Hambletonian Maturity for 4-year-olds at 1-1/8 miles by three-and-a-half lengths on the Meadowlands Pace undercard Saturday (July 16) night at the Meadowlands.

Hannelore Hanover, the 4-5 post-time favorite and daughter of Swan For All—High Sobriety recorded her ninth victory in 10 starts this year and paid \$3.80 to win.

“She was even better tonight than she was in Canada (winning three straight in the Armbro Flight eliminations and final and Ms. Versatility),” said Gingras. “The second time I raced her in Canada, she was a little bit hot. They made a couple of changes on her and she usually starts out a little bit stiff, but she warms right out of it. Tonight, the minute she hit the track, she felt super. She just dominated them.”

Trained by Ron Burke, Hannelore Hanover brushed past Musical Rhythm, driven by John Campbell, at the half-mile mark and cleared to take the lead for good. Fractions for the 1-1/8-mile trot were :26.3, :55.4, 1:24.4, 1:52.3 and 2:05.4.

Wings of Royalty, driven by Brian Sears, held on nicely to finish second with Crazy Wow, driven by Tim Tetrick and also trained by Burke, grabbing the show spot.

Hannelore Hanover is owned by Burke Racing Stable LLC, Weaver Brusceci LLC and Frank Baldachino. Supplemented to the race for \$50,000, Hannelore Hanover joins Bee A Magician (second in 2014) and Shake It Cerry (third in 2015) as the only mares to start in the Maturity against the males.

Created by the Hambletonian Society and the Meadowlands as a racing opportunity solely for

four-year-olds previously eligible to the Hambletonian and Oaks, the Maturity racing conditions prohibit the use of Lasix, the only race day medication permitted in New Jersey.

Positively Golden

Lady Shadow sets a 1 1/8th mile world record in Golden Girls.

Roughly an hour after watching five-year-old stallion Always B Miki establish the world record for pacing the distance of 1-1/8 miles, five-year-old mare Lady Shadow went out and lowered the mark by three-fifths of a second with a 2:00.3 victory in Saturday's (July 16) \$229,900 Golden Girls for older female pacers at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Frost Damage Blues led the field to the opening quarter-mile in :24.4 before yielding the front to Lady Shadow and driver Yannick Gingras. Lady Shadow remained on top from there, with fractions of :53, 1:20.4, and 1:47 to the mile. The time of 1:47 for one mile equaled the record for the fastest-ever mile by a female pacer, set by Shebestingin in 2013.

Solar Sister made a late charge in the stretch, but finished four lengths behind Lady Shadow. Inittowinafortune was third.

Always B Miki set the short-lived world record of 2:01.1 for 1-1/8 miles in winning the William R. Haughton Memorial for older male pacers three races prior to the Golden Girls.

“24.4? Yeah, that’s a first,” Gingras said. “I didn’t know until after the race how fast we were actually going in the first quarter. I knew it was fast but I was going to take my time to get there.

“If I knew it was going to be 1:47 flat (to the mile) I might have let her go a little bit down the stretch. I knew I had a big lead so I wasn’t chasing her. I just kind of let her do it on her own. That would have been cool, (1):46.4 or something.”

Ron Adams trains Lady Shadow, who has won five of 11

races this year. She has won 21 of 46 career races and pushed her lifetime purses to \$1.05 million with the triumph in the Golden Girls.

Lady Shadow (Shadow Play—Lady Camella) is owned by David Kryway, Carl Atley, Ed Gold, and BFJ Stable. She paid \$3.40 to win.

Hambletonian matchup looms between Dancer winners

Southwind Frank and Marion Marauder won their respective divisions of the Stanley Dancer Memorial on Saturday at the Meadowlands.

Southwind Frank did nothing to damage his status as the favorite for next month's Hambletonian Stakes and Marion Marauder cemented his status as a top contender, each with victories in their respective \$153,250 divisions of the Stanley Dancer Memorial for three-year-old male trotters Saturday (July 16) at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

The \$1 million Hambletonian is Aug. 6 at the Meadowlands.

Southwind Frank won his Dancer division by one-and-a-quarter lengths over Sutton in 2:06.4 in the 1-1/8 miles event. Marion Marauder won his division by two-and-three-quarter lengths over Bar Hopping in 2:08.1.

The races were contested at 1-1/8 miles rather than the traditional one-mile distance because each division consisted of 11 horses, requiring one horse to start in the second tier.

In the opening division, driver Yannick Gingras was patient with Southwind Frank, content to sit in fifth place through nearly three-quarters of a mile as Dominion Beach and driver Marcus Johansson cut the early fractions of :26.3, :55.2, and 1:24. Southwind Frank, the 1-9 favorite, followed the cover of

Hollywood Highway around the final turn, as the mile was reached in 1:52.4, and trotted to victory.

Love Matters was third behind Sutton, the second-tier starter, followed by Dominion Beach.

"I don't think (the extra distance) is a really big deal for these horses, they just start up the stretch a little bit more," winning trainer Ron Burke said. "If there was any variance it was that the track looks like it favors closers maybe slightly.

"I wasn't really thrilled with today. He was all right, he wasn't excellent. In a little bit we'll go back to the drawing board, we've been messing with his bridle trying to calm him down. Now we're going to go the other way, now we'll try to let him be a little more aggressive, like he was before we started messing with his bridle."

Southwind Frank (Muscle Hill—Flawless Lindy) has won four of five races this year and earned \$395,375 for the Southwind Frank Partners ownership group. The colt, who was the 2015 Dan Patch Award winner for best 2-year-old male trotter, has won 15 of 17 career starts and banked \$1.18 million.

In the second division, even-money favorite Marion Marauder (Muscle Hill—Spellbound Hanover) went to the lead at the start and never looked back. It was the first time in 18 career races that Marion Marauder led a race at the first quarter.

Marion Marauder, with driver Scott Zeron, led the field through fractions of :27.1, :57.2, 1:27, and 1:54.4 to the mile.

Iron Mine Bucky was third behind Bar Hopping, with Blenheim fourth.

Marion Marauder, from the stable of trainers Mike Keeling and Paula Wellwood, has won four of five races this year and five of 18 in his career.

The colt is owned by Wellwood's mother, Marion, the widow of the U.S. and Canadian Hall of Fame horseman Bill Wellwood. Marion shares the ownership of Marion Marauder with her grandson Devin Keeling — Paula and Mike's son.

Marion Marauder, who is four-for-five in 2016 with earnings just shy of \$200,000 on the year, was purchased for \$37,000 from the Lexington-Selected Yearling Sale. Sold as Marion Monopoly, the colt had his name changed in honor of his two owners — Marion for Marion Wellwood and Marauder for Devin Keeling who plays football for the McMaster University Marauders in Hamilton, ON.

"You could tell they weren't leaving out of the gate much and Scott and I had discussed just to try (to leave) to show that he could do it," Keeling said. "So it seemed like they were going to give him respect and it all worked out.

"I think he's the best horse I've been around so we'll find out in three weeks or so just how good he is."

Asked what winning the Hambletonian would mean, Keeling said, "Everything, everything. This is the race that everybody that trains trotters, they dream of this."

Blue Moon Stride captures Mistletoe Shalee in 1:49.2

Blue Moon Stride and driver Andrew McCarthy won Saturday's (July 16) \$157,400 Mistletoe Shalee for three-year-old female pacers by one length over Penpal in 1:49.2 at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Blue Moon Stride, the 4-5 favorite, was near the rear of the six-horse field during the race's early goings, but started to make her move from fifth place as the group neared the halfway point in the mile.

O'Brien Award winner L A Delight, who was the even-money second choice, went off stride as she attempted to challenge Lindwood Beachgirl for the lead, leaving Blue Moon Stride first over as the field entered the final turn.

New Jersey Sire Stakes champion Blue Moon Stride took over the top spot at the top of the stretch and then held off an upset bid from Penpal and driver Patrick Lachance. Shezarealdeal finished third, followed by Skinny Dipper.

Fractions for the mile were :26.2, :54.3 and 1:23.

Trained by Mark Harder, Blue Moon Stride (Rocknroll Hanover—Classic Star) is owned by Emilio and Maria Rosati of Australia. She has won four of seven races this season and \$233,700.

"This race didn't come up quite the way I thought it would, with L A Delight, a great filly in the past, she had a miscue at the half," Harder said. "You know what? (Blue Moon Stride) is just good right now, she's in a little groove. She's healthy and strong, she's done the job."

The Miss New Jersey on July 30 at the Meadowlands is expected to be her next start.

Broadway Donna impressive in Delvin Miller; Womans Will, Unica Steed dead-heat

Sophomore trotting fillies contested a pair of divisions in the Delvin Miller Memorial on Saturday night (July 16) at Meadowlands Racetrack. The 2015 Dan Patch Award winner Broadway Donna put on a furious rush from three wide in the final strides to win the \$97,750 second division in 1:52.2.

Driven by David Miller, Broadway Donna started from post six and let Celebrity Eventsy (John Campbell) control the early fractions in :27.4, with Sunset Glider (Brett Miller) and Just Jess (Tim Tetrick) behind her.

Yannick Gingras took over the lead with All The Time at the three-eighths and held it to the :56.2 half. Just beyond the half, David Miller tipped out with Broadway Donna from fifth along the rail and was second on the outside by the 1:25 three-quarters.

When the field turned for home, Broadway Donna was in position to get the lead, with Celebrity Eventsy squeezing into contention down the stretch between Broadway Donna and All the Time along the rail.

Those three were within a few feet of each other down the stretch with Broadway Donna winning by a head over All The Time and Celebrity Eventsy a nose back in third.

Broadway Donna (Donato Hanover—Boadway Schooner) was bred and is owned by Fashion Farms and is trained by Jim Campbell.

"We were just taking our time getting there," said winning driver David Miller. "I had a good filly on the lead and I wasn't going to run at her too early. I was just taking my time. She came back real good (this year). So far so good."

A photo could not separate Womans Will (Andy Miller) and Unica Steed (Tim Tetrick) in the \$95,250 first division of the Delvin Miller Memorial. The time was 1:54.2 for the pair.

Womans Will and Miller were first to the lead at the :28.4 first quarter, with Haughty (Yannick Gingras) and Unica Steed (Tim Tetrick) along the rail behind the leader. The order was unchanged to the :57.4 half and the 1:26.2 three-quarters.

At that marker, Tetrick took Unica Steed off the rail to challenge and took aim at the leader all the way down the stretch. The finish line did not come up fast enough for Womans Will, as Unica Steed caught up with her in time for the dead heat. Miss Tezsia (Brett Miller) was third.

The top three finishers are all eligible for the Aug. 6 Hambletonian Oaks at The Meadowlands.

Unica Steed (Muscles Yankee—Premiere Steed) is trained by Jimmy Takter and owned by Ecurie Ab Trot of France and Womans Will (Donato Hanover—Will Of A Woman) is trained by Julie Miller for Al Libfield and Marvin Katz.

Longer races with trailers, or one mile with all noses on the gate?

On Friday, we asked you:

In light of Saturday's Meadowlands card when five races will feature trailers and three will be contested at a distance of 1 1/8th miles, do you prefer:

A. Longer races and more entries, even if there are trailers or

B. Every horse on the gate and the standard one-mile distance?

Here's some of the responses we received on social media:

Phillip Coole: B.

Benjamin Medich: A. Makes for more interesting racing and better payouts.

Dean Hoffman: A. One-mile monotony makes for predictable racing. More horses over longer distances makes for more excitement and better payoffs.

Jeff Courchesne: A. Force them to mix it up a little more.

Rob Henry: Yeah, but you let everyone in then you end with the debacle that is the Kentucky Derby. Twenty horses every year just because they can. About eight of them actually belong there. I would rather have eight great horses than 12 and four are just clutter.

Robert Winkler: Hate it. I wanna see them go for the one-mile world record.

Mickey Barnes: Everyone on the gate!

Mark David: I don't think there should ever be a trailer in any race period. I'm fine with the longer distance. But, those Yonkers races with the three or four trailers that are longer, those are no good either. Too much clutter leaving.

Michelle Luce: On the gate, one mile.

Charlie Guiler: B.

Dennis Sharkey: On a mile track: B.

Gillian Stockman: We mix it up in NZ and it's great. Constant mile racing can be monotonous.

Carol Nichols Shuman: B.

Derrick Leuci: B.

Liz Snedden-Chadwell: A.

David Robinson: One mile, but 11 occasionally is okay. Twelve is too much.

Ronald Statkus: I think they should go 1 1/4 if there are trailers!

Barry Miller: I like both the added distance and a trailer or too. I've often thought Yonkers should add trailers for every race with the twist of having each trailer in a different spot each race instead of always being behind the 1 or 2 horse. A handicap perhaps.

Elliot Philip Craike: Standing starts. LOL. Two-mile handicaps. U.S. trots are boring as f---. Watch how we do it in oz, many distances, mobiles and stands.

Dave Shebroe: One mile, all on gate... The owner of the Meadowlands missed a huge chance to promote the sport.

Randy Sanchelli: I would prefer trotters (aged) go a mile and quarter, mile and half, especially on the mile tracks. I'd like the pacers to go one mile.

Moir Fanning: There's a huge difference in talking about this in overnight races or stakes races.

Garnet Barnsdale: I'm for whichever option creates increased wagering and bigger pools.

Randall Zhok: Trailers suck.

Garnet Barnsdale: Trailer has to be better than a 10-hole unless you are sending Precious Bunny or Riyadh to the gate and they can clear before the turn.

Randall Zhok: Not really. Rather have 10 hole. If there are trailers better to scratch. especially in trotters, like last night. Just ridiculous to have a trailer in a trotting filly race.

David Mattia: The entire concept of an 8 hole or a 10 hole sucks. There must be a reason why we get angry when we draw outside. I would prefer a 9 hole second tier over an 8 hole, but having that 9th horse would annoy me — and always has.

Randall Zhok: I'm talking about 11 and 12 with 10 wide or 10 or 11 with 9 wide is just plain stupid, especially where they keep their handholds now. Georgian Downs had 10 hole behind 9 to have more horses in the super in the last races and it was torture. 7, 8, 9 had zero chance.

Moira Fanning: I'm also for consistency and doing things that are supported by numbers and stats. I'm also for giving stakeholders at least a voice in any process.

Garnet Barnsdale: Ditto, but I'm also for giving customers a voice.

Moira Fanning: Ditto, but owners are also customers.

Bob Boni: Most paid in events should have all on the gate regardless of distance and if that were the case added distance could be indicated in conditions. For now save most added distance and trailers for overnights. There has to be balance between gambling and horseman/owners and management.

Ken Heineken: I agree... won two elim. for 1,000,000 races and drew 10 hole (each time) and trailed. Got no money in ether race. Should have drawn either the rail or two hole.

Randall Zhok: Absolutely correct. I've got the 11 and 10 hole in added money events with 11 horses. Sucks. Got wiped out at the start of 11 hole when both one and two horses ran without a recall and missed \$130,000 final which I paid into for two years.

David Mattia: Harness racing is raced by STANDARDBREDS – the very name of the breed incorporates the historical fact that trotters and pacers race at a standard for one mile. To race at other distances you need to start breeding trotters and pacers differently.

Murray Brown: I think varying distance races over a period of time could have, or could possibly still enhance the game. However I don't think the time to introduce them is the first time these outstanding horses are racing at these distances. As is the norm, I could be wrong.

Garnet Barnsdale: Did anyone complain when they paid into the race with the possibility of a 12-horse field racing 1 1/8 miles existing? Why complain now?

Anthony Haughan: Who is complaining? I never seen any complaints from the participants!!

Garnet Barnsdale: Seen it in many places on the net.

Anthony Haughan: From?

Murray Brown: Garnet, Almost nobody but Bob Boni was aware of the condition. I know I wasn't. George Teague was quoted as saying that he wasn't and might not even have entered if he knew. Of course it's a responsibility to know what you are paying into. But, this came out of left field. It is far from the norm.

Garnet Barnsdale: True it is not the norm at all.

Anthony Haughan: Murray it was on the condition sheet.

Murray Brown: I know it was Anthony. Who reads those things?

Anthony Haughan: Lol that's true I guess.

Bob Boni: Murray Brown, I read the changed conditions last year when it included certain exclusionary clauses and the short lived trainer restrictions.

Jody Jamieson was just 20 days from his 19th birthday and less than two months removed from racing on the Ontario fair circuit when he was dispatched to Windsor Raceway on Nov. 26, 1995 to race his father Carl's star pacer Elegant Killian.

"I forget why dad didn't drive her the week before at Mohawk, but she made a break in the Canadian Breeders and Doug Brown drove her. She just rolled off. She had a tendency to do that late in the stretch if you didn't know her. Whatever the reason was, she would do it, and she rolled off on Brownie and they were going for \$80,000. They ended up finishing last, so I was up on her the next week," Jody said. "So, I felt a lot of pressure just to make sure she got around there pacing, because she was free-legged."

Compounding Jody's anxiety was the fact he had yet to find the winner's circle in his young driving career and Elegant Killian was in \$11,000 main event against top older pacer Draft Day and leading Windsor driver Al Cullen.

"She pretty much pulled you out of there anyway, but I barreled her out of there to the lead and got a good lead. I'll never forget it. I had Al Cullen sitting on my back. He was always very animated and could really get a horse to go and to live. I could hear him yelling at his horse around the last turn as we straightened up down the stretch," Jody said.

That's when disaster nearly struck for young Jody.

"I was posing a little bit and I went to hit the wheel disc to drive on... and, whatever it was, the vibration or the bang off the wheel disc flicked the whip out of my hand. I didn't throw it away on purpose. I dropped it. That was right at the head of the stretch and here was Draft Day and Al Cullen coming off my back and I thought, 'Oh my God, I dropped my whip and I'm going to lose the race.' I just kept yelling at her and she kept pacing and she won.

"Good horses overcome stupid drives or bad drivers or whatever. I really felt like a fool that day because I was going to hit the wheel disc and really showboat a bit."

More than just the horse that delivered the first of Jody's more than 7,300 victories in a most memorable way, Elegant Killian changed his life — and that of his family. Carl purchased the daughter of Run The Table—Ore Dana for just \$9,000 at the 1992 Forest City Yearling Sale. She went on to earn just shy of \$800,000 in her nine-year racing campaign with a record of 39-23-11 in 123 starts. Carl Jamieson went on to earn a berth in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

"Elegant Killian was always special to me and gave us the opportunity to travel to Mohawk and the Meadowlands and to the big time," said Jody, who has purse earnings approaching \$115 million to his credit in more than 42,000 career drives. "She was my dad's first really good horse. She really made it possible for my dad to buy a bit better pedigreed horses and she was a free-legged world champion at two and three.

"She was the horse that changed my life."

Filion sweeps second half of double OSS feature

Mohawk Racetrack's fans enjoyed a double feature of Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) action on Saturday evening as both the three-year-old trotting fillies and two-year-old pacing colts competed in a pair of \$105,000 (Cdn) Gold Series divisions.

First up were the trotting fillies and 2015 division champ Caprice Hill was an easy winner in the opener. The Kadabra—Bramasole daughter and driver Randy Waples took command before the half and were on cruise control for the remainder of the mile, reaching the finish in 1:54. Pocket-sitter Emoticon Hanover was one length back second and Flowers N Songs was three more to the rear in third.

"She's just a one of those special animals that just come around every once in a while in a guy's career," said Milton, ON resident Waples from the winner's circle. "She has no flaws; she's perfect gaited, she does everything you want her to do, and she loves her job. And she's got a big motor in her."

Waples engineered Caprice Hill's third win in four sophomore starts for New Jersey-based trainer Tony Alagna and owner Tom Hill of Hamilton, ON. The winner of \$754,377 has only been bested once in seven OSS starts and only four times in 14 career starts.

While Caprice Hill picked up her sixth Gold Series trophy, the second division went to a filly earning her very first.

Starting from post seven in the seven-filly field, driver Jody Jamieson allowed Jarette AS to ease away from the starting gate and settle in at the back of the pack while Radiant Beam, Jangone and Tymal Tempest skirmished for position at the front. Radiant Beam won the early battle, reaching the quarter in :28.2, but fan favorite Tymal Tempest took over before the :56.3 half. Catch A Mission started the forward march from the backfield, pursued by Jarette AS and Royal Charm and it was those two fillies who thrilled fans with their late stretch combat, battling through the wire in 1:53.2. Jarette AS emerged the winner by a head, leaving Royal Charm with the second-place finisher's spoils. Catch A Mission was three and one-half lengths back in third.

"She's a nice little filly. She wasn't the smoothest until she got into full gear in the stretch, and then she just trotted by," said Moffat, ON resident Jamieson. "I was real impressed"

Jamieson added that he felt fortunate to be asked to drive Jarette AS for trainer Anette Lorentzon and owners ACL Stuteri AB of Paris, KY and Kjell Johansson of Sosdala,

Sweden. The Striking Sahbra—Golden Door Lindy daughter made her first five sophomore starts south of the border, shipping north after a July 10 contest at Pocono Downs. A Grassroots winner at two, Jarette AS now boasts a sophomore record of three wins, one second and earnings of \$70,675 through six starts.

The second OSS feature saw Streakavana kick things off with an impressive victory for new owners Brad Grant and Teresa Davidson of Milton and trainer Scott McEneny of Waterdown, ON, who acquired the two-year-old pacing colt on July 10.

In rein to Sylvain Filion, Streakavana left smartly from Post 2, allowed The Dark Shadow to control the pace to the :27.1 quarter, but then went straight back to the front. Brave World and driver Doug McNair came calling heading for the :56.3 half, but Filion opted to maintain his position and urged Streakavana forward to the 1:24.3 three-quarters. Once the Big Jim—Stonebridge Madonna son had shifted into overdrive he simply pulled away from the field, reaching the wire four and one-quarter lengths the best in 1:52.2.

"I was hoping to get covered up by one of the favorites, but nobody showed up, just Dougie (McNair) kind of come late and his horse got a little steppey, so I decided to keep going," explained Filion. "And when I pulled the plugs at the top of the stretch, he just took off."

The Dark Shadow followed Streakavana into second and Yogi Bayama was driven into third-place by Yves Filion, Sylvain Filion's father. The Milton resident had driven Yogi Bayama to a Grassroots victory at Mohawk on July 7 and encouraged his father to move Yogi Bayama up to the Gold Series level.

"He was a little upset when I told him I was going to try the other colt, but he understands," said Filion of the conversation with his father, who will be inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame on Aug. 3.

Similar conversations may continue to take place over the remainder of the season, as Filion also captured the second Gold Series division with Tony O'Sullivan trainee Happy Trio. The colt fired away from post five to reach the quarter in :27 and then allowed Sports Column to take command heading for the :57 half. Sports Column continued to lead the field through the 1:25.3 three-quarters, but when Happy Trio stepped out of the pocket he was able to accelerate past the heavy favorite and claim a neck victory in 1:53.2. Sports Column settled for second and Big Bad Bill was well back in third.

"My horse raced great," said Filion of Happy Trio, who had finished second to Sports Column in the Gold Series season opener. "I couldn't get to him (Sports Column) last time, and tonight we were able to go by him. It's either his wasn't 100 per cent or mine's getting better."

Puslinch, ON resident O'Sullivan conditions the Mach Three—Village Jovial colt for his partners Domenic Chiaravalle of Hamilton and Lorne Keller of Exeter, ON. In three starts, Happy Trio has tallied one win, one second and earnings of \$79,870.

"They're both nice colts, they're both very nice colts," said Filion of Streakavana and Happy Trio. "They're still green, they're still learning, so I expect they'll go even faster miles next time out."

Summer Side wins Lawrence B Sheppard

"I've had success with his family, and he was cheap."

Such was the pre-race assessment of one Ray Schnittker Saturday night in advance of Yonkers Raceway's \$100,000 Lawrence B. Sheppard Pace for two-year-old colts and geldings.

Schnittker and favored Summer Side (\$4.30) kept their heads while others around them were losing theirs, winning by three-and-a-quarter widening lengths in 1:55.3.

The \$15,000 (Harrisburg) son of Well Said—Beachy Lady was put in play early from post position six. He had company, including pole-sitting Southwind Diablo (George Brennan, and eight-holer Hurrikane Kingkong (Dan Dube), which forced a spiffy :27.1 opening quarter-mile.

"Diablo," steppy behind the gate, was the first to do the dance of damned, before the quarter. Summer Side inherited the lead before yielding to Hurrikane Kingkong, parked into the second turn for the privilege.

Nearing the 57-second intermission, Humboldt (Mark MacDonald), coupled with Southwind Diablo, also broke. He bothered a few of the back-of-the-bussers, as "Kingkong" led toward the payoff lap.

Then out of fourth moved Chip Walther (Jason Bartlett), doing so with purpose. He took over at the 1:25.4 three-quarters, opening daylight in the final turn, until...oops. He blew up badly. That allowed Summer Side the chance to extricate himself from the cones, and he opened from there.

Hurrikane Kingkong held second, with Rollin' About (Brent Holland) crossing the line third.

However, after a lengthy look, he was set down for bothering fourth-place finisher Joe's Bid (Jordan Stratton) down the backside the second time, so those two positions were reversed.

Pinkribbon Warrior (Tyler Buter) earned the final pay envelope, seventh-placed-fifth after all the misdeeds were adjudicated.

For Summer Side, co-owned (with Howard Taylor) and trained by his driver, it was a maiden win in his third start. The exacta paid \$29.20, with the triple returning \$235.50.

"I wanted to leave and sit a hole," Schnittker said. "I did, then Jason (Bartlett, Chip Walther) came about a hundred miles an hour and went by, and I thought I was in big trouble.

"Things worked out, for us, not him."

Schnittker, whose other Sheppard win was back in 1995 (Bingo Hanover), admitted he was prepared to move this one. "I had him in a '2-year-old in training sale' with a reserve of \$80,000, but there were no takers."

Now, he's out for the purchase price, and then some.
