

There's No Wiggle Room to This Debate: He's the Best

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ—Another race. Another chapter. Another success story.

The Wiggle It Jiggleit victory tour made a stop in the swamps of New Jersey last night and the result was the biggest win to date in the career of this remarkable, over-achieving gelding. With Montrell Teague driving for his father, owner George Teague Jr., Wiggle It Jiggleit won last night's Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace by 1 3/4 lengths over Dude's The Man.

The winning time was 1:47.4 and he paid \$2.80.

"This was unbelievable," Montrell Teague said. "I've been waiting to get a big race like this under my belt. We tried to do it with Custard The Dragon, but it didn't work out. To do this for dad and my family, it's unbelievable."

It was a raucous and emotional scene in the winner's circle as the Teague entourage numbered a good 40 people, most of them wearing red Wiggle It Jiggleit t-shirts. Montrell Teague celebrated by pumping his fist a couple of times as his horse crossed the wire and then he jumped on the back of Wiggle Its's groom for a piggyback ride.

The horse is so good right now he makes things look easy.

As the field of ten left off the gate in the \$706,000 race, Pace elim winner In The Arsenal sprinted to the lead. Montrell Teague allowed his horse to settle briefly before sprinting to the front before the first quarter mile. The driver backed down the pace and dared his rivals to come after him. With Tim Tetrick driving, Wakizashi Hanover, the only horse to ever beat Wiggle It, drew alongside on the far turn, and it appeared that the Meadowlands Pace was going to turn into a horse-race.

Instead, Wiggle It Jiggleit looked his rival in the eye and

said adios amigo.

"When I was backing down the fractions like that I wasn't too worried," Montrell Teague said. "I was dictating the whole pace and I was going to back things down as much as I could. In the last turn I waited a little bit and popped the earplugs and he took off like a rocket."

George Teague said Wiggle It Jiggleit is even better now that he has made an equipment change. After the gelding lost in the North America Cup, Montrell Teague told his father that the horse was having problems seeing his rivals. They went with cut-out blinkers that allowed him to better see any opposition that might arise in the stretch.

"I dropped the ball," George Teague said. "He never should have lost the North America Cup. Montrell felt that in Canada he didn't have a shot at seeing that other horse. It took a little convincing on my part. We didn't change anything for the Hempt elims, but then we made the change for the final and he raced super at Pocono."

But all that is ancient history. The horse George Teague has said is better than Somebeachsomewhere is now 15 for 16 in his career and is clearly the star of one of the sport's marquee divisions, the 3-year-old male pacers.

"Every time this horse gets on the track my heart pounds like a drum," the elder Teague said. "I have raced (Meadowlands Pace winner) Southwind Lynx, Total Truth and Rainbow Blue and no horse has ever made me feel the way this one does."

Wakizashi Hanover finished third. Artspeak was sixth and In The Arsenal faded to finish eighth.

It's already been a long year for Wiggle It, who has come a long way from the days when he was pounding soft competition in the winter at the Meadowlands. But Teague said he has seen no signs of fatigue from the son of Mr Wiggles and he plans on continuing on. He confirmed last night that he will supplement the horse into the Cane Pace on August 8th at the Meadowlands. With last night's win he also became eligible to be supplemented to the Little Brown Jug. Teague said that as long as the horse is healthy come September he very much would like to go to Delaware, Ohio.

"He'll race in as many races as I can race him in," Teague said. "We're not going to run from any horse or any size track. We hope to go to Delaware, Ohio, where some didn't go because they were scared they would draw bad and scared of everything else. People might think that because he's a gelding I think differently with him. I don't. I just think he's a great horse and a horse like that should go to all the big races and compete against the very best."

The win moved Wiggle It Jiggleit's career earnings to \$985,242 and the 1:47.4 was the fastest time of his career.

that good a night for the trainer in the Stanley Dancer at the Meadowlands.

Takter finished first and third in both divisions of the prep for the Hambletonian. He won the first with Pinkman, and Canepa Hanover finished third. Two races later, Takter's The Bank won the second division with French Laundry finishing third.

Pinkman has clearly been the most consistent of Takter's 3-year-old trotting group. Now a winner of five of six this year and 11 of 14 overall, the son of Explosive Matter was second early, moved to the lead approaching the half and held off Habitat to win by a neck 1:52.2 with Yannick Gingras in the bike.

"I know he doesn't do it impressively," Gingras said. "If you watch him on TV it might look like he's done at the wire, but he's not. He's just playing around a little bit in the stretch. If I were to get into him and hit him a couple of times he would just take off. There was no need for that tonight.

"He's definitely on the lazy side. He's one that if you wake him up in the post parade he'd be even better, up on the bit. I have yet to do that this year and hopefully I can wait for a couple of weeks."

In the second division, it looked like Takter's best shot was with French Laundry. Instead, it was the Donato Hanover colt The Bank who came through, winning by a length over Centurion ATM, who turned in a remarkable effort after breaking stride. Takter drove the 9-1 shot himself. It was The Bank's first win since a May 14

Pennsylvania sire stakes event at Harrah's Chester.

"This is a nice colt," Takter said. "It just took a little while for him to start waking up. In my group, I always thought he was one of the best. I'm not surprised. I've been waiting for this for the longest time. He's out of Lantern Kronos, so he's bred to be a good horse. He been battling a huge problem with studdiness. He's the horniest horse I've ever been around."

Takter was elated with the win, raising his whip as he crossed the wire.

"I was so happy because the horse is owned by a very good friend of mine (Goran Falk)," he said. "He hasn't had the greatest couple of years. It felt very good to win for a friend who is from my home town in Sweden.

Takter said he was also pleased with the performances of Canepa Hanover and French Laundry, noting that neither one had raced in four weeks.

"Four weeks is a long time in harness racing," he said. "With French Laundry and Canepa I thought they both raced extremely well. Both of them will step up a little bit from here."

Pinkman won in 1:52.2 and The Bank went in 1:50.4.

The biggest threat to Takter in the Hambletonian could come from the Ake Svanstedt trained Centurion ATM. He broke stride in the early going of the Dancer and somehow managed to make up a ton of ground to finish second. It was quite an impressive effort.

"He put in a top race, but he can do better," Svanstedt said. "They went in 50.4 and he broke. I lost 50 to 60 meters because of it. He was irritated with the sand hitting him from other horses. Yes, he is a Hambletonian horse but he can't do it like this. He never broke before. If he hadn't he would have won easily."

Among the Takter group, Uncle Lasse, who sat out the Dancer is a definite for the July 26 Zweig at Vernon. Takter said he was unsure who else he might enter in that race.

Takter finished one, two, three in the Dancer last year (it was only one division) and went on from there to win the Hambletonian with Trixton. Trixton finished third in the 2014 Dancer behind Father Patrick.

That's The Sprit: A Shocker in the Del Miller

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - Trainer Dustin Jones knew that Sprit To Win was better than her last performance lines had indicated. But even he admitted he was hoping his filly would be "third or fourth" in last night's Del Miller at the Meadowlands. It turned out a whole lot better than he had hoped.

Dismissed at 48-1, the Frederick Hertrich-bred filly, stunned the crowd last night at the Big M with a nose win in the Del Miller. In the process she beat a pair of outstanding fillies in Mission Brief and Livininthefastlane. Mission Brief was second and "Fast Lane" was third. Brett Miler was the winning driver.

"I drove her in her last start at Chester and Chester is kind of a tough track," Miller said. "She wasn't getting over the track very well. Honestly, for her to finish third (in a Pennsylvania sire stakes race) and get beat just 1 3/4 lengths, she raced really good. Actually, tonight at the top of stretch I had a lot of trot but I didn't know if I had time to get there. Then I said we got a shot to be third here. Halfway down the stretch I thought we got a shot of winning this. When I popped her plugs she really took off."

It was the first win on the year from four starts. for the filly by Cantab Hall

"We thought she was top filly last year but she ended up cracking a pastern and we had to stop on her," Jones said. "We were really, really high on her last year."

The bettors thought it was a two-horse race between Mission Brief and Livininthefastlane and for a while that's how it played out on the racetrack. Mission Brief led early, but Andy Miller moved Livininthefastlane to the lead and it looked like she had the race won. But Mission Brief fought back valiantly and got back in front of her rival. The only problem was that neither could hold off Sprit To Win.

This was the first time in her career that Mission Brief lost when she didn't break stride, but it was far from a poor effort and may have been an improvement over her workmanlike wins earlier in the year in a pair of Jersey sire stakes races.

Moonlight Dance Just Keeps Coming to Win the Mistletoe Shalee

Showing the courage of a champion despite never seeing the rail for the entire mile, Moonlit Dance just kept coming and edged clear in tonight's \$207,350 Mistletoe Shalee Pace. The daughter of Art Major, out of the Presidential Ball mare Gone Dancing, obliterated her previous lifetime mark in the process by pacing in 1:49.0.

Moonlit Dance more than doubled her lifetime earnings with the courageous winning effort as her share of the purse took her to just over \$203,000 for owner/breeder David Goodrow. Miller, who with the win passed Mike Lachance for third-place on the all-time earnings list with more than \$190 million earned, was clearly impressed with his filly's effort.

"I tell ya what, I can't say enough about her," Miller beamed in the winners circle. "She took a very tough trip and still had horse left. It wasn't a very good trip at all and she just overdid my drive."

Leaving from the outermost 9 post, Miller floated Moonlit Dance out and looked to get in 5th or 6th but all holes closed up so he gradually tracked the early leader Bettor Be

Steppin. When Brian Sears roared out of the 4-hole with Divine Caroline and surged to the front just past the 54 3/5 half, Moonlit Dance was briefly covered up. But when that filly cleared, the eventual race winner was forced to try to wear her down first-over; and that she did.

Winning trainer Tony O'Sullivan wasn't surprised by his filly's huge effort.

"Apart from the post, I thought she had a really good chance," he noted. "I knew trip might be a problem, but she really has no bottom to her."

Based on the huge trip she went to take the 2015 Mistletoe Shalee, it's hard to argue.

Moonlit Dance returned \$17 to win and combined with Divine Caroline to return \$146.60 for the exacta.

Mach It So Wins First Half of Bamond Double By Bill Finley

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ--Jeff Bamond Jr. has been training for less than a year, but he's proving to be a force in the business. Bamond won two stakes races last night at the Meadowlands, beginning with an upset win by Mach It So in the \$430,600 William Haughton Memorial. It was the richest win thus far of the trainer's career. The horse is owned by his father, Jeff Bamond Sr.

Mach It So came into the race with just one win from 11 starts on the year, but he put it all together last night with the big money on the line,

"He is a good horse; he's always been a fast horse and has overcome his issues," the trainer said. "The trip certainly helped tonight. Anytime you can get a second over trip here you're going to be in a good spot. Once he got away from there and I saw he was behind Dancin Yankee I thought he would get a good trip. I knew Dancin Yankee would carry us. It worked out good."

Mach It So won by a neck over State Treasurer. The old war horse, Foiled Again, was another nose back in third.

Tim Tetrick was the winning driver and the race went in 1:48.1. Mach It so paid \$36.40.

"When he trips out like that, he's pretty tough to beat," Tetrick said. "He proved that tonight."

Sent off as the even-money favorite, Doo Wop Hanover finished eighth. The loss napped a four-race winning streak.



Anndrovette completed a big night for the Bamond stable

Anndrovette Surprises in the Golden Girls

"Never forget about Anndrovette" is likely what many bettors were

thinking after the 4-time Dan Patch Award winner produced a huge mile from post 10 to take the \$213,000 Golden Girls at odds of 36/1!

Expertly driven by Tim Tetrick, \$3 million earner Anndrovette blasted right off the gate to the front and led past a 26.0 quarter and 55.0 half, only to be overtaken by race favorite Sandbetweenurtoes heading to the far turn. With Rocklamation laboring first-over around the final turn and no one behind her gaining, it became obvious the race was down to three.

Sandbetweenurtoes turned first with both Anndrovette angling out of the pocket and Table Talk - who had a great covered trip throughout - angling out behind her. As Sandbetweenurtoes started to tire after a 1:49.1 mile, it was down to two and the \$3 million mare showed her class in the drive to the wire to hold the challenger at bay by about a 1/2 length.

Trainer Jeff Bamond, who had just combined with Tetrick to light up the board (\$36) the race previous with Mach It So in the William Haughton Memorial, noted that the extra distance may have helped his mare who has seemed to excel everywhere except The Meadowlands throughout her storied career.

"I think the mile-and-an eighth definitely helped her and you can never count her out," he remarked. "She was 1 for 15 here (before tonight), but I mean...she definitely surprises you."

Bamond mentioned that Anndrovette's win surprised him more than Mach It So's.

"Honestly, just because of the 10-hole and being 35/1," he explained. "She really surprised me, but she always does."

The 8-year-old daughter of Riverboat King surprised most on this night, returning \$74 for the win and combining with Table Talk for a \$552 exacta. The Dime Superfecta of 10-6-2-9 returned more than \$6,000...for a dime!

Anndrovette's 1 1/8th mile clocking of 2:02 4/5 was just 1/5 of a second off Doo Wop Hanover's World Record taken in a leg of the Graduate Series on June 18th.

He Cruzes Once Again By Garnet Barnsdale

If there was a shred of doubt left who the best trotter in



There's no stopping JL Cruze

North America is prior to tonight's Hambletonian Maturity it was surely erased by a Tour De Force performance by JL Cruze.

In rein to regular driver John Campbell, the 4-year-old Crazed gelding made a brush

from last-to-first on the backstretch and held his only challenger at bay while obliterating the World Record for a mile and an eighth in the \$443,300 event for 4-year-old trotters. JL Cruze in winning for the 16th time in 18 starts this year trotted the distance in 2:04.2, erasing by more than a full second the old record of 2:05.3 set by Your So Vain in this same event last year. It was the trotter's 12th straight

win.

The winner, a noted leaver, had been on top at the 1/2 in 8 of his past 10 races and no worse than 4th in the other two. Campbell explained the surprising strategy of dropping back to last early.

"They were trotting out of there hard the last two weeks and I just thought I was going to have to use him pretty hard the first part of it to get there," he said. "I was able to come down the backstretch when the pace had slowed a little bit and once he made the front he did the rest." Campbell added that he had no worries about the added 1/8th of a mile.

"Not really; he trots right down to the wire all the time and I wasn't that concerned about it," he noted. "But it's a tough group of horses and he's raced really hard the last three starts. I was more concerned about him keeping his form with the hard racing."

There were several lead changes in the race despite the compact field of six as Gural Hanover was set right to the front by Matt Kakaley at the outset. As that gelded son of Crazy hit the opening 1/4 in 26 1/5 he was already under attack from the lone mare in the field, Shake It Cerry, who was only a nose short of upsetting JL Cruze last week. But things would remain unsettled as Father Patrick was soon on the move and he made front at the 1/2 in 54 3/5. As Father Patrick tried to take a breather that's when the eventual race winner made his move with Resolve and driver Ake Svanstedt hot on his hooves.

As the field turned home, Resolve drew almost even with JL Cruze as they ticked the mile off in a sharp 1:50 1/5. JL Cruze began to pull away halfway down the lane then Resolve came again near the wire and made things interesting before succumbing to a valiant 1/2 length defeat. Pushed by Resolve the entire length of the stretch, JL Cruze dug down for a 14 1/5 final 1/8th to set the new record. Shake It Cerry finished a distant 3rd while big longshot Il Sogno Dream rallied for 4th. Gural Hanover faded to fifth and last year's start trotter Father Patrick - who has now only one win to show for 5 starts - faded to last, beaten more than 21 lengths.

Campbell wasn't surprised by Resolve's effort.

"He was very good last week and I knew he was a force to be reckoned with tonight," he commented. "He's getting better and better."

That may be true, but so too is JL Cruze who took his season's earnings over the \$600,000 mark for owners W Kenneth Wood, W J Dittmar Jr. and S J Iaquina with the victory after earning only \$26,000 from 14 starts last season.

Iaquina, not surprisingly, had high praise for his star trotter in the winner's circle.

"There's no quit in this horse," he said. "He's just unbelievable. Every week you think maybe he's going to get tired and every week he races better and better. "It's a dream come true. I keep thinking I'm going to wake up from this dream, but I don't."

JL Cruze returned \$4 to win.

Meadowlands Baby Race Report

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ – The Meadowlands Pace Day edition of Breakfast With The Babies got underway on a sloppy track for the first time all summer. A light breeze from the east dried the track as the day wore on and temperatures held in the 70's.

The day began with the Bee A Magician team, driver Dave Miller and trainer Nifty Norman, sending out first-timer Loveable Grace and having her return with a 1:59.3 mark. The Donato Hanover lass, a \$37,000 Harrisburg yearling buy for Mel Hartman and Pinske Stable, led at every call closing it out with a 28.1 final quarter. Amour Heiress was a good second beaten just a neck in her debut for Jimmy Takter.

Double Exposure took the same route for Tim Tetrick and Tony Alagna, a 1:59.3 winner in the second over Celebrity Eventsy. Another Donato filly in the 2:00 list here, a remarkable start for the sire this season. Brittany Farms and Mel Hartman are partners on Double Exposure, a \$50,000 Harrisburg grad.

An exceptionally athletic looking freshman colt trotter named Soderberg was a handy winner in his career debut for Takter. Settled in the pocket until the final bend, Jimmy tipped Soderberg from behind Threueupthreedown, gave him a clout to get his attention and wore down the leader with grim resolution in 2:01.2 / 29.2. The winner is a Muscle Hill colt purchased by Christina Takter, John & Jim Fielding, RAW Equine and Bud Hatfield at Harrisburg for \$70,000.

Takter came right back with the diminutive Muscle Hill colt Hillman to with the fourth in 2:00.1. Brushing to the lead up the backstretch, Hillman held off a battalion of closers in 29.1 for the win. Mrs. Takter and Brixton Medical own the colt who was a \$40,000 Lexington buy.

John Campbell drove BYOB to an impressive win for trainer John Butenschoen, going it virtually alone after the rest of the field broke early on. The SJ's Caviar colt went legit numbers and closed the 1:58.4 mile with a 29.3 final panel under quiet restraint. BYOB is owned by Mike Simons in partnership with Chris Giaccio, Al Abdala and Don Eccleston who parted with \$24,000 to get him at Harrisburg.

Graceful Vision impressed the panel of experts in attendance this morning, going the mile of the day in 1:54.2 for driver Marcus and trainer Erv Miller. The Yankee Cruiser filly cut the mile and drew away on her own to a double-digit score, the last half in 55.2 and quarter in 27 flat over the off going. She cost Erv but \$11,000 at Harrisburg and his phone will likely be ringing this afternoon.

Sam McSmith was a handy 1:56.2 winner for Scott Zeron and Tony Alagna in the seventh. The homebred McArdle colt rode along third through until the stretch and went by on his own when shown racetrack through the 28 flat final panel. Andray Farms and David Miller have been partners on Sam McSmith since he was foaled.

Trainer Tony Alagna fielded the entire superfecta in race eight, as was also the case in one of the pacing colt races last week. This time it was Tom Hill's eponymous American Ideal colt, coincidentally a brother to last year's Meadowlands Pace winner He's Watching, coming from just off the pace to win in 1:55.1 / 27.3 for Tetrick. Cedar Dunes

Autotune Hanover Wins Saturday 107g Final of Lawrence B. Sheppard Pace

YONKERS, NY (July 18, 2015) - After a couple of starts failing to grasp the "left foot, right foot" concept, Autotune Hanover (Tyler Buter, \$12) picked a good night to have a good night.

The \$120,000 son of Art Major turned in a solid, maiden-breaking effort Saturday night, winning Yonkers Raceway's \$107,500 final of the Lawrence B. Sheppard Pace for 2-year-old colts and geldings. It's the Raceway's premier "open" stakes event for first-season pacers.

Winning the draw in the field of seven colts and a lone (Armagic) gelding, "Autotune" stung 7-10 favorite Tailgunner Hanover (Ray Schnittker) a bit. Artmagic (Mark MacDonald), a 57-1 outsider, was also put in play early, resulting in a spiffy, 27-second opening quarter-mile.

"Tailgunner," one of two elimination winners a week ago, continued through a rated, :29.4 next subsection (:56.4 half). He took the gang down the backside before Autotune Hanover made his move.

It was decisive. Autotune Hanover rolled from third, getting past the non-resisting fave at the 1:26.1 three-quarters. He then opened a length-and-three-quarters turning for home, only to widen from there.

His closest pursuers had interesting trips. Do Over Hanover (Jason Bartlett), also an elim winner, was done no favors from the eight-hole and was out the entire mile. Rodeo Rock (Dan Dube), jammed in be the half while a handful to handle, extricated himself and appeared to impede Gleneagles (George Brennan).

Autotune Hanover's final margin was four lengths in 1:54.3, second-fastest Sheppard ever (Hail the Taxi's 1:54.1 in 2012). Rodeo Rock edged past "Do Over" for second, then survived an inquiry to stay there. War-N-Munn (Eric Goodell) and Endeavor (Pat Lachance) completed the cashers, while Artmagic, Tailgunner Hanover and Gleneagles rounded out the order.

For third choice Autotune Hanover, co-owned by (trainer) Mark Harder, Peter Paul Venturini, Deena Frost and Rick Phillips, it was that first win in three career starts. The exacta paid \$71, with the triple returning \$387.

"Mark (Harder) just told me to drive him with confidence," Buter said. "Last week (in elims), he went a bit sideways, but as soon as he hit the track tonight, he felt completely different. Mark said he changed some things up, and he was much better.

"These are 2-year-olds, after all."

Saturday's pair of \$48,000 Open Handicaps were won by eight-holers:

Trot: Melady's Monet (Bartlett, \$5) in 1:53.3, fastest local mile of the season;

Pace: Great Vintage (Dube, \$10) in 1:51.1.

drive, care for his or her horse for a race the following week and we all made a living. Not anymore. That's why so many of us small owners and trainers have left the business, never to return.

The attraction of harness racing used to be its participation by the common person; as opposed to the sport of (only) kings. Now, the common person can rarely be involved. Perhaps harness racing should go back to its roots and race in time bars. That would give every participating owner a chance to win an occasional race and make a living.

With the amount of dollars required to obtain and maintain a profitable racing operation it is imperative that racing maintains a certain minimum betting handle. It is also necessary that new customers continue to replace those that leave the sport. Harness Racing is failing in its attempt to develop new customers. Why is that, millennials are more intuitive, tech savvy and intelligent than their predecessors and the racetracks have failed to recognize and deal with these items.

The advent of the "special consideration" betting cartels and a lackadaisical consideration for integrity has also exasperated those fleeting customers. I'm frankly tired of seeing odds drastically fall after the horses reach the quarter pole and the tracks process the betting-cartel's dollars into the betting pools or hearing in the post-race interview that "When we go for the big money next week he'll be better and you'll forget this week" or he had a short week of training or he has a slight mucus or temperature problem.

These are problems under the control and purview of

those officials installed by the State Racing Commission. Every other major sport has an injury report. Why not horse racing? Make every trainer sign a statement that their horses are fit and they will race them at 100% of their ability -prior to each race. Next, why can't we have a zero tolerance on drug offenses? I've got to believe that honest trainers with clean horses would have no problem with this oversight.

If the good ole boys continue to do things the same old way they have been done in the past they will continue to lose market share to other past times. In closing, I see no reason why this industry is exempt from the same reporting guidelines as other sports. Why would an intelligent bettor think the integrity of this sport compares to those that have taken more appropriate steps?

Why Not...?

Why can't ADW customers bet the Twin Trifecta or other exchange ticket wagers?

The one area that online horse and greyhound racing area of potential huge increases in handle lies in the hands of the tote companies. Albeit they are in the business of handling wagers for a fee, I would love to see them do something that is already being handled by their computer programs; that is the exchange tickets in the Twin Tri and Tri Super wagers.

Take for example Palm Beach Kennel Club today. There is a force-out of these wagers periodically; some seem to be weekly or biweekly. Those days really see the pools grow.

In today's Twin Tri force-out, the race with the first half had over \$76,000 in it before the race crew loaded the dogs. All other wagers in the race had about \$15,000 (which is an average handle in the afternoon at PB). All those exchange wagers were at the track itself, an off track simulcast place, be it another race track, off track location or an ADW with phone wagering that can take the call to get the second half picks on the exchange ticket. What if you and I could wager via the computer (using the same technology that is currently in place for the mutuel tellers) instead of sitting by and just watching the race?

I think there are only two tote systems in the USA, AmTote and United Tote. I would love to see one of them have their computer programmer write the interface format so that we could bet into these larger if not largest pools available on a track's card.
