## **The Best Medicine**

Septuagenarians Keith Ross, 79, and Don McKirgan, 75, have conquered a series health challenges and say Ohio champion Like Old Times gets the credit for extending their lives and rekindling their partnership.

Racehorses aren't known for saving lives. However, some do get credit for extending lives. And a select few are even commended for inspiring or throwing a financial lifesaver to those who own or care for them.

Like Old Times, a four-year-old brown trotting mare, may be eligible on all counts for what she has done and continues to do for a pair of Buckeye septuagenarians.

Ohio's 2015 Horse of the Year races for breeder/owner Keith Ross, a 79-year-old businessman from Bellefontaine, OH and Don McKirgan, a 75-year-old trainer-driver based at Northfield Park.

Between the two of them, they have thoroughly tested the medical profession, tallying three arterial stents, two open heart bypass surgeries and a frightful case of Guillain-Barre

Syndrome.

Ross and McKirgan have met and conquered their physical challenges and they credit Like Old Times, a winner of 18 of 36 career starts and \$350,100, for keeping them healthy enough to continue reaching for condition and entry sheets.

"She has been good medicine for both of us," said Ross.
"She has added several years to our lives, at least four years, and maybe more."

Ross has the heart for it, having been the one who has undergone the extensive ticker repairs, including a visit to a Columbus area hospital just a few days before Like Old Times rolled to victory at Northfield Monday (July 18) in the featured \$13,500 open trot.

McKirgan has scored many an upset in his more than 50-year career, but he has never won at the toteboard melting price of 100,000-1. Those are the odds that a person will contract Guillain-Barre Syndrome, an inflammatory disorder of the nervous system that attacks a person's extremities.

The disease struck McKirgan in late 2003. It left him paralyzed for nearly a half a year.

"All I know is that it's named after a couple of French guys,"

said McKirgan. "I was unable to move, or even talk. All I could do was blink my eyes. When I beat it, I had to learn to walk, talk, even eat all over again. There is still numbness in my legs, but I'm getting along."

McKirgan not only had to rehabilitate himself, but his stable, too. Official United State Trotting Association statistics show that McKirgan had just three starters in 2004. They earned \$350.

His business remained slow for several years, which didn't go unnoticed by an old and longtime McKirgan client — Keith Ross.

"I was at the farm where my young horses were stabled (Marvin Raber's harness nursery in Baltic, OH) and I was looking at one of the young fillies I bred," said Ross. "I knew Don was down on his luck and that he and I had some very good years together.

"So I turned to Marvin and said, 'I'm going to name this one Like Old Times and give her to Don to train.' I was hoping that maybe we would get lucky, like in the old days."

McKirgan began training the daughter of Chip Chip Hooray out of the Royal Troubador mare Royal Two in preparation for her freshman campaign in 2014.

It wasn't long in the process before he called Ross.

"I answered the phone and Don said, 'Keith, this might be the best one I've ever had in my barn.' I told him, 'Don, don't give me that bull.' That's because I've heard that too many times from trainers and ended up selling the horse to the Amish."

But Like Old Times was too well-bred to end up pulling a buggy through the Ohio countryside.

Royal Two, her dam, raced just once, winning a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes race at two in 1998. Ross said she went lame the following week and was retired to the broodmare barn where she became a huge success.

Two of her sons, Cool Colby and Lucky Colby, full-brothers by Jailhouse Jesse, have each earned slightly less than \$250,000. Cool Colby was sharp enough to be the 2009 Ohio Sires Stakes two-year-old colt trotting champion.

McKirgan sensed that Like Old Times had the opportunity to be as good or even better than her half-brothers.

"She had perfect manners from the start," said McKirgan. "She is beautifully gaited and loves being out on the racetrack."

Like Old Times had a solid two-year-old campaign, winning three of 10 starts and \$64,105.

"It should have been better, but the mistakes we made was having too many different drivers on her," said McKirgan. "I think there were four of us. The problem is you don't get a feel for the horse."

Despite the musical sulkies, Like Old Times produced a huge effort in the \$200,000 Ohio Sires Stakes final.

"She got beat about a foot (actually two noses), but two feet past the wire she was two feet in front," said McKirgan.

There would be few disappointments last year for Like Old Times as she won 11 of 15 starts and \$250,860. Never worse than second in defeat, she avenged her Ohio Sires Stakes near-miss the previous year, rolling to an easy victory in the \$200,000 finale at Scioto Downs on Sept. 12.

"Ronnie Wrenn drove her in all but one of her starts," said Ross. "He's done a great job with her. The only time Ronnie couldn't drive her (a July 3 open at Scioto) I told McKirgan he should do it. He won a photo-finish, and at age 75."

Not only did Like Old Times earn Ross and McKirgan the OHSS title, she was voted the state's outstanding performer for 2015.

"She's my first Horse of the Year," said Ross. "She's made the most money of any horse I've owned, and I've never missed one of her races."

When he can't make it to the track to see her race (Northfield Park is nearly three hours from his home), Ross heads for Scioto Downs to watch live simulcasts of Like Old Times' performances.

"I usually meet some of my buddies from the Columbus area," said Ross. "But I've never bet a dime on her and never will."

Like Old Times is dealing with a much different menu of races this year. There is just one Ohio Sires Stakes race for older female trotters (Oct. 15 at Hollywood Dayton), meaning she must face all-comers, both male and female.

"She'll have to earn her money the hard way," said McKirgan. "We'll pick our spots, but we'll have to face the boys as well as the girls."

"Yes, it won't be easy," said Ross. "But I think she'll keep winning."

So far in 2016, Like Old Times has won four of 11 starts and \$35,135. She hasn't lost a step from last year's champion campaign. Her June 20 victory at Northfield Park in 1:55 was the fastest mile by a four-year-old female trotter in track history. She equaled the mark in winning last Monday at the suburban Cleveland oval.

"All I know is that she makes me want to get up in the morning," said Ross.

And McKirgan?

"She's the best I've ever had in my barn," he said. "I can't wait to get to work in the morning to train her."







## **Death By Fedora**

Waiting to pick up Lyft riders allows plenty of time to reinvent harness racing. I have more plans to help our sport in my glove compartment than the Republican party had candidates for the presidential nomination; most of them are more erudite than The Donald's. Let me pull one out for perusal:

To overstate the obvious, new blood for our old sport is hard to find. We need a transfusion. The game could be

improved, of this there is no doubt, but it is not just our game that keeps the young at bay. The bar that a newbie has to hurdle when first entering our game is very high.

Imagine that Elmo, one of my slacker friends, hangs up the video game to which he has dedicated much of his so-called life, Attack of the Plebian Hordes, Silver Swords Part Three. Elmo's doctor has suggested sunshine and a pastime easier on the eyes and ears.

Elmo is a smart guy with money. Chess strikes him as a fascinating test of skill and strategy. To get started, he learned

the basics of chess from a friend and went online to watch a few YouTube videos. Next, Elmo began to look for people to play against. Since he is not an idiot or a sadist, he will not challenge grandmasters; he will seek fellow novices for competition. If I was Elmo, I would look for kindergarteners to pummel.

If Elmo decides to take up the sport of harness racing, he will start against the best, the sharpest, the survivors, the computer nerds, the whales, the insiders and the cheaters. He will not compete against beginners or fools. He will pay, pay big time, for the privilege of playing against very tough competition. Unfortunately, kindergarteners available for

pummeling are rare in our sport.

The flocks of railbirds shrink every year, but the attrition is compounded by the fact that the reduced number of players makes the game more difficult for the remaining handicappers and owners and darn near impossible for a guy off the street who does not know a pacer from the Pillsbury Dough boy.

Today's harness race fans may be old but they are not dumb. Many have followed the horses for half a century and know their way around a race program or a sales catalogue. The veteran owners who have paid their dues in money and tears are trying to make lemonade out of a very dry lemon.

It has never been easy to make a profit wagering on horse racing. It may well be impossible to triumph over the horses; certainly my experiences have proved that financial success at the track is a forbidden land to which I do not have a passport. A few people swear to me that they have conquered the handicapping game, but then they walk out and get into a rusted 1997 Ford Pinto with a muffler dangling precariously from a coat hanger. And horse owners

making a killing are as rare as a Chicago Cubs fan holding a World Series ticket.

When crowds piled into Liberty Bell Raceway wearing fedoras and smoking unfiltered Camel Cigarettes, at least a few thousand of the patrons were less than brilliant when it came to placing wagers. Perhaps a hundred were the cream of the Liberty Bell handicapping crop.

Today, these 100 creamy guys are still around (these guys seem to live forever); the loose, dumb money is long gone. The absence of dumb money makes it very difficult for novices in the horse wagering and horse ownership games to learn the

craft. A lonely stranger entering harness racing is in for a long, serious thrashing from gnarly hands.

Doesn't it bug you to read babbling like this that points out problems and does not offer solutions?

Here is my balm for this obvious problem:

These days, the dumb gambling money gravitates to the slot machines and lotteries. That's fine, they are not our type, but there are a lot of these folks and we need a few of these people who long to senselessly lose their money to come to their senses. We need them in the horse race wagering pools and in the owner's boxes. Their expendable income would be



a welcome addition.

We have to ease some dumb money into our sport. Dumb money is still legal tender; it would be very welcome and the hope is that a smidgen of these dumb money players will see some logic in betting on horse races and join our choir.

To permit dumb money players access to our kingdom of the wise wager people, we must offer an entrance point. We have to give new players a place to play where they will not get pummeled. We need to let them crawl before running.

We need a wager that takes much of the thinking out of the betting on a harness horse race. There could be a site (on the Internet of course) where novice bettors can place a very simple bet much like the flip of a coin; a red or black casino choice. We need a place where new players do not need to over think things, a place where new horse gamblers would find the illusion that slot machine players operate under – they "win" often. Maybe after a hundred races or five hundred odd/even wagers, the new player has not been shredded financially and decides to slip over to a world where they try to figure out odd or even races with some logic. Then, maybe, some day in the future they will make the leap into real harness handicapping.

Let me get specific in my lunacy. Take a track that is on life support, maybe one from Michigan. Set up a season where every wager is odd or even. Get an outfit to take the wagers and to push and promote the new wagers on social media.

Start out fun, fast, easy to follow and dumb.

That's my motto.

I may get a tattoo.







## O'Sullivan records 1,000th training victory

Mayhem Seelster's first win of the season Friday was not only a big win for the three-year-old filly, but also a milestone victory for her conditioner.

Trainer Tony O'Sullivan picked up his 1,000th career win Friday (July 22) evening at Mohawk Racetrack.

The Cambridge, ON resident sent out sophomore pacing filly Mayhem Seelster in an \$18,000 overnight event and the daughter of Mach Three—Macapelo Rose came through with her first win of the season in a career best 1:51.3. Sylvain Filion steered the winner of \$244,000 to victory.

O'Sullivan, 40, has been a top trainer on the WEG circuit since breaking out on his own in 2004. The New Zealand native has sent out the winners of over \$1 million in earnings in 12 of 13 full seasons operating his own barn.

O'Sullivan has topped \$3 million in earnings on four occasions, including last season when his stable had 105 victories.

Operating a successful stable on both sides of the border, O'Sullivan's stable earned over \$1.1 million in the United States and over \$1.8 million in Canada last season (by Standardbred Canada accounting).

O'Sullivan has trained many notables over his career, including Breeders Crown winner Susies Magic, Adios winner Alsace Hanover and Ontario star Love Canal.

This season, O'Sullivan has sent out the winners of 56 races and over \$1 million. He currently ranks third in the Mohawk meet trainer standings with 20 wins.

## Southwind now freezing Googoo Gaagaa's semen

World champion Googoo Gaagaa (3, 1:504f (\$665,339) (Cam's Rocket – Kora's Trotter – Veeba Rova) has joined world champion Muscle Hill and Muscle Hill's stakes-winning son, EL Titan at Southwind Farms in Pennington, NJ for freezing semen for European and Southern Hemisphere export.

For the 2016 season the pacing-bred trotter stood at owner Richard Hans farm in Maryland.

Muscle Hill stood in Pennsylvania at Marion Farms for the 2016 season and EL Titan stood at Tara Hills Stud in Ontario. Both stallions have returned to Southwind after their respective breeding seasons have concluded.

Southwind Farms, along with Walnridge Equine Clinic, Cream Ridge, New Jersey, have been certified by the USDA for freezing semen for export. Southwind has been certified for over 15 years and now welcomes outside stallions to our facility for freezing.

## Campbell schools Kindergarten foes at Big M

As the all-time earnings leader in harness racing history, John Campbell has guided and won with many favorites.

But Friday night (July 22) at the Meadowlands in the Kindergarten Series for 2-year-olds, he made his fans jump for joy after steering two longshots to the winner's circle.

Campbell scored with Sunshine Delight in the filly trot at odds of 11-1 and paid \$25.60 to win, completing the mile in 1:56.3 for trainer Staffan Lind and owner James Wilhite Jr.

Saving his best for last, Campbell guided 39-1 chance Muscles Jared (\$80.40) to victory lane in the colt and gelding trot in 1:56.1 for trainer George Ducharme and owner Alfred Ross.

Chalk players were not left out in the cold on this extremely warm night, however, as Fly On (\$2.10, 1:55.3, colt and gelding trot), Grandma's Moni (\$4.60, 1:55.2, filly trot) and Rubio (\$2.20, 1:56.1, colt and gelding trot) scored in the other Kindergarten divisions.

FROM WAY BACK: Fashion Creditor scored in the overnight

feature, a \$17,500 conditioned trot in the most exciting race all night, when five horses were less than a length apart at the wire.

The Tom Fanning trainee, who was driven by Brett Miller, was up in a driving finish after racing in a fifth-over flow at three-quarters. The 4-year-old gelded son of Credit Winner completed the mile in 1:52.2 and paid \$28.40 to win. Rules Of The Road, sent off at 14-1, finished a nose back in second.

**CARRY ON:** The 5th race 20 cent Jackpot Super High Five failed to produce a single-ticket winner, upping the carryover to \$38,241.19 for the next program... Despite a smaller than usual pool in the 13th race finale, all-source wagering totaled \$2,468,369... Racing resumes at the Big M Saturday at 7:15 p.m.

## Givenupdreaming wins Paul Bunyan in track record time

Givenupdreaming shattered the track record at Bangor Raceway with a dominating five-and-three-quarter length victory in the 23rd edition of the \$22,500 Paul Bunyan Invitational Pace on Friday evening (July 22).

Sent off the gate from post five by Stephane Bouchard, Givenupdreaming battled past A Sweet Ride and Eddie Davis Jr., who left from post four, into a :27.2 opening panel. Givenupdreaming continued to lead the way through middle splits of :55.3 and 1:23.2 before drawing away from his competition to stop the clock in 1:51.2. The five-year-old son of If I Can Dream—Ain't Given Up lowered the Bangor track record by one second and one-fifth.

Escape The News and Ron Cushing launched first over from third approaching three-quarters to finish in second-place and Bet You followed in third for driver Heath Campbell. Race Me Villa, A Sweet Ride, Northern Companion, and Governor's Plate champion YS Lotus completed the finish order.

Heidi Rohr trains the winner for Maine owner Marc Reynolds and partners Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. The victory was the seventh from 18 starts this year for Givenupdreaming, who had taken a mark of 1:49.3 two starts ago in an open event at Plainridge. The 4-5 race favorite paid \$3.60 to win.

## Three divisions of Incredible Tilly contested at Hawthorne

On another warm Friday (July 22) evening in the Chicagoland area, three divisions of leg three of the Incredible Tillie Stakes were contested. The Incredible Tillie is for Illinois-bred 2-year-old filly pacers.

The first division went as race seven over a fast track as Princess Sage was sent away as the favorite.

Leaving for the lead was Princess Sage as she made the top easily through the opening quarter of :28.3. On the backside, the 1-5 favorite maintained her lead for driver Freddie Patton Jr. through the half in :58.3. On the turn Princess Sage opened a five-length lead through three-quarters in 1:27.0. In the stretch Princess Sage shortened, but held on by a 1-1/2 lengths in 1:56. Fox Valley Charliz closed for second while Pinstripe Pants finished third.

Owned by Keli Jo Bell and Freddie Patton, Jr. and trained by Freddie Patton, Jr., Princess Sage paid \$2.60, \$2.10, and \$2.10. Fox Valley Charliz paid \$4.60 and \$3.20 while Pinstripe Pants returned \$3.00 to show.

The second division of the Incredible Tillie had a full field of 10 as Fox Valley Honor was bet down to favoritism off a 30-1 morning line. Making the lead early was Filly Forty but was quickly pressed by My Mona Me through the quarter in :29.1. On the backside, Razzleme Dazzleme took over through the half in :59.2. After three-quarters in 1:28.2, Razzleme Dazzleme led the field into the lane. Mid-stretch, a row of four came to challenge but Razzleme Dazzleme and driver Kyle Husted held everyone off, stopping the clock in 1:56.4. Hope Hotspur finished second while Dandy's Dududiddudu was third.

Owned by Derek and Amy Jacobus and trained by Nick Prather, Razzleme Dazzleme paid \$15.80, \$6.80 and \$5.00. Hope Hotspur paid \$4.80 and \$3.80. Dandy's Dududidudu returned \$3.00 to show.

The third division of the Incredible Tillie had another full field of ten as My Kind of Dance took the majority of the wagering action. At the start, A Real Doozie moved to the lead but Jump Right quickly took over through the quarter in :29.0. On the backside, Just Doit Queeny assumed command through the half in :59.2. On the turn A Real Doozie moved to challenge Just Doit Queeny through three quarters in 1:28.2. In the lane favored My Kind of Dance and Casey Leonard ranged up to challenge as they were three across. At the wire, My Kind of Dance prevailed by a neck over A Real Doozie. Just Doit Queeny finished third.

Owned by Adrian Adam and trained by Alex Adam, My Kind of Dance paid \$3.00, \$2.40, and \$2.60. A Real Doozie returned \$9.80 and \$6.40 while Just Doit Queeny paid \$2.60 to show.

## Battle elimination races set at Grand River Raceway

On Monday night (July 25), 16 colts and 20 fillies will vie for a spot on center stage of Grand River Raceway's marquee event, Industry Day.

While the 26th edition of the horse racing industry celebration is on Aug. 1, finalists in the \$139,500 Battle Of Waterloo and \$92,800 Battle Of The Belles will be decided on July 25, as the Elora, ON track hosts a total of five elimination rounds.

BATTLE OF WATERLOO: Two elimination divisions of the Battle Of Waterloo (for Ontario-sired two-year-old pacing colts) are carded for races four and eight. The top four finishers from each division, plus one of the two fifth-place finishers (as determined by draw) will advance to the Aug. 1 final of the 19th annual Battle Of Waterloo.

Past Battle Of Waterloo-winning trainers Ian Moore, Bob McIntosh, and Gregg McNair have one hopeful in each of the two divisions.

Trainer Blake MacIntosh also has two contenders: Brave World from post seven in race four, and Sports Column in race eight. The Sportswriter—Lady Leslie colt holds the current North American season's record for his 1:52.1 maiden win over Mohawk Racetrack on July 4. On July 16, he was second by a neck to Happy Trio, who will start to his left, from post one, in Monday's Battle elimination division.

Happy Trio won that OSS Gold division at Mohawk Racetrack in 1:53.2m bumping his career earnings to \$79,870 in three starts. He is conditioned by trainer Tony O'Sullivan who also campaigns the outside starter in the first division, Calvin K, a North American season's record-setter with a 1:52.3 triumph in his second career win on July 4 at Mohawk Racetrack.

Silverinyourpocket (R4 #3) is the morningline favorite in the first division for Canada's leading money-winning trainer, Richard Moreau, of Puslinch, ON. The Badlands Hanover—Filly's Victory colt is fresh off a 1:53.3 win in OSS Grassroots action at Mohawk Racetrack with driver Sylvain Filion.

Although he enters race eight with less experience than the competition, Dreamfair B J set a Canadian season's record for a freshman colt over a half-mile track when he won his lone qualifying race at Grand River Raceway on July 13 for trainer Patrick Fletcher and driver Phil Hudon. Dreamfair B J is bred and owned by John Lamers, who won the 2001 edition of the Battle Of Waterloo with Dreamfair Vogel.

BATTLE OF THE BELLES: Three elimination divisions of the Battle Of The Belles (for Ontario-sired two-year-old pacing fillies) are carded for races one, two and six. The top three finishers from each division will advance to the final of the 8th annual Battle Of The Belles on Aug. 1.

Past Battle Of The Belles-winning trainers Gregg McNair and Stephen Gillard each have one campaigner in Monday's elims.

Eddie Green has a pair of hopefuls, including Canadian season record-holder Warrawee Speedy. Her maiden win in 1:57.1 over Hiawatha Horse Park on June 18 remains the quickest of the season over a five-eighths oval. She will start from the rail in the third division (Race 6) with Green in the bike.

Village Jamie will start from post four in the second division for Green. The Mach Three—Village Jest miss is a

half-sister to the 2010 Battle Of The Belles champ, Village Janus.

Mike Weller trains the 8-5 morningline favourite in the first division, Aint Three OK. The Mach Three—Ain't Given Up daughter was scratched sick in last week's OSS Gold division at Mohawk Racetrack. She was second by a neck two weeks before, with Trevor Henry, who pilots her from post five on Monday.

**POST POSITION DRAW:** Starting positions for the finals of the Battle Of Waterloo and Battle Of The Belles will be determined during a post position draw which will be conducted and broadcast live following race nine on July 25.

Grand River Raceway's Industry Day Celebration on Aug. 1 features an 11-race card that also includes racing under saddle, consolation races for the Battles, and a Gold Leg for three-year-old pacing fillies in the Ontario Sires Stakes. Festivities and the TV broadcast kick off at 1:00 p.m. Post time for the first race is 1:30 p.m.


