Campbell on coming full circle, closing out career in Clinton

One week from today, the most successful driver in harness racing history will close out his career with a drive in the \$15,000 Legends Day Trot at Clinton Raceway close to where it all started... and he couldn't be happier.

John Campbell made his mark over the last 40 years on a big-city New Jersey track in the shadow of New York City, but he said he couldn't pick a better ending to his Hall of Fame driving career than to do it one week from today (July 30) at Legends Day in Clinton, Ontario (pop. 3,200).

"It just feels good to me to end up in Ontario, not far from where I started and in front of a number of people who were there when I started driving back in the spring of 1972," Campbell said Thursday. "It feels like full circle for me and kind of apropos."

On July 1, Campbell, 62, became president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society that owns and operates a number of major stakes races including the Hambletonian and the Breeders Crown series. He said ending his driving career close to where it started wasn't orchestrated, it just happened organically.

"It just worked out. When I started talking to the (Hambletonian Society) executive committee and (former president) Tom Charters, I wasn't long into it when I thought to myself, 'Clinton is going to be my last drive.' So I knew in the back of my mind, from the very early conversations with

the Hambletonian Society, that it was going to work out that way. I was quite happy about that.”

Campbell, the most successful driver in the sport's history by most measures, grew up near Ailsa Craig, ON in the farming community of Nairn west of the city of London that is home to The Raceway at The Western Fair District. Three generations of his family have raced horses in rural Ontario for nearly 100 years.

Though Campbell never raced at Clinton Raceway as a younger man, he did often race horses in nearby Goderich and earned his first career driving victory at Western Fair in 1972. But his roots in the area go much deeper through his father, Jack, and his grandfather, Dunc Campbell, who is also a member of the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

In 1923, just 30 kilometres southeast of Clinton on Highway 8, Dunc, raced his first horse at the Mitchell Fair and won. Teddy Mac, a five-year-old pacer Dunc purchased for \$55, made a break in the second heat that afternoon and was disqualified, but Dunc sold him the next day for \$400 and soon acquired Teddy Mac's sister, Hazel Mac, who produced the family's great foundation mare, Babe Grattan.

Dunc's son, Jack, made an equally impressive debut with horses 21 years later just 20 minutes further down Highway 8. That day in 1944, as war consumed much of the world, 13-year-old Jack Campbell hitched a ride 60 kilometers from the Campbell family farm near Ailsa Craig to Stratford to prep Babe Grattans Boy to race. Jack returned home triumphantly that night with a pocket full of cash for his father.

John said he knows the old stories well. “It was just part of our fabric, to talk about the horses and the ones we had,” he said. “It was a neighbor that lived over on another block that got my grandfather interested in the horses. He told me lots of stories about how he started and figuring it out as he went, racing all afternoon to win three heats to win,” John said. “He raced five heats one day and the money he made just meant the world to him at that time.

“My dad and my grandfather were basically farmers, who fooled with horses. When I came along, I wanted nothing to do with the farming and all I wanted to do is be around the horses from the time I could walk. That was the difference in them and myself. I just thought (farming) was such hard work – not that the horses weren't hard – but I basically just fell in love with horses... and wanted to be around them.”

It was at the Campbell homestead on Argyle Road that John and his younger brother, Jim, learned not just horsemanship from Jack and Dunc, but lessons on life, hard

work and, above all, family.

In those early years on that farm, young John Campbell would often play out his greatest racing fantasies from the seat of a broken sulky he tied to a pump with binder twine. When John was six, his mom, Florence, made him a set of his own colours to wear while riding on Jack's lap when Babe Grattan, then 31, led the post parade at Western Fair.

Campbell said the fans are incredible at Legends Day.

Though John got his start racing in London, Windsor and Toronto, he truly made his mark on the sport when he moved to the Meadowlands Racetrack in New Jersey in the late 1970s, shortly after the mega-track opened. From his base in the state, where he still lives with his wife Paula, John piled up unprecedented results. He has recorded 234 major stakes victories, his 10,668 victories currently ranks ninth all-time, and some \$300 million in purses is not only tops in the sport by a wide margin, it is \$84 million more than the next closest man – fellow Legends Day attendee David Miller. As a point of reference, when compared with thoroughbred racing, John has earned more than every jockey in history except all-time leader John Velazquez.

Among numerous career honours, John has been inducted in Canada's Sports Hall of Fame, the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame, the U.S. Harness Racing Hall of Fame, the London Sports Hall of Fame and has received special awards from both the government of Canada and the state of New Jersey. He will be inducted into the Ontario Sports Hall of Fame this fall.

Before hanging up his famous white, maroon and blue racing colours for a final time, Campbell wanted to honour a commitment he made long ago to drive at Legends Day, a biennial event started in 2001 that features a group of the sport's biggest stars racing against each other, signing

autographs for fans and joining in on a popular banquet that in 2015 fed more than 1,000 people in a trackside tent.

Clinton Raceway general manager Ian Fleming said he is deeply honoured John's last drive will come at Clinton Raceway with all proceeds from the day being donated to the Clinton Public Hospital Foundation.

"It's great," Fleming said. "Legends Day has always been our biggest day since we started it. So, it was a big day for us to start with and now with it being the last drive for John, it makes it even more exciting. We're honoured he's decided to make Clinton his last stop."

John's final drive will come in the \$15,000 Legends Day Trot against Miller and fellow superstars Bill O'Donnell – who is also retiring that day – Mike Lachance, Ron Waples, Doug Brown, Steve Condren and Dave Wall. Combined, the eight legends have earned over \$1.15 billion and won nearly 69,000 races.

It wasn't until the inaugural Legends Day in 2001 that John drove for the first time at Clinton Raceway. He said he was instantly hooked and has been back every two years since.

"It's been a privilege to be a part of every Legends Day since they started it and it's the fans," John said. "Ian (Fleming) does a tremendous job of putting it on. He's evolved with Legends Day, but it all comes back to the reaction that all of us get from the fans. It's really special..."

You get a variety of people and a variety of reasons for why they are there, but it's all positive."

As a man that places family above all else, John said he's looking forward to his entire family being at Clinton on July 30 – his mother, his wife, their three daughters and their families, his sister Jo-Ann McLinchey and her family and their brother, Jim, a successful horse trainer in his own right.

"My whole family is coming up from New Jersey to go to Clinton. It's going to be a great family gathering for us, as well," John said, adding that his late father loved Legends Day and would have beamed to know it would be the site of John's last drive.

"He'd say, 'Well, that's just great,'" John said.

As for the end of his driving career, John said he's not looking back with any melancholy.

I'm very content in my decision," he said, adding – as one might expect from a man that topped them all – that he would love to go out a winner – as he did with wins in his final two drives at the Meadowlands on June 30 and his final drive in the United States on July 2 in the Hall of Fame Trot at Goshen Historic Track in New York. Can he make it four straight wins to close out his career? It's wise not to bet against him.

"I've raced against all of these guys before and if they give me anything, it'll be the first time and I'm not expecting it," John said, "(but) I'm going up to (Clinton to) win."

Two things on the (very) short list of things I don't hate – Clinton and John Campbell

Everywhere I look there are things to hate: passport photos, 88 per cent humidity, self-serve grocery store check-out machines, which always seem to have an employee Johnny-on-the-spot to tell you that you did it wrong, but not actually to help check you out.

I'm getting too old for all of this. I like consistency and predictability, especially in the people and places that I encounter.

All I'm asking for is someone who makes eye contact with his eyes and good sense with his mouth, which is why I'm going to miss John Campbell when he hangs them up next weekend at Clinton Raceway.

Campbell, now that's consistency. In close to 40 years, never did I have to wonder whether I'd check into a simulcast to all of a sudden see JC trying out a goatee. Just like I never had to worry that I wasted a bet on him or that I didn't get my money's worth from one of his drives. Good people.

Cripes, my kids cut their teeth playing the John Campbell board game. Who needs the Game Of Life or Monopoly, when the Campbell game gave you both in one roll-up tube? I still remember the lump in my throat when my then nine-year-old daughter Beckie chided her brother for setting such slow opening quarters.

Since I have an opinion on just about everything, you won't be surprised to learn that I have a few thoughts about little Clinton, Ontario, too, the spot Campbell has chosen for his last drive.

Back in the days before you needed a passport to cross into our Canadian neighbor's yard, we'd go visit my wife Bernie's aunt Florence for a few weeks every summer at her cottage on the shores of Lake Huron in Bayfield, Ontario.

About 10 minutes inland sits Clinton, with a population sign that hasn't changed from 3,200 in decades. Some smartass on its Wikipedia page recently updated it to 3,201, but you get the gist.

Since I'm not much for the dampness by the lake and the

sound of delighted children playing in the sand, I would always cruise into Clinton and spend my Sunday afternoon with my people at the local racetrack.

And it's a beaut, that half-miler, with that pretty red barn on the hill. That barn was home to Breeders Crown champion Lifetime Dream back in the early '90s and, boy, did those Clinton folk turn up at Mohawk the night she won it. Sometimes the little guys win big. I don't hate that.

Just up the street from that red barn is the REACH Centre, a showcase-type place for horse and agriculture events, like various horse shows, barrel racing and civilian service horse school. You can even enroll in college and university level equine courses there. If you're feeling shmancy on John Campbell Day – I hear there's also an Arabian Horse Club Show taking place over there.

Above all, Clinton is a place that I can respect. This little town was the primary radar training site for Canadian, U.S. and U.K. servicemen throughout WWII and the Cold War.

Over the past few years, the town has taken its licks with two separate fires knocking out chunks of buildings on both sides of its historic main street, but these folks keep ticking.

There's two high schools, two stop lights and basically three public places to score a drink – The Royal Canadian Legion, the Huron Fish And Game Club, and the racetrack/slot hall. Frankly, to my way of thinking, these are the only three worthwhile places to drink anyway – toasting a hero, toasting venison pepperettes or toasting a winning tri.

Sure, they've got Tim Hornuts like every other Canadian Tom, Dick and Harry town, but my money goes to main street stalwart Bartliff's Bakery. I've gotten into many an argument over whether my black, black coffee is better complemented with Bartliff's apple pie or a hot cross bun, but the real magic is something called a 'mocha circle'. Yep, sounded pretty floofy to me, too, at first, but take my word for it.

Cross the street and head up a few blocks and you'll find Marita's Fashion Boutique, where my wife and daughter like to shop for pretty things.

Now, I'm the guy that usually sits outside the store holding my wife's purse, but this is one place where I tag along because I get to talk horses there, too. You see, Marita's is owned by a spry young lady by the name of Jess Carnochan, who is also the marketing manager at Clinton Raceway.

So, yeah, I guess there are two things I like, Campbell and Clinton. I'll be there on July 30 and I even renewed my passport for it... which I hated.

Opinion**Time for owners' colors, and the Hambletonian is the place to start***by Bill Finley*

When the field lines up behind the gate for this year's Hambletonian, it's quite possible that nine horses will be carrying the colors of their driver and one, International Moni, will be racing under the colors of its owner, the Antonacci family's Lindy Farms. Let's hope this turns out to be more than a one-and-done gimmick and that the Antonacci family has spearheaded a new tradition for the sport and its most prestigious trotting event. May this be the last Hambletonian where any driver wears his colors and not those of the horses' owners.

The sport needs to do everything it can to attract new owners and keep the ones it has in the game. Letting them see their own colors in the winner's circle is no small thing. It's an ego rush that can be just as important as the victory and the purse check. I'm for the sport converting entirely to the thoroughbred model, where jockeys always wear the silks of the owners, but realize that's not going to happen overnight. The Antonaccis' idea needs a push to keep up the momentum and new Hambletonian Society President and CEO John Campbell needs to pick up the ball. As one of his first official acts in his new job, he should announce that starting in 2018 all drivers in the Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks will be required to wear the colors of the owner. That's just the sort of thing that could open the door for the sport to change a tradition that needs to go.

According to the Hambletonian Society's jill-of-all-trades Moira Fanning there is nothing in the Hambletonian's rules or New Jersey racing regulations that prevent horses from racing in the colors of the owner and not the driver.

"It's something we're going to give a shot and I encourage other owners to do the same," trainer Frank M. Antonacci told HRU when the colors story broke last month. "To me, it just makes sense. Do I think every overnight is going to have guys with owner colors? No. But the places where we showcase our sport and showcase our breed, why wouldn't owners and farms demand that these guys wear these colors? It's their horses, their product and it's the greatest billboard you can have for your brand — your winning horse."

The Antonaccis are part of the thoroughbred ownership group Ice Wine Stable, so they have experienced firsthand the thrill of seeing their team's silks cross the wire first and then enter the winner's circle at such prestigious tracks like Gulfstream Park and the Saratoga thoroughbred track. Thoroughbred owners tend to be very proud of their silks and what they represent, so much so that they can become a major issue. Simon Callaghan was fired as the trainer of the top 3-year-old filly Abel Tasman, the winner of the Kentucky Oaks, over a mixup about what colors the horse wore in the

Santa Ysabel Stakes earlier this year at Santa Anita. Co-owned by the China Horse Club and Clearsky Farms, she showed up in the Clearsky silks in the Santa Anita race when the co-owners had agreed that she would wear the China Horse Club colors. The China Horse Club syndicate was so miffed it demanded that Callaghan be fired. He was replaced by trainer Bob Baffert.

You might think that the China Horse Club overreacted, but that's not the point. The Abel Tasman foul-up goes to show just how important something as simple as a pair of silks can be to people. That particular ownership group has invested millions into the business and they were not pleased when one of their best horses showed up in a big race with the jockey wearing someone else's silks.

When owners get into either game, thoroughbred or standardbred racing, they know they're probably not going to make any money. They stay involved for the thrills, the excitement, and the pride that comes with accomplishing a victory. When it happens in thoroughbred racing, people want to see their banner, which is their silks, flying high. Why wouldn't they?

"Obviously, I would love to see our colors and all harness owners be represented with their own colors," said Richard Munk, whose Funky Munky stable races both breeds. "I think it would make the sport more fun. You get a bigger thrill in thoroughbreds because of the silks. Doing something like that in harness racing could help attract more owners and anything you can do for owners is beneficial to the sport."

Fanning pointed out that, in addition to International Moni, there are precedents for drivers to wear the owners' colors. When driving, Jacqueline Ingrassia wears the colors of owner Arden Homestead and in Sweden top owners like Courant AB will sometimes have the drivers wear the stable colors.

Drivers are an important part of the sport but they are not as important as owners. There's no reason whatsoever that they, and not the owner, should get the glory that comes from winning a race in one's own uniform. Making the change isn't going to make thousands of new owners flock to the sport, but it would do a little something to make it more fun to own a harness horse. That's important.

International Moni, who raced last night at the Meadowlands in the Lindy colors, is being pointed for the Hambletonian. Should he make it, regular driver Scott Zeron will put aside his own red, white and blue colors and wear the black, blue and white that represent Lindy. Zeron is one of the best young drivers in the sport, but I hope to never see his colors, or those of any driver, in the Hambletonian again.

Huntsville, Fear The Dragon win Adios elims despite tough trips

Huntsville and Fear The Dragon had to work much harder in the slop than overwhelming favorites would like, yet each was game enough Saturday to capture an elimination of the 51st edition of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids at The Meadows.

They'll be joined in next Saturday's \$400,000 Adios final by Blood Line, Miso Fast, RJP, Western Hill, Eddard Hanover, Hurricane Beach and Highalator, who advanced as the fifth-place finisher with higher career earnings.

The Adios final anchors a blockbuster card that begins at noon and features six Grand Circuit stakes.

Coming off a narrow victory in the Meadowlands Pace, Huntsville was parked for Tim Tetrick from post 7, finally reaching the top at the three-eighths. He still couldn't relax, as he faced stern challenges from Highalator outside and the menacing Blood Line in the Lightning Lane. But the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Wild West Show was up to the task, holding off Blood Line by a neck in 1:49.3, with the rallying Miso Fast third.

"When you go a half in :53 on an off track, you're always concerned," Tetrick said. "It's not really what I wanted to do. I thought I would get a spot in the first turn, but it closed up. But he got it done, and he's going to the final. Hopefully it didn't take too much out of him. I was trying to save as much as I could — that's why I didn't open it up. He was awesome. He got brutalized to the half, and he got the job done. The horse raced super."

With the win, the Ray Schnittker trainee now has banked \$1,316,665 for owners Ted Gewertz, Steven Arnold and Schnittker. Huntsville has finished first or second in all 19 of his career starts.

Fear The Dragon, who last raced July 1 when he won the final of the Max Hempt, waited patiently in third before David Miller sent him after the leader, Hurricane Beach. Under unexpected urging from Miller, the son of Dragon Again—Armbro Cinnamon finally overtook Hurricane Beach in the lane and prevailed in 1:50.3, a half-length better than the closing Western Hill. Eddard Hanover was third.

While it was a successful, determined performance from a colt who has won eight of nine starts this year, winning trainer Brian Brown characterized it as "a little dull."

"Normally, when David pulls him and pulls the plug, he's really pacing forward," Brown said. "But David was chasing, he was working to make him go. I hope he was just a little short and needed the race. I'll check everything out — scope and pull blood and do all the normal stuff. I hope everything checks out; if not, we'll fix whatever it is."

Brown later reported that a post-race examination found an insignificant amount of mucous in the horse's lungs. Emerald Highlands Farm campaigns Fear The Dragon, who extended his lifetime bankroll to \$952,844.

The connections of Huntsville and Fear The Dragon won the right to select their post positions for the final — Brown indicated he would prefer post 3 or 4 but would leave the choice to Miller — with the other slots chosen by random draw. That draw is set for Tuesday (July 25), 12:30 p.m., and will be available on Meadows Live! and at meadowsgaming.com. Trainer Ron Burke, who started six in the eliminations, saw three of his charges make it through: Miso Fast, RJP and Eddard Hanover.



Done Well remains undefeated with PASS victory at The Meadows

Done Well did well again, extending his career unbeaten streak to three with an impressive win in Saturday's \$159,165 Pennsylvania Sires Stake (PASS) at The Meadows. The event for freshman colt and gelding pacers, known as the Albatross, was contested over three divisions, with Closing Statement and Pedro Hanover taking the other splits. All three were bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and Tim Tetrick enjoyed a PASS double behind Done Well and Pedro Hanover.

Done Well had won two stakes with mid-pack moves, but Tetrick sent him to the front from post 8. It took the entire first quarter for him to pocket Karpathian Kid, but he easily kept him there to down him by two lengths in a stake-fastest 1:52 over a sloppy surface. Better Watch Out earned show.

The victory contributed to a big day for winning trainer Brian Brown, whose top-ranked 3-year-old, Fear The Dragon, won an Adios elimination later in the card.

"We've had lots of horses in the past who looked great and trained down great," Brown said of the son of Well Said—Dagnabit Hanover. "But this one has never disappointed us. We've loved him from the beginning."

James Stambaugh, Wingfield Brothers, Milt Leeman and

Alan Keith campaign Done Well, a \$45,000 yearling acquisition.

Closing Statement also was stuck outside during his first panel, but he was strong enough to hold off the previously undefeated Kwik Talkin by a length in 1:52.4 for David Miller. Early leader Lucky Leonard completed the ticket.

"I wasn't worried about the first quarter," said Joe Holloway, who conditions the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Ideal Newton, a \$120,000 yearling acquisition for Val D'Or Farms, Rojan Stables and Ted Gewertz. "I thought that was just David waiting until things settled down."

Pedro Hanover broke stride from post 8 in his last start, yet rallied strongly outside to finish third. He was flat and even more powerful from post 8 in the Albatross, plucking off horses to score in 1:52.2 for trainer Andrew Harris and owners Brad Gray and Denise Guerriero.

"That break last time, that was just some green stuff," Tetrick said. "He showed what he could do."

Dave Palone and Tetrick each collected four wins on the 15-race card.

Gabbysloosechange pays her way for Beaver family

Ohio-based trainer Chris Beaver, along with his parents, Charles and Johanna Beaver, have enjoyed much success over the years with homebred trotters and the three-year-old filly trotter, Gabbysloosechange, is adding to that success. What makes her story unique is how the daughter of Triumphant Caviar—Gabby's Creditcard came back to the Beaver Stable.

"My parents sold her at the Ohio Selected (Jug) Sale. The owners couldn't get her to go, so they sent her to the Amish," said Chris Beaver. "Since she was the first foal (out of Gabby's Creditcard) we wanted to get her back, so we found her and bought her back.

"She went to Florida and my dad got her to trot. He deserves all the credit, he's the one that figured her out."

Unraced at two, Gabbysloosechange now has five wins and has amassed \$68,500 in just seven career starts and sits atop

the Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS) points standings for three-year-old filly trotters.

The Beaver family has a long history with the maternal side of Gabbysloosechange. The Beavers owned and bred the dam, Gabby's Creditcard (\$135,694), the second dam Lotstoliveupto (\$147,038) and the third dam, Looklikenorma (\$219,242).

"Her pedigree goes all the way back to my grandfather (Henry) and Success Norma (a foal of 1962)," said Beaver.

On the paternal side, the 45 year-old Beaver trained her sire, Triumphant Caviar (\$796,794), who finished second in the 2009 Breeders Crown Final behind Muscle Hill and established a new world record in the Old Oaken Bucket at the Delaware County Fair.

"(Triumphant Caviar) has shown the ability to throw some nice foals," said Beaver.

Triumphant Caviar has produced 13 \$100,000 earners in his first three seasons at stud.

Beaver hopes Gabbysloosechange will be the next name added to that list.

She made her career debut at Miami Valley Raceway on April 10 with a solid second-place finish, beaten by just a length and a quarter and timed in 1:59.3.

A week later she broke her maiden in 1:57.2.

She would face much tougher competition in the first leg of the Ohio Sires Stakes at Miami Valley Raceway on May 1. Piloted by Dan Noble, Gabbysloosechange was parked for most of the mile, but gutted out a two-length victory in 1:57.2.

She took the second leg of the OHSS at Northfield Park on June 17 in a lifetime best 1:54.4.

Gabbysloosechange remained undefeated in OHSS with another first-over effort in the third leg at Scioto Downs on July 14.

"She doesn't strike you as a great horse when she trains. She only does what she has to," said Beaver. "In a race, she likes to grind. She likes it on the outside. I think she needs to see someone next to her."

By winning the first three OHSS legs, Gabbysloosechange is assured a spot behind the gate for the \$250,000 Ohio

Sires Stake final on Sept 3. Beaver may find himself very busy that night as he currently has two other sophomore filly trotters that he trains and co-owns in the top eight in the points standings – Chim Swift (\$148,770) and Bamaslastchance (\$102,861).

"We don't have any real superstars in the stable, just a lot of nice horses," said Beaver. "Nothing jumps off the page right now, but several are real close."

Beaver currently trains 40 head at his farm in Radnor, OH, just 10 minutes north of the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

Due to the late start of Gabbysloosechange, her future stakes engagements are limited.

"I want to race her in an overnight next week, then we have the Ohio State Fair (August 4), the final Ohio Sires Stakes leg (Aug. 25), the OHSS final (Sept. 2) and the Ohio Breeders Championship (Sept. 18)," said Beaver.

Stutzman's Schnitzledosomethin turning heads

The winner of the Indiana Sires Stakes final on July 14 was initially unloved by buyers at the Hoosier Classic, but is now a hot commodity in Dylan Davis' barn.

Yearling buyers rely heavily on sale catalogs and what can be extracted from the lines of a pedigree page. But there are times when a pedigree doesn't tell the full story on a horse or the subsequent family. Such may have been the case with buyers considering Schnitzledosomethin last fall at the Hoosier Classic Sale.

From the first crop of Fred And Ginger, Schnitzledosomethin's second dam is the accomplished Whitefish Falls mare Summer In Fiji. As a racehorse, Summer In Fiji banked \$173,180 over three seasons and won Indiana Sires Stakes finals at both two and three, a notable

accomplishment considering her stablemate was the millionaire-to-be Go On BB. As a three-year-old Go On BB took her 1:51.3 mark, and finished her career with 13 trips to the winner's circle.

Bred in 2009, Summer In Fiji's first foal was the filly Summer N Sand. The pacer brought \$17,000 at the Hoosier Classic Sale, purchased by breeder Aaron Stutzman. A northern Indiana-based breeder that operates Luckiana Farm, Stutzman campaigned Summer N Sand over nine starts during her freshman and sophomore campaigns.

"That family is loaded with speed, and she had exceptional speed. Holy cow, you wouldn't believe what kind of speed she had," Stutzman said of the filly. "She had a license to go. That's why I kept her as a broodmare."

Despite the turn of speed, tendon issues would prevent her from reaching her full potential or registering complete campaigns in 2012 and 2013. While Summer N Sand was race timed in 1:52.4 as a three year old, the filly only

collected two wins and a meager \$24,520 in earnings over two years. That didn't dissuade Stutzman from breeding the mare in 2014 to Fred And Ginger, the millionaire and world champion son of Real Artist standing in Indiana for his first season.

"I thought he crossed well with the mare. I watched every one of his races and he showed guts," said Stutzman. "You don't go that fast if you don't have any guts."

That pairing produced a colt that was part of Luckiana Farm's 2016 consignment at the Hoosier Classic. He was cataloged as Hip 1 in the first of two sessions. Perhaps it was his placement in the sale, the fact he was the product of a first crop sire, or the perceived lack of production from Summer In Fiji combined with Summer N Sand's sparse race record, but Shnitzledosomethin only brought a final bid of \$18,000. Not bringing what Stutzman had hoped, the full-time recreational vehicle builder and trainer on the side returned to Goshen, IN with the colt after buying him back.

"I liked the colt from day one," he said. "We thought he should bring more the way that he looked. He was a big, strong colt. He scanned clean. There was nothing wrong with him."

Between working his factory job building RVs and overseeing 30 broodmares, Stutzman found time to develop Shnitzledosomethin over the winter and into the spring, preparing him for Indiana Sires Stakes at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino. The colt competed in his first qualifier June 3, winning with Stutzman in the bike in 1:58.4 with a last quarter in 27 seconds. Two weeks later, he won again in qualifying action, this time pacing in 1:55.4 for the breeder.

"He was a natural from the first day I hooked him up and drove him. He didn't make a mistake," Stutzman said. "He had a 20-acre pasture at home. He could go up and down hills; he was free to run and develop."

The breeder admits that if he raced full time he would have kept the two-year-old. However, he fielded multiple inquiries on his colt, and by the time Shnitzledosomethin lined up in his next qualifier, he did so for trainer Dylan Davis. The colt was purchased by a partnership that included Fred And Ginger's owners, Howard Taylor (as part of BFJ Stable) and Edwin Gold, and added Thomas Lazzaro and Abraham Basen. In his Indiana Sires Stakes debut, a \$20,000 elimination held July 7, Shnitzledosomethin and Peter Wrenn took advantage of a pocket trip to score their first win. Sent off as the favorite, the colt won by just over four lengths in a time of 1:53.1.

Drawing near the outside in post seven for the \$75,000

final one week later, Shnitzledosomethin was again tabbed the favorite. Wrenn left the gate in fifth early on before brushing to the lead before the half. Once on the lead, the colt remained comfortably in front under Wrenn's urging, cruising to a four-length advantage at the wire and stopping the clock in 1:52.2.

"He's been pretty impressive ever since we bought him. I don't think he's been anywhere near empty yet. He looks like he's still well within himself, and Pete speaks very highly of him. The horse has a great attitude," Davis said of the colt, also eligible to the Fox Stake, Elevation and Breeders Crown. "I think if he gets a little more aggressive when he's on the lead, that's going to make him a better racehorse. He is still very green and immature. He goes and stops. I think when he figures it all out and puts it all together at the same time, you might see something special."

With a quick \$47,500 added to his card in two starts for his connections, Shnitzledosomethin has served notice that he will be a factor in the division here in Indiana should he continue his impressive debut. And while Stutzman won't be along for the ride as a partner, he'll enjoy watching the colt compete while preparing a Net Ten Eom sister for the auction this fall. The filly's pedigree just picked up a little more black type.

Dante Boko wins at Arjängs, Midnight Hour in Mikkeli

An even field and bad post position for the big favourite Propulsion opened up the gates for quick starter Dante Boko (Going Kronos) in Årjängs Stora Spriterlopp in Sweden last Saturday (July 15).

Dante Boko was one of the contenders in Elitloppet earlier this summer, but that time the son of Going Kronos had no luck when the posts was drawn. The horse, trained by Lutfi Kolgjini and driven by his son, Adrian, developed a lot in France last winter and is now in the category of elite horses in Europe.

In front of over 14.000 spectators in Årjäng, the seven-year-old trotter opened quickly behind the gate and Adrian Kolgjini put the horse safely in the lead and without any struggle he could keep the pace down when the field passed 5/8ths of a mile.

Dante Boko had a lot of power to give in the last turn and when the toughest opponents Ringostarr Treb and Propulsion sat third and fourth over, a lot was won for Kolgjini, who put in all gas and stepped on the pedal with a quarter to go. Dante Boko had a three-four lengths lead when they reached the home stretch and it was enough to keep Propulsion behind by a nose in the finish.

Dante Boko came home in 1:52 and earned \$68,000. "This was an important victory for us. I think that we've had a lot of bad numbers and bad luck this season, but we also knew what this horse is capable of. When we sent him to France, Dante Boko advanced and became an international star", Adrian Kolgjini said.

In Finland last Sunday (July 16), the six-year-old Diesel Don son Midnight Hour led the seven-horse field in St Michel Ajo in Mikkeli. The race is known as a speed show, but this year the contenders showed no interest in putting the pace up. In history, horses such as Varenne have made the track in the Finnish woods famous, because of its fast surface.

Ilkka Nurmonen was allowed to steer the race the way he wanted behind Midnight Hour and even if Workout Wonder tried to challenge on the short home stretch, the victory was safe in 1:53.3. The winner earned \$72,000.

Sylvain Filion heating up; scores three OSS Gold victories

If you are looking for a hot driver right now at Mohawk Racetrack, look no further than the reigning two time 'O'Brien Driver of the Year' Sylvain Filion.

Filion, who has been heating up of late after going through a lukewarm streak (for him), won six times in a 12 drive stretch from Friday through Saturday, punctuated by wins in three Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold events for three-year-old trotting colts with On A Sunny Day in 1:53.3, Magic Night in 1:56.1 and R First Class in 1:55.

Filion's expertise was on full display in all three wins. In the first OSS Gold race, he bided his time in the pocket with 2-5 On A Sunny Day while Trevor Ritchie and Royal Witch were intent on carving out some solid splits. Taking no chances of getting pinned in, Filion guided his charge to the outside around the final turn and they gradually edged clear of Royal Witch in a clocking that beat On A Sunny Day's previous lifetime best clocking by 1 and 2/5 seconds.

The next two winners were both sent right down the road by a confident Filion and it sure didn't hurt Magic Night's

chances when Filion stole a :30.2 second quarter and :59.4 middle half. R First Class showed gameness keeping Try Try Again – who had only lost once in six starts – at bay at the end of the mile.

While it could be argued that two of these winners were odds-on and the third one only 5-2 on the board, Filion's three winners on Friday weren't chinks and all three were tripped out perfectly to win. Both Bedroom Confessions (\$7.20) and Diamontoothgertie (\$20.30) were put into perfect striking position on cover, while Shadow Play (\$16.50) was provided with a golden pocket trip by Filion.

Filion has had an interesting year in that while he has lost some business from leading trainer Richard Moreau, he has picked up several live drives – such as R First Class – from trainer Ben Ballargeon while Ballargeon's brother Mario is sidelined with a medical issue.

While Filion currently sits fourth in the overall WEG standings for the year behind Louis-Phillippe Roy, Doug McNair and Trevor Henry, batting what is for him a mediocre 11.5 per cent strike rate, stakes season is where he typically excels and if the past couple of cards are any indication, Filion is heating up and looking like his old dominant self with every drive recently.

Bit Of A Legend N upsets in Gerrity at Saratoga

Bit Of A Legend N and driver Jordan Stratton pulled off a 15-1 with a late-closing victory in the ninth annual \$260,000 Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial Pace on Saturday (July 22) at Saratoga Casino Hotel and Raceway.

The Gerrity began with multiple horses leaving the gate and jockeying for early position into a :26.4 opening quarter. With the inside posts, Boston Red Rocks (Brett Miller) made front first ahead of All Bets Off (Matt Kakaley), but Somewhere In L A (Jason Bartlett) was on the move early from third. Meanwhile, 9-5 favourite Sintra (Jody Jamieson) and post eight leaver Keystone Velocity (Simon Allard) were caught outside in the early going.

Somewhere In L A took over command in front of the grandstand with Sintra hot on his heels to challenge on the way to the half-mile mark in :54.3. Those two continued their battle on the front through three-quarters in 1:21.2 while the backfield fanned out wide turning for home.

Bit Of A Legend N closed widest of all in the stretch outside of Mach It So (David Miller), who edged out Boston Red Rocks and Somewhere In L A for the runner-up role. Bit Of A Legend N, who was a runner-up in last year's Gerrity to 1:51 winner Wiggle It Jiggleit, won the 2017 edition in a lifetime-best 1:50.3.

Bit Of A Legend N returned \$32.20 to his backers at the betting windows.

Peter Tritton trains the eight-year-old son of Bettors Delight and Sokys Legend for the Harry Von Knoblauch Stable of San Diego, CA.

The win was Bit Of A Legend N's fourth of the year from 15 starts and 37th lifetime pushing his bankroll to \$1.76 million.

Oho Diamond breaks Meadowlands track record

Six days ago, she finished third at nearly 100-1 odds behind world champion Hannelore Hanover in the Miss Versatility. Friday, the previously unheralded mare Oho Diamond broke that superstar's track record, winning a conditioned trot at the Meadowlands in 1:50.2, one-fifth of a second faster than Hannelore Hanover's record set in that race six days ago.

Oho Diamond, a 6-year-old mare by Ken Warkentin out of

Friday's Gem who is owned by Dan Clements and trained by Renaldo Morales III, moved to the front for driver Brett Miller after a :27 opening quarter. From there, Miller had Oho Diamond comfortably on the lead with the talented 3-year-old colt Victor Gio chasing from second.

After three-quarters in 1:22.3, Oho Diamond just kept going while comfortably in front, tacking on a :27.4 final quarter to stop the teletimer in the record time.

"She has always had a ton of ability, but she's been a little fussy," said Miller. "I got her going and just kept her going. When three quarters flashed up that fast, I kind of smooched at her a little bit because it felt like she was going track record time. Even though she doesn't have as much money on her card as some of those other mares, she proved she can go with them tonight."

Oho Diamond has now won 18 times from 56 career starts good for \$184,648 in lifetime earnings. She is eligible to the TVG Mares Trot series at the Meadowlands.

Miller and Morales teamed up to win in the other division of the featured overnight trot with P L Jill, who also dropped out of the Miss Versatility on the Pace Night undercard.

In second leg action in the Kindergarten Series for 2-year-olds, Jimmy Takter won three divisions with filly trotter Dab Hanover, colt trotter Hill Street, and colt pacer Grand Teton.

Takter added another win with Hambletonian-eligible Achille Duharas, to make it four wins on the card.

Total handle on the 11-race card was \$2,010,474.

Campbell and USTA leading charge for universal rules

The U.S. Trotting Association will join an industry-wide initiative to review the rules of racing promulgated by the Association, to create a rule book that every harness racing jurisdiction will adopt and enforce. The initiative, chaired by new Hambletonian Society president John Campbell, will conduct a detailed and comprehensive review of the rules of racing, with input from all stakeholders.

The initial goal of this effort is to identify rules that should be clarified, modified or expanded to enhance uniform adoption and interpretation and to more accurately reflect contemporary racing conditions. The group will ultimately work to incorporate changes to existing USTA rules and seek their adoption with state and provincial racing commissions.

"We should have universal rules throughout harness racing, throughout North America," said Campbell. "That is something I've felt quite strongly about for a long time. I don't believe some of our rules are worded as well as they could be. That can make it difficult for the judges to rule consistently. If the wording were made more concise and definitive, it would be easier for judges.

"I think there is more of an impetus for the Commissions to go by USTA rules right now than there has been in the past. The beneficiaries are twofold – this will benefit the gamblers betting on our game across North America as well as participants and judges. It will be better for all involved to get this accomplished."

It's anticipated that there will be some review and revision of rules completed prior to the Sept. 1 deadline required for USTA rule changes to be considered in 2018, but Campbell cautions the effort will be a sustained one over time.

"It's not something to be done quickly," he said. "It will be a long thought process to get the wording done right."

While every aspect of the rules of racing will be considered, the initial areas of scrutiny will be driver safety and fitness, fair start, recall and starting gate rules, horses coming out of a hole, causes of interference, and in the era where so much handle is generated by simulcast, conduct of post parades.

Members of the committee include driver Yannick Gingras, Hall of Fame driver and racing official Dave Magee and driver Jeff Gregory, chairman of the USTA Trainer-Driver Committee, as well as retired Hall of Fame driver Bill O'Donnell, now serving as president of the Central Ontario Standardbred Association.

Brett Revington of the Pennsylvania Racing Commission will participate, as will presiding judges from both the U. S. and Canada, Don Harmon, Tim Schmitz, Jeff Tallarino, Bill McLinchey, Tom Miller and Dan Kazmaier.

Racetrack executive and USTA director Jason Settlemyer, USTA directors Dick Brandt, chairman of the rules committee, and Steve McCoy, former president of the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, who helped craft rules and policies for the Association following the introduction of racinos, will also contribute.

Registrar TC Lane will serve as the USTA representative, to assist in coordination and execution of the group's agenda. In addition, there will be two non-voting members, horseman Gary Buxton and professional harness racing gambler and former horseman Les Stark.

Minnesota seeking to fund adoption and retirement organizations

The Minnesota Racing Commission is seeking 501(c)(3) non-profit racehorse adoption, retirement and repurposing organizations that have been in operation at least one year to be considered for funding. These new funds were generated by legislation passed in 2015 to direct fines collected via rulings issued at Canterbury Park and Running Aces to be directed to a special revenue fund to support racehorse adoption, retirement and repurposing.

"The Minnesota Racing Commission is excited about launching this new industry supported program that the Governor and Legislature approved to help care for our equine athletes after their racing career is over. The Commission's efforts, in combination with the already instituted programs executed by Canterbury Park, Running Aces and their horsepersons' organizations, will further our goal to provide resources to care for these gifted animals," said Tom DiPasquale, executive director of the Minnesota Racing Commission.

Approximately \$50,000 is currently available for distribution to organizations that care for and repurpose standardbreds, quarter horses and/or thoroughbred racehorses. Some of the criteria for receiving funding includes documentation of 501(c)(3) status, an established board of directors, and availability of site visits performed by an equine veterinarian. Facilities must have adequate shelter and pasture turnout, access to clean water, and safe fencing. Preference will be given to organizations that have taken or will take horses who have raced at Minnesota racetracks.

Organizations are asked to submit completed applications by August 15, 2017. The Minnesota Racing Commission will distribute funding by September 30, 2017.

After judge Tomasello's letter was published, HRU received feedback via social media still questioning the decision. People obviously are passionate about this matter. Thus, in order to provide a forum on the topic, we have decided to publish many of the original letters we received this week on the topic prior to judge Tomasello's explanation being released).

Huntsville cut the corner, what about the bettors?

Huntsville clearly cut the cones at the top of the stretch in the Meadowlands Pace, giving him a distinct advantage over a fast closing Downbytheseaside.

If that cone had been the now obsolete rail, he would have propelled off of it like a rocket.

There was no call from the judges or from the trainer of the second place horse, Downbytheseaside, or any other trainer or owner for that matter.

What about the bettors who used Downbytheseaside at 4-1, who felt abandoned and abused by the lack of a call by the judges for what was a blatantly obvious foul?

And we want to know why bettors shun harness racing?

At least post the "inquiry" sign

Was anybody who runs or polices harness racing awake during the running of the Meadowlands Pace on Saturday?

Let's head this off right at the pass: Huntsville was the best. I have no question about that.

With that said, were the judges having a beer during the race, or maybe getting another hotdog, because it was a big, festive evening?

I would think that when you are going for three-quarters of a million and the winner cuts at least one pylon, and another horse breaks behind him, posting the "Inquiry" sign isn't asking for much. In fact, it's asking for you to do your job.

I don't think that many judges would take the horse down, but don't you have to at least take a look?

And once again we can beat the dead horse of uneven judging, or in this case, no judging.

When will they finally get it? Racing is a game of PERCEPTION. Perception IS REALITY!

When the people who support the game and pay ALL of the freight (especially in NJ with no slots) feel like the game is tilted away from fairness, or at least is being judged unevenly, the players leave. And if you don't believe it, just look at the handle numbers year after year. They aren't getting better, and if you adjust for "real" dollars for yesteryear compared to today, it's really bad.

I won't address the other things that swirled around this

race and the horses who didn't race. That's a sideshow to me.

I want judges to adjudicate every race the same way, whether it's a cheap claimer (never thought I'd say "cheap claimer and Meadowlands" in the same sentence).

A foul is a foul.

If not, then put back the hubrail and we would either see much more careful driving, or many more circus like drivers catapulting over other horses and the solid rail.

I think this lack of action is a flagrant slap at the bettors and the game itself, and is yet another reason that I and others bet a small fraction of what I/we once did.

Wake up guys. You've already missed the boat. The train is gone too and you can't run fast enough to catch up and go forward.

Agreeing with Towers on Pace Night

Dean Towers brings up a good point in his latest Brush and Crush ([full story here](#)) regarding the Meadowlands Pace. It was a stacked card with nine of the 13 races classified as stakes with purses that ranged from \$125,000 to \$738,550.

On one hand, Towers praises the crowd of 10,000 plus and the overall handle of \$3.8 million. On the other, he laments the facts that there were perhaps too many stakes races, which, because of some heavy favorites, offered little value to the bettors. There is validity in both of those statements.

It is an interesting dilemma for sure. Towers wrote The Big M might have been better off with a few less stakes races and more overnights and smaller purse races; suggesting that card was "too stacked," which may have caused some veteran horseplayers to shy away from the big races.

He asks if major stakes cards have jumped the shark. How do we answer that? We know that the Meadowlands doesn't offer alternative gaming, so, in order for the track to get people to come in person it has to offer big events. I believe that it's better to get 25 new people out to the track once, than one person 25 times. That person is already accounted for, but the newbies are the ones that are needed going forward. The Meadowlands knows that they have to cash in with their two mighty events – the Hambletonian and the Pace. They do this by offering "millions" in purses, and, if judged by the attendance and handle spike, it worked.

I bring up a different view. As a fan of harness racing that

rarely bets on races, I love it. To see all those races with all the great pacers and trotters was exciting. To me, there is nothing like the big event. The reason the Kentucky Derby gets great TV ratings is for that very same reason. But, if tracks relied on me, they would go belly up; they need bettors and they need bettors who believe they can make some money. When a Walner is entered, if you bet against him, you're probably going to lose your money. When you don't bet on a race, you can appreciate the greatness of Walner, Huntsville, Downbytheseaside and Ariana G – when you're trying to wager and make money, perhaps not so much.

Most harness racing players like their tracks because they know their horses and like their \$14,000 open pace or trots, their non-winners of \$6,500 in their last five and so on. A nine to 11-race stakes cards with shippers coming in to compete can be unsettling to those who study and play the track on a regular basis. I was always told that it's best – when wagering – to pick one track and stick with it to learn the biases, the drivers, the trainers and most importantly, the horses. When the big races come, the vets might lose the interest that the non-fan might love. Most of the people that came to The Big M Saturday were looking to have fun more than they were looking to wheel four horses with Huntsville to make a big score. They made their bets, but they were betting names, hunches and looking over the programs and newspapers for guidance. Of course, that used to be easier when the Times, Post, Newsday and Daily News used to care and write about harness racing. But, the one who prepares knows where to find the proper guidance.

And, a card with less stakes races might bring fewer to the track, meaning fewer hot dogs, beers, sodas, waters and pretzels consumed. Most of the wagering today is done online, so again, not an easy task for the racetracks to be in. They need their online presence, but they also want people to come out and enjoy live harness racing because if my kids aren't exposed to it, you can bet their kids won't be either.

It's tough. Load up the card, get 10,111 people who buy beers, hot dogs, pretzels and sodas or balance the card and get more in overall handle? I'm not privy to know which makes more money for Jeffrey Gural, the Meadowlands owner. Is the \$5 hot dog more valuable than betting \$5 on the favorite to win?

There probably is a happy medium. With 13 races, could you have three to four biggies and nine "regulars" and still have that big event feel and, at the same time, placate your bettors? There would be that natural buildup to the Pace,

just like there is to the Kentucky Derby and the Travers.

It appears that marketing is leaning towards stacking. The Belmont Stakes card is loaded with stakes races; in fact, only the Breeder's Cup offers more stakes races than Big Sandy does on Belmont Day. The same goes for the Preakness. These tracks plan these mini-festivals to lure in the big crowd for one or two days per year and afterwards, it's back to overnights and online wagering — and small crowds. Most harness tracks market their casinos and racinos with little time or money spent on hyping the actual racing. As long as people are coming in to gamble, the Monticellos, Saratoga and Tioga Downs of the world don't mind as long as the patrons are spending their hard earned cash. For the Meadowlands, all they have is the racing and though they could do more, they have likely budgeted accordingly.

The Hambletonian is the next big event in harness racing and it too, is at the Meadowlands. There will be 10 stakes races and over 20,000 people in attendance. They will bet, buy food and drink and hopefully have a great time. The sport is trying to find the right balance and because harness racing is not rising, it's a tough balance to find, something that Mr. Towers accurately addresses.

One wonders if the advice suggested by Towers — and others — is being heard. After a card like Saturday, is the Meadowlands brain trust honestly evaluating how well their product went off? Are they looking for ways to improve it for 2018? Or, were they satisfied with what transpired on a beautiful evening in East Rutherford, NJ? There isn't a wrong answer to this question; the only wrong thing would not to be thinking ahead, for the future.

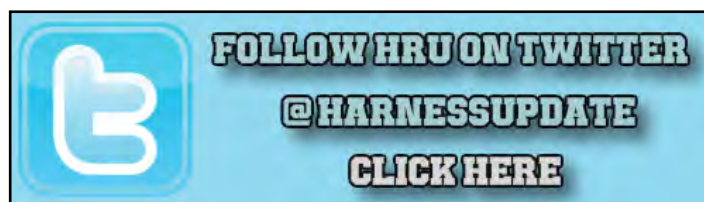

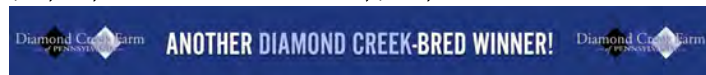
