On the brink of \$3 million

Wiggle It Jiggleit overcame a difficult opening half and cruised to victory in the \$260,000 Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial Saturday at Saratoga to push his career earnings to \$2.99 million.

Wiggle It Jiggleit pushed his career earnings just shy of \$3 million and posted his 10th win in 15 starts this year when he overcame a tough early trip Saturday (July 23) to win the eighth edition of the \$260,000 Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial Pace at Saratoga Casino Hotel.

Starting from five-hole on the half-mile track, Wiggle It Jiggleit and Montrell Teague were parked three-wide through the :26.3 opening quarter by post one starter Bit Of A Legend N (Jordan Stratton) and post three starter All Bets Off (Matt Kakaley).

By the :54.4 half, All Bets Off had cleared to the front and Wiggle It Jiggleit was still outside, but second and looming. Teague had his pacer on the front before tripping the three-quarter timer in 1:23.4 and cruised to a two-length score over Bit Of A Legend N in 1:51. All Bets Off held on for third. Sunfire Blue Chip (Mark MacDonald) was fourth and Artistic Major was fifth.

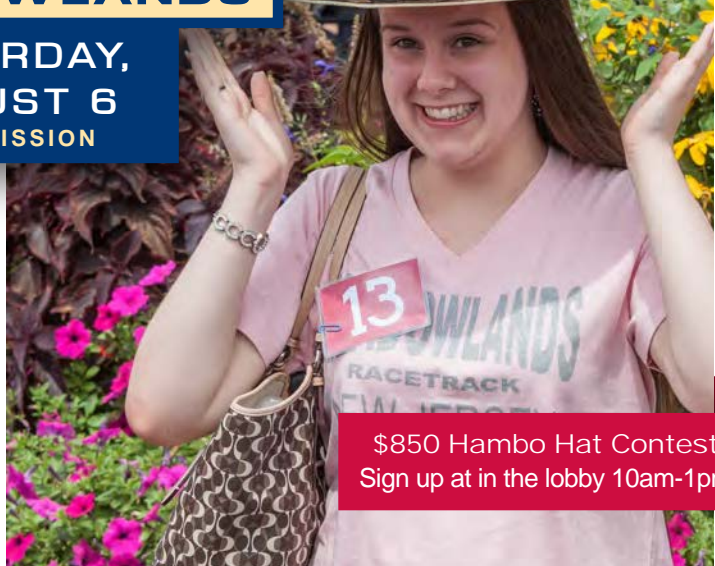

Wiggle It Jiggleit, the 1-9 favorite, paid \$2.20 to win.

Racing fans, who came to see the superstar, roared in appreciation as Wiggle It Jiggleit made his way to the winner's circle.

The victory was the 33rd in 42 career outings for Wiggle It Jiggleit (Mr Wiggles—Mozzi Hanover) and it pushed the four-year-old gelding's bankroll to \$2,992,162 for owner George Teague Jr. Inc. of Harrington, DE and the Teague Racing Partnership LLC of Boynton Beach, FL.

Wiggle It Jiggleit, trained by Clyde Francis, has earned \$803,667 this year.

It marked the first time in 12 years that a Horse of the Year has raced at the Saratoga Springs, NY harness track. The last to do it was local favorite Bunny Lake, the 2001 Horse of the Year who raced at Saratoga in 2004 for trainer/driver and co-owner John Stark, Jr. of Saratoga Springs.

Adios eliminations won by Racing Hill, Manhattan Beach

Racing Hill overpowered the field as he captured his elimination in the 50th edition of the Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids in 1:49.1, while Manhattan Beach found late racing room to take Saturday's (July 23) other \$25,000 elimination at The Meadows.

Those two will be joined in next Saturday (July 30) afternoon's \$400,000 Adios final by Check Six, Lyons Snyder, More Dragon, Fernando Hanover, Another Daily Copy, American Passport and Big Top Hanover. Big Top Hanover earned his berth in the field of nine as the fifth place finisher with higher career earnings. Five of the six entrants trained by Ron Burke made it through to the final.

The draw for Adios post positions is set for Tuesday (July 26) at 12:30 p.m. and can be seen on Meadows Live! The connections of Racing Hill and Manhattan Beach will choose their post positions, with the others drawn randomly.

Racing Hill boasted the strongest credentials in the field, having won the final of the \$500,000 Hempt Memorial and finishing second in the \$732,050 Meadowlands Pace and the \$780,000 million final of the North America Cup. If that grueling schedule of five tough races in little more than six weeks took anything out of him, it wasn't evident in his Adios elimination.

The son of Roll With Joe—Chasing Ideals made the front with an extended quarter-pole move for Brett Miller and thwarted the first-over challenge of Check Six to down him by three-quarters of a length. Early leader Lyons Snyder finished third.

"He's just ultra-sharp," said Tony Alagna, who trains Racing Hill for owner/breeder Tom Hill. "He felt so good coming out of the Meadowlands Pace—he was so fresh and jogged great—that I felt good about bringing him here. If the final had been an open draw, I probably would have preferred that he sit in so we could make the final. But with the new format this year, it's important that you get to pick your post—especially with a bunch of Burke horses making the final. You don't want to draw the nine-hole against a big entry."

The victory pushed Racing Hill's lifetime bankroll over \$770,000.

Manhattan Beach saved ground for most of the mile before Matt Kakaley sent him through a seam in mid-stretch. He

held off the Lightning Lane charge of his stablemate, Fernando Hanover, to defeat him by a neck in 1:50.2, a career best. Another Daily Copy, who fronted the mile, saved show.

Kakaley said he wasn't worried about being pinned late.

"If I'd had to wait for the passing lane, he'd have got through," he said. "There was no worry there. He raced really good in the Meadowlands Pace, and he raced good today. He was sneaky good a few starts before the North America Cup. Hopefully he brings his 'A' game next week."

Burke conditions Manhattan Beach, a Somebeachsomewhere—Benear gelding who soared over \$200,000 in career earnings, for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli LLC, Geoffrey Lyons Mound and Wingfield Brothers.

As thoughts turned to Tuesday's draw for post positions, both camps seemed to be heading in the same direction.

"The inside here is tough to get off," Miller said. "I got away fourth today from the rail, and I was leaving just about as hard as I could. I could live with post three, but I think I'd rather have post four, right around there."

Kakaley's reasoning was similar.

"I don't want the one or two hole," he said. "Probably three or four."

No Adios Moment?

After Control The Moment won the \$732,050 Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace last Saturday, some of the connections suggested the pacer's next race might be in the \$400,000 Adios.

But when the entries came out, Control The Moment's name was not among the 12 that dropped in the box.

Control The Moment's part-owner Howard Taylor of Philadelphia told HRU this week that the pacer is fine and simply skipped the Adios to get a break in his schedule after seven straight weeks of racing. The connections had originally considered the Adios, Taylor said, because race officials at The Meadows indicated there might be only enough entries for a single straight-to-the-final dash, giving Control The Moment this week off. When 12 dropped in the box, Control The Moment opted to skip the race.

Taylor said Control The Moment's next race would likely be the \$400,000 Carl Milstein Memorial on Aug. 13 at Northfield Park.

Pure Country increases win streak to five with PASS victory

Pure Country continued her relentless march to a second straight divisional title, capturing her fifth consecutive victory in Saturday's (July 23) Pennsylvania Sires Stake action at The Meadows, part of the Adios eliminations card. Shesasmokinlady took the other division in the \$159,350 event for 3-year-old filly pacers known as the Romola Hanover.

Pure Country won all 10 starts at age two en route to her Dan Patch Award. While she's lost three of nine outings this year, the daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Western Montana appears to have elevated her game to a new level, with victories in the finals of the Fan Hanover and the Lynch and two straight PASS splits.

"I've never driven a filly like her," winning driver Brett Miller said. "I don't know if I've ever driven a colt like her. She might be the best horse I've ever driven. To race at the top level like this every week and be that good — it's amazing. She's one of the smartest fillies I've ever sat behind, and she has the heart of a champion. The couple times I got beat with her, it was probably my fault."

In the Romola Hanover, Pure Country grabbed the lead with a quarter-pole move, easily thwarted the first-over challenge of I Said Diamonds and defeated the pocket-sitting Darlinonthebeach by two-and-a-half lengths in 1:50. Shezarealdeal was third.

Jimmy Takter trains Pure Country, who now boasts \$1,276,610 in career earnings, for Diamond Creek Racing. Shesasmokinlady also made the front past the quarter for trainer/driver Ray Paver and owner/breeder Iris Horowitz and had just enough in the tank to hold off Newborn Sassy by a nose in 1:50.4. Call Me Queen Be completed the ticket.

"I figured if I got away third today, I wasn't sitting," said Paver of Shesasmokinlady, who now has \$144,795 in her bankroll. "She usually doesn't get tired, but she looks for a horse to race. A horse never really got to her until late."

Although she may reach the PASS final or consolation leg,

Paver said a stakes payments snafu has left Shesasmokinlady with only one definite stake engagement: the Keystone Classic at The Meadows.

Saturday's program also featured five divisions of this event; as with the other stakes on the card, this one became "Miller Time." Miller won two splits, giving him four stakes victories on the day, while trainer Michael Hall enjoyed a stake double.

The highlight for Miller and Hall was the 1:51.1 win by Dismissal, which lowered the stake record of 1:51.3 previously held by Icommandmyspirit and matched earlier in the day by A List Hanover.

Hall owns Dismissal, a daughter of Western Terror—Her Mattjesty.

The other three splits went to Terror at Night, Kryptos and Square Dancer.

A List Hanover saw her stake record fall, but she turned in a huge performance, challenging first-over for longer that winning driver Dan Rawlings intended.

"The more I grabbed her, the more her gait became less than perfect," Rawlings said. "So I let her go as fast and as far as she could."

Gingertreescarlett finished second, three lengths back, with Nip's Beach Girl third.

Hall trains and leases A List Hanover, a daughter of Somebeachsomewhere—Allamerican Nadia.

Terror At Night also converted a first-over trip to victory, edging by early leader Hug A Dragoness by a half length in 1:51.4, a lifetime mark. Donna's Beach completed the ticket.

"She's one of the laziest fillies I've ever driven," Miller said. "You have to make her do her work. When she made the front, she thought the race was over. If you're on the front, it's not as bad, but if you're passing somebody, she pulls up as soon as she gets by."

Embracing Racing

The shotgun marriage between casinos and horse racing often leaves racing neglected, but in Indiana, Centaur is investing heavily in the sport at Hoosier Park and Indiana Grand and embracing the game as an important part of its total entertainment package.

The racing landscape is changing. The metamorphosis has been underway for some time. It's a battle of the haves and have-nots: venues with casinos and those seeking to add them. Merely having a casino on the grounds, however, does not solve all racing woes. Operators have been knocked for treating racing as a line item, tolerated but not embraced. And the decoupling headlines from Florida earlier this year certainly didn't help to dispel that notion.

Horseman Roger Welch said he "can't speak highly enough of Centaur and Hoosier Park."

In Indiana, Centaur, owner of Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and thoroughbred facility Indiana Grand, is approaching horse racing with a different perspective. Management is taking an active role in promoting the sport and industry. The goal is to create a win-win situation where together new heights are reached.

"I think it's understood that all of these pieces fit together, and we're not going to do a second-rate job on any part of the business that we operate," said Jim Brown, Centaur president & COO. "If you look at it, racing brought us to the table. Racing brought a casino to Hoosier Park. And racing brought a casino to Indiana Grand."

In June 2008, Hoosier Park became one of the coveted

tracks with a racino when Centaur opened the doors to a 92,000 square-foot facility. The casino, and revenue set aside for the racing industry, has become a catalyst for Indiana's improved breeding and racing.

Brown talks passionately about standardbred racing in Indiana. It is more than a line item in his view; it's a critical piece of the entertainment experience at the Anderson facility. When he refers to those "pieces" fitting together, it's the combination of racing, gaming, dining and entertainment. Friday night (July 22) for instance, patrons coming out for the Kenny Rogers concert could have enjoyed a great meal in the clubhouse while taking in a full card of racing beforehand. That's three opportunities for the facility to shine.

"We look at our business as a multi-faceted business, particularly racing, gaming and entertainment. If you look at the fan side, we want to provide them the best experience possible," Brown said. "Whether it's racing, gaming, dining or entertainment. We want, as a team, to be the best that we can be and provide the best that is available."

That desire to be the best takes shape on the racing side in many ways. First, Centaur has invested millions in capital projects focused on elevating racing with the hopes that it can become the best in the nation. The projects are a mix of improvements meant for fans as well as horsemen racing in Central Indiana. The company partnered with the state's horseman's association to bring the Breeders Crown to Hoosier Park in 2017. They have added Trakus, are broadcasting racing in high definition, and added a passing lane. With chairman and CEO Rod Ratcliff as the driving force, Centaur has aggressively worked to show harness racing in the best light, and the efforts have been noticed by those in and outside Indiana.

"When compared to other racetracks they go out of their way to accommodate horsemen. They don't mess around; they get things done," said Roger Welch, a longtime Illinois horseman stabled at Hoosier Park for the first time this season. "I can't speak highly enough of Centaur and Hoosier Park. I've been around other tracks and talk to my friends that race in other states. The horsemen don't have this kind of relationship with track owners."

Centaur president and COO Jim Brown (with his wife, Debbie) said "we don't make money particularly in racing, but we don't make a profit in housekeeping. That doesn't mean we're going to let our facilities be dirty."

Showing racing in its best light and teaming with the horsemen is paying off. Over the last four years, the Hoosier Park racing product has enjoyed significant gains in the simulcast area. This year Brown says handle is up 15 per cent over last year's business levels. Last week, the Hoosier Park signal was picked up by the Las Vegas sports books for the first time in five years. The signal is also exported to Australia. It's no secret that conducting racing is not a profitable venture, but Brown views it as an important cog to not only the facility and the entertainment options available to patrons, but Indiana's burgeoning standardbred industry.

"Right now, from a profitability standpoint, we don't make money particularly in racing, but we don't make a profit in housekeeping. That doesn't mean we're going to let our facilities be dirty. We may not make a profit in food and beverage, but we're still going to provide the best food and beverage product possible to our customers. From a business standpoint, it's the intangibles rather than a financial statement," he explained. "The rising tide raises all boats. We're all on these boats together. There has always been an interest and a passion in forwarding and contributing to the improvement of the sport overall, but specifically in the state of Indiana. It's something that is a responsibility that we

have, but it's one we take on joyously and really want to move Indiana racing to the top of the national scene."

Harness racing's "Big Three" of Always B Miki, Freaky Feet Pete and Wiggle It Jiggle It have helped the tide rise, bringing significant attention to the Indiana breeding program. And while Hoosier Park benefits from that added attention, management is also working on grassroots efforts to cultivate new racing fans. The First Turn Stable is the latest in a series of progressive ideas aimed at creating an experience that will keep fans coming back. Hoosier Park publicly offered 50 fractional ownership shares in a racehorse earlier this year for \$250 apiece. This group of owners will experience the excitement of racing throughout the season in a risk-free endeavor. Should their horse finish the season in the red, the owners are not on the hook for the shortfall. If the stable turns a profit, it will be split among the owners. Again, management is focused less on balance sheets and fiduciary responsibility and more on providing a memorable experience.

"We look at the big picture, but we also look at the smaller picture. There are components that can be put in place to help improve racing from a fan perspective," Brown noted. "First Turn Stable is an opportunity to allow someone to become a first-time owner of a horse. Maybe that turns into owning a horse on their own, or owning multiple horses. We want to continue to help grow the industry. We want to promote and contribute to a sport that's given a lot to us and to see that industry and sport become what our hopes, dreams and visions wanted it to be."

NA Cup champ Betting Line's sixth straight win is golden

Reigning division and North America Cup champion Betting Line captured his sixth straight victory in the second of two \$105,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Series divisions Saturday (July 23) at Mohawk Racetrack.

Starting from Post 8 in a skirmish that also featured the number one and two point earners in the three-year-old pacing colt division, Magnum J and Sintra, Betting Line eased away from the starting gate and watched from sixth as Magnum J and Arsenic duelled to a :26.3 opening quarter. Magnum J was still in control at the :55.2 half, but Semi Automatic, Sintra and Betting Line had shifted into the outer lane and were threatening by the 1:22.1 three-quarters.

Rolling off the turn driver Jonathan Drury of Guelph, ON shifted Betting Line into overdrive and, in spite of a few wonky steps, the colt laid down a :26.4 final quarter to claim his sixth straight victory and second straight in Gold Series action. Sintra was three lengths back in second and Magnum J held on for third in the 1:50 mile.

"We're not exactly sure what he did just quite yet," said trainer Casie Coleman of Betting Line's awkward stretch

drive. "JD (Drury) said he couldn't have felt any better, he was just jogging, and he never spoke to him, just sitting there on him like a passenger and all of a sudden he just got all out of gear.

"We don't see anything on the track, and I don't see any marks on him where he touched himself or anything, and JD said once he gathered him out of it he was perfect and pulled up well. It's kind of a head scratcher for us, but he has had a tendency in the past, when he gets all by himself alone on the front he just kind of looks at stuff — that's why he wears that big shadow roll — but every once in a while he sees something. He did do it right at the wire in the Somebeachsomewhere, not nearly as bad as that tonight, but yeah, I wish we could, obviously, 110 per cent correct whatever that problem is, but we really don't know."

Overall Coleman was very pleased with the way Betting Line raced in his first start since having a splint treated in early July.

"I was really, really happy with the way he was steering tonight," said the Cambridge, ON resident, who shares ownership of Betting Line with Ross Warriner of Burlington, ON, Christine Calhoun of Chatham, ON and Mac Nichol of Burlington, ON. "That splint actually took me almost two weeks before I could even train him."

The son of Bettors Delight and Heathers Western will enjoy one more week of relative leisure before his schedule shifts into high gear. Following the fourth Gold Series Leg at Georgian Downs on Aug. 7, Betting Line heads to Northfield Park for the Aug. 13 Carl Milstein Memorial, followed by the Battle of Brandywine at Pocono Downs on Aug. 20. The final Gold Leg goes postward Sept. 7 at Mohawk and the Campbellville oval also plays host to the Simcoe Stake on Sept. 10, before Betting Line heads back to the U.S.A. for the Little Brown Jug on Sept. 22.

"He gets pretty busy now, so I was glad to be able to give him a little bit of a break, in this little gap," said Coleman of the winner of \$1,224,922 (Cdn). "He needed that time."

Betting Line will be joined in the Carl Milstein Memorial by his Ontario rival Sintra, who has also been invited to the Aug. 13 event.

"Instead of being a 'paid into' event, this year it's an invitational and Sintra's been invited to that, so that's going to fit pretty big on his radar," said trainer Dave Menary of the Mach Three—Dancin Barefoot colt he owns in partnership with Brad Gray of Dundas and Michael Guerriero of Brampton, ON.

While Sintra settled for his second runner-up finish behind Betting Line, his stablemate Nvestment Bluechip took home the Gold Series trophy from the first division.

Starting from Post 5 driver Jody Jamieson of Moffat, ON fired Nvestment Bluechip off the gate and reached the opening quarter in :26.3. The pair then settled in behind fan favourite Gerries Sport, who led the field to a :55 half and 1:23.3 three-quarters. Jamieson tipped Nvestment Bluechip out as the colts turned for home and the Shadow Play—Haze's Zure Bet son was able to reel in the favourite and grab his first win of the season in a personal best equalling 1:51.1. Gerries Sport finished a neck back in second and Nocturnal Bluechip was three-quarters of a length back in third.

"Tonight's, I think, a pick me up for the horse and our ownership group, and Jody and I," said Menary. "I mean he was supposed to be the star of the barn this year, where Sintra's had the limelight so far."

"He come back so good, and maybe he got thrown to the wolves a little bit early. He was in pretty tough, and he had the odd bad post, and nothing really lined up, but the money's in the bank, he's a good horse and hopefully this is a step in the right direction, that he's turned the corner."

The win was the first in seven sophomore starts for Nvestment Bluechip, who won four of 11 outings at two,

including three Gold Legs and his Champlain Stakes division, in addition to finishing second in the Super Final and third in the Breeders Crown.

"He was just a good horse, he just did it week-in-week-out. He did it on the five-eighths, seven-eighths, he did it in the pocket, off the pace, locked in, on the front end," said Menary. "Now, there's so many good horses. When you're two you're able to win a little bit slower, you can get by with a few flaws and little bit of bad luck, but when you're three they can all go so fast, there's so many good horses, you can't get by with bad luck or flaws."

Cambridge, ON resident Menary shares ownership of Nvestment Bluechip with Michael Guerriero of Brampton, ON, Denis Breton of Welland, ON and Thomas Kyron of Toronto, ON. Saturday's win boosted the colt's lifetime earnings to \$452,303 (Cdn) and he will be looking to pad that total further when the three-year-old pacing colt titans gather for the fourth time on Aug. 7 at Georgian Downs.

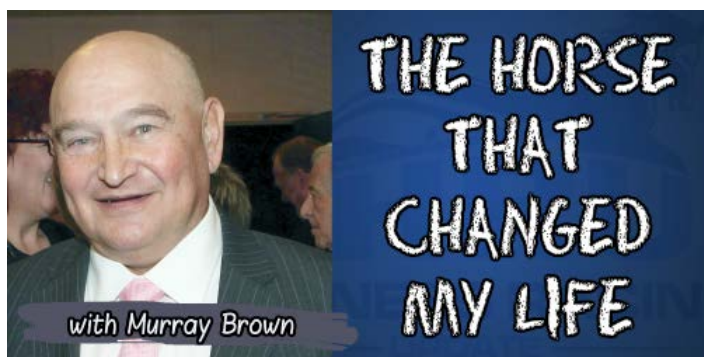

For Murray Brown, the road to the famed Hanover Shoe Farms started in his late-teens at Richelieu Park in his native Montreal in the late 1950s with a horse that provided considerable enlightenment.

"The horse that changed my life, the one that got me really involved was a horse called Confuscious," said Brown, who celebrated his 75th birthday this weekend. "My oldest brother, Sam, owned a small piece of him and he started taking me to the racetrack to see Confuscious race. Bill Habkirk trained and drove him. Any time Confuscious raced was a holiday for me. I started going to the racetrack. I started becoming interested in breeding and went forward from there."

Not surprisingly, Murray still remembers Confuscious' pedigree. He is, after all, a man who earned berths in both the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame and the Communicators' wing of the U.S. Hall of Fame for his

decades-long work as the publicity director for Hanover Shoe Farms in Pennsylvania.

"He was by Congressional out of a mare called Peggy F. Braden," Murray said, correctly. "He was a solid B3 pacer. He'd win in B3, they'd move him up and he wouldn't do quite as well. In those days, he went around 2:05. He made money and he was a wonderful horse to come see."

"I remember him being a big, long-legged horse. He had a very good stride and was ultra-consistent."

Murray said his brother, Sam, who is still alive at age 92, "ultimately had small pieces of one or two other horses... but was never deeply involved."

Not so for Murray. Confuscious was the start of a long, rich career he has chronicled in a book to be published this fall.

Canada's Horse of the Year off the schneid

It may have taken a little longer than expected, but State Treasurer scored his first win of 2016 in style Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack.

In his 10th start, reigning Canadian Horse of the Year State Treasurer (Chris Christoforou) scored his first win of 2016 Saturday at Mohawk.

The Dr. Ian Moore trainee captured the \$34,000 Preferred Pace in 1:48.4 over six rivals Saturday.

Driven by Chris Christoforou, State Treasurer got away fourth and was sent towards the front in the second-quarter. The Moore trainee was used hard, as he cleared Nickle Bag, who posted an opening-quarter of :26, for the lead at the half in :53.3.

Despite the tough second-quarter, State Treasurer continued to power along around the final turn and paced a :27.3 third-quarter to reach the third station in 1:21.1.

In the stretch, State Treasurer was asked to dig in and the seven-year-old responded by holding off a late push from the gritty Nickle Bag to win by half a length in 1:48.4.

American Virgin finished third, while the other Moore trainee, Rockin In Heaven, was fourth.

State Treasurer entered Saturday's contest winless in nine starts this season after winning nine of 19 and \$865,807 last season en route to being named the Canadian Horse of the Year and the Older Pacer of the Year in the U.S.

The son of Real Desire—Ideal Treasure now has 31 career wins and just shy of \$1.9 million earned over the course of his career for owners Sally MacDonald and Paul MacDonald. State Treasurer paid \$5.80 to win Saturday.

He was followed across the finish line by narrow second wagering choice Spicebomb and favored Jann and Dean. Uncle Nicky was fourth at 26-1 and the sequence was rounded out by 63-1 Gotti.

Big M plays host to penultimate Breakfast With The Babies

The penultimate edition of Breakfast With The Babies got underway at 9 a.m. Saturday on a pleasantly hot morning with a considerable cross track breeze.

Trainer Linda Toscano opened the day's activities by revealing another sharp looker from the first crop of her 2012 Horse of the Year Chapter Seven in the filly Seventh Heaven. Making her career debut, Seventh Heaven was reserved off the early fractions by driver Steve Smith then trotted through the stretch with aplomb to nail Kim's Spitfire (John Campbell) late in 2:01.1 with her last quarter much quicker than the 30 seconds on the timer. Richard Balog of Plesac fame bred and retains ownership of the filly, who is out of Porque.

Havanna Bar was the race two winner in 1:59 with Andy McCarthy at the lines. Andy held the Muscle Massive—With Sprinkles filly in third early off comfortable fractions then tipped her off the cover of Myrna Myrna (Buzzy Sholty) mid-stretch through the :29 final quarter to draw clear by a length. Noel Daley trains Havanna Bar, a \$23,000 Harrisburg yearling, for Christer Haggstrom whose day job is coordinating just about everything that goes on for the Elitlopp.

Catch The Game took a record of 1:59 this morning, making a slow grind up to the lead by the 59.4 half for Mark

MacDonald then holding sway over Long Tom (Marcus Melander) and Mac And Pay (Andy Miller) through the 29-second end to the mile. Paul Kelly trains the Muscle Hill–Angleina Chip \$47,000 Lexington yearling and owns him in partnership with Little E, LLC, SRF Stable and Anders Jonsson.

Muscle Hill sired another impressive winner right back the next race in the royally-bred Signal Hill (out of Special Appeal). Brett Miller picked up the drive for trainer Tony Alagna and steered the colt right into a pocket trip behind Euro Gap (Jimmy Takter) through a 1:28 three quarters then surged by that rival in deep stretch for the 1:57 record. Southwind Woody (Andy Miller) evidenced some talent with a late gain to be third. Signal Hill cost the partnership of Brittany Farms, Dave McDuffee, Marvin Katz and Adriano Sorella \$250,000 at the Lexington sale last fall.

Sky Fulla Star won the first of the pacing races with a deep close in 1:58.4 for Mark MacDonald. She rated off the pace kindly then used a stretch surge to score over Colorful Jasmine (Corey Callahan) and pace setter Odds On Miami (A. Miller). Bruce Saunders trains Sky Fulla Star for Julie, Francine and Charles “Cotton” Nash of Lexington, where they purchased the Art Major–Frankie’s Dream filly for \$42,000 last fall.

Captain Velocity was a winner again for Tony Alagna and owner the Trent Stohler Stable, this time in a “shut-down” 1:56.4 / :28.3 for driver Marcus Miller. He led all the way and held sway over the late rally of Mr. Varsity (Brett Miller) with American Dreamer (John Campbell) a solid third.

Trainer Alagna wrapped the morning’s baby menu with a winning effort by Art Scene in 1:57.1 / :28.1 for Corey Callahan. He got a nice trip, following the leader Bold And Brassy (Jimmy Marohn, Jr) until mid-way on the final bend where he engaged and then went by that stubborn rival late for the win. Rock N Blue was a gaining third for John Campbell. Brittany Farms bred and retains an interest in the son of American Ideal with Alagna Racing, In The Gym Partners and Americam Art Stable.

More Joe and Jeff

I saw the two (letters) last Sunday regarding my feud with Joe Faraldo. To be honest, I totally agree and for that reason two years ago when Joe and I were on a panel together at the Annual Saratoga Institute for Racing and Gaming Law when we were done I walked over to Joe and reached out my hand and said that I thought we should bury the hatchet for the good of the sport. His exact words to me at that time were that he would gladly shake my hand if he thought for one minute that I cared about the sport of harness racing but since he knows that I don't care about harness racing he had no interest in burying the hatchet.

I walked away in shock because when you consider that I own three harness tracks; two of which were in bankruptcy when I took over and the third was about to close and only one of these tracks is profitable, the other two lose money. I own breeding farms in New York and Pennsylvania together with 48 broodmares and both of those farms lose money. I currently have all or a piece of 48 horses in training including 24 two-year olds that were purchased at auction and that operation loses money. I started going to the track in high school in 1959 and I bought my first horse in 1972 and have owned horses ever since.

After that experience I realized that Joe and I were never going to resolve our differences even though it is certainly not productive for the two of us to have such an acrimonious relationship. In my eyes, Joe is the most powerful leader in the sport as it was his decision not to use any of the \$500 million a year we get from the slots for marketing and as a result we had a great card of racing last Saturday at the Meadowlands and only our hardcore fans knew what was taking place. We get more people at the Meadowlands to watch camel and ostrich racing than we did to watch three of the best horses that our sport has compete against each other. We do even better when we have food trucks. Had we been smart enough to use some of this money to be on TV every Saturday night we just might have had a huge crowd

but we got no media coverage so only the insiders were aware and most of them probably watched it on TV.

As far as the other issue raised last weekend about the mile and an eighth races with trailers, it seemed the only real consistent observation was that it probably made it easier for the favorites to win because if they drew a bad post that had the long straight away to get to the top or find a hole. I am not sure that is a good thing as most people would like to see bigger payoffs, but clearly the longer races apparently made it easier for the favorites as they all won.

As far as the handle, it seems that, as expected, the one race with all the horses that everybody recognizes the names of handled \$526,309 this year with two trailers and the added distance. Last year, the same race with 10 horses and a mile distance handled \$317,095, so clearly the main factor is more having horses with name recognition than the size of the field or the length of the race. We also suffered somewhat with the early start and having to finish by 11:15 pm so that our customers would not have to deal with the concert traffic as we were told that the concert would end around 11:20 pm. All in all it was a great night of racing and there was a lot of energy in the building but I was disappointed with the on-track attendance although a concert does not help.

The distance debate

The debate about trailers and distances beyond a mile is interesting. As someone who has owned racehorses, I understand Bob Boni's viewpoint. However, I think it's a really short-sighted one. This is where slots-fueled purses have gotten us. The guys putting on the show no longer need to be concerned about customers. That's a great business model if you can pull it off. Sadly, as we have seen in jurisdiction after jurisdiction, it's not one that is sustainable.

Is there any question that, for the most part, harness racing has become a dreadful product for the gambler? Regardless of what anyone wants to say about Jeff Gural – and he can breed horses, race horses, own racetracks – at heart, he's still a bettor from the grandstand at Roosevelt. And he understands what the bettor wants.

On Meadowlands Pace Night, four of the five races that were run at a mile and an eighth with trailers were absolutely great. The one that wasn't was the race where they let Marion Marauder walk around the track. I suspect that was because the extra distance fools the drivers into believing they have more time, which is why I would run the races at the straight mile and still have the trailers. But I understand the horsemen would scream even more about that.

In any case, can't everyone in this business see that what has been done isn't working? The slots-infused purses may trick some into thinking everything is great. And for them, maybe it is. Temporarily.


