Respected Trainer Chuck Sylvester Gets Cobalt Positive

Hall of Fame trainer Chuck Sylvester has been hit with a Cobalt positive in Pennsylvania after a horse he trained

Hall of Famer Chuck Sylvester says he has no idea why his horse tested positive for Cobalt moved to a new barn.

tested for an excess level of the banned substance. Sylvester has been handed a 15-day suspension and a \$500 fine by the Pennsylvania Harness Commission.

An even bigger problem for Sylvester could be his status at the Jeff Gural-owned racetracks. Gural said yesterday that if a split sample taken from the horse also tests positive for the drug then Sylvester will no longer be allowed to compete at The Meadowlands. Vernon Downs and Tioga Downs. He also said the two horses Sylvester trains for him will be

"This is a total shock to

me and very disappointing," Gural said.

The horse Murderers Row, a 3-year-old filly, tested positive for Cobalt after a June 16 race at Pocono in which she finished third. A week later she was second in a June 24 race at Chester and has not raced since.

Sylvester said yesterday he did nothing wrong.

"It was shocking to me," he said. "I have no idea how this happened. All I know is that I'm the trainer on record and that I'm going to get 15 days. That's all I can tell you. I am embarrassed that something like this happened and I have no idea why it happened. It's a horrible thing to have it happen to you. I know some people do get positives and they haven't done anything wrong. That's absolutely what happened to me."

Ask anyone in the industry who is the least likely trainer to get a Cobalt positive and Sylvester would no doubt have topped many lists. He has only one other blemish on his record, a 2008 positive for the Class 4 drug Dexamethasone, for which he was fined \$1,000.

Sylvester is a 1997 inductee into the Hall of Fame and has trained the winners of four Hambletonians.

Sebastian K has already been bred on a limited basis in Sweden.

very fast in the U.S. I know these will be tough races for him. It will be very hard to beat the best horses over here but I think he will race well. I know the racing here is very tough."

Magic Tonight is being pointed for the Aug. 8 Cashman at the Meadowlands and D'One will go the same day in the Fresh Yankee. Örjan Kihlström is scheduled to drive both at the Meadowlands.

The Cashman will be a homecoming for Magic Tonight, a 6-year-old son of Andover Hall. He began his career in the U.S. for trainer Noel Daley and last raced on this side of the Atlantic in the May 4, 2013 Meadowlands Maturity, finishing eighth.

#### He's Watching Not Done Yet

Conspicuously absent from any competition this year, He's Watching could still be brought back to the races. The 2014 Meadowlands Pace winner has not started since the Nov. 15 Breeders Crown elims. He has been battling foot issues and other problems for trainer David Menary.

"David been trying to get him on the track and that's where we are," co-owner Robert Muscara said. "There have been different discussions, but I'm not in a position to say anything about them. David has been working on the horse. Obviously, we want to see him back on the track and we're disappointed he hasn't raced this year. We are exploring all options. What we've always been hoping for all along is that we can race him again."

He's Watching's lone appearance on the track this year was a May 1 qualifier at Mohawk, where he finished second in 1:54.

Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey President Tom Luchento Has Issued this Statement/Letter on the News That Showplace Farms Is Closing:

It started with a four paragraph announcement, and it sent shockwaves through the racing industry in New Jersey. On July 23, 2015, Showplace Farms in Millstone, NJ announced that after 36 years in business, it would be closing its doors on October 1, 2015.

Showplace is 140 acres of prime real estate on Route 33. When it opened nearly four decades ago, it reflected the health of the standardbred racing industry in New Jersey, thanks to the debut of the Meadowlands Racetrack in 1976.

Showplace, home to more than 425 horses, was a new concept: a first-class training center with its own track, state-of-the-art barns, a swimming pool for rehabilitating horses, and fenced in pastures for grazing.

It would be the inspiration for other training centers throughout Central New Jersey where horsemen would pay for the privilege to house their racehorses in pastoral Monmouth County rather than free stabling at the Meadowlands.

New Jersey horsemen, however, have fallen on hard times, competing against the casino-fueled purses in surrounding states. It is making it more difficult for Showplace and other training centers to collect rent and

make their businesses viable. Meanwhile, the racetracks – including Freehold and the Meadowlands – have torn down their barn areas, leaving many horsemen without stabling options.

In a matter of months, the bulldozers will be demolishing Showplace Farms, and it will not be long before other training centers and breeding farms will be following their example. These farms will soon be shopping malls and housing developments.

Until now, the owners of the farms and training centers were willing to gamble on the future of New Jersey racing, believing that the addition of gaming at the Meadowlands would raise the purses and justify the risks.

However, the failure of our leadership in Trenton to put the question of North Jersey gaming on this year's ballot has been the last straw for Showplace Farms, and perhaps others to follow.

"It has been a good run," said Bix DiMeo, general manager of Showplace, in the announcement of closure. "But with fewer horses racing and the current economic climate here in New Jersey for harness racing, this business model no longer works for us."

For anyone in the state legislature and the governor's office who thought racing's leadership was crying wolf – well, the impending closure of Showplace Farms on the heels of the dismantling of the 1,000-acre Perretti Farms in Cream Ridge seem to suggest that instead of crying wolf, the wolf is at the door.

This is an industry that represents thousands of your

friends and neighbors, who could go from taxpayers to unemployed in a heartbeat. If the racing industry in the Garden State were to fail, it goes beyond track ownership and track employees. Its demise would trickle down to the veterinarians, hay and grain growers, blacksmiths, horse transport companies, and others who make their living in some fashion off the racing and breeding industries. This is a billion-dollar industry in jeopardy, a meaningful source of revenue to the state's economy.

Unless New Jerseyans want to see our farmland, of which 20 percent is equine-related, paved over, we need Trenton to step up and bring gaming to the Meadowlands now.

USTA Sets to Work on Summit Priorities (press release)

**COLUMBUS, OH** - United States Trotting Association Executive Vice President Mike Tanner is working with staff members and pertinent stakeholders on activities of greatest priority, as voted on by Summit participants, in increasing foal crops and the number of horse owners. The Summit was held in Columbus, Ohio, on July 13 and focused upon foal crop and ownership issues.

"We'll take the message of our recent Summit participants to those in a position to make a change that we anticipate will show improvement in the target areas," said Tanner. "There was unanimous sentiment that a shift in purse offerings to provide incentives for racing young,

untested horses would yield an upturn in the breeding industry. We will be taking that message to both Harness Horsemen International and North American Harness Racing Secretaries, Inc."

Education, in reproductive technology and husbandry practices, is also a priority.

"Nationally, we have a conversion rate of about 60 percent of mares bred to foals registered," said Tanner. "However, there's wide variation in that percentage between breeders. We have more resources to reach our members now than ever before and we plan to use them to empower all breeders, whether they have one horse or 100, to help their mares conceive and carry a healthy foal and raise that foal to be a commercially viable racehorse."

The USTA will also team up with tracks, horsemen and pertinent stake holders to educate those considering first-time purchase of a Standardbred. The first such event is planned as a four-hour workshop on Sept. 12 at the Goshen (NY) Yearling Sale. Market Share Is Back, Tetrick On Fire at The Meadowlands

Entering Friday night, Market Share was winless in four starts this season. In fact, he was yet to hit the board. But that all changed in the featured \$28,500 Open Handicap Trot at The Meadowlands. Market Share had his game face on this Friday night, as he soared around the East Rutherford oval, winning in wire to wire fashion as the 2-1 second choice. Market Share led at every point of call, and trotted a 27.2 final quarter while holding off the fast-closing Handover Belle to win in 1:51.1. The race favorite, Obrigado, trailed for much of the mile and despite flying home in 26.3, could only manage to finish third.

Both the winner and third place finisher are likely headed to the John Cashman Memorial on Hambletonian Day. Eliminations (if necessary) will be contested next Saturday night.

The win was the 26th in the illustrious career of Market Share, whose earnings surpassed \$3.7 Million.

He is owned by Richard Gutnick, William Augustine and the T L P Stable. He is conditioned by Linda Toscano and was driven to victory by Tim Tetrick, one of five wins on the 12-race card for Tetrick.

Tetrick also scored in the \$28,500 Fillies and Mares Open Handicap Pace with the Pennsylvania invader, Ooh Bad Shark, who scored an off the pace win in 1:48.3.

Ooh Bad Shark left for position from post six, but was quickly trapped along the pylons as Sandbetweenurtoes and Radar Contact vied for command. In the stretch Ooh Bad Shark was loaded with pace, but had to wait for racing room before angling out wide and finishing with a flourish to chase down Radar Contact with a 26.3 final quarter to score in a lifetime best performance. Longshot Lucy's Pearl rallied to be third.

The winner is owned by Donna Fedorak and William Wiggins, who is also the trainer.

The first round of the Kindergarten Trotting Series commenced on Friday as well. The colts split into three \$10,000 divisions while the fillies contested a pair of \$10,000 heats.

On the colt side, Reve Royale, Waitlifter K and Winter Harbor emerged victorious while Hollywood Hill and Twice Is Right scored in the filly divisions. Both filly winners are trained by Jimmy Takter and are eligible to the Jim Doherty Memorial while Waitlifter K and Winter Harbor are Peter Haughton-eligible.

Brittany Farms had a big night, finding the winner's circle three times with Winter Harbor, Propulsion and Twice Is Right.

Rules Of The Road came up with a big effort in a condition trotting event, dominating a solid group in 1:52.3, a lifetime mark. The filly is trained by Janice Connor for the Arden Homestead Stable and was driven by Corey Callahan. She is eligible to the Hambletonian Oaks. Eliminations will take place next Saturday night.

There was more than one winning ticket in the last race Jackpot Super Hi-5, therefore that carryover will be \$214,272.42 into the 13th race on Saturday.

The Saturday program will begin at 7:15 P.M. and it features the \$200,000 New Jersey Classic and the \$100,000 Miss New Jersey.



Favorite Horses and Horsemen from the Glory Days

It's impossible for most people today to imagine just what a powerful magnet that Roosevelt and Yonkers were in the 1960s. Racing there was the dream of every horseman and owner. It was comparable to the impact that the

Meadowlands had after it opened in 1976.

Yonkers and Roosevelt were to harness racing what banks were to the famous robber Willie Sutton. When asked why he robbed banks, Willie said, "That's

where the money is."

It was the same at Roosevelt and Yonkers. The purses were huge compared to most other harness tracks. But the competition on the track was brutal; the best horses and best horsemen were regulars at these tracks. As the song says, if you could make it there, you could make it anywhere.

So I got my education in harness racing watching the best. Stanley Dancer and Billy Haughton were legendary, of course, but there were so many more. Harness racing has changed so much that it's impossible to compare Dancer and Haughton to the next generation of heroes, guys like Herve Filion and Bill O'Donnell.

For one thing, Dancer and Haughton trained and drove their own horses. I suspect that they had royal carpet trips in races because of who they were. They made it to the top without a severe challenge or they "found" holes when their steeds couldn't clear to the top from the gate.

Dancer was notorious for slowing down the pace when he was cutting the mile. If another driver pulled, he had no chance of clearing without a speed duel. (Maybe that's what a race was all about.) The opening and closing quarters were the speed sprints on the Big Apple half-mile tracks.

When catch drivers started appearing, it was for the bigger stables when the bosses were off racing on the Grand Circuit. Ben Steall, a second trainer in the Haughton Stable, would catch-drive for Billy. Later drivers like Buddy Gilmour and Ben Webster appeared. Webster actually had a training barn.

When driver George Sholty came to New York from the Midwest in the early 1960s, he showed me that the whip was an accelerator. Sholty was such a little guy that his success caused lightweight drivers to become all the rage. Clint Hodgins certainly was not a lightweight, but he was one of my favorites among the older drivers on the Roosevelt-Yonkers circuit. He raced Bye Bye Byrd, a horse that took on all comers. He also had the top trotting mare Elaine Rodney. When Clint was in a race, he was always a threat.

If I had to pick the races that stand out in my memory, it would be the duels between Overtrick (1963 Jug winner) and New Zealand import Cardigan Bay in 1964. More than a half-century later, I still have photos of Overtrick and Cardigan Bay in my home in Manhattan. And I can still hear cheers of a packed grandstand echo in my mind when I stare at those photos.

They hit the wire together in two separate races. The "Photo" sign was posted. Then we all waited. And waited. While the bettors waited, John Patterson with Overtrick and Vernon Dancer with Cardigan Bay both milled around in the stretch, playing chicken. Neither driver wanted to be close to the paddock, symbolizing their defeat.

Cardy won one of the photo finishes and Overtrick won the other. That was fitting and fair.

Looking back over the years, great horses stand out more than horsemen because they don't tarnish over time. Su Mac Lad, trained and driven by Dancer, was one of my favorite trotters. He had the eight hole every week at Roosevelt and Yonkers. I suspect Dancer would lose a race every month just to keep the free-for-all horses from shipping out.

The free-for-all purse was \$25,000 each week---that equates to almost \$200,000 in today's dollars. The classification system then used went down to C-3, the lowest rung on the ladder. Trotters were always on the card Monday through thru Friday, but never on Saturday except once a year for the Roosevelt International. The FFA trot was on Thursday.

The noted basketball and sports announcer Marty Glickman was the race caller then at Yonkers. I loved Marty's calls---he was cool, concise, and rhythmic. One night when Billy Haughton's top trotter went offstride, Marty actually yelled, "Trader Horn on a break!" and then resumed his cool and casual race call.

The Roosevelt International was so successful that Yonkers started an International Pace series. All of us wise guys just assumed that the American horses were the best, but Caduceus and Apmat of New Zealand stunned the best hometown heroes. That opened the floodgates for overnight steeds with the letters A or N at the end of their name to designate that they were from Australia or New Zealand.

Ah, the memories. Remember that in this era the New York Yankees with Mantle and Maris dominated baseball. To me harness racing was far more exciting than the World Series. It took just two minutes, not seven games, to determine the winner.

National Seelster has dominated NYSS action, with four wins in as many legs. But two of those victories came on half-mile ovals at Monticello and Yonkers. Chris Ryder, who trains National Seelster for Robert Mondillo and Oompa's Farm, thinks his star will have little trouble handling The Meadows' five-eighths-mile track since he's already won at several bigger tracks.

"It's turning out he does excel on a half, but it remains to be seen how he'll do on bigger tracks," Ryder said. "I don't think a bigger track will be a problem, but he certainly does like the half."

National Seelster finished second to division leader Wiggle It JiggleIt in a Hempt elimination at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs — also a five-eights-mile track — but drew post 9 in the final and couldn't get involved. Unraced at 2, he has won seven of 13 starts and \$137,402 this year, with a mark of 1:50.2 — on the seven-eighths-mile track at Vernon Downs

The colt's performance has caught the attention of horsemen in an acquisition mode. In fact, Ryder indicated that following his most recent victory, the owners received an overture from a "serious" potential buyer.

"My owners aren't looking to sell, so they weren't major

talks," Ryder said.

Ryder said he's used his customary training regimen to prepare National Seelster for the Adios, and that the colt has responded well.

"I tried backing off with him in the spring, but he didn't like it," Ryder says. "I've gone back to the usual methods."

National Seelster leaves him post 3 in race 4 as the 5-2 second choice and will have the services of Tim Tetrick. Ryder, who has been known to drive some of his own stakes horses at The Meadows, said he never entertained the notion of putting down his own name.

"I like driving my own horses once in a while when we get stuck for a driver, but I wouldn't want to embarrass myself," he said. "I like the big boys with broad shoulders to take the responsibility. I need someone to blame."
