Hambletonian Picture Could Be Crystal Clear After Zweig

Can anyone beat Jimmy Takter in this year's Hambletonian?

That question will be a lot easier to answer around 4:30 this afternoon as Takter will send out four of his Hambo

hopefuls in the \$370,000 Zweig Memorial at Vernon Downs. The Takter quartet, which will be coupled in the wagering, consists of Uncle Lasse, Canepa Hanover, Pinkman and Whom Shall I Fear. It's not a matter of Takter separating himself from the pack but,

now, one of his horses giving off signs they are the superior 3-year-old trotter in their stable.

"It's going to be very difficult to beat any one of Jimmy's horses, let alone all four," said trainer George Ducharme, who will challenge Team Takter with Wings Of Royalty. "My horse has to step up a little bit to think he can go at this level."

The situation is reminiscent of last year when Takter trained what most considered the top three members of the division in Father Patrick, Nuncio and Trixton. He wound up winning the Hambletonian with Trixton. This year, he has even more depth as he has at least five horses pointing for the race. His list of contenders also includes The Bank, a winner of a division of the Stanley Dancer who will sit this one out.

Of his four Zweig starters, Pinkman has been the most consistent and would be the favorite if the group were able to race uncoupled. The 2014 Dan Patch Award winner, he has lost just once this year from six tries. He will be driven by Yannick Gingras. Uncle Lasse is also a strong candidate as he gave Pinkman all he could handle when losing to him by just a head in the Beal Final at Pocono Downs.

Then there's Canepa Hanover. He was a \$300,000 yearling buy at the 2013 Harrisburg sales and, though he's made only \$129,868 in his career, he appears to be a horse with a huge upside. With Takter driving, he finished third behind Pinkman in a Dancer division, which was his first start in four weeks.

"He raced really, really well," co-owner Marvin Katz said of Canepa Hanover's last race. "He hadn't raced in 28 days and considering he didn't race a full race in finals of the Goodtimes (when he broke stride) it really had been five weeks since he raced. I know he trained well at the farm in

between starts, but that was a big effort, a fast mile and he trotted home in a fast time (27). It was a great effort.


"I know this is a process and I have all the confidence in the world in Jimmy Takter. There's no one better when it comes to bringing a horse to a big race like this. I don't get discouraged or encouraged. I just sit back and watch the master at work."

Whom Shall I Fear hasn't hit the board in his last four starts and looks like the weakest of the group.

Ron Burke once thought his best shot at winning the Hambletonian was going to come with the filly Mission Brief. But she hasn't been as sharp as she was last year, which has moved Habitat to the top of Burke's Hambletonian contenders. Habitat was second in the Dancer, a neck behind Pinkman. Mission Brief will also appear on the card, racing in the Zweig division for fillies.

"Habitat is just always so consistent," Burke said. "I think they will both do well this weekend and I enjoy racing at Vernon because it is such a nice track."

As for Mission Brief, Burke has said she has been battling back problems throughout the year. He hasn't ruled out racing her in the Hambletonian, but it seems more likely he will go with her in the Hambletonian Oaks. In her last start



she lost by a nose in the Del Miller. It was the first time she has lost when not breaking stride.

"I know she was beaten last week," Burke said. "But I really like how she came out of the race and I think we are ironing out her back issues at the right time. We've definitely been doing a lot of work on it.

"I thought Mission Brief raced super last week. I know how I feel when my back bothers me so I can only imagine what it is like for her. She fought back on the inside but I don't think she ever saw that other filly (Spirit To Win) coming on the outside. You also have to give it that other filly. Mission Brief trotted her last guarter in :26.3 and the winner trotted in :26 flat."

Ducharme won the 2013 Hambletonian with Royalty For Life, like Wings Of Royalty, a son of RC Royalty. He doesn't think this year's candidate stacks up to his Hambletonian winner, but he sees a horses that is on the improve.

"I don't think he has the raw speed that Royalty For Life had," Ducharme said. "He seems to be more a grinder type horse that seems to be getting better at the right time of the year. But Jimmy will be tough. I think he's definitely got all the best cards in his hand." | share story |

Sorella-Coleman Team to Break Up By Perry Lefko

Horse owner Adriano Sorella is ending his partnership with trainer Casie Coleman, putting all the horses they own

up for auction with the exception Vegas Vacation, with which they won the 2013 Little Brown Jug. because of financial reasons and philosophical differences.

Fourteen horses they own will be dispersed Meadowlands, Vegas



Vacation is not part of the sale because he is currently sidelined with an injury, Sorella said. Sorella owns at least 25 percent of the horses and in some cases 50 percent.

Sorella, who has been active buying horses in recent years and is also one of the more high-profile owners in Ontario, contacted Harness Racing Update to provide specifics for the dispersal, amid various rumours, including suggestions he is broke.

"I'm just trying to make a decision based on the fact the horses aren't doing well," he said. "The stable as a whole is not doing well."

Sorella said the plan was to include Vegas Vacation, who did not race in 2014 because of an injury and has only started six times this season without a win, in the sale. He said he abandoned the idea because of how it would be perceived selling a Jug winner. It became a moot point when the horse suffered another injury.

"I'm going to stay in horse racing," Sorella insisted. "I'm getting out, but I know I won't be out for long. I'll be back in horse racing, but there's a couple other things I'm doing right now that are a lot more important to me. I'm merging my company with another company and this is taking up a lot of time. I have no time for all these horses. When the racing is going bad and you have no time for all these horses, you have to start picking and choosing your priorities. That's just it. It's easy for people to say, 'oh, look at you, you're a quitter' but you've to say to yourself 'what do I have more time for?' I'm looking at the horse racing, I'm losing money and my business is booming.

"It wasn't an easy decision, but it wasn't a hard one, either. Up until two weeks ago I had 16 horses racing and the stable would have made just \$500,000. We're in the middle of summer. I understand there's a lot of two-year-olds that haven't raced yet, but if your two-year-olds are already qualifying and you can tell they are sires stakes horses or lower-stakes horses at best, you've got to say to yourself what makes financial sense here? If you're spending hundreds of thousands of dollars and you can't foresee yourself making that kind of money or even breaking even in the stable, you've got to start making changes."

He said he discussed the idea of buying claiming horses "just to keep the ball rolling," but Coleman, who switched a few years ago to racing young horses bought at sales or homebreds, didn't want to go that route, so Sorella figured it was best to end their business relationship.

"I totally understand (her decision)," he said. "I've got respect for her. She only wants two-year-olds, three-year-olds, good free-for-allers and I get that. She cut her stable down to 40-plus horses. She wants to have the best she can possibly have. I like that mentality of only having the best, but at a certain point I need to start making money, too."

Sorella said he asked one of Coleman's assistant trainers, Andrew Harris, if he would claim horses for him, and he agreed. But Coleman didn't favor that idea and Sorella said that contributed to his relationship with her going in a



"downward spiral."

"I understood what she was trying to say, but I didn't get it," he said. "I understood her point, but I didn't get her point. There's some really nice horses going into the sale and it really sucks because you've got so much money tied into it. But what are you going to do? It has to make sense. I'm trying to wipe the slate clean and start all over again."

Sorella, who began as a harness racing owner seven years ago with Casie through a program to introduce new owners to the business, is hoping to remain friends with the veteran trainer, who has won numerous awards and major races in recent years. Coleman has been voted Canada's trainer of the year several times.

"You've got to look at it from my point, it's a business decision," he said. "A dozen-plus horses and every one of them is losing money in that barn and you have to say to yourself 'I know there's good horses here, I can see them,' but in that stable, it's a high-powered, high-results stable, and what's the politest way of saying the bills are expensive in that stable, so your horses have to be performing to the maximum peak. That's basically what I'm saying. I don't know what the nicest way of saying that is because that's what the truth is. You're in a high-powered stable. If you play for the Detroit Red Wings it's a little bit different than if you play for the Minnesota Wild because there's more expected from you. There's a lot more that comes with the territory. The horses get everything that they need, they are treated great, she's good staff. Her two assistant trainers -Anthony Beaton and Andrew Harris - are the best assistant trainers I've ever met in my life. Those guys could both be (head) trainers someplace else. I have all kinds of respect for them. It's hard because I like those guys, but what are you going to do?

"At some point you have to say what makes sense and what doesn't? I'm in the middle of building a \$3 million house, do you think I want to stare at millions of dollars lost in horse racing? It doesn't make sense. The accountant looks at me and says, 'You're crazy, dude.' She's saying, 'Adriano, you're nuts. You're bleeding out of every single finger right now.'

"When you're backed against a wall and you've got to make a decision, you don't want to be a statistic (where people are saying, 'Look at that guy, he lost all his money on horse racing.' That's not happening here. I can go on taking a beating on these horses, but I'd rather wipe the slate clean and know I've lost \$200,000, \$300,000, \$400,000 in livestock and start all over again.

"The big thing I'm trying to make people understand is these horses are not garbage. I'm trying to max out as much money as I possibly can get out of these horses going into the sale, but I'm trying to make people understand they're not going to sale because I'm trying to get rid of bad horses. They're going to the sale because I'm getting out, wiping the slate clean. Some people are going to benefit from it buying some nice horses and they'll eventually see I'm starting fresh and most likely it's got to be a different trainer.

"I'm building a house right around the corner from Mohawk Racetrack, I'm not getting out of horse racing. We

just seem to not be on the same page anymore, myself and Casie and that's never good. There's a possibility of getting destroyed and losing millions of dollars when you're already coming off a really bad year where you lost \$750,000. Do vou really want to get killed like that?

"I notice on social media people saying, 'maybe he got too big.' Does it really matter if you have 20 horses losing money and you cut down to 10 horses losing money? It doesn't make any sense. So big deal, instead of losing 10 horses losing \$100,000 each, you're losing five horses losing \$100,000 each. That makes no sense to me. That's not business." | share story |

Magic Tonight Third in Meadowlands Qualifier

In his first appearance this year on a U.S. racetrack, Elitlopp winner Magic Tonight finished third in a qualifier yesterday at the Meadowlands, hitting the wire in 1:54. He finished five lengths behind the race winner, Lindy's Tru Grit.

One race later, his stablemate D'One won her qualifier by three lengths in 1:54.3. Marcus Johansson drove both horses for Swedish-based trainer Roger Walmann. Magic Tonight is being pointed for the Aug. 8 Cashman Memorial at the Meadowlands. D'One will race that same afternoon in the Fresh Yankee.

It was a busy morning at the Meadowlands with 15 qualifying races, eight of them for 2-year-olds. One of the more notable winners among that group was Bene Bene, a Kadabra filly that sold for \$400,000 at Lexington. Trained by Nifty Norman and driven by Dave Miller she went in 1:59.2.

As is almost always the case, the big winner among trainers on the morning was Jimmy Takter as he won three of the eight baby races.

#### Canadians Conquer Jersey

Making his first start outside of Canada, Split The House took off in the stretch to win last night's \$200,000 SBOA

Last night, Waples hustled him off the gate but yielded when Artspeak and Scott Zeron made it clear they were intent on controlling the pace. Waples drafted in behind Artspeak and then came after him near the top of the stretch. He got by him fairly easily and then had little problem holding off a late bid from 13-1 shot Revenge Shark. He won by a half-length in 1:48.3.

"I just wanted to draft as long as I could," Waples said. "I have a lot of respect for Artspeak. He was going to be a tough horse to track down, whether he's at the top of his game or not right now. He's a very good animal. I was hoping to draft along and just hope my horse had pace. At the head of the lane he swelled up and I swung him to the outside and he dug down. He is a really, really nice horse. He has all the parts."

Four races earlier on the card, Wicked Little Minx won SBOA Miss New Jersey for 3-year-old pacing fillies. She drew the ten post but driver Brett Miller did a good job working out a trip on his way to a 2 1/4-length win. The winner is trained by Nancy Johansson and the winning time was 1:50. It was only the second win on the year from eights starts for the 3-year-old filly.

"I love this filly," Johansson said. "She tries so hard. She is very strong. She's like a big diesel, Mack truck. Once she gets rolling she's pretty honest and she'll go there."

Sent off as the 6-5 favorite The Show Returns finished third.

#### "Super" in the Gerrity

The rugged half-mile track specialist P H Supercam picked up his biggest win on the year as he scored a game victory in last night's Joe Gerrity Jr. Memorial Pace at Saratoga harness.

The 8-year-old gelding by Million Dollar Cam rarely ventures into Grand Circuit action, but last night made the most of a big opportunity in a \$260,000 race. In his 172nd career start, he went after Dancin Yankee on the third turn but couldn't get past that rival. Instead, the two got locked into an elongated battle with P H Supercam getting the worst of it on the outside. Driven by Jason Bartlett, P H Supercam hung tough and out fought Dancin Yankee to the wire to win by a neck in 1:501. He paid \$11.20 and is trained by Jeff Bamond Jr.

Domethatagain was third. Luck Be Withyou, the second choice at 2-1, failed to show his customary speed, settled into last and never seriously challenged while finishing sixth.

The win was the latest for the red-hot Jeff Bamond Jr. stable. A week earlier, Bamond won the \$430,600 William Haughton with Mach It So and the \$213,450 Golden Girls with Anndrovette. Both races were at the Meadowlands.

Manhattan Beach Breaks His Brother's Stake Mark in Pass at the Meadows By Evan Pattak

WASHINGTON, PA (July 26, 2015) - Saturday's Adios eliminations card at The Meadows was supported by three other compelling stakes that, along with the elims, comprised 13 of the 15 races. Yannick Gingras and trainer Ron Burke each scored five times in those stakes while Tim Tetrick enjoyed a stake four-bagger. Highlights from Saturday's stakes:


The Albatross, \$217,340 PASS - 2-Year-Old Colt and **Gelding Pacers** 



Manhattan Beach

Manhattan Beach zipped to the lead for Tetrick and rolled home in a stake-record 1:51.1. bettering the mark of 1:52 held jointly by Limelight Beach and Seventh Secret. Sossy's King Kong

was second, 1-1/2 lengths back, with McPhil third. Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi LLC, Geoffrey Lyons Mound and Wingfield Brothers campaign the Somebeachsomewhere-Benear gelding, a full brother to the



former record-holder, Limelight Beach, winner of the 2014 Little Brown Jug.

Check Six powered to the point with a quarter-pole move for Gingras and held off the late thrust of McDave to down him by a neck in 1:52.3, with Mr Right Hanover third. Burke trains the son of Somebeachsomewhere-Southwind Vanna for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, William Switala and James Martin.

"That was a horse race down the stretch — he wouldn't let them go by him," Gingras said. "He has all kinds of potential, He has the size, a nice gait, speed and guts. He has the package. Pacing colts are a little fickle at this stage. In another month, they'll separate the men from the boys."

Do Over Hanover pulled the pocket down the backside to avoid the faltering leader, Genovese, and held off Another Daily Copy by a neck to triumph in 1:52.4. Allie's Cruiser earned show.

"He's very versatile and good mannered," said Jim Campbell, who trains the son of Western Ideal-Driven To Sin — a \$25,000 yearling acquisition — for Jeffrey Snyder, Michael Snyder and Robert Unice. "I'll give him a week or two off because he's gone hard the last three weeks. We'll probably get him ready for the next sires stake leg."

Spider Man Hanover and The Catamount Kid took the other Albatross divisions.

#### The Romola Hanover, \$182,016 PASS, 3-Year-Old Filly **Pacers**

Doctor Terror unleashed a huge uncovered bid from sixth that carried her to victory in 1:50.4 for Corey Callahan and trainer Blake MacIntosh, who owns the daughter of Western Terror-Doctor Seth with Stuart McIntosh. Imagine Dragon was second by a head, with Momas Got A Gun third. With the victory, Doctor Terror soared over \$200,000 in career earnings.

The other Romola Hanover split also went to a daughter of Western Terror, as Safe From Terror and Gingras edged her stablemate, Storm Point, by a neck to win in 1:51.1. Macarena Mama completed the ticket. Burke conditions Safe From Terror for Our Horse Cents Stables, Stable 45 and J&T Silva Stables.

#### \$60,000 PA Stallion Series - 3-Year-Old Filly Pacers

Off a layoff of more than two months, Dobre Povedane matched Icommandmyspirit's stake record of 1:51.3 when she followed cover and brushed home to defeat Lean On Yourself by 1-3/4 lengths, with Angel Or Terror third. Callahan drove for trainer John Butenschoen and owners David Prushnok and John Prushnok.

"We thought she could use a little time," said Tyler Butenschoen, the winner's assistant trainer. "She raced good her last race but maybe seemed a little sore afterward. Nothing major, but we gave her a little time, and she trained back great. I expected her to race good, but a 1:51.3 mile was an eye-opener."

Mezzanine Fashion and Repeat Please captured the other stallion series splits.

#### Special 'Delivery' For Menary Courtesy Of Woodbine Entertainment

Even before his three-year-old pacing geldings Robert Hill and J Js Delivery swept the Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series divisions at Mohawk Racetrack on Saturday, trainer

Dave Menary was having a pretty amazing weekend.

"I'm pretty pumped. I wasn't at the races tonight myself. I was watching them at home on TV, because yesterday morning I had a daughter born," explained the rural Cambridge, Ont. resident. "Julie and I, my fiancé, we had a beautiful baby girl born yesterday morning. We just come home from the hospital tonight."

As if in celebration of daughter Mikayla's birth, the Menary Stable had an extraordinary evening at Mohawk. In addition to sweeping the Gold divisions, the trainer captured an overnight event and posted three seconds and one third.

"I had seven in to go, including three colts in the Sires Stakes, and it couldn't have gone any better," said the trainer. "Everything we raced tonight has been unbelievable."

Adding another touch of the extraordinary to the evening was the fact that James MacDonald was in the race bike behind both of Menary's Gold Series winners, just one night after being involved in an accident at Mohawk that sent him to the hospital for stitches in his arm.

In the first \$105,000 Gold test, MacDonald and Robert Hill started from post six and were sitting seventh when Shoe Shine reached the opening quarter in :26.4. At the :54.1 half and 1:22.1 three-quarters clocked by fan favourite Drachan Hanover, Robert Hill was still at the back of the pack, although MacDonald had moved him into the outer lane.

At the top of the stretch, Drachan Hanover still had a short lead and another Menary other starter, Sportsmanship, looked poised for victory, but when MacDonald gave Robert Hill a clear look at the wire the gelding powered down the stretch to a one and three-quarter length victory in a personal-best 1:51.1. Sportsmanship finished second, giving Menary a one-two sweep, and Thinkofagameplan rounded out the top three.

"Last week I think Sportsmanship went the mile of his life, and tonight when they come up to the head of the stretch I was cheering for him, but then all of sudden, when he was getting conquered it was by my other horse, so I had to change cheering," said Menary. "I had to jump off one bandwagon and get on the other bandwagon."

Menary conditions Jeremes Jet son Robert Hill for Tom Hill of Lancashire, Great Britain and Sportswriter son

Sportsmanship for Kenneth Ewen of Georgetown, Ont., Denis Breton of Welland, Ont., Thomas Kyron of Toronto, Ont., and Parkinson Farms of Lucan, Ont.

In the second Gold division, MacDonald and J Js Delivery also lined up at post six, but the Guelph, Ont. resident hustled the Jeremes Jet son away from the starting gate, reaching the opening quarter in :26.1. The duo yielded to Go Daddy Go through the :53.2 half, but were back out and powering toward the front at the 1:21.1 three-quarters.

J Js Delivery turned for home with a narrow lead and had to battle all the way down the stretch to secure the victory, keeping a neck in front of Go Daddy Go and Star Cover. The 1:49.4 clocking was a personal best for J Js Delivery, who had posted one second and one third in the first two Gold legs.

Bob Hamather of Exeter, Ont. owns J Js Delivery, who is a half-brother to \$1.1 million winner Secrets Nephew.

"It's been a non-sleep week. I'm lucky I have a good staff around me," said Menary. "Everything has just fallen into place, partly because of luck, partly because of the people, but mostly because of the horses."

Joining J Js Delivery in the winner's circle was lucky "Be A Winner" contestant Nick Toltl, who had his photo taken with the gelding and driver MacDonald. In addition, Toltl will be back at Mohawk for the Sept. 26 Grassroots Championships enjoying dinner for four and a \$100 wagering voucher.

In regular racing action, Shamballa earned his third straight win in the \$34,000 Preferred Pace -- and fifth in his last six starts -- for the Rick Zeron Stables of Oakville. Ont. and Tao Racing LLC of Pompano Beach, Florida. Zeron guided the five-year-old Somebeachsomewhere gelding to the 1:49.4 victory over Evenin Of Pleasure and Piston Broke.

Freaky Feet Pete is Freaky Fast at Hoosier Park By Emily Gaskin

ANDERSON, IN (July 25, 2015) - After winning the opening round of the 2015 Champion Drivers Series at Hoosier Park Racing & Casino on Saturday, July 25, Trace Tetrick would find the winner's circle once more on the evening as he guided Freaky Feet Pete to a stunning 1:48.4 score in the \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes Final for three-year-old pacing colts and geldings.

With the win, Freaky Feet Pete extended his win streak to five, established a new lifetime best, and equaled the track record at Hoosier Park for three-year-old pacing colts in the process. The previous mark of 1:48.4 was established by Always B Miki and Peter Wrenn in Indiana Sires Stakes action in 2014.

Freaky Feet Pete was unhurried off the gate through opening splits of :26.1 and :55 set by Gallipolis and Tyler Smith. Tetrick gave Freaky Feet Pete the green light down the backside and the three-year-old colt quickly took command just past the half.

As the rest of the field struggled to stay within striking distance at the three-quarter-clocking in 1:22.1, it was clear the race belonged to Freaky Feet Pete as he effortlessly opened up on the field with a six length lead turning for

home. Freaky Feet Pete used a :26.3 final quarter, under no urging from Tetrick, to overpower his competition by nine

"He's an amazing animal," trainer Larry Rheinheimer said of his star pupil. "He amazes me every time he is on the track. We always knew we had a nice colt but I don't think any of us dreamed of him being this nice."

Freaky Feet Pete notched his fourth win from five outings this season with his only defeat coming from Wiggle It Jiggleit in the opening round of the \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes finals earlier in the season. The homebred son of Rockin Image-Skyway Lori has now won fourteen of sixteen lifetime outings while amassing \$387,100 for his owners Mary Jo Rheinheimer and Marty Rheinheimer.



Revisiting the Three Year Old "Crown" - It's Doable, and Needed


It's been close to three years since my Harness Racing Update column titled "Harness Racing Needs a Triple Crown." I wasn't the first to write such an article, nor was I the last, but it amazes me how relevant that article is today; more, I believe, than it was many years ago.

In June, American Pharoah won the Triple Crown of Thoroughbred racing. There's been quite a bit of chatter about what this means for Thoroughbred racing, or horse racing in general. I am not going to bore you with grandiose tales - stories that are filled with words like 'game changer', 'savior' or the like. Let's hope that more people watch and bet the sport, or more owners look to buy horses, sure, but I, like you, wouldn't be betting on anything game changing. What American Pharoah did, and the Triple Crown does in general, is sustain a sport in the nation's consciousness. It, year to year, keeps people watching, and over time, one hopes the number of people watching and wagering on horse racing increases.



The above graph shows web interest in the search term "Triple Crown of Horse Racing" (blue) versus "The Stanley Cup" (red). There are two simple takeaways from the above graph: i) both events seem to be growing and ii) they, most notably in Triple Crown years, overlap. Thoroughbred horse racing is not as popular as a major league sport like hockey, but for a few big event days a year, it is, and that's an unqualified success.

This is not seen with any other event in Thoroughbred horse racing. Take, for example, the Breeders' Cup.



When comparing the Breeders' Cup (blue) to the Kentucky Derby (red) there is simply no comparison. Even the 2010 year, which featured Zenyatta going for 20 in a row in prime time in the Breeders' Cup Classic, it did not crack the magic of any Derby. The old, storied Triple Crown race dominates its newer rival; this despite the Breeders' Cup being on network television for 30 years, being branded by the Cup team guite well, and being, in itself, a pretty storied event.

The public is conditioned to understand the Triple Crown series - a three year old trying to win three races in a prescribed period of time. They're not conditioned to understand an 8.5 furlong juvenile filly turf race, or a Breeders' Cup Sprint or Marathon. The Triple Crown is understood and generational, the Breeders' Cup hopes to

build upon the interest already shown in the Triple Crown to stock its own viewership pool in November.

This is why an event of three, or possibly four races for Standardbred 3-year-olds is possibly beneficial for harness racing. The public grasps the concept because they have been conditioned to, yes, but taking it one step further, fans of Thoroughbred racing love the series, and it's incredibly easy to sell a similar event to them. That is a large pool of potential bettors, viewers and fans. Politicians, the government and others who hold the purse strings for racing (through slot purses and regulation) understand it as well. They are becoming more and more important to speak to, through these events.

In addition, harness racing is smaller and more disparate than Thoroughbred racing. There's also a heck of a lot less money to promote the sport. If the Thoroughbreds have resources to only promote two large events per year, and quite frankly, excel in only one of them, how can we expect harness racing to promote itself 365 days a year? It would be great if the Hoosier Cup, Battle of Lake Erie, Yonkers Trot, Canadian Trotting Classic and a half dozen other good events had unlimited money to promote to the masses, but that's unrealistic.

I think it's pretty clear that one series, with the backing of the sport itself, is the answer to at least one major question: "How can harness racing remain in the nation's consciousness?"

Whenever this topic is broached in the sport the inevitable argument that Yonkers "owns" the Triple Crown trademark for harness, or that the event has to be comprised of the Cane, Messenger, and Jug rears its head. Then the idea gets stuck in a bog. I say poppycock. Ninety-nine out of 100 people could not even name the three races in the harness Triple Crown, and who says it has to be called a Triple Crown anyway?

Another criticism (one that I think is valid) is that the sport runs on slots and if a race is chosen as a 'Triple Slam' race, it might not be here in ten years, if the state or province that holds it loses alternative gaming. That's probably an easy fix, though: Pick three races that have backing, or have succeeded without slot machines. The Meadowlands Pace, North America Cup and Little Brown Jug fit that bill just fine. As for the logistics - staking, purses, a slush fund to market the brand - that's not overly difficult. Despite what you may hear (or sometimes read in this column) harness racing is filled with capable individuals with ability to put it together.

Harness racing is small, compartmentalized and off the radar with the general public. It does not have mega-millions to promote every event, at every track from Cal Expo to Pompano, from Charlottetown Driving Park to Fraser Downs. Harness racing needs an event -or series of events - that can tap into the general public's built-in awareness of horse racing; an event or series of events that can be branded; an event or series of events that can attract viewership and betting dollars; an event to remind politicians and others it exists; an event or series of events that can be run from a central office, with a goal in mind. The easiest and most beneficial set of events is a Triple Crown type series for 3-year-old pacers. Harness racing should focus on the concept and develop it for 2016 and bevond.

#### How Much Does it Cost to Smile?

There have been talks over the last couple of years regarding ways to get new fans into the game. Discussions surrounding new owners, lower takeouts and non-gaming attractions abound. However, I feel the real key to bringing new players and keeping the older ones lies in the customer experience. With the pari-mutuel system in place, the tracks want the players to win. This isn't always the case as well all know. While we cannot guarantee the players win, we can provide them with a positive experience. Win or lose, if the customer is enjoying themselves there is a good chance they will be back.

Tracks must play to their strengths. Most casual fans and first timers have no idea about the takeout associated with different types of wagers. Nor do they have a great understanding of the different classes of races put on. Races such as the Triple Crown series for the flats have been ingrained in American society and as such are much more than race cards; they are events. When the Breeders' Cup races were created, it became over time a huge event for all race fans and I believe the handle and attendance speak to that. These events are wildly successful, not only due to the quality of racing being presented but also due to the frequency of them.

There has been much concern over declining horse populations. While this is true, I think the real problem is the number of races being run on a normal week. Look at the average attendance and handle for tracks that run multiple times during the week year-round. There is nothing appealing or attractive to these. Most are simply gambling

operations churning out as many races as they can fill. For the novice and new player, what is so exciting about these?

There will always be some tracks that do well. Saratoga has a certain charm and atmosphere that is hard to copy. The fan experience of being able to sit under the trees and essentially picnic all day by bringing in your own food and beverages makes it equally affordable and attractive for everyone involved. The fact they run such a short meet also adds a sense of urgency to it; enjoy it before its gone.

Parx has recently decided to take a much needed break and come back with the trendy "racing festival" this fall with higher purses and better quality fields. The Meadowlands and Monmouth Park are trying to run non-gaming promotions every week as well as entertainment. Canterbury has seen huge increases in attendance, yet the handle has decreased over the years. It has yet to be determined if they will work in the long run, but at least they are trving.

Tracks must be willing to try something different, and if they fail try again. Cut back on race days, spend money on promotions and advertising and improve the customer experience. Preach to your employees that customer service is key, after all they are the front line interacting with your customer base. How much does it cost to smile? What about having a quarterly meeting between management, staff and fans? Let everyone express their concerns or ways they feel things can be improved. Let them know how important they are and how vital they are to this game we love.

Resources and racing dates need to be coordinated across state lines, as well as a general governing body, but that is a discussion for another time. Ultimately, if the fan can leave with a smile on their face and a pleasant memory in their mind, they will be back. You can bet on that. - Joe Longo

#### People Racing For Lower Purses Need Love Too
