Fear The Dragon outguns Huntsville in Adios

The sport's number one ranked horse defeated number two to win the 51st Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids.

Fear The Dragon (David Miller) edged Huntsville (Tim Tetrick) at the wire in the 51st Adios Saturday at The Meadows.

Fear The Dragon, harness racing's top-rated horse, cemented that position Saturday at The Meadows when he wore down the sport's No. 2-ranked horse, Huntsville, with a prolonged, dramatic first-over move that brought him victory in the \$400,000 final of the 51st Delvin Miller Adios Pace for the Orchids.

Heavy rains that had soaked The Meadows for the better part of two days stopped shortly before the card began, yielding to sunny, cool weather and a fast track for the highly anticipated battle of No. 1 and No. 2. Early on, it appeared that drama might not develop as Huntsville and Tim Tetrick, got an easier lead than most observers anticipated, including Fear The Dragon's trainer, Brian Brown.

"I was really worried out of the gate once Huntsville cleared to the lead that easy," Brown said.


Fear The Dragon was fifth down the backside when David Miller felt compelled to put the son of Dragon Again—Armbro Cinnamon into the race.


"I probably moved him a little earlier than I had to, but he was gapping a little too much," Miller said.

Fear The Dragon steadily erased the five-length deficit

until the final turn, when it briefly seemed he hit the wall.

"At the head of the stretch, I thought Huntsville had us put away," Brown said. "Dragon never gives up. He fought back."

But Fear The Dragon spurted again and caught Huntsville in the shadow of the wire, downing him by a half-length in 1:49.1, with RJP third.

"Going into the turn, I asked him to go, and he wasn't getting it done," Miller said. "He made it up in the stretch."

Tetrick, indicated he thought he had enough horse left to hold off Fear The Dragon.

"I thought I had him beat," Tetrick said. "My horse grabbed the left line a little bit, but he raced well and had every opportunity to win. Hats off to Fear The Dragon."

Ray Schnittker, who trains Meadowlands Pace winner Huntsville and owns with Ted Gewertz, Steven Arnold and Crawford Farms, accepted the tough beat graciously.

"Huntsville raced really well," he said. "Brian's horse came first over and kind of wore him down. I thought we had it, but he got nailed. It was a good race. I'd be crazy not to be disappointed, but he raced really well. You can't ask more than that."

It was the first Adios victory for Brown, the third for Miller, who won previously with Shadow Play (2008) and McWicked (2014). Brown said Fear The Dragon would be pointed to the Carl Milstein at Northfield while Schnittker indicated Huntsville would race next week in the Cane Pace at the Meadowlands.

Adios notes

With the win, Fear The Dragon became a millionaire, boosting his career bankroll to \$1,152,844... It was a huge Adios Day for Bruce Trogdon's Emerald Highlands Farm, breeder and owner of Fear The Dragon. Two other Emerald Highlands homebreds, Blazin Britches and Whatstroublinurocky, also won Grand Circuit stakes on the card. "It was the day of a lifetime," Trogdon said... Ella Christina earned the day's longshot honors when she pulled a 56-1 upset in a division of the Quinton Patterson Adioo Volo.. Adios Day attendance was 4,113.

Ken Warkentin, the voice of the Meadowlands, will call his 18th Hambletonian next Saturday.

Warkentin cherishes every moment of calling the Hambletonian

This year will mark the 18th time the voice of the Meadowlands Racetrack has called North America's greatest trotting race.

The night before the 2016 Hambletonian, the voice of that race for much of the last 20 years was long on perspective despite being short on time. Standing beside the set of his simulcast broadcasting duties for the night between races at the Meadowlands Racetrack, Ken Warkentin said he was counting his blessings and taking nothing for granted while preparing to call North America's greatest trotting race for the 17th time in the last 18 years.

"I was thinking about this today. For me, Hambletonian Day is almost melancholy. Sad. I'm 57 years old. You never know. Maybe this is the last one I'll do. The way things are going in New Jersey, that's possible... Something can happen to you. You don't know," said Warkentin, who is in his 26th year calling races at the Meadowlands.

Those comments, found nearly a year later in an unused interview, are particularly poignant given what we know now. Over four months ago, Sam McKee — Warkentin's longtime race-calling partner at the Meadowlands — died at age 54 from complications of a stroke.

Warkentin, of course, was not contemplating or predicting anything of the sort. How could he? But his perspective sounds right. A person never knows what the future holds and should appreciate every opportunity to the fullest.

The Hambletonian stands at the top of Warkentin's list of career opportunities.

"It's like any good thing, it goes by too quickly," he said of calling the classic, which he will do for the 18th time on



Saturday (Aug. 5). "You think, 'Is it going to happen again?' One of your feelings is joy and satisfaction. You're happy and you enjoy yourself and you're excited. On the other hand you're like, 'Wow.' You walk out of here and you just have to hope it happens again."

Despite often being linked with McKee, Warkentin is a tremendous race caller in his own right that could stand alone at any track.

Bob Heyden, another broadcasting colleague at the Meadowlands, said Warkentin is the rare race caller who keeps getting better year after year.

"It's very rare that someone works 25 years anywhere where they're much better the second half of that 25-year run than the first half. First half was good, the middle part got better and the last five years have been his best. It's almost impossible for that to happen," Heyden said.

Warkentin, a Toronto native, has been calling races for a little more than 35 years, beginning in 1981 while he was still a student in Seneca College's Radio and Television Broadcasting Program.

As a kid, Warkentin, who is deeply proud of his Canadian heritage, "wanted to be a hockey announcer, a play-by-play guy. That just didn't work out. I've done a little high school hockey. I was in radio and then I fell into this" he said of calling harness races.

Warkentin's first real gig in racing came in 1982 when he took a job calling the races at Flamboro Downs in Hamilton, ON after a one-year stint at a Top 40 radio station in Peterborough, ON. He called the races at Flamboro for eight years and came to the Meadowlands in 1991. He has been at the East Rutherford, NJ track ever since and began calling the Hambletonian in 1998, the same year McKee came to work at the Meadowlands.

Warkentin said he's not exactly sure how he became the voice of the Hambletonian and McKee took on the Meadowlands Pace, but believes seniority played some role.

"Also, one year Sam said, 'I'll do the Pace, you do the Hambo," Warkentin said, adding that McKee called the 2009 Hambletonian won by superstar Muscle Hill.

"That year I was asked to do TV for CBS," Warkentin said.
"Some years I did both. Some years I ran down (after calling the race) to do the presentation, but we stopped that nonsense."

At some point in recent years, Warkentin was offered the opportunity to continue calling the race or do more TV work.

"I said, 'I'll stay upstairs and call the race. It's more fun' even though it may have helped my TV career. I don't know. There's a lot that goes into the TV, but I do the same prep as I would if I was doing TV. I've got two binders full (of preparation)," Warkentin said.

Warkentin puts that immense preparation into every Hambletonian call because of the enormity of the Hambletonian.

"There's a responsibility involved. You're here to perform a service. I hate to make it sound boring, but I will bore you with my diligence. I'm here to be professional, to be positive, so the people don't think, 'Wow, he doesn't sound too positive.' I have fun with it. If you don't have fun with it, you don't sound positive and you don't come across like you're inviting people to participate and enjoy the day of racing," said Warkentin, who is often his own toughest critic.

"There were some years where I think I said too much at the end of the race. 'The first Canadian-sired winner, blah, blah, blah' or 'Shout it from the mountain tops, Chip Chip Hooray.' I kind of said to myself, 'Maybe just tone that down a bit. Just put a bow on it," Warkentin said before doing a trial-run of a few horses from the 2016 field and what he might say if they won the next day.

"Don't be too cute or too crazy. You really have to get the driver's name and the trainer's name. If Jimmy Takter wins again, you've got to say, 'It's Jimmy Takter again' or something, but it will come to me."

Warkentin said he's proud of a couple of Hambletonian calls, including, "Taktertonian. Dave Brower told me to say that. I thought, 'Yeah, that sounds good. I'll steal that.' Also, 'From the Pennsylvania Fairs to the Hambletonian winner's circle' (when Roger Hammer and Vivid Photo won). That was fun."

Most of all, he just wants to do justice to the Hambletonian.

"I'm proud of my work and I'm proud that I've put a lot into it," he said. "I haven't messed up that much. I think I messed up one year and gave a quarter of 22 seconds or something. I forget what one that was, but I was so hyped up.

"There's been years that I've been so jacked up, I've got to calm down. The binoculars are shaking. You've got to calm down and show some control and have fun with it, let it happen, let it come out... It's not about me. It has nothing to do with me. Jack Stephens told me a long time ago, 'It's not about you.' I'm not trying to draw attention to myself, I'm trying to do justice to what's out there. They're the stars. Hopefully, I do, but it's my own way of doing it. My own signature, or like when a comic comes onstage, 'Now, the comic stylings of...' Those are my stylings."

There's growth potential for harness racing's strongest brand and we may be only scratching the surface of what's possible.

I'm a bit of a business and statistics geek, and I have been for as long as I remember. From time to time, I get lost looking at trends and facts and figures in this new age – the growth of new sports like e-sports, what people are watching and how they're consuming sports and media in various parts of the world, how companies such as Amazon are growing rapidly and incrementally changing our lives.

When I study such facts and figures for harness racing

however, I tend to get a little depressed. It's not big news that the tarmac isn't as full; it's not news that handle has been down. What is bothersome to me is that no matter how much I dig, I rarely see any metric that gets me excited.

As Fig I (below) clearly shows, harness racing's general popularity has been waning. The past year, nationwide interest via Google (a surprisingly good gauge) in the sport is about 55 per cent what it was a dozen years ago.

Something different happened last week, though, after I spent a couple of hours looking deeper into the numbers regarding next week's Hambletonian.

As Figure II illustrates, general interest in the Hambletonian in the U.S. is not on the slide. The trend is solid, and it can be argued (especially when examined against the underlying sport's curve) interest in the event is as high as ever. With handle near even, and attendance at times wavering, this might surprise some, but it is reality.

Where are the public searches for the event occurring? I'd submit from areas the sport wants them to be originating from. Maybe the race has lost a little bit of steam in the west coast states, but New York, Maine, Ohio and pockets in other east coast states are seeing more interest than six or seven years ago.

When we break it down further – by city - it gets very eye-opening.




Fig I - Google searches for "harness racing" and related terms since 2004




Fig II - U.S. searches for "Hambletonian" and related terms since 2006




Figure III - Areas of Hambletonian interest, dark blue higher, lighter lower

It's nice to see a large metro area like New York be attracted to a historically rural event, but what really jumps out is the Albany, NY area. This locale's interest in the event continues to grow. Could it be because this geographical area includes Saratoga Springs, where thoroughbred fans are gathered for the Spa meet? It's probably so, proving that our friends in that sport like big equine events, whether the horse is being ridden or steered.

Despite what we may read in the press with globalization and free trade, it's a simple fact that the world is getting smaller as we grow more and more connected. This gives events like the Hambletonian a wider market to sell to. Are there countries worldwide that know of the Hambletonian, and show that they want to learn more?

Yes, Sweden is certainly one, as Figure V illustrates.

Since 2010, in terms of Google interest, the event is not only holding its own, it's been growing.

Other European countries that show increased general interest in the Hambletonian include France and Finland.

What does this all mean? I think a strong case can be made that when it comes to the Hambletonian, the glass is half full, not half empty.

If Saratoga fans are interested in the event, it probably means they can be marketed to. With digital media, along with a past performance link, it's not overly costly in this day and age.

If Sweden's fans are showing more and more willingness to engage with the event, it's a market that has only been scratched at the surface. The fact that John Campbell is heading up the Hambletonian Society and is well known in Europe certainly can't hurt. Maybe European handle for the event has not peaked, but is barely nascent.

The underlying local interest in New Jersey and area is still hanging tough, too. This means that local marketing does have an audience, and continuing to sell the event that way is probably not wasted dollars.

Harness racing's big events are important. With so many politicians holding the purse strings, the sport uses these events as a conduit to stay on their radar. And with a fickle general public, along with scarce marketing dollars, it's tougher than ever to stay relevant. Although the general trends are not our friend, the Hambletonian is not failing, and does have a roadmap forward.

Next Saturday when you enter your horse, drive to the track; when you're sitting down to handicap, hopping into the sulky or going on your second warm up trip, remember you're a part of something that the world is increasingly interested in; that you're part of a show with a real and willing audience.

The Hambletonian has upside and its importance to the sport of harness racing should never be underestimated.






Figure V - Hambletonian and related searches in Sweden

Retired sheriff Phillips enjoying the ride with Dee Rocks

Offers are coming in to purchase the undefeated Indiana-sired freshman pacing filly out of Just Peachy's family, but Ron Phillips said he and partner John Carver are having too much fun to sell.

When John Carver acquired Nihilator filly Just Peachy in early 1991, the Illinois owner and breeder hoped for a reasonable return on his investment. As it turns out, what Just Peachy couldn't deliver on the racetrack she has produced as a broodmare. Three generations later, Carver and his partner, Ron Phillips, continue to enjoy the fruits of the bloodline, the latest manifestation in the form of the Indiana-sired and undefeated freshman filly Dee Rocks.

It will be 25 years ago this October that Just Peachy made her first, and only, pari-mutuel start. Lining up behind the gate for trainer Scott Forbes in a race at Pocono Downs, the filly made a break racing to the quarter and finished last in a field of eight. She wouldn't see the starting gate again. Within months Just Peachy would begin her career as a broodmare.

She would go on to produce 13 foals during her time as a broodmare, marked by 11 starters. From that group there were six winners, led by Dee Revrac, a gelding that collected 36 wins, just over \$250,000 in earnings, and a speed badge of 1:51.1. Just Peachy's second foal, M L Revrac, never made it to the races, but has gained notoriety as the dam of word champion Mel Mara.

Like her mother, Peachy Revrac, the third foal from Just Peachy, had an abbreviated racing career. The Falcon Seelster-sired pacer managed only three trips behind the gate, the last coming in Balmoral Park in September 1998. In that contest, she broke stride early in the mile and finished up the track in seventh. As it would turn out, she sustained an injury that would bring her career to an abrupt close.

"I trained them myself back then. No matter how fast she

was going, she would just give you more," said Phillips, a retired sheriff. "She got a slab fracture in her knee and she was done. She's still running around the farm today. She's my best older mare. She's really been a good producer."

Peachy Revrac's 11 foals have all started, with 10 of them reaching the winner's circle. She has produced a trio of \$100,000 winners for Carver and Phillips, with several mares to carry on the line. One of those mares, Incredible Katie, has already shown she can carry Just Peachy's legacy forward. The Incredible Finale mare registered two wins and three-runner up efforts in 11 career starts for her connections.

"She was a nice big, stout mare, and she was a handful," said Phillips. "I don't think she ever reached her full potential."

Just as the mares before her, Incredible Katie has made up for a lack of production on the racetrack with results back at the farm. From three foals she is responsible for three winners, all by different sires. Mr Leland's Filly, by Sportsmaster, took a mark of 1:53 as a sophomore and earned \$199,588. But Dee Rocks has garnered the most attention of the trio, and in her first season of racing, the filly has turned heads competing at Hoosier Park.

Entrusted to Dossie Minor, the Rockin Image freshman has yet to taste defeat in six starts. The filly collected her first three triumphs at Hawthorne, each time with Tim Curtin in the bike. Making her Indiana Sires Stakes debut July 5, Dee Rocks and Sam Widger closed late to nose out Laila J And Ginger in the \$20,000 Round 1 elimination. The filly stopped the clock in 1:54.1 after coming home in :26.3. One week later, Dee Rocks captured the first \$75,000 final of the season, taking control after the quarter and crossing the wire more than three lengths in front in a time in 1:53.3.

"All she has is a bridle and a head pole. She isn't afraid of anything. She just doesn't do anything wrong," Minor said of his pupil. "She can sit in a hole, she can leave if you want to leave with her. She'll let you use her the way you want to use her. You can't ask for a better horse."

In her latest start for Minor, Dee Rocks picked up her second ISS elimination win at Hoosier Park. This time, Widger was able to sit third through the opening half before moving to the lead and winning by a length and a half, tripping the

timer in 1:54. To date, the filly has earned \$68,000, and will be sent off as the favorite in the second \$75,000 final slated for Wednesday (Aug. 2). She has drawn post four.

"She's pretty impressive so far. You can't imagine all the calls that I've got, guys really wanting me to put a price on her," said the 77-year-old Phillips. "I don't want to do it. I just don't want to sell her. I enjoy watching her race."

As Dee Rocks continues to build upon her early accomplishments, inquiries continue. Phillips admits that if he were in the same position in the past, the partnership may have seriously entertained selling the filly. Time, however, has changed his perspective.

"I'm certainly not wealthy. I just have retirement and a little social security. I was a sheriff in law enforcement most of my life. \$200,000 or \$225,000 is one hell of a lot of money," Phillips said. "At this stage of the game, if she doesn't make another dime, I'm still going to eat tomorrow. When you get older you change your thinking about things."

Instead of cashing in on the quick success of Dee Rocks, Phillips and Carver are going to enjoy her freshman campaign. Another filly like this just doesn't come around every day. Just Peachy never made it to the winner's circle, but she has become the foundation for a family that continues to produce speedy racehorses.

Ariana G, Magic Presto take Hambletonian Oaks elims

Now the question is, will Ariana G race in the Hambletonian or Hambletonian Oaks next weekend?

Ariana G (Yannick Gingras) won the first of two \$40,438 elimination races for the Aug. 5 \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks for three year-old trotting fillies on Saturday at The Meadowlands in a time of 1:51.3 by two lengths.

Ice Attraction and Ake Svanstadt were first to the lead at the :27.2 first quarter, with 1-5 favorite Ariana G well off that pace in fifth. Glitzy Gal was off the rail to challenge for the lead just past the quarter and got that lead by the :55.1 half, with Ice Attraction behind her along the rail. Glitzy Gal made a break just past the half, leaving Ice Attraction, at 103-1, to inherit the lead.

By the 1:23.3 three quarters, Ice Attraction was on the lead, with Ariana G now moved up to second over behind Fine Tuned Lady (Corey Callahan). As the field turned for home, Gingras fanned wide with Ariana G and those two trotted past all the fillies in front of them for the win.

Dream Together (Daniel Dube) was second and Sunshine Delight third.

"I had an option open going into the first turn and there

were a lot of leavers," said Gingras. "So I took my time and she is beautiful to drive, so she let me drive anyway I want. Not my decision (to choose the Oaks or the Hambletonian with the colts), whatever they go, filly or colt, I can tell you one thing, I'm definitely going to drive her. So it doesn't matter what division they choose to go in, I will be sitting behind her."

Ariana G is trained by Jimmy Takter and is owned by her breeders Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

"She was spectacular again tonight," Katz said. "I think we will just enjoy her great race tonight. With regard to a decision (about whether to go in the Oaks or Hambletonian), we will have a full discussion with Jimmy in the next day or two."

Gingras has driven four fillies for the Takter Stable in the Oaks, and has yet to win. Asked if he thinks Araina G might be the best of that bunch, he said, "Yes I think she is. This is the first time I think we are going into the Oaks as the favorite. Oaks or Hambo, any of them sounds good to me."

In the second division, Magic Presto and Brian Sears won in 1:52.1 by a half length to get their chance at the Oaks.

Feed Your Head (Yannick Gingras) was first to the lead at the :28.2 first quarter, with Hillarmbro (Trond Smedshammer) tucked in behind him with eventual race winner, Magic Presto in third. Just past that marker, Magic Presto was off the

rail and trotting for the lead, grabbing it before the :56 half. Hillarmbro tipped off the rail to try for the lead at the five eighths, with Overdraft Volo behind her, but Magic Presto held that lead to the 1:24.1 three quarters and into the homestretch. Feed Your Head was trapped along the rail behind her and inside Hillarmbro, shook loose to make up ground late, but not enough to pass Magic Presto.

"We have our hands full with her (Ariana G, the other elimination winner), said Sears. "She looks very good no question about it. My filly was a little peculiar tonight. She was just looking at everything and usually she is very relaxed, but maybe all of the commotion tonight had her on her heels a little bit."

Magic Presto is owned by Mel Hartman, Herb Liverman, David McDuffee and Little E LLC. And trained by Richard Norman. That's All Moni was scratched out of the race.

The top five in each field advanced to the final, so the field is: Ariana G, Dream Together, Sunshine Delight, Fine Tuned Lady and Dream Baby Dream, Magic Presto, Feed Your Head, Southwind Avanti, Overdraft Volo and Caviart Wonder. Elimination winners draw for posts one through five on Tuesday (Aug. 1).

Lady Shadow will not be able to race at the Meadowlands

The Meadowlands Racetrack is announcing that Lady Shadow, an earner of \$1,915,777 and the 2016 Dan Patch Award winner as champion pacing mare, will be unable to race at the Meadowlands after a post-race test at Harrah's Philadelphia on May 28 came back positive for Clenbuterol.

According to the ruling issued by the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission, "Ronald Adams as trainer is in violation of PHRC medication rules and the trainer responsibility rule. Mr. Adams has waived his hearing before the Judges and will appeal the ruling to the Racing Commission. All purse money earned on 5/28/2017 must be returned and redistributed. Transfers of horses must be approved by the Judges at Harrah's Chester or by the PHRC."

"As a result of the finding that Lady Shadow was found to have unacceptable levels of Clenbuterol when she raced at Harrah's Philadelphia and the split sample came back positive, the owners have been advised that the horse will not be allowed to race in the upcoming stake at the Meadowlands," said Meadowlands chairman Jeffrey Gural.

Ella Christina wins Adioo Volo division at 56

Ella Christina (Jim Pantaleano) pulled off the 56-1 upset in the first Adioo Volo division at The Meadows.

Dismissed at 56-1, Ella Christina poured through the Lightning Lane to pull off the shocker in Saturday's \$125,950 Quinton Patterson Adioo Volo at The Meadows. Blazin Britches captured the other division of the Adioo Volo, a Grand Circuit stake for 3-year-old filly pacers that was part of the Adios Card.

Ella Christina hadn't won a stake this year, and driver Jim

Pantaleano had little chance to get her into the cover flow.

"Going down the backstretch, I thought I might follow one of the favorites, but that spot disappeared and kind of made my decision for me," he said. "They weren't going much on the lead, so I figured they'd be getting home pretty good. I was surprised my filly had as much pace as she did. They were honking home pretty good."

The daughter of Western Ideal—Arthroscopic was fourth and apparently going nowhere when the horse immediately in front of her, Glassine Hanover, tipped off the cones for the drive.

That was the opportunity Ella Christina needed, and she took full advantage of it, downing Colorful Jasmine by 1/2 length in 1:52.2, matching her career best. Rosemary Rose was third. Nick Surick trains Ella Christina for Nick Surick Stable, J.L. Benson Stables, William Daggett, Jr. and Lawrence Vukovic.

The freshman campaign of Blazin Britches was aborted after a single race due to soreness, but she won six of her first seven starts this year, racing primarily at Hoosier Park. Then, trainer Brian Brown thought he noticed something amiss in her recent outings.

"We figure she bled her last three starts; luckily, we found it in time," Brown said. "She looked like she would win in 1:50, and she got halfway up the stretch and started to let up. As you saw today, she didn't give up."

With the addition of Lasix for the Adioo Volo, Blazin Britches gobbled up the leader, Bettor's Up, with a backside burst and went on to defeat her by 2 lengths in 1:50.1, a career best. Brazuca earned show.

Emerald Highlands Farm bred and owns Blazin Britches, a daughter of Rock N Roll Heaven-Soggy Britches who is eligible for most of the rich year-end stakes.

Saturday's card at The Meadows also featured four other Grand Circuit stakes. Here are the highlights of those Arden Downs events:

\$45,000 James Manderino — 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Trotters

Snowstorm Hanover was a major player in his division last year, banking nearly \$350,000 and taking a mark of 1:55.1. At three, however, he finished out of the money in his first eight starts, prompting trainer Ron Burke to add hopples and Lasix. The changes may have helped in the Manderino, as Snowstorm Hanover moved powerfully first over to score in 1:55 for Matt Kakaley. Andy M was second, beaten a neck, with Frankie Mullins third.

"He's been a disappointment this year," Kakaley said. "I know I had high hopes for him; he finished the year so good last year. The combination of Lasix and hopples probably helped him out a lot. He has more confidence. Hopefully he's in the right direction now."

Ron Burke trains the son of Muscle Massive—Snow Angel Hanover for Burke Racing Stable, Frank Baldachino, Phillip Collura and Weaver Bruscemi LLC.

\$57,356 Ned McCarr — 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters

Broadway Concert's split figured to end on a sour note; she appeared to be tiring after a demanding trip, and rivals inside and out were threatening. But the daughter of Broadway Hall—Luscious Lindy dug in for Corey Callahan, trainer John Butenschoen and owner Bay Pond Racing Stable, holding off the rallying Mimosa Hanover by 1/2 length in 1:55.1, matching her life mark. Gin's Tonic completed the ticket.

Broadway Concert was outside for the opening panel plus, but Callahan said that wasn't a big issue.

"I kind of waited for everything to settle in the first eighth," he said. "I did get a tiny break up the backside. She kept fighting. I had to urge her a little bit, but she wanted to get her nose up."

In her McCarr division, Crann Tara looked the best on paper, so Tim Tetrick drove her accordingly, moving first over at his leisure. The 1-5 favorite prevailed comfortably, defeating Itsgoodtobequeen by 2 lengths in 1:56.2, with Dangle Then Deke a distant third.

"I thought she was the best," Tetrick said. "Her form's been good, and some of the others aren't at the top of their game. Coming first up doesn't bother her; she likes wearing them down."

Linda Toscano conditions the daughter of Donato Hanover-Shan Riches for William Donovan.

\$47,630 Mary Lib Miller — 2-Year-Old Filly Pacers \$57,350 Gov. David L. Lawrence — 2-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

Each of these stakes for freshmen was conducted over two divisions, with the winners being three maidens and a \$38.00 shot.

The Emerald Highlands Farm of owner Bruce Trogdon and trainer Brian Brown might have unveiled their 2018 Little Brown Jug contender in the very first race, the first Gov. Lawrence division, as Whatstroublnurocky broke his maiden in fine style, a 1:53.2 victory over a "good" track after intermittent rain, sometimes quite hard, had buffeted the

area during the previous 24 hours.

The altered son of A Rocknroll Dance looked like he might be forced into first-over duty, but he got cover later in the backstretch, and the colt came his own back half in 55.1, three-wide on the turn, for a 3-length victory over Antagonist and Someboysomewhere with the guidance of David Miller.

"He was really good last week but was behind a wall of horses," Brown said. "If you saw him at the top of the stretch today, he started running in, so you know he's having a little steering trouble. He's not taking to this bit very well. I'll have to make some more changes."

Yannick Gingras and the Somebeachsomewhere colt Disorder made the lead nearing the quarter and held gamely in a blanket finish to notch his first win in 1:53.1, a race after the track was updated from "good" to "fast" as the sun broke through. Disorder withstood a late charge from the prospective pocket rocket, and Ron Burke stablemate, Aleppo Hanover by 3/4 of a length for Burke Racing Stable LLC; Silva, Purnel & Libby; Weaver Bruscemi LLC and Diamond Creek Racing.

"He's been in horrible spots against real good horses, so he couldn't go forward," Burke said. "Today we were thinking, let's try to be aggressive and go forward, and he reacted to it. Not a great mile, but it's a better mile than he's been going."

Reign On Me had to surmount the tough first-over trip from mid-backstretch, but the Well Said filly persevered, picked up pace-setting Yankee Will Dance in early stretch, and strode off by 3 1/2 lengths while taking a maiden mark of 1:53.2 in the first section of the Mary Lib Miller. The Nifty Norman trainee had shown good closing speed with a second and a third in Kindergarten Series action, and here she was able to take her late ability all the way to Victory Lane for the Jennifer Dalton Stable LLC while giving driver David Miller a win in the freshman stakes for each sex.

"That's the first time she had to be first over that long, and she handled it pretty well," Miller noted.

Unlike the three freshmen preceding her to stakes Victory Lane, the Bettor's Delight filly Cult Icon had tasted pari-mutuel success prior to her Grand Circuit contest, with two wins, including a PA Stallion Series victory in her last race. The bettors were undoubtedly worried about her outside starting spot in the field of nine and let her go at 18-1, but Cult Icon, under canny handling by Tyler Smith, slid a mid-pack tuck early, then tipped wide off a second-over trip and produced a length victory over favored Aim's Whisper in 1:54.2.

"I loved her last week, but I didn't like our draw at all,"

Smith said. "I lucked out — there was a spot for me (at the pylons) and we got a perfect second-over trip. She did the rest."

Trent Stohler conditions the filly with a winning attitude, and his Trent Stohler Stable Inc. shares ownership with Tim Graber, Single G Stables, and Stately Gaits Stable.

DSBF finals highlight Governor's Day card

Harrington Raceway hosted its annual Governor's Day card during the Delaware State Fair Thursday, featuring more than \$600,000 in total purses over 13 races.

The annual program is a focal point for many Delaware horsemen, as a showcase of The First State's top Standardbreds as every horse on the program is either Delaware owned and/or Delaware bred.

The coveted \$40,000 Governor's Cup is a sought after title for older horses and was won for the second straight year by

Foulk Stables' Sparky Mark (\$45.80, Jon Roberts) via a pocket trip over Captive Audience and Tip It On Back. The 10-year-old Astreos stallion registered his 58th career win for trainer Trish Foulk. Governor John Carney was on hand to participate in the winner's circle ceremonies.

Four \$100,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund final races for 3 year olds were much anticipated after two elimination legs were completed in June.

Perhaps the most stirring finish came in the male pacing final as Bags To Riches (\$8.20, Tim Tetrick) overcame an overland trip in which he was parked the mile to outlast Automatic Dragon and Daiymir. Trained by co-owner Jason Skinner for Only Money Inc., it was the seventh win of the year for the Roddy's Bags Again colt, who completed a sweep of DSBF final events this year.

Jo Ann Looney-King's Logan's Girl (\$4.40, Victor Kirby) was an easy winner in the filly pacing final for trainer Jim King Jr. in 1:53.4. Spanish Dream was second with Lunar Phase third. A daughter of Roddy's Bags Again, "Logan" recorded her 13th lifetime win. The race honored the memory of the late Ben Stafford Jr., a well-liked Delaware horseman who passed away in 2016.

The filly trotting final, named the Jack Walls Memorial, was won in dominant fashion by Nanticoke Racing and Delbert Cain's Spoonful (\$2.40, Corey Callahan) in 2:01.3 over Gogh Cinorita and Willow Mill Anna. Trained by Les Givens, the political briefing filly set all the fractions in her ninth career win, the 28th career DSBF final win for Givens. Walls was the former president of Harrington Raceway, who passed away in 2003.

Ben Brooks' Master Clave (\$2.10, Ross Wolfenden) notched his 11th career win in the male trotting final for trainer John Wilkerson, who won two races on the program. The Master Lavec gelding took the lead in deep stretch to complete a sweep of 3-year-old DSBF finals. Command The Fire was second with Jiggs third. The race was named in memory of former trainer/driver Hal Belote, who was tragically killed in a racing accident. (Harrington)

Stakes stimulate breeding

I have read in this publication both articles and responses about stake races versus overnight purses, especially at the Meadowlands, that dealt with where the money should be allocated. And although it seemed that both sides had made seemingly valid arguments, they missed the real point. The discussion should have gone one step further and discussed the allocation of purses between younger green horses versus seasoned overnight horses.

The main purpose for stake races is to stimulate the breeding of more horses that in turn become the overnight horses of tomorrow. The only way breeders have a chance to make out economically is that if there's a market to sell their product, which are yearlings. The main incentive for people to buy these yearlings is the potential for a financial score and/or the excitement factor that goes along with it. Without the potential financial opportunity that is created by stake races that market would dry up. It is actually by and large the horses that don't race at the stake level that become the meat and potatoes overnight horses of tomorrow. We need to create more incentives to stimulate the production of the new horses or we will continue to see the decline of new foal counts and more short fields in overnight races. We, as an industry, also need to create a better purse structure so that the purchasers of yearlings have a better chance to

recoup their investment which in turn to leads to more demand, which leads to higher prices which leads to more foals which leads to bigger fields which leads to bigger handle etc. etc. .What is the point of having a horse in stake race with a purse of \$20,000-\$30,000 or non-winners of two to go for \$13,000 when you can claim or purchase an overnight horse with much less risk and wait time to race for the same or more the following week?

And a person grows up and dreams of driving and before they even get a "q" license they have designed their own unique colors. It is part of the harness driver dream. Drivers are known by colors.

Last but not least, the colors are expensive and not everyone has the resources to buy two or three sets of colors. Another big item to put on an owner's bill? With large stables with lots of owners it would be logistics nightmare of sending them with the horse.
