Campbell Breaks Wrist in Baby Race Spill at Meadowlands, Still Hopes to Make Hambo By Bill Finley

Hall of Fame driver John Campbell broke his wrist in a

John Campbell is hoping for a speedy recovery

spill during baby races yesterday at the Meadowlands. Campbell sat out last night's races at the Meadowlands and will also pass on his drives tonight. However, he told Harness Racing Update last night that he hopes to drive next weekend.

"The timing of this could not have been worse," he said. "It's eight days before the Hambletonian and that's obviously not a day I want to miss."

The accident occurred during the fifth race on the card of qualifiers. Campbell was driving Drazzmatazz, who took the early lead but started to tire and drop

back on the field on the far turn. Driving Usher, Jimmy Takter found himself right on Campbell's heels as Drazzmatazz was coming to a near stop. Takter and Campbell locked wheels and Campbell went down.

The spill came amidst what has been one of Campbell's best years in quite a while. With 116 wins on the year, he has already surpassed his 2014 total, when he had 115 victories. Campbell's drives have earned \$2,973,756 on the year, much of it coming with JL Cruze, who is regarded as the top trotter in the sport.

This will be the second time within the last two years that Campbell has been sidelined. In February, 2014, he broke his collarbone when ice skating with his grandson. He also suffered a broken knee and shoulder in a 2011 spill at Chester.

"Am I snake bit? It doesn't do me any good to look at things that way," he said.

His latest mishap doesn't figure to cost him much time, but it could be a big blow if he misses Hambletonian Day. Campbell, 60, is scheduled to drive Muscle Diamond in the Hambletonian. He said that he wasn't in any pain yesterday and that break was about as about as mild as a fractured

bone can get. His plan is to train horses next week and the re-evaluate his status.

"If it were the middle of winter I'd be fine taking some time off," he said. "But this is different and I'm hoping this won't stand in the way of my driving next weekend. I'll just see how I feel and go from there."

While Muscle Diamond is an outsider in the Hambletonian, Campbell possibly could drive a live contender in the Hambletonian Oaks in Wild Honey. She will compete tonight in the elims for the Hambletonian Oaks. Takter is her trainer and said yesterday he has not yet enlisted a driver to take over for Campbell tonight, but mentioned he might handle the driving chores himself. Campbell said he did not speak to Takter yesterday and, therefore, cannot be certain that he will get the drive on Hambo Day of he is available.

Campbell was also scheduled to drive Melady's Monet for trainer Kevin McDermott in tonight's TVG series. McDermott said Corey Callahan will get the assignment tonight and that Jason Bartlett will be given the drive on Hambletonian Day in the Cashman.

"You can't help but feel bad for John," McDermott said. "He's had such bad luck lately and he was having a huge year. I wish him well."

Campbell was also listed to drive Doo Wop Hanover in the TVG leg for pacers tonight and was down for eight drives Friday night, including Gifted Lady in a Jim Doherty Memorial 2-year-old filly trot elims. He also had a drives in all three of the elims for the Peter Haughton Memorial for 2-year-old colt trotters.

Pierce to Undergo Knife Again, Says Retirement Not Out of Question By Bill Finley



Ron Pierce is having problems getting over back problems

Originally hoping to be back on Hambletonian Day, Ron Pierce appears to be nowhere close to making his return as he said yesterday his back problems will likely lead to another surgery. Pierce is scheduled to meet with his doctor next week, but seemed resigned to the fact that he will need another operation. Due to nagging problems that built up over his career, Pierce had neck and back surgery in March. He said

yesterday his neck is doing well but his back is an issue and he cannot see himself driving again until it gets better. He believes the only way that is going to happen is with another operation.

"I could probably drive now, but if I did it would only be a matter of time before I'm busted up again and would need something done," he said. "This isn 't just about driving. Right now, my back is bad enough that I can't do the things in life I enjoy, driving and all sorts of other things. I need to get this fixed. One thing I really don't want to do is to start taking pain medication to get through this."

Pierce has not driven since March 7. Originally, he thought he would be out no more than six weeks. When it became clear he would be out longer, he targeted Hambletonian weekend for his comeback, another goal that won't be reached.

"I really miss driving," he said. "It takes something like this to make you realize how much you appreciate what you do."

Pierce is 58 and has 9,569 career victories. He said two of his goals are to drive a winner in his sixties and to reach 10,000 winners. He is cautiously optimistic that will happen.

"I want to drive again and I think I can," he said. "But if I can't get my back properly fixed I can't go out there anymore. Retirement is not out of the question." share this story

There's no "Wiggle" in the Adios, Good News for the Nine Who Will Go

National Seelster has lost to the reigning king of he 3-year-old male pacing division all four times he has faced him this year, and he's 8 for 10 in all other races. So when Ryder learned that Wiggle It would not be going in today's \$400,000 Adios at The Meadows, he was quick to point for the race.

"After we won a sire stakes at Yonkers with him we had an idea that Wiggle It Jiggleit and three or four other good ones weren't going to the Adios so we jumped in," he said. "If he were going in this race I don't know if we would have gone or not. It would have made for a much tougher decision."

Zigging when Wiggle It zags could be a constant theme throughout the season for those with lesser pacers. There won't be many \$400,000 races on the calendar that won't include the star of the George Teague Jr. barn, so the Adios is a huge opportunity for those who are in.

National Seelster could more than double his seasonal earnings of \$149,902 with a win today, but he'll have to do so out of the nine hole. He wound up there despite winning an elimination race last week, the same fate that befell him after he won an elimination for the Hempt at Pocono. In the Hempt finals, he couldn't overcome the post and finished last.

"That race is an anomaly," Ryder said. "I have no idea what happened to him that night."

But Ryder is certainly no fan of the nine post.

"I used to be on the fence as far an opinion when it comes to whether winners of eliminations should get to pick their posts." he said. "I've had mainly good experiences with that, but after wining two elims with this horse and drawing the nine hole in two finals I now have an opinion. The Meadowlands has a good system, where the elim winners get to draw one through six. The people who don't like that system, I'd like to see how they like it after winning two elims and getting the nine hole both times."

Another storyline this afternoon at The Meadows will be Ron Burke's attempt to win his second career Adios. Burke, who last won the race in 2007 with May June Character, calls The Meadows his home track and has long let it be known that, to him, winning the Adios ranks right up their with any accomplishment in the sport. He'll send out three horses, Yankee Bounty, Cooperstown and My Hero Ron. The latter, a new acquisition into the Burke barn in June, looks like his best shot. The son of Well Said, has won all three starts since moving into his new barn and looked sharp in victory in the elims.

"I love him," Burke said about the gelding. "I think he's our best shot. He just gets better every time we race him. He's versatile. He's a big horse, a strong horse, with a good attitude."

After winning eight of 10 starts last year, Yankee Bounty is 0 for 10 on the season, but Burke is hoping a second place finish in an elim behind My Hero Ron is a positive

"He's definitely underachieved," the trainer said. "He was the best 2-year-old in Pennsylvania last year. Other horses got better (this year) and he didn't seem to. But last week also was a little bit of a return to form."

Dude's The Man is the 5-2 morning line favorite in the race. The horse has lost six straight, but only missed by a neck when third in the elims. Corey Callahan will drive.

#### Another Cobalt Positive for Aaron Lambert

Trainer Aaron Lambert has been hit with a positive after a horse he trained tested positive for an elevated level of cobalt in a June 27 race at Pocono Downs. The horse in question is Dynamic Youth. Lambert was handed a 15-day suspension and a \$500 fine by Pennsylvania authorities.

Lambert made news when he had a horse test positive for the same drug last year at the Meadowlands. After private tests done by the Meadowlands revealed the cobalt positive, Lambert was banned at the Jeff Gural-owned tracks, but Gural showed a soft side this year and let Lambert race again at his tracks. That, likely, is about to change.

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - Breakfast with the Babies, Final Edition drew a small crowd of dedicated racing enthusiasts to enjoy the weather and the chocolate babka along with some nice trotting and pacing prospects. They ended as they began with the Jimmy Takter Stable the undisputed star of the show.

NJSS two-year-old filly trot final winner All The Time put on a public workout this morning for the Takter/Yannick Gingras team cruising the oval in 1:57. The top Muscle Hill filly was not made eligible for the Jim Doherty Memorial, a good break for the competition in there but likely a disappointment for her camp comprised of owner/breeders Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld.

Straight A Student took a nice record of 1:58.1, nailing Time To Talk in the last stride or two for driver Mark MacDonald. Paul Kelly trains the filly, a \$65,000 Credit Winner Lexington buy for his interests as Paul Kelley Racing along with partners Abraham Singer and Bill Weaver.

Takter drove his Donato Hanover filly Haughty to an impressive 1:56.4, displaying a good late kick closing into the 28.3 final quarter. Jimmy bought her for the interests of Libfeld, Katz and Goldband for \$80,000 at Harrisburg last fall.

Threeupthreedown was a front end winner in the first trotting colt race for Tim Tetrick and trainer Erv Miller taking a record of 1:59.4 in the process. He's a homebred Muscle Hill racing for the interests of Shim Racing and Mike Anderson's Paymaq Racing.

Zlatan won another baby race for Gingras and Takter, this on in 1:57 holding off Open Road Hanover. Christina Takter, Herb Liverman and John & Jim Fielding paid \$37,000 for this Muscle Mass colt. This race was marred by an incident on the final turn where John Campbell was dumped from his sulky. John was up quickly but reportedly had gone in for an x-ray of the wrist.

Reigning Moni looked great this morning after the break winning in 1:55.4 for Gingras and Takter in just the second start for the son of Donato Hanover. Yannick let him roll along through pretty good numbers and had more left, finishing in 28.1 to win by many. With the great Moni Maker a generation back in his pedigree, Reigning Moni is owned by a couple of her owners in KR Breeding, Preferred Equine along with Brixton Medical and Christina Takter.

Western Fame won the first pacing race for Gingras and Takter in 1:55.4. He sat in behind Headforthebeach and got by that one late in the 28 second final quarter. He's a Brittany homebred Western Ideal colt.

The Art Major colt Talk Show created a buzz all the way from Florida this winter and he has done nothing to discourage that talk. Trainer Steve Elliott gave Talk Show a few weeks off after a 1:52.3 NYSS win at Tioga and he looked sharp in this morning workout with Scott Zeron subbing for John Campbell in 1:54.1 home in 26.3 completely on his own. Pegasis Racing, Team S Racing and Barbara Bongiorno own this exciting prospect, a \$40,000 buy in Lexington last fall.

Yannick and Jimmy struck yet again with the Somebeachsomewhere pacing filly Bring A Ring in 1:56.1. She opened a long lead into the stretch and held on despite drifting out a few paths late. Bring A Ring was a \$40,000 Harrisburg purchase by Christina Takter, John Fielding and Joyce McClelland.

The final two-year-old race of the 2015 season at The Meadowlands was taken by Shezarealideal and Andy Miller. The Western Ideal filly already a PASS winner over at The Meadows, led all the way and closed the 1:55 mile with a 26.3 kicker. Darlinonthebeach was a restrained second and Call Me Queen Be third in a meeting of three stakes winning fillies. Nick Surick and KDM share ownership of the winner who was bred by Nick's mom Debbie Surick.

Handover Belle Heads Into Fresh Yankee On A High-Note

Handover Belle just missed by a nose to Market Share one week ago, tonight, she flipped the script on her eight opponents winning the \$28,500 Open Trot in 1:51.1.

Combined in the wagering with Gural Hanover, Handover Belle allowed the pace to settle down in front of her, as her stablemate did the early lifting, reaching the quarter in a sharp 26.4. As the field turned down the backstretch, Hanover Belle made her move for the lead and she cleared Gural Hanover and rolled past the half-mile in 54.1. With no challenge coming around the far turn, Handover Belle was able to back the field down a bit, trotting 28.4 on the far turn. At that point, Gural Hanover pulled the pocket to challenge his entry-mate in the stretch as the rest of the field closed in. Wind Of The North mounted a strong bid along the pylons, while Allie Labrook and Shake It Cerry came

charging down the center of the racetrack. But, Handover Belle was able to hold everyone off to score a game victory. Wind Of The North rallied up the pylons for the place spot, with Allie Labrook rolling late to get up for third.

Handover Belle was driven by Yannick Gingras for Ron Burke, Weaver Bruscemi and Howard Taylor. With the victory, Handover Belle surpassed \$500,000 in lifetime earnings.

The Jimmy Takter duo of French Laundry and The Bank were as-advertised in the \$23,750 three year old open trot as they made their final tune-ups for The Hambletonian. Sent off as the 2/5 favored entry, The Bank cleared the lead going past the three-eighths pole, while his stable-mate, French Laundry, followed suit and took over into the far turn. French Laundry opened up daylight as the field reached the head of the stretch, but The Bank cut into that margin through the lane as the two finished well in front of the rest of the field and streaked under the line together, with French Laundry holding on by a neck in 1:52.4. It was four lengths back to Aldebaran Eagle in third.

French Laundry was driven by Brett Miller for Jimmy and Christina Takter, John and Jim Fielding, Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld. The win was the 10th in 18 lifetime starts for French Laundry and his earnings now stand at over \$392,000.

The freshman trotters geared up for the first round of major stakes for the two year olds on Friday night at The Meadowlands. Twenty four fillies went behind the gate in three eliminations of the Jim Doherty Memorial (formerly The Merrie Annabelle) while 19 colts and geldings contested the Peter Haughton Memorial eliminations, split into two divisions.

One of the major stars of the night was Broadway Donna, who entered the first Doherty elimination with an unblemished record and she left just the same, romping to a 1:53.3 score as the 1/9 prohibitive choice over Celebrity Eventsy and I'm Outstanding. The clocking was not only a lifetime mark, but it was the fastest mile by any two year old trotter, filly or colt, thus far in 2015.

Broadway Donna was guided to victory by Dave Miller for trainer John Campbell and Fashion Farms LLC, who also bred the filly. She will undoubtedly be a short-priced favorite in the \$389,450 Jim Doherty Memorial Final on Hambletonian Day after running her record to a perfect five for five.

The second elimination for the Doherty saw Womans Will assert her will over eight other fillies, winning in 1:55.3 as the even money favorite. She held off a late burst from the Jimmy Takter trained and driven Miss Tezsla and Silent Blessings.

Womans Will was driven by Andy Miller for Julie Miller and owners Al Libfeld and Marvin Katz, who bred the filly.

Kathy Parker got the job done as a co-favorite at 5/2 in the third elimination of the Doherty, winning in 1:56.1 for Johnny Takter. The two year old filly was guided to the lead before the half-mile pole and appeared to be an easy winner, until a 90-1 longshot, Lindy's On Fire, burst on the scene in the last sixteenth of a mile, but Kathy Parker was able to hold on by the narrowest of margins. Sunset Glider was a trapped-in third.

Kathy Parker, named for the editor of the Horsemen and Fair World, was trained by Jimmy Takter for Christina Takter, Brixton Medical, R A W Equine and J. Mc Clelland.

The first Peter Haughton elimination saw another favorite return dividends as Southwind Frank made short work of the field of 10, scoring his third victory in four starts in 1:54.1 as the 1/5 betting choice. Leading from the three-eighths pole to the wire, Southwind Frank easily held sway in the stretch over Earn And Burn and Alexander Hanover.

Southwind Frank was driven to victory by Yannick Gingras for Ron Burke, who co-owns the colt with Weaver Bruscemi, Our Hrs Cents Stables and J & T Silva Stables.

The second elimination produced an 8-1 upset in Milligan's School, who sat third behind a rapid pace, moved on the far turn, opened up in the stretch and held sway rather easily in 1:54.1. Favored Bar Hopping rallied willingly in the stretch to be second with Brooklyn Hill a game third.

The winner is owned by Story Inc and trained by Julie Miller. Andy and Julie Miller teamed up for their second win of the night.

NICHOLS, NY - Jim Morrill, Jr. continued his success on the New York Sire Stakes circuit on Friday (July 31) evening at Tioga Downs, prevailing in five of the evening's 10 races. Among his wins was a \$56,500 New York Sire Stakes split for 2-year-old pacing fillies, in which Soft Idea (\$3.00) kicked clear in upper stretch after staving off mild pressure on the far turn.

Soft Idea, a daughter of American Ideal and Walk Softly,

was relaxed in the early stages, brushing from fourth to clear Wishy Washy Girl (Ray Schnittker) after a:27.4 first quarter. Once making the lead with a circuit to go, Soft Idea pulled the pace back through middle fractions of:57.4 and 1:26.1 before Mother of Art (Mike Simons) applied mild first-over

pressure through the far turn. Soft Idea kicked clear off the far turn, opening up 4-3/4 lengths on her rivals for a 1:54.2 triumph. Mother of Art held second, while Art Critic (Aaron Byron) emerged from traffic to take third.

Linda Toscano trains Soft Idea for the South Mountain Stables, the Bay's Stable, the Radio Racing Stable, and Little E. LLC.
