"Dude" Says Adios to the Competition By Bill Finley

Dude's The Man had lost six straight coming into the \$400,000 Adios at The Meadows, but none of them by more than two lengths. He was a horse knocking on the door, and yesterday they let him in. Winning his first start since the June 6 Somebeachsomewhere, Dude's The Man turned in a career best effort and took advantage of a group of competitors that was lacking Wiggle It Jiggleit and some other top names to win the Adios by two lengths.

Trained by Jessica Okusko and driven by Corey Callahan, the son of American Ideal paid \$5.00 and went the mile in 1:48.4.

"He's from a great family, and he has great conformation," said Okusko, who couldn't fight back tears in the winner's circle. "He's really come into himself. This was the first time he raced on a five-eighths, and he got around it great."

Though third, beaten a neck, in his elimination, Dude's

The Man had shown enough that the bettors made him the favorite. They were also, no doubt, impressed by his second place finish behind Wiggle It Jiggleit in the Crawford Farms Meadowlands Pace. The chalk players might have had a few anxious moment when Callahan was forced to go first over from his spot in fourth

position. But he easily rushed past the leader, 5-2 shot My Hero Ron, and, from there, simply drew off to win impressively.

"On these speed-favoring tracks, you can't circle them from last," Callahan said. "You can't get away seventh, be third over and have a shot. I wanted to get away as close as possible, and fourth is where I ended up.

"I thought My Hero Ron was just okay last week," Callahan said. "I came at him last week with Yankee Bounty and almost got him, so I was pretty confident being first up with that horse on the lead."

Okukso said her horse has had problems dealing with shadows, which was evident yesterday as he took an erratic step here and there. He might have gotten a big break when a cloud covered the sun in the middle of the race.

"I was trying to talk him over the shadows and hold onto him," Callahan said. "Around the last turn, clouds came over. Someone was looking out for me in the last turn. The clouds covered the sun, and he paced right home."

After taking the lead and getting to the quarter in 26.3 and the half in 54.2, the Ron Burke-trained My Hero Ron tired badly and finished fifth. Burke is also the trainer of runner-up Yankee Bounty, whose now 0 for 11 on the year.



potential buyers after he was uncharacteristically dull last out when eighth in an Open at Chester.

"We have a lot of horses that are in the sale that are racing and winning," said sales manager Dave Reid. "We have numerous horses that have won in the last two weeks. And we have a lot of young horse. Somebody buying a horse Sunday will be able to race them for a while and they will have a lot of conditions left."

Through last night there were 16 outs, leaving 140 horses ready to go in the auction ring. There's no clear-cut favorite for the sale topper, but Reid said that Hip 112, Propulsion, is likely to be at or near the top of the list. By Muscle Hill out of Danae, the now 4-year-old cost \$250,000 as a yearling and just now seems to be reaching his potential. He was winless at two, won three times at three and, this year, has won three of his last four. Trained by Tony Alagna, Propulsion won a \$17,000 overnight race last out at the Meadowlands in 1:52.1.

"Propulsion is a very interesting horse," Reid said. "He's a stud by Muscle Hill and is very strong on the maternal side. I think he's going to have a lot of interest. He's won three of his last four three and two starts back he beat The Bank (the subsequent winner of a division of the Stanley Dancer). He was immature at two, raced at three and has really come into his own this year, winning in 52 and change in a serious mile. He's only going to move forward."

Allstar Legend should go for a good amount as should Hip 107, Odds On Amethyst. He's another 4-year-old Muscle Hill horse who is in top form. Racing for Jimmy Takter, he's won three of his last four in the Open ranks at the Meadowlands. Though finishing sixth in yesterday's Adios, Dreams Beachboy is a well bred horse by Somebeachsomewhere with a lot of upside and should sell for decent money.

"It's a pretty solid sale and I'm quite optimistic coming into this sale," Reid said. "We have a very strong middle to upper middle market. I know it's a cliché, but we really have something for everybody."

There were also be a lot of interest in the 16 horses in the sale trained by Casie Coleman. They are being sold to break up a partnership between her and owner Adriano Sorella.

"That adds some good flavor to the sale," Reid said. "They have some 2-year-olds that are racing and winning and some 3-year-olds that have plenty of life left. There are a lot of nice prospects in their group."

Reid notes that the Meadowlands sales have produced plenty of horses that have gone on to be big successes.

"At these sales we turn over a lot of horse who have gone on to do tremendous things for their new owners," he said.

HRU Race Criteria

Looks Like a Wide Open Hambletonian Oaks

With Mission Brief opting to take on the boys and with both favorites falling short in last nights elims at the Meadowlands, the Hambletonian Oaks could be anybody's race.

The list of top contenders will definitely include Spirit To Win and Lock Down Lindy, last night's elim winners.

By Lucky Chucky, Lock Down Lindy hadn't done a whole lot right this year, but she put it all together last night. She moved first over to take the lead on the backstretch and from there controlled the remainder of the race. She was 3 1/4 lengths in front at the stretch call and was a geared-down two-length winner crossing the wire for Tim Tetrick. She went the mile in 1:51.4.

Trained by Tony Alagna, Lock Down Lindy picked up her first win since taking a May 23 sire stakes race at Vernon

Downs. In her prior start she broke in the Zweig and finished last.

"I've had confidence in her all year even though things hadn't really worked out," Tetrick said. "A lot of bad spots and there were mistakes here and there, mostly mine. She showed tonight what kind of talent she does have. All cylinders were firing tonight."

Wild Honey, the 4-5 favorite was second, with trainer

Jimmy Takter subbing for the injured driver John Campbell. She was never a serious threat in the stretch but can no doubt fare better next week.

The Oaks favorite very well could be Spirit coming off a nose victory over Mission

Brief in the Del Miller at 48-1. After last night, that win doesn't appear to be the least bit fluky.

Livininthefastlane was made the 4-5 favorite for the Andy and Julie Miller team and she had the early lead after a comfortable opening half in 56.2. Meanwhile, Brett Miller, driving Spirit To Win, geared his filly up, moved from sixth to second and blew past the chalk in the stretch to win by

two lengths in 1:52.2.

"After last week I had a lot of confidence in her," Miller said. "Honestly, the slow fractions didn't bother me. The way she feels you know she's one of those horses that gives 100 percent and she won't stop until she gets by them."

Livininthefastlane was easily second best and is another one who should make her presence felt next week.

"When she's good, she's good from anywhere," said winning driver Yannick Gingras. "She hasn't been on her game for a little while. Her blood wasn't right — everything was messed up. But it seemed like she was back today. She can race any which way when she's good."

Bee a Magician, Texican N Win Saturday Night 48G Co-features

Publicity Director, Empire City @ Yonkers Raceway YONKERS, NY (August 1, 2015) - We offer up the Saturday night idiom, "Give them an inch and they'll take a mile."

We do so because after Texican N (Eric Carlson, \$7) won the first of Yonkers Raceway's \$48,000 co-features by an inch, Her Highness, Bee a Magician (Brian Sears, \$2.50), won the other by a mile.

Bee a Magician, as the 1-4 favorite, took no prisoners from an assigned eight-hole in the Open Handicap Trot. Making the lead just after a :28.1 opening quarter-mile, she completed her night's work as she pleased (:57.1, 1:25.4, 1:54.3). The final margin was an effortless 3½ lengths, while the final time knocked a tick off her own track record for aged mares.

Take My Picture (Larry Stalbaum) was second from a loose pocket, with Not Afraid (Dan Dube), Cashontherocs (George Brennan) and Fort Valley AS (Jason Bartlett) settling for the remainder.

For triple millionairess Bee a Magician, a 5-year-old daughter of Kadabra trained by Nifty Norman for co-owners, Mel Hartman, Herb Liverman and David McDuffee, it was her eighth win (sixth consecutive) in nine seasonal starts (39-for-56 lifetime). The exacta paid \$19.40, with the triple returning \$60.

Texican N, from post position No. 3, won the weekly pacing feature. Sitting pocketed to 17-10 choice Michael's Power (Bartlett), he then held off a three-hole The Real One (Pat Lachance) by a nose in 1:52.3.

The favorite decided to retake from the eventual winner (:27, :56.2, 1:24.4) passing the first substation, but faced in the lane. Frankie's Dragon (Sears), Michael's Power and Take it Back Terry (Brennan) came away with the lesser loot.

For second choice Texican N, a 7-year-old Down Under Bettor's Delight gelding trained by Peter Tritton (three winners Saturday) for owner Harry von Knoblauch, it was his fourth win in 22 '15 tries. The exacta paid \$30.40, with

the triple returning \$274.

The Raceway's live season continues Monday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings (all at 7:10 PM), with a Tuesday matinee (first post 1 PM). Evening simulcasting accompanies all night programs, with afternoon simulcasting available daily.

Judges Going Through the Motions

I would like to personally thank Murray Brown and Dean Towers (and others) for their full support concerning my previous articles on Meadows judges not performing their just duties and due diligence. It appears from watching the races at the Meadows recently, that Mr. Palone's right foot activities have ceased for whatever reason. His driving percentage has dropped approx. 30 points. In May it was .400, and as of July 31 it is down to .367. At no time did anyone for the Pennsylvania Racing Commission ever acknowledge or discuss my emails over the past 18 months. So why they enforce it now is up for debate.

I will now move on to pylon infractions, more importantly horses going completely off the track and re-entering the track where clearance exists and possibly hitting the board. Imagine for a moment that the lead horse on a 5/8 track or bigger breaks half way down the backside and enters the turn on a break. The driver pulls the horse up, gets off the track, lets trailing horses go by and re-enters the track after getting back on gait after going by the 3/4 pole. Which would mean, the horse and driver would have been going a much shorter distance at tracks with big radius turns, therefore saving ground in the actual distance of the race. The horse and driver would lose position at the time of the break when going off the track.

Since judges at most tracks don't want to be bothered or have suggestions made, maybe HRU is the best venue to pursue change at this time. Based on some of my conversations concerning active judges, most are looking towards retirement and don't want the hassle, especially judges working at racinos that received fat salary increases and retirement packages.

The people that put harness racing in the shape it is in today (which includes the USTA, various race commissions and owners associations) are in no way capable of solving or resolving today's issues. Had Mr. Gural put together a plan with a National Commissioner, nationwide rules and then presented a national plan, things might be different

now.

The parties in charge with their own personal agenda need to go..soon.

Murray Brown Explains Why He's on Chuck Sylvester's Side

Just so everyone is clear about my intentions regarding my comment in my letter to the editor in last Sunday's HRU:

(1) The horse in question trained by Chuck Sylvester came up with a cobalt positive in Pennsylvania. The authorities ruled that Chuck, being the trainer was responsible and imposed a fine of \$500 and a fifteen-day suspension. They had no recourse. Those are the rules and they had no choice but to uphold them.

The fact that Sylvester had this horse in his stable for only ten days and that it has been shown that cobalt can show positive for up to seven weeks and beyond is not the judges' fault, but that of the system. Some application of common sense needs to be applied to situations such as these.

Yes, I do understand trainer responsibility and what it means. I also understand that racing today is far different than what it was when the concept of trainer responsibility was instituted. I also understand the need to uphold our standards and have a drug-free level playing field. Do I have a solution to the dilemma? No I do not.

But I do think that extraneous situations need to be considered. It is far from a black and white situation.

(2) I respect and to a great degree admire Jeff Gural. I am certainly grateful to him for most of what he has done with his three tracks in particular and Harness Racing in general. However, I question his decision to both take away his horses from Chuck and barring him from his three racetracks as he was quoted as being about to do in HRU last Saturday.

Chuck Sylvester likely will serve his suspension and pay his fine, although it's highly likely that he isn't remotely guilty of the offense for which he is being punished. After he has paid his debt for an offense for which he is undoubtedly innocent, Mr Gural is about to bar him from the tracks that he controls whilst he is allowed to resume racing in the jurisdiction in which the offence took place.

There is something totally incongruous and inconsistent about that.

(3) When I said that Jeff Gural should close the doors to his racetracks, if he enforced the banishment of Chuck Sylvester, the statement was made metaphorically. To those that may have misinterpreted what I meant, I felt that if our sport was in such a state of disrepair that we were going to bar someone of the highest quality and accomplishment from it, then we had reached a point of no return and might as well give up the ship.

I understand and admire Jeff Gural's goals for integrity, great racing and a level playing field. Whatever he does

with his own horses is entirely his business. However, if he goes forward with banishing Mr Sylvester from participating at his racetracks, he is in effect throwing out the baby with the bathwater.

From a Batavia Downs Fan

I drove by Batavia Downs the other day. Construction of a new state-of-the-art hotel is underway in the area that was formerly the paddock. There has been a major facelift in the appearance of the track, now part of Batavia Downs

Gaming.



As I continued down the road, ghosts of races and drivers past fluttered through my brain. It was a journey back in time that evoked some wonderful memories from a different era of harness racing in Western New York.

I grew up hearing more stories about the great trotting mare Proximity than I did about my own relatives. My











mother would spin the same tale over and over, how Proximity and driver Clint Hodgins won two heats in the same night at different distances in 1949 (both of them track records at Batavia) and how part of the overflow crowd that came to witness history had to be moved to the infield.

My first personal experience with Batavia Downs came in the late 1950's. I could barely contain my excitement! In the very first race I watched, Canadian Dr. John Findley was involved in a terrible pile-up and suffered a broken leg. Although that cast a pall over the rest of the evening's nine race card, the enthusiasm in race announcer Max Robinson's voice prevailed.

And what great horses and drivers there were in the late '50's and the 60's! The Autumn Gold Series each year attracted the very best trotters, pacers, and drivers! Local horses like Clint Galbaith's Helen Brooke K, Don Huff's Cherry Point, and Vince Aquino's Grace Frost campaigned at the top of their game for many years.

The biggest extravaganza took place on August 26, 1966. Race secretary Don D'Andrea invited Bret Hanover and Cardigan Bay to the "Friendly Track" for a \$25,000 invitational pace. The purse and the publicity were unprecedented for the small track located halfway between Rochester and Buffalo. Stanley Dancer, driving Cardigan Bay, the great gelding from Down Under, vowed that if Frank Ervin left the gate with Bret Hanover that he would never see the rail. Despite of Dancer's intentions, Bret Hanover left from the outside post and had the lead and the rail before the first turn. Cardigan Bay was no match for Bret Hanover that night. The overflow crowd went wild when Bret Hanover paraded in front of the grandstand and bowed and pranced to the audience.

Two months later, the eyes of the harness world focused on Batavia Downs once again. Batavia's first and only International Trot took place. Two horses from the Soviet Union, American bred Apex Hanover (Stars Pride), and Russian bred Osman (Napor), competed against the best of the locals. Apex Hanover, winner of 14 of his previous 26 races, was driven by master Russian driver Maria Burdova. Osman, winner of 29 races in two years, all of them at the Hippodrome in Moscow, was handled by Ivan larotskov. While Osman turned out to be ordinary, Apex Hanover was the class of the race, trotting the mile and a half in 315.2. That was a major improvement over Apex Hanover's previous race in which he lost to the great French mare Roquepine in the United Nations Trot at Yonkers Raceway.

Over the years, many of the great names in harness racing have come and gone from Batavia—Buddy Gilmour, Ben Webster, Del Manges, Ronny Feagan, John Schroeder, Levi and Eldon Harner, Lou Rapone, Mike Lachance, Harold and Bill Wellwood, and Ed Arthur. Other drivers, possibly just as talented but never a major force on the national scene, such as Tom Dufford, George Forshey, Bob Bomar, Joe Hodgins, Jim Holmes, and Ken McNutt competed successfully for many years at Batavia Downs.

Batavia Downs faces many challenges now that its 2015

season has begun—I have no idea what the future holds for Batavia Downs, which is owned by the Western New York Off Track Betting Corporation. Even though the names of the drivers and horses are different, and Max Robinson is no longer calling the races, it is good to be back at Batavia. Joel Weiss
