Hambletonian Draw Not Kind to Takter By Bill Finley

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - Sometimes it might seem that Jimmy Takter never has a bad day, but that wasn't the case Monday at the Meadowlands as the draw for the 90th edition of the Hambletonian was anything but good news for the trainer.

Takter entered a powerful quintet of five horses in the Hambletonian, which will be held Saturday, but it's generally thought that his two best horses are Pinkman and Canepa Hanover. They drew into the same heat and drew the two outside posts. Pinkman was assigned post 10 and Canepa Hanover got the nine.

"Of course it did," Takter said when asked if his confidence had waned after the draw. "Nine and ten is like a nightmare. They also drew into what I think is the way tougher division of the two."

Takter will have three horses in the first heat, with the other being The Bank. He drew post two. He is down to drive both The Bank and Canepa Hanover and said he has yet to decide which one he will take.

In the second heat, Takter will send out French Laundry (post six) and Uncle Lasse (post seven).

"I was hoping Canepa and The Bank would be in split divisions because I was hoping to drive both of them," he said. "The Bank is really sharp right now and Canepa and has a world of ability."

Takter won last year's Hambletonian with Trixton, part of an overwhelmingly powerful trio of contenders he had that also included Nuncio and Father Patrick. Though he has more horses this year he admitted it's impossible to go into the race with the same confidence level.

"Last year, I had three that were totally outstanding," he said. "We won every single race with those three. There

wasn't a fourth horse that compared to them. There are a couple of good ones in here and, of course, there's Mission Brief. She's a serious horse. In the rankings we have five out of the top six. They are nice horses. Pinkman is not the flashiest horse in the world but he gets the job done every time."

Takter knows that Mission Brief could be a formidable opponent.

"I think she is," Takter said when asked if Mission Brief is the biggest threat to his group. "Ronnie (Burke) has done a helluva job with that filly. She really didn't look good for a long time and it was a big relief when she was second in the Del Miller. Then she looked good up at Vernon (in the Zweig). I understand why he is taking a shot in this race. You want to be in the main event. I'm sure he feels very comfortable in his division and he'll probably end up winning his elimination and maybe without taking too much out of her. That's a huge plus."

Mission Brief drew the two post in the second elimination and will likely be heavily favored. Takter and Burke will have to wait until after the heats until hearing from Yannick Gingras about which of the two he is picking. Takter said he hasn't given much thought as to who he will choose if Gingras is not available to him. Burke has not unveiled his back-up plan either, but said yesterday that Brian Sears is in the mix. Sears will drive his other Hambletonian entrant, Habitat. | share this story |

favorite. Sprit To Win died after a freakish accident yesterday at a training center in New Jersey.

Trainer Dustin Jones, who was in Canada at the time. explained that the filly got loose from

her handlers while they were attempting to get the equipment on her for her morning training session. She made it to the track at Mark Lancaster's training headquarters and tripped over the loose jog cart. Jones said when she went down there was blood coming out of her nostrils and she did not get up. Jones believes the filly ruptured an artery, perhaps in her lungs.

"Who knows what caused that," Jones said. "It's just one of those things. It's just a freak thing, like somebody having an aneurysm. She didn't have a scratch on her."

Jones' son Tyler was supervising her training at the time. He came out of the incident physically unscathed, but Dustin Jones said his son was reeling from the event. The elder Jones also made it clear that in no way was his son to blame.

"My son just got scratched up a little bit," Jones said. "Emotionally, he's petty shook up. So is the Lancaster family. They were pretty pumped up for this race."

Jones said there's nothing he can do now but move on.

"It didn't really sink in for about three hours," he said. "I was sort of numb. Then after that I felt sick to my stomach. In this business there are so many things that knock you down. People just get back up. The horsemen are so tough, they get back up and keep going."

A homebred racing for Fred Hertrich III, Sprit To Win had a coming out party when defeating Mission Brief by a nose at 48-1 in the Del Miller. Proving that race was no fluke, she came right back to win an elimination for the Hambletonian Oaks. She is the only horse to have beaten Mission Brief in a race where that filly did not break stride.

With Propulsion Leading the Way, Big Numbers at Meadowlands Sale

Thanks in large part to sale topper Propulsion, who sold for \$210,000, Sunday's Summer Mixed Sale at the Meadowlands showed a 17 percent increase over 2014 figures. It was another sign that the market for racehorses, particularly those who are racing and winning, is as strong as ever.

"I continually say that this is the best place to sell a horse at public auction," sales manager Dave Reid said. "That's

not just for self-servicing reasons but for obvious reasons. I think this sale proved again that our venues serve the need of many people and many levels of buyers."

Propulsion, a 4-year-old horse by Muscle Hill, led the

way as Swedish horsemen Daniel Reden bought him for one of his primary owners, Brixton Medical AB. Reden was among those who believes the horse has a huge upside. Out of Hambletonian Oaks winner Danae, Propulsion, who sold for \$250,000 as a yearling, got off to a slow start in his career but has recently put it all together. He has won two in a row and three of his last four and two starts back beat The Bank, who went on to win a division of the Stanley Dancer.

Reden said the horse will be sent shortly to Sweden to compete there.

"I saw the horse when he was in Lexington as a yearling and I had very good grades on him," he said. "I bought Trixton there the same year and this horse was close to him in my grades. I had really good grades on him and he had very good conformation. He looks like a late bloomer so when we saw he was in this sale I talked to my owner and said if we can get him this would be a great horse for Sweden. I think he will be very good at a little longer distance because he has very good speed. We have high hopes for him. I have bought many horses in the U.S. that

have been very good here in our stable and I think he will turn out to be one of the best."

Reden said he hasn't made any immediate plans for Propulsion but hopes to makes some of Sweden's bigger races with him this fall. If the horse performs well at that level Reden will have bought a nice stallion prospect.

The second highest price paid on the afternoon was \$132,000, the amount Nick Surick paid for New York sire stakes performer Oneisalonelynumber before dashing off to watch American Pharoah in the Haskell at Monmouth Park. Surick and his owner Howard Schniedler are looking for immediate dividends as they have entered the son of Bettor's Delight in Saturday's Cane Pace at the Meadowlands.

Oneisalonelynumber was one of 13 horses put in the sale by trainer Casie Coleman and owner Adriano Sorella, who are ending their partnership.

"The break up of the Cassie and Adriano partnership is unfortunate but when you put the caliber of horses they put in the sale people are willing to pay good money for them," Reid said. "There were several active bidders on Oneisalonleynumber."

The 2-year-old Michael's Victory checked in in third place at \$95,000, but was a buy-back for trainer Ed Hart.

"He's the kind of colt that started out slow for us but within the last month and a half he really turned the corner; he has really come around," Hart said. "There's a little more value to him now and we didn't really want to let him go. Sometimes that happens with young colts."

Reid said he was somewhat disappointed that the 2-year-olds did not sell better and that Canadian horsemen were as quiet as they were.

"One thing I found very noticeable and I've heard a lot of chatter about is, due to the weak level of the Canadian dollar right now versus the U.S. dollar, the Canadian guys are reluctant to spend," he said. "That's a concern going forward to the yearling sales. The Canadians are great friends to harness racing, Tattersalls Red Mile and Preferred Equine. If their dollar doesn't rebound before the yearling sales I think we have something to be concerned about." | share this story |

Campbell Won't Drive This Weekend, Aiming For August 22 Return

Despite breaking his left wrist last Friday in a spill during qualifiers at the Meadowlands, John Campbell had hoped

he could drive on the Hambletonian Day card. Yesterday, he said that's not going to happen.

"It just wasn't going to work," the Hall of Fame driver said. "Saturday night, I said to my wife, Paula, this is going to be pushing it too much and I'm not going to be able to do the things that I

want to do. It wouldn't be fair to the horses. So I decided Saturday night that I wouldn't try."

Campbell said his goal now is to be back in time to drive August 22 at Pocono, a night that will feature several major stakes and an appearance by one of his top mounts, the trotting star J L Cruze.

"I go back to doctor at end of week and I'll know more then," he said. "I'm optimistic for Pocono."

Had he stayed healthy, Campbell's drives Saturday would have included morning line favorite Wild Honey in the Hambletonian Oaks and Muscle Diamond in the Hambletonian. Tim Tetrick picked up the drive on Muscle Diamond and Yannick Gingras will get the assignment with Wild Honey.

"This is what everybody in the business strives for, to get into the Hambletonian," Campbell said. "It's a huge disappointment."

Campbell came into last weekend riding a wave of momentum and was in the midst of one of his best years in several years. He acknowledged yesterday that it can be difficult to regroup after an injury, even if sidelined for just a few weeks.

"I'm sure I can come back fine," he said. "I'm not sure I'll get the drives to. It's one thing to have momentum but you have to have the horses. I had lots to drives right now, lots of really good horses to drive. Getting those horses back and getting horses that are competitive, that's always an issue when you come back."

Barn Doll Wins her 8th in a Row (press release)

The die was cast early in the card at Monticello Raceway on Monday August 3, front end speed held up for 7 of the 8 Sire Stakes contested. In race 4, first heat of the Sire Sires, going for a purse of \$61,300, the Ken Jacobs filly, Jewels in Hock was no different as she went wire to wire to score in 1:56:3, 2 ticks off the track record held by Gerri Joys of 1:56:1. With regular driver John Campbell out due to a broken wrist, sustained last Friday baby racing at the

Meadowlands, owner Ken Jacobs put Jim Morrill Jr. down to drove his beautiful Credit Winner filly for Trainer Linda Toscano.

He was not disappointed. Summers Windsong left hard for Ray Schnittker to grab the lead, followed by Waiting Room, once the dust settled, Morrill who was sitting 3rd tipped Jewels in Hock to the outside to take the lead and took the field through fractions of 28:4, 58:1 1:28:1 to win by 3 lengths, she never had an anxious

moment, trotting her last 1/4 in 28:2

The bridge jumpers' delight, Barn Doll, cruised to an easy win for regular driver Jeff Gregory as the Conway Hall filly won her 9th win in a row. Her slate in 2015 reads 9 starts, 8 - 1 - 0, 1:52:1, with career earnings of \$260,000.

At the gate left, so did the entire field, Summer Scent wrestled her way to the lead, taking the filed past the 1/4 in 29:1. Going into the paddock turn Gregory started to mount his challenge and had the lead past the half in 1:00. Going down the back side, Frou Frou and driver Mark MacDonald came first over as Barn Doll tripped the ¾ timer in an evenly rated 1:29:1.

Dan Daley and Summer Scent was sitting the pocket, but as the field turned for home Gregory let her out a notch and the filly put an instant 5 lengths on the field, to score in 1:58:1 and returned a paltry \$2.10. She was barred from show wagering.

"She's just amazing," remarked driver Jeff Gregory in the winners circle following the win.

She is trained by co-owner Steven Pratt in conjunction with Purple Haze Stable LLC.
