It's Another "Takter-Tonian" as Pinkman Beats Mission Brief

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - He's a gelding, his wins always seem workmanlike and his own trainer was once so down on him that he placed him in the Harrisburg mixed sale last year, hoping someone would take him off his hands. There have been flashier Hambletonian winners, better bred Hambletonian winners and faster Hambletonian winners. Even his regular driver failed to stick with Pinkman vesterday.

But Pinkman has something few horses have, an innate ability to hit the wire before his opponents.

He did it again yesterday. Winning for the 14th time in 17 career starts, the gelded son of Explosive Matter was too tough, too good and too determined. The end result was a half-length win in the 90th Hambletonian over Mission Brief.

"He's such a fighter," winning trainer Jimmy Takter said. "This horse, you can do anything you want with him. He's not impressive, but he is impressive in the winner's circle. He gets it done every time."

There was plenty of drama before the race even started. Yannick Gingras was the regular driver of Pinkman and the superstar filly Mission Brief. After both won their elimination races he was faced with the most difficult decision of his career, and he picked wrong. He chose Mission Brief and in his absence Brian Sears picked up the drive on Pinkman.

Takter said he warned Gingras before the race that he had picked the wrong horse.

"I tried to tell (Gingras) you're making a great mistake," Takter said. "And I was right. Pinkman is just such a fighter. He's not impressive, but he gets it done every time." It was Takter's second straight Hambletonian win, coming a year after he won the race with Trixton, and his fourth overall.


Many had billed this as Takter vs. Mission Brief, and that was pretty much the story. Takter entered five horses in the Hambletonian and made the final with four. On paper, it looked like the only thing standing between him and the winner's circle was Mission Brief.

Mission Brief won her elimination by 4 3/4 lengths in 1:51.3. Some 25 minutes earlier Pinkman overcame the 10 hole and won the first elim by a half-length over stablemate The Bank in 1:51.2.

That set the stage for a battle of the sexes, with Pinkman, a gelding, the flag-bearer for the males and Mission Brief trying to become the first filly to win the Hambletonian since Continentalvictory in 1996.

Uncle Lasse, still another Takter horse, got the jump on the Hambletonian field and led early, but Sears didn't waste any time moving to the lead and seized control after a half had gone in 55.2. It was a smart tactical move and put him one up on Mission Brief in a game of catch-me-if-you-can.

"The draw was very important," said Sears, noting that Pinkman had the inside track with the two post while Mission Brief drew the four. "It put me in a great spot. He left in 26.2 from the 10 hole in the elimination, so we knew he can leave and get in a position to control the race."

Entering the stretch, the race was down to two. Pinkman had the lead and it was just a question of whether or not Mission Brief could catch him. She could not. Pinkman won by three-quarters of a length in 1:51. The

second choice in the wagering behind Mission Brief, he paid \$5.60.

"She raced really good," trainer Ron Burke said of Mission Brief. "If things shook out a little differently, the result might be different. She was the only one still going forward at the wire. She really gave it her all."

In some respects, this was an act of revenge of the part of Pinkman's sire Explosive Matter. He finished second in the 2009 Hambletonian behind Muscle Hill, the sire of Mission Brief.

Uncle Lasse finished third, beaten 4 1/4 lengths.

It was a huge day for the Pinkman connections as Takter also trained the Hambletonian Oaks winner Wild Honey. It was the second straight year he pulled off the Oaks-Hambo double. Owners Christina Takter, John and Jim Fielding and Herb Liverman also pulled off the double as all own parts of Wild Honey and Pinkman.


"We have been at this 30 years trying to win this (Hambletonian) trophy and I'll tell you this was the greatest thrill you could ever want in this sport," John Fielding said. "I am just blown away and very honored and happy to be in this situation."

Perhaps the only person with a bigger smile on his face yesterday than Takter and the owners was Brian Sears. He began the day thinking his only hope at winning the Hambletonian was with Habitat, Burke's "other horse." Habitat made the final after finishing fourth in his elimination, but, of course, Sears jumped at the chance when Pinkman became available.

"Just to get that opportunity, with the connections asking me drive a horse like that is very humbling," Sears said. "To get an opportunity like that is very special. I always have family come in for Hambletonian Day and friends from my childhood. I lost my mother in January and she'd always come up for the Hambletonian. This is an emotional moment for me."

It was Sears' third Hambletonian win. He also won with Royalty For Life (2013) and Muscle Hill (2009).

Gingras: No Regrets

EAST RUTHERFORD, NJ - There's no crying in harness

racing.

Yannick Gingras made as costly a mistake as a driver can make yesterday, taking off a Hambletonian winner.

The regular driver of both elimination winners, Pinkman and Mission Brief, Gingras chose to drive Mission Brief in the Hambletonian final. He simply chose the wrong horse as Pinkman, with Brian Sears in the bike, won the 90th edition of the \$1million race.

Afterward, Gingras didn't pout or complain. He knew all along that this would be a tough choice and went with the horse he felt had the best chance of winning the race.

"I'm not going to second-guess myself," he

said. "You have to live with it. I made the decision. I really thought I had the best chance (with Mission Brief). I promised both trainers I would make a decision and go with whoever I felt had the best chance after the first heat. That's how I felt and I can't change it now and I'm not going to look back at it."

At the top of the stretch Pinkman had the lead and the only horse with any chance of catching him was Mission Brief. But Gingras said he knew it wasn't going to happen. Knowing Pinkman as well as anyone, he just could not see that horse coughing up a sizeable lead.

"It was a good performance from Mission Brief, but Pinkman is a winner," he said. "He's a great horse. I know how great he is, I just thought maybe she could beat him, but he proved what a champion he is."

While Mission Brief raced well, Gingras said she wasn't quite as good as she was in her elim.

"I knew at top of the stretch I wasn't going to win," he said. "I knew what I had and I know how he is. At the top of the stretch I gave her a chance to do it but I would have been shocked if she got by him in the stretch.

"She wasn't quite as strong in the second heat as she was in the first heat. She was not as smooth gaited where I could make the moves I wanted to make. She showed what kind of guts she has she toughed it out and gave me a great performance."

The Hambletonian has not been kind to Gingras, who has never won the race. Last year he also drove the favorite, Father Patrick, but he broke stride and finished last.

"I am still young and I am thankful that I've had two great chances already," he said. "I'll have many more with connections like Ron Burke and Jimmy Takter I am sure it's going to happen for me even if it has escaped me so far.

Broadway Donna Wins the Jim Doherty Memorial to Remain Unbeaten

Maybe it wasn't as easy as those that made her an overwhelming favorite expected, but regally-bred two-year old trotting filly Broadway Donna bravely hung on late to win the \$389,450 Jim Doherty Memorial trot by a nose over a game Sunset Glider in 1:54 2/5.

Broadway Donna has now won 6 of 6 lifetime starts and has earned more than \$269,000 for owner Fashion Farms LLC from New Hope, Pennsylvania and she's supposed to be this good. Broadway Donna is by a Hambletonian winner - Donato Hanover - out of a Hambletonian Oaks winner, Broadway Schooner. Broadway Donna was made a 1/9 choice based on her opening five victories which were all taken by 2 ¾ lengths or more.

In the Doherty, however, Broadway Donna was forced to pass her sternest test to date. After taking over from early leader Sunset Glider just past a reasonable 56 4/5 half, Broadway Donna appeared on her way to another easy win. But when Sunset Glider slid out of the pocket at the 3/4 - timed in 1:25 flat - and Broadway Donna drifted out slightly, that opened the rail up for the Johnny Takter-driven Kathy Parker, and the race was on.

Just when it looked like Sunset Glider was about to get up on the inside, Broadway Donna found more and turned her rival away by the slimmest of margins.

"She fought off the horse coming on strong on the inside," winning trainer Jim Campbell said. She's done everything we've asked of her. She did it easier last week, but today she dug in when she had to, she hung on and that's the main thing."

The Doherty Memorial is named after popular horseman Jim Doherty, winner of more than \$20 million in purses at The Meadowlands, who passed away this March at the age of 74. Campbell paid tribute to Doherty in the winners circle.

"I knew Jim for 20 years of being stabled with him here and at Garden State," Campbell said. "He was a very good friend and a great horseman. He was a gentleman; if you bumped into Jim 10 times in the same day, he's say hello to you 10 times."

Broadway Donna paid \$2.20 to win and combined with Kathy Parker for a \$30.80 exacta. The trifecta with Sunset Glider third paid \$168.50 for \$2.

Anndrovette Dominates in the Lady Liberty

With driver Tim Tetrick pointing her to command shortly after the start, ageless pacing mare Anndrovette dominated the \$251,250 Lady Liberty, raced at 1 1/8th miles. In winning for the 44th time in a stellar career, Anndrovette easily pulled away down the stretch from pocket sitter Table Talk who sat a good trip on the winner's helmet throughout after leaving hard.

Table Talk blasted off the gate the same way she did in the 1 1/8 miles Golden Girls with Anndrovette dropping in second early. But Tetrick, seeing Beach Story floating up on the outside on the first turn, popped the pocket just past the 26 2/5 opening quarter and used the hung out Beach Story to advantage as she prevented a good flow from developing.

As Anndrovette marched past the ½ in 54 2/5 and the 3/4 in 1:22 2/5, Sandbetweenurtoes then circled up around a faltering Beach Story and briefly looked dangerous. Anndrovette, however, accelerated and after rolling past the mile marker in 1:50 2/5, the 4-time Dan Patch winner easily held Table Talk at bay, same as she did in the Golden Girls. The final time for the 1 1/8 miles was 2:04 1/5

"I just wanted to be in control or follow the one that's got some speed up front," Tetrick explained. "I got to control it, my mare was happy to be up there and when she's on her game, she's one of the toughest mares I've ever been associated with. She shows up and she's a true champion, no question."

The Lady Liberty victory boosted Androvette's earnings to more than \$3.4 million for owners Bamond Racing and Joe Davino of New Jersey. She trails all-time leading aged mare money earner Eternal Camnation by just \$250K now. Tetrick didn't blink when asked if he thought Anndrovette could make up that deficit on that great mare and assume top spot.

"She's eight and she's still going strong," he said. "She's broke a lot of hearts in this older division, you know a lot of horses try to take it to her and she lasts year in, year out. I give her tons of credit because I race her hard all the time and she likes it. She keeps coming back."

Anndrovette returned \$7.10 to win and combined with Table Talk for a \$38.40 exacta payoff. Venus Delight closed late to nab third and complete a trifecta that returned \$274.80.

State Treasurer Blows Them Away in the U.S. Pacing Championship

State Treasurer parlayed a big third-quarter move into a

dominating World and Track Record victory in the \$215,400 U.S. Pacing Championship, stopping the teletimer in 1:47.0 to shade Sweet Lou's mark of 1:47.1 set here last year in the William Haughton Memorial.

Under a supremely confident drive by Dave Miller, State Treasurer left mid-pack, but he

and several others were soon on the move in an active flow chasing after early leader Dancin Yankee who reached the opening 1/4 up by a length and a half in :26 flat.

By the time the field reached the 1/2 in :53 flat, the ageless wonder Foiled Again - who had been used hard had made the front but State Treasurer was hot on his hooves. State Treasurer then made a similar move as the one in this summer's Canadian Pacing Derby and moved to the front and quickly opened up two lengths by the time he reached the 3/4 pole in 1:19 4/5.

When State Treasurer turned first for home up by three lengths, Foiled Again was spinning his wheels in the pocket and no other rivals wre making any noticeable ground, the race became against the clock and a 27 1/5 kicker sealed the new records for an aged male pacer.

The time was only 1/5 of a second off the all-time fastest mile shared by four horses. Doo Wop Hanover closed widest from far back to nail down the place right on the wire but he was never a threat to the winner. State Treasurer was winning for the fifth time in eleven 2015 starts and pushed his earnings more than \$418,000 for owners Sally MacDonald form Prince Edward Island, Canada and Paul Macdonald of Toronto. He also pushed his lifetime earnings over the \$1.35 million dollar mark.

State Treasurer returned \$6.60 to win to his backers and combined with Doo Wop Hanover for a \$30.60 exacta. The trifecta with Foiled Again third paid \$124.80.

But while the big stars in yesterday's mile-and-an-eighth race barely showed up, Flanagan Memory put together one of the best races of his career to win by three lengths for Canadian-based trainer Rene Dion. Brian Sears was the winning driver.

"He's been good all along and he really likes this track


here," Dion said. "Last week (in the TVG Series) his odds were a little high (12-1) but he was coming from a break back home, and maybe that's why the odds were high. He's had a good season. He's been steady. I really liked the horse today because he has been

racing very good. The only thing that concerned me was the 12 horses in the race."

Market Share finished ninth. Magic Tonight was even worse, finishing tenth. He had traffic problems and was trapped along the inside for much of the race for Swedish driver Orjan Kihlstrom, but showed little when he did have racing room.

"Magic was not really himself, but that's racing," trainer Roger Walmann said. "You never know. I can't give you a

D'One was supposed to be the "other" horse racing yesterday for the Swedish team of trainer Roger Walmann and driver Orjan Kihlstrom as she was overshadowed by her stablemate and Elitlopp winner Magic Tonight. But it was the Donato Hanover mare D'One who came through for her connections, winning the Fresh Yankee by a length over Bee A Magician. Shake It Cerry finished third.

"I wish Magic Tonight did better today and I'm not sure why he didn't," winning trainer Roger Walmann said. "Between him and D'One, I really thought he was doing the better of the two. So I'm both surprised and happy that she's the one who won for us today."

D'One is out of Giant Diablo, who holds the world record for the fastest mile for an older trotting filly, which is 1:50.1.

"One of my goals now for D'One is to go to Lexington and beat her mother's record," Walmann said.

It was not a bad effort from Bee A Magician, the 3-10 favorite. It was just a matter of her getting beat by a good horse.

"She raced tough but the other horse got a little better

trip," said Bee A Magician's driver Brian Sears. "I knew that other filly was she coming, I knew there were a couple of them coming. She fought gamely, it just wasn't her day today."

D'One paid \$31.40 and wnet the mile-and-an-eighth in 2:05.

With Yannick Gingras driving, he won yesterday by 2 1/4 lengths in 1:54.3. He was the 3-5 favorite. Like Burke's 2015 Hambletonian starter Mission Brief he is by Muscle

For now, though, Burke is not ready to put her in the same league as Mission Brief.

"There's no second coming of her, at least among horses I've seen," Burke said. "He's very good and he keeps getting better every time. Yannick says he's different from her. He waits, but whenever he asks him he goes a little bit faster until he doesn't hear them and then he slows down.

The widest post and a long overland journey were no

Ake Svanstedt won the Vincennes with Resolve

sweat for Resolve on Saturday as the son of Muscle Hill stormed around stalling cover on the far turn and powered to an impressive two length win in 1:50 4/5 in the \$75,000 Vincennes.

The four-year-old Muscle Hill gelding seemingly was taking an edge, having faced JL Cruze in his last four starts in which he finished second once and third the other three starts. The wagering public made him a strong 6/5 favorite based on the obvious class drop despite the trotter not having won a race in six starts this year.

He didn't disappoint.

Driver Ake Svanstedt obviously had intent to leave hard with the winner from post 10 and they appeared in some trouble early when forced three-wide on the first turn as several rivals to his inside all left hard for position. Svanstedt was able to briefly drop in 5th at the 1/4 set by Canadian invader Etruscan Hanover in 26 3/5, but Resolve didn't sit long.

When Svanstedt saw II Sogno Dream tip from fourth, he was right back out and on the move. By the half, Luminosity had made front with Etruscan Hanover sitting in the pocket and Yannick Gingras drove the leader to a solid split of 54 2/5 with II Sogno Dream in hot pursuit and Resolve on his teamster's helmet.

Luminosity hit the three-quarters in 1:23 2/5 with II Sogno Dream stalling first-over, Etruscan Hanover looking for room in the pocket and Resolve swinging up three-wide appearing full of trot. When they straightened out down the lane, Resolve quickly sprinted away from those rivals, unleashing a 26 3/5 final quarter en route to the 1:50 4/5

Etruscan Hanover drove up the inside for 2nd in a good performance and Not Afraid closed for third.

Despite not having won in six starts this year Resolve had already earned \$160,000. The winners share from the Vincennes pushed those earnings just shy of the \$200,000 mark for owner Hans G Enggren of Pennsylvania. His

"I got stung to the quarter and then Brian never let up," Montrell Teague said. "I was thinking I wasn't guaranteed to go to the wire following him. It just didn't work out. When Brian started banging on his horse and made it clear he was not going to let up, yes, I was a little bit worried. We were going ungodly fractions, which was stupid."

In The Arsenal finished eighth, beaten 38 ½ lengths. Wiggle It Jiggleit will look to get back on track in Friday's Carl Milstein at Northfield.

Dealt A winner was 0 for 7 on the year, but was in the right place at the right time with the pace meltdown.

"I got him away fifth and they were going really hard into the first turn and they kept marching pretty good up the backstretch," winning driver Dave Miller said. "I never had to move him till the half. He actually swelled up in the hole and when I moved him he just took right off. This horse, he struggled a little bit this year, but he has got plenty of ability and got to show it today.

Apparently, just winning the Hambletonian isn't good enough for Jimmy Takter.

For the second straight year he won both the Hambo and

the Hambletonian Oaks. taking the \$500,000 race for fillies with Wild Honey. With Yannick Gingras driving, Wild Honey won the Oaks by 1 3/4 lengths.

John Campbell would have driven Wild Honey if he didn't break his wrist the prior week in a spill in a baby

race at the Meadowlands.

Wild Honey had lost four straight but was nonetheless made the 13-10 favorite. This was not the toughest of Hambletonian Oaks as star filly Mission Brief raced instead in the Hambletonian and Oaks elim winner Spirit To Win died earlier in the week in a freak training accident. Making things even easier for Wild Honey, second choice Lock Down Lindy broke stride.

The sad story of Spirit To Win was on the mind of winning co-owner John Fielding after the race.

Unlike Mission Brief, Wild Honey is a not a robust filly. but she is good. This was her 13th career win from 18

"This is fantastic," Takter said. "This little filly, she overcame her size. She's not a very big filly but she's got a big heart and she gives her all every time. I am just so happy and proud of her, so happy to be here with John Fielding. He has been with me for so many years."

When asked if he wanted to take a crack at Mission Brief with Wild Honey, Takter replied: "Not at all. I want to stay as far away from her as I can."

Fielding, Takter and another owner, Herb Liverman, were just warming up as 30 minutes later they won the Hambletonian with Pinkman.

Band of Angels and Yannick Gingras set most of that pace but it quickly became obvious after they passed the 3/4 pole in 1:22 2/5 that they would not be able to sustain that pace. As several horses fanned out the race looked wide open until Zeron unleashed Stacia Hanover's late move. She closed in 26 1/5 to seal the deal. Bettor Be Steppin and a fast-closing Divine Caroline finished in a dead-heat for second.

"She has unlimited speed, it's just a matter of how I drive her," Zeron said. "Steve always brings her ready to go and I just have to work out those magic trips and today it worked out great."

Stacia Hanover, 9/2 in the morning line, returned a surprising \$22 considering she was coming off a strong performance in the Miss New Jersey where she set strong fractions and was only beaten late.

In winning for the third time in 11 starts this year the daughter of Western Ideal raised her 2015 earnings to more than \$144,000 and her lifetime earnings to more than \$238,000 for owners David Van Dusen and Michael J Cimaglio of Ohio. The 1:49 2/5 clocking was more than two seconds faster than her previous speed mark.

-- In the first race, track announcer Ken Warkentin said "Welcome to Hambletonian Day 2015" as the aged horses scorched by the half in 52.2. Over \$100,000 was bet in the pick 5, a nice superfecta pool, that was logical, paid over \$2,000. This is what harness racing can offer, when the horses race, and the pools are big. What a start.

--It's interesting to watch some horses have a bad week when you least expect it. This is a game of no sure things. Broadway Donna had that bad day in the Jim Doherty, but she is such a solid racehorse she still got the job done. That's a nice filly folks.

-- The Lady Liberty allowed Anndrovette to pad her resume as an incredibly underappreciated racemare. She's amazingly tough. However, with a horse first over acting like a pick, Tim Tetrick did what he could to grab a 56.2 middle half. Distance racing is a neat thing, especially on Hambo Day, but the rules of racing need to be looked at for them, if harness racing wants to continue to showcase these tilts. Horses not advancing on the outside, turns a nine furlong affair into a quarterhorse race, and that's not the way it's supposed to be.

--State Treasurer has been the best older pacer this year, but at times his trips have been awful. Finally he got a chance to take control and it was over. The US Pacing Championship was perhaps not as deep as other years, but it's always entertaining and it's a great staple for Hambo Dav.

-- The Cashman did not disappoint. Like the US Pacing Championship, this year's edition might've not been deep, but the race was entertaining, and resulted in a nice payout. I have been watching Flanagan Memory for some time now and he's a hard trying horse who deserved to win a big one. Brian Sears picked up a live drive and won all the chocolates.

--It's 1:49 in the afternoon and I already miss John Campbell. Hambo day without John is just not right.

--After their first start a couple of months ago, the two best two year old trotting colts for the season looked like they'd be Southwind Frank and Brooklyn Hill. They came one-two in the Haughton Memorial. Burke gets some grief in some quarters for being a trainer that does well with purchases of high conditioned pacers, but simply gets a little lucky with the square gaiters. With his success with two year old trotters the past couple of years I think we can put that to

--After the Hambletonian eliminations we had some musical driver chairs. I don't think too many expected Yannick to book off Mission Brief, however, for Sears to move from the two horses he qualified to another, is something we don't see in harness racing. --It's rare to see a "First Jewel of the Triple Crown" be raced with so little fanfare, but such is the sport right now. The Cane Pace was anything but uninteresting. Wiggle it Jiggleit was used far too hard - especially off the time off - and was picked up by the always talented Dealt a Winner. It wasn't overly shocking that Wiggle was beaten; it was more surprising - to me anyway - how the judges left a horse that galloped like American Pharoah for a half a turn in his placing. - --Pinkman's one of those trotters; he is not flashy, or superiorly fast, but he is so seasoned and handy he gets the job done. Another well-deserved winner on a day full of them. Mission Brief is such a classy sort; she's obviously a bit off, yet she tries so hard. If you watch the replay take a look at her continue to try and fight right to the wire; even after Yannick knew they were second. It was like she was saying "c'mon Gingras, let's go". She, Ron, Yannick and the connections have absolutely nothing to be ashamed of. If she raced this race as a two year old she probably would've won. She's still the fastest filly I have ever seen.
- --"I thought you were doing a great mistake Yannick," said Jimmy Takter in the post-race interview about his conversation with Yannick when he chose Mission Brief. No comment from me, but that was certainly ear-catching! --I thought it was nice to see Scott Zeron and Stacia Hanover win the Shady Daisy. They've tried to race that filly kindly, and to teach her the ropes, and she delivered on a big day.
- --A few of the betting pools were a little lower than

expected, and quite frankly, it's hard to figure out. Pick 5's overlapped some of the pick 4's, yes, and with chalk in the mix the pick 5 is a better bet than the pick 4, but regardless, a few were soft. The last race Super High Five jackpot mandatory payout probably should've done better. Since earlier this summer, some of these pools (at Gulfstream Park and elsewhere) have been patronized less on carryovers than some of the massive pools we saw early in the year. Maybe the shine is off the rose a little. However, \$600,000 for a harness racing pool - when most people have gone home - is nothing to shake a stick at, and when professional Thoroughbred players like Charlie are sending in a c-note, it's a good thing.

We Must Not Water Down Trainer Responsibility

Everybody in our business knows and likes Chuck Sylvester. Murray Brown opines that the positive is probably due to the previous trainer. In this day and age with horses shifting barns often, I would think the prudent action for all trainers would be blood tests as soon as the "new" horse comes in to make sure no one is inheriting the previous guy's issues. This is just sound business practice.

As an industry, we must not water down trainer responsibility. In my profession, the concept of strict liability is taught in law school and has never been weakened in our jurisprudence. I remember vividly arguing as a USTA director for many years for the strengthening of trainer responsibility, particularly with the advent of so-called program trainers.

We cannot succumb to adjudicating positives or its consequences based on whether the accused is a great guy with a spotless record. We cannot create exceptions to fit the person. The "no exception" rule is what I admire about Jeff Gural's management style even when it affects horses he owns in whole or in part.

As an industry, we must hold on tight to the concept of strict liability, as this concept does not attach blame in all instances (as may be the case here) but rather attaches responsibility for our actions or those of others.

When Dealing With Positives Use Common Sense

The subject of cleaning up the sport of harness racing is getting a lot of attention, as well it should. I applaud any and all ideas to help us collectively achieve that goal. Sunday's articles from Murray Brown and Barry Mandell do, however, bring up clear points. Those are that some common sense needs to be observed and all the facts need to be evaluated before judgments are made either in making rules or forming opinions. I may be naïve and this seems so simple, if it has been floated before and discussed please don't print this.

We have lots of rules. How about a Sylvester Rule in honor of a trainer who has dedicated decades of his life to training and racing Standardbred horses with little or no positive tests for illegal substances. This rule would allow the new trainer of a horse to voluntarily take that horse to any race track, at the horse owner's expense, to have its blood/urine tested just as it would be tested after a race. This testing would be done within seven days of acquiring

the new horse. Training and racing would go on as usual. If these tests are negative and later post race tests are positive then there would be grounds for suspicion the new trainer was involved. If the initial tests came back positive then the new trainer would not be held liable although current rules in place for forfeiture of purse monies, etc would be in effect for the horse and owner should it test positive after a race.

This should help on several fronts. It would first protect the reputation of dedicated trainers who work hard and have success by following the rules. It would also augment out of competition testing. Trainers should want to have this done to protect themselves and their reputation. It would also make obvious, over time, what trainers were using illegal medications as their horses would test positive at the new barns.
