Downbytheseaside slays the Dragon in Milstein Memorial

The Brown Brown trainee set a 1:49.3 track record while defeating his stablemate by a length Saturday in the \$300,000 event for sophomore pacing colts at Northfield Park.

Fear The Dragon entered Saturday's \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial as harness racing's top-ranked horse. Everything looked to be going his way. He drew the rail, was the overwhelming favorite and posted soft fractions. However, Downbytheseaside paced home in :26.4 despite a tough first-over trip to best Fear The Dragon by a full length.

Downbytheseaside started from post seven and sat fifth through the opening :27.1 quarter. Driver Brian Sears pulled Downbytheseaside and grinded first-up through fractions of :56 and 1:22.4. The 1:49.3 final time was a new track record for sophomore colt pacers.

"I knew he was going to have a lot left with those soft fractions," said Sears. "I didn't want to have a speed duel."

The duel came in the final quarter when Downbytheseaside drew alongside Fear The Dragon, eventually wearing him down in the stretch, returning \$11.60 to win.

"He put in a great effort and every time I called on him he gave more," said Sears.

Brian Brown trains both colts at the historic Delaware County Fairgrounds.


"I am thrilled this horse raced the way that he did and got there," said Brown. "It wasn't like Fear The Dragon raced bad."

Finishing behind Downbytheseaside were Fear The Dragon, Classic Pro, Blood Line, Drunk On Your Love, Rock N Tony, R J P and Bags To Riches.

Saturday's stablemate duel was intense and trainer Brian Brown indicated that the colts will meet again in September in the Little Brown Juq.

USA's Marcus Miller leads World Driving Championship


The WDC got underway Saturday at Century Downs in Calgary.

The United States' Marcus Miller emerged with the early lead in the standings after driving a pair of winners during the 2017 World Driving Championship opener on Saturday, (Aug. 12) at Century Downs Racetrack & Casino in Calgary, AB, while Canada's James MacDonald also doubled up to finish the five-race leg in second-place.

RACE RECAPS

Race 1: United States' Marcus Miller opened the 2017 World Driving Championship (WDC) with a victory in the first race aboard 2-1 second choice Ashlynn Grace (\$6.20) to take the early lead in the point standings. Miller secured a pocket trip with Ashlynn Grace, who started from the trailing tier in post 10, behind the inside leaver and found room between horses

in the final turn to come through for the victory, timed in 2:05.3 over 1-1/16 miles. Defending WDC champion Dexter Dunn of New Zealand finished second aboard Freesia, the 3-2 favourite, after rallying four-wide outside of third-place finisher Run And Tell, driven by Austria's Gerhard Mayr.

"It set up just how I was hoping it would," said Miller following the race. "My trainer said the rail horse was the one to follow. There wasn't too much action outside of us early and it set up just perfect. I had just enough room to get out in the last turn, the right time, and it worked out. She raced great and they had her ready for today, it was a good deal. She was pretty wrapped up. A cozy trip like that through will do that."

Race 2: Canada's James MacDonald was victorious in the second WDC race, with 8-1 shot Lucky Lucka (\$19.70) clearing to command from post eight after the first quarter and holding off the competition for the victory in 2:03.1. Brighten Your Life came on for second for Finland's Mika Forss and Wild Chic finished third with Noel Baldacchino of Malta.

"She was really good, I never drove her before obviously, but it's just good to get the first win out of the way and I can concentrate on trying to pick away and keep making points and hope everything goes well," said MacDonald, who moved into first-place after the first two races.

"She hit her knee a little bit in the last turn and when she was starting to get a little tired, she was getting a little bumpy. I knew I had lots of horse, I just didn't want to push her off her feet. I was confident if I could get her to the straightaway, she had lots of go left and she could get there."

Race 3: Marcus Miller became the first two-time winner in the 2017 WDC and reclaimed his place atop the driver standings after scoring with 9-5 Kavola (\$5.60) in the third race. The United States reinsman sent Kavola three-wide from the outer flow approaching the third quarter mark to take over command and then held off a wall of closers to win in 2:07.3. Mods Mystery and Gerhard Mayr edged out Pinkmakesboyswink and Australia's Shane Graham for the runner-up honours.

"I'm very happy. There's a lot of races to go yet so I'm just going to try to hang in there and keeping doing the same thing," said Miller.

"They said that last week she was parked the whole mile and won anyway so I knew that she tried hard and I figured as long as I stayed close and was able to work out some kind of trip, which the way these races are going so far, second-over without seeing the wood seems like that's okay so far. She's a game little horse, a nice little racehorse and was good today.

"I think it was pertinent that I cleared before the last turn and I think that's what won the race for me, but she made a nice brush, that was good."

Race 4: Sweden's Bjorn Goop pulled off a 19-1 upset in the fourth WDC race as he made a power move in front of the grandstand sending Newport Min (\$40.90) three-wide to the lead and then prevailed in a three-way photo finish in 2:07.1. The duo held off a resurgent Outlawintriguedbyu, driven by Shane Graham, and early leader Test Pattern with Belgium's Rik Depuydt in the bike.

"First time ever racing in Canada tonight," said Goop after the victory. "That was a typical European move because they went so slow and I was far behind and I had to do something because I was at the end and I had to do something if I was supposed to have a chance to win.

"I was trying to make her go [down the backstretch] and she responded very well. She fought all the way to the line."

Race 5: James MacDonald closed out the first WDC leg with his second victory of the night for Canada. MacDonald sent Barossa Blue Genes (\$6.70) three-wide off cover approaching the third quarter mark and drew clear in the stretch to win by two and a quarter lengths in 2:03.3. Graham hit the board again with Chief Saratoga finishing second while Gray Zee and Miller got up for third.

"The horse went a big trip. I was out every step of the way, I was covered up," said MacDonald. "But I drove him a month ago when I was here in Calgary [for the Pacing For Charity event] so I did know a little bit about him and he was dropping a lot down from where he was that day and he came up with a huge effort today."

Miller ended the first leg of the WDC atop the leaderboard with 57 points while MacDonald finished in second-place with 50 points. Graham's top placings secured him third position in the standings, trailing MacDonald by just two points.

Drivers will earn points based on their finishing position in each race and the top point-earner at the end of the five-day competition will be declared the 2017 World Driving Champion and win \$25,000 in prize money.

The WDC leg is the culmination of the First Annual Calgary Racing Festival. The week-long event, running through to Saturday, included an Industry Day, Mid-Summer Classic card, Charity Bowling and Charity Golf tournaments, and a Charity Gala.

The drivers will head to Ontario for the next two legs at Mohawk Racetrack in Campbellville on Monday (Aug. 14) and Georgian Downs in Innisfil on Tuesday (Aug. 15). The action then moves to Trois-Rivières, QC on Wednesday (Aug. 16), where Hippodrome 3R will host the fourth leg before the drivers head to Prince Edward Island's Red Shores Racetrack and Casino at Charlottetown Driving Park for the fifth and final leg of the Championship on Friday (Aug. 18), one of the major highlights of Old Home Week.

The World Driving Championship — along with the 25th anniversary edition of the World Trotting Conference, to be hosted in Charlottetown — are both held every two years and will coincide with the 250th Anniversary of horse racing in Canada, and Canada 150 celebrations.

Drones at Old Home Week

How Curtis MacDonald and Red Shores Charlottetown put harness racing in High Definition.

It's often said that harness racing is resistant to change. Fortunately, Curtis MacDonald never got the memo. The Cujo Entertainment videographer is based in Guelph, ON, but turned to his home province and one of Canada's most historic racetracks to introduce a potential game-changer in 2015.

Curtis is a member of the well-known PEI racing family that includes his brothers, reinsmen Mark, Anthony, and Canada's representative in the 2017 World Driving Championship, James. Their mother, Gail, shares duties as track photographer at Red Shores Charlottetown.

"I've always been in the broadcast industry, and Ajax Downs (a quarter horse track in Ontario) started using a drone, every now and then, for special event days. I really liked the way the imagery looked from it," he said. "So I went out myself and bought one."

MacDonald's cousin, Scott MacLean, is one-half of the Universum Media team, which produces the Red Shores Charlottetown "Race Day" simulcast show. Curtis said he first asked MacLean about steaming live video from his drone for the 2015 Old Home Week simulcast. "He said he would run it by (Red Shores marketing manager and simulcast host) Lee Drake, and Lee was like, 'Yeah, for sure! Let's try it out."

The experiment took place under well-controlled conditions, albeit in a province renowned for its traditional ways. Drones have had a limited role in North American harness racing videography to date, although their use made headlines last November, when the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario hired a private operator to stream and record select qualifiers from The Raceway at Western Fair District. The AGCO's pilot project was intended to assist racing officials, not provide public entertainment.

Red Shores Charlottetown and MacDonald would prove an optimal match for a test flight during one of North America's best-attended racing events. "I understand the dos and don'ts around horses," said Curtis.

Despite widespread popularity of drones, non-professionals are prohibited from bringing them to racetracks. MacDonald noted that even with his professional experience and local connections, he wasn't exempt.

"To be flying over the racetrack, you need written permission from the racetrack, and you have to have permits with Transport Canada. If you don't have either one of those

things, then you're flying recreationally, which you're not allowed to do over an open-air event like that. You have to keep 500 lateral feet from any spectators or anything. You couldn't even be on the premises if you kept 500 lateral feet away."

MacDonald's Old Home Week drone is a DJI Inspire One professional model. He said that due to proximity of Charlottetown Airport to Red Shores, the first year he applied to fly it above the racetrack infield, there was extra paperwork involved. "They recently changed this, but on the day of the event, you had to contact the control tower at Charlottetown, because you're within three kilometres of the airport. I think it's approach path 'B' you're actually on."

He noted that the altitude of his drone isn't comparable to that of aircraft. "So it's not a big deal — they're just aware that I'm in the air."

Responsible operation involves a "spotter" to help monitor the device's every move. For Old Home Week 2015 and 2016, Curtis said his wife, Jaimi, worked alongside him.

"I'm watching the screen, seeing how the shot looks; she's got her eyes on the drone, just in case of something like coming close to a light pole. Those are really the only obstructions at Charlottetown."


Major outdoor events are inappropriate settings for amateur videographers to break out the drones. Recently, while working at PEI's Cavendish Beach Music Festival, MacDonald said he saw two "rogue drones" flying near his own. Festival organizers were swiftly notified, then the RCMP. "They knew what mine looked like, and I landed right away."

The 2015 Gold Cup and Saucer final will always be remembered for the torrential rains that saw it delayed, cancelled, and rescheduled for the following afternoon. "The drone that I have isn't designed to fly in the rain, so I wasn't going to fly in the rain at all," said Curtis. "When (horses) came out for post parade, I had Jaimi watching the radar on my phone, because I knew it was coming, and coming fast."

"I had to land anyway, because they were turning all the lights out. So I landed, and then it just came down like cats and dogs."

It wasn't the first time Curtis had dealt with adverse conditions. He assists his brother, trainer/driver Anthony, with live coverage of training days for young horses owned by "The Stable" fractional ownership group. "We actually started mid-winter last year. We were streaming every second Saturday, when I was there with the drone. We were livestreaming it; there were roughly a thousand people viewing the live drone days," said Curtis, adding that The

Stable's "Spring Showcase" drew an online audience of around 3,500 viewers.

While rain posed no complication to The Stable's livestreaming, drones are sensitive to other climactic conditions. "A couple of times this winter, we had to cancel the drone days, because it was just too windy, or if it got really too cold, Anthony wouldn't want to be out there training his horses anyway," said Curtis. "The battery is the main thing — if I go out and it's -20 (Celsius), I'm probably only getting about 10 minutes out of the battery."

According to Curtis, the unexpected, formerly unattainable, vantage points of drones bring a freshness of perspective. "I think it's a shot that's different," he said. "For the last 40 years, let's say, that they've been recording horse racing, it's always the same shot — it's a pan shot from the side of the grandstand... Last year at the start of the Gold Cup and Saucer, where I followed [horses] through the turn, I wasn't right over them, but it had the illusion that I was right over top of them when the gate let go... You never see that kind of shot."

Inclusion of drone video in live 2015 Gold Cup and Saucer race coverage appears to have been an unofficial first in Canadian harness racing. "When you do it, you always get comments on social media — people are blown away by how

it looks, how Charlottetown seemed to be the innovator to do this — take a live drone feed, and put it into their broadcast. Nobody else had done that, up to that point," said Curtis.

When he submitted a photo captured using his Inspire One to the O'Brien Media Excellence Awards, it didn't win, but it helped further the acceptance of drone photography. "You still have to have an 'eye'. The drone is flying in the air, but you have to be able to compose the shot."

Curtis confirmed there won't be drones overhead at Gold Cup and Saucer 2017. "Of all years to be 10 days away from giving birth to our first child, it happened to be the year that James is there on Friday night for the World Driving Championship," he said. "I'll be at home in Guelph watching it, cheering him on." He added that he hopes to be invited back to resume low-altitude aerial coverage next Old Home Week, as drones are no passing trend.

"It wouldn't surprise me in the least if Hoosier Park had a drone for Breeders Crown," he said. "It's just a shot like no other."





Finnish hour at Aby

The Åby Stora Pris, with \$245,000 for the winner, was held at Åby racetrack on Saturday afternoon and after the two heats, a race off was required to determine the winner.

Åby Stora Pris is a mile race with eight horses in two heats where the horse with post one in the first race starts from post eight in the next.

This year's edition was a fresh gathering with new horses in the elite and in favorite position four-year-old American bred (Brittany Farms) Muscle Hustle (Muscle Mass—Crown Laurel) started from the numbers eight and one. In the first race, Muscle Hustle made a break and spoiled his chances to win the Åby Stora Pris in two heats. Cantab Hall son Volstead, with Johnny Takter in the bike, was in front, but had no gas when the home stretch closed. Instead, it was the Finnish trained Midnight Hour (Diesel Don—Quanna Kemp) who used the open stretch at Åby and won the heat in 1:53.4 on a sloppy track for likka Nurmonen.

Midnight Hour was served a trip third over in the second heat and finished last in the eight-horse field.

Robert Bergh and Muscle Hustle opened quickly from post position one and was in front all the way. A time of 1:55.1 was enough to win the race and since there were two different winners in the races, a race off had to be held between the two horses.

Midnight Hour, who won the St Michel race in Mikkeli earlier this summer, easily took control of the last heat and Robert Bergh did not bother to push the speed up with Muscle Hustle. The first 5/8ths of a mile was passed in 1:21.2 (approximately 2:10 in mile time) and likka Nurmonen stole the race behind his six-year-old son of Diesel Don. Muscle Hustle tried his best on the outside during the last quarter, but Midnight Hour's victory was safe and this was a great win for Finland.

A time of 2:03.4 was enough to win Åby Stora Pris 2017.

"I was thinking of giving the front to Muscle Hustle but

Robert Bergh didn't seemed so interested, so I tried to keep the pace down as much as I could and in the home stretch my horse felt strong," Nurmonen said.

Discussions the last week has been about the shape of Åby Stora Pris, with two heats over the mile and this might have been the last time the spectators saw the race like this. A suggestion is about racing over 3.140 meters (1.95 miles), which could attract more of the best French horses to come to Sweden at this time of the year.

Hambletonian Day in review

Scott Zeron is the eighth driver to win the Meadowlands Hambletonian, but finish last the following year. International Moni was impeded and broke stride.

All eight horses broke stride.

Records set

This year marked the 35th straight time the Hambletonian was contested for \$1 million.

It was the fourth straight time the same driver/trainer won a race valued at \$500,000 or more — Yannick Gingras and Jimmy Takter in the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks.

It was the fifth time a Swedish horseman has won the Hambletonian: Per Eriksson (3), Jan Johnson (1) Jimmy Takter (4) Stefan Melander (1) and Ake Svanstedt (1).

The 1:48.4 track record tied by Blazin Britches for the 3 YOFP puts her in a three-way tie.

There were 30 sons/daughters of Muscle Hill on the card, the most of any one trotting sire for a single Hambletonian Day Card.

Perfect, you say?

Perfect Spirit is the third Hambletonian participant to have "Perfect" in his name, but the first to win it.

In 1985, Nearly Perfect was ninth and in 1965, Perfect Freight was 11th, ninth and sixth in his heats.

Muscle Hill's Hat Trick

Three offspring of Muscle Hill were entered in the John Cashman and they finished one-two-three: Resolve-Marion Marauder and Looknlikechipndale.

The top two finishers by the way were the only two to win

a million-dollar race (U.S. funds) in 2016.

Somebeachsomewhere

Eight of 12 in the Cane Pace were sons of Somebeachsomewhere, and he finished 1-2-3-4-7-9-11-12! (Huntsville-RJP-Downbytheseaside and Filibuster Hanover were 1-2-3-4).

Beach also did well in the Sam McKee Memorial, as his only entrant, 38-1 Check Six, scored the upset.

Beach continued on in the Golden Girls, with just two representatives — his daughter Pure Country held on (Call Me Queen Be was the other) to give him a stakes trifecta for the day. (Idyllic Beach was second in the Shady Daisy).

He had 13 on the card altogether and was 3-2-1.

Ladies Day - again and again

In 21 of the last 23 Hambletonians, a female caretaker has had the winner. This year, it was Janika Haggman

Pure talent

Pure Country held on to win the \$200,400 Golden Girls, with Mark Macdonald driving for Jimmy Takter. The two-time defending divisional winner is trying to do what Peace Corps did on the trotting side-be THE GAL all three years-Unprecedented in the Pacing World.

Numbers

155 horses competed on Hambletonian Day - 108 were trotters. Sixty-three of those 155 horses were trained by someone born outside of the USA.

The card had \$3.8 million plus in purses and favorites were seven-for-16 on the card.

Devious Man's 2.40-1 price in the Hambletonian final as the favorite made his the highest-priced Hambletonian favorite ever at the Meadowlands. Prior, twice a fave had been 2.20-1 (Armbro Keepsake in 1992 (fourth) and 2.20-1 (Tom Ridge in 2004 (eighth)).

How Swede it is, again

Of the last 20 checks handed out in the Hambletonian, 12 — or 60 per cent — have gone to a Swedish trainer. There were three this year as Svanstedt (1st) Marcus Melander (3rd) and Takter (5th) got money. In 2016, Takter was fourth with Bar Hopping, the favorite, and in 2015 Jimmy himself got three checks.

In 2014, the same. In 2013, it was Jim Oscarsson and Takter.

This year marks 10 straight years a Swedish trainer has gotten at least one check in the Hambletonian.

'Romp'-Er-Room

The two ladies who paid the least won by the most — they had the biggest winning margin on the day — the same 4 and 3/4 lengths. Blazin Britches in the Shady Daisy and Ariana G in the Oaks.

Elder statesman

For the first time in 15 years, the oldest driver in the Hambletonian won it — 58-year-old Ake Svanstedt. Mike Lachance was 52 with Amigo Hall in 2003 when he took it.

Not quite Ladies Day

Even though Julie Miller was the first female trainer to be second in a Hambletonian final, for the day, the lady conditioners fell a buck shy: 21 starts and a record of 0-4-1

Pinkman and Perfect Spirit

The two trotters are the only two to start from post 10 in

the Hambletonian eliminations at the Meadowlands and still win the Hambletonian final.

Had the original Hambletonian finish stood...

It would have paired the richest active driver, David Miller, with the richest all-time trainer, Ron Burke, in the winner's circle for, fittingly, the richest race of the year.



Long shots sweep PASS splits at The Meadows

A trio of long shots — Scirocco Bob (20-1), Fashion Woodchopper (15-1) and Toast Of Lindy (13-1), a combined 1-9 lifetime entering the day — laid waste to the favorites by sweeping the three divisions of Saturday's \$165,152 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows. David Miller enjoyed a double (Scirocco Bob, Fashion Woodchopper) in the event for freshman colt and gelding trotters known as the Florida Pro.

Scirocco Bob may have been the least likely winner, given that he had finished off the board in his two previous PASS encounters and remained a maiden. But he left alertly for early position, powered first over past Lawmaker down the backside and held off that rival late to defeat him by a neck. Rose Run Tyrone earned show. The time of 1:55.2 was just two ticks off Correctamundo's world record for 2-year-old geldings on a five-eighths-mile track, a mark set at The Meadows that has stood since 2009.

He has a lot of ability but hasn't been ready to go with it."
