Eight is Great

Despite going off-stride in the final turn, Betting Line recovered to win the \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park by four lengths for his eighth straight win.

Betting Line recovered from a break in the final turn to draw off and win the \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield with David Miller at the controls.

It's not easy becoming a racetrack millionaire. Especially in U.S. dollars.

Betting Line who had never before raced outside of Ontario, captured Saturday night's \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park, but not before making several hearts skip a beat after he skipped a stride or two in the clubhouse turn.

Though his margin of victory was four lengths, Betting Line's connections, including co-owner Christine Calhoun, trainer Casie Coleman and driver David Miller, had to wait out an inquiry by the track's judges who put a hold on the winner's circle ceremonies as they scanned the race video for a possible violation of the breaking rule by Betting Line.

After several anxious and silent moments, the result was made official and Betting Line, a winner of 14 of 21 starts and the \$1 million (Cdn) Pepsi North America Cup, was the sport's newest millionaire. The \$150,000 he earned for a Milstein mile in 1:51 put his career earnings at \$1,133,505.

Trainer and co-owner Casie Coleman said Betting Line survived a lot of firsts to win his U.S. racing debut.

Pure Country, the lone filly in the field, rallied from the back of the pack to finish second, a nose before Magnum J, who held a similar margin on the Milstein pacesetter, Mr Wiggle Pants. Sintra finished fifth, followed by Duel of Truth and Don'tcallmefrancis.

While the Milstein money is nice, Betting Line, now a winner of eight consecutive starts, gave both Miller and Coleman a few thrills they didn't need.

"He got to running in on me in the turn," said Miller. "He was uncomfortable and put in an extra step. Once I got him back, he just took off."

Coleman believes that too many firsts contributed to her horse's uneasiness turning for home.

"He had lots of firsts tonight," she said. "First time he shipped, first time in the States, first time on a half-mile track."

That said, Coleman was more than happy with the son of Bettor's Delight—Heather's Western's performance.

"He was awesome," she said. "But I do have to fix that problem in the turn."

And the main reason to remedy Betting Line's missteps is that the next time he races on a half-mile track will more than likely be in the Little Brown Jug at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.

Coleman knows her way around Delaware, having sent out back-to-back winners of the Jug in Michael's Power in 2012 and Vegas Vacation the following year.

Participating in the Milstein has proven a good luck charm in Delaware as the last two Jug champions, Wiggle It Jiggleit and Limelight Beach, both raced in Northfield's richest race.

Not violating harness racing's breaking rule is just the latest stroke of good fortune for Betting Line. Late last month, following a score in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold division at Mohawk Racetrack, he was involved in an accident when the trailer, driven by Coleman assistant Mark McKinnon was hit in a head-on collision.

While McKinnon reported that Betting Line "was a little agitated," he was unhurt.

Mr. Wiggle Pants, starting from the rail, was first away from the gate with Sintra on his heels. Betting Line rated third while well back after an opening quarter in :25.4, but was

the first to challenge for the lead when the field got to the half in :54.4.

The tightness of the turns on a half-mile track took a toll on Betting Line as he sagged a bit heading into the backstretch a second time. But he quickly gained on a determined Mr Wiggle Pants and was at his throat after three-quarters in 1:22.3.

Then came the misstep. However, Miller got Betting Line back on stride and he exploded down the Northfield stretch for his largest winning margin of the year.

Heavy rains turned the Northfield Park surface to slop earlier, but the track was upgraded to good prior to post time for the Milstein.

The Milstein had an early afternoon defection when Peter Blood and Rick Berks' Boston Red Rocks was scratched sick. A Dan Patch award winner as a freshman after winning the Breeders Crown, the son of Rocknroll Hanover—McGibson was to have started from the outside post eight.

Kiss Me Onthebeach sets 1:48.3 world record

Kiss Me Onthebeach, who had never been better than third in a stakes race during her first 17 career starts, changed her luck in a huge way Saturday (Aug. 13) night at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono, coming home strongly after wild front-end numbers to win her division of the fourth and final preliminary of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS) in 1:48.3,

a world record for three-year-old pacing fillies on a five-eighths mile track. Another daughter of Somebeachsomewhere, Darlinonthebeach, took her second Sires prelim win with a 1:48.4 victory.

To be fair, Kiss Me Onthebeach had been “there or thereabouts” against top fillies throughout her career before Saturday at Pocono, getting checks in 12 of 14 starts in stakes competition and winning her only three starts in overnights for trainer Chris Ryder and Bella Racing LTD. And she used every bit of Hall of Famer John Campbell’s sulky magic to make her breakthrough in a big way while defeating Newborn Sassy by a neck.

Favorite (2-5) I Said Diamonds left strongly from midpack in the field of five, but she met resistance from East Side Hanover, with the pole-sitter using racetrack geometry to force her flying rival to tuck well before an astonishing :25.2

quarter. East Side Hanover had her earplugs out coming into the stretch the front time, and soon so did I Said Diamonds, who rushed out for command 5/16 and was stretched by "East Side" before making to the top into the second turn, just before the ":52.3" clocking flashed and had the crowd buzzing.

Shezarealdeal was the first to move around the tiring East Side Hanover and tucked in the pocket, with Campbell and Kiss Me Onthebeach going on from behind her to challenge the leader to the 1:20.3 three-quarters. When "Kiss Me" took the advantage late on the turn, Newport Sassy, who hadn't been far back, tipped outside, and that filly ate into the two-length advantage the leader still had at midstretch, but came up short in the photo, with I Said Diamonds settling for third, a total of four lengths behind.

The 1:48.3 mile lowered by a tick the world divisional standard set by I Luv The Nitelife at Pocono just under three years ago (Aug. 17, 2013). The winner lowered her record by three full seconds, and with her first stakes victory raised her bankroll to \$131,075 while returning \$53.40 to win to her scattered backers.

Had Darlinonthebeach raced 17 minutes earlier, her 1:48.4 clocking would have put her name alongside that of I Luv The Nightlife, however temporarily; in any case, "Darlin" returned to the track where he had had a problem and had to be pulled up in the Lynch Final on July 2, putting to rest any "bad vibes" or whatnot with her authoritative triumph. Driver Matt Kakaley settled the winner of \$488,272 in fourth early as Call Me Queen Be worked to get around Lispatty in a :25.4 quarter, then got to the front past the finish line the first time and hung up middle splits of :54 and 1:21.4.

Call Me Queen Be had stayed tight in the pocket, and after a first-over move from Lispatty was shaken off, the "Queen" mounted a strong charge in the famed Pocono Pike, but Kakaley's filly still had a :27 last quarter in her and kept her adversary at bay by one-and-a-quarter lengths, with longshot Skinny Dipper third after an inside journey. Darlinonthebeach, who was sent off at 7-5 from the outside post six against Call Me Queen Be's 4-5 favoritism, is trained by Nancy Johansson for owner/breeder White Birch Farm, and lowered her mark by two-fifths of a second.

With Pure Country off at Northfield again taking on the boys in the Milstein Pace (she was second to Betting Line after finishing fourth in the Cane Pace on Hambletonian Day), Newborn Sassy saw her 25 points earned in finishing second Saturday bring her unofficially 100 points in the Sires preliminaries (35-25-15-10-8-5-4-2-1) to lead her group with a 4-1-2-1 record. With stakes conditions limiting the \$350,000 Championship, which will be held at The Meadows on Sept. 10, to eight, the following horses also get automatic qualification for the championship, listed in points order: Darlinonthebeach (95), Call Me Queen Be (90), I Said Diamonds and Pure Country (tied at 85), Kiss Me Onthebeach (65), Shesasmokinlady (58), and Lispatty (35). Skinny Dipper (31) and Shezarealdeal (30) will be programmed as AEs and can draw into the race until 6 p.m. the day before. The next nine highest point-earners not in the championship will have a \$50,000 consolation on the condition sheet for them.

Celebrity Eventsy posts easy win in Moni Maker

Celebrity Eventsy worked hard to seat her early challengers, then coasted home to capture Saturday's \$147,500 Moni Maker for three-year-old filly trotters at The Meadows.

Celebrity Eventsy left from the rail and could have settled for a two- or three-hole trip. But winning driver John Campbell wanted the front and hustled Celebrity Eventsy to the lead before throwing on the brakes.

"I wanted to be on the front if I could get there within reason," Campbell said.

With the field lined up behind him and no one eager to pull, Campbell was able to give the daughter of Manofmanymissions—Little Ms Queenie an internal half of :58, a breather that assured Celebrity Eventsy would have plenty left for the stretch. She did, scoring in 1:54.1, one-and-a-half lengths better than Zweig winner Flowers N Songs, who endured a tough trip from post eight. Southwind Pearl rallied for show.

"Once I got everybody seated, she got a middle half that was uncontested," Campbell said. "As long as no one was coming, I wasn't going to step on the gas until they did. She

responded really well. I think she'll have a good rest of the year."

Staffan Lind trains Celebrity Eventsy, who vaulted over \$400,000 in career earnings, for Celebrity Farms.

Celebrity Eventsy entered the Moni Maker off a respectable third-place finish to All The Time last Saturday in the \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks. Now, with All The Time sidelined after emergency surgery, Celebrity Eventsy may loom even larger in the battle for divisional honors.

"There are really nice fillies in her division," Campbell said, but I think she's in the top three. She beat All The Time and Broadway Donna in the elimination for the Oaks, so she's right there with those fillies."

Jimmy Takter, All The Time's trainer, reported Saturday that the filly came through her surgery well and, if her recuperation has no complications, could begin jogging in four months.

\$160,760 PASS – 3-Year-Old & Gelding Pacers

Saturday's card also featured two stakes for sophomore colt and gelding pacers – a \$160,760 Pennsylvania Sires Stake known as the Tarport Effrat and an \$80,000 Pennsylvania Stallion Series event.

In the Tarport Effrat, Manhattan Beach saved ground until the three-quarters, then unleashed a wicked first-over brush to triumph in 1:49.2, fastest this year by a three-year-old gelding on a five-eighths-mile track. Another Daily Copy was second, two-and-a-half lengths back, while early leader Western Fame completed the ticket.

"He's getting better and better," said winning driver Matt Kakaley. "He raced awesome (in the Cane Pace) on Hambo Day. He was second from last in a 12-horse field and finished second. He probably raced better than anything in that race that day, and today he followed up with another good one. He's sharp."

Ron Burke trains Manhattan Beach, a son of Somebeachsomewhere--Benear who now boasts a lifetime bankroll of \$350,412, for Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli LLC, Geoffrey Lyons Mound and Wingfield Brothers.

Check Six took the other division on the front end in 1:51.4

for Gingras, Burke and owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli LLC, William Switala and James Martin. That provided Burke a PASS training sweep, and when Fernando Hanover and Big Top Hanover chased their stablemate home, it gave Burke a 1-2-3 finish in the Check Six leg.

Although Check Six soared over \$700,000 in career earnings, the son of Somebeachsomewhere—Southwind Vanna is still seeking that signature victory that would elevate him to the hunt for divisional honors.

"He's raced against some good colts, and he's got some good results," Gingras said. "He hasn't been able to get to the winner's circle, but he's a really good horse. I really like him."

The Meadows will host the PASS championships for 3-year-olds, each worth \$250,000, on Saturday, Sept. 10.

\$60,000 Pennsylvania Stallion Series – 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

Spider Man Hanover seemed to have lost his super powers – he dropped all seven of his previous 2016 starts after earning \$221,355 at two. But he looked like the old Spidey on Saturday when he spun off a win in a stake-record 1:50.3.

Also taking \$20,000 splits were JJ Flynn, Western Dynasty and Power Of A Cruiser. Tim Tetrick (Western Dynasty, Power Of A Cruiser) and Gingras (Spider Man Hanover, JJ Flynn) swept the event while trainer Chris Ryder (JJ Flynn, Western Dynasty) also enjoyed a stake double.

Following Spider Man Hanover's last outing, owners Country Club Acres, Kenneth Vaupel, Mike Mallett and Milton Leeman transferred him to the Burke stable. The son of Western Ideal—Stolly Up Bluechip responded well to his new surroundings, knocking a tick from the previous stake mark established by Shock It To 'Em. Safesound Hanover was second, two lengths in arrears, with Nimble And Quick a rallying third.

"He hasn't seen the front for a little bit," Gingras said, "so I figured I'd put him there and let him see what he could do. He was a little tired finishing, a little grabby."

Western Dynasty powered to the front at the quarter and held off Urban Renewal by a half-length in 1:53.2, with Shoreview third.

"I thought he would be a contender in the sires stakes when I first drove him," Tetrick said. "He's just turned into a 'B' horse now. But he's big and strong and good enough to beat this group."

Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo and Ryder campaign Western Dynasty, a Western Ideal-Caitlin Q gelding.

JJ Flynn blazed to the lead in a blistering :26.3 before getting some valuable cover. He proved the freshest late, prevailing in 1:51.3 — matching his lifetime mark — for owners Joseph Barbera and Vincent Barbera. Owen Hanover and Sapient Hanover completed the ticket.

“He had the outside at Yonkers the last few weeks, and I wanted to be near the front,” Gingras said. “I thought he fit the race really good. Earlier this year, he showed more speed than the other horses in the race. I wanted him in contention, and (the fast opening quarter) was the price we had to pay. But I wasn’t worried.”

Goosebump Hanover, Non Stick score in NYSS at Batavia

Despite the oppressive humidity at post time, victory in the \$119,300 New York Sire Stakes for three-year-old trotting fillies was no sweat Saturday (Aug. 13) for Goosebump Hanover and Non Stick at Batavia Downs.

Goosebump Hanover (RC Royalty—Good Common Cents) took a wait-and-see approach in the first \$59,100 division as Jim Morrill Jr. took back to last while Lindylicious (Kevin Cummings), Swinging Royalty (Chris Lems) and Earn Your Wings (Charlie Norris) accounted for three lead changes before the half that was reached in :58.2.

At that station, Earn your Wings was on top by two when Morrill pulled Goosebump Hanover to follow the live cover of Lindylicious, who had made a move at five eighths. Morrill followed the outer flow until it stalled and then swung three-wide at the top of the far turn and started pouring on the speed. When they hit the straightaway, Goosebump Hanover was in full-stride and scored a one-length victory in 1:58.

After the race, driver Jim Morrill Jr. spoke glowingly of his

filly. “The race set up perfectly for her with the fast half. But when I tipped her and asked her for more, she trotted strong to the wire.”

Goosebump Hanover (\$10.40) is trained by Ron Burke for owners Burke Racing Stable LLC, J&T Silva Stables LLC, Crawford Farms LLC and Joseph DiScala Jr.

In the second \$60,200 leg, Non Stick (Lucky Chucky--Meucci Madness) took no prisoners as trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt left immediately and worked his way to the lead by the quarter in :29 flat. Open Access (Charlie Norris), who left behind Non Stick, was pressuring her on the outside at that point but made a break in the turn and that allowed the leader a :30.4 breather in the second panel.

Approaching the five-eighths pole, post time favorite Fad Finance (Jim Morrill Jr.) pulled from third and drafted outside of Non Stick up the backside. But as soon as the pair hit the final turn, Morrill gave the filly her head and Fad finance surged a length ahead of Non Stick. However the tables turned quickly when they straightened out in the lane as Non Stick came back on and pulled away to an easy two-length win in 1:58.2.

Non Stick (\$5.60) is owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc. and Little E LLC.

The second leg was won by Dazzling Dollars (Cash Hall--Designed To Dazzle) who was also driven by Jim Morrill Jr. and was also timed in 1:57.3. Dazzling Dollars (\$3.30) is trained by Trond Smedshammer for owner Wanda Polisseni's Purple Haze Stable.

The third split was captured by Hullaba Lulu (RC Royalty--Lulu Pernilla) who was teamed by his trainer, John Stark Jr. in 1:58.2. Hullaba Lulu (\$16.20) is owned by the estate of Edmund Smith, Daniel Giannuzzi, James Giannuzzi and Carol Wink.

Jim Morrill Jr. had a driving triple on the card while Dave McNeight III won with two.

Knead to Know

How to succeed in breeding and selling your own yearling.

Peter Remington, Esq., scheduled an emergency meeting of the Remington/Nosrac Harness Horse Corporation at the Knead to Know Bagel and Coffee Emporium. Peter was already seated with a cup of tea when I arrived.



Peter is a gangly 6'5" but does not appear tall due to a constant slouch. A basically good looking guy in his mid-thirties, for some reason this morning, my former college roommate sported a tweed jacket, slicked back hair and comically over-sized black glasses. Peter rapped his knuckles on the wooden table to call the meeting to order.

Merriman wins one in Ireland

Two of the harness racing world's top drivers, Aaron Merriman of the USA and Dexter Dunn from New Zealand, both found their own pots of gold Saturday (Aug. 13) on day one of the Ladbrokes Vincent Delaney Memorial weekend at Portmarnock Raceway.

After driver Aaron Merriman won a race in Ireland Saturday, he was interviewed by Hall of Famer Roger Huston.

Merriman, the world's top dash winning driver in 2015 and the current world leader this season, had to wait until the last race on the program to get his first victory outside of North America.

It came in the 11th race free-for-all pace sponsored by PJI Engineering and Lee Edwards, a bulky nine-horse field where only four horses can have their nose on the starting gate. Merriman was in post nine, thus starting from the third tier for the one-mile race.

"I really wanted to get a win today," Merriman said, "and it may have taken until the last race, but man is this awesome. My horse was a little aggressive and once we had clearance I just let him do it."

Driving the six-year-old Somebeachsomewhere stallion Sepia Sands, for owner/trainer Geoff Dunne, Merriman was able to swing wide of the field after the opening quarter mile and then came first-over, clearing to the lead at the half-mile. From there they were home free, coasting to the wire four lengths up on the field.

Their time of 1:58.1 was not only the fastest mile of the day on Portmarnock's half-mile oval, but a lifetime mark for Sepia Sands.

"I'm loving it here," Merriman said. "I have never been on this type of track before and might of have been a bit nervous at the start of the day, but after a couple of races I was into the swing of things. The people here are so friendly and outgoing, coming up to me just to say hello and welcome me to Ireland. It's all awesome!"

There were four elimination divisions Saturday for the 5th annual Ladbrokes Vincent Delaney Memorial for two-year-old pacers. Two divisions for fillies and two for colts. The first two finishers from each division plus the fastest six other horses from either division, return and race today (Aug. 14) in their respective finals for colts and fillies.

It was in the two filly divisions where Dunn rose to the occasion, winning one division and finishing third in the other, thus now having to choose between the two fillies on which one to drive in the final.

Should Sears, Kakaley been allowed to drive on Hambletonian Day?

Now that this year's Hambo is behind us, I had a thought that came to me watching the races at the Big M. When was Brian Sears or Matt Kakaley at the Meadowlands this year? I was curious and did a TrackMaster search.

Sears had 22 drives this year at the Meadowlands since Jan. 1. Ten of these drives came on Hambo Day. Kakaley had 27 drives, 10 on Hambo Day. I don't think it is fair that Sears who had only 12 drives and Kakaley who had 17 drives all year gets to come in and drive on the biggest day of the year. It is not fair to the fans, the other drivers and Jeff Gural. Cursing the courtesy tuck

Another great performance by Wiggle It Jiggleit winning (Friday's) \$325,000 Dan Patch race at Hoosier Park. Has anyone seen such consistency from a horse of this caliber for such an extended period of time? Unfortunately, that great win is not my motivation to write about that race.

The race re-emphasized how nauseating harness "racing" has become. Dave Miller floated out at the start with Always B Miki knowing that he could get a tuck any place he wanted. He decided to tuck in front of Ricky McComber Jr driving All Bets Off. I'm not singling out McComber for his crime (which it was) because whatever hole Miller wanted, the driver selected would have backed off. McComber did not follow Miller when Always B Miki moved (negating the strategy of letting the favorite in front of you so you could follow him) and got shuffled to the back. He closed stoutly to dead heat

Shamballa for third, losing the race by only a length-and-a-half. The first quarter was only :27 — a tepid first quarter time for this caliber of horse. If Miller was forced to go on, the first quarter would have been :26 and change making a :53 and change half inevitable. Could All Bets Off had won if that happened? We'll never know, but he certainly would have had a better chance.

Despite the \$325k purse, driving courtesy is more important than winning.

In harness "racing" where courtesy tucks are the given, trip handicapping by the customer is virtually impossible. You can never be sure when a horse that has never shown early speed will float out from an outside spot and create a favorable tuck where none exists.

There was a race a couple of weeks ago at the Meadowlands where the 10-horse clearly laid over the field, but showed no ability to leave the gate. From a handicapper's perspective, he was a great toss at even money. "Come from last or get parked the mile at odds on? Not with my money." So he tries to leave and goes up slowly when some other driver chokes back his horse to let him in at midpack. He grabs second over and wins for fun. That's just one race I am pointing out, but you see it all the time at every track.

But of course, in today's harness racing, the customer be damned. Courtesy for the drivers, but not for the customers who finance the business. Yet they wonder why handle has dropped so precipitously.
