Canada's James MacDonald stands astride the world

The PEI native won the World Driving Championship Friday evening at his hometown track.

A huge crowd in Charlottetown celebrated James MacDonald's hometown win in the World Driving Championship.

Canadian harness racing driver James MacDonald of Guelph, ON clinched the 2017 World Driving Championship (WDC), and its \$25,000 top prize Friday evening (Aug. 18) at Red Shores Racetrack and Casino at Charlottetown Driving Park, Prince Edward Island.

In a night to remember, a capacity crowd witnessed the hometown triumph of MacDonald, the first-ever Canadian to claim the international title on home turf.


MacDonald entered the fifth and final day of competition with a 26-point lead over Finland's Mika Forss. Without a win in the first three races to clinch the overall points lead, MacDonald sealed his claim to the WDC title in the night's final of four races by earning four points for an eighth-place finish with Instant Shadow.

The Canadian reinsman amassed a total of 211 WDC tournament points, ultimately besting overall runner-up Forss, who completed his drives with an accumulated 193 points for second. Marcus Miller, from the United States, tallied 181.5 points to round out the top three WDC drivers.

The 31-year-old Prince Edward Island native returned to

Harness Racing Update

his home province as the only one of the 11 WDC contestants to have won at least one race at each track leading up to the final leg of the tournament. MacDonald won two of five heats at Century Downs in Alberta on Saturday (Aug. 12), teaming up with Lucky Lucka and Barossa Blue Genes, before prevailing with Mystery Bet on Monday (Aug. 14) at his current home base of Mohawk Racetrack in Ontario. He went on to double up again at Georgian Downs on Tuesday (Aug. 15), reaching the winner's enclosure with Shemars Lulu and Walk The Plank, before earning his sixth WDC win at Québec's Hippodrome 3R on Wednesday (Aug. 16) aboard Federal Strike.

MacDonald is now the fourth Canadian driver to win the World Driving Championship, the first to do so on Canadian soil. Hervé Filion won the inaugural edition in 1970; his nephew Sylvain Filion won in 1999; and Jody Jamieson won the 2001 and 2011 editions of the WDC.

RACE RECAPS

Race 1: Björn Goop (Sweden) scored impressively in the first of four World Driving Championship (WDC) 2017 final races. The 1-1/16-mile pacing event saw him take Jinglewriter (\$3.70) to the front by the :27.3 quarter-mile mark, guiding the mare around early leader Maudail Mac, piloted by Marcus Miller (USA). On the way to the :58.1 half, Goop and Jinglewriter easily kept two lengths between themselves and first-up attacker Ameriquel, driven by WDC points leader MacDonald. Goop would only extend his advantage through a 1:27.4 clocking at the three-quarters, and a going-away victory at the 1:57.2 mile mark. Jinglewriter was the easiest of winners in the 1-1/16 mile event in 2:05 flat over late-charging runner-up Jays Little Spark (Mark Purdon, New Zealand), who left from post #11 in the second tier, and took the place-photo decision over show finisher Formidable (Shane Graham, Australia).

Goop called his mare "the best horse in the race", with "gate speed and plenty of stamina", adding "I wanted to win, for sure."

Free-legged Bignprecious broke stride before the start for Mika Forss (Finland).

Race 2: Austrian driver Gerhard Mayr sprung a 20-1 upset in the second heat of the WDC, staying alive while parked the mile and a sixteenth with Keep A Secret (\$42.90).

After floating just behind the front flight on approach to the first turn, the seven-year-old Galantine Hanover gelding was parked, but would cede to second-over position behind Dilans Mustang and Australian Shane Graham up the far side. After losing cover following a :27.4 first quarter (Dilans Mustang pushed clear of Elm Grove Kaptain and Sweden's Björn goop before yielding immediately to that rival), Keep A Secret would again find cover at the halfway stage, this time yielding to Caughtfoolinaround and Finland's Mika Forss. Caughtfoolinaround pushed clear of a tiring Elm Grove Kaptain with a quarter mile to go, but Keep A Secret sustained to a mid-stretch lead en route to a 2:06 victory

over the added distance.

Go With It and Canada's MacDonald reached second up the open stretch after a traffic-troubled journey, but were disqualified to third behind Caughtfoolinaround after inconveniencing that rival at the midway stage.

Race 3: Dexter Dunn of New Zealand circled four-wide up the backstretch with Kennairn Fame (\$15.60) to take the third WDC race of the night, covering a mile and a sixteenth in 2:07.3.

Pick N Scoop (MacDonald, Canada) dueled early from the pole position with Rising Fella (Forss, Finland), but yielded up the backstretch before being exerted to reclaim command three-eighths of a mile into the journey. Nearing the half-mile split in :58.3, Pick N Scoop raced erratically and drifted off the pegs, enabling Rising Fella to scoot up the pegs to reclaim the lead and causing interference to multiple horses in the outer tier.

Meanwhile, Kennairn Fame — who was relegated to third-over position in the middle stages — was caught in a blind switch by Quick Mad (Graham, Australia) on the third turn. With just over a quarter to go, Dunn swung Kennairn Fame to the four-path, and the pair were able to reel in Rising Fella in the final sixteenth. Pick N Scoop re-emerged to finish second past the post, but was disqualified to tenth for the aforementioned mid-race interference. Electric Syl and Maltese driver Noel Baldacchino were elevated to second, and the gathered-in Rising Fella was elevated to third.

As a result of the 10th-place finish, MacDonald was guaranteed no less than a share of the WDC title. For Forss to share the title with MacDonald, the Finnish driver had to win the last race outright while also needing MacDonald to finish 11th.

Race 4: New Zealand's Mark Purdon, who spent the duration of the week among the back markers of the WDC field, ended the tournament on a winning note with Painted Pony (\$65.10), circling four-wide on approach to the home turn to overtake the front flight and sprint clear in the straight.

Painted Pony left from the extreme outside and was parked second-over on the first turn, only to be caught behind a three-way battle through a :57.1 first half which included Bowyer Hanover (Mayr), Fly With Max (Forss), and All Turain (Rik Depuydt, Belgium). With just over a quarter mile remaining, Purdon angled the eight-year-old SS Sand Dollar gelding four-wide around the tiring Fly With Max and All Turain, neither of whom saw cover at any point. Painted Pony flew off at once, completing the mile and a sixteenth in 2:04.2.

Artners In Crime and Norwegian Eirik Høitomt mounted a stand-side rally to lift into second over Saulsbrook Quick (Goop), who chased from astern to take third.

MacDonald, who drove Instant Shadow from the second row, was locked in for the entire journey and could only muster an eighth-place finish, while Forss and Fly With Max ultimately faded to ninth.

The World Trotting Conference did its job

This week, I was reminded, yet again, about the passion and goodwill of the people in this sport.

On the day I arrived at the 25th Annual World Trotting Conference in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island I hailed a cab and got in. The driver — Dave from GrabbaCab — asked me what I was doing in town. I responded, and he mentioned he drove someone the previous night to the Delta for the same event.

"His name was Russell, and he had something to do with harness racing in the States," he said.

"Russell Williams," I asked, thinking it may in fact be the newly-elected president of the United States Trotting Association.

"Yes, that's it!" said Dave. "He's a heck of a nice fella."

That about summed up my whole 48 hours in Charlottetown; at panels, having a beer at the bar, walking the street, or just sharing a story or two.

I met John Campbell, a man I've always admired for various reasons, but someone I'd never actually met. The best compliment one can give someone in my view (and it's the reaction I had chatting with Sam McKee for the very first time), is when you can say "he (or she) is exactly like I expected him to be." That was John. During our chat I could sense the passion he has for the game, and his hopes to make it better. The Hambletonian Society is in good hands.

I had the pleasure of presenting on the first panel of the symposium with three others, one of whom was Chris Schick. Chris, as most know, runs Cal Expo. I never had the chance to meet Chris, but I've sung his praises before here in this column for his work with the USTA's strategic wagering plan. The plan that guarantees pools is one of the best ideas I've seen the sport come up with, and it has tangibly lead to handle increases. Chris, like John, displayed the same passion

for the sport.

When speaking about guarantees he told the assembled audience, "If your track is hitting the \$10,000 number, raise it to \$15,000, and then when it nears \$15,000 raise it to \$20,000. Never stop working, never stop getting better; don't be afraid if you fall short. It's the whole point of the program."

Chris's enthusiasm is infectious and I felt this even more when he described his circuitous route to the conference. He and his business partner at Cal Expo drove through New England, visiting harness tracks to catch some racing in Maine and elsewhere, including at a fair track. He was beaming when telling me about his experiences. The man absolutely loves the sport.

I remembered from my last time in Charlottetown that you sometimes run into harness racing participants and fans on the street during "Old Home Week" (the week that culminates with the Sobey's Gold Cup and Saucer pace). Sure enough, right on cue, I bumped into Ken Warkentin on Queen Street. Ken wasn't there for the conference, but lo and behold there he was smack dab in front of me. Never having met each other (and both on our way to somewhere) you'd think that maybe our interlude would be brief. But that wasn't the case. I bet we chatted for close to a half hour. The stories ranged from Greenwood to Garden State; from Freehold to Orangeville Raceway.

Encounters like the above were numerous. Dan Gall, Russell Williams (my cab driver was correct) and so many others I'd never met all struck me exactly the same way — passionate, and all possessing that harness racing lack of pretension gene; an everyman or everywoman perspective.

I get that the sport has a lot of issues. We all know there are problems in harness racing. But I was happy to be reminded over the past couple days what I love about it. It's a sport with a whole lot of "nice fellas" and "nice gals" who are passionate and capable and always working.

I'm so happy I was invited to speak, and to the folks slaving day to day working on harness racing's myriad issues, I wish you nothing but my very best. You deserve something good to happen.

Symposium Notes:

I found the session that asked the question "is whip free racing coming" quite interesting. There was a realization on the panel that the world is changing (the most important license for harness racing to get from government is a "social license," noted Australia's Geoff Want), but there was also a





pragmatism about the use of the whip for safety. John Campbell drove the latter point home when speaking about pacers that break, and their need to be controlled. As expected, no one argued with John.

I have no idea how Standardbred Canada's Darryl Kaplan gets through these conferences that he organizes. The man is a pit bull and one of the hardest working execs I've ever met. Harness racing is lucky to have him.

John Campbell spoke a few times about the judges needing to call the rules consistently and by the book. He also said that perhaps some rules will have to be written that are black and white to take interpretation out of the judges hands. As you probably know, John is heading up a new uniform rules committee, so this might be a harbinger of what's to come.

Dave from Grabba Cab story two: Have you ever gotten in a cab anywhere in North America where the cab driver tells

you who he likes in an upcoming harness race? Dave said Y's Lotus looked great on Monday and thinks he's going to win tonight's Gold Cup and Saucer again. You have to love Charlottetown.

Not only are the cab drivers keenly aware of the Gold Cup and Saucer, so is everyone else it seems. In the hotel there were GCS ads scattered about in information kiosks, and I picked up a local paper, to see the race advertised on the inside sleeve. Most surprisingly, perhaps, was a tweet from the provincial lottery (below). Yes, you can bet head to heads and the over/under on the winning time via a lottery ticket for a harness race in Eastern Canada. And you can purchase them in gas stations and corner stores.

World Trotting Conference symposium concludes

Topics focused on the future of harness racing across the globe.

The symposium portion of the 2017 World Trotting Conference, in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, concluded on Thursday (Aug. 17) with four panels addressing topics important to the future of harness racing worldwide. Following Friday's World Driving Championship Final, the World Trotting Conference will resume for its final sessions on Saturday, followed by the closing ceremonies.

On Thursday, Angel Suarez of Red Circle, an American marketing agency serving a racing and gaming-industry clientele, suggested ways in which tracks can bring traffic to their websites, and customers to their grandstands and simulcast signals. He said easy toggling between racing and gaming areas of racino websites was "extremely important." Suarez said targeting the Millennial customer base was difficult, yet offered opportunity: "They don't have money and they're not interested in sitting at a slot machine," but harness racing "lends itself to the Millennial mindset."

Racehorse breeding experts took to the stage next, with Ryan Dupuis of Ontario Racing sharing recent developments in that province's standardbred industry. He explained how purse bonuses and benefits for mare owners and breeders were helping Ontario harness racing in its lengthy recovery from the end of the Slots at Racetracks Program in 2012. "we're actually starting to see, in our standardbred sector, stability and growth," said Dupuis.

Christina Olsson of Sweden's Svensk Transport opened her remarks by advising that, "to promote breeding is very much to promote horse-owning." She said that trotters of mixed Standardbred-Trotteur Français bloodlines comprised around 100-thousand of Sweden's 350-thousand horses, with Coldblood trotters making up around 10 per cent of racing stock. "The next generation is born in Stockholm and has to have an opportunity to meet horses," she said, adding that programs like Rikstravet fractional ownership and the "Star Driver" program have helped keep harness racing popular.

Lisa Pfister promoted upcoming clinical trials of a specialized "milk analysis system" for mares, called Pfera. She said that better predication of foaling times reduces the mortality rate for mares and foals.

The "It's a Small World" international simulcasting panel was led by PMU France's Scott Finley, who identified three main barriers to the export of signals: data quality, pool size, and "time of day" that races are conducted. Arthur Cooper, a consultant to the Irish Harness Racing Association asked, "How do you change the image of trotting in Ireland?" to attract wagering. Andrew Kelly, the chief executive of Harness Racing Australia, credited the late Sam McKee with having "great confidence" in Southern Hemisphere racing, and "really delivering" by helping get Sky Racing World's simulcast Australian races to North American wagering sites and racetracks.

The last panel of the conference explored the question of "Is it time for whip-free racing?" Geoff Want, chairman of Harness Racing Australia, said the whip ban that would have taken effect in September 2017 was now on indefinite hold, and he was concerned about the popularity of racing in light of animal welfare activists' growing influence. John Campbell, the new director and CEO of the Hambletonian Society, said that, in his driving career, he considered the whip essential safety equipment, especially for pacers. Whip rule enforcement in Ontario had not harmed speed or racing performance, said Brent Stone, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario's director of racing. In fact, Stone said a number of horses had taken new lifetime marks shortly after stricter regulation became the norm.



Fear The Dragon roars, Huntsville "wild" in PASS

The latest battle of the top-rated sophomore pacing colts resulted in a 1:50.2 victory by Fear The Dragon Friday at The Meadows.

Perhaps Fear The
Dragon heard through the
grapevine that Huntsville
was poised to avenge his
defeat by 'Dragon' in the
Delvin Miller Adios Pace
for the Orchids. Perhaps
he was still miffed by his
tough loss last week to his
stablemate,

Downbytheseaside, in the Carl Milstein.

Or perhaps he's just that good. Harness racing's top-rated horse made a strong case for that theory Friday at The Meadows when he put away Huntsville at the top of the stretch and scored in 1:50 in The Tarport Effrat, a \$140,828 Pennsylvania Sires Stake for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers. A "wild" and spent Huntsville faded to fifth, beaten three lengths.

The stirring Adios duel between Fear The Dragon and Huntsville, at the time the sport's No. 1- and No. 2-ranked horses, produced one of the most memorable renewals in the 51-year history of the classic. The rematch was much anticipated, with some giving the edge to Huntsville, who'd enjoyed a week off following his victory in the Cane Pace.

But Huntsville was overanxious and sped through fractions of :26 / :54.3, resisting Tim Tetrick's efforts to rate him.

"He was really wild today," Tetrick said. "I was trying to rate him, and he had different plans. I guess all those fast halves finally caught up to him."

Fear The Dragon, meanwhile, was following the so-so first-over cover of long shot Some Attitude, making David Miller wonder if his cover would take him where he wanted to go.

"It would have been nicer if he'd taken me a little further," Miller said. "But my horse overcame it. I flipped him three deep into the last turn, and he took off really strong."

The son of Dragon Again—Armbro Cinnamon blew by the faltering Huntsville and defeated Perfectly Close by 1-1/2 lengths, with Blood Line third.

"He raced great today," said winning trainer Brian Brown of Emerald Highlands Farm's homebred, who now boasts \$1,263,201 in career earnings. "You saw him struggling past the quarter, but that's because Timmy was going so much. I think the horse is getting smarter, and he only does what he has to do."

Both Fear The Dragon and Huntsville will race next in the PASS championship Sept. 3 at Harrah's Philadelphia. Ray Schnittker, Huntsville's trainer and co-owner, indicated the

break would allow him to review his colt's rigging.

"He looked like he was out of control," Schnittker said.
"We'll change his rigging a little bit and see what happens.
We have some time to play with it."

In the other Tarport Effrat division, Filibuster Hanover served notice that he could be a force in late-season stakes when he roared to an off-the-pace victory in 1:50, 2 lengths better than Boogie Shuffle, with Q's Cruise third. The time was a lifetime best and fastest this year by a sophomore gelding on a five-eighths-mile track.

Filibuster Hanover signaled that he might be sitting on a big performance when he closed from 12th to fourth in the Cane Pace.

"He got away last in that big Cane field and closed so well," said winning driver Matt Kakaley. "He was awesome today. He did it so easy I never even pulled the plugs. If he can build on his last two starts, he could be one of the big players."

Ron Burke trains Filibuster Hanover, a son of Somebeachsomewhere-Fashion Ecstasy who extended his career bankroll to \$291,040, for Burke Racing Stable, Joseph DiScala, Jr., J&T Silva Stables and Weaver Bruscemi LLC. \$60,000 PA Stallion Series Stake — 3-Year-Old Colt & Gelding Pacers

In Friday's co-feature, Donttellmeagain remained undefeated in seven stallion series starts over two seasons when he triumphed in 1:50.4, a tick off the stake mark. Hypothetical and Braley Hanover took the other splits. Tetrick enjoyed a stake double behind Donttellmeagain and Hypothetical.

At 2, Donttellmeagain swept the four preliminary legs but missed the final due to illness. He skipped one leg this year but won the other three. On Friday, he moved to the front past the quarter pole and downed Jo Pa's Somebeach by 1-1/2 lengths while Mike's Z Tam earned show. The Dragon Again-Donttellmewhattodo gelding extended his lifetime earnings to \$189,960 with the win, which came after a month's layoff.

"There was no place to race him," said Jim King, who trains the winner for Paton Racing Stables. "He's won too many races so he doesn't fit anything. So I would have had to race him with horses he's probably not competitive with."

Hypothetical, who added a Cornell collar for the race, moved powerfully first over and won handily in a career-fastest 1:51.1. Southwind Yukon was 1-3/4 lengths back in second while Harry Terror earned show. Tetrick isn't sure the new equipment played a significant role.

"I know he's had some times where he breathed differently, but he did pace in 1:49 with me earlier this year," Tetrick said. "He just wore them down pretty good. He has some speed, and he's a big, strong colt who can carry it pretty good."

Braley Hanover tracked down the 2-5 Highalator and edged him by a nose in 1:53.4 for Miller and trainer Chris Ryder, who owns the Western Ideal-Brissonte Hanover gelding with Craig Henderson, Oompa's Farm and Robert Mondillo. Cinnabar Dragon was third.



From Valley Victory to notable HOY notes

Valley Victory, the sire of Muscles Yankee who is the sire of Muscle Hill, can be considered the "father" or maybe "grandfather" of Hambletonian Day. It was a day he never got to compete in himself in 1989 after contracting a virus, not being entered and calling it a career on a 10-race winning streak and a perfect sophomore season of seven-for-seven. His sons and daughters dominated the sales of the late 1990s-take a look:

In 1995, Valley Victory offspring were the second, fourth, fifth, seventh and ninth highest priced yearlings of the season.

In 1996, his offspring were eight of the top nine yearlings -1-2-3-4-5-6-8-9 — and that number does not include the \$200,000 price tag on his son Muscles Yankee, who was tied for 17th.

In 1997, Valley Victory's progeny were the second, third, seventh and ninth highest priced yearlings sold.

In 1998, the first, second and fourth highest-priced yearlings were Valley Victory offspring.

In 1999, Valley Victory's progeny were the first, fourth, 11th and 14th highest-priced yearlings sold at auction.

Svandstedt's simultaneous accomplishments

Ake Svanstedt won the 2017 Hambletonian with Perfect Spirit while also holding the world trotting record thanks to Sebastian K's 1:49 mile.

Trainer Chuck Sylvester held the same two accomplishments in 1998 winning with Muscles Yankee while Pine Chip's 1:51 time trial was the global standard.

Stanley Dancer also did this with Bonefish in 1975 while Nevele Pride's 1:54.4 still ruled.

Swan song

Hannelore Hanover's sire Swan For All may not be as well known as some of the other sires, but remember he was fourth in Stan Bergstein's 2009 Experimental Ratings — behind Muscle Hill, Explosive Matter and Federal Flex.

Harrisburg Heaven

Seven of the top nine races on Hambletonian Day were won by horses sold at Harrisburg — including the \$75,000 paid for the Hambletonian winner. This evoked memories, for some, of 1963 and 1964 at Harrisburg, when Bret Hanover went through the ring and everybody noticed — and then a year later a filly managed to slip past almost everyone. Fresh Yankee's \$900 didn't compare to the sales-topping \$50,000 paid for Bret the year prior, but both became Horses Of The Year:

In 1964-1965-1966 Bret Hanover was HOY all three years and 62-for-68 lifetime.

In 1970, Fresh Yankee was HOY and she had the distinction of defeating the other three-time HOY Nevele Pride in 1969.

WIJI-Moni Maker-Good Time

If Wiggle It Jiggleit returns to the track in 2018 and can regain his magic and be Horse Of The Year — again — it would not be without some precedent. The last two times a six-year-old was named Horse Of The Year, they had won it before.

In 1999, Moni Maker was HOY after also earning that title in 1998.

In 1952, Good Time was named HOY after also earning that title in 1949.

Wiggle It Jiggleit earned the 2015 HOY award and is the last \$2 million single-season earner in the industry.

Did You Know?

That the 1926 Hambletonian, in its first year, went for more than the Kentucky Derby?

That year, the purse of the Hambletonian was \$73,451 and the Kentucky Derby went for \$60,075.

Did You Know? (part 2)

That the last two Horses of the Year were undefeated the year before?

Wiggle It Jiggleit was one-for-one in 2014, the years before he was HOY.

Always B Miki was four-for-four in 2015 before becoming the 2016 HOY.

Others who have been named HOY with an unblemished record the year prior include Gallo Blue Chip in 2000 (eight-for-eight as a freshman in 1999), Niatross 1980 (13-for-13 as a 2YO in 1979 and also HOY), Somebeachsomewhere in 2008 (six-for-six in an abbreviate

Somebeachsomewhere in 2008 (six-for-six in an abbreviated campaign at two in 2007) and of course Bret Hanover in 1965 after a perfect start to his career going 24-for-24 in 1964 at age two. There's no trotters on the list, yet.

Conversely...

Notable horses who did not exactly distinguish themselves as freshman, but more than made up for it include:

- 1991 HOY Precious Bunny, who was one-for-14 at age 2.
- International Moni, this year's winner of the Goodtimes and a Hambletonian elim, was one-for-12 at 2 in 2016.
- Marion Marauder, the Trotting Triple Crown winner and the richest ever Triple Crown horse (pacer or trotter), was one-for-13 at two.
- No Pan Intended, the only horse to win both a Triple Crown and a Breeders Crown, was one-for-13 as a freshman in 2002.
- Escort won the very first Meadowlands Pace in 1977 after a winless 2 YO season of 0-for-15.
- Art Official was winless at 2 (0-for-15), but won the Meadowlands Pace at three, handing Somebeachsomewhere's only career loss.
- Triple Crown winner Western Dreamer (1997) was 2-for-10 in 1996.

Yes Mickey scores 34-1 Zweig upset

Trainer Ake Svanstedt swept the male and female Zweig finals Friday at Vernon Downs as Ariana G was second vs. the boys.

Yes Mickey closed along the pylons to defeat the filly Ariana G at the finish line for a 34-1 upset in the \$320,000 Dr. Harry M. Zweig Memorial Trot on Friday night (Aug. 18) at Vernon Downs. Trainer Ake Svanstedt swept the Zweig stakes, with his stable's Evelyn and driver Andy Miller also winning the \$135,000 filly division.

Svanstedt was in the bike behind Yes Mickey and left out from post three with Ariana G (Yannick Gingras) settling in behind while Long Tom (Brett Miller) advanced outside to take the lead into the first turn.

Long Tom clocked the opening quarter in :26.4 before Ariana G swept to command down the backstretch, reaching the half in :55.1 and then three-quarters in 1:23.3.

In the stretch, Long Tom tipped out with Devious Man (Andy Miller) rallying out three-wide, but the leading lady's biggest threat was looming in behind. Yes Mickey closed inside of Ariana G and surged ahead as the wire approached to win by a head in 1:51.2. The time of the mile was just one-fifth of a second off the track record for three-year-old trotting geldings.

A one-time starter as a freshman, Yes Mickey earned his second win to go along with six runner-up finishes in nine starts this year.

"He's a very nice trotter, but it has been hard for him to win races — he always finishes second — but today was the right race to win," said Svanstedt, who trains the Muscle Hill—My Favorite Chip gelding for owner Mellby Gard Inc. "He was very good the whole race and when I free on the inside, he did it easy."

In the \$135,000 Zweig filly division, Evelyn slipped out the pocket in the stretch and overtook the popular pacesetter Feed Your Head to win.

The Svanstedt-trained Evelyn and driver Andy Miller left from post three with 3-2 favourite Feed Your Head (Yannick Gingras) forging ahead through a :27 opener. The bettors' choice cleared to command past the first quarter mark with Sunshine Delight (Brett Miller) parked from post eight and Celebrity Ruth (Jason Bartlett) tipping out on cover.

Feed Your Head remained clear on top through middle splits of :57 and 1:25.4 while Evelyn bided her time in the pocket spot before finding room to split horses in the stretch

and trot by Feed Your Head for the 1:54.1 victory. Sunshine Delight finished second closing to her outside while Feed Your Head settled for third.

"I felt really good except I was a little claustrophobic looking for a little room," said Miller after the race. "She felt really good, I was just kind of waiting, biding my time to get a little room there, and when she got room, she took off."

Fresh off her first victory of the season in the Duenna Stakes, Evelyn paid \$16 to win.

The Muscle Hill—Viva Las Lindy filly is owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc., Little E LLC, Borje Nasstrom, Silva Stable 45.

Trainer Frank Antonacci and driver Scott Zeron swept the Zweig consolations with Fred Monteleone Stable's Ostrich Blue Chip going wire-to-wire in the \$28,220 filly event in 1:55.1 and Lindy The Great prevailing in the \$70,000 open division in 1:52.2 by half a length over Fly On for owner/breeder K R Breeding LLC.

Kadabra Queen remains perfect after three Gold events

Apprentice M and Perfetto also won Ontario Sires Stakes Gold events Friday at Mohawk.

Mohawk Racetrack hosted the two-year-old trotting colts and fillies on Friday evening and the novices put on an impressive show in a trio of Gold Series divisions.

The fillies jump started the evening and Apprentice M's

effort had trainer Jonas Czernyson's heart beating a little quicker than normal as she toured the Mohawk oval on the front end. Starting from Post 5, Apprentice M was sitting fourth when Sorceress Seelster reached the opening quarter in :28.3, but driver Doug McNair soon moved the fan favourite to the front and Apprentice M sailed through fractions of :59 and 1:28 on her way to a three-quarter length win in 1:57.2 Sorceress Seelster finished second and Miss Mimi was third.

"I was hoping for a come from behind trip with her and not being in the lead, but she did it and she got the job done from there, so I'm very

happy with that," said Czernyson, adding that his concern about her early move to the front was rooted in an equipment change made after her Aug. 4 runner-up effort at The Meadowlands. "A green horse and the first time open bridle too, so it was a little like 'I don't know if this is going to work', but she got it done."

The win was Apprentice M's first after a pair of runner-up finishes, the other coming in the July 25 Gold Leg at Mohawk. A Kadabra half-sister to \$1.3 million winner Charmed Life, Apprentice M was an \$85,000 yearling acquisition at last fall's Lexington Selected Sale by Menhammar Stuteri AB of Paris, KY and Czernyson had high expectations for her early in the training process.

"She's done everything right from Day 1, pretty much, so I've been very pleased with her," said the New Jersey-based trainer. "She's kind of a nice going filly and pretty easy to get along with."

The winner of the second \$94,800 trotting filly division is also pretty easy to get along with, and just over an hour after her third straight Gold Series win Kadabra Queen was gobbling down her dinner and heading back outside to her paddock.

"We're sitting here waiting for her to eat her dinner so I can turn her back out with her girlfriend and she'll go and spend the night outside," said trainer Chad Milner. "She lived outside all winter, no blanket, the whole nine yards. I think she's maybe spent five nights in the barn this year."

The natural life clearly suits the Kadabra daughter, who has not been worse than third in six starts through her freshman campaign. On Friday she and driver Scott Coulter went gate-to-wire from Post 4, rolling through fractions of :29.1, :58.3 and 1:27.2 on the way to a one-length victory in a personal best 1:57.1. Northern Lightning and favourite Smoke And Mirrors finished second and third.

"We're very happy with her, first time on the front end, wire-to-wire, real happy," said Milner, adding that he had considered making his own equipment change after the filly made a brief bobble at the start of an overnight event at Mohawk on Aug. 4 that resulted in a third-place finish.

"I was too scared to change anything," Milner admitted

with a laugh. "I tried all week and I warmed her up in the (ear) plugs and she was fine, but I was like, you know what, she's already won two Golds without them, I'm just going to leave them out."

Owned by breeder Harness Horsepower Inc. of Campbellville and Frank Monte of Markham, Kadabra Queen boosted her earnings to \$150,900 with the win and stretched her lead to 50 points in the two-year-old trotting filly standings.

In the \$124,200 trotting colt Gold division, Perfetto got a steady steer from Trevor Henry, who sat mid-pack with the fan favourite for much of the

race, waiting until the stretch to ask the novice trotter for a second gear. Perfetto responded with a sharp finishing kick that propelled him to a two and three-quarter length victory over Winning American in 1:57.3. Union Jack was well behind the leaders in third.

"I think he's going to be a really nice colt. He's very green and he's a little goofy, as we saw last week when he kind of made a break," said trainer Richard "Nifty" Norman. "He's just a little unsettled yet, but Trevor did a fantastic job driving him, and kept him really quiet. You know, the main thing was just to get him round in one piece and try and teach him something, and he did that and got paid for doing it, so it worked out really good."

Friday's outing was just Perfetto's second lifetime, he finished third in the August 1 Gold Leg at Mohawk, recovering from a bobble going to the half. The Majestic Son gelding, who was a \$32,000 purchase from the Harrisburg Yearling Sale, is owned by Norman's Enzed Racing Stable of Allentown, NJ and his partners David McDuffee of Delray Beach, FL and Joe Hansford of Foothill, AB.

The two-year-old trotting fillies and colts will return to Mohawk Racetrack for their fourth Gold Series starts on Sept. 25 and 26 after a series of open stake events, starting with the Champlain Stakes on August 31 and Sept. 1.

Tonight, the Campbellville oval will host the two-year-old pacing colts and fillies as they battle in their third Gold Series event. The pacing fillies will compete in Races 2 and 8, while the colts duel in Races 5 and 7. Mohawk Racetrack's first race goes in behind the starting gate at 7:30 pm.

Harrisburg Yearling Sale Preview now posted


