Black Broadway pulls off 20-1 shocker in PASS at The Meadows

Corey Callahan drove Black Broadway to a surprise victory in the PASS for trainer Michael Eaton Friday at The Meadows.

Black Broadway, a bargain acquisition due to an unsightly and potentially dangerous medical condition, justified her connections' faith in her when she pulled off a stunning 20-1 shocker in a stake-fastest and career best 1:53.1 in Friday's \$159,433 Pennsylvania Sires Stake at The Meadows.

The stake, known as the Meadow Bright, was contested over three divisions, with Miss Tezsla and Lookin Sharp taking the other splits. Corey Callahan enjoyed a PASS double behind Black Broadway and Lookin Sharp.

Black Broadway developed a hematoma at two and was sent back through the Meadowlands sale after a pair of

qualifiers. There, trainer Michael Eaton purchased her for \$9,000 for himself and co-owner Robert McHugh.

"She won a qualifier in 1:59.1, so we thought we'd take a chance on her - \$10,000 was our limit," Eaton said.

South Side Hanover (6, Todd Schadel) defeated Glidinthruparadise by a neck in a career-best 1:55 in the Pennsylvania Stallion Series.

Although the daughter of Broadway Hall-Sly Fox was winless in 11 previous outings this year, she came first over near the three-quarters and overtook last year's divisional champion, Broadway Donna, defeating her by 2-3/4 lengths. Spicedbourbon girl was third.

"I got excited when I saw Corey pull her," Eaton said. "I figured that meant she had enough trot. She gets better and better."

Miss Tezsla also saved her brush for the stretch as she cruised past Womans Will to triumph in 1:53.3 for David Miller, trainer Jimmy Takter and owner Miss Tezsla Stable. Goodtogo Hanover, who suffered her first defeat in 10 outings this year, shot the Lightning Lane for second, 1-1/2 lengths back, while Womans Will saved show.

"Her last few starts show she's on the way up," said Takter of the daughter of Andover Hall-Filly At Bigs. "I trained her mother — she was a really good filly for me. That was a good mile tonight."

Lookin Sharp worked out a pocket trip behind Kathy Parker, then blew by in the lane to score in 1:55.2, 2 lengths better than Haughty. Kathy Parker saved show.

"She's definitely improved," Callahan said. "She won her first start here this year, then had a couple bad goes. But she's always shown a lot of talent, and today she got the right trip."

John Butenschoen conditions Lookin Sharp, a daughter of Andover Hall-Warrawee Krisp who extended her lifetime bankroll to \$242,913, for William Wiswell and M&L Of Delaware.

\$40,000 Pennsylvania Stallion Series — 3-Year-Old Filly Trotters

The sub-feature on Friday's card featured another upset, as South Side Hanover poured from the pocket to score at 12-1. Ameliosi captured the other \$20,000 division.

South Side Hanover released Glidinthruparadise to the lead early and enjoyed a pocket trip thereafter. Nevertheless, trainer/driver Todd Schadel wasn't sure the daughter of Cantab Hall-Sharise Seelster would have enough pop in the lane.

"I know my filly has a big brush coming home," said Schadel, who owns the filly with Roger Hammer, "but I had to use her a good bit getting out of there. I thought the filly on the front end was the best in there. I would have been happy for second."

But South Side Hanover had plenty, defeating Glidinthruparadise by a neck in a career-best 1:55. Keystone Taylor completed the ticket.

Ameliosi made it look easy on the front end, triumphing in 1:55.3, a lifetime mark, for Yannick Gingras. Twill Be Done finished second, 1/2 length in arrears, with Casey T third.

"She doesn't have a whole lot of stakes left; I'm not sure she'll make it to the final of the stallion series," said Jenny Melander, who trains the daughter of Explosive Matter-Amelia Hall for John DeVito and Rocco Manniello. "Other than that, she doesn't have a whole lot."

Checking the Trainer Trends

A look at how some of the sport's top trainers are fairing compared to a year ago.

HOLDING STEADY



Trainer Ron Burke has maintained his torrid pace from a year ago. Saturday night in Charlotettown his star pacer Foiled Again will try to win the prestigious Gold Cup and Saucer.

Perennial top grossing trainer Ron Burke is on pace for another stellar year. As of Aug. 15, he was only \$132,590 short of his total earnings on that date in 2015. Keep in mind that we're talking about close to \$12 million. Last year, Mission Brief was sixth on the money list at this point, but she was his only entry in the top 20. Right now Southwind Frank, Check Six, Hannelore Hanover, All Bets Off and JK Will Power are all in the top 20. Burke was the leading trainer at the Meadowlands. He is on top at The Meadows, second at both Pocono Downs and Harrah's Philadelphia and fifth at Yonkers. He's a busy boy.

Jeff Bamond keeps a very low profile; the fact that he's made more than three quarters of his starts at quiet Yonkers Raceway is responsible for much of that. The indefatigable Krispy Apple is still getting it done, with more than \$137,000 banked already, but Anndrovette and Venus Delight have fallen short of expectations. The former has one win in 12 starts. And PH Supercam isn't what he was. Still, number five Bamond has only dropped one spot from a year ago.

Julie Miller was seventh on the money list on Aug. 15, 2015 and she was seventh on that date this year - color her consistent. Milligan's School, Sutton, Allerage Star, Southwind Hope and freshmen Devious Man, Big Man Ev and Money MacIntosh are a few of her charges.

TRENDING UP

Tony Alagna, on the strength of Adios and Hempt winner Racing Hill and OSS stalwart Caprice Hill, has gone from eighth at this point last year to fourth. The former, who is raising the profile of his daddy, Roll With Joe, is surely benefitting from Tony's experience campaigning Captaintreacherous. Alagna has taken advantage of numerous opportunities in the Ontario program in recent years, and he's the number nine trainer at Mohawk.

Richard Moreau, the top trainer on the WEG circuit and Canada's answer to Ron Burke, has gotten even better. He was ninth at mid-August of last year, but has moved up to sixth in 2016. He finished the 2015 season at number 13. Golden Son, Evenin Of Pleasure, Silverinyourpocket and PL Kahluaa are a few of his winners.

Ake Svanstedt was 19th this time last year, a half-season removed from money tree Sebastian K's retirement, but he's currently in ninth. Dexter Cup and EBC winner, Dante, the crack Lucky Chucky filly, Non Stick, and of course, Cutler and Cashman winner Resolve, are a few of the reasons for his rise.

Linda Toscano, who is having a very good year in the NYSS, has moved up from 15th in mid-August 2015 to eighth this year. Soft Idea, Robin J, Planet Rock and World Apart are a few of her better fillies.

Dylan Davis continues to amaze. The trainer of speedball Mel Mara and NJSS star and Tompkins Geers winner Every Way Out (Howard Taylor) has gone from 40th one year ago to 15 right now. He's acquired the Midas touch.

Casie Coleman had 25 per cent fewer starts in 2015 when she finished the year in 23rd place — than she had the previous year when she ended up in fourth. Last year, in mid-May, she was at 44. Right now, the trainer of Betting Line is at 25. She's the number five trainer at Mohawk.

Anette Lorentzen was off the top 50 last August, but she's at number 30 right now. The Credit Winner filly Earn Your Wings and the Dejarmbro freshman filly Madera AS are both performing well for her. Lorentzen's charges have already earned \$940,293 this year.

Rick Zeron is another who was off the board a year ago, but is now at number 37, with almost \$857,000. U.S. Pacing Championship winner Shamballa was good for almost \$300,000 of that.



Jimmy Takter is \$970,000 short of his mid-August 2015 haul. And since his earnings are only 37 per cent of Ron Burke's haul that shortfall is substantial. Hambletonian winner Pinkman had won eight of nine for \$1.1 million to this point last year. The winner of one race in Europe and none in North America has only earned \$76,000 this time around. And Wild Honey had banked almost \$400,000 by mid-August of 2015, but she's now across the sea. The Bank is also gone. Not that the cupboard is bare: Takter has the top sophomore pacing filly Pure Country, older beast Always B Miki and recovering Oaks winner, All The Time. As a matter of fact, he swept the three \$55,000 splits of the Hickory

Smoke on Aug. 16, the day after these stats were tallied. So, he's once again a sure bet for second on the money list. However, Burke may prevent Takter from getting that fifth Trainer of the Year award in 2016.

Gilbert Garcia-Herrera, who was sixth at the close of 2015, was fifth one year ago, but is now in 10th, despite being the leading trainer at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Brian Brown has no Lost For Words this year, but he is doing very well in the Ohio SS with the likes of Type A Grey and Bye Bye Felicia. Still, he's dropped from 12th a year ago to 21st today. Brown is the number two trainer at Scioto Downs.

Virgil Morgan Jr., the leading trainer at Scioto Downs, was in sixth a year ago and finished 2015 in 10th, but he's currently at number 21.

Tony O'Sullivan, the number 11 trainer a year ago, has fallen to 22. The Kiwi expat, who had Muscle Baby Doll raking in OSS cash in 2014 and 2015, has Calvin K and Happy Trio, to name two, this year.





Track Star is now a show star for Captain Kirk

I just glimpsed him out of the corner of my eye.

It was Sept. 16, 2012 and I was at the Delaware County Fairgrounds in Ohio handling a radio broadcast of Little Brown Jug week. Our broadcast tent was located behind infield judges' stand and I had only limited visibility of the track's homestretch.

But as the horses were parading to the post for the day's

fifth race, a non-descript event for a purse of \$6,000, a horse caught my eye.

He was a high-stepping chestnut with lots of chrome. He carried his head high and had a proud way of going.

"That horse might have the makings of a show horse," I mused.

To be truthful, I know about as much what makes a show horse as I do about quantum physics. Maybe even less.

But if I may be allowed to fast-forward a bit, this Indiana-sired trotter did indeed become a show horse. He became a champion in his first season in the show ring, and now is owned by William Shatner, the famed actor best known as Captain Kirk on Star Trek.

His name when he raced was Moveman, and he was by the Indiana stallion Semper Fi Hall, and out of a mare by Super Ben Joe.

In the race that day at Delaware, he left from post one, trailed the leader all the way, and was beaten more than five lengths.

There were many other races — and far, far more important ones — that week at Delaware and yet I simply couldn't get Moveman out of my mind.

So I mentioned him to my friend David Yoder, a perceptive horseman I first met in 1997 at the World Championship Horse Show at the Kentucky State Fair in Louisville. Earlier that year, Yoder had bought a horse named Sounds Like Fun. He earned just \$660 that year, and Yoder bought the son of Speed In Action after he'd been distanced behind a 2:06.2 winner in a qualifier. Sounds Like Fun's days of racing were clearly done. But Yoder converted him into a roadster for the show horse circuit, and sold him for a hefty profit in early '97.

Performing in the ring under his show name of Power Ranger, the horse won the first USTA Classic at the Kentucky State Fair. The purse of \$15,000 was a veritable gold mine in the roadster world.

Yoder told me that night in 1997 after Power Ranger's victory, "The owners could probably sell him tonight for \$75,000. Of course, that's a lot more than I got for him."

Power Ranger went on to be an enduring champion in the show ring for many years under the masterful touch of Raymond Shively of Indiana. If you combined the talents of Stanley Dancer, Billy Haughton, Jimmy Takter, Howard Beissinger and other greats of the trotting world, you would have what Raymond Shively is to the roadster world.

So when I mentioned Moveman to David Yoder in 2012, he decided to watch a few videos of the horse in action. His expert eyes saw some potential, but when he made an inquiry, he learned that Moveman was not for sale.

Yoder now lives in South Carolina where he operates Yoders Good Health Products LLC and he didn't have a chance to see the horse race in person. But he never forgot about him.

Good horsemen are patient and persistent, and Yoder

followed Moveman and later was able to purchase him. Moveman left the track with a 1:59h mark and earnings of \$58,861.

It was then Yoder's task to transform the racehorse into the show horse.

The roadster (or road horse) slice of the show horse world is small but enduring. They are shown to a cart and under saddle. The sanctioning organization is the American Road Horse & Pony Assn.

In 1997, the U.S. Trotting Association wanted to promote the versatility of the standardbred and helped establish the USTA Classic for trotters and pacers in their first season in the show ring. The purse of \$15,000 was a jackpot in the roadster world.

"I guarantee you that they'll have every guy who can hook a horse to a cart competing in that class," a horseman in the Bluegrass told me. "For that much money, they'll be coming out of the hills and hollers."

Two decades later the USTA Classic continues as a "coming out party" for newly-minted roadsters. Many of the horses are given "show names" when they leave the track. That was why Sounds Like Fun became Power Ranger in 1997 and Moveman became "The Mailman" and later "Track Star" in 2015. Even pacing-bred standardbreds can compete in roadster classes, but they perform on the trot. They are judged on gait, carriage, speed and manners. And it sure helps to have that "wow" factor that dazzles judges and fans.

Yoder wasn't too sure Moveman had that wow factor when he began trying to convert him into a show horse. He was worried that Moveman at about 16.1 hands was too big; he prefers this road horses to be 15.2 or so. Taller horses are often not so handy.

Moveman proved to be an exception, but it took a while for Yoder to appreciate that.

"It just takes time," said Yoder. "Standardbreds know how to go forward, but many of them don't have a mouth on them. I spent a lot of time with this horse on long lines teaching him to bend his neck and his body and to feel the bit. You've got to let the horse have time to forget the racetrack."

Yoder liked the fact the Moveman was finely made and had a long neck. A roadster must set his head in a certain way to get high marks from judges.

"A roadster must be a line-gaited trotter," Yoder emphasized. "Those passing-gaited trotters don't get around tight turns in the area that well."

Shoeing is important, said Yoder, but he said that roadsters seldom carry the exaggerated weight seen in breeds as the Tennessee Walking Horses.

"Even with a leather pad and a toe weight and shoe, a roadster probably won't carry more than 16 ounces," he said. "The less weight the better."

Yoder's friend Danny Bugg of Kentucky, who's had his share of top roadsters, saw Moveman in training and liked him so much that he bought half-interest in him. In the process, Moveman was renamed The Mail Man.

In the spring of 2015, Yoder says that The Mail Man started to understand what his new job was all about. So it was time to test him in the show ring. Bugg was in the bike when the flashy chestnut made his show debut in 2016 in Clemson, SC. The Mail Man delivered by winning the blue ribbon over one other contestant.

He was so impressive, however, that the champion chasers were soon hot on his trail. It seemed that every trainer saw The Mail Man as a rising star and wanted to acquire him. They began tossing some big prices at Yoder and Bugg. Yoder was practical and sensible enough to be tempted by the big money, but Bugg held out for more.

The person who was the most persistent and who had the deepest pockets was trainer Raymond Shively, and he finally made the partners an offer they could not refuse.

Shively then won three out of the next four shows with the

horse before his big victory in the USTA Classic at Louisville. The flashy chestnut was then sold to Shatner and named Track Star.

Shatner shows Track Star himself and the flashy gelding should have a long career in the spotlight at horse shows across America.

Meanwhile, the 2016 USTA Classic will be held next Thursday (Aug. 25), as part of the World Championship Horse Show in Freedom Hall in Louisville•

Rick Zeron said he owes pretty much everything he has to a \$2,000 claimer named Shadydale Alex — most importantly, his family.

In 1980, Zeron was a 24-year-old struggling trainer/driver in Ottawa when Shadydale Alex caught his eye. He wanted to claim the trotter, but couldn't afford it. So, he asked his girlfriend Joyce for the money. At the time, she was working for the Canadian government.

"She said, 'I'm going to lend you the money and you claim the horse.' She's the one that leant me the money to claim Shadydale Alex," Zeron said. "The little trotter, I think he only had a record of 2:14 or 2:15 at the time. I won with him one day in 2:10.1 and it was just like winning the Hambletonian. We were all excited and happy."

Shadydale Alex, a son of unknown sire Atlanta Georgia out Alexis Hanover only earned some \$17,000 in his career, but he was, essentially the foundation horse in what became the Rick Zeron Stable. The stable has campaigned such horses as Hanko Angus (\$1.2 million), Wild Turkey (\$791,922) and Lady Rainbow (\$800,616). Over his career, Rick has trained the winners of nearly \$30 million with more than 2,200 trips to the winner's circle.

Thursday (Aug. 19) at Mohawk, Rick won his 8,000th race as a driver. Recently, he also topped \$100 million by USTA accounting.

More importantly, Shadydale Alex helped Rick pass an important test with Joyce.

"The rest of the story is we got married, had four kids and

did well," said Rick, the father of top Meadowlands driver Scott Zeron.

"The running joke with Rick is that I leant him enough money that I had to marry him because I had so much invested in him," Joyce said, laughing. "I'm still waiting for the return. It's an inside joke that we keep having about how far we've come in our relationship.

"Had he not had someone to believe in him we wouldn't be where we are today."

Rick laughed when asked what might have happened with Joyce if Shadydale Alex had been a bust.

"She would have said, 'I'm out of here. See you later, loser.' Thank God we made money with him or she would have been gone," Rick said.

Wiggle It Jiggleit heads \$200,000 Prix D'Ete field

Wiggle It Jiggleit, headlines a short field of five pacers that will do battle Sunday (Aug. 21) in the \$200,000 Prix D'Ete at the Hippodrome 3R in Trois-Rivieres, QC.

Currently ranked #1 in the Hambletonian / Breeders Crown Weekly Top 10 poll and the richest harness horse of the 2016 season with earnings of \$1,016,927 (U.S.), Wiggle It Jiggleit, drew post one in the Prix D'Ete.

Once the richest and most prestigious race in all of Canada, the Prix D'Ete was dropped from competition in 1992 and was then revived by the Quebec Jockey Club at the Hippodrome 3R two years ago.

Prior winners of the Prix D'Ete before coming to 3R included world champion performers Niatross (1980), Cam Fella (1982), Strike Out (1979), Beach Towel (1990), Armbro Emerson (1986) and Romulus Hanover (1972) to name a few.

As the Prix D'Ete was an open event in the past, it is now restricted to just four-year-olds. The race was won by Sunfire Blue Chip in 2014 and by All Bets Off in 2015. Both horses won in identical times of 1:50.3, which was the fastest miles ever in Canada for four-year-old pacers on a half-mile track.

"It will be very special this year to all the harness racing fans in Quebec to be able to come and see the Horse of the Year, Wiggle It Jiggleit, compete at the Hippodrome 3R," said Vincent Trudel, general manager at 3R. "To have a world champion in this race is what made the Prix D'Ete so special many years ago and is now happening again this Sunday. It will be very prestigious for our racing program to feature such a great horse."

The post position draw is as follows:

Wiggle It Jiggleit comes into the race with 11 wins in 17 starts and lifetime earnings of \$3.2 million. Last week he captured the \$325,000 Dan Patch at Hoosier Park in 1:49.1, last quarter mile in an amazing :26 in defeating rivals Always B Miki, All Bets Off and Shamballa.

"The draw worked out great again," George Teague, owner of Wiggle It Jiggleit said. "We can't wait to come up to Quebec this weekend. Wiggle It Jiggleit is feeling great and

from what I hear he will really like racing over 3R's oval. It will also be special to show him off to the race fans in Quebec."

Rockin Ron hails from the Ron Burke Stable and comes into the race sporting 10 wins in 18 starts, a record of 1:50.1 and earnings this year of nearly \$300,000. His stablemate, Rock N Roll World, sports two wins and earnings of nearly \$100,000 this season.

Rockin In Heaven comes into the Prix D'Ete for trainer Dr. Ian Moore, off an impressive 1:51.2 victory at Mohawk Raceway for driver Jody Jamison. He has three wins and \$84,000 won this year.

ASAP Hanover has been first, second or third in eight of his 12 starts this year for trainer Sean Mehlenbacker and has a record this season of 1:50.2.

Harness racing returning to Virginia

The Virginia Racing Commission gave unanimous approval at its Thursday (Aug. 18) meeting to bring pari-mutuel harness racing back to the Commonwealth this fall at Shenandoah Downs.

The limited-license request was submitted by the Virginia Downs Foundation. The Virginia Equine Alliance will provide race office personnel and conduct the races, and the Virginia Harness Horsemen's Association will provide \$800,000 from its purse account to fund the races.

In the request presentation Thursday, VEA Executive Director Jeb Hannum noted 10 days of racing will occur this fall over five consecutive weekends from Sept. 10-Oct. 9, and races will be held every Saturday and Sunday at 1 p.m. An extensive \$700,000-plus track renovation project reached the completion stage this past week.

"This is a very significant day," said D.G. Van Clief, Chairman of the Virginia Racing Commission. "The Commission approved a new racetrack and meet today along with a slate of racing officials. This is a big step forward as we rebuild the Virginia racing industry."
